Buckeyes Face Penn State to Open B1G Tournament

Ohio State enters the tournament winners of eight of its last nine

Winners of eight of their last nine games, the Ohio State softball team begins postseason play on Thursday in the opening round of the 2014 Big Ten Tournament. Seeded seventh, the Buckeyes will take on 10th-seeded Penn State at Northwestern's Sharon J. Drysdale Field on Thursday at 1:30 p.m. (CST). If Ohio State advances, it will face second-seeded Nebraska on Friday, also at 1:30 p.m.

BUCKEYES IN A NUTSHELL

Ohio State finished the regular season 28-24 overall and 13-10 in the Big Ten. The Buckeyes won eight of their final nine games, including a doubleheader victory over Penn State, a three-game sweep of Northwestern and two of three last weekend at Iowa.

At the plate, senior **Evelyn Carrillo** leads the way with a .380 average, 34 RBI, 20 runs scored and a .552 slugging percentage. In Big Ten play, she hit .458 with 17 RBI, five home runs and a .708 slugging percentage. **Cammi Prantl** (.325, 14 2B, 33 runs, 31 RBI), **Taylor Watkins** (.361, 37 runs, 28 RBI) and **Caitlin Conrad** (.325, 35 RBI, 37 runs, .584 slugging percentage) also provide all-around offensive production. In Big Ten play, Carrillo, Prantl, Watkins and senior Leesa Gresham (.423 in 15 games) all hit over .400.

In the circle, Ohio State is led by **Olivia O'Reilly** (15-8, 3.01 ERA, 87 Ks) and **Shelby Hursh** (5-8, 4.39 ERA, Big Ten-leading seven saves). Last week, O'Reilly won three games while Hursh picked up two saves.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

Penn State finished 5-18 in Big Ten play and tied with 11th place. It received the 10th seed based on winning two of three games during the regular season against Indiana. Earlier this year, Ohio State took both games of a doubleheader against the Nittany Lions, winning by scores of 3-1 and 3-0, respectively.

Lexi Knief leads the way for Penn State with a .382 average, seven doubles and 12 RBI. Team-

mate Kasie Hatfield has driven in a team-best 27 runs while also hitting .309. In the circle, Marlaina Laubach is 9-17 with a 3.55 ERA.

ALL-TIME IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

Ohio State holds a 9-8 record all-time in the Big Ten Tournament. The Buckeyes won the 2007 tournament in Columbus with a 2-1 victory over Northwestern. Last year, Ohio State was the eight seed and defeated ninth-seeded Iowa in the opening round, 8-4, before falling to top-seeded Michigan in the quarterfinals.

BTN will provide live coverage of the tournament quarterfinals, semifinals and final, while Thursday's opening round will be streamed on the Big Ten Digital Network (BTDN). Ohio State 3, Penn State 1

Olivia O'Reilly earned her team-leading 10th win of the year by pitching six scoreless innings while Taylor Watkins provided what proved to be the game winning run in the third inning with a solo home run to left center field.

Ohio State 3, Penn State 0

Shelby Hursh pitched her third complete game of the season, limiting Penn State to just three hits while striking out nine. At the plate, senior Evelyn Carrillo hit a solo home run, the 200th hit of her career, while Watkins had a pair of doubles in the winning effort.

Additionally, several individuals rank among the Big Ten leaders – Evelyn Carrillo is second in Big Ten-only batting average (.458) while Cammi Prantl is sixth and Taylor Watkins is seventh. Prantl has a league-best 11 doubles in conference play. Olivia O’Reilly is 12th in opposing batting average (.254).

SINGLE SEASON RANKINGS

- Cammi Prantl has 14 doubles on the year, the seventh most in single season school history.
- Evelyn Carrillo has 62 hits on the year, the 14th most in single season school history.
- Caitlin Conrad reached the 40 runs scored mark for the year, the 13th most in single season school history.

NOTES FROM LAST WEEK

- Last week against Pittsburgh and Iowa, Gresham hit .538 (7-of-15) with a .538 slugging percentage and .571 on base percentage.
- Ohio State finished 13-10 in the Big Ten and tied for sixth. It is the most conference wins and best regular season finish since 2010.

THE CANNON CREW

Ohio State’s outfield of Caitlin Conrad, Cammi Prantl and Taylor Watkins have been dubbed “The Cannon Crew” (TCC) partly because the first letters of their first names spell TCC and also because they have combined for 16 outfield assists thus far. The group is also lethal at the plate:

Caitlin Conrad.....325, 35 RBI, 7 HR, 13 2B
 Cammi Prantl..... 325, 31 RBI, 14 2B, 33 R
 Taylor Watkins361, 37 R, 28 RBI, 7 HR

Collectively, the group is hitting .336 with 94 RBI, 110 runs scored, 36 doubles, 13 stolen bases and 20 home runs.

DEFENDING THEIR HOME TURF

The Buckeyes finished 12-2 at home this year, outscoring their opponents 85-45 (an average of 6.1 runs per game). Ohio State had a team batting average of .343 at Buckeye Field with 23 doubles, 16 home runs and a .545 slugging percentage. In the circle, opponents batted just .216 vs. Buckeye pitchers. Olivia O’Reilly went 9-2 at home with a 1.88 ERA.

PLAYING THE BEST

The Buckeyes’ non-conference schedule will once again test Ohio State against some of the nation’s elite. In all, OSU will play at least 16 games against teams that qualified for last year’s NCAA Tournament, including eight against squads that advanced to the Women’s College World Series. Additionally, Ohio State

plays 15 games against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the NFCA/USA Today Pre-season Top 25 poll. Nine of those games are against Top 10 teams.

OHIO STATE/PURDUE NOTES

- Despite losing two of three games, Ohio State outscored Purdue, 12-6
- Cammi Prantl hit a team-best .444 over the weekend with a double, two RBI and a .500 on base percentage.
- Olivia O'Reilly limited the Boilermakers to just 10 hits over 17.2 innings.

O'REILLY EMERGES AS THE ACE

Junior Olivia O'Reilly is enjoying a season for the Buckeyes as she leads team in every major pitching category, including wins (13), ERA (2.95), strikeouts (86) and complete games (12). Two weeks ago, she pitched 25.2 innings and gave up just six earned runs while registering three complete games and two shutouts.

SCHOENLY SIGNS HIGHLY RANKED RECRUITING CLASS

COLUMBUS, Ohio - The Ohio State softball team has signed four recruits for the 2015 season, head coach Kelly Kovach Schoenly announced today. Three of the signees play multiple positions while the other is an outfielder. The class is ranked 17th nationally by StudentSports.com and second in the Big Ten.

“It is with great pleasure that I announce our recruiting class,” said Schoenly. “All four players have played at the highest level possible to get themselves ready to make an impact immediately upon arriving in Columbus. We look for well rounded, strong academic, high character athletes, and Cassidy, Ashley, Bailee and Taylor definitely fit that mold. Loaded with athleticism and competitiveness, I fully expect this group to contribute significantly to the success of our program.”

Cassidy Clough - MIF - San Diego, Calif.

A standout and team captain at Mission Bay High School, Clough was a second team All-Western League selection from the San Diego Union-Tribune during her junior season in 2013. She hit .546 with 13 RBI, 21 runs scored, 31 stolen bases and an on-base percentage of .631. For her efforts, she was named the team’s Most Valuable Player. In the Premier Girls Fastpitch 16U Nationals, she hit .455 with six RBI and seven stolen bases in seven games and helped her team reach the championship game. She is also plays soccer and volleyball at Mission Bay and is a three-time All-Academic team selection. Her father, Keith, played football for UNLV.

Schoenly on Clough: “Cassidy is a multi-dimensional offensive threat. She is a table setter that jumpstarts an offense, getting on base from the left side with her many tools of bunting, slapping, or hitting. She is an instinctual baserunner, using her speed to put pressure on the defense and make things happen. She will also use that quickness defensively to cover a lot of territory in the middle infield.”

Bailee Sturgeon - OF - Ashville, Ohio

Sturgeon hit .370 last year with 32 runs scored, 16 RBI and 11 stolen bases for Teays Valley High School where she was a first team all-Mid State League selection, second team all-district and Golden Glove Award honoree. A three-year varsity letterwinner, she started as a freshman on a team that won the district championship and included current Buckeye Cammi Prantl. Also earned a varsity letter in basketball.

Schoenly on Sturgeon: “Bailey is a sparkplug and known for making spectacular plays in the outfield. She plays with grit and guts, not afraid to go for the big play. She is a difference maker on defense. From the left side, she will use her speed to be a catalyst for our offense.”

Taylor White - C/OF - Granada Hills, Calif.

At Chaminade Prep High School, White is a three-time team Most Valuable Player, three-time first team All-Mission Valley selection and the 2012 Mission League MVP. Her club team, the Corona Angels, won the championship at the 18U ASA Champions Cup, finished runner-up at the TC/USA Nationals and was eighth at the 18U Louisville Slugger Independence Day Tournament.

Schoenly on White: “Taylor offers incredible versatility. She can catch, play outfield, hit for average and power, while also being a threat to steal bases. She is the prototype 5 tool player. Her strong arm and accuracy will limit our opponents on the basepaths.”

Ashley Purdy Goodwin - C/IF - Riverside, Calif.

As a sophomore, Goodwin’s team at Norco High School won the CIF Division I title and ESPN/Powerade FAB 50 National Championship with an infield that featured four players who are headed to major Division I programs. Last year, Norco was ranked 10th in the final national rankings and made it to the CIF Division I final for the third time in four years. A three-year starter, Goodwin earned all-Inland Empire first team and all-CIF second team honors in 2012. She also played on the same club team, the Corona Angels, as fellow Buckeye signee Taylor White.

Schoenly on Goodwin: “Ashley is that clutch, nose-to-the-ground, do-whatever-it-takes-to-win kind of player. She will bring that competitiveness to the infield. She has a natural quickness on the hot corner, but has the ability to move into the middle infield or even catch if needed. Her strength as a hitter is that she can hit for power to all fields.”



HEAD COACH KELLY KOVACH SCHOENLY

Kelly Kovach Schoenly is in her second season guiding the Ohio State softball program. She was named the eighth coach in the program's 40-year history on June 29, 2012.

"I am honored and humbled for the chance to lead the Buckeye softball program, one I have respected for decades," Schoenly said at the time of her hiring. "I would like to thank Gene Smith, Heather Lyke, and the entire search committee for this incredible opportunity. What makes this university special are the people, the tradition, and the excellence. My goal is to continue that legacy within our softball program."

In her first season with the Buckeyes, Schoenly led Ohio State to a 34-22 overall record and berth in the Big Ten Tournament. Two of her players - Cammi Prantl and Everlyn Carrillo - earned postseason recognition from the Big Ten Conference while Taylor Watkins was a Second Team NFCA All-Midwest Region selection.

Schoenly spent six seasons as head coach at Miami (Ohio) and was the program's all-time winningest coach with 188 career victories, leading the RedHawks to their first MAC Tournament title in 2009 before winning again in 2012. Schoenly also led the team to two NCAA Tournament berths in both 2009 and 2012, respectively. Prior to her stint at Miami, Schoenly was an assistant coach at Penn State (1998-2006) for eight seasons and helped guide the Nittany Lions to seven Big Ten Tournament appearances and six NCAA Tournament berths. Before her time in State College, Schoenly was an assistant at her alma mater, Michigan, for three years (1995-98), helping the squad reach the NCAA Women's College World Series three consecutive times.

At Miami, Schoenly led the team to four consecutive 30-win seasons, including a record-breaking 41-win campaign in 2012. Last season, the RedHawks won three consecutive games in one day at the MAC Tournament to claim the league tournament title and an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. She led

the RedHawks to a 1-0 upset over fifth-ranked Tennessee in the opening round of the Knoxville Regional. Under Schoenly's leadership, the RedHawks collected 83 wins in MAC play. She had 15 players earn a total of 25 All-MAC honors, three players earn four All-Region honors and two players earn three MAC Player of the Year awards.

Prior to her time in Oxford, Schoenly guided one of the nation's best pitching staffs in 2006, as the Nittany Lions finished the season ranked 12th nationally in ERA (1.36) and limited their opponents to 74 earned runs in 380.2 innings. During her eight-year tenure, Schoenly helped Penn State to seven 30-win seasons, including a program-record 39 wins in 2006. Schoenly also produced two All-America pitchers, including 2005 National Fastpitch Coaches Association Third-Team honoree Ashley Esparza and 2006 Second-Team All-Great Lakes Region pitcher Missy Beseres, the first Nittany Lion in program history to be drafted to play professional softball.

During her stint in Ann Arbor, the Wolverines won two Big Ten regular-season titles, three Big Ten Tournament titles, three NCAA Regional Championships and made three trips to the NCAA Women's College World Series. In addition to being honored as part of the NFCA Great Lakes Coaching Staff of the Year in 1998, Schoenly coached one All-America pitcher, three conference pitchers of the year and six all-conference selections.

A two-time GTE Academic All-American, Schoenly received her bachelor's degree in elementary education from Michigan in December of 1995. After receiving the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship, Schoenly went on to earn her master's degree in elementary mathematics education from Michigan in May of 1998.

Schoenly and her husband Doug, a Penn State alumnus and tennis professional, has one daughter, Danielle.

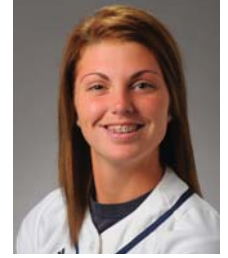
