The 37 goals to date are the most since Penn State scored 36 in the first two games of the 1987 season and the first 30-plus scoring through two games since the Nittany Lions had 33 goals in 2013. Penn State's scoring offense is averaging 18.50 goals per game, which ranks second nationally.
- Cornell holds a 20-19 edge in the all-time series against Penn State in a series that dates back to 1923. The Nittany Lions and the Big Red will meet for the first time since 2003 this weekend. The trip also marks Jeff Tambroni's first return to Ithaca as Penn State's head coach since leaving Cornell after 10 years at the helm of the Big Red program.
- » Penn State entered both the USILA Coaches Poll and the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll this week. The Nittany Lions received 49 points to move to No. 19 via Inside Lacrosse and 39 points to come in at No. 20 in the USILA poll.
- A total of 15 Nittany Lions have scored at least one goal to date, with at least three from four different players. TJ Sanders is leading the way with seven goals, averaging 3.50 per game, which ranks fifth in the Big Ten standings and 13th nationally.

Following Penn State's 17-12 win over Hobart, the Nittany Lions improved to 2-0, marking the first time the Nittany Lions have opened the season with back-to-back wins since 2013. The Nittany Lions are now 2-0 to start the season for the second time in most recent four years under head coach Jeff Tambroni.

GOALS ON GOALS ON GOALS

Penn State has scored 37 goals in the first two games of the season, marking the most amount of goals in the first two games of the season in program history. The 37 goals to date are the most since Penn State scored 36 in the first two games of the 1987 season and the first 30-plus scoring through two games since the NIttany Lions had 33 goals in 2013. Penn State's scoring offense is averaging 18.50 goals per game, which ranks second nationally.

AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Through two games, the Nittany Lion newcomers have continued to make their mark, contributing 11 goals and 11 assists in the first two outings for nearly 30 percent of the team's total goal-scoring on the year. Grant Ament recorded his first collegiate hat trick with three goals against Hobart, while also tallying a pair of assists for a team-high five points. Chris Sabia also made his second consecutive start on defense, tallying one ground ball and leading the team with three caused turnovers.

All 16 Nittany Lion freshmen saw action in Penn State's 2016 season-opening victory against Robert Morris. Making the most of their debuts, a total of six newcomers combined for seven goals and six assists, accounting for 35 percent of the goal scoring against the Colonials.

Defensively, Sabia made his first collegiate start at defense, tallying three ground balls. Trevor Scollins also saw action in goal, notching two saves in 10:50 seconds between the pipes.

"The freshmen made an immediate impact," Nittany Lion head coach Jeff Tambroni said following the win over Robert Morris. "For Grant Ament and Chris Sabia to come out here and play with the poise that they did, says a lot about their character and a lot about the guys around them too."

CORNELL CONNECTION

Nittany Lion head coach Jeff Tambroni will return to Cornell for the first time since taking over as Penn State's head coach in 2011. Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA semifinal appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

SANDERS NEARING ANOTHER MILESTONE

With a team-high four goals in Penn State's win against Robert Morris, senior TJ Sanders notched his 100th career goal to join an elite group as just the seventh Nittany Lion all-time to amass 100 career goals. As the first Nittany Lion to hit the mark since Jack Forster in 2013, he needs 24 more goals to tie for first all-time.

INTO THE POLLS WE GO

Penn State entered both the USILA Coaches Poll and the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll this week. The Nittany Lions received 49 points to move to No. 19 via Inside Lacrosse and 39 points to come in at No. 20 in the USILA poll.

The Nittany Lions opened the season receiving votes in both polls. Penn State was ranked within the Top 20 of both polls for the first three weeks of the 2015 season, spending the first two weeks at No. 14/17.

Including Penn State, all six Big Ten teams are either ranked or receiving votes in both polls. Maryland, Johns Hopkins and Ohio State and are also ranked within the top 15 of each poll, with the Terps slotted the highest at No. 4 in both media polls.

PENN STATE RALLIES PAST HOBART

Helped out by an offensive surge in the fourth quarter, Penn State rallied past Hobart to earn its second straight win. Penn State's offense fired on all cylinders in the fourth quarter as the Nittany Lions came from behind to close out the game with nine goals in 11 minutes to secure the win.

Grant Ament, TJ Sanders and Ryan Keenan led the team with three goals apiece. Both Keenan and Ament's multi-goal scoring outings marked career high efforts for the pair. Ament also added two assists to lead the team with five points.

Matt Florence and Dan Craig posted multigoal outings, registering two goals each. Brian Prestreau, Kevin Fox and Billy Lombardi and Mike Sutton all logged one goal apiece to round out the balanced group of goal scorers.

AMENT EARNS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONORS

Penn State's Grant Ament earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors after helping guide the Nittany Lions to a 20-7 victory against Robert Morris.

Ament is the first Nittany Lion in program history to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors and the fourth conference weekly award winner all-time.

Ament recorded two goals and led the team with five assists for a seven-point outing in his collegiate debut in the Blue and White against the Colonials. He put away his first collegiate goal in the first quarter, just one minute after registering his first collegiate assist.

After tallying four consecutive assists in the second quarter, he closed out the afternoon with Penn State's 17th goal of the game for a multi-goal outing against Robert Morris.

TRIO TO LEAD AS 2016 CAPTAINS

A trio of midfielders will lead the team during its 2016 campaign. Seniors Tommy O'Neill and James Burke and redshirt junior Drake Kreinz have been voted as captains. The process for choosing captains has remained unchanged for years and Jeff Tambroni is confident in the system he has in place.

"There are a number of different factors going into the captains process," Tambroni said. "One is a consensus vote from last years team, we want to get exiting seniors, graduating seniors opinions on who they believe will lead this team most effectively."

After the team vote, Tambroni and fellow assistant coaches evaluate upperclassmen during the fall semester before making a final decision. Penn State men's lacrosse has experimented with the number of captains the team has every year. In 2014 three seniors led the team but in 2015 the task fell solely on senior Kyle Zittel.

Jeff Tambroni has announced the signing of 11 newcomers to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period. From U.S. Lacrosse All-Americans and MVPs to state champions and honor roll athletes, this year's class features a talented group poised to join the Nittany Lions in 2016.

Gerard Arceri (Saint James, N.Y.), Nick Cardile (West Grove, Pa.), TJ Connellan (Cazenovia, N.Y.), Colby Kneese (Dallas, Texas), Nick McEvoy (Bethesda, Md.), Mac O'Keefe (Syosset, N.Y.), Kane Randolph (Annapolis, Md.), Jack Rusboldt (Richmond, Va.), Mitch Schaefer (Canandaigua, N.Y.), Conor Smith (West Islip, N.Y.) and Barrett Sutley (Stevenson, Md.) are all set to arrive in Happy Valley.

Three of the signees are ranked within Inside Lacrosse's list of top 25 recruits with Arceri ranked No. 11, O'Keefe tabbed No. 23 and McEvoy slotted No. 25.

SNAPSHOT: LOOKING BACK AT 2015

2015 was a historic season for Penn State men's lacrosse as the team kicked off its first official year of participation in the Big Ten conference. The Nittany Lions opened the season with a non-conference upset win over No. 16/11 Penn and earned a pair of Big Ten wins over Rutgers and Michigan to qualify for the first ever Big Ten Tournament.

WHO'S BACK?

Penn State returns nearly all of its offensive production from last year, including Nittany Lion top scorer and USILA All-America honorable mention, TJ Sanders, who led the team with 29 goals and 13 assists in 2015 for a team-high 42 points. Mike Sutton also joins Sanders as one of two 20-plus goal scorers from last year. Sutton closed out the year second on the team with 24 goals, including eight multi-goal outings. Both Sanders and Sutton both earned 2015 All-Big Ten honorable mention distinction.

Another top returner at attack is Nick Aponte, who transitioned from midfield to attack late in 2015 season. Prior to the move, Penn State averaged 8.9 goals per game, but since transitioning in the first meeting against Johns Hopkins (4/17), the team improved to 10.33 goals per game, with Aponte highlighting the remainder of the season with three goals and one assist for four points in a close 10-9 victory against Michigan.

In the midfield, Penn State returns Big Ten All-Tournament Team honoree Matt Florence, who finished third on the team with 16 goals in 2015. Also moving positions last year and returning is Dan Craig, who transitioned from attack to the midfield mid-

year. He scored 11 goals and finished second on the team with nine assists.

Craig also enters the 2016 season with at least one goal in the last four consecutive games. Other returners at midfield include Brian Prestreau and Chris Young. Prestreau saw action in 13 of 14 games, notching five goals including one in each of the last two games of the season.

At defensive midfield, the Nittany Lions have a veteran crew of seniors: James Burke, Tommy O'Neill and James Chakey, with Burke at the longstick. Burke registered a teamhigh12 caused turnovers to go along with 34 ground balls. Defensively speaking, Penn State has Peter Triolo returning at close defense, who played in 13 games, starting the final 10.

Penn State is also solid at the faceoff "X" with returner Drake Kreinz who finished 129-237 on the year with a .544 winning clip.

WHO'S GONE?

Penn State is tasked with replacing standout goalie Connor Darcey, who passed away suddenly last summer. Darcey played all 14 games, recorded 176 saves with a .553 save percentage on the year. The Nittany Lions also saw departures from defenseman JP Burnside and Pat Manley at attack. Manley played in 13 of 14 games, tallying 12 goals and six assists for 18 points.

WHO'S NEW?

Ranked No.12 nationally by Inside Lacrosse, Penn State welcomes 16 newcomers in its freshmen class this year. The class includes five All-Americans, eight all-conference honorees, three all-league picks and a Canadian national champion. Defenseman Tommy Wright was slotted No. 12 in Inside Lacrosse's Power 100 Freshman Rankings while attackman Grant Ament came in at No. 31. Midfielder Drew Petkevich was slated No. 67, while Kevin Hill (midfield) and Robby Black (midfield) rounded out the group at No. 81 and No. 93, respectively.

After guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni returns for his sixth season as Penn State's head coach in 2016.

Tambroni guided the Nittany Lions through a historic season in 2015 that brought Penn State's first appearance in the Big Ten Tournament following the first ever season of Big Ten lacrosse. The Nittany Lions opened the season ranked No. 14 in the USILA DI Preseason Coaches' Poll and knocked off No. 16/11 Penn during the 2015 season. Tambroni also led Penn State to its first two Big Ten conference victories as well as a berth to the conference tournament. He also mentored rising senior TJ Sanders to USILA All-America honorable mention honors.

In 2014, Tambroni led Penn State to its fourth consecutive above-.500 season. His student-athletes earned the eighth USILA All-American and third Scholar All-America honors of Tambroni's Penn State career. He also coached goalkeeper Austin Kaut to his school record third All-America honor and conference-best All-CAA First Team award.

Penn State's 2013 campaign saw Tambroni lead Penn State to one of the greatest seasons in program history while celebrating its 100th season. The Nittany Lions set new records for wins (12) and earned the program's first outright regular season conference title by sweeping the CAA with a 6-0 record. PSU rattled off 10 straight wins from March through May to earn the school's third NCAA bid and first chance to host an NCAA game.

Tambroni was named CAA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (2011), while Kaut (under Tambroni's tutelage) was named Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award for the nation's best goalie. Also, Kaut was CAA Player and Defensive Player of the Year. TJ Sanders was named Rookie of the Year and the Nittany Lions placed six on the All-CAA First Team.

During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a secondplace CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees. Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman goalkeeper Austin Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Semifinal appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010.

During his tenure, his players earned 37 first-team All-Ivy honors, including five Ivy League awards, and three conference Rookie of the Year selections. In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III national championship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA championships (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.







UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Penn State kicked off the 2016 season with a dominant 20-7 victory against Robert Morris Saturday afternoon at Holuba Hall.

"We're thrilled," head coach Jeff Tambroni said. "I thought our guys came out of the locker room and from the start of the game at the first whistle they played a very inspired game of lacrosse and gained a ton of momentum in the second and third quarter."

Penn State jumped out to an early lead in the first quarter as Matt Florence found the back of the net off an assist from Nick Aponte less than two minutes into the game to spark a 5-0 scoring streak. Aponte, Grant Ament, James Chakey and Brain Prestreau all added goals during the stretch.

Looking to spark some momentum, Robert Morris' Eric Rankel popped in a goal to cut the Nittany Lion advantage to four with less than two minutes remaining. Florence answered with his second goal of the quarter to send Penn State ahead 6-1 at the end of the frame.

The Colonials opened the second quarter with a goal from JonPatrick Kealey to trim the gap back to four, 6-2. Penn State came storming back with 11 consecutive goals spanning the remainder of the second quarter and into the third to surge ahead by as many as 15, 17-2.

TJ Sanders kicked off the scoring streak with back-to-back goals, scoring his first on an extra-man opportunity after the Colonials were whistled for cross-checking. Sanders powered the charge with a total of four goals in the offensive push, while Mike Sutton, Aponte, Florence, Robby Black, Prestreau, Kevin Fox and Ament all chipped in a goal apiece to bolster the lead.

Robert Morris looked to halt the momentum with a pair of goals from Luke Laszkiewicz, 17-4, with 5:09 left in the third but the rookie duo featuring Nick Spillane and Jimmy Nowoswiat answered with a pair of goals to push Penn State up 19-4 at the end of the third quarter.

Just a few minutes into the fourth quarter, Matt Donnelly put away his first collegiate goal to give the Nittany Lions their largest lead of the game, 20-4. The Colonials looked to rebound with three consecutive goals, but could not recover as the Nittany Lions claimed a 20-7 win as time expired.

NOTES: The Nittany Lions put up 20 goals for the first time since downing Michigan 22-7, Feb. 8 2014 ... Penn State improves to 21-17 all-time in season-openers and 11-5 when playing at home ... PSU is also 5-1 in yearly openers under the direction of sixth year head coach Jeff Tambroni ... Penn State improves to 2-2 in the all-time series against Robert Morris and 2-1 when playing at home ... Sanders' four goals are the most for a Nittany Lion since Pat Manley had four at Johns Hopkins April 11, 2015.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Helped out by an offensive surge in the fourth quarter, Penn State rallied past Hobart 17-12 Saturday afternoon in Holuba Hall.

Penn State's offense fired on all cylinders in the fourth quarter as the Nittany Lions came from behind to close out the game with nine goals in 11 minutes to secure the win.

Grant Ament, TJ Sanders and Ryan Keenan led the team with three goals apiece. Both Keenan and Ament's multi-goal scoring outings marked career high efforts for the pair. Ament also added two assists to lead the team with five points. Matt Florence and junior Dan Craig posted multi-goal outings, registering two goals each. Brian Prestreau, Kevin Fox and Billy Lombardi and Mike Sutton all logged one goal apiece to round out the balanced group of scorers.

Sanders opened the scoring for the Nittany Lions with an early goal, but the Statesmen answered back with a pair of goals to pull ahead, 2-1 with 10:03 remaining in the first quarter.

From there, Penn State and Hobart kept it close, trading goals throughout the first quarter and into the second. With the Statesmen leading by one, 5-4, Lombardi won the faceoff and charged toward the net for a goal to spark a 3-0 scoring streak. Sutton and Florence chipped in back-to-back goals, to round out the stretch that pushed Penn State ahead 7-5 with 4:42 left in the second quarter.

Hobart answered back in the third quarter with two consecutive goals to even the score, 7-7 with 10:48 remaining in the third quarter. Craig looked to spark a run with a goal off an assist from Ament, to give the Nittany Lions a one-goal lead, 8-7. With PSU unable to sustain the momentum, the Statesmen rallied with a 4-0 run to take over a three-point lead, 11-8 with 14:48 in the fourth quarter.

Rallying back, Ament opened up a 5-0 run with an unassisted goal to send Penn State surging ahead, 13-11. Sanders and Keenan went back-and-forth, totaling four goals after Ament's. Hobart looked to halt the momentum with a goal to arrive within one, 13-12, with 8:35 remaining in the game. The Nittany Lions answered back with goals from Fox, Ament, Florence and Craig to wrap up a 17-12 win in favor of Penn State.

NOTES: TJ Sanders recorded his second straight game with at least three goals and 18th of his career ... Sanders has recorded multi-goal outings in each of the last five games dating back to April 19, 2015 Penn State moves to 24-34-1 in the all-time series against Hobart with wins in five of the last six meetings ... The Nittany Lions have scored at least 17 goals in both games this season, having posted 20 in its 2016 season-opener against Robert Morris.
