TOUCH 'EM ALL - THE TOP STORYLINES THIS WEEK

► Michigan plays its second Big Ten Conference series of the season at Penn State. This is U-M's first road series in the league.

► Head coach Carol Hutchins earned her 1,300th career win last season at Penn State in Michigan's 7-4 win on March 29.

► The Maize and Blue has won 16 straight against Penn State, a streak that dates to 2008.

► Junior Haylie Wagner won the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week award for her performances against Indiana. The southpaw pitched 11.0 innings without giving up a run, and won two games.

► Among Big Ten players, Sierra Romero currently leads or is tied for first in seven offensive categories: batting average (.507), slugging percentage (.887), on-base percentage (.645), runs scored (33), runs batted in (34), walks (31) and home runs (8). Her on-base percentage is tops in the nation.

► Michigan is in pursuit of its 17th conference title. The Wolverines have won six consecutively, a feat no other team has matched (Northwestern won two in a row in 1984-85).

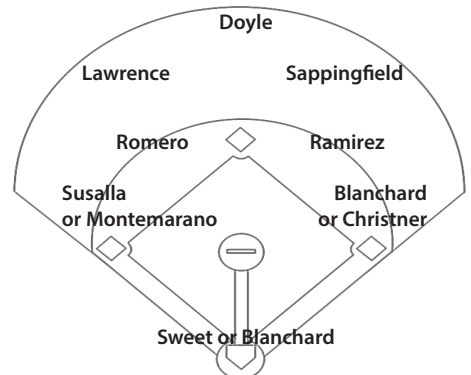

THE LOWDOWN ON THE NITTANY LIONS

- Penn State comes into the weekend series with a 6-18, 0-3 record in the Big Ten. Purdue swept PSU in the Big Ten opening series for both teams (March 21-22).
- Head coach Amanda Lehotek is in her first season at the helm of the Nittany Lions. Lehotek arrived in State College from the University of Texas-San Antonio, where she guided the Roadrunners for seven seasons.
- PSU is looking for some wallop in its lineup to replace All-American Cassidy Bell, who graduated in 2013. Bell hit 20 home runs and slugged 1.007 in her senior season. So far the Nittany Lions have hit just eight home runs as a team, with Karlie Habitz accounting for four homers and Macy Jones tallying three.
- Sophomore outfielder Lexi Knief is PSU's leading hitter, with a .375 average and a slugging percentage of .500 plus an on-base percentage of .471.
- Freshman hurler Marlaina Laubach leads Penn State from the circle, with a record of 4-8 and an ERA of 3.61. Opponents are hitting .325 against the rightly.

WEEKEND REWIND 7: HOME/BIG OPENER

- Michigan swept its Big Ten opening series against Indiana with three-run rule victories. It marked the first time since March 21-24, 2012, that U-M put together three mercy wins in a row.
- The Michigan bats were hot against the Hoosiers, with a total of 30 hits in three games and 29 runs scored.
- The Maize and Blue tallied 13 extra-base hits, including six in the series finale (March 22). Freshmen Lindsay Montemarano and Kelly Christner hit their first home runs at home.
- Junior Haylie Wagner earned the victory in two of U-M's three wins, with a complete-game win in game one and a win in relief in game three.
- The series was also Michigan's home opener. U-M is 26-11 in home openers, including six in a row dating back to 2009.
- The Hoosiers mostly avoided pitching to Sierra Romero, issuing her seven walks over three games. When they did pitch to her, she made them pay, going 3-for-4 with two home runs and a double. She also scored seven runs.
- Sara Driesenga picked up her first win of the season on March 21 (game two). It marked her 12th appearance of the season. She had 31 wins in 54 appearances in 2013.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS

- Taylor Hasselbach collected three RBI in her first 14 games in 2014. In the six games since then, she has knocked in 11 runs.
- Against Indiana, U-M raised its season batting average with runners in scoring position from .319 to .334.
 - Sierra Romero is batting .629 (22-for-35) with runners in scoring position.
 - Four hitters helped boost U-M's average with runners in scoring position over the past weekend: Lauren Sweet (2-for-4), Kelly Christner (1-for-2), Lindsay Montemarano (1-for-2) and Taylor Hasselbach (3-for-6). Sweet came into the weekend batting .148 with RISP, Montemarano .143 and Christner .118.
- Michigan also raised its batting average with two outs from .307 to .316.
- Senior Nicole Sappingfield has recorded a hit in all but six of Michigan's 28 games. Over the past 14 games, Sappingfield is hitting .447 (21-for-47). Her on-base percentage over that span is .458 and she has struck out just three times.

- U-M has scored 23 runs in back-to-back games twice this season. First it scored 12 against Kent State and then nine against Louisville on March 15. Then on March 21-22 against Indiana, the Wolverines scored nine and then 12.
- Michigan has the 10th best batting average in the nation at .336 (255-for-758).
- Sierra Romero is in the top-10 nationally in four offensive categories: first in on-base percentage (.645), third in walks per game (1.11), fourth in batting average (.507) and 10th in slugging (.887).
- Haylie Wagner has the sixth-best earned run average in the nation (0.81).

HALF IN THE BOOK

- Michigan has now played half of its schedule, posting a 22-6 record. Only three of those games came in Ann Arbor. Oregon is the only team in the top-10 that has yet to play at home (the Ducks play at home this weekend). Both U-M and OU were the only top-10 teams to play their first six weeks on the road.
- U-M has leaned on its pitching through 28 games, with the hurlers posting eight shutouts. A pair of those shutouts came in 1-0 wins (Kent State on Feb. 22 and Florida Atlantic on Feb. 23).
- The Wolverines are 3-4 against top-10 teams, with two of those losses coming in extra innings (Florida on Feb. 8, UCLA on March 4).
- More hits equals more runs: Michigan is 20-2 when it outhits its opponent.
- U-M's win over Utah Valley was its first over another team with the nickname "the Wolverines" in its 37-year history. Wellesley College is the only other American college with "Wolverines" as its mascot.
- The Wolverines hit grand slams in bunches at the Ragin' Cajun Invitational. U-M hit four grand slams through its first nine games. Sierra Romero and Sierra Lawrence have each hit a pair. Romero is already tied for second on U-M's career grand slam list with five (Ashley Lane, Amanda Chidester). Last season, the Maize and Blue hit seven grand slams in 64 games.
- Bad weather has plagued the Wolverines this season, as four games on the schedule (Nevada, Long Beach State, Oregon State and Louisville) have been lost to inclement weather. Three other games (UCLA on Feb. 28, Bowling Green on March 18 and March 25) were postponed.

THE TABLE SETTERS

- Lyndsay Doyle and Nicole Sappingfield have batted 1-2 in all but three of U-M's first 28 games. Both are four-year starters, but are putting together their finest offensive seasons as seniors so far.
- Doyle came into the season a career .310 hitter -- including 13 extra-base hits -- with an on-base percentage of .409. Through 28 games, she is batting .356 (eight XBH) and has an OBP of .385.
- Sappingfield came into the season with a .337 ca-

reer batting average -- including 13 extra-base hits -- and an OBP of .386. Through 28 games, Sappingfield is batting .404 (five XBH) and reaching base .434 percent of the time.

ROMO IS ROLLING

- Sierra Romero is leading all Big Ten Conference players with a .507 batting average (36-for-71). Michigan's season best batting average is .455, set by Melissa Taylor in 2001.
- Among Big Ten players, Sierra Romero currently leads or is tied for first in seven offensive categories: batting average (.507), slugging percentage (.887), on-base percentage (.645), runs scored (33), runs batted in (34), walks (31) and home runs (8).
- Romero has four top-10 national rankings:
 - on-base percentage (.645)..... 1st
 - walks per game (1.11)..... 3rd
 - batting average (.507)..... 4th
 - slugging percentage (.887)..... 10th
- The sophomore now has 31 career home runs, giving her sole possession of seventh place on U-M's career homer list. This season, she has passed Melissa Angela Findlay (25 HR, 2007-10), Melissa Gentile (28 HR, 1997-2000), and Grace Leutele (30 HR, 2003-06).
- At UCLA on March 5, Romero put on a show in front of a hometown crowd. She batted 3-for-3, including a home run and a double, and knocked in five runs.
- Romero leads U-M with 12 multi-hit games and 11 multi-RBI games (through 28 games).
- Romero is now tied for second on U-M's career grand slam list with five (Ashley Lane, Amanda Chidester).
- The power hitter showed her versatility against Bethune-Cookman when she laid down a bunt for a suicide squeeze in the second inning to score Lyndsay Doyle from third.
- Romero laid down a bunt for a base hit against Houston with the defense playing back in the first.

COLIE'S CATCHING FIRE

- Since batting from the nine spot in the lineup for two games (March 5-6) instead of her usual No. 2 spot, senior Nicole Sappingfield is batting .513 (20-for-39) with nine runs (12 games).
- Sappingfield has collected 14 two-out RBI through 28 games.
- She has six multi-hit games in her last 12 games, including a four-hit game and a three-hit game.
- The senior tied a career best with four hits against Kent State (achieved once before at Ohio State on April 7, 2012).
- She also tied a career best with two stolen bases against the Golden Flashes (twice before).
- The senior has five sacrifice hits this season, giving her 39 in her career. That puts her in a tie for eighth on U-M's career list (Meghan Doe, Mary Campana).

HASSELBACH HEATING UP

- Senior Taylor Hasselbach is batting .600 (6-for-10) with 6 RBI in two-out situations.
- The senior is taking ownership of the six spot in the lineup six games ago, she is batting .500 (9-for-18) with five extra-base hits and 11 RBI.
- U-M is 9-0 when Hasselbach starts at designated player.
- Hasselbach had only started five games before the Class Act Federal Credit Union Classic (March 15-16), but her hot hitting earned her starts in all three of Michigan's games.
- In U-M's 12-4 win over Kent State (March 15), Hasselbach did a lot of the offensive damage. She cleared the bases with a bases-loaded double in the bottom of the first, then added another run on sac fly in the third. Her second double of the day in the fourth re-

sulted in her fifth RBI of the game.

- Before the Kent State game, U-M's hitters in the six spot had accounted for six RBI in the previous 22 games. Hasselbach nearly equaled that in one game from the six hole.
- Hasselbach hit her first home run of the year against Louisville (March 15), giving her a six RBI day.
- The Big Ten honored Hasselbach with the Big Ten Player of the Week award for her performance at the tournament in Louisville.

WAGNER'S HITTING HER SPOTS

- Junior Haylie Wagner has an impressive streak going in 2014: she is 4-0 against ranked teams and 3-0 against top-five teams (Kentucky, UCLA, Arizona).
- The lefty was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week for the second time in 2014 (March 24), for tossing 11.0 scoreless innings against Indiana and posting two wins in the conference opening series.
- Wagner was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week (March 10) for posting a 3-0 record and 1.18 in 23.2 innings pitched.
- Wagner defeated two ranked teams, then-No. 4 UCLA and then-No. 7 Arizona. She became the first pitcher to defeat the Bruins in 2014. The Wildcats came into the game batting .395 as a team, and Wagner held them to four hits in seven innings.
- Wagner has now thrown complete-game shutouts against two ranked teams: then-No. 5 Kentucky (Feb. 22) and then-No. 7 Arizona (March 7).
- The southpaw tossed 4.2 innings of relief against No. 2 Arizona State at the Judi Garman Classic, and yielded one unearned run.
- With eight strikeouts against Texas, Wagner now has three games of eight-plus strikeouts (better than one per inning): 10 vs. Illinois State (Feb. 9) and nine vs. Memphis (Feb. 14).
- Wagner has nine complete game wins: Illinois State (Feb. 9), Memphis (Feb. 14), Louisiana Lafayette (Feb. 15), Kent State (Feb. 21), Kentucky (Feb. 22), Arizona (March 7), Texas (March 8), Louisville (March 15), and Indiana (March 21). She also has four wins in relief: Boston College (Feb. 16), FAU (Feb. 23) and Utah Valley (March 1), and Indiana (March 22).
- The southpaw is the only Big Ten Conference pitcher with an ERA below one: 0.81. She has the second-most wins with 15.

WEEKEND REWIND 6: LIFE IN LOUISVILLE

- Michigan posted a 3-0 record at the Class Act Federal Credit Union Classic in Louisville, Ky. The Wolverines beat Kent State 12-4, Louisville 9-1, and Iowa State 6-4.
- The Maize and Blue is now 41-7 in all games played in Louisville.
- U-M run-ruled both Kent State and Louisville, its fourth and fifth run-rule wins to that point in the season.
- Senior Taylor Hasselbach started all three games at designated player and batted .667 (6-for-9) with three extra base hits and six RBI.
- Senior Nicole Sappingfield batted .700 (7-for-10) during the tournament, and knocked in three runs against Iowa State.
- Junior Haylie Wagner earned two of U-M's three wins, giving up just two earned runs in 11.2 innings pitched.
- Junior Sara Driesenga earned her third save of the season, giving her eight in her career. She is now tied for third-most saves in U-M history with Jennie Ritter (2003-06). Driesenga's three saves rank her sixth in the nation.
- Michigan improved its two-out hitting to .307, up from .296 before the tournament.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST IN LOUISVILLE

- On March 15, Michigan scored 10 or more runs in a game for the first time in a month when it plated 12 against Kent State. U-M previously scored 15 against Louisiana Lafayette on Feb. 15.
- The Wolverines hit four home runs against Louisville (Taylor Hasselbach, Sierra Romero, Sierra Lawrence, Kelly Christner), the first time the team has hit more than two in a game.
- Kelly Christner hit the first home run of her collegiate career against Louisville. It was a special moment for the Christner family. Her older sister Katie plays for Wisconsin, and with the Badgers playing in the same tournament, the entire family was on hand to witness it.
- Lindsay Montemarano tallied her first RBIs of her career against Kent State. She knocked in three runs against the Golden Flashes and also collected two hits, the first multi-hit game of her career.

THE SIERRAS ARE PEAKING

- Sierra Romero and Sierra Lawrence are two of best run producers among Big Ten players. Romero has 34 RBI (first in the B1G) and Lawrence has 28 (T-3).
- The two sophomores are leading the Wolverines in home runs: Romero has eight and Lawrence has three.
- The pair is getting on base via walks. Romero has drawn 31, most on the team, and Lawrence has drawn 15, second-most.
- Romero is leading the Wolverines in slugging at .887, Lawrence is third at .557.
- Both were members of the USA Women's Junior National Team in 2013.

- Beware intentionally walking Sierra Romero as two other teams have chosen to do (USF on Feb. 8, Louisville on March 15). Each time Caitlin Blanchard has delivered a run-scoring hit.
- Against USF, Blanchard hit a two-run single into center that became the game-winning hit.
- Against UL, Blanchard hit a two-run double into left-center that helped break the game open.
- Blanchard is 2-for-2 with four RBI in 2014 following an intentional walk to Romero.
- In 2013, following an intentional walk to Romero, Blanchard batted 5-for-7 with two doubles, eight RBI and two walks.
- Blanchard all-time following a Romero intentional walk: 7-for-9 with 12 RBI.

WEEKEND REWIND 5: J. GARMAN CLASSIC

- Michigan finished its West Coast trip with five games at the Judi Garman Classic, compiling a 2-3 record.
- U-M opened the tournament with three straight losses to No. 10 Arizona State, No. 6 Washington and Houston. That marked the first time since 2006 that Michigan dropped three straight games (March 15-17, also at the Judi Garman Classic).
- The Maize and Blue closed out the tournament with two consecutive wins over No. 7 Arizona and Texas.
- Junior pitcher Haylie Wagner posted a 0.38 ERA with two wins against no losses during the tournament.
- Senior outfielder Nicole Sappingfield put together one of her better stretches of the season, getting a hit in each game. She finished with a .400 average (6-for-15) with a .438 OBP.
- Senior leadoff hitter Lyndsay Doyle knocked in the game-winning runs in the bottom of the sixth against Texas. The two RBI marked the first multi-RBI game of the season for Doyle and fifth of her career (three in 2013, one in 2011).
- Freshman outfielder Kelly Christner collected Michigan's first outfield assist of the season when she nabbed a runner going from first to second vs. Texas.

THE SHUTOUT STREAK - FEB. 21-MARCH 1

- Michigan pitchers tossed 34 consecutive scoreless innings between Feb. 21 and March 1. The streak began after the third inning against Kent State (Feb. 21), and was snapped in the third inning of the Utah Valley game (March 1)
- At the FAU Invitational, U-M pitchers surrendered one run in 35 innings pitched leading to an earned run average of 0.20.
- Opposing batters hit .126 (14-for-111) against U-M pitchers at the FAU Invitational.
- U-M's pitchers racked up 31 strikeouts in 35.0 innings pitched at the FAU Invitational.
- Sara Driesenga put together her best game of the season against Kent State (Feb. 23). The junior threw 7.0 innings with four strikeouts and yielded four hits. She came away with a tough-luck no-decision, as it took the Wolverines nine innings to score the game's lone run. Haylie Wagner was the pitcher of record then and picked up the win.
- Haylie Wagner earned three of Michigan's five wins at the FAU Invitational. Her most impressive win came against then-No. 5 Kentucky. She gave up just two hits to the Wildcats, a team that came into the game batting better than .300. U-M won 3-0.
- Michigan has had several four-game shutout streaks in recent years: 2012 (Feb. 17-19), 2008 (April 13-18) and 2007 (March 2-4).
- The longest consecutive shutout streak for the Wolverines is eight games, recorded in 2004 (April 4-14).

BIG SERIES WITH THE BRUINS

- Michigan split a two-game weekday series with No. 4 UCLA (March 4-5), dropping game one 4-1 in eight innings, but taking game two 9-4.
- Senior Taylor Hasselbach pushed game one into extras with a pinch-hit seventh inning, run-scoring double.
- Megan Betsa started game one and was tough on the Bruins, striking out nine. She had two blemishes on her night, a solo home run in the second and three-run homer in the eighth.
- Sierra Romero tied a career high with five RBI in game two against UCLA, including a three-run homer. She went 3-for-3 in the game, her fifth game this season with three or more hits.
- Lauren Sweet came through with a big run-scoring double in the sixth, her first extra base hit of the season. She had 14 extra-base hits in 2013 (10 home runs, four doubles).
- Caitlin Blanchard provided a boost with a seventh-inning home run. The two-run shot extended the lead to 9-4 and effectively salted the game away.
- Sara Driesenga picked up her second save of the season and seventh of her career.
- Nicole Sappingfield batted in the nine spot in the lineup for the 16th time in her career in game two (after batting in the second spot 141 times). She responded with a 2-for-3 night and two runs scored.
- Michigan and UCLA have split their all-time series very evenly: 9-9-1 in 19 career meetings.

DOYLE'S HIT PARADE

- Lyndsay Doyle collected five hits against Illinois State (Feb. 9), tying a single-game Michigan record.
- Doyle went 5-for-5 in the game, including a RBI double in the fourth inning.
- In a strange coincidence, the last time a U-M hitter tallied five hits was also against Illinois State. Ashley Lane had five hits in an extra innings game on Feb. 22, 2013.
- The other Wolverines to collect a quintet of hits are Pam Wright (May 9, 1986 at Ohio State) and Alicia Seegert (April 28, 1984 at Ohio State).
- Doyle collected her fifth double of the season against Texas (March 8), setting a new career high in one season. U-M has 30 games yet to play.

CATCHING ON QUICKLY -- THE FRESHMEN

- Michigan's quartet of freshmen made their collegiate debuts during the opening weekend tournament in Tampa, Fla.
- Abby Ramirez and Kelly Christner both started the season opener against then-No. 4 Florida with Ramirez at second base and Christner in left field.
- Pitcher Megan Betsa made her debut in relief of Sara Driesenga in the seventh inning against Florida. She then started the night cap of the doubleheader against then-No. 25 USF, pitching a complete game for the win.
- Lindsay Montemarano made her collegiate debut by getting the start at third base against USF. She also started at the hot corner against Illinois State and Bethune-Cookman.
- Ramirez and Christner each played all 26 innings during the four-game tournament.
- The Michigan infield against Bethune-Cookman featured all four freshmen: Christner at first, Ramirez at second, Montemarano at third and Betsa in the circle.
- Ramirez hit safely in all four games, compiling a .583 batting average (7-for-12) in the opening weekend and scored a run each game, tallying six in all. For her efforts, she was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

RECAPPING 2013

- Michigan posted a 51-13 record, the 12th time U-M reached the 50-win plateau.
- U-M won the Big Ten title for the sixth consecutive season, the most in league history. No other team has won more than two in a row (Northwestern 1984-85).
- The Maize and Blue earned a berth in the Women's College World Series, the 10th in school history. U-M has the seventh-most WCWS berths in the tournament's history.
- Michigan's spot in the WCWS continued an incredible streak: every incoming freshman class since the fall of 1991 has played in the WCWS.
- Sierra Romero was named the Big Ten Player of the Year and Big Ten Freshman of the Year, becoming just the second player to win both honors (Sara Griffin, U-M 1995).
- Seven Wolverines earned All-Big Ten honors, including first teamers Caitlin Blanchard, Sara Driesenga, Ashley Lane, Sierra Lawrence, Lauren Sweet and Sierra Romero, and second teamer Haylie Wagner.

THE 2013 NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Michigan was awarded the eighth overall seed and hosted a NCAA Regional. U-M defeated Valparaiso and California twice to take the Regional title.
- U-M played host to Louisiana Lafayette (champions of the Baton Rouge Regional) in a competitive Super Regional series. Ashley Lane belted an extra-innings home run to win game one, the Ragin' Cajuns blanked U-M in game two, and then Lane delivered another game-winning hit in the fifth inning of game three to send the Wolverines to the WCWS.
- Michigan posted a 1-2 record at the Women's College World Series. U-M lost to eventual champion Oklahoma 7-1, outlasted Arizona State 2-0 in a game that began at 11:54 p.m. CT, and then was knocked out of the tournament by Washington 4-1.

SEASON PREVIEW

- Michigan has 55 games on its schedule for the 2014 season.
- The schedule features nine teams ranked in the pre-season top-25: Florida, Washington, Arizona State, Texas, Kentucky, UCLA, Louisiana Lafayette, Louisville and USF.
- The Wolverines will play more than two-thirds of their schedule away from home (40 games). The season begins with 29 straight games away from Ann Arbor, including tournaments in Tampa, Fla., Lafayette, La., Boca Raton, Fla., Long Beach, Calif., Fullerton, Calif., and Louisville, Ky.
- Michigan will host four Big Ten series: Indiana (March 21-23), Ohio State (April 4-6), Minnesota (April 18-20) and Wisconsin (May 2-3). Intrastate rival Michigan State visits for one game (April 11) before the two squads conclude the series in East Lansing on April 12-13.
- U-M does not play Northwestern, Nebraska or Iowa in Big Ten play this season.

BIG TEN LANDSCAPE

- Michigan and Nebraska both received top-10 placements in the two national preseason polls, with Michigan at No. 4 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and No. 5 in the USA Today/NFCA poll, and Nebraska came in at No. 9 in both.
- Michigan and Nebraska each earned spots in the WCWS in 2013. U-M & Iowa were the last two B1G schools to make it to OKC in the same year (2001).
- Two new head coaches will debut in the Big Ten this season: Amanda Lehotak at Penn State and Kim Schuette at Purdue.
- Several coaches in the Big Ten have Michigan ties: Indiana head coach Michelle (Bolster) Gardner played

- Seven Big Ten standouts were named to the USA Softball POY Watch List: Megan Blank (Iowa); Sara Driesenga (Michigan); Sierra Romero (Michigan); Kaitlin Richardson (Minnesota); Tatum Edwards (Nebraska); Andie Varsho (Purdue); Mary Massei (Wisconsin).

FACILITY UPGRADES

- During the offseason, Alumni Field experienced a few phases of renovations. A new AstroTurf surface was installed in the outfield to create a more consistent playing surface and enhanced drainage. A new video scoreboard went up beyond the left field wall.
- Just days after the team returned from the 2013 WCWS, construction crews razed the Donald R. Shepherd Softball Building. In its place they built the new Donald R. Shepherd Softball Facility, a three-story building built on the footprint of the previous one-story building. The new softball center features a larger locker room, coaches offices, more space for the athletic training staff including hydrotherapy, fitness rooms and more team meeting space.

TEAM 37

- Michigan returns 16 letterwinners, including six starting position players and its top-two starting pitchers for the 2014 season.
- Seniors Nicole Sappingfield and Katie Luetkens were elected co-captains for the 2014 season by a team vote. Sappingfield will be serving her second year as captain, just the fifth Wolverine to do so.
- U-M welcomes a quartet of freshmen for the 2014 season: RHP Megan Betsa, IF/OF Kelly Christner, IF Lindsay Montemarano and IF Abby Ramirez.
- Reigning Big Ten Player of the Year Sierra Romero will anchor an offense bolstered by All-Big Ten first team selections Caitlin Blanchard, Sierra Lawrence and Lauren Sweet.
- Head coach Carol Hutchins begins her 30th season guiding the Wolverines. She is the third-winningest coach in NCAA softball history (1,325).
- Associate head coach Bonnie Tholl enters her 21st season and assistant coach Jennifer Brundage enters her 16th season. Volunteer assistant coach Nikki Nemitz is in her third season.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Michigan received a pair of top-five preseason rankings: No. 5 in the USA Today/NFCA poll and No. 4 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll.
- Junior Sara Driesenga and sophomore Sierra Romero were both named to the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 50 Watch List.
- Driesenga is one of 20 juniors on the list and Romero is one of six sophomores on the list.
