FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

1 Minnesota welcomes Penn State to TCF Bank Stadium this weekend as the teams face one another for the Governor's Victory Bell. The teams have met 12 times on the field and Penn State leads the all-time series 8-4. The Nittany Lions won the first four games of the series, but Minnesota then won the next four games. Penn State has beaten Minnesota four straight times entering Saturday, which includes a 33-21 win in Minneapolis in 2010. The Gophers last beat Penn State in 2004 when they won 16-7 at home.

2 Minnesota enters this weekend's game against Penn State with a 16-17 record all-time at TCF Bank Stadium. The Gophers, who opened their new stadium with a 20-13 win against Air Force on Sept. 12, 2009, could climb to .500 at TCF Bank Stadium with a win on Saturday. Minnesota was 5-9 at its new digs before Coach Kill was hired. Since then, Minnesota has recorded an 11-8 record at home to get to 16-17 overall. The last time Minnesota had a .500 record at TCF Bank Stadium was on Sept. 11, 2010, when the Gophers were 4-4 after losing to South Dakota 41-38.

3 Minnesota has rushed for 21 touchdowns this year, after rushing for 14 scores last year. Sixteen of those touchdowns have been of five yards or shorter and 11 (including eight in a row at one time) have been 1-yard scoring bursts. Minnesota's longest touchdown run this year was a 48-yard scamper by quarterback Philip Nelson. Under Jerry Kill, the Gophers are 14-10 when scoring a rushing touchdown. That includes an 11-4 mark when reaching the end zone two or more times on the ground. During that time, Minnesota has gone 2-8 in games when it failed to score a rushing touchdown (Gophers beat Northwestern on Oct. 19 despite not rushing for a score). Minnesota did not score a rushing touchdown in its two defeats this season (at home against Iowa and on the road at Michigan).

4 Prior to their current three-game Big Ten win streak, the Gophers' last such streak came in 2008 when they won against Indiana and at Illinois and Purdue. Minnesota has not won four straight conference games in one season since 1973, when it won at Northwestern, against Purdue, at Illinois and against Wisconsin. The Gophers' most recent four-game streak stretching across different seasons came in 1975-76. They ended the 1975 season with a win against Wisconsin, then opened 1976 by beating Indiana. They then played three non-conference games before continuing the B1G streak with wins against Illinois and at Michigan State. A win Saturday would also be Minnesota's fourth Big Ten win this year (would be first time since 2008 when it finished 4-4).

5 Minnesota has played 22 games since the start of the 2012 season. In those 22 games, the Gophers are 13-9 overall. Minnesota was 5-17 in its previous 22 games from Sept. 18, 2010 to Nov. 26, 2011.

ABOUT THE NITTANY LIONS

Penn State is 5-3 overall and 2-2 in the Big Ten after a 24-17 overtime win against Illinois last week. Bill Belton ran for 201 yards and freshman quarterback Christian Hackenberg threw for 240 yards, including a winning touchdown pass to Kyle Carter. Penn State earlier earned a 4OT win against Michigan this season.

The Nittany Lions average 436.5 yards of total offense, fifth in the B1G. Hackenberg leads the B1G with an average of 253.0 yards per game through the air, while his favorite target, Allen Robinson, leads the conference with 130.4 receiving yards per game. Belton leads the ground attack with 83.5 yards per game.

On the defensive side of the ball, linebacker Glenn Carson is the Nittany Lions' leading tackler with 66 on the season. DaQuan Jones ranks fourth in the B1G in tackles for loss with 9.5.

LAST MEETING

Penn State won the teams' 2010 meeting, 33-21. The Gophers' Adam Weber threw for 299 yards to surpass the career 10,000-yard mark, and WR Da'Jon McKnight tallied three TDs and 103 yards. But Penn State's Rob Bolden and Matt McGloin combined to throw three TD passes in addition to Silas Redd's rushing score.

YOUNG AND OLD

Freshman and sophomores make up the majority of the Gophers' roster, and the youth has accounted for much of the team's production this season. Underclassmen have produced 2,387 yards of total offense, compared to 928 by the upperclassmen.

A major reason for this difference is that both of the Gophers' quarterbacks who have played, Philip Nelson (942 pass, 295 rush) and Mitch Leidner (366 pass, 381 rush), are underclassmen. They have thrown for 1,308 total yards and rushed for 676 (1,984 yards total offense).

While underclassmen have combined for 1,079 rushing yards, the upperclassmen are not far behind with 928. The junior class leads all other classes with 907 yards on the ground. David Cobb (803) has the most on the team.

Upperclassmen have the edge over the youngsters in receiving yardage. Seniors (433 yards) lead the way with Derrick Engel accounting for 361 of those yards. The juniors (373) are second.

Behind the leg of kicker Chris Hawthorne (a team-best 65 points), the upperclassmen have scored the most points (175) for Minnesota. However, all 108 of the underclassmen's points have come on offense. Of the upperclassmen's 110 points not scored by Hawthorne, 72 have been offensive. Leidner (42 points) is the Gophers' offensive scoring leader, and Cobb is next with 36 points.

WHERE THE GOPHERS ARE FROM

The 2013 Golden Gophers hail from 19 different states and one foreign country. Forty-three Minnesotans are on the team. Florida is the second-most represented state with 15, while Wisconsin and Texas each produced 12 Gophers. Illinois (9) and California (4) are next on the list. Georgia, North Carolina and Ohio have three natives each on the roster, while Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri and Michigan have two apiece. Alabama, Delaware, Mississippi, South Carolina and Tennessee have lone representatives. The Gophers' only international player is punter Christian Eldred from Australia.

DEGREE IN HAND, BUT STILL YOUNG

Minnesota will begin the season with 10 players who have an undergraduate degree in hand. That number is tied for third in the nation with Nebraska and trails only Louisiana Tech and Virginia Tech who have 12 student-athletes who fit the criteria.

The Gophers rank tied for third in the nation by having 10 graduated student-athletes on the team. However, Minnesota is one of the schools with the fewest amount of seniors on it this season. The Gophers have 18 seniors on their roster (including Zach Mottla who suffered a career-ending injury last season at Illinois), which places them near the top for fewest amount of seniors in the nation. South Carolina boasts the fewest amount of seniors this year with five and is followed by UCF and Virginia, who each have eight seniors.

The 121-man Gopher roster includes 75 underclassmen, accounting for 62 percent of the team. The 44 true and redshirt freshmen (36 percent) make up almost as much of the roster as the 46 juniors and seniors combined. Minnesota has 18 seniors (15 percent) this season.

► There is loyalty and then there is loyalty to Minnesota head coach Jerry Kill. The Gopher coaching staff is the most tenured in the nation. The group of Kill's nine assistants and strength and conditioning coach has served under him for a combined 124 years, which is by far the most in the nation.

► Minnesota is one of 18 schools that return all nine assistants from 2012 to 2013. The Gophers and Northwestern are the only schools that have had the same nine assistants for three straight years.

► Kill has five former players of his -- Rob Reeves, Trevor Olson, Jeff Jones, Melvin Rice and Corey Hanson - on the Minnesota football staff. Reeves, who coaches the h-backs/tight ends, played quarterback for Kill at Saginaw Valley State. Olson, who is from Richfield, Minn., started 54 straight games at Northern Illinois and was on the team that beat Minnesota 34-23 in 2010. Olson is an offensive graduate assistant for the Gophers. Jones, who is an assistant coordinator of recruiting operations, played for Kill at Southern Illinois. He ended his career as a three-time captain and led the Salukis to records of 10-2, 10-2 and 9-4 after the team went a combined 5-18 in his redshirt year and freshman year. Rice played his final season of college football at NIU in 2008, which was Kill's first year leading the Huskies. Rice then served as a defensive graduate assistant for Kill in 2010 at NIU before joining the Gophers as defensive quality control assistant. Hanson, who is from Minneapolis and attended DeLaSalle High School, was a member of Kill's leadership council at NIU where he played linebacker. Hanson is a recruiting assistant at Minnesota.

YOUNG, INEXPERIENCED QUARTERBACKS

► Minnesota entered the season with the second youngest and most inexperienced quarterback corps in the nation. The Gophers were only one of two teams in the county that met the following criteria 1.) does not have a junior or senior on the roster and 2.) quarterbacks have combined to play fewer than 10 career games. Redshirt sophomore Dexter Foreman is the oldest quarterback on the roster, while sophomore Philip Nelson was the only quarterback to play last year. Prior to the season, Florida State had the youngest and most inexperienced group in the nation, as the five underclassman Seminole quarterbacks had appeared in a combined four games.

RUNNING QBs

► Coach Kill likes to say that his offense will take what the opposing defense gives it, and this year that has meant that his quarterbacks have been able to tuck the ball and run. Mitch Leidner rumbled for 151 yards against San Jose State, while Philip Nelson raced for 122 yards at New Mexico State earlier this year. Leidner's performance was the seventh-best in school history for a quarterback, while Nelson's 122 yards place him 14th on the list. Leidner (seven TDs) and Nelson (five TDs) have also combined for 12 of Minnesota's 21 rushing touchdowns this year.

NELSON HEATING UP

► Philip Nelson had a career day at Indiana last week as he led Minnesota to a 42-39 win. Nelson set career marks in completions (16), yards (298) and touchdowns (4) as the Gophers moved to 7-2 overall and 3-2 in the Big Ten. Nelson became just the 17th (ninth actual player) Minnesota quarterback to pass for four scores in one game and was the first quarterback to do so since Adam Weber tossed five touchdowns against Michigan State in 2009. Nelson's 298 passing yards were the most by a Gopher quarterback since Weber went for 299 yards against Penn State in 2010. In Minnesota's last three wins, Nelson has completed 31-of-49 passes for 562 yards and six touchdowns. He has also rushed for two scores during that time.

IN A RUSH

► The Gophers have relied on their legs during their 7-2 start. Minnesota is No. 20 in the nation in rushing offense, having run the ball 420 times for 1,990 yards (average 221.1 yards per game, 4.73 yards per carry). Minnesota has four players (David Cobb, Mitch Leidner, Philip Nelson and Rodrick Williams) who have tallied at least one 100-yard game this year. The last time the Gophers had four players rush for 100-yard games in one season was 1967 (Jim Carter, Mo Forte, John Wintermute and Curtis Wilson). Minnesota is 12-2 (5-0 this year) under Kill with a 100-yard rusher.

► David Cobb was not listed on Minnesota's season-opening depth chart. However, the junior leads the Gophers in rushing through eight games this season with 803 yards on 148 carries. His six touchdowns rank second on the team behind Mitch Leidner who has seven. Cobb has four 100-yard games this year after rushing for a career-high 188 yards on 29 carries last week at Indiana. He also rushed for 138 yards on 31 carries (most carries for a Gopher running back since Amir Pinnix ran 34 times against Texas Tech in 2006) against Nebraska. Cobb went for 125 yards against San Jose State and for 103 yards at Northwestern. Cobb needs 177 more yards this year to become Minnesota's first 1,000-yard running back since Pinnix, who rushed for 1,272 yards in 2006.

► David Cobb churned out 236 all-purpose yards (188 rushing, 48 receiving) at Indiana last week. His 236 yards tie for 24th all-time by a Gopher and is the most since Troy Stoudemire's 240 yards against Michigan State in 2009. Cobb's 188 rushing yards were the most by a Gopher since Amir Pinnix rumbled for 206 yards in 2005 against Michigan State. Cobb became the 15th Gopher (11th actual player) to rush for 100 yards in three straight games in the same season since Pinnix ended the 2006 season with three straight 100-yard games. He is the first Gopher running back to go for more than 100-yards in three straight games against Big Ten opponents since Laurence Maroney in 2005.

YEAR 3

► Coach Kill's third year at a school has historically been a turning point for his teams. Despite only having two true recruiting classes with the Gophers, Kill has continued that trend at Minnesota. Kill's Southern Illinois and Northern Illinois teams went a combined 18-31 in their first two seasons before going a combined 20-5 in their third seasons.

PICKED OFF

► The Gophers have eight interceptions this year (by eight different players, with two going for touchdowns) and now have 21 interceptions in their last 22 games. In Minnesota's prior 22 games, it recorded 11 interceptions.

APR SUCCESS

► Kill's turnaround of the Gophers is also taking place in the classroom. Minnesota recorded a 994 Academic Progress Rate for the 2011-12 season, the first under Kill. The score is the highest single-season score that Minnesota has ever recorded and only 10 teams have tied or beaten a 994 since the NCAA made single-season scores available.

IT'S A LOSS

► Theiren Cockran is third in the Big Ten with 5.5 sacks this year (leaders have 6.5 sacks). Cockran and teammate Ra'Shede Hageman are also ranked in the conference for tackles-for-loss. Hageman is tied for eighth (1.00 average per game) while Cockran is 14th (0.89 average).

ZONED IN

► The Gophers rank second in the Big Ten and third in the nation in red zone offense, as they are 29-for-30 (96.7 percent) this year. Minnesota has scored 22 touchdowns (18 rushing, four passing) and is a perfect 7-for-7 on field goals.

SOMETHING SPECIAL

► Marcus Jones has a punt return (65 yards at New Mexico State) for a touchdown and a kickoff return for a score (98 yards vs. UNLV) this year, to become the first Gopher ever to return a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown in the same season. Jones' return at New Mexico State was Minnesota's first punt return for a TD on the road since Oct. 5, 1996 (Rodney Hood, 72 yards at Purdue). The most combined punt and kick returns for touchdowns Minnesota has had in one season is two (2013, 2002, 1997 and 1968).

TDS MOUNTING UP

► The Gophers have surpassed their 2012 touchdown total of 35, as they enter this weekend's game with 36 this year. Thirty-six is the most touchdowns Minnesota has scored since 2008, when they reached the end zone 38 times. The last time Minnesota scored 40 touchdowns in one season was 2007 (42).

HALFWAY THERE

► Minnesota led Indiana 28-13 at halftime of last Saturday en route to a 42-39 win against the Hoosiers. The Gophers improved to 6-0 this year and 13-0 under Coach Kill when they are leading at the half. Minnesota is also 1-0 this year and 3-0 all-time under Kill when it is tied at the half.

WINNING SEASON

► Minnesota improved to 7-2 overall after a 42-39 win last Saturday at Indiana, which means the Gophers are guaranteed a winning season. The last time Minnesota had a winning season was 2008, when the team finished with a 7-6 record. The Gophers are also off to their best start since they began the 2008 season with a 7-2 record.

WATCH LIST

► Ra'Shede Hageman who is on the watch list for the Outland Trophy, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Lombardi Award. The Minneapolis native has 28 tackles this year, 9.0 tackles-for-loss and two sacks. He also has six pass breakups, one interception, one blocked field goal, (returned for a TD by Martez Shabazz against UNLV) and one blocked point-after attempt. Hageman would be the first Gopher to win the Bronko Nagurski Trophy or the Lombardi Award. He would be the fourth Gopher to receive the Outland Trophy, joining Tom Brown (1960), Bobby Bell (1962) and Greg Eslinger (2005). Tight end Matt Spaeth was the last Gopher to receive a national award, as he was honored with the 2006 John Mackey Award.

ROAD TRIP

► The Gophers are 3-1 on the road this year, as they have won at New Mexico State, Northwestern and Indiana. Minnesota's lone road loss was at Michigan. The Gophers have one road game remaining this season, which is Nov. 30 at Michigan State. No matter the outcome of the game at Michigan State, the Gophers have secured a winning road record this year. The last time the Gophers had a winning record on the road was 2005 when they went 3-2 (wins: Tulsa, Michigan and Indiana; losses: Penn State and Iowa).

KILL ON THE ROAD

► Coach Kill has a knack for winning football games on the road. He has a career record of 56-55 on the road despite taking over teams that traditionally did not fare well on the road before his arrival. Saginaw Valley St. was a combined 18-8 away from home during the five years Kill was head coach. Emporia State was 2-3 on the road during both of Kill's years at the school. At Southern Illinois, Kill's squad lost its first 11 road games before going 21-10 away from home during the next five years. At Northern Illinois, the Huskies went 2-4 in each of Kill's first two years at the school. In his final year, they were 5-2 on the road, which included a 34-23 win at Minnesota. The Gophers were 0-5 on the road under Kill in 2011 and 2-3 last year. This year, Minnesota is 3-1 on the road.

LOOKING FOR THREE

► On Nov. 30, the Gophers will head to Michigan State looking for their third straight Big Ten road win. The last time Minnesota won three straight conference road games was in 2003, when the Gophers won at Penn State on Sept. 27, Northwestern on Oct. 4 and Illinois on Oct. 25.

HOME SWEET HOME

► Minnesota is 4-1 at home this year, which guarantees the Gophers a winning record at TCF Bank Stadium (Minnesota has home wins against UNLV, Western Illinois, San Jose State and Nebraska and still play Penn State this Saturday and Wisconsin on Nov. 23). The Gophers finished the season 4-3 at home last year, which means Minnesota will have consecutive winning seasons at home for the first time since the 2008 and 2009 seasons (Gophers were 4-3 at home both years). The last time Minnesota won five home games in one season was 2004 when the Gophers were 7-5 overall and 5-1 at home.

CATCHING ON

► Senior wide receiver Derrick Engel had a breakout performance against Texas Tech in the bowl game last year (four catches for 108 yards). This year, he leads the Gophers with 22 catches, 361 yards and five touchdowns. All of Engel's touchdowns have come in a Big Ten game, as he has scored against Iowa, Northwestern, Nebraska and Indiana (2).

FITTING IN FINE

► Damien Wilson, who transferred to Minnesota from Jones County Community College, leads the Gophers with 50 tackles and 23 assisted tackles. Wilson, who is the cousin of David Cobb, also has one sack and 5.5 tackles-for-loss this year.

GO FOR IT

► Minnesota has found success this year when it has

gone for it on fourth down. The Gophers have converted 8-of-11 (72.7 percent) fourth-down opportunities, which ranks first in the Big Ten and fifth in the nation.

CALL IT A COMEBACK

► Minnesota was trailing 10-0 to Nebraska 7:06 into the first quarter on Oct. 26, but came back to beat the Cornhuskers 34-23. It was the first game that the Gophers had won when trailing by 10 or more points since they rallied to beat Iowa 22-21 in 2011. That year, Minnesota trailed 21-10 in the fourth quarter.

STREAK SNAPPED

► Minnesota is 7-2 this year, as the Gophers have posted wins against UNLV, New Mexico State, San Jose State, Western Illinois, Northwestern, Nebraska and Indiana. Minnesota's wins against New Mexico State, San Jose State, Northwestern and Nebraska all snapped losing streaks to these opponents. The Gophers had previously lost their most recent games to New Mexico State (2011) and San Jose State (1992) before posting wins this year. Minnesota snapped a three-game losing streak (last win was 2009) to Northwestern with a 20-17 road win this year and ended a 16-games losing streak (last win was 1960) to Nebraska with a 34-23 home win last Saturday. The 16-game streak was tied for the second-longest in program history, as Minnesota also lost 16 consecutive games to Michigan from 1987-2004 (teams did not play in 1999 or 2000) and Ohio State from 1982-1999 (teams did not play in 1993 or 1994). Minnesota's longest losing streak in program history was 17 games and came to Michigan State from 1977-1997 (teams did not play in 1987, 1988 1993 or 1994). The Gophers ended that streak with a 19-18 win in 1998 and are 6-5 against Michigan State since then. Minnesota's win at Indiana last week ended a one-game skid in Bloomington. The Gophers fell 40-20 in 2007 at Indiana and did not play there since.

MORE TO COME?

► Minnesota has a chance to end three more losing

streaks this year, starting on Saturday against Penn State. The Gophers, who have lost four straight games to Penn State (last win was 2004), also face Wisconsin and Michigan State this season. The Maroon and Gold have dropped nine straight to Wisconsin (last win was in 2003) and three straight to Michigan State (last win was in 2009).

40 POINTS

► The Gophers beat Indiana 42-39 last Saturday. Minnesota's 42 points were the most it scored in Big Ten play since it beat Purdue 44-28 at home last year. Saturday's win was only the tenth time since 2004 (span of 77 Big Ten games) that the Gophers scored 40 or more points in a league game. In addition to this year and last year, the Gophers scored 40 or more points one time each in 2006, 2007 and 2009. Minnesota scored 40 or more points in Big Ten games three times 2005 and two times in 2004.

16 WINS

► Coach Kill picked up his 16th win at Minnesota last Saturday at Indiana and now has a 16-18 overall record leading the Gophers. Kill, who inherited a team that was 3-9 in the season prior to his arrival, has the same record that former Minnesota coach Glen Mason had after 34 career games (1997-1999).

COMING OFF A BYE

► Minnesota played four teams this year that had a bye week prior to playing the Gophers. Minnesota finished 3-1 against those teams, posting wins against San Jose State, Nebraska and Indiana. The Gophers lone loss came at Michigan.

WINNING OCTOBER

► Minnesota ended October with a 2-1 record. It was the first time Minnesota had a winning October since it went 3-0 in 2008.

PERFECT TIMING

► Minnesota is 4-0 in 11 a.m. CT games this year.

HEAD COACH JERRY KILL

Jerry Kill was named head coach of the University of Minnesota football program on December 7, 2010. He entered his 20th year of being a head college football coach in 2013 and his overall collegiate head coaching record is 143-91.



The Gophers were 3-9 in Kill's first season in 2011, but reached a bowl game and finished 6-7 in 2012. Minnesota is 7-2 this year, giving Kill a 16-18 record as head coach of the Gophers. Kill's reputation as a turnaround artist has continued with the Gophers, as Minnesota doubled its win total from 2011 to 2012 in his second year. Last season, Kill led the Gophers to a bowl game for the first time since 2009, as Minnesota faced Texas Tech in the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

On Oct. 10, 2013, it was announced that Kill would take time to focus on his treatment and better manage his epilepsy. As he has done in previous situations, defensive coordinator Tracy Claeys will serve as the acting head coach when Kill is away.

Kill's rebuilding of the Minnesota program is also taking place in the classroom. The Gophers recorded a 994 Academic Progress Rate (APR) for the 2011-12 season, the first under Kill's leadership. The 994 score is the highest single-season score that the Minnesota football team has ever recorded and only 10 teams have tied or beaten a score of 994 since the NCAA has made single-season scores available.

Kill came to Minnesota after spending three seasons on the sidelines at Northern Illinois University. Kill led the Huskies to three consecutive bowl games during his tenure and also coached NIU to a berth the Mid-American Conference Championship game in 2010. Kill was 23-16 in his three seasons with the Huskies.

At Northern Illinois, Kill coached two winners of the Mid-American Conference Vern Smith Leadership Award, given annually to the conference's top football player. Defensive end Larry English won the award in 2008, Kill's first season. Running back Chad Spann was honored as the conference's top player in 2010. English went on to be the No. 16 overall choice in the 2009 NFL Draft and currently plays for the San Diego Chargers.

(formerly Division I-AA) program in Carbondale, Ill. He spent seven years on the Saluki sideline and compiled a 55-32 record. Kill's record over his final five seasons with Southern Illinois was 50-14 and included five consecutive NCAA FCS Playoff appearances.

Kill was the head coach at Emporia (Kan.) State for two seasons in 1999-2000. He went 11-11 with the Hornets, who play at the NCAA Division II level. Prior to coaching at Emporia State, Kill was the head coach at NCAA Division II member Saginaw Valley State from 1994-1998. He compiled a 38-14 record with the Cardinals.

Kill served as defensive coordinator and offensive coordinator in two different stops at Pittsburg (Kan.) State University. He helped lead the Gorillas to three NAIA playoff appearances as the defensive coordinator from 1985-87. Kill returned to Pitt State as the offensive coordinator from 1990-93. In that four-year span, the Gorillas advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs four times, reaching the championship game twice and winning the 1991 national title.

Sandwiched between his stints at Pittsburg State, Kill was the head coach at Webb City (Mo.) High School. He was 25-1 in two seasons at Webb City and won a state championship in 1989.

Kill and his wife Rebecca have two daughters, Krystal and Tasha.

During 2010, Kill mentored six first-team All-MAC selections. In his three seasons, the Huskies earned 10 first-team all-MAC honors. His 2010 squad ranked No. 7 in the nation in rushing offense, No. 12 in scoring offense, No. 19 in total offense, No. 14 in scoring defense, No. 26 in total defense, No. 24 in rushing defense and No. 44 in passing defense. Following the 2010 season, Kill was named the National Coach of the Year by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

In 2009, Kill was presented with the National Football Foundation Courage Award by the Chicago Metro Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

In four previous stops as a head coach, he has never left a school with a sub-.500 record. In three of his previous four head coaching positions, he took over a team with a losing record and turned in a winning season in three years or less.

Prior to serving as the head coach at Northern Illinois, Kill was in charge of the football program at Southern Illinois University, an FCS

LET'S PUNT

► Peter Mortell, who saw action only as a holder for two fake field goals in 2012, has stood out in his first season as the Gophers' punter. His average of 42.5 yards ranks third in the Big Ten and 34th in the nation. Mortell has punted 41 times and has connected on nine punts of 50 yards or better (career-long 58-yarder against Iowa). Five of his punts have been touchbacks, while 10 have been fair caught and 13 have been placed inside the 20-yard line.

STARTING POINT

► Redshirt junior Zac Epping has started 30 straight games on the offensive line, while redshirt sophomore Josh Champion has started 22 straight games (every game of his career). Redshirt junior Caleb Bak has started 20 straight games. Redshirt senior Ed Olson, who is healthy after battling an ankle injury, became the first senior starter on the offensive line for Minnesota this year when he got the nod against Nebraska and Indiana. Ed's brother, Tommy Olson, is expected to make his first start at center against Penn State, as he fills in for Jon Christenson who was injured at Indiana.

CLEAN LAUNDRY

► Through nine games, the Gophers are the least penalized team in the Big Ten (T11 in the nation with an average of 4.00 per game). Minnesota has been called for 36 penalties for 319 (35.4 yards-per-game). Minnesota was flagged six times at Michigan on Oct. 5. Prior to the Michigan game, the Gophers went eight straight regular season games where they were penalized five times or fewer.

LONG DRIVE

► Sixteen of Minnesota's 41 offensive scoring drives (39.0 percent) this year have been produced by drives that lasted nine plays or longer. Minnesota's longest drive this season took 16 plays and 9:44 and covered 75 yards before a first quarter touchdown at Michigan. Last year, the Gophers churned out 20 drives of nine plays or longer on 47 scoring drives (42 percent). The Gophers rank tied for third in the Big Ten and 14th in the nation in time of possession, as they hold the ball for an average of 33:09 per game.

POINT PRODUCTION

► Chris Hawthorne leads the Gophers in scoring with 65 points (11 FGs, 32 PATs). Mitch Leidner (7 TDs) is second on the team with 42 points, while David Cobb is third (36) and Philip Nelson and Derrick Engel are fourth (30). A year ago, Jordan Wettstein led the Gophers in scoring with 75 points (14 FGs, 33 PATs). Last year, the Gophers had six players score 18 or more points. This year they already have seven players after nine games.

► The Gophers have scored 36 touchdowns through nine games this season. They have rushed for 21 touchdowns (Gophers rushed for 14 touchdowns in 13 games last year), passed for nine and have also scored six non-offensive touchdowns (two interception returns, one fumble return, one kickoff return, one punt return and one blocked field goal return) this year. It is believed to be the first time that Minnesota has scored six non-offensive touchdowns in one season in the modern era.

► Fourteen different Gophers have scored points for Minnesota in nine games this season. Last year, 14 different players scored in 13 games, while 12 players scored in 12 games in 2011. Minnesota had only 10 players produce points in 2010, while 17 scored in 2009. This year, 12 players have found the end zone after 13 players scored a touchdown in 2012.

► The Gophers scored 42, 34 and 20 points in their three Big Ten wins this year (at Indiana, vs. Nebraska and at Northwestern) and scored seven and 13 points in their two conference defeats (Iowa and at Michigan). Minnesota is now 7-0 this season when scoring 14 or more points and 0-2 when scoring less than 14 points. Last year, the Gophers were 6-1 when they scored more than 14 points and 0-6 when they were held to less than 14 points. The last time Minnesota won when scoring 14 points or less was Nov. 21, 2006 (beat North Dakota State 10-9). The last time it happened in Big Ten play was Oct. 12, 1991 (beat Purdue 6-3).

ACTING HEAD COACH TRACY CLAEYS

Tracy Claeys has been the defensive coordinator for the University of Minnesota football program since head coach Jerry Kill's arrival in December of 2010. As of Oct. 10, 2013, he will serve as the Acting Head Coach while Kill continues to receive treatment for his epilepsy. Minnesota is 2-1 with Claeys as Acting Head Coach this season.



Claeys has helped transform Minnesota's defense in the two full seasons he has been in charge, as the unit improved in every defensive category from 2011 to 2012. Minnesota allowed 380 points in 2011, but allowed only 321 in 2012. The Gophers allowed 31.7 points per game in 2011, but yielded only 24.7 in 2012. The Gophers also allowed fewer rushing touchdowns in 2012 and fewer rushing yards per game, as they ended the year ranked No. 33 in total defense.

However, Minnesota's biggest defensive improvement from 2011 to 2012 was its pass defense, as the Gophers finished the year ranked No. 12 in pass defense and No. 23 in pass efficiency defense.

In 2011, the Gophers allowed 23 passing touchdowns and 216.7 yards per game through the air. In 2012, Minnesota allowed only 15 passing touchdowns and allowed only 186.6 yards passing per game. Under Claeys, the Gophers have recorded 13 interceptions in 2012, as compared to four in 2011.

Claeys started his coaching career at Santa Fe Trail High School in 1994. He joined up with Kill in 1995 at Saginaw Valley State, where he coached the defensive line. Claeys became Kill's defensive coordinator at Emporia State in 1999. He remained in that capacity when Kill took over at Southern Illinois in 2001 and Northern Illinois in 2008.

Claeys led a Northern Illinois defensive unit that was ranked No. 14 in the nation and No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference in scoring defense, allowing an average of just 19.08 points per game in the 2010 season. The Huskies were also No. 32 in the nation in pass efficiency defense, No. 27 in total defense and No. 27 in rushing defense in Claeys' final season at NIU.

Claeys' defense topped the MAC and ranked 30th in the country in total defense in 2009. The Huskies were also among the top 30 FBS teams in the country in scoring defense last season and held opponents below 125 yards per game on the ground. In 2008, his first season at NIU, Claeys and the defensive staff engineered one of the biggest turnarounds in the country, as the Huskies led the MAC in pass defense, total defense and scoring defense. The Huskies finished in the top 20 nationally in three categories - fifth in pass defense, 14th in scoring defense and 17th in total defense. Rivals.com named Claeys as the MAC's Defensive Coordinator of the Year for 2008.

Both Claeys and offensive coordinator Limegrover deserve credit for Northern Illinois' turnover margin of +0.79 per game in 2010, which ranked No. 2 in the MAC and No. 17 in the nation. The Huskie offense turned the ball over just 14 times in 13 games in 2010 to rank No. 5 in the nation.

Claeys' resumé also includes coaching several standout defensive players, most recently NIU's Larry English, the first-round draft choice of the NFL's San Diego Chargers in 2009. Claeys also coached Seattle Seahawks' 1999 first-round draft choice Lamar King at Saginaw Valley State. Claeys also tutored linebacker Bart Scott at Southern Illinois and now-retired defensive end Paul Spicer at Saginaw Valley St.

Claeys, who is from Clay Center, Kan., is a 1994 Kansas State graduate.

GOPHER VICTORY WALK

The Golden Gopher football program saw a new tradition take shape in 2007, with the advent of the "Gopher Victory Walk."

Prior to each game, the entire Minnesota football team, led by the Minnesota Marching Band, will walk through the fans on Oak Street and head into TCF Bank Stadium.

Each Gopher Victory Walk will begin two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff.

The Minnesota Football program is encouraging fans to participate in the Gopher Victory Walk throughout the season, by lining the entire path from the bus to the stadium and cheering for the players as they arrive on game day.

GOPHER CHAMPIONSHIPS

Minnesota has won seven national championships and 18 Big Ten titles in the 128-year history of the Gopher football program.

Minnesota's first national championship came in 1904 under the guidance of coach Henry L. Williams. The Gophers outscored their opponents 725-12 en route to a 13-0 record. The only team to score on Minnesota that year was Nebraska, as the Gophers downed the Huskers 16-12.

Bernie Bierman would lead Minnesota to national titles in 1934, 1935, 1936, 1940 and 1941. The Gophers also won a national title in 1960 under Murray Warmath.

Minnesota won its first-ever Big Ten title in 1900. The Gophers have a total of 18 Big Ten Championships in their history: 1900, 1903, 1904, 1906, 1909, 1910, 1911, 1915, 1927, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1937, 1938, 1940, 1941, 1960, 1967.

TCF BANK STADIUM

When the Gophers hosted Air Force on Sept. 12, 2009 it marked the first time since Nov. 21, 1981 that college football has been played on campus at Minnesota.

Minnesota's 16-13 win over South Dakota State marked the final game of the inaugural season at TCF Bank Stadium. Minnesota put together a 4-3 record in its new home stadium in the inaugural season and is 16-17 in five years at TCF Bank Stadium.



TCF Bank Stadium was the first Big Ten Stadium built in nearly 50 years. Beaver Stadium (Penn State) and Memorial Stadium (Indiana) were both built in 1960. In May 2006, the Minnesota legislature made the stadium a reality, approving the \$288.5 million facility. The stadium holds 50,805 fans and is an open-air facility. Construction began during the summer of 2007.
