WHERE WE ARE ...

- ▶ After dropping a tough road Big Ten opener at Indiana on Friday, Maryland looks to bounce back in the friendly confines of the XFINITY Center as the Terps welcome Penn State to kickoff a three-game home stand. The game will tip at 7:00 PM and will be televised on BTN. Fans can listen to the game on the Maryland Sports Radio Network with Voice of the Terps Johnny Holliday calling the action alongside Chris Knoche and Walt Williams. The Terps look to remain unbeaten at home this year with a 15-game win streak in place (8th-longest overall).
- ▶ The game will also be Maryland's annual Red Out presented by Weis Markets. All 4,000 students in attendance will receive a Red Out t-shirt and commemorative newspaper.

WHERE WE'VE BEEN ...

- ▶ Maryland fell 65-53 last Friday night at Indiana to open Big Ten play. Jahmir Young scored 20 points to lead the Terps, while Julian Reese added 14 points and a team-best eight rebounds. For Young, it was his third 20-point outing in the last four games where his is averaging 19.5 points in that stretch.
- ▶ Reese has also been stellar this season with four double-doubles while averaging a career-best 14.9 points and 9.6 rebounds per game. He has five games with 15+ points including a season-high 22 points.
- ▶ Defensively, Maryland is allowing just 63.0 points per game which ranks 31st nationally. The Terps have given up under 60 three times: Mount St. Mary's (53), Villanova (57), and South Alabama (55).

THE BIG NOTE ... LOOKING TO CONTINUE THE STREAK

- ▶ Maryland has won 15 straight home games which is the 8th-longest streak nationally. The Terps won 11 straight home games last season after falling to UCLA and are 4-0 at the XFINITY Center this season.
- ▶ In terms of conference win streaks, Maryland has won 13 consecutive league games dating back to Feb. 21, 2022 and thanks in part to last season's 10-0 mark in Big Ten home games. That streak is the seventh-best streak nationally spanning multiple seasons.
- ▶ After going 16-1 at home last season, Maryland is 20-1 heading into Wednesday's game.

DONTA SCOTT CONTINUES RECORD BOOK CLIMB

- ▶ Donta Scott became the 59th player in program history to reach 1,000 points last season. Through eight games this year, he now has 1,394 points and 737 rebounds. He is also the 17th Terp to post 1,300 points and 600 rebounds in a career.
- ▶ Darryl Morsell (1,090 points / 510 rebounds / 2018-21) and Anthony Cowan (1,881 points / 508 rebounds / 2017-20) were the most recent Terps to post 1,000/500.
- ▶ Scott is now 24th all-time in scoring and needs five points to move past Dez Wells (1386, 2012-15) for 23rd. He needs nine more boards to pass Maryland all-time great Len Bias (745, 1982-86) for No. 12 all-time.
- ▶ Additionally, thanks to his fifth season, Scott (137 GP - 16th most, 122 GS - 6th most, 3984 MIN - 9th most) will have a chance to set Maryland's games played record (141, Jake Layman, 2012-16), the games started record (136, Steve Blake, 1999-03), and minutes played record (4568, Greivis Vasquez, 2006-10).

FEAR THE JAHMIR

- ▶ Entering his first year at Maryland, many questioned Jahmir Young's ability to translate his scoring from C-USA to Power 5 play. Young's response was a team-best 15.9 points and 3.1 assists per game. Last season, he had eight 20-point games including a season-high 30 against No. 24 Ohio State. In Big Ten play, Young was magnificent averaging 17.7 points. He was also the third-leading rebounder (4.6) overall, led the team in steals (44) and had the fourth-most blocked shots (13).
- ▶ Young is the 2nd-ranked active player for overall scoring with 2,085 points and is ninth for scoring average at 16.4 points.

HONORS STACKING UP FOR YOUNG

- ▶ After a standout season in 2022-23, Jahmir Young, one of the top point guards in the country, has racked up the preseason accolades. He has been named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 and is a member of the Bob Cousy Award Watch List as well. Young was also a unanimous selection to the Preseason All-Big Ten Team, the first unanimous pick for Maryland since Cowan in 2019.
- ▶ Additionally, Young picked up Preseason All-America honors from Blue Ribbon and Lindy's, while The Field of 68 had him on the All-Big Ten Preseason Team and ranked him as the No. 35 of 100 top players nationally entering 2023-24.
- ▶ Last season, Young was a second team All-Big Ten selection, was named to the USBWA All-District Team, and selected to the NABC All-District Second Team. Additionally, he was chosen as the Pigskin Club of Washington Collegiate Player of the Year.

JUJU BEAST

- ▶ After a breakout sophomore campaign that saw Julian Reese become one of the top big men in the Big Ten, the Baltimore native enters 2023-24 with high praise. Reese joined Jahmir Young on the Preseason All-Big Ten Team and was named to the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award Watch List.
- ▶ Reese showed his impact for the Terps in 2022-23 as he scored in double-figures in 22 games with a career-high 24 points against Coppin State. He had seven double-doubles on the year including 17 points, 12 rebounds at Ohio State.
- ▶ Had one of his best league outings going toe-to-toe with Purdue's Big Ten Player of the Year Zach Edey where Reese scored 19 points on 8-of-11 shooting while adding three rebounds and committing zero turnovers.
- ▶ Reese finished 2022-23 tied for second on the team in scoring at 11.4 points and led the Terps in rebounds (7.2).
- ▶ In two NCAA Tournament games last year, Reese averaged 15.5 points against West Virginia and No. 1 Alabama.
- ▶ His 63.2 field goal percentage last season stands as the third-best mark in Maryland program history for a single season.

FRESHMAN CLASS BEST SINCE 2018

- ▶ Maryland's freshman class of DeShawn Harris-Smith, Jamie Kaiser, Jr., and Jahnathan Lamothe ranked as the No. 15 recruiting class in the country during the offseason. They were later joined in the spring by the addition of 7-foot center Braden Pierce who played at IMG Academy last year.
- ▶ Harris-Smith, widely regarded as one of the top-10 freshmen in the country this year, collected a number of individual honors after a standout year at Paul VI High School – Virginia Gatorade Player of the Year, Naismith High School All-American, WCAC Player of the Year, All-MET Player of the Year.
- ▶ Harris-Smith, Kaiser, and Lamothe make up one of the best DMV trios to sign with Maryland since 2002 when Travis Garrison, John Gilchrist, and Chris McCray joined the Terps. It's the most DMV players to sign with Maryland in 15 years.
- ▶ As a group, they represent the highest ranked class for Maryland since 2018 when the Terps ranked 7th overall.

UNIVERSITY PARK, PA - Camren Wynter's putback layup with 0:00.5 left in the game gave Penn State a 65-64 comeback win in the regular-season finale.

Jahmir Young scored 26 points, his ninth game this season with 20-plus points as he shot 9-of-17 from the field. He also grabbed eight rebounds

Reese scored 12 points, including a layup with 19.2 seconds left that gave the Terps a 64-63 lead.

Ian Martinez, who has been red-hot from three-point range recently knocked down 3-of-4 triples and finished with 11 points. Don Carey, who has been on a roll recently too, scored in double-figures for the fourth game in a row with 11 points.

After trailing 10-6, a quick five points by Young following the under-16 media timeout gave the Terps their first lead of the game 11-10 at the 14:37 mark.

A triple by Don Carey on the next possession capped a 10-0 run for Maryland as it built out a 14-10 lead. Another spurt of 14-0 keyed by three Martinez triples put the Terps ahead 28-15 with 3:45 left in the first half. Overall, Maryland outscored Penn State 24-5 over a span of more than 11 minutes. The Nittany Lions were held scoreless for a span of 8:37 missing 10 field goals in a row.

Defensively Maryland held Penn State to just 3-of-15 from the field over a 12-minute stretch and four points overall taking a 35-22 lead into the intermission. It was the Terps' second-largest lead at halftime on the road this season (41-21 at Minnesota).

The Terps maintained a double-figure lead for the first 10 minutes of the second half. Pickett's layup with 9:42 left in the game cut Penn State's deficit to 50-42.

Penn State continued to threaten cutting the deficit to 59-54 with 4:12 remaining on a Myles Dread three-pointer. The Nittany Lions pulled within one, 62-61, on a jumper by Andrew Funk with 1:27 remaining.

Penn State took a 63-62 lead with 42 seconds to go as part of a 15-3 run over a four-minute stretch. Reese's layup with 19.2 gave the Terps a lead before Wynter's winning shot.

- ▶ With Donta Scott reaching the 1,000 point mark for his career last season, Maryland's 59 all-time 1,000 point scorers ranks as the 11th most among all schools.
- ▶ The Terps have two 1,000 point scorers on this season's roster but Jahmir Young (2,105 pts) hit the mark at his previous institutions, Charlotte.
- ▶ Young could have the honor of scoring 1,000 points at two different institutions. After scoring 553 points last season for the Terps, if Young has a similar season in 2023-24, he could reach that plateau at Maryland as well.

SCOTT, YOUNG EXTEND SCORING STREAKS

- ▶ Donta Scott extended his scoring streak to **107 consecutive games** in the loss at Indiana. The fifth-year senior was last held without a point on March 3, 2020 at Rutgers.
- ▶ Scott has been so consistent for the Terps throughout his career, he has only been held scoreless once in 133 games played. In half of his games played (68), Scott has reached double-figures.
- ▶ Young leads the Terps having scored in all **128 career games played**. Only six times has he been held under 5 points in that stretch. Overall, Young has 113 double-figure scoring games with 44 20-point efforts.
- ▶ **Young's 44 20-point games are the most among all active Big Ten players.**

YOUNG LOOKING TO DOUBLE UP ON 1K POINTS

- ▶ Jahmir Young is looking to become just the sixth NCAA player since 2006 to post 1,000 points at two different institutions during his career. Prior to the the extra year of eligibility due to COVID-19, only three players had achieved the feat in the past 20 years.
- ▶ Young's 2,105 career points ranks 2nd among active players in the NCAA behind Max Abmas of Texas (2,679 points).

HOME COOKIN'

- ▶ Maryland has won a program-record 13 consecutive Big Ten conference games at XFINITY, including all 10 games last season and the final three of 2021-22. The Terps previous record of nine consecutive home Big Ten wins was in 2014-15. The Terps were 16-1 at home overall last season with the lone loss coming to UCLA.
- ▶ Maryland's 13-game home conference win streak is its longest since winning 16 consecutive ACC games from the 2000-01 through 2002-03 seasons.
- ▶ Maryland's 10-0 home conference game record marked just the second time for that to occur in Big Ten history - Purdue was 10-0 during the 2018-19 season.
- ▶ Maryland's 16-1 home record was the best since 2019-20 and the eighth time overall to win 16-or-more at home. In both 2012-13 and 2014-15, the Terps won 18 games at home going 18-3 and 18-1, respectively.

UNDEFEATED HOME CONFERENCE SEASONS

- ▶ Maryland went undefeated at home in conference play last season for the first time since 2014-15 (its first Big Ten season) and for the eighth time overall. On top of that, the Terps went 10-0 in home conference games for the first time ever.

- ▶ Maryland's 47 game win streak in home openers is the third-longest active streak nationally. The streak began during the 1977 season with the Terps tied alongside Michigan State.
- ▶ The last time Maryland lost a home opener was on Nov. 27, 1976 to Notre Dame, 80-79, in overtime.
- ▶ Prior to the Notre Dame loss, the Terps had won eight consecutive home openers dating back to 1968-69. Since 1963-64, Maryland has won 58-of-60.

WILLARD 2.0

- ▶ Head coach Kevin Willard energized and excited the fan base in leading the Terps back to the NCAA Tournament last season. In his first season at the helm, the 16-year veteran led the Terps to a 22-13 overall record, a NCAA Tournament Second Round appearance, and a national Top-25 ranking throughout the season.
- ▶ Willard became the first coach in program history to achieve 20 wins, a national ranking, and a berth to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. Additionally, he was also the first coach in Maryland history to start their tenure 8-0 and was the first coach in Big Ten history to win each of his first seven games by at least 15 points.
- ▶ The 2022-23 campaign was also highlighted by five Top 25 wins including a 68-54 sellout win over No. 3 Purdue, a perfect 10-0 record in home Big Ten games, and a 16-1 mark at the XFINITY Center which saw three sellouts overall. The Terps finished the year ranked No. 32 in the NET (NCAA Evaluation Tool) after being as high as No. 6 and spent 11 weeks ranked or receiving votes in the Top 25 with a high of No. 13 in the AP Poll.

COACHING STAFF UPDATES

- ▶ Maryland was one of two schools (Alabama) last season to have three coaching staff members move on to become head coaches. Tony Skinn was named the head coach at his alma mater George Mason, while Grant Billmeier was chosen to lead NJIT. Director of Player Development Tevon Saddler was also tabbed to lead his alma mater, Nicholls State.
- ▶ Returning assistant coach David Cox was promoted to associate head coach, while veteran staff member Greg Manning, Jr., was promoted to assistant coach after serving as the director of operations.
- ▶ Longtime DeMatha High School head coach Mike Jones, who had spent two seasons as an associate head coach at Virginia Tech, was brought back home as an assistant coach.
- ▶ Charlie Butler was elevated to Director of Operations, while Ricky Harris, one of the top all-time players in University of Massachusetts history, was tabbed the Director of Player Development.

YOUNG, REESE EARN PRESEASON BIG HONORS

- ▶ Jahmir Young and Julian Reese were named to the All-Big Ten Preseason Team ahead of the 2023-24 campaign. This marked the first time that Maryland has had a pair of players on the preseason team since 2019-20 when Anthony Cowan Jr. and Jalen Smith were selected to the preseason squad.
- ▶ Young was a unanimous selection after last season where the fifth-year player earned All-B1G Second Team honors by the media and the coaches. Young was the first unanimous selection to the All-Big Ten preseason team for the Terps since Anthony Cowan Jr. in 2019. Reese also features on the All-Big Ten preseason list following a sophomore campaign that saw the Baltimore native earn honorable mention All-Big Ten honors after the 2022-23 season.
- ▶ The duo's selection also marked the third time since 2015-16 that a pair of Terps were named to the All-Preseason Team. For this year's All-B1G Preseason Team, only Maryland and Michigan State had two players represented.

ALL AROUND HOOPS SUCCESS

- ▶ Maryland was one of 26 schools last year to have teams in both the men's and women's NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ Only 12 schools had men's and women's teams that were among the Top 8 seeds in both NCAA Tournaments (Arizona, Baylor, Connecticut, Creighton, Duke, Indiana, Iowa, Iowa State, Maryland, Tennessee, Texas, UCLA).
- ▶ Maryland is one of five schools in history to win men's and women's NCAA Championships, along with Baylor, Connecticut, North Carolina and Stanford.
- ▶ Maryland and Stanford are the only schools to win the national championship in men's basketball, women's basketball and football.

TERPS UNVEIL NEW UNIFORMS FOR 2023-24

- ▶ In partnership with Under Armour, Maryland unveiled new uniforms for the basketball programs in September. Each team will have four sets of uniforms in each official color: white, red, black, and gold.
- ▶ The design of the uniform incorporates a blend of nostalgic elements that will excite all die-hard Terp fans, while also adding new, modern elements.
- ▶ All four uniforms feature the arch Maryland word mark on the chest and a prominent Under Armour logo at the neckline. This placement will allow Maryland to utilize other special patches on the uniform such as the Graduate patch which was recently announced.
- ▶ The white and red uniforms incorporate black and gold trim along the sides and arms of the uniforms, while alternating red and white on each opposite colored set. Additionally, the shorts carry that look around the waist, down the side and around the bottom.
- ▶ The black and gold uniforms add a touch of flair with the Maryland flag along the bottom of the shorts with the M-Bar logo on the sides. The tops are trimmed with a solid color stripe, while the front waistline of the shorts also carries the primary logo.

IMPACT TRANSFERS FOR 2023-24

- ▶ The Terps added a trio of transfers in the off-season led by veteran Jordan Geronimo who played three seasons at Indiana. Mady Traore and Chance Stephens, both highly talented underclassmen, are both high-potential transfers who add depth to the roster for multiple years.
- ▶ Geronimo, who has a 7-foot wingspan, played 82 games for the Hoosiers where he averaged 4.2 points and 2.7 rebounds. His mother, Dawn Royster Geronimo, was a standout at North Carolina where she was an All-America honorable mention as a senior in 1987. She was the 1985 ACC Tournament MVP.
- ▶ Traore is an athletic 6-foot-11 wing who can play above the rim both in transition and defensively. The native of Paris, France was a highly-recruited three-star recruit despite a relatively late start with the game.
- ▶ Stephens played in 28 games with four starts for Loyola Marymount (CA) last season averaging 6.0 points in 17.1 minutes as a true freshman. He hit 49 three-pointers (out of 52 total made field goals) at a clip of 37.4 percent from beyond the arc. His 49 treys were third-most on the team. In LMU's win over Wake Forest in the Jamaica Classic Championship game, Stephens was 7-of-10 from deep for a career high 23 points earning MVP honors.

TELEVISION SCHEDULE

- ▶ In addition to coverage on the Big Ten Network and FS1, Maryland will have a total of four games carried nationally this year on CBS and FOX as well as three others on ESPN networks.
- ▶ Maryland will appear twice on CBS this season, both home games, against Michigan State (Jan. 21, 12 PM) and against Indiana (March 3, 2 PM). The Terps will also have two games on FOX – at Michigan State on Feb. 3 (5:30 or 8 PM) and at home against Illinois on Feb. 17 (5:30 PM). With three games from the XFINITY Center on CBS and FOX, Maryland has the second-most home nationally televised games in the league behind Michigan State (4).
- ▶ The Terps will receive major national exposure for both its basketball teams on Feb. 3 as the women's team will also appear on FOX when it hosts Iowa at the XFINITY Center.

WILLARD ICE CREAM FLAVOR MAKES DEBUT

- ▶ Head coach Kevin Willard became the newest Maryland coach to receive an ice cream flavor from the UMD Dairy. The name for the ice cream, as selected in an online fan vote, will be Willard's Full Court Press.
- ▶ Coach Willard's ice cream is made up of blackberry, peanut butter cups, banana and vanilla. The flavor will officially be available on Nov. 6 before the home opener against Mount Saint Mary's.
- ▶ Select Maryland head coaches enjoy the unique perk of having their own custom ice cream flavor created in their honor. While not every coach has one, there is no hard-and-fast rule on who gets one, success of the program does play a role.
- ▶ Current head coaches who have their own flavor include Mike Locksley (Pop, #LockedIn, Drop It), women's basketball head coach Brenda Frese (Brenda's Peanut butter Frese), women's lacrosse head coach Cathy Reese (Cathy Reese's Victory Swirl), men's soccer head coach Sasho Cirovski (Sasho's Crew Crunch), and field hockey head coach Missy Meharg (Terpresso).
- ▶ The ice creams are created by University Dining Services' Executive Pastry Chef Jeff Russo for the Maryland Dairy. Housed in the student union, the Dairy uses milk from local cows along with the specialized ingredients for each head coach. The first coach-inspired variation actually began in 2004 with Ralph Friedgen (vanilla, fudge, brownies, chocolate-covered cashews).

ITALY TRIP JUMP STARTS 2023-24

- ▶ The Terps embarked on a 10-day training tour in Italy from July 31-August 10 which gave Maryland an early start to the season. The trip spanned four cities and featured three exhibition games for the Terps.
- ▶ During the trip, Maryland toured several historic sites such as the Vatican, the Sistine Chapel, and St. Peter's Basilica in Rome; St. Mark's Square and Grand Canal gondola rides in Venice; and boat tours of Lake Como and Lake Maggiore along with visiting the island of Bellagio in Lake Como.
- ▶ Aside from the benefit of the team bonding and seeing all the cultural history of Rome, Florence, Venice and Lake Como, the tour also had an important benefit before Maryland even left the United States - the Terps were able to hold 10 official full practices during the offseason period before departing which gave the team a significant head start on the year.

- ▶ Maryland allowed just 63.5 points per game in Kevin Willard's first year, putting together one of its best defensive seasons since 2014-15.

20 WINS!

- ▶ Maryland won 20 games in a season for the 31st time in program history last year.
- ▶ The last time Maryland won 20 games was in the 2019-20, when the Terps went 24-7.
- ▶ This was the 6th time Maryland had won 20-plus games since joining the Big Ten: 2014-15 (28-7), 2015-16 (27-9), 2016-17 (24-9), 2018-19 (23-11) and 2019-20 (24-7).
- ▶ Maryland won a school record 32 games in the 2001-02 national championship season.

LOOKING BACK AT 2022-23

- ▶ Last year, the Terps won 22 games and reached the NCAA Tournament Second Round before falling to No. 1 Alabama.
- ▶ The Terps were ranked as high as No. 6 in the NET and as high as No. 13 in the AP Top 25 Poll last season.
- ▶ Maryland went 8-0 to open last season before winning 8-of-10 in the heart of the Big Ten schedule. Home court was huge for Maryland as the Terps posted a 16-1 record at XFINITY including 10-0 in Big Ten games.
- ▶ Willard's defensive focus was a hallmark of the Terps last year but more so over the last 18 games where Maryland allowed just 62.3 points per game including 54 against No. 3 Purdue (a season-low for the Boiler-makers). The 46 points allowed at Minnesota were the second fewest for any Big Ten opponent in Maryland's history since Nebraska scored 45 on Feb. 6, 2019.

FRATERNITY OF GREATNESS

- ▶ One of Willard's early initiatives at Maryland has been to reconnect and embrace the tradition of excellence. As part of that alumni outreach, he has dubbed those in the Terp family as the "Fraternity of Greatness".
- ▶ Within the team hallway, alumni now have a wall-outline of the state to sign with the message "A Lasting Legacy". Additionally, custom-made shirts are provided to alumni and current team-members only with the "Fraternity of Greatness" slogan.
- ▶ Prior to the 2022-23 season's start, the Terps hosted an alumni dinner with over 30 former players in attendance.

TERPS IN THE PROS

- ▶ Maryland currently has five players on NBA rosters: Bruno Fernando (Atlanta), Kevin Huerter (Sacramento), Alex Len (Sacramento), Jalen Smith (Indiana), and Aaron Wiggins (Oklahoma City).
- ▶ Huerter made a major impact on the Kings last season averaging 15.2 points shooting .402 from three-point range in 75 games. Smith played in 68 games for the Pacers averaging 9.4 points and 5.8 rebounds per game. Wiggins saw action in 70 games last year for Oklahoma City averaging 6.8 points and 3.0 rebounds per game highlighted by a 17-point, seven-assist night against Toronto on Dec. 11. He also had a double-double with 11 points, 10 rebounds against the LA Clippers.
- ▶ Maryland has produced 67 all-time NBA draftees including 13 top-10 selections. Both John Lucas (1976) and Joe Smith (1995) were No. 1 picks.
- ▶ Jalen Smith was the most recent top-10 selection going 10th overall in the first round to Phoenix.
- ▶ Walt Williams, now a member of the Maryland radio crew, was the No. 7 overall pick by Sacramento in the 1992 draft.

MARYLAND RADIO CREW

- ▶ Maryland Sports Radio Network play-by-play announcer Johnny Holliday is in his 45th season of broadcasting Maryland basketball this season. Holiday is the 8th longest-tenured broadcaster in the country for NCAA basketball and the second-longest serving play-by-play man in the Big Ten behind Indiana's Don Fischer.
- ▶ Holliday's partners on the call are Chris Knoche, who was the head coach at American (1990-97) in his 24th season as Maryland's color analyst, and Terrapin legend, Walt "The Wizard" Williams, who averaged 26.8 points as a senior in 1991-92 and went on to play 11 seasons in the NBA.
- ▶ Holliday has broadcast over 1,500 University of Maryland games during his Hall of Fame career, including 17 bowl games, 12 Sweet 16s, two Final Fours and Maryland's 2002 National Championship.
- ▶ Knoche played basketball at American University under HOF coach Gary Williams from 1979-81, and he later coached there from 1990-97 before joining the Maryland Sports Radio Network crew.
- ▶ Williams set numerous Maryland records during his playing days from 1988 to 1992, including his incredible streak of seven consecutive 30-point games. He was selected with the seventh pick of the 1992 NBA Draft and would go on to play 11 seasons.

ONE MARYLAND COLLECTIVE

- ▶ In September 2023, Maryland announced its partnership with Blueprint Sports, the industry leader in full-service Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL) collectives, to unveil the 'One Maryland Collective' – the official NIL collective supporting more than 550 student-athletes across all 20 sports at the University of Maryland. Until then, various collectives and other efforts had been underway to support NIL opportunities for Maryland student-athletes. The One Maryland Collective is the first collective to create a united and conscious effort to elevate the level of NIL opportunities in the market.
- ▶ Maryland Athletics has been a leader in the NIL space since its inception. Since NIL was instituted in 2021, our student-athletes have signed 1,522 NIL agreements covering all of our 20 programs, conducted hundreds of hours of community service, and engaged in meaningful opportunities to leverage their individual brands.
- ▶ The One Maryland Collective will be operated by Blueprint Sports, staffed by a dedicated full-time team to manage the daily operations of the collective, fundraising campaigns, corporate partnerships and more.

BREAKING GROUND ON THE NEW BARRY P. GOSSETT BASKETBALL PERFORMANCE CENTER

- ▶ On June 22, 2023, Maryland officially broke ground on the new Barry P. Gossett Basketball Performance Center - the new dedicated home and practice facility for the men's and women's programs.
- ▶ The ceremony was highlighted by head coaches Kevin Willard and Brenda Frese operating backhoes to dig out the first pieces of dirt.
- ▶ The 44,000 square foot facility will be located adjacent to the XFINITY Center creating a new landmark on the northern edge of the Maryland campus. It will feature a dedicated practice court for the teams, a centrally located strength and conditioning facility, expanded locker rooms with cutting-edge technology, state-of-the-art athletic training areas with hydrotherapy, dedicated space for film study and game-planning as well as large lounge areas and office space for both coaching staffs.
- ▶ Current spaces in the XFINITY Center will be repurposed to support other athletics programs for Maryland.



HEAD COACH KEVIN WILLARD

Pittsburgh '97 - 2nd Year at Maryland, 17th as Head Coach

Coming off one of the best inaugural seasons for a Maryland head coach, Kevin Willard enters his second season leading the Terps in 2023-24.

Willard was named the new head coach of the Maryland men's basketball program by Damon Evans, Barry P. Gossett Director of Athletics on March 21, 2022.

In his first season at the helm, the 16-year veteran led the Terps to a 22-13 overall record, a NCAA Tournament Second Round appearance, and a national Top-25 ranking throughout the season. Willard became the first coach in program history to achieve 20 wins, a national ranking, and a berth to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. Additionally, he was also the first coach in Maryland history to start their tenure 8-0 and was the first coach in Big Ten history to win each of his first seven games by at least 15 points.

The 2022-23 campaign was also highlighted by five Top 25 wins including a 68-54 sellout win over No. 3 Purdue, a perfect 10-0 record in home Big Ten games, and a 16-1 mark at the XFINITY Center which saw three sellouts overall. The Terps finished the year ranked No. 32 in the NET (NCAA Evaluation Tool) after being as high as No. 6 and spent 11 weeks ranked or receiving votes in the Top 25 with a high of No. 13 in the AP Poll.

With a renewed focus on recruiting the DMV, Willard and his staff assembled a top-15 recruiting class leading into the 2023-24 season and has found success through the transfer portal in players like Jahmir Young, Patrick Emilien, and Don Carey who all played key roles in 2022-23.

Over the last five seasons, Willard has been one of the winningest coaches in terms of NET Quad 1 victories. His teams have combined for 29 Quad 1 wins in that span which ranks among the Top 15 for active coaches since 2018-19.

In his career as a head coach, his teams have 33 wins over Associated Press Top-25 teams including 19 wins over Top-15 teams, 15 wins over Top-10 teams and seven wins over Top-5 teams.

Overall, teams under Willard have reached the NCAA Tournament seven times with nine 20-win seasons. He has posted 10 consecutive .500-or-better records and 12 total during his career.

In 2023-24, he will look to become the fifth active Big Ten head coach to amass 300-or-more career victories as he enters the season with a 292-223 mark.

Before taking over in College Park, Willard returned Seton Hall to its status as one of the premier programs in the Big East during his tenure from 2010-22. He reached five NCAA Tournament appearances in the last six events that were played. He led the Pirates to the Big East Tournament Title in 2015-16 and the regular-season title in 2019-20. He was the 2016 Big East Coach of the Year and the 2020 USBWA District II Coach of the Year during those runs. Additionally, he was a three-time Peter A. Carlesimo Met Writers Coach of the Year (2016, 2017, 2019) and the 2019 NABC District 5 Coach of the Year. He also has the most non-conference wins of any coach in the nation against Big Ten teams since 2014-15.

In addition to his coach of the year accolades, he was also named one of Forbes Top 10 NCAA Basketball Coaches for the Next 10 Years in 2017. His teams won the prestigious NABC Team Academic Excellence Award for five straight years (2016-20) and earned three NCAA Academic Progress Rate Public Recognition Awards.

In a six-year span from 2016-17 through 2021-22, he was one of 10 active head coaches in the Power 6 conferences to achieve a regular-season championship, a conference tournament championship, and a conference coach of the year honor. He also finished in the top-four in the Big East on six occasions. In 2018, he led the Pirates to their first victory in an NCAA Tournament since 2004.

Through his 12 seasons at Seton Hall, Willard produced a 225-161 overall record. He ranks second all-time in victories (225) in Seton Hall basketball history and has the most wins in conference play in program history (110). He is also the 11th all-time winningest coach in Big East history, dating to the conference's inception in 1979. The Pirates also had 82 combined wins between the Big East regular-season and postseason, second only to Villanova in the conference, since the 2015-16 season.

His teams at Seton Hall were ranked in the Top 25 in five of his last eight seasons with a high ranking of No. 8 in the 2019-20 season. In 2020-21 the Pirates were ranked as high as No. 15 and spent eight weeks in the polls.

Willard's Seton Hall teams also posted an 11-5 record against Big Ten teams over his last eight seasons, which included wins over Maryland in 2018 and 2019. Willard's teams also won road games at Michigan, Iowa, Penn State and Rutgers and beat Indiana at home. Willard held the most non-conference wins over Big Ten teams of any coach since 2014-15.

In 2021-22, Willard led the Pirates to a 21-11 overall record and an 11-8 mark in conference play. That included wins over No. 4 Michigan and No. 7 Texas as part of six NET Quad 1 victories.

Willard coached the Big East Player of the Year in two of his last three years in Myles Powell (2020) and Sandro Mamukelashvili (2021). He mentored two Big East Most Improved Players of the Year in Powell (2018) and Romaro Gill (2020). He coached the Big East Tournament MVP, Isaiah Whitehead (2016); the Big East Defensive Player of the Year, Fuquan Edwin (2014) and Gill (2020); the Big East Rookie of the Year, Angel Delgado (2015) and the Big East Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Michael Nzei (2019) and Ike Obiagu (2021).

Whitehead, Delgado, Powell and Mamukelashvili all earned All-American honors and Consensus First-Team All-Big East honors, and all in the last seven years. All four went on to play in the NBA with Powell playing for the Philadelphia 76ers this season and Mamukelashvili playing for the Milwaukee Bucks.

Powell was Seton Hall's first Consensus First-Team All-American since 1953. This past season, Jared Rhoden was named to the All-Big East First Team marking the sixth time in seven years that Willard coached a first-team all-conference honoree. Overall, he mentored 15 All-Big East selections and three Big East All-Rookie Team honorees.

Making a huge emphasis on effort in the classroom, Willard's student-athletes combined for 72 Big EAST All-Academic team selections, and the program boasted a perfect single-year academic progress rate in six of the nine NCAA reports since he served as head coach as well as perfect multi-year APR scores in 2016 and 2017. The NCAA has also recognized Seton Hall with NCAA APR Public Recognition awards for boasting an APR in the top 10 percent in the country three consecutive years from 2015-17. The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) gave the program the Team Academic Excellence Award for five consecutive years from 2016-20 after finishing the academic year with a grade-point-average above 3.0.

Willard showed to be a strong evaluator and recruiter of talent, as he brought in a consensus top-15 national recruiting class in 2014, led by Whitehead, the program's first McDonald's All-American since 2001 and just the fifth all-time. His 2021-22 recruiting class was also rated in the top 25 by 247Sports.

The 2020-21 season marked Seton Hall and Willard's sixth consecutive top-four finish in the Big East Conference, one of the best basketball conferences in the country. Only Villanova also completed six straight top-four finishes in the same span.

Willard was named head coach of the Seton Hall men's basketball program on March 29, 2010. He became the 19th head coach in Seton Hall history joining the Pirates after three years serving as the head coach at Iona. In 2007, he had inherited a Gaels team that had won just two games the prior season. In his first year at the helm, the Gaels had a 10-win improvement, ranking as one of the top turnarounds in NCAA Div. I. Then in year three in 2009-10, Willard guided Iona to a 21-10 overall record, and he was named MAAC Coach of the Year.

Prior to the start of his career as a head coach, Willard was an assistant and associate head coach for six years at Louisville, where he was mentored by Naismith Basketball Hall of Famer Rick Pitino. Willard also credits his father, Ralph, as one of his coaching influences. Ralph Willard enjoyed a successful 19-year run as the head coach at Western Kentucky, Pittsburgh and Holy Cross, winning 336 games and advancing to six NCAA Tournaments.

WILLARD'S EARLY MILESTONES

- ▶ First coach in program history to lead Maryland to NCAA Tournament in first year.
- ▶ First coach in Maryland history to post 20 wins during his inaugural season.
- ▶ First coach in program history to have Maryland ranked nationally during a coach's first season.
- ▶ First coach in Maryland history to start 8-0 in his first season.

At Louisville, Willard was responsible for assisting with the Cardinals' game preparations, scouting and preparing game plans. He also served as chief recruiting coordinator. During his tenure, Louisville was ranked in the Top 25 for five seasons and reached the postseason in each of his six years. The squad reached the NCAA Tournament on four occasions including a visit to the 2005 Final Four, the first time in 19 years that the Cardinals had advanced that deep into the postseason. In his six seasons at Louisville, the Cardinals posted a phenomenal 142-58 record averaging nearly 24 wins per season.

Prior to Louisville, Willard worked with Pitino as a coaching associate with the Boston Celtics for four years. His duties with the Celtics included game and practice preparation, scouting and assisting the coaching staff in all facets of basketball operations. He also provided advance scouting, videotape breakdowns and assisted with individual workouts prior to games.

A basketball lifer, Willard played point guard on the Division I level for four years; the last three coming at the University of Pittsburgh. He earned Big East All-Academic honors while appearing in 60 games for the Panthers. He spent his freshman season at Western Kentucky, where he played in the backcourt and sank over 40 percent of his three-point field goal attempts.

Willard hails from New York and was born in Huntington on Long Island, but played his high school basketball at Bowling Green High School (Ky.) while his father was the head coach at Western Kentucky. He earned second-team All-State honors as a senior and helped his team to a combined 76-15 record in his final three prep seasons.

Willard is married to the former Julie Wagner and they have two sons, Colin, who was born in August 2006 and Chase born in June 2008.

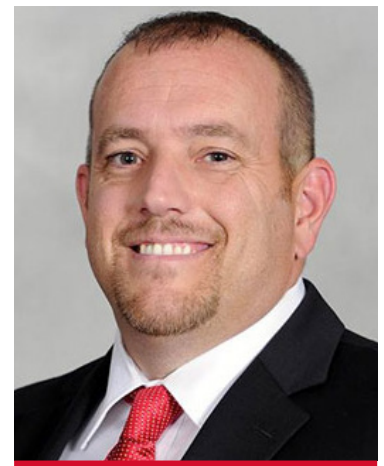

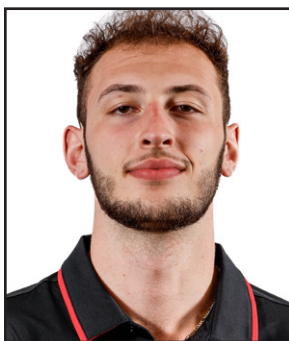
