INSIDE THE GAME

NO. 8 PENN STATE HOSTS BOWLING GREEN FOR HOME OPENER

- OPENING KICK:** No. 8 Penn State welcomes Bowling Green for a non-conference matchup. Kickoff is set for noon on Big Ten Network at Beaver Stadium.
- RETURN OF THE MAC:** The Nittany Lions will open their home schedule with the Falcons, the third matchup between the schools. Penn State is very familiar with Mid-American Conference teams, having played a MAC team in 21 of the last 23 seasons with the only exceptions being a Big Ten-only schedule in 2020 and 2023's non-conference schedule. Penn State is 30-3 all-time against current members of the MAC and also hosts Kent State on September 21.
- SERIES HISTORY:** Penn State meets Bowling Green for the third time in program history. The Nittany Lions own a 2-0 advantage in the series. Penn State earned a 45-19 win in 1987 and a 48-3 victory in 1998. In the 1998 matchup, Cordell Mitchell ran for 104 yards and two touchdowns. LaVar Arrington and Joe Dawkins scored on interception returns and Bruce Branch returned a punt for a touchdown.
- HOME SWEET HOME:** Penn State opens its 65th season in Beaver Stadium on Saturday. The Nittany Lions are 122-13-1 all-time in home openers and owns a 54-10 record in Beaver Stadium home openers. PSU has won 20 of its last 22 home openers.
- TAKEAWAYS:** Since 2022, Penn State's defense has been one of the nation's best in creating takeaways. The Nittany Lions continued that trend against West Virginia, forcing three takeaways. Jaylen Reed recovered a fumble in the first quarter, Dani-Dennis Sutton recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter and Elliot Washington II recorded an interception in the fourth quarter. Over the last three seasons, Penn State has forced 53 turnovers (27 interceptions, 26 fumbles) and recorded three or more takeaways in 11 games. Since 2022, PSU is 14-0 when forcing multiple takeaways in a game.
- THE OPPOSITION:** Bowling Green earned a 41-17 win over Fordham in its season-opener last Thursday. The Falcons rushed for 305 yards and scored five times on the ground. Terion Stewart led the squad with 161 yards and three touchdowns on 14 carries. Justin Pegues returned the game's opening kickoff for a 100-yard touchdown.

PROGRAM NOTES

RECENT SUCCESS

Since 2016, Penn State holds a .735 winning percentage, with a record of 75-27, the ninth-best winning percentage among Power Four programs. Penn State has won at least nine games in five of the last seven seasons.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 616 of Penn State football student-athletes have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 316-81 (.796) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572. The Nittany Lions are 45-9 in Beaver Stadium since 2016, an .833 winning percentage, the ninth-best home record among Power Four teams.

NOTABLE

- In 1985, Penn State opened the season with a 20-18 win at No. 7 Maryland. Michael Zordich got PSU on the board with a 32-yard pick-six. The Terrapins took an 18-17 lead in the third quarter, but PSU responded with a 48-yard field goal by Massimo Manca.
- Penn State's 81-0 win over Cincinnati in 1991 is its largest margin of victory since 1966 and is the fourth-largest margin in program history. PSU tallied 706 total yards, including 484 rushing, while scoring eight touchdowns on the ground.
- In 2019, Penn State earned a 45-13 win over Buffalo. The Nittany Lions trailed 10-7 at halftime, but took the lead early in the third quarter on a 36-yard interception return for a touchdown by John Reid. Penn State offensive coordinator Andy Kotelnicki was the offensive coordinator at Buffalo at the time.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- He is one of three current FBS head coaches (Dabo Swinney, Clemson; Gus Malzahn, UCF) to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of four (Swinney; Malzahn; Mike Gundy, Oklahoma State) to do so in 12 of their first 13 seasons.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He joins Mack Brown (UNC), Kirby Smart (Georgia) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson) as the only active coaches in college football to have won at least three New Year's Six or College Football Playoff games in their career.
- Franklin has led his teams to four Top 10 finishes (4 at Penn State) and eight Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 6 at Penn State).
- In the last eight seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least six times, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls - 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 29 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 13 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 107 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is first all-time in total wins and winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins).

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- In **2023**, Penn State posted a 10-win season for the second-straight year and reached the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl after finishing 10th in the College Football Playoff Rankings. PSU put together one of its top defensive performances in school history, leading the country in sacks (49) and rushing defense (75.5), while finishing second in total defense (246.7), tackles for loss (111) and fewest first downs allowed (13.9) and third in scoring defense (13.5). The 49 sacks were a school record.
- Penn State defeated No. 8/7/10 Utah, 35-21, in the 109th Rose Bowl Game to cap off the **2022** season. The Nittany Lions reached the 11-win plateau for the 19th time in program history.
- Penn State earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in **2021**. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- In **2020**, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in **2019**, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In **2018**, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in **2017** and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in **2016**, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in **2015** and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era PinStripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Olumuyiwa Fashanu (2023), Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th, 19th and 20th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujuan collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- In 2023 and 2024, Penn State Football partnered with Soles4Souls, whose mission is to turn unwanted shoes and clothing into opportunities, keeping them from going to waste and providing reliefs, creating jobs and empowering people to break the cycle of poverty.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.

HEAD COACH SCOT LOEFFLER

- Scot Loeffler is in his sixth season as head coach at Bowling Green.
- Loeffler has led the Falcons to back-to-back bowl games in 2022 and 2023, making trips to the Quick Lane Bowl.
- Bowling Green made back-to-back bowl appearances for the first time since 2012-15.
- The Falcons have improved their win total each of the last three years going from 0 (2020) to 4 (2021) to 6 (2022) to 7 (2023).
- Before taking over at Bowling Green, Loeffler served as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Boston College from 2016-18, also serving as deputy head coach in 2018.
- Loeffler was offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Temple (2011), Auburn (2012) and Virginia Tech (2013-15) before his stop at Boston College.

SCOUTING THE FALCONS

- Bowling Green started the 2024 season with a 41-17 win over Fordham on August 29.
- The Falcons went 7-6 in 2023, appearing in the Quick Lane Bowl against Minnesota.
- Against Fordham, Bowling Green tallied 475 yards, including 305 yards on the ground.
- Terion Stewart led the squad with 161 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 14 carries (11.5 ypc). He scored on runs of 7, 7 and 73 yards.
- Connor Bazelak completed 15-of-22 passes for 168 yards and scored on an 8-yard run.
- Lucian Anderson III added a 13-yard touchdown run.
- Justin Pegues returned the game's opening kickoff for a 100-yard touchdown.
- Bowling Green allowed 401 total yards against Fordham, including 219 through the air and 182 on the ground.
- The Falcons recorded five sacks, including two by Anthony Hawkins and one each by Joseph Sipp Jr. and Charles Rosser.

LAST MEETING PENN STATE RUNS PAST BOWLING GREEN, 48-3

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Penn State scored three times in the first quarter on its way to a 48-3 win over Bowling Green. The Nittany Lions scores included a punt return and two interception returns.

After forcing a three-and-out on the Falcons' first possession, Cordell Mitchell burst through the left side for a 77-yard touchdown on Penn State's first play.

The Nittany Lions' defense forced another punt on Bowling Green's next possession. Bruce Branch took the punt back for a 73-yard touchdown return, his first career score. Penn State led 14-0 just 2:40 into the game.

Two possessions later, LaVar Arrington snagged his first career interception at the Bowling Green 16-yard line and scampered into the end zone for a pick-six to put Penn State ahead, 21-0.

A 16-yard touchdown run by Mitchell extended the lead to 28-0 early in the second quarter.

Mike Cerimele added a 2-yard scoring run before halftime to give the Nittany Lions a 34-0 lead at the break.

Omar Easy capped Penn State's first possession of the third quarter with a 5-yard touchdown run.

On the following Bowling Green possession, Joe Dawkins picked off a pass at the Bowling Green 30 and raced into the end zone for a score to put Penn State ahead, 48-3.

Penn State gained 432 yards, including 242 on the ground. Cordell Mitchell led the way with 104 yards and two touchdowns on 16 carries. Eric McCoo added nine rushes for 52 yards, while Cerimele had 43 yards on a score on six carries.

Kevin Thompson completed 8-of-13 passes for 133 yards with Corey Jones making three catches for 40 yards and Joe Nastasi adding two receptions for 54 yards.

Maurice Daniels led the PSU defense with nine tackles (eight solo) and a sack. James Boyd recorded six solo stops.

- Bowling Green senior QB Connor Bazelak was coached at Indiana in 2022 by Penn State defensive coordinator/linebackers coach **Tom Allen**.

BOWLING GREEN COACH CONNECTIONS

- Penn State offensive line coach **Phil Trautwein**, Penn State offensive analyst **Frank Leonard**, Bowling Green head coach Scot Loeffler and Bowling Green running backs coach Brian White all coached together at Boston College in 2018. Trautwein was the offensive line coach and Leonard was the Assistant Head Coach/tight ends coach, while Loeffler was the deputy head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach and White was the running backs coach.
- Leonard coached with White at Boston College from 2015-19 and with Loeffler at Boston College from 2016-18.
- Penn State co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Anthony Poindexter** and Bowling Green wide receivers coach Erik Campbell coached together at UConn in 2016. Poindexter was the defensive coordinator/safeties coach, while Campbell was the wide receivers coach.
- Poindexter coached at Purdue in 2017-18 with Bowling Green cornerbacks coach Derrick Jackson. Poindexter was the co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach and Jackson was the cornerbacks coach.
- Penn State special teams coordinator/outside linebackers/nickels coach **Justin Lustig** and Bowling Green cornerbacks coach Robert Armand coached together at Vanderbilt in 2022-23. - Due to lightning in the area, the start of the second half was delayed by 2 hours and 19 minutes.

- The Nittany Lions won at least 10 games in back-to-back seasons for the 12th time in program history.
- Penn State joined Alabama, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Michigan, Ohio, Ohio State, Oregon, Troy, Tulane and Washington as teams who posted 10+ win seasons in 2022 and 2023.
- The Nittany Lions reached 10 wins for the fifth time since 2016.
- Penn State is one of 11 FBS teams with at least 10 wins in at least five of the last eight seasons, joining Alabama (8), Boise State (6), Clemson (7), Georgia (6), Michigan (6), Notre Dame (5), Ohio State (7), Oklahoma (6), Troy (5) and Washington (5).

- **Andy Kotelnicki** joins Penn State after spending three seasons as Kansas' offensive coordinator, including the 2023 season as the associate head coach.
- Over the last three seasons, Kotelnicki's Kansas offense was explosive, ranking 12th in the country in 20+ yard plays (8.3%), 15th in 30+ yard plays (3.89%) and 11th in 40+ yard plays (2.12%) during that span.
- Additionally, KU ranked 10th in the country in 15+ yard pass plays (20.97%) over the last three years.
- The Kansas offense was efficient in the red zone and on third downs over the last three seasons, ranking 11th in red zone touchdown percentage (68.24) and 16th in third down conversion percentage (44.9).

- The Jayhawks scored 40+ points in nine games in during the three-year window and 50+ points in five games.
- Kansas reached the 400 total yards mark in 20 games and 500 total yards in 11 games, while rushing for 200 yards in 16 games and 300 yards in three games.

ALLEN HIRED AS PENN STATE DC

- **Tom Allen** joined Penn State after spending seven seasons as head coach at Indiana.
- The 2020 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year, Allen brings 32 years of coaching experience to Happy Valley.
- During his last 28 seasons, Allen's teams have posted a combined record of 255-117 (.685).
- Allen joined the Hoosiers in 2016 as associate head coach/defense and engineered the biggest defensive turnaround in the nation.
- From 2015-17 the Hoosiers had the most improved defense nationally in total defense (-169.4) and passing defense (-134.1), the sixth-most improved in third-down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ppg).
- In his eight-year tenure at Indiana, IU ranked top five in the Big Ten in third down defense in five seasons and in the Top 15 nationally twice. The Hoosiers ranked sixth in the Big Ten in third down defense (36.6%) during the eight-year span.
- Allen coached four defensive All-Americans (Tiawan Mullen, 2020; Aaron Casey, 2023; Tegray Scales, 2017; Micah McFadden, 2020) and 35 All-Big Ten honorees.

LUSTIG TABBED SPECIAL TEAMS COORD.

- **Justin Lustig**, a 2022 Broyles Award nominee, enters his first season as Penn State's special teams coordinator, outside linebackers and nickels coach.
- Lustig spent three seasons at Vanderbilt, serving as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach. He was promoted from assistant head coach to associate head coach following the 2021 season.
- During his career, Lustig has mentored 53 All-conference selections, including the 2018 Lou Groza Award recipient Andre Szmyt at Syracuse, 2023 Ray Guy Award finalist Matthew Hayball at Vanderbilt and two-time All-SEC long snapper Wesley Schelling with the Commodores.
- As a team in 2023, Vanderbilt was one of 20 programs in the country to block multiple punts and finished 11th nationally in net punting.

HOME SWEET HOME

- With a 316-81 all-time record in Beaver Stadium, Penn State owns the sixth-best record in its venue amongst current FBS schools and leads the Big Ten.
- Penn State averaged 108,409 fans in seven home games in 2023, which is the second-highest single-season average attendance in Beaver Stadium history and is the highest since record 108,917 average in 2007.
- The Nittany Lions welcomed 110,856 fans against Michigan in 2023. It is the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history. This season, Penn State has recorded attendances numbers of 110,747 (vs. West Virginia), 110,830 (vs. Iowa) and 110,856 (vs. Michigan).
- The 2023 Penn State White Out attendance was 110,830, which is the third-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history behind only the 110,889 from the 2018 Penn State White Out game against Ohio State and 110,856 against Michigan in 2023.
- Only Alabama (.841) and Oklahoma (.817) have higher winning percentages in facilities older than Beaver Stadium.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2023 season was the 23rd-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State is 62-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 21-11 at home, 29-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

ON TV

- Penn State has had 360 of its last 362 games televised, including 256 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, CBS, NBC, Peacock or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 341 regular season TV appearances since 1995.
- Penn State games averaged 3.66 million viewers in 2023.
- The Nittany Lions played in three of the Top 25 most-watched games in 2023, including Penn State-Ohio State (9.96 million viewers; FOX), Penn State-Michigan (9.16; FOX) and Penn State-Ole Miss (7.77; ESPN).

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

TEAM NOTES

POSLUSZNY TABBED COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMER

- Penn State national award winner and two-time first-team All-America linebacker **Paul Posluszny** has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as part of the 2024 class.
- Posluszny will be inducted to the Hall of Fame December 10, 2024 at the 66th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner in Las Vegas.
- Posluszny is the 27th member (21 players, 6 coaches) of the Penn State football family to be elected to the College Hall of Fame. Linebacker LaVar Arrington was the most recent player inductee in 2022.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006.
- A native of Aliquippa, Pennsylvania, he was selected a first-team honoree by the Associated Press, Football Writers Association of America, Sporting News and Walter Camp Football Foundation in 2005 and the Associated Press and Walter Camp Football Foundation in 2006.
- Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006.
- In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor.

CARTER, DOZIER ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen **Ki-Jana Carter** and **D.J. Dozier** have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2025.
- A native of Westerville, Ohio, Carter was selected a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign.
- He staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in all-purpose yardage (158.4). Carter led the Big Ten Conference in all three categories.
- Carter's 7.8 yards per carry easily was the best among the nation's Top 25 rushers.
- A tailback, Dozier matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. and earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986.
- Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86, and ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt.
- Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and scored 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad.

JONES, HAM TEAM UP FOR 25TH SEASON

- In 2024, Steve Jones and Jack Ham are set to team up for their 25th season as the play-by-play voice and color analyst, respectively, on the Penn State Sports Network.
- The pair began working on Penn State football radio broadcasts in 2000.
- The 2023 Peach Bowl against Ole Miss was the duo's 300th broadcast.
- Jones is a 1980 Penn State graduate and also serves as the play-by-play voice of Penn State Men's Basketball.
- Jones began his time with the Penn State Radio Network in 1983 and worked on Penn State football pregame, halftime and postgame shows before taking over as play-by-play announcer in 2000.
- Ham, an All-American in 1970, became the 10th Nittany Lion to be enshrined in the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in 1990.
- Ham was the first Penn state product in both the College Football and Pro Football Halls of Fame after a nine-time All-Pro career as a linebacker for the Pittsburgh Steelers.

TRUSTEES APPROVE BEAVER STADIUM RENOVATION PLANS

- The Penn State Board of Trustees on May 21 approved in investing in the renovation of Beaver Stadium, which will grow revenue-generating opportunities, transform the fan and community experience, and fuel the future funding for all 31 athletics programs at Penn State.
- The approved renovations will enable year-round use of Beaver Stadium, further driving economic growth and development in the surrounding region.
- Since January 2024, when the initial expenditure for the Beaver Stadium renovation was approved, steps have been underway at the stadium and will continue leading up to the 2024 college football season.
- Initial construction has prioritized safety and accessibility through the widening of select concourses and the installation of new escalators, as well as field lighting performance and videoboard replacements.
- Winterization work also is ongoing, which entails the insulation of pipes and other upgrades to allow the building to be occupied when temperatures are below freezing, giving Penn State the ability to host a College Football Playoff game beginning in 2024 and other potential events beyond Penn State football games in the winter months.
- After the 2024 season, the project plans encompass three distinct phases over the course of the next three football offseasons and will offer a new mix of seating options and improved amenities, such as restrooms and concessions.
- A new welcome center is planned for the community that will include a 21,000-square-foot facility for events and many other uses, serve as a connection point for all in the community, and augment enrollment efforts for prospective students and future student-athletes.
- The campus visit experience continues to be one of the most important drivers for prospective students, and the new center enables customization by leveraging technology to create visits that are personalized, immersive and showcase Penn State's areas of distinction.

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is third in the Big Ten in red zone touchdown percentage (66.97; 11th nationally) and scoring offense (34.33; 21st), fifth in total offense (425.02; 37th) and sixth in points per possession (2.19; 20th), touchdown percentage (31.95; 19th), scoring percentage (41.03; 20th), yards per pass attempt (7.78; 34th) and yards per play (6.00; 37th).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.18; 2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.36; 7th) and holds third in 60-plus (0.52; 25th), fourth in 40-plus (1.91; 21st) and 50-plus (0.96; 35th) and sixth in 20-plus (7.43; 29th) and 30-plus (3.42; 38th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 offensive plays of 20 or more yards in seven of the last nine seasons (67 in 2022; 57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (9-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are sixth in the Big Ten and 24th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (18.93 percent).
- Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing 44 times in the **James Franklin** era. PSU is 39-5 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has recorded 200 passing yards on 83 occasions. Penn State is 62-21 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has tallied 400 total yards on 70 occasions. Penn State is 57-13 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State is 46-1 when leading by 10+ points at halftime.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is first in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.11 margin (1.96 gained per game; 0.85 lost per game).
- Over the last three seasons, Penn State is averaging 8.11 points per game off turnovers, ranking first in the nation, and had 95 points off turnovers in 2023.
- Against West Virginia, Penn State tallied 457 total yards on 60 plays, averaging 7.6 yards per play.
- Penn State rushed for 222 yards, averaging 5.3 yards per carry, and threw for 235 yards, averaging 19.6 yards per completion.
- The Nittany Lions tallied seven pass plays of 17+ yards and eight run plays of 10+ yards.
- Penn State had four plays of 40+ yards, including a 50-yard touchdown pass from **Drew Allar** to **Harrison Wallace III**, a 55-yard pass from Allar to **Omari Evans** and a pair of 40-yard runs (one for a touchdown) by **Nicholas Singleton**.
- The Nittany Lions did not allow a sack against the Mountaineers.
- In the second quarter, Allar threw three touchdown passes, connecting with Wallace on the 50-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the quarter, **Kaytron Allen** on a 20-yard touchdown and Wallace again on an 18-yard score on the final drive of the first half.
- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a quarter since Trace McSorley in 2016 against Michigan State (third quarter).
- Wallace had five catches for a career-high 117 yards and a career-best two touchdown receptions.
- Singleton earned his sixth career 100-yard rushing game with 114 yards on 13 carries (8.8 average).
- The junior added a 13-yard reception and 56 kick return yards for a total of 183 all-purpose yards.
- Through week one, Allar ranks seventh in the nation, first in the Big Ten, in yards per completion (19.64) and eighth in passing efficiency (229.7; 2nd in B1G).
- He's also second in the FBS in quarterback rating (98.3), trailing only Alabama's Jalen Milroe (98.7).
- Singleton is 13th in the country, second in the Big Ten, in yards per carry (8.8) and 19th in all-purpose yards per game (183.0).
- Wallace is sixth in the nation and leads the Big Ten with two touchdown receptions.
- Twelve Nittany Lions on offense earned All-Big Ten honors last season, including returners RB **Kaytron Allen** (2nd), RB **Nicholas Singleton** (3rd), TE **Tyler Warren** (3rd), QB **Drew Allar** (HM), OL **Olaivavega Ioane** (HM), OL **JB Nelson** (HM) and OL **Sal Wormley** (HM).
- Wormley was a preseason All-America second-team selection by the Action Network and is on the Outland Trophy watch list.
- Allar is a member of the Davey O'Brien Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award and Maxwell Award watch lists.
- Allen and Singleton are on the Doak Walker Award watch list, while Singleton is also on watch lists for the Maxwell Award, Paul Hornung Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- Redshirt senior OL **Nick Dawkins** is on the Wuerffel Trophy watch list, while Ioane is on the Polynesian Player of the Year Award watch list.
- Warren was tabbed for the Mackey Award watch list, while WR **Omari Evans** is on the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list.
- **Andy Kotelnicki** is in his first season as Penn State's offensive coordinator.
- Over the last 10 seasons as an offensive coordinator, Kotelnicki's offenses lead the nation in lowest sack percentage (3.82) and lowest tackle for loss percentage (7.86).
- Kotelnicki's offenses are third in the nation in rushing touchdowns per game (2.08), yards per rush (4.72), rushing yards per game (190.92), rushing yards per season (2,004.9) and rushing touchdowns per season (22.80) over that span.
- Over the last 10 seasons as an OC, Kotelnicki's offenses are first in points per play (0.46), second in yards per play (6.21), touchdown percentage (29.60), 40+ yard play percentage (1.97), third down conversion percentage (43.0) and fourth in red zone touchdown percentage (65.43).
- Penn State has scored 40 points 32 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

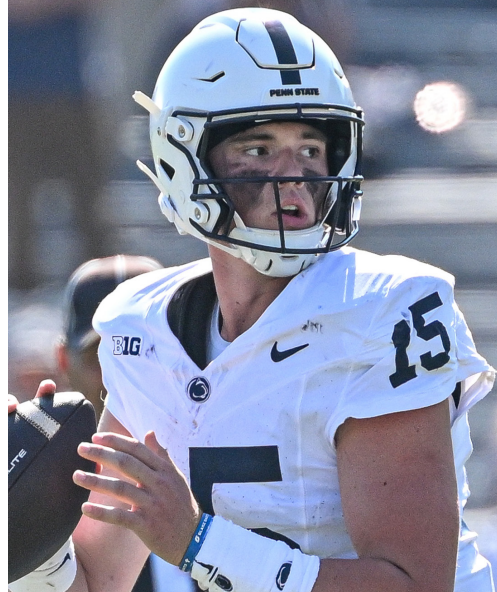

QUARTERBACK NOTES

- Junior quarterback **Drew Allar** is on watch lists for the Davey O'Brien Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award and Maxwell Award.
- Allar was selected honorable mention All-Big Ten by the coaches and media in 2023.
- In his career, the Ohio native has completed 59.9 percent of his passes (279-of-466) for 3,191 yards and 32 touchdowns (two interceptions) and added 302 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns.
- He ranks first in school history in career interception percentage (0.43), third in completion percentage (59.9), fourth in touchdown pass percentage (6.87) and sixth in pass efficiency (139.2).
- He also sits 11th in school history with 32 career touchdown passes.
- Before an interception on his 29th pass attempt of the Indiana game in 2023, Allar tallied 311 passing attempts without an interception to start his career. Allar's 311 pass attempts without an interception to start his career is an FBS record, bettering Baylor's Robert Griffin III's 209 attempts in 2008.
- Allar is the first quarterback in Penn State history to throw for 10 or more touchdowns before throwing an interception in a season.
- Against West Virginia, Allar completed 11-of-17 passes for 216 yards and three touchdowns.
- It was his third career game with 200+ passing yards and 3+ passing touchdowns.
- All three of Allar's touchdown passes came in the second quarter, a 50-yard touchdown to **Harrison Wallace III** early in the frame, a 20-yard touchdown pass to **Kaytron Allen** and an 18-yard touchdown toss to Wallace on the final drive of the first half.
- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a quarter since Trace McSorley in 2016 against Michigan State (third quarter).
- With his third touchdown pass of the day, Allar recorded the 32nd of his career, leaping Anthony Morelli (31; 2004-07) for 11th all-time at Penn State.
- He also connected with **Omari Evans** on a 55-yard pass, one of six completions over 15 yards on the day.
- In the first quarter, Allar went over the 3,000 career passing yards mark.
- Allar added six carries for 44 yards (7.3 ypc), including one run of 15 yards and two 10-yard runs.
- Allar was tabbed to the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8.
- Through week one, Allar ranks second in the nation with a 98.3 quarterback rating, trailing only Alabama's Jalen Milroe (98.7).
- He also ranks seventh in the nation, and leads the Big Ten, averaging 19.64 yards per completion.
- He sits eighth in the nation, second in the Big Ten, with a 229.7 passing efficiency.
- In 2023, Allar completed 59.9 percent of his passes for 2,631 yards and 25 touchdowns (two interceptions), while rushing for four scores.
- Allar is one of two FBS quarterbacks ever, joining Tennessee's Hendon Hooker in 2022, with 25+ touchdown passes and two or fewer interceptions in a season.
- Allar set a Penn State season record for lowest interception percentage (0.51) and became the first quarterback in school history to throw for 10+ touchdowns before throwing an interception in a season.
- In the last 10 years, Allar is one of three Power Five players with 450 touches (pass attempts + runs), joining Jayden Daniels (2019) and Oregon's Bo Nix (2023).
- In the last 10 years, only 12 FBS players (three active) have had 2,800+ total yards and four or fewer turnovers in a season, including Allar (2023), WVU's Garrett Greene (2023), Coastal Carolina's Grayson McCall (2023), Michigan's JJ McCarthy (2023), Oregon's Bo Nix (2023), Florida State's Jordan Travis (2023), BYU's Zach Wilson (2020), Kent State's Dustin Crum (2019), Arizona State's Jayden Daniels (2019), Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa (2019), Alabama's Jalen Hurts (2017) and Memphis' Paxton Lynch (2015).
- Allar began the 2023 season with 251 pass attempts without an interception. Since 2000, his 251 pass attempts without an interception are the sixth-most to start a season, trailing only Louisiana Tech's Colby Cameron (428; 2012), Oregon's Marcus Mariota (285; 2013), Western Kentucky's Tyrrell Pigrome (278; 2020), NC State's Ryan Finley (274; 2017) and West Virginia's Geno Smith (273; 2012).
- He is the only Big Ten quarterback, since 2000, to start a season with 175+ pass attempts and no interceptions.
- Allar finished second in the country in touchdown-to-interception ratio (12.5-to-1).
- Allar's 25 touchdown passes in 2023 were tied-third in a season at Penn State, while he ranked fifth in touchdowns responsible for (29), sixth in completions (233), seventh in pass attempts (389), ninth in completion percentage (59.9) and tied-ninth in 200+ yard passing games (7).
- Allar has 10 career games with multiple touchdown passes, six games with three or more touchdown passes and two games with four touchdown passes.
- He has eight career 200-yard passing games and one 300-yard passing game.
- The Ohio native owns four career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown.
- Quarterback **Beau Pribula** also enters his third season with the Nittany Lions. He has played in 12 games at Penn State.
- Pribula has 12 completions for 168 yards and five touchdowns as a Nittany Lion, while adding 354 rushing yards and six scores.
- He ranks 11th all-time among Penn State quarterbacks with 354 rushing yards.
- At WVU, Pribula connected on a 19-yard touchdown pass with **Tyler Warren** in the fourth quarter.
- He added three rushes for 25 yards, including runs of 11 and 12 yards.
- He has two games with both a passing and rushing touchdown.
- In 2023, Pribula has completed 11 passes for 121 yards and four touchdowns, while rushing for 329 yards and six scores.
- Pribula ranked third among Big Ten quarterbacks with 329 rushing yards and rushing touchdowns (6) last season.
- Pribula's 329 rushing yards rank ninth in a season among Penn State quarterbacks, while his six rushing touchdowns are tied seventh in a season among PSU QBs.

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach **Ja Juan Seider** has 16 years of college coaching experience, including 13 at the Power Five level.
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- A loaded running back room is led by dynamic juniors **Kaytron Allen** and **Nicholas Singleton**.
- Singleton is on watch lists for the Doak Walker Award, Maxwell Award, Paul Hornung Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- Allen was tabbed to the Doak Walker Award watch list.
- In 2023, Allen earned All-Big Ten second team (coaches) and third team (media honors), while Singleton was voted third team as a running back and honorable mention as a return specialist.
- Singleton (1,927) and Allen (1,789) each have over 1,780 career rushing yards.
- Penn State is one of eight FBS teams with at least two career 1,780-yard rushers on its roster.
- Penn State and UCF are the only FBS teams with two career 1,780-yard rushers who have played their whole career at one school.
- Allen and Singleton are two of 13 Big Ten players with at least 1,780 career rushing yards.
- Singleton is one of 21 FBS players with 1,900+ career rushing yards and 21+ career rushing touchdowns.
- Singleton's 5.7 career rushing average ranks 10th among active FBS players (2nd in Big Ten) with 340+ rushing attempts.
- Singleton (5.7) and Allen (5.1) career rushing averages are second and third, respectively, among Big Ten players with 340+ rushing attempts.
- With 3,051 career all-purpose yards, Singleton ranks 24th among active FBS players and sixth among Big Ten players.
- Singleton owns 1,927 career rushing yards, ranking 20th all-time at PSU, and 21 career rushing touchdowns, tied 18th at PSU.
- Singleton owns 18 career runs of 20+ yards.
- He also has 38 career receptions for 406 yards and three touchdowns.
- He has six career 100-yard rushing games and six career games with multiple rushing touchdowns.
- Singleton began his 2024 campaign by rushing for 114 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries at West Virginia.
- He averaged 8.8 yards per carry, while earning his sixth career 100-yard rushing game.
- Singleton scored on a 40-yard run in the third quarter and added another 40-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- He now owns four career rushes of 40+ yards.
- Singleton added a 13-yard reception and 56 kick return yards to total 183 all-purpose yards.
- On a 4-yard run in the third quarter, Singleton surpassed the 3,000 career all-purpose yards mark, becoming the 21st Penn State player to reach that milestone.
- Through week one, Singleton ranks 13th in the country in yards per carry (8.8) and 19th in all-purpose yards per game (183).
- Singleton finished the 2023 season with 171 rushes for 752 yards and eight touchdowns. Added 26 catches for 308 yards and two touchdowns, while averaging 24.1 yards per kick return.
- He ranked third in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards per game (105.6) and tied-fifth in rushing touchdowns (8).
- Against Delaware in 2023, Singleton scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns.
- The Pennsylvania native recorded a 100-yard rushing game at Michigan State in 2023, finishing the contest with 118 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries.

- In the Peach Bowl, Singleton rushed for 50 yards on eight carries, while catching four passes for 86 yards and a touchdown. He scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.
- In his third season in Happy Valley, Allen has 1,789 career rushing yards, ranking 21st all-time at Penn State, 16 career rushing touchdowns and 2,115 career all-purpose yards.
- He also owns 35 career receptions for 289 yards and three scores.
- He has three career games with multiple rushing touchdowns and four career 100-yard rushing games.
- Allen hauled in a 20-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter.
- He added 20 yards on the ground.
- In 2023, Allen rushed for 902 yards on 172 carries (5.2 ypc) with six touchdowns, while adding 14 receptions for 81 yards and a score.
- Allen ranked fourth in the Big Ten in yards per carry (5.2), fifth in rushing yards (902) and tied-ninth in rushing touchdowns (6).
- In the Delaware game in 2023, Allen rushed for 103 yards on 19 carries. Allen scored on a 4-yard rush.
- The Virginia native recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game against Michigan State, tallying a career-high 137 yards on 15 carries (9.1 average). He added a 2-yard touchdown grab.
- Allen had a 50-yard rush against the Spartans, his second career rush of 50+ yards, and added a 40-yard run.
- He rushed for a team-best 51 yards, including a 24-yard rush, against Ole Miss in the Peach Bowl.
- Redshirt freshman **Cam Wallace** made his collegiate debut at West Virginia, gaining 24 yards on nine carries, including an 11-yard rush.
- Redshirt junior **Tyler Holworth** has played in six career games and owns nine career carries.

- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021 "35 Under 35" list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- In his four seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped 18 offensive linemen earn All-Big Ten honors, including six in 2023.
- Last season, Olumuyiwa Fashanu was the 2023 Big Ten Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year and a William V. Campbell Trophy Finalist.
- Fashanu was named a first-team All-American by the Associated Press, AFCA, Sporting News and the Walter Camp Football Foundation, becoming Penn State's first offensive lineman to be named a consensus All-American since Jeff Hartings in 1995.
- Fashanu (11th overall), Caedan Wallace (third round) and Hunter Nourzad (fifth round) each heard their name called in the 2024 NFL Draft, marking the first time since 1996 the Nittany Lions had three linemen drafted.
- Redshirt senior **Sal Wormley** has started 27 games in 31 appearances.
- He is on the Outland Trophy watch list.
- Wormley is a preseason All-America second-team selection by the Action Network.
- According to PFF, Wormley allowed just one sack in 406 pass plays in 2023.
- Redshirt senior **JB Nelson**, voted All-Big Ten honorable mention selection by the coaches and media in 2023, has appeared in 16 games, making eight starts.
- Redshirt sophomore **Olaivavega Ioane**, named All-Big Ten honorable mention selection by media in 2023, has made six career starts in 18 appearances.
- Ioane is on the Polynesian Player of the Year Award watch list.
- Junior **Drew Shelton** has appeared in 21 games and made seven starts.
- Redshirt senior **Nick Dawkins** is on the Wuerffel Trophy watch list. He made his first career start against WVU and has played in 27 career games.
- Redshirt freshman **Anthony Donkoh** made his first career start in the West Virginia game.
- Redshirt junior **Nolan Rucci** made his Penn State debut in the WVU game and has played in seven collegiate games.
- Cooper Cousins** was one of three true freshmen to see playing time against WVU.
- Penn State did not allow a sack against West Virginia.
- The Nittany Lions gained 457 yards, averaging 7.6 yards per play, and 222 rushing yards.
- PSU had eight runs of 10+ yards, including a pair of 40-yard runs (one for a touchdown) by **Nicholas Singleton**.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 32 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2023.
- **Olumuyiwa Fashanu** was a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman", and an National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete. He was the 20th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2023, Penn State posted a program-record 93% graduation success rate. The 93% mark tops the previous high GSR of 91% set in 2005 and is just the second time in program history topping 90%. This is the 14th consecutive year the football team has surpassed the national average GSR for its sport.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increased Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach **Marques Hagans** is in his second season on the Penn State staff.
- Hagans joined the Penn State staff after serving as the associate head coach/wide receivers coach at Virginia for the previous 11 years. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach for the Cavaliers prior to the 2022 season.
- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 yards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams. He spent three seasons with the Rams before being picked up by the Kansas City Chiefs and Indianapolis Colts in 2008. Hagans spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns with Washington.
- Redshirt junior **Harrison Wallace III** has appeared in 25 career games, making seven starts, as a Nittany Lion.
- He owns 43 catches for 618 yards (14.4 average) and four touchdowns in his PSU career with a long reception of 50 yards.
- Wallace registered his first career 100-yard receiving game in the win at West Virginia.
- He hauled in five catches for 117 yards and a career-best two touchdown receptions.
- Wallace had a 50-yard catch-and-run touchdown on the first play of the second quarter.
- He added an 18-yard touchdown reception right before halftime.
- Through week one, Wallace is sixth in the nation and leads the Big Ten with two touchdown receptions.
- Wallace played in eight games and started six in 2023. He made 19 catches for 228 yards and a touchdown, with a long catch of 29 yards. Thirteen of Wallace's 19 catches went for first downs last season.
- Junior **Omari Evans** has 11 receptions for 204 yards and two touchdowns in 25 career games.
- He had two catches at West Virginia, including a 55-yard reception to setup a touchdown on the final drive of the second quarter.
- Evans had a career-best 60-yard catch at Michigan State in 2023.
- Senior **Julian Fleming** transferred to Penn State from Ohio State and made his PSU debut against West Virginia.
- He has appeared in 39 games, including 22 starts, in his college career.
- Fleming has collected 79 receptions for 963 yards (12.2 average) and seven touchdowns in his career.
- In 2023, Fleming posted 26 receptions for 270 yards. Among his 26 catches, 16 resulted in first downs.
- In 2022, Fleming ranked third in the Big Ten in yards per reception (15.7) and tied-seventh in receiving touchdowns (6).
- Redshirt junior **Liam Clifford** has appeared in 26 career games, including two starts, with 21 receptions for 219 yards and a long reception of 33 yards.
- Redshirt sophomore **Kaden Saunders** has appeared in 16 games as a Nittany Lion. He has eight career receptions for 77 yards and a touchdown.

- He was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Theo Johnson, selected by the New York Giants in the fourth round of the 2024 NFL Draft, was Penn State's fifth tight end drafted since 2015, tied for the third-most in the FBS.
- In 2023, Penn State tight ends combined for 73 receptions, 820 receiving yards and 16 touchdowns.
- Penn State's 16 receiving touchdowns by tight ends were the most of any FBS team last season.
- Penn State was the only FBS team with multiple tight ends owning 7+ receiving touchdowns in 2023.
- Junior **Tyler Warren**, named All-Big Ten third team by the coaches and honorable mention by the media in 2023, has played in 41 games with 16 starts.
- Warren is on the Mackey Award watch list.
- He owns 52 receptions for 636 yards and 12 touchdowns, while adding two rushing scores, in his career. Warren has seven career receptions of 20+ yards.
- He has 12 career touchdown receptions, tied for 16th all-time at Penn State and tied-third among PSU tight ends, trailing only Mike Gesicki (15; 2014-17) and Pat Freiermuth (16; 2018-20).
- Warren is one of six FBS tight ends (two Big Ten) with 50+ receptions, 630+ receiving yards and 12+ touchdown receptions in his career.
- Among active FBS tight ends, Warren is tied-fifth in career touchdown receptions (12; 2nd in B1G), while sitting tied-third among Big Ten tight ends in career receptions (52) and fifth in career receiving yards (636).
- Warren had three catches for 30 yards at West Virginia, including a 19-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter.
- In 2023, Warren tied-first in the Big Ten and tied-third in the nation among tight ends with seven touchdown receptions, while his 422 yards were fourth-most among Big Ten tight ends.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Warren was tied-seventh among FBS tight ends with nine red-zone catches in 2023.
- Warren's seven receiving touchdowns in 2023 are tied third in a season among Penn State tight ends.
- He hauled in a career-high six receptions, including a 2-yard touchdown, against Delaware.
- The Virginia native caught three passes for 35 yards and an 11-yard touchdown at Illinois.
- Warren hauled in a pair of touchdowns against Iowa. He caught a 2-yard touchdown midway through the third quarter and a 7-yard touchdown grab late in the third quarter.
- Against UMass, Warren had a 7-yard touchdown catch.
- At Maryland, Warren caught four passes for 51 yards and an 8-yard score.
- Warren made an 8-yard touchdown grab in the third quarter against Michigan State.
- He tallied five receptions for a career-high 127 yards, earning his first 100-yard game. He had a career-long 75-yard reception in the first quarter and added a 22-yard grab in the fourth quarter.
- Redshirt junior **Khalil Dinkins** has played in 22 career games, making nine catches for 110 yards and three touchdowns.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- **Tom Allen** enters his first season as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Penn State.
- Allen, the 2020 AFCA National Coach of the Year and Big Ten Coach of the Year, brings 32 years of coaching experience to Happy Valley after spending the last eight years at Indiana, including seven as head coach.
- Allen coached four defensive All-Americans and 35 All-Big Ten honorees at Indiana.
- Thirteen Nittany Lions on defense earned All-Big Ten honors in 2023. Among the returners are **DE Abdul Carter** (1st as LB), **DE Dani Dennis-Sutton** (3rd), **DT Zane Durant** (HM), **DT Dvon J-Thomas** (HM), **LB Kobe King** (HM), **S Jaylen Reed** (HM) and **S Kevin Winston Jr.** (HM).
- Carter, making the switch from linebacker to defensive end, has been tabbed to Preseason All-America honors by the Action Network (1st team), Associated Press (2nd), CBS (2nd), ESPN (2nd), the Athletic (2nd) and the Walter Camp Award.
- Carter is on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy, Nagurski Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- Dennis-Sutton has also been tabbed to the Lott IMPACT Trophy watch list.
- J-Thomas is on the Polynesian Player of the Year Award watch list.
- King has been named to the Butkus Award watch list.
- Winston is on the Bednarik Award watch list.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has held 20 opponents under 100 rushing yards, most in the FBS.
- Over the last three seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in nine games, the nation's 12th-most in that span.
- Over the last three seasons, the Nittany Lions have allowed under 10 completions in six games, tied sixth-most in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has forced 53 turnovers (27 interceptions, 26 fumbles), tied-second in the nation and most among Power Five teams.
- Penn State's 26 fumbles recovered over the last three seasons are tied second-most in the nation and are most in the Big Ten, while the 27 interceptions are tied 26th.
- Penn State has recorded three or more takeaways in 11 games over the last three seasons, tied-most among FBS teams.
- Over the last three seasons, Penn State is 14-0 when forcing multiple takeaways in a game.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is first in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.11 margin (1.96 gained per game; 0.85 lost per game).
- Against West Virginia, the Nittany Lions forced three takeaways, including two fumbles and an interception.
- Reed recovered a fumble in the first quarter.
- Dennis-Sutton recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter after a strip-sack by **DE Smith Vilbert**.
- Later in the fourth quarter, **CB Elliot Washington II** recorded his first career interception.
- The Nittany Lions added a fourth-down stop and a red zone stop in the first quarter.
- Penn State limited West Virginia to 246 yards on 66 plays (3.7 yards per play).
- The Nittany Lions held the Mountaineers to 85 rushing yards and 161 passing yards.
- PSU limited WVU to 4-of-14 on third down, including 1-of-5 on third-and-short (4 or less yards).
- Winston led PSU with 12 tackles (7 solo) and added a forced fumble to earn Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week and Bednarik Award National Player of the Week honors.
- Through week one, Penn State ranks sixth in the country in takeaways (3) and fifth in fumble recoveries (2).
- Winston ranks 19th in the nation with 12 tackles and 24th with 7 solo tackles.
- Reed added a career-high nine tackles, a tackle for loss and a career-best two pass breakups.
- Penn State's 49 sacks in 2023 were a school record, bettering 47 sacks in 2018, 1999, 1998 and 1979.
- PSU led the country in 2023 in sacks (49), sacks per game (3.77), rushing defense (75.5), yards per rush (2.26), fewest first downs allowed (181) and tackles for loss per game (8.5).
- The Nittany Lions finished second in the nation in total defense (246.7), total tackles for loss (111) and yards per play (4.16).
- PSU held third in the country in scoring defense (13.5), fifth in fumbles recovered (12), seventh in passing defense (172.1), 11th in pass efficiency defense (116.44) and third down defense (30.2), 12th in takeaways (24) and 36th in interceptions (12).
- In the Peach Bowl against Ole Miss, the Nittany Lions snapped a streak holding opponents to 24 or less points in 17-straight games. It was the nation's longest active streak.
- The Nittany Lions earned three shutouts in the 2023 season (31-0 vs. Iowa; 63-0 vs. UMass; 42-0 at Michigan State). The last time PSU posted three shutouts in a season was 1978 (19-0 at Ohio State; 58-0 vs. TCU; 30-0 at Kentucky).
- Penn State recorded seven shutout halves in 2023, the most in a season since 2017 (9).
- The Nittany Lions had two shutouts against Big Ten teams in 2023 (31-0 vs. Iowa; 42-0 at Michigan State) for the first time since 2021 (24-0 vs. Indiana; 28-0 vs. Rutgers) and recorded its first ever shutout against the Spartans.
- Penn State held 10 opponents under 100 rushing yards last season (Delaware, 82; Illinois, 78; Iowa, 20; Northwestern, 45; UMass, 64; Ohio State, 79; Indiana, 80; Maryland, -49; Rutgers, 99; Michigan State, -35).
- The Nittany Lions held four opponents to 60 or less passing yards last year (Delaware, 58; Iowa, 56; UMass, 45; Michigan, 60).
- Penn State held four opponents to 9 or less first downs last year (Delaware, 5; Iowa, 4; UMass, 9; Michigan State, 5).
- In 2023, Penn State limited Iowa to four first downs, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- Penn State held Iowa to 76 yards of offense, the second-fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game, and just 33 plays.
- PSU limited Maryland to -49 rushing yards. Since 1947, the -49 rushing yards are the second-lowest allowed by a Penn State defense. The -49 rushing yards allowed were the fewest by an FBS team in a game this season.
- Since 2014, Penn State is one of four FBS teams that have allowed -49 or fewer rushing yards in a game joining San Diego State (-66 vs. Middle Tennessee State, 12/24/22), Michigan State (-73 vs. Tulsa, 8/30/19) and Arizona State (-52 vs. Washington State, 10/22/16).
- Penn State held Maryland to -40 rushing yards on 11 attempts in the first half and -49 in the game. The -49 rushing yards are Penn State's lowest allowed under **James Franklin**.
- Penn State held Michigan State to 53 total yards, marking the second time in the 2023 season holding an opponent to 76 or fewer yards (76 vs. Iowa; 53 at MSU).
- Since 1947, the 53 total yards were Penn State's fourth-fewest allowed in a game (-47 vs. Syracuse, 1947; 25 vs. Temple, 1947; 43 vs. Pitt, 1947) and the fewest allowed in a game under Franklin.
- Since 2000, Penn State and TCU (2017 vs. Jackson State and Kansas) are the only FBS schools to hold multiple opponents to 76 total yards or fewer in a single season. Penn State is the only team to do so against two conference opponents.
- Penn State limited Michigan State to -35 rushing yards. The Nittany Lions held two opponents under -35 rushing yards last season (-49 at Maryland), the two-lowest single-game totals in the FBS in 2023.
- Since 2000, Penn State is the only FBS school to hold multiple opponents to -35 rushing yards or fewer in a single season.
- Since 1947, the -35 rushing yards are Penn State's third-fewest allowed in a game (-107 vs. Syracuse, 1947; -49 at Maryland, 2023) and the second-fewest allowed in a game in the James Franklin era.
- Over the last 10 seasons, PSU sits first nationally in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (0.94), second in sacks per game (3.11; trailing only Clemson) and QB hurries (990), tackles for loss percentage (11.05) and total pressures generated (1,530), sixth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.25) and eighth in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.44).
- Penn State's 358 sacks over the last nine years (2015-24) are fourth behind Clemson (408), Alabama (391) and Pitt (369).
- Over the last nine years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.86 percent sack percentage (358 sacks on 4,002 pass plays), which ranks second in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 30 times, sixth-most among FBS teams. Twenty-two of those 30 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- Since 2015, Penn State has recorded 11 shutouts, second-most among FBS teams. PSU is also tied for the second-most shutouts (16) in the FBS since 2007.
- The Nittany Lions lead the FBS with eight shutouts against conference opponents since 2015.
- Since 2014, PSU has held an opponent under 300 total yards 60 times, sixth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200 passing yards in 73 games, eighth-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 100 passing yards in 22 games in that span, seventh-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 59 occasions, tied ninth-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 50 rushing yards in 22 games, tied eighth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 33 times since 2014, second-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has collected six or more sacks in a game 18 times, most among FBS teams.
- The Nittany Lions have forced multiple takeaways in a game on 56 occasions since 2014.

- **Deion Barnes** is in his second season heading the Nittany Lion defensive line corps. Barnes spent the previous three years on the Penn State staff as a graduate assistant working with the defensive line.
- Barnes was a three-year letterwinner at defensive end for Penn State from 2012-14 and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 2012.
- He has helped coach 16 All-Big Ten defensive linemen, including five first-team selections and a second-team All-American in his first five seasons working with the Penn State defensive line.
- Junior **Abdul Carter**, an All-Big Ten first team selection in 2023, is making the transition to defensive end after spending his first two seasons at linebacker.
- Carter is on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- He was also named a Preseason All-American by the Action Network (1st team), Associated Press (2nd team), CBS (2nd team), ESPN (2nd Team), The Athletic (2nd team) and the Walter Camp Award.
- Following the 2023 season, Carter was tabbed a second-team All-American by Sports Illustrated.
- Carter owns 105 tackles (62 solo), 16 tackles for loss, 11 sacks, three forced fumbles, an interception and nine pass breakups in his third season in Happy Valley.
- He has three career games with 2+ tackles for loss and two games with 2+ sacks.
- Carter had one solo tackle at West Virginia.
- In 2023, Carter notched 48 tackles (25 solo), 5.5 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, a forced fumble, an interception, five pass breakups and five QB hurries.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Carter had a 24.1 pass rush win percentage, ranking third in the FBS among players with at least 100 pass rush snaps.
- Carter started his 2023 campaign with a solo sack in the fourth quarter against West Virginia.
- Sophomore DE **Dani Dennis-Sutton**, an All-Big Ten third team selection by the coaches last season, is a member of the Lott IMPACT Trophy watch list.
- Dennis-Sutton has tallied 44 tackles (29 solo), 9.5 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, an interception and three pass breakups as a Nittany Lion.
- He owns two career games with multiple tackles for loss and one game with multiple sacks.
- Dennis-Sutton recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter at West Virginia, while adding a solo tackle and a pass breakup.
- Redshirt senior+ DT **Hakeem Beamon** owns 19 career starts and 38 career appearances. Beamon has totaled 38 tackles, 9 tackles for loss, one sack and four pass breakups at Penn State.
- He had a half-tackle for loss in the win at WVU.
- According to PFF, Beamon posted the highest pass rush grade (71.3) among PSU defensive tackles last season. It was the fifth-best pass rush grade (min. 175 pass-rush snaps) among Big Ten interior defensive linemen.
- Redshirt senior+ DT **Dvon J-Thomas**, selected All-Big Ten honorable mention by the media in 2023, has made 13 career starts in 44 appearances, with 61 tackles (31 solo), 9.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup in his career.
- He owns one career game with multiple tackles for loss with a career-high 2.5 vs. UMass in 2023.
- J-Thomas is on watch list for the Polynesian Player of the Year Award.
- He notched two tackles at West Virginia.
- He tallied 26 tackles, five tackles for loss and a QB hurry in 2023.
- According to PFF, J-Thomas was tied-seventh among Big Ten interior defensive linemen with five tackles for loss or no gain on run plays.
- Junior DT **Zane Durant**, selected All-Big Ten honorable mention by the media in 2023, has recorded 26 tackles, eight tackles for loss, four sacks and one fumble recovery in his career.
- The Florida native has one career game with multiple tackles for loss, registering three at Northwestern in 2023.
- Durant recorded a solo sack in the third quarter and tallied 1.5 tackles for loss at West Virginia. He had four tackles (2 solo).
- Senior DE **Amin Vanover** has made 30 appearances as a Nittany Lion, tallying 31 tackles, seven tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. He owns one game with 2+ tackles for loss.
- Vanover assisted on two tackles against the Mountaineers.
- Redshirt senior+ **Smith Vilbert** has played in 20 games at Penn State, notching five tackles for loss, four sacks and one forced fumble. He has one career game with multiple sacks.
- At West Virginia, Vilbert recorded a strip-sack in the fourth quarter for his first career forced fumble.
- Senior DT **Coziah Izzard** has made 36 appearances at Penn State, including seven starts. He has recorded 48 tackles (25 solo), 10.5 tackles for loss, seven sacks and two forced fumbles in his career.
- He owns two career games with multiple tackles for loss and one game with multiple sacks.
- Izzard made one tackle at West Virginia.
- Redshirt senior DT **Alonzo Ford Jr.** has played in 25 collegiate games, registering 70 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

- Smith has tutored a secondary which has seen 14 defensive backs taken in the NFL Draft since 2015, tied with LSU for the second-most in the nation, behind only Alabama (18).
- Daequan Hardy (sixth round, Buffalo Bills) and Kalen King (seventh round, Green Bay Packers) were selected in the 2024 NFL Draft.
- It marked the third-straight year PSU had multiple defensive backs drafted.
- Joey Porter Jr. was selected 32nd overall by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 2023 NFL Draft.
- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Junior **Cam Miller** has totaled 32 tackles, four tackles for loss, three sacks, an interception and three pass breakups in 25 games at Penn State.
- He recorded three tackles at West Virginia.
- Miller finished the 2023 season with 24 tackles (19 solo) to go along with four tackles for loss, three sacks, an interception and a pass breakup.
- He ranked second among FBS cornerbacks with three sacks in 2023, including two against UMass to become Penn State's first defensive back to record multiple sacks in a game since Derek Bochna had two for the Nittany Lions at West Virginia in 1992.
- Redshirt senior **Jalen Kimber** transferred to Penn State from Florida. He has appeared in 26 career games, making 12 starts.
- He owns 41 tackles (31 solo), one fumble recovery, one interception and seven pass breakups in his career.
- Kimber notched three tackles and a pass breakup at WVU, while making his first start at Penn State.
- Last season, Kimber posted 23 tackles (18 solo), a fumble recovery, five pass breakups and a QB hurry.
- According to PFF, he allowed a 55.0 completion percentage and forced eight incompletions when targeted last season.
- Sophomore **AJ Harris** transferred to Penn State from Georgia.
- Harris made his first collegiate start against West Virginia, recording three tackles and a pass breakup.
- He has 11 tackles, including three solo, and one pass breakup in his career.
- Redshirt sophomore **Audavion Collins** has played in six games at Penn State and had one tackle at WVU.
- Sophomore **Zion Tracy** has played in 14 games, making 14 tackles, including 11 solo.
- He had one tackle at WVU.
- Sophomore **Elliot Washington II** has appeared in 11 games, registering 10 tackles (seven solo), one tackle for loss and an interception.
- Washington recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter against West Virginia.

- Redshirt junior **Kobe King**, voted All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media in 2023, leads the linebacker unit. He has played in 31 games and started 12 at Penn State. He was voted a captain for the 2024 season.
- King was named to the Butkus Award watch list in the preseason.
- He owns 106 tackles (61 solo), 10 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, two fumble recoveries and three pass breakups as a Nittany Lion.
- He has one career game with 10+ tackles, registering 10 against Rutgers in 2023, and two games with 2+ tackles for loss.
- King had three tackles at WVU.
- He posted 59 tackles (39 solo) to go with six tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, one fumble recovery and one QB hurry in 2023.
- He finished third on the team with 27 solo tackles on run plays.
- According to Pro Football Focus, led Big Ten linebackers with an 85.3 run defense grade (minimum 200 run defense snaps).

- DeLuca picked off a pass, his first career interception, and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown against Delaware.
- He recorded an interception at Maryland, returning it 35 yards.
- Sophomore **Tony Rojas** made his first career start at WVU and has appeared in all 14 games in his first two years in Happy Valley.
- As a Nittany Lion, he has tallied 27 tackles (10 solo), five tackles for loss, a forced fumble and an interception.
- Rojas notched 1.5 tackles for loss at WVU, tying his career high. He finished the game with five tackles (2 solo) in his first career start.
- At Maryland in 2023, Rojas caused turnovers on back-to-back possessions in the fourth quarter. He recorded his first forced fumble and picked off a pass, which he returned 20 yards.
- Since 2000, he is one of 10 PSU players with an interception and a forced fumble in the same game.
- Senior **Tyler Elsdon** has played in 40 career games, owning 77 tackles (51 solo), four tackles for loss and two fumble recoveries.
- Elsdon made four stops against the Mountaineers.
- Redshirt sophomore **Keon Wylie** has appeared in 16 games with 19 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He has one career game with 2+ tackles for loss.
- Redshirt freshman **Ta'Mere Robinson** had two tackles at WVU.
- Penn State has 71 linebackers drafted all-time, the most for any school.

- Co-Defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Anthony Poindexter** is in his fourth season on the Nittany Lion coaching staff.
- Poindexter has 20 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven as a defensive or co-defensive coordinator.
- As a player, Poindexter, a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020.
- Junior **Kevin Winston Jr.**, voted All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media, has seen playing time in 26 games in his first three years in Happy Valley. He was voted a captain for the 2024 season.
- He is a member of the Bednarik Award Watch List.
- Winston has 89 tackles (52 solo), 3.5 tackles for loss, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, one interception and five pass breakups as a Nittany Lion.
- Against West Virginia, Winston tied a career high with 12 tackles (7 solo) and earned his third career game with 10+ tackles. Eight of his 12 stops came in the first half.
- The junior registered his first career forced fumble in the first quarter and added a solo tackle for loss.
- Winston earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week and Bednarik Award National Player of the Week honors.
- Winston ranks 19th in the nation with 12 tackles and 24th with 7 solo tackles.
- Last season, Winston led PSU with 60 tackles (35 solo), 2.5 tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries, an interception and five pass breakups. He paced PSU with 28 solo tackles in run defense.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Winston had a 86.8 coverage grade, ranking fourth among Big Ten safeties and 11th among FBS safeties.
- He earned a 90.6 run defense grade, leading the Big Ten (all positions) and ranking third in the nation among safeties (min. 200 run defense snaps).
- His 90.6 run defense grade was tied fifth in the nation among all players.
- Senior **Jaylen Reed**, an All-Big Ten honorable mention selection by the coaches and media in 2023, has played in 35 contests and started 14 games. He has tallied 92 tackles (62 solo), seven tackles for loss, one sack, one fumble recovery, two interceptions and six pass breakups at PSU.
- At WVU, Reed made plays all over the field, collecting a career-high nine tackles (3 solo), a solo tackle for loss, a fumble recovery and two pass breakups.
- Reed notched his first career fumble recovery in the first quarter and had a career-best two pass breakups.
- He posted 46 tackles (32 solo), four tackles for loss, a sack, two interceptions and a pass breakup last season.
- Redshirt junior **Zakee Wheatley** has played in 31 career games, making one start, collecting 57 tackles (39 solo), one tackle for loss, two interceptions, one forced fumble and one pass breakup.
- He tallied four tackles (3 solo) and a half-tackle for loss at WVU, his first career start.
- In 2023, Wheatley totaled 24 tackles (14 solo) and a half-tackle for loss.
- **Dejuan Lane** was one of three true freshmen to play against WVU.

- Sixteen members of the Penn State coaching staff, support staff and athletic department played at Penn State.
- Associate head coach/cornerbacks coach **Terry M. Smith** was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91.
- Co-offensive coordinator and tight Ends Coach **Ty Howle** was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts.
- Defensive line coach **Deion Barnes** made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Defensive graduate assistant **Torrence Brown** was a three-year letterman on the defensive line for the Nittany Lions (2015-17). He appeared in 30 career games, making seven starts.
- Defensive graduate assistant **Jordan Lucas** was a reliable member of the defensive backfield during his Penn State career, appearing in 46 games (2012-15).
- Defensive analyst **Dan Connor** was a two-time first-team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- Director of performance science **Andrew Nelson** was a four-year letterwinner on the offensive line for Penn State (2014-17) and appeared in 33 games, making 28 starts.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement **Tyrone Smith** was a defensive tackle for Penn State and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Director of life skills **Jordan Hill** lettered at Penn State from 2009-12 and finished his Penn State career with 171 total tackles, including 9.5 sacks. He posted a 64-tackle, 4.5-sack season his senior year and was named first-team All-Big Ten for his efforts in 2012.
- Recruiting coordinator **Alan Zemaitis** was a three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of Football Academic Services **Todd Kulka** lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the Football Letterman's Club **Wally Richardson** was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.
- Assistant athletic director for the brand academy **Omar Easy** lettered for the Nittany Lions from 1999 to 2001 and spent time in the NFL with the Kansas City Chiefs and Oakland Raiders.
- Associate director of development **Michael Mauti** was a four-year letterwinner fo the Nittany Lions and the Big Ten Linebacker of the Year and a first-team All-American in 2012.
- Assistant AD for Premium Seating **Bobby White** was Co-Captain of the 1986 National Championship Penn State Football team.
- Assistant director of high performance **Dan Vasey** was a defensive end with the Nittany Lions (2017-21).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- **Justin Lustig** is in his first season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebackers/nickels coach.
- A 2022 Broyles Award nominee, Lustig served the last three seasons at Vanderbilt. In 2023, Vanderbilt was one of 20 programs in the country to block multiple punts and finished 11th nationally in net punting.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks second in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (75.4; 2nd in B1G), fifth in the nation in touchback percentage (71.3; 1st), sixth in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned (18.0; 1st) and 13th in average opponent field position (25.4; 5th).
- Since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is ranked fourth in the country in punts inside the 10 (17.3 percent; 4th in B1G), sixth in punts inside the 20 (42.1; t-2nd) and eighth in net punting (41.6; 3rd).
- Since 2017, Penn State has scored nine special teams touchdowns (four kick return, five punt return), ranking second in the Big Ten, and is one of six FBS schools that has not allowed a special teams touchdown since the start of the 2019 season (62-straight games).
- Redshirt junior kicker **Sander Sahaydak** served as Penn State's primary kicker against West Virginia.
- Sahaydak converted all four extra-point attempts against the Mountaineers.
- Junior P **Riley Thompson**, selected All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media in 2023, is on the Ray Guy Award watch list.
- Thompson has placed 44 career punts inside the 20 and 14 punts inside the 10, while blasting 30 punts of 50+ yards in his career.
- His 45.7 punt average at Penn State ranks first all-time at PSU (minimum 50 punts).
- Thompson averaged 44.0 yards per punt on four boots against WVU. He landed a 46-yard punt at the WVU 11 in the third quarter.
- His 45.8 punt average in 2023 ranked fourth in the Big Ten, while he helped Penn State to sit sixth in the nation (second in the Big Ten) with a 42.9 net punting average.
- Thompson's 45.8 punt average last season ranks second at Penn State behind only Jordan Stout's 46.01 average in 2021.
- KR **Nicholas Singleton**, an All-Big Ten honorable mention honoree as a return specialist, is averaging 23.9 yards per kick return in his career, 11th all-time at Penn State, with one touchdown.
- Singleton is on the Paul Hornung Award watch list for the most versatile player in the country.
- He had three returns for 56 yards against WVU.
- He tallied 13 kick returns for 313 yards (24.1 average) and ranked third in the Big Ten with 105.6 all-purpose yards in 2023.
- Redshirt junior SN **Tyler Duzansky** has appeared in 21 career games.
- Duzansky is a member of the Patrick Mannelly Award watch list.
- He led FBS long snappers with six tackles in 2023.
- Redshirt junior P **Gabriel Nwosu** landed two kickoffs for touchbacks at WVU.
- Last season, Nwosu ranked fourth in the Big Ten in kickoff average (63.7), and landed 50 touchbacks, good for third in the conference.
- LB **Dominic DeLuca** has been voted as a captain for the second-straight year and was awarded No. 0 as the team's special teams leader.
- In 2023, DeLuca deflected a punt against UMass for his second career punt block. His first came against Minnesota in 2022.
- Redshirt freshman LB **Ta'Mere Robinson** had two tackles on kickoff returns against West Virginia.
