INSIDE THE GAME

NO. 10/8 PENN STATE WELCOMES KENT STATE FOR FINAL NON-CONFERENCE MATCHUP OF 2024

- **OPENING KICK:** No. 10/8 Penn State hosts Kent State for its final non-conference matchup of the season. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on Big Ten Network at Beaver Stadium.
- RETURN OF THE MAC: The Nittany Lions will close its non-conference slate with Kent State. Penn State
 is very familiar with Mid-American Conference schools, having played a MAC team in 21 of the last 23
 seasons with the only exceptions being a Big Ten-only schedule in 2020 and 2023's non-conference
 schedule. Penn State is 31-3 all-time against current members of the MAC after a 34-27 win over
 Bowling Green on September 7.
- SERIES HISTORY: Penn State meets Kent State for the seventh time in program history. In the last
 matchup in 2018, the Nittany Lions earned a 63-10 win. PSU gained 643 total yards, including 346
 passing yards and 297 rushing yards. Trace McSorley threw for two touchdowns and scored on three
 rushing touchdowns. Sean Clifford threw his first career touchdown pass, a 95-yard completion to Daniel
 George
- TERRIFIC TIGHT END: Senior Tyler Warren had a record-setting day against Bowling Green, hauling in a career-high eight receptions for a Penn State-tight end record 146 yards. Warren topped Matt Kranchick's 136 yards against Wisconsin in 2003 and earned his second career 100-yard receiving game. Warren ranks third among FBS tight ends in receiving yards per game (88.0) and sits second in yards per reception (16.0) among tight ends with 11+ receptions.
- **GENERATING EXPLOSIVE PLAYS:** Penn State tallied nine plays of 20-plus yards against Bowling Green, giving PSU 14 plays of 20-plus yards this season. The Nittany Lions lead the country in percentage of 15-plus yard pass plays (34.21) and rank fifth in big play percentage (22.22), while sitting third in percentage of 40-plus yard plays (4.27), fifth in 10-plus yard plays (29.91) and sixth in 20-plus yard plays (11.97). PSU is fourth in yards per completion (17.56).
- THE OPPOSITION: Kent State is 0-3 to begin the 2024 season after falling at No. 7/9 Tennessee last
 Saturday. The Golden Flashes tallied 112 total yards. JD Sherrod led the rushing attack with 56 yards on
 seven carries. Rocco Nicholl paced Kent State with 10 tackles.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- He is one of three current FBS head coaches (Dabo Swinney, Clemson; Gus Malzahn, UCF) to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his
 first nine seasons as a head coach and one of four (Swinney; Malzahn; Mike Gundy, Oklahoma State) to do so in 12 of their first 13 seasons.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He joins Mack Brown (UNC), Kirby Smart (Georgia) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson) as the only active coaches in college football to have won at least three New Year's Six or College Football Playoff games in their career.
- Franklin has led his teams to four Top 10 finishes (4 at Penn State) and eight Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 6 at Penn State).
- In the last eight seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least six times, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- · Franklin has 29 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 13 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 107 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is first all-time in total wins and winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins).

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- In 2023, Penn State posted a 10-win season for the second-straight year and reached the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl after finishing 10th in the College Football Playoff Rankings. PSU put together one of its top defensive performances in school history, leading the country in sacks (49) and rushing defense (75.5), while finishing second in total defense (246.7), tackles for loss (111) and fewest first downs allowed (13.9) and third in scoring defense (13.5). The 49 sacks were a school record.
- Penn State defeated No. 8/7/10 Utah, 35-21, in the 109th Rose Bowl Game to cap off the 2022 season. The Nittany Lions reached the 11-win plateau for the 19th time in program history.
- Penn State earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in 2021. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- In 2020, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear
 Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked
 ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear"
 Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall
 record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway
 Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first
 outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as
 Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the
 Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in **2015** and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Olumuyiwa Fashanu (2023), Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th, 19th and 20th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- In 2023 and 2024, Penn State Football partnered with Soles4Souls, whose mission is to turn unwanted shoes and clothing into opportunities, keeping them from going to waste and providing reliefs, creating jobs and empowering people to break the cycle of poverty.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.

LAST MEETING MCSORLEY LEADS NO. 11/10 PENN STATE PAST KENT STATE, 63-10

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Senior quarterback Trace McSorley accounted for five touchdowns as No. 11/10 Penn State totaled 643 yards of total offense in a 63-10 victory over Kent State..

For the Penn State offense, McSorley threw for 229 yards and two touchdowns and ran for 54 yards and a caréer-high-tying three touchdowns. His top target was DeAndre Thompkins, who made four catches for 101 yards, including a diving 40-yard reception in the end zone. On the ground, seven Penn Staters combined for 297 yards with Miles Sanders posting 86 yards on 14 carries, while Mark Allen, Ricky Slade and Johnathan Thomas each rushed for a touchdown.

The Penn State defense held the up-tempo Kent State offense to 221 yards, with just 41 yards allowed on the ground. Cam Brown led the unit with seven tackles, while Penn State totaled seven sacks, led by Shareef Miller and Jayson Oweh with 2.0 each. Miller also led the team with 3.0 tackles for loss.

Despite a 56-yard touchdown pass to Hamler getting nullified by a holding penalty on the second play of the game, Penn State managed to score on the game's opening drive. The Nittany Lions were forced to punt after the penalty, but a roughing the kicker penalty gave the Lions a second chance, and McSorley delivered with a 40-yard touchdown toss to Thompkins, who made a diving catch in the back of the end zone.

Kent State tied the game with a 47-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Barrett to Carrigan on its ensuing possession, and then recovered an onside kick to keep the ball on offense. Penn State forced a three-and-out and McSorley rushed for touchdowns on Penn State's next two offensive possessions for a 21-7 lead.

Kent State's Elvis Hines made a pick at the Penn State 33 and returned it to the 7, but the Penn State defense limited the Flashes to a field goal with 35 seconds remaining in the half after not yielding a yard. Hamler returned the kickoff 52 yards to the Kent State 43. The 25 seconds remaining in half was plenty for McSorley, who completed an 8-yard pass to Thompkins and a 22-yarder to Hamler to advance to the 13. After an incompletion and Kent State timeout, McSorley called his own number again for a 13-yard rush across the goal line, giving Penn State 28-10 lead at the break

It was all Penn State in the second half. Allen and Slade both rushed for touchdowns before the midpoint of the third quarter, and McSorley connected with

Polk on a 41-yard touchdown strike late in the quarter for a 49-10 lead. George broke open for a 95-yard touchdown pass from Clifford, the longest play in Penn State history, midway through the fourth quarter, and Thomas capped the scoring with a 15-yard touchdown run in the final minutes for the final margin.

- Over the last three seasons, Kotelnicki's Kansas offense was explosive, ranking 12th in the country in 20+ yard plays (8.3%), 15th in 30+ yard plays (3.89%) and 11th in 40+ yard plays (2.12%) during that span.
- Additionally, KU ranked 10th in the country in 15+ yard pass plays (20.97%) over the last three years.
- The Kansas offense was efficient in the red zone and on third downs over the last three seasons, ranking 11th in red zone touchdown percentaage (68.24) and 16th in third down conversion percentage (44.9).
- The Jayhawks scored 40+ points in nine games in during the three-year window and 50+ points in five games.
- Kansas reached the 400 total yards mark in 20 games and 500 total yards in 11 games, while rushing for 200 yards in 16 games and 300 yards in three games.

ALLEN HIRED AS PENN STATE DC

- Tom Allen joined Penn State after spending seven seasons as head coach at Indiana.
- The 2020 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year, Allen brings 32 years of coaching experience to Happy Valley.
- During his last 28 seasons, Allen's teams have posted a combined record of 255-117 (.685).
- Allen joined the Hoosiers in 2016 as associate head coach/ defense and engineered the biggest defensive turnaround in the nation
- From 2015-17 the Hoosiers had the most improved defense nationally in total defense (-169.4) and passing defense (-134.1), the sixth-most improved in third-down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ppg).
- In his eight-year tenure at Indiana, IU ranked top five in the Big Ten in third down defense in five seasons and in the Top 15 nationally twice. The Hoosiers ranked sixth in the Big Ten in third down defense (36.6%) during the eight-year span.
- Allen coached four defensive All-Americans (Tiawan Mullen, 2020; Aaron Casey, 2023; Tegray Scales, 2017; Micah McFadden, 2020) and 35 All-Big Ten honorees.

HOME SWEET HOME

- With a 317-81 all-time record in Beaver Stadium, Penn State owns the sixth-best record in its venue amongst current FBS schools and leads the Bin Ten.
- Penn State averaged 108,409 fans in seven home games in 2023, which is the second-highest single-season average attendance in Beaver Stadium history and is the highest since record 108,917 average in 2007.
- The Nittany Lions welcomed 110,856 fans against Michigan in 2023. It is the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history. This season, Penn State has recorded attendances numbers of 110,747 (vs. West Virginia), 110,830 (vs. lowa) and 110,856 (vs. Michigan).
- The 2023 Penn State White Out attendance was 110,830, which is the third-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history behind only the 110,889 from the 2018 Penn State White Out game against Ohio State and 110,856 against Michigan in 2023.
- Only Alabama (.842) and Oklahoma (.818) have higher winning percentages in facilities older than Beaver Stadium.

TEAM NOTES

LUSTIG TABBED SPECIAL TEAMS COORD.

- Justin Lustig, a 2022 Broyles Award nominee, enters his first season as Penn State's special teams coordinator, outside linebackers and nickels coach.
- Lustig spent three seasons at Vanderbilt, serving as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach. He was promoted from assistant head coach to associate head coach following the 2021 season.
- During his career, Lustig has mentored 53 All-conference selections, including the 2018 Lou Groza Award recipient Andre Szmyt at Syracuse, 2023 Ray Guy Award finalist Matthew Hayball at Vanderbilt and two-time All-SEC long snapper Wesley Schelling with the Commodores.
- As a team in 2023, Vanderbilt was one of 20 programs in the country to block multiple punts and finished 11th nationally in net punting.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2023 season was the 23rd-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State is 62-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 21-11 at home, 29-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

ON TV

- Penn State has had 361 of its last 363 games televised, including 257 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, CBS, NBC, Peacock or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 342 regular season TV appearances since 1995.
- · Penn State games averaged 3.66 million viewers in 2023.
- The Nittany Lions played in three of the Top 25 most-watched games in 2023, including Penn State-Ohio State (9.96 million viewers; FOX), Penn State-Michigan (9.16; FOX) and Penn State-Ole Miss (7.77: ESPN).

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. lowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

POSLUSZNY TABBED COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMER

- Penn State national award winner and two-time first-team All-America linebacker Paul Posluszny has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as part of the 2024 class.
- Posluszny will be inducted to the Hall of Fame December 10, 2024 at the 66th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner in Las Vegas.
- Posluszny is the 27th member (21 players, 6 coaches) of the Penn State football family to be elected to the College Hall of Fame. Linebacker LaVar Arrington was the most recent player inductee in 2022.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006.
- A native of Aliquippa, Pennsylvania, he was selected a first-team honoree by the Associated Press, Football Writers Association of America, Sporting News and Walter Camp Football Foundation in 2005 and the Associated Press and Walter Camp Football Foundation in 2006.
- Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player,
- In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor.

CARTER, DOZIER ON HALL OF FAME **BALLOT**

- Penn State lettermen Ki-Jana Carter and D.J. Dozier have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2025.
- A native of Westerville, Ohio, Carter was selected a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign.
- He staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in all-purpose yardage (158.4). Carter led the Big Ten Conference in all three categories.
- Carter's 7.8 yards per carry easily was the best among the nation's Top 25 rushers.
- A tailback, Dozier matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. and earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986.
- Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86, and ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt.
- Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and scored 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad.

JONES, HAM TEAM UP FOR 25TH SEASON

- In 2024, Steve Jones and Jack Ham are set to team up for their 25th season as the play-by-play voice and color analyst, respectively, on the Penn State Sports Network.
- The pair began working on Penn State football radio broadcasts in 2000.
- The 2023 Peach Bowl against Ole Miss was the duo's 300th
- Jones is a 1980 Penn State graduate and also serves as the playby-play voice of Penn State Men's Basketball.
- Jones began his time with the Penn State Radio Network in 1983 and worked on Penn State football pregame, halftime and postgame shows before taking over as play-by-play announcer in 2000.

- Ham, an All-American in 1970, became the 10th Nittany Lion to be enshrined in the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in 1990.
- Ham was the first Penn state product in both the College Football and Pro Football Halls of Fame after a nine-time All-Pro career as a linebacker for the Pittsburgh Steelers.

TRUSTEES APPROVE BEAVER STADIUM **RENOVATION PLANS**

- The Penn State Board of Trustees on May 21 approved in investing in the renovation of Beaver Stadium, which will grow revenue-generating opportunities, transform the fan and community experience, and fuel the future funding for all 31 athletics programs at Penn State.
- The approved renovations will enable year-round use of Beaver Stadium, further driving economic growth and development in the surrounding region.
- Since January 2024, when the initial expenditure for the Beaver Stadium renovation was approved, steps have been underway at the stadium and will continue leading up to the 2024 college football season.
- Initial construction has prioritized safety and accessibility through the widening of select concourses and the installation of new escalators, as well as field lighting performance and videoboard replacements.
- Winterization work also is ongoing, which entails the insulation of pipes and other upgrades to allow the building to be occupied when temperatures are below freezing, giving Penn State the ability to host a College Football Playoff game beginning in 2024 and other potential events beyond Penn State football games in the winter months.
- After the 2024 season, the project plans encompass three distinct phases over the course of the next three football offseasons and will offer a new mix of seating options and improved amenities, such as restrooms and concessions.
- A new welcome center is planned for the community that will include a 21,000-square-foot facility for events and many other uses, serve as a connection point for all in the community, and augment enrollment efforts for prospective students and future student-athletes.
- The campus visit experience continues to be one of the most important drivers for prospective students, and the new center enables customization by leveraging technology to create visits that are personalized, immersive and showcase Penn State's areas of distinction.

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is third in the Big Ten in red zone touchdown percentage (66.82; 11th nationally) and scoring offense (34.33; 15th), sixth in total offense (423.96; 33rd), points per possession (2.19; 18th), touchdown percentage (31.96; 16th), scoring percentage (41.12; 20th), yards per pass attempt (7.80; 32nd) and yards per play (6.02; 37th).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.18; 2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.36; 6th) and holds fourth in 40-plus (1.91; 19th), 50-plus (0.96: 32nd) and 60-plus (0.51; 32nd) and sixth in 20-plus (7.50; 28th) and 30-plus (3.42; 36th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 offensive plays of 20 or more yards in seven of the last nine seasons (67 in 2022; 57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (9-game schedule)
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are fifth in the Big Ten and 22nd nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.0 percent).
- Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing 45 times in the **James Franklin** era. PSU is 40-5 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has recorded 200 passing yards on 84 occasions. Penn State is 63-21 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has tallied 400 total yards on 71 occasions. Penn State is 58-13 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State is 46-1 when leading by 10+ points at halftime
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is first in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.11 margin (1.96 gained per game; 0.85 lost per game).
- Over the last three seasons, Penn State is averaging 8.07 points per game off turnovers, ranking first in the nation, and had 95 points off turnovers in 2023.
- Against West Virginia, Penn State rushed for 222 yards, averaging 5.3 yards per carry, and threw for 235 yards, averaging 19.6 yards per completion.
- The Nittany Lions tallied seven pass plays of 15+ yards and eight run plays of 10+ yards.
- Penn State had four plays of 40+ yards, including a 50-yard touchdown pass from Drew Allar to Harrison Wallace III, a 55-yard pass from Allar to Omari Evans and a pair of 40-yard runs (one for a touchdown) by Nicholas Singleton.
- $\bullet \quad \text{The Nittany Lions did not allow a sack against the Mountaineers}.$
- In the second quarter, Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a quarter since Trace McSorley in 2016 against Michigan State (third quarter).
- Wallace had five catches for a career-high 117 yards and a career-best two touchdown receptions.
- Against Bowling Green, the Nittany Lions had nine plays of 20+ yards on Saturday (five passes, four rushes).
- Penn State had two 100-yard rushers (Singleton, 119; RB Kaytron Allen, 101), marking the second time in their careers that Singleton and Allen both rushed for 100 yards in a game.

- On the season, Penn State has 14 plays of 20+ yards this season (eight passes, six rushes).
- Penn State ranks first in the country in pass efficiency (209.67), fourth in yards per completion (17.56) and 22nd in rushing yards per game (228.0).
- In 2024, Penn State has been one of the most explosive offenses in the country, ranking fifth in 10-plus yard play percentage (29.91), sixth in 20-plus (11.97) and third in 40-plus (4.27).
- Penn State is first in the nation in percentage of 15+ yard pass plays (34.21), 13th in 12+ yard runs (16.46) and fifth in big play percentage (22.22).
- Through week two, Allar ranks fifth in the nation and second in the Big Ten with a 89.0 quarterback rating (QBR).
- He's also fourth in the country in yards per pass attempts (11.35), fourth in yards per completion (17.5) and sixth in passing efficiency (199.4).
- Singleton ranks second in the nation in yards per carry (8.96; leads B1G), eighth in all-purpose yards per game (158.0) and 13th in rushing yards per game (116.5).
- He is tied for the nation's lead in 40+ yard runs (3), while tying fourth in 30+ yard runs (3) and tying eighth in 20+ yard runs (3).
- Among FBS tight ends, in 2024, TE Tyler Warren ranks third in receiving yards per game (88.0; 1st in B1G), sixth in receiving yards (176; 2nd) and 11th in receptions (11; 3rd).
- He is the one of two FBS tight ends with 11+ targets who has a 100% catch percentage and sits second in yards per reception (16.0) among FBS tight ends with 11+ receptions.
- Warren ranks sixth in 10+ yard catches (8), tied-third in 15+ yard catches (6) and tied-fifth in 25+ yard catches (2).
- Andy Kotelnicki is in his first season as Penn State's offensive coordinator.
- Over the last 10 seasons as an offensive coordinator, Kotelnicki's
 offenses lead the nation in lowest sack percentage (3.9) and
 lowest tackle for loss percentage (8.1).
- Kotelnicki's offenses are third in the nation in rushing touchdowns per game (2.13), yards per rush (4.74), rushing yards per game (191.52), rushing yards per season (2,028.3) and rushing touchdowns per season (23.0) over that span.
- Over the last 10 seasons as an OC, Kotelnicki's offenses are second in points per play (0.46), yards per play (6.00), third down conversion percentage (42.0) and 40+ yard play percentage (1.97), third in touchdown percentage (29.64) and fourth in red zone touchdown percentage (65.29).
- Penn State has scored 40 points 32 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

QUARTERBACK NOTES

- Junior quarterback **Drew Allar** is on watch lists for the Davey O'Brien Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award and Maxwell Award.
- Allar was selected honorable mention All-Big Ten by the coaches and media in 2023.
- In his career, the Ohio native has completed 60.1 percent of his passes (292-of-486) for 3,395 yards and 34 touchdowns (three interceptions) and added 309 rushing yards and six rushing touchdowns.
- He ranks first in school history in career interception percentage (0.62), third in completion percentage (60.1), fourth in touchdown pass percentage (6.99) and fifth in pass efficiency (140.6).
- He also sits 11th in school history with 34 career touchdown passes, 13th with 40 touchdowns responsible for, 16th with 486 career pass attempts, 17th with 3,395 career passing yards and 18th with 3,704 career total vards.
- Before an interception on his 29th pass attempt of the Indiana game in 2023, Allar tallied 311 passing attempts without an interception to start his career. Allar's 311 pass attempts without an interception to start his career is an FBS record, bettering Baylor's Robert Griffin III's 209 attempts in 2008.
- In 2024, Allar has completed 64.9 percent of his passes for 420 yards and five touchdowns, while rushing for one score.
- He has completed eight passes of 20+ yards this season.
- Through two games, Allar ranks fifth in the nation and second in the Big Ten with a 89.0 quarterback rating (QBR).
- He's also fourth in the country in yards per pass attempt (11.35), fourth in yards per completion (17.5), sixth in passing efficiency (199.4) and 43rd in passing touchdowns (5).
- Against West Virginia, Allar completed 11-of-17 passes for 216 vards and three touchdowns.
- It was his third career game with 200+ passing yards and 3+ passing touchdowns.
- All three of Allar's touchdown passes came in the second quarter, a 50-yard touchdown to Harrison Wallace III early in the frame, a 20-yard touchdown pass to Kaytron Allen and an 18-yard touchdown toss to Wallace on the final drive of the first half
- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a quarter since Trace McSorley in 2016 against Michigan State (third quarter).
- With his third touchdown pass of the day, Allar recorded the 32nd of his career, leaping Anthony Morelli (31; 2004-07) for 11th all-time at Penn State.
- He also connected with **Omari Evans** on a 55-yard pass, one of six completions over 15 yards on the day.
- In the first quarter, Allar went over the 3,000 career passing yards mark.
- Allar added six carries for 44 yards (7.3 ypc), including one run of 15 yards and two 10-yard runs.
- Allar was tabbed to the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8.
- Against Bowling Green, Allar threw for 204 yards on 13 completions.
- He scored on a 5-yard rush in the first quarter and connected with Evans (29 yards) and Nicholas Singleton (14 yards) on touchdown passes.

- Allar completed five passes of 20+ yards.
- Allar in 2023 is one of two FBS quarterbacks ever, joining Tennessee's Hendon Hooker in 2022, with 25+ touchdown passes and two or fewer interceptions in a season.
- In the last 10 years, only 12 FBS players (three active) have had 2,800+ total yards and four or fewer turnovers in a season, including Allar (2023), WYU's Garrett Greene (2023), Coastal Carolina's Grayson McCall (2023), Michigan's JJ McCarthy (2023), Orgon's Bo Nix (2023), Florida State's Dordan Travis (2023), BYU's Zach Wilson (2020), Kent State's Dustin Crum (2019), Arizona State's Jayden Daniels (2019), Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa (2019), Alabama's Jalen Hurts (2017) and Memphis' Paxton Lynch (2015).
- Allar began the 2023 season with 251 pass attempts without an interception. Since 2000, his 251 pass attempts without an interception are the sixth-most to start a season, trailing only Louisiana Tech's Colby Cameron (428; 2012), Oregon's Marcus Mariota (285; 2013), Western Kentucky's Tyrrell Pigrome (278; 2020), NC State's Ryan Finley (274; 2017) and West Virginia's Geno Smith (273; 2012).
- He is the only Big Ten quarterback, since 2000, to start a season with 175+ pass attempts and no interceptions.
- Allar finished second in the country in touchdown-tointerception ratio (12.5-to-1).
- Allar's 25 touchdown passes in 2023 were tied-third in a season at Penn State, while he ranked fifth in touchdowns responsible for (29), sixth in completions (233), seventh in pass attempts (389), ninth in completion percentage (59.9) and tied-ninth in 200+ yard passing games (7).

- The Nittany Lions had 32 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2023
- Olumuyiwa Fashanu was a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman", and an National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete. He was the 20th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2023, Penn State posted a program-record 93% graduation success rate. The 93% mark tops the previous high GSR of 91% set in 2005 and is just the second time in program history topping 90%. This is the 14th consecutive year the football team has surpassed the national average GSR for its sport.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increased Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Marques Hagans is in his second season on the Penn State staff.
- Hagans joined the Penn State staff after serving as the associate head coach/wide receivers coach at Virginia for the previous 11 years. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach for the Cavaliers prior to the 2022 season.
- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 yards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams. He spent three seasons with the Rams before being picked up by the Kansas City Chiefs and Indianapolis Colts in 2008. Hagans spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns with Washington.
- Redshirt junior Harrison Wallace III has appeared in 26 career games, making eight starts, as a Nittany Lion.
- He owns 43 catches for 618 yards (14.4 average) and four touchdowns in his PSU career with a long reception of 50 yards.
- Wallace registered his first career 100-yard receiving game in the win at West Virginia.
- He hauled in five catches for 117 yards and a career-best two touchdown receptions.
- Wallace had a 50-yard catch-and-run touchdown on the first play of the second quarter.
- He added an 18-yard touchdown reception right before halftime.
- Through week two, Wallace is fifth in the Big Ten with two touchdown receptions.
- Wallace played in eight games and started six in 2023. He made 19 catches for 228 yards and a touchdown, with a long catch of 29 yards. Thirteen of Wallace's 19 catches went for first downs last season.
- Junior Omari Evans has 13 receptions for 238 yards and three touchdowns in 26 career games.
- He had two catches at West Virginia, including a 55-yard reception to setup a touchdown on the final drive of the second quarter.
- Evans hauled in a 29-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter against Bowling Green.
- Wallace (23.4) and Evans (22.2) are second and third in the Big Ten in yards per reception.
- Senior Julian Fleming transferred to Penn State from Ohio State and made his PSU debut against West Virginia.

- Theo Johnson, selected by the New York Giants in the fourth round of the 2024 NFL Draft, was Penn State's fifth tight end drafted since 2015, tied for the third-most in the FBS.
- In 2023, Penn State tight ends combined for 73 receptions, 820 receiving yards and 16 touchdowns.
- Penn State's 16 receiving touchdowns by tight ends were the most of any FBS team last season.
- Penn State was the only FBS team with multiple tight ends owning 7+ receiving touchdowns in 2023.
- Junior Tyler Warren, named All-Big Ten third team by the coaches and honorable mention by the media in 2023, has played in 42 games with 17 starts.
- · Warren is on the Mackey Award watch list.
- He owns 60 receptions for 782 yards and 12 touchdowns, while adding two rushing scores, in his career. Warren has 11 career receptions of 20+ yards and two career 100-yard games.
- He has 12 career touchdown receptions, tied for 16th all-time at Penn State and tied-third among PSU tight ends, trailing only Mike Gesicki (15; 2014-17) and Pat Freiermuth (16; 2018-20)
- Warren is one of nine FBS tight ends (two Big Ten) with 60+ receptions, 780+ receiving yards and 12+ touchdown receptions in his career.
- Among active FBS tight ends, Warren is tied-fifth in career touchdown receptions (12; 2nd in B1G), while sitting fourth among Big Ten tight ends in career receptions (60) and career receiving yards (782).
- He's also tied-eighth among active FBS tight ends, averaging 13.0 yards per reception (minimum 60 receptions).
- He has 11 receptions for 176 yards and one touchdown in 2024.
- Among FBS tight ends, in 2024, he ranks third in receiving yards per game (88.0; 1st in B1G), sixth in receiving yards (176; 2nd) and 11th in receptions (11; 3rd).

- With his second career 100-yard receiving game, Warren is now tied-second among Penn State tight ends, trailing only Ted Kwalick (1966-68). He is tied with Mickey Shuler (2; 1975-77) and Pat Freiermuth (2; 2018-20).
- Redshirt junior **Khalil Dinkins** has played in 23 career games, making nine catches for 110 yards and three touchdowns.
- In 2023, he made a 9-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter against lowa and a 9-yard touchdown grab against Indiana.
- Redshirt freshman Andrew Rappleyea made his first career start against West Virginia.
- Luke Reynolds was one of three true freshman who played in the WVU game.
- · Reynolds made his first career start against Bowling Green.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Tom Allen enters his first season as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Penn State.
- Allen, the 2020 AFCA National Coach of the Year and Big Ten Coach of the Year, brings 32 years of coaching experience to Happy Valley after spending the last eight years at Indiana, including seven as head coach.
- Allen coached four defensive All-Americans and 35 All-Big Ten honorees at Indiana.
- Thirteen Nittany Lions on defense earned All-Big Ten honors in 2023. Among the returners are DE Abdul Carter (1st as LB), DE Dani Dennis-Sutton (3rd), DT Zane Durant (HM), DT Dvon J-Thomas (HM), LB Kobe King (HM), S Jaylen Reed (HM) and S Kevin Winston Jr. (HM).
- Carter, making the switch from linebacker to defensive end, has been tabbed to Preseason All-America honors by the Action Network (1st team), Associated Press (2nd), CBS (2nd), ESPN (2nd), the Athletic (2nd) and the Walter Camp Award.
- Carter is on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy, Nagurski Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- Dennis-Sutton has also been tabbed to the Lott IMPACT Trophy watch list
- J-Thomas is on the Polynesian Player of the Year Award watch liet
- · King has been named to the Butkus Award watch list.
- · Winston is on the Bednarik Award watch list.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has held 20 opponents under 100 rushing yards, most in the FBS.
- Over the last three seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in nine games, the nation's 13th-most in that span.
- Over the last three seasons, the Nittany Lions have allowed under 10 completions in six games, tied seventh-most in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has forced 55 turnovers (29 interceptions, 26 fumbles), fifth in the nation and fourth among Power Four teams.
- Penn State's 26 fumbles recovered over the last three seasons are tied third-most in the nation and are most in the Big Ten, while the 29 interceptions are tied 25th.
- Penn State has recorded three or more takeaways in 11 games over the last three seasons, tied-most among FBS teams.
- Over the last three seasons, Penn State is 15-0 when forcing multiple takeaways in a game.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is first in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.11 margin (1.96 gained per game; 0.85 lost per game).
- Against West Virginia, the Nittany Lions forced three takeaways, including two fumbles and an interception.
- · Reed recovered a fumble in the first quarter.
- Dennis-Sutton recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter after a strip-sack by DE Smith Vilbert.
- Later in the fourth quarter, CB **Elliot Washington II** recorded his first career interception.
- The Nittany Lions added a fourth-down stop and a red zone stop in the first quarter.
- Penn State limited West Virginia to 246 yards on 66 plays (3.7 yards per play).
- The Nittany Lions held the Mountaineers to 85 rushing yards and 161 passing yards.
- PSU limited WVU to 4-of-14 on third down, including 1-of-5 on third-and-short (4 or less yards).
- Winston led PSU with 12 tackles (7 solo) and added a forced fumble to earn Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week and Bednarik Award National Player of the Week honors.
- Reed added a career-high nine tackles, a tackle for loss and a career-best two pass breakups.
- Penn State stopped Bowling Green on a fourth down conversion in the second quarter.
- The Nittany Lions held Bowling Green to six total yards in the third quarter (1 rushing, 5 passing) and 89 in the second half (27 rushing, 62 passing).

- PSU grabbed two interceptions in the fourth quarter vs. BGSU on picks by LB Tony Rojas and S Zakee Wheatley.
- On Bowling Green's opening drive, Penn State snapped a streak
 of 28-straight games not allowing a first-drive touchdown,
 dating back to the Michigan State game in 2021. It was the
 nation's longest active streak.
- The Nittany Lions snapped a streak of 15-straight regular season non-conference games not allowing more than 20 points.
- Through two games, Penn State ranks 22nd in the country in fumbles recovered (2), 26th in first downs allowed (39) and takeaways (5).
- Reed is second in the Big Ten, averaging 9.5 tackles per game.
- Penn State's 49 sacks in 2023 were a school record, bettering 47 sacks in 2018, 1999, 1998 and 1979.
- PSU led the country in 2023 in sacks (49), sacks per game (3.77), rushing defense (75.5), yards per rush (2.26), fewest first downs allowed (181) and tackles for loss per game (8.5).
- The Nittany Lions earned three shutouts in the 2023 season (31-0 vs. lowa; 63-0 vs. UMass; 42-0 at Michigan State). The last time PSU posted three shutouts in a season was 1978 (19-0 at Ohio State; 58-0 vs. TCU; 30-0 at Kentucky).
- The Nittany Lions had two shutouts against Big Ten teams in 2023 (31-0 vs. Iowa; 42-0 at Michigan State).
- Penn State held 10 opponents under 100 rushing yards last season (Delaware, 82; Illinois, 78; lowa, 20; Northwestern, 45; UMass, 64; Ohio State, 79; Indiana, 80; Maryland, -49; Rutgers, 99; Michigan State, -35).
- The Nittany Lions held four opponents to 60 or less passing yards last year (Delaware, 58; Iowa, 56; UMass, 45; Michigan, 60).
- Penn State held four opponents to 9 or less first downs last year (Delaware, 5; Iowa, 4; UMass, 9; Michigan State, 5).
- In 2023, Penn State limited lowa to four first downs, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- Penn State held lowa to 76 yards of offense, the second-fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game, and just 33 plays.
- PSU limited Maryland to -49 rushing yards. Since 1947, the -49
 rushing yards are the second-lowest allowed by a Penn State
 defense. The -49 rushing yards allowed were the fewest by an
 FBS team in a game this season.
- Since 2014, Penn State is one of four FBS teams that have allowed -49 or fewer rushing yards in a game joining San Diego State (-66 vs. Middle Tennessee State, 12/24/22), Michigan State (-73 vs. Tulsa, 8/30/19) and Arizona State (-52 vs. Washington State, 10/22/16).
- Penn State held Maryland to -40 rushing yards on 11 attempts in the first half and -49 in the game. The -49 rushing yards are Penn State's lowest allowed under James Franklin.
- Penn State held Michigan State to 53 total yards, marking the second time in the 2023 season holding an opponent to 76 or fewer yards (76 vs. lowa; 53 at MSU).
- Since 1947, the 53 total yards were Penn State's fourth-fewest allowed in a game (-47 vs. Syracuse, 1947; 25 vs. Temple, 1947; 43 vs. Pitt, 1947) and the fewest allowed in a game under Franklin.
- Since 2000, Penn State and TCU (2017 vs. Jackson State and Kansas) are the only FBS schools to hold multiple opponents to 76 total yards or fewer in a single season. Penn State is the only team to do so against two conference opponents.
- Penn State limited Michigan State to -35 rushing yards. The Nittany Lions held two opponents under -35 rushing yards last season (-49 at Maryland), the two-lowest single-game totals in the FBS in 2023.
- Since 2000, Penn State is the only FBS school to hold multiple opponents to -35 rushing yards or fewer in a single season.
- Since 1947, the -35 rushing yards are Penn State's third-fewest allowed in a game (-107 vs. Syracuse, 1947; -49 at Maryland, 2023) and the second-fewest allowed in a game in the James Franklin era.

- Over the last 10 seasons, PSU sits third nationally in sacks per game (3.09), QB hurries (993), tackles for loss percentage (11.00) and total pressures generated (1,533), fourth in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.04), sixth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.25) and ninth in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.44).
- Penn State's 358 sacks over the last nine years (2015-24) are fourth behind Clemson (409), Alabama (397) and Pitt (374).
- Over the last 10 years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.78 percent sack percentage (358 sacks on 4,042 pass plays), which ranks second in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 30 times, sixth-most among FBS teams. Twenty-two of those 30 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- Since 2015, Penn State has recorded 11 shutouts, secondmost among FBS teams. PSU is also tied for the second-most shutouts (16) in the FBS since 2007.
- The Nittany Lions lead the FBS with eight shutouts against conference opponents since 2015.
- Since 2014, PSU has held an opponent under 300 total yards 60 times, tied-sixth among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200
 passing yards in 73 games, eighth-most among FBS teams,
 and have held opponents under 100 passing yards in 22 games
 in that span, seventh-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 59 occasions, ninth-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 50 rushing yards in 22 games, tied eighth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 33 times since 2014, second-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has collected six or more sacks in a game 18 times, most among FBS teams.

- · Barnes was a three-year letterwinner at defensive end for Penn State from 2012-14 and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 2012.
- · He has helped coach 16 All-Big Ten defensive linemen, including five first-team selections and a second-team All-American in his first five seasons working with the Penn State defensive line
- Junior Abdul Carter, an All-Big Ten first team selection in 2023, is making the transition to defensive end after spending his first two seasons at linebacker.
- · Carter is on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- · He was also named a Preseason All-American by the Action Network (1st team), Associated Press (2nd team), CBS (2nd team), ESPN (2nd Team), The Athletic (2nd team) and the Walter Camp Award.
- Following the 2023 season, Carter was tabbed a second-team All-American by Sports Illustrated.
- Carter owns 112 tackles (67 solo), 17 tackles for loss, 11 sacks, three forced fumbles, an interception and 10 pass breakups in his third season in Happy Valley.
- He has three career games with 2+ tackles for loss and two games with 2+ sacks.
- Carter recorded seven tackles (five solo), one tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Bowling Green.
- In 2023, Carter notched 48 tackles (25 solo), 5.5 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, a forced fumble, an interception, five pass breakups and five QB hurries.
- · According to Pro Football Focus, Carter had a 24.1 pass rush win percentage, ranking third in the FBS among players with at least 100 pass rush snaps.
- · Sophomore DE Dani Dennis-Sutton, an All-Big Ten third team selection by the coaches last season, is a member of the Lott IMPACT Trophy watch list.
- Dennis-Sutton has tallied 46 tackles (30 solo), 9.5 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, an interception and three pass breakups as a Nittany Lion.
- · He owns two career games with multiple tackles for loss and one game with multiple sacks.
- · Dennis-Sutton recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter at West Virginia, while adding a solo tackle and a pass breakup.
- Redshirt senior+ DT Hakeem Beamon owns 19 career starts and 39 career appearances. Beamon has totaled 38 tackles, 9 tackles for loss, one sack and four pass breakups at Penn State.
- · He had a half-tackle for loss in the win at WVU.
- According to PFF, Beamon posted the highest pass rush grade (71.3) among PSU defensive tackles last season. It was the fifth-best pass rush grade (min. 175 pass-rush snaps) among Big Ten interior defensive linemen.

- Redshirt senior+ DT **Dvon J-Thomas**, selected All-Big Ten honorable mention by the media in 2023, has made 14 career starts in 45 appearances, with 65 tackles (33 solo), 10.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup in his career.
- He owns one career game with multiple tackles for loss with a career-high 2.5 vs. UMass in 2023.
- J-Thomas is on watch list for the Polynesian Player of the Year Award.
- He notched two tackles at West Virginia.
- J-Thomas recorded four tackles (2 solo) and one tackle for loss against Bowling Green.
- He tallied 26 tackles, five tackles for loss and a QB hurry in
- According to PFF, J-Thomas was tied-seventh among Big Ten interior defensive linemen with five tackles for loss or no gain
- Junior DT Zane Durant, selected All-Big Ten honorable mention by the media in 2023, has recorded 27 tackles (15 solo), eight tackles for loss, four sacks and one fumble recovery in his career.
- The Florida native has one career game with multiple tackles for loss, registering three at Northwestern in 2023.
- Durant recorded a solo sack in the third quarter and tallied 1.5 tackles for loss at West Virginia. He had four tackles (2 solo).

- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Junior Cam Miller has totaled 37 tackles, four tackles for loss, three sacks, an interception and three pass breakups in 26 games at Penn State
- He recorded three tackles at West Virginia and five stops against Bowling Green.
- Miller finished the 2023 season with 24 tackles (19 solo) to go along with four tackles for loss, three sacks, an interception and a pass breaking.
- He ranked second among FBS cornerbacks with three sacks in 2023, including two against UMass to become Penn State's first defensive back to record multiple sacks in a game since Derek Bochna had two for the Nittany Lions at West Virginia in 1992.
- Redshirt senior Jalen Kimber transferred to Penn State from Florida.
 He has appeared in 27 career games, making 12 starts.
- He owns 43 tackles (32 solo), one fumble recovery, one interception and seven pass breakups in his career.
- Kimber notched three tackles and a pass breakup at WVU, while making his first start at Penn State.
- Last season, Kimber posted 23 tackles (18 solo), a fumble recovery, five pass breakups and a QB hurry.
- According to PFF, he allowed a 55.0 completion percentage and forced eight incompletions when targeted last season.
- Sophomore AJ Harris transferred to Penn State from Georgia.
- Harris made his first collegiate start against West Virginia, recording three tackles and a pass breakup.
