NO. 9/8 PENN STATE HOSTS NO. 19/21 ILLINOIS FOR B1G OPENER

- OPENING KICK: No. 9/8 Penn State welcomes No. 19/21 Illinois for its Big Ten opener on Saturday. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. on NBC.
- NBC SATURDAY NIGHT: The Nittany Lions are set to make their first appearance on NBC this season after
 playing twice on the network in 2023. Penn State is 9-3 all-time in games broadcast on NBC.
- SERIES HISTORY: Penn State meets Illinois for the 28th time in program history. Penn State holds a 21-6
 advantage in the series and has won four of the last five matchups. In 2023, the Nittany Lions earned a
 30-13 victory in Champaign. Penn State forced five takeaways, including four interceptions and a fumble.
 Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton each scored on rushing touchdowns, while Trey Potts threw an 11yard touchdown pass to Tyler Warren.
- **BIG TEN OPENER:** The Nittany Lions are 16-15 all-time in Big Ten openers. Penn State has won its last three Big Ten openers and six of the last seven. The Nittany Lions will start Big Ten play at home for the first time since 2015 and just the second time since 2010. Illinois is tied with Wisconsin as PSU's most frequent Big Ten opener opponent with five matchups each.
- EXPLOSIVE OFFENSE: Penn State (282.7 passing; 255.0 rushing) joins Tennessee (275.8 passing; 290.0 rushing) as the only FBS teams averaging 250+ passing yards and 250+ rushing yards this season. Penn State holds seventh in the nation averaging 537.7 total yards and ranks second in the nation in big play percentage (22.73) after posting 718 yards and 40 first downs, both school records, against Kent State.
- SHUTOUT: Against Kent State, the Nittany Lions posted their 12th shutout since 2015, tied with Alabama for the most shutouts in the FBS. PSU also has the nation's most shutouts against conference opponents (8) since 2015. The Nittany Lions have notched 20 games without allowing a touchdown since 2014. Penn State joins Tennessee and Fresno State as the only FBS teams with a shutout in each of the last four seasons.
- THE OPPOSITION: No. 19/21 Illinois is 4-0 this season after earning a 31-24 win in overtime at No. 22/22
 Nebraska last weekend. Luke Altmyer threw for 215 yards and four touchdowns, connecting with Pat
 Bryant on two scores. In overtime, Altmyer hit Bryant for a 4-yard touchdown in overtime.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- He is one of three current FBS head coaches (Dabo Swinney, Clemson; Gus Malzahn, UCF) to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of four (Swinney; Malzahn; Mike Gundy, Oklahoma State) to do so in 12 of their first 13 seasons.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He joins Mack Brown (UNC), Kirby Smart (Georgia) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson) as the only active coaches in college football to have won at least three New Year's Six or College Football Playoff games in their career.
- Franklin has led his teams to four Top 10 finishes (4 at Penn State) and eight Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 6 at Penn State).
- In the last eight seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least six times, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- · Franklin has 29 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 13 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 107 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is first all-time in total wins and winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins).

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- In 2023, Penn State posted a 10-win season for the second-straight year and reached the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl after finishing 10th in the College Football Playoff Rankings. PSU put together one of its top defensive performances in school history, leading the country in sacks (49) and rushing defense (75.5), while finishing second in total defense (246.7), tackles for loss (111) and fewest first downs allowed (13.9) and third in scoring defense (13.5). The 49 sacks were a school record.
- Penn State defeated No. 8/7/10 Utah, 35-21, in the 109th Rose Bowl Game to cap off the 2022 season. The Nittany Lions reached the 11-win plateau for the 19th time in program history.
- Penn State earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in 2021. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- In 2020, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear
 Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked
 ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear"
 Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO
 Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall
 record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway
 Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first
 outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as
 Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the
 Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in **2015** and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Olumuyiwa Fashanu (2023), Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th, 19th and 20th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- In 2023 and 2024, Penn State Football partnered with Soles4Souls, whose mission is to turn unwanted shoes and clothing into opportunities, keeping them from going to waste and providing reliefs, creating jobs and empowering people to break the cycle of poverty.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.

LAST MEETING NO. 7 PENN STATE WINS BIG TEN OPENER, 30-13, OVER ILLINOIS

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State took down Illinois, 30-13, at Memorial Stadium. The Nittany Lions played complimentary football on both sides of the ball, fueled by five defensive takeaways

The defense led the way for the Nittany Lions, recording its first five-takeaway game in seven years. Penn State racked up four interceptions, by four different players, and a fumble recovery. Offensively, the Nittany Lions scored 20 points off of the five turnovers. Stout defense held the Illini in check all day, allowing just 62 yards on the ground.

Dominic DeLuca forced the first fumble of his career, the first of the Nittany Lions' five takeaways. Linebacker Abdul Carter, and cornerbacks Johnny Dixon, Daequan Hardy, and Cam Miller each secured interceptions.

Penn State's running backs were involved in all three offensive touchdowns on

the afternoon. Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton each recorded rushing scores,

while Trey Potts tossed a touchdown pass to tight end Tyler Warren.

The Nittany Lions made their first splash play of the day on their second defensive drive of the game as DeLuca forced a fumble that was picked up by Kobe King. The Nittany Lions capitalized with a 20-yard field goal.

Penn State's defense forced its second furnover in two possessions with an interception by Carter, the first of his career. Carter picked off Luke Altmyer at the

Penn State 45 yard-line and returned the ball to the Illinois 37. Alex Felkins knocked

through a 45-yard field goal to increase the Nittany Lion lead to 6-0.

The Nittany Lion defense recorded its third turnover in the first quarter on the Illini's next drive. Hardy picked off an Altmyer pass at the Penn State 43 yard-line and the offense proceeded to use 12 plays to march 57 yards for its first touchdown

of the ballgame as Allen punched in the 4-yard score. Reggie Love III put the Illini on the board with a 5-yard touchdown run with 2:08 left to play in the half, but the Nittany Lions were able to tack on an additional field goal before halftime to go up 16-7 at the break.

Both defenses stood tall through the first 10-plus minutes of the quarter before the Nittany Lions were able to break through for their second touchdown of the afternoon to go up 23-7. Potts caught a lateral from Allar and tossed an 11-yard touchdown pass to the tight end, Warren.

On the ensuing Illinois possession, the Nittany Lions intercepted Altmyer for the fourth time, this time by Miller. Penn State wasted no time, scoring in just over a minute on a 16-yard rushing touchdown by Singleton.

Illinois found the end zone one more time in the game, scoring on a 19-yard reception by Malik Elzy from quarterback John Paddock at the 4:21 mark of the fourth quarter. A failed two-point conversion left the score at 30-13.

- The Nittany Lions own a 74-24-5 record in 103 games in front of the alumni crowd since their 14-7 victory over Dartmouth in the first Homecoming game on Oct. 9, 1920.
- In 2023, Penn State won 63-0 against UMass.
- Penn State has won nine out of its last 12 Homecoming tilts, defeating UMass (2023), Minnesota (2022), Purdue (2019), Rutgers (2017), Maryland (2016), Indiana (2015), Michigan (2013), Northwestern (2012) and Purdue (2011).
- The Nittany Lions have claimed 15 of their last 18 contests in front of the alumni crowd

GENERATIONS OF GREATNESS

- Penn State is turning back the clock for its "Generations of Greatness" game, as the Nittany Lions will don uniforms with design elements from uniforms past.
- Penn State is wearing its "Generations of Greatness" uniforms for the seventh time in the last eight seasons. The threads debuted in 2017 against Indiana (W, 45-14) and Penn State donned them again against Purdue in 2019 (W, 35-7), lowa in 2020 (L, 21-42), Illinois in 2021 (L, 18-20, 90T), Minnesota in 2022 (W, 45-17) and UMass in 2023 (W, 63-0).

Uniform Elements

- Numbers on Helmets The Nittany Lions had the number on the side of their helmet from 1959-61 and then again from 1967-74. A No. 42 also appeared on the side of every Penn State helmet in the season finale against Wisconsin in 2012 to honor injured senior Michael Mauti.
- Block Uniform Numbers The block uniform numbers are similar to those uniform numbers that donned the Blue & White from mid-1950s-66.
- White Stripe on Sleeve Penn State's uniform had a white stripe on the sleeve several times, including 1957-66, 1982-89 and 1992-2011
- Stripe on the Pants The Nittany Lions had a blue stripe on their pants from 1952-68.
- Gray Facemask The gray facemask was donned by the Nittany Lions from 1959-86.
- White Cleats The white cleats were worn by the Nittany Lions in the 1979 Sugar Bowl.
- Gloves The gloves will feature the Lion Shrine on the palm of the hands
- Lion Shrine The image of Lion Shrine appears on the "home plate" of the front of the jersey. It is an original element of the "Generations of Greatness" uniform to pay homage to the Lion Shrine that was a gift from the Class of 1940.
- Back Inside Collar The back inside collar of the jersey reads "Penn State 1959" in recognition of the first Liberty Bowl game, played in Philadelphia. Penn State defeated Alabama, 7-0.

- Penn State redshirt freshman DT Joseph Mupoyi and sophomore CB Zion Tracy and Illinois junior DB Miles Scott all played at St. Thomas More High School in Connecticut.
- Penn State redshirt junior LS Tyler Duzansky and Illinois junior DB Grayson Griffin and Illinois redshirt freshman OL TJ McMillen all played at St. Francis Prep in Illinois.
- Penn State junior RB Kaytron Allen and Illinois redshirt sophomore WR Weston Adams both played at IMG Academy in Florida.

- Penn State redshirt senior WR Jake Spencer and Illinois senior DB Sage Luther both played at Colgate University from 2020-21.
- Penn State freshman WR Tyseer Denmark, freshman CB Kenny Woseley Jr. and redshirt sophomore LB Keon Wylie and Illinois freshman OL Zafir Stewart all played at Imhotep Charter in Pennsylvania.

ILLINOIS COACH CONNECTIONS

- Penn State offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Marques Hagans and Illinois outside linebackers coach Clint Sintim coached together at Virginia from 2020-22. Hagans was the wide receivers coach (2020-21) and associate head coach/wide receivers coach (2022), while Sintim was defensive line coach (2020-21) and linebackers coach (2022).
- Penn State co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach Anthony
 Poindexter and Illinois co-defensive coordinator/defensive
 line coach Terrance Jamison coached together at Purdue in
 2020. Poindexter was co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach,
 while Jamison was the defensive line coach.
- Penn State analyst Robb Smith coached under Illinois head coach Bret Bielema at Arkansas from 2014-16. Smith was the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach.
- Smith also coached at Arkansas with Illinois defensive coordinator/secondary coach Aaron Henry from 2014-15 and Illinois offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Barry Lunney Jr. from 2014-16. Henry was a defensive graduate assistant, while Lunney was the tight ends coach.

KENT STATE NOTES

- Penn State posted 718 yards of total offense and allowed 66 total yards on defense, a difference of 652 yards. The difference is the most for a Penn State team since 1947 and according to ESPN Stats & Info, the highest yard differential in the FBS in the last 20 years.
- Penn State had a school-record 718 yards of offense. The previous record was 711 yards vs. Susquehanna in 1926.
- The Nittany Lions had a school-record 40 first downs. The previous record was 38 vs. West Virginia in 1962.
- PSU had eight different players score a touchdown in a game for the first time since eight scored against Georgia State in 2017.
- Penn State's 409 passing yards are the fifth-highest in school history and the most since the Nittany Lions had 429 passing yards vs. Villanova in 2021.
- Between the second and third quarters, Penn State scored four touchdowns in a 7:36 span, while covering 319 yards.
- Penn State had three different players (QB Drew Allar, QB Beau Pribula, TE Tyler Warren) throw a passing touchdown in the same game since 2008 in a 55-13 win over Syracuse (QB Daryll Clark, QB Pat Devlin, QB Paul Cianciolo).
- Warren threw a 17-yard touchdown pass to Nicholas Singleton in the second quarter. It was Warren's first career touchdown

 Dass
- Warren is the first non-PSU quarterback with a passing and receiving touchdown in the same game since WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith against Michigan State in 2022.
- Penn State held Kent State to 66 yards of offense (48 rushing, 18 passing), tied for the seventh-fewest since 1947. It is the fewest yards allowed by the Nittany Lions since holding Michigan State to 53 yards of total offense in 2023.
- The Nittany Lions held Kent State to 20 total yards in the first quarter (0 pass, 20 rush) and 40 total yards in the first half (18 pass, 22 rush). Penn State held Kent State to 26 yards in the second half (0 pass, 26 rush).
- The 18 passing yards allowed are the fewest allowed by Penn State under James Franklin.
- Penn State only allowed six first downs, the fewest since allowing five at Michigan State in 2023.
- The two passing completions allowed are the second-fewest allowed under Franklin and the lowest number of completions allowed since Army had one completion in 2015.

- Penn State is 123-13-1 all-time in home openers and 55-10 in Beaver Stadium home openers, including wins in 21 of the last 23 home openers.
- On Bowling Green's opening drive, Penn State snapped a streak
 of 28-straight games not allowing a first-drive touchdown,
 dating back to the Michigan State game in 2021. It was the
 nation's longest active streak.

- The senior earned his second-career 100-yard receiving game.
 He is tied-second among Penn State tight ends, trailing only Ted
 Kwalick (1966-68). He is tied with Mickey Shuler (2; 1975-77)
 and Pat Freiermuth (2; 2018-20).
- Penn State held Bowling Green to six total yards in the third quarter (1 rushing, 5 passing).

WEST VIRGINIA NOTES

- The Nittany Lions have won six-straight matchups in the series and 34 of the last 36 contests.
- Penn State is now 114-22-2 all-time in season openers and has won 20 of its last 23 season-opening contests.
- Due to lightning in the area, the start of the second half was delayed by 2 hours and 19 minutes.
- QB Drew Allar threw three touchdown passes in the second quarter, becoming the first Penn State quarterback to throw three touchdown passes in a quarter since Trace McSorley against Michigan State in 2016 (third quarter – Chris Godwin 34 yards, Mike Gesicki 45 yards, Godwin 59 yards).
- Penn State forced three turnovers, including two fumbles and an interception.
- S Kevin Winston Jr. tied a career high with 12 tackles (7 solo), earning his third career double-digit tackle game.
- Winston claimed Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- in the fourth quarter, DE Dani Dennis-Sutton recovered a fumble and CB Elliot Washington II picked off a pass.

STREAKING

- Penn State has not allowed a special teams touchdown in 64-straight games, dating back to the start of the 2019 season.
- Penn State has won 20 consecutive games against teams that are not members of a Power Four conference.

- Penn State has won 22 consecutive games over non-conference opponents during the regular season, dating back to a win over Temple in 2016.
- Penn State has won 27-straight non-conference home games, dating back to a win over Kent State in 2013.

DAWKINS ON GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Redshirt senior OL Nick Dawkins was named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team on Sept. 17.
- Dawkins is one of 22 student-athletes on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, which recognizes exemplary community service.
- By being one of 11 FBS players selected to the Good Works Team,
 Dawkins is also a semifinalist for the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy.

BACK-TO-BACK 10 WIN SEASONS

- In 2023, Penn State reached 10 wins in a season for the 26th time in program history and 10 regular season wins for the 21st time in program history.
- The Nittany Lions won at least 10 games in back-to-back seasons for the 12th time in program history.
- Penn State joined Alabama, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Michigan, Ohio, Ohio State, Oregon, Troy, Tulane and Washington as teams who posted 10+ win seasons in 2022 and 2023.
- The Nittany Lions reached 10 wins for the fifth time since 2016.
- Penn State is one of 11 FBS teams with at least 10 wins in at least five of the last eight seasons, joining Alabama (8), Boise State (6), Clemson (7), Georgia (6), Michigan (6), Notre Dame (5), Ohio State (7), Oklahoma (6), Troy (5) and Washington (5).

IN THE CFP RANKINGS

- Penn State opened the 2023 College Football Playoff rankings at No. 11 and finished at No. 10 in the final 2023 poll.
- Penn State is one of nine FBS teams who have appeared in each of the last 12 CFP rankings.
- With appearances in the last 12 CFP rankings, Penn State is tied for the sixth-longest active streak among FBS teams.
- The Nittany Lions have appeared in the CFP rankings 36 times since the College Football Playoff was introduced in 2014.
- Penn State has ranked among the CFP Top 10 on 20 occasions.
- Penn State has finished in the CFP Top 12 six times, ranking sixth-most among FBS teams and second among Big Ten teams.

HOME SWEET HOME

- With a 318-81 all-time record in Beaver Stadium, Penn State owns the sixth-best record in its venue amongst current FBS schools and leads the Big Ten.
- Penn State averaged 108,409 fans in seven home games in 2023, which is the second-highest single-season average attendance in Beaver Stadium history and is the highest since record 108,917 average in 2007.
- The Nittany Lions welcomed 110,856 fans against Michigan in 2023. It is the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history. This season, Penn State has recorded attendances numbers of 110,747 (vs. West Virginia), 110,830 (vs. lowa) and 110,856 (vs. Michigan).
- The 2023 Penn State White Out attendance was 110,830, which is the third-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history behind only the 110,889 from the 2018 Penn State White Out game against Ohio State and 110,856 against Michigan in 2023.
- Only Alabama (.842) and Oklahoma (.816) have higher winning percentages in facilities older than Beaver Stadium.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- With the Nittany Lions battling Illinois at 7:30 p.m. on NBC, the 2024 season marks the 24th-straight with at least one regularseason night game on the schedule.
- Penn State is 62-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 21-11 at home, 29-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

ON TV

- Penn State has had 362 of its last 364 games televised, including 258 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, CBS, NBC, Peacock or an ESPN or FOX channel.

- Penn State has made 343 regular season TV appearances since 1995
- Penn State games averaged 3.66 million viewers in 2023.
- The Nittany Lions played in three of the Top 25 most-watched games in 2023, including Penn State-Ohio State (9.96 million viewers; FOX), Penn State-Michigan (9.16; FOX) and Penn State-Ole Miss (7.77; ESPN).

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. lowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

POSLUSZNY TABBED COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMER

- Penn State national award winner and two-time first-team All-America linebacker Paul Posluszny has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as part of the 2024 class.
- Posluszny will be inducted to the Hall of Fame December 10. 2024 at the 66th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner in Las Vegas.
- Posluszny is the 27th member (21 players, 6 coaches) of the Penn State football family to be elected to the College Hall of Fame. Linebacker LaVar Arrington was the most recent player inductee in 2022.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006.
- A native of Aliquippa, Pennsylvania, he was selected a first-team honoree by the Associated Press, Football Writers Association of America, Sporting News and Walter Camp Football Foundation in 2005 and the Associated Press and Walter Camp Football Foundation in 2006.
- Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player,
- In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor.

CARTER, DOZIER ON HALL OF FAME **BALLOT**

- Penn State lettermen Ki-Jana Carter and D.J. Dozier have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2025.
- A native of Westerville, Ohio, Carter was selected a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign.
- He staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in all-purpose yardage (158.4). Carter led the Big Ten Conference in all three categories.
- Carter's 7.8 yards per carry easily was the best among the nation's Top 25 rushers.
- A tailback, Dozier matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. and earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986.
- Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86, and ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt.
- Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and scored 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad.

JONES, HAM TEAM UP FOR 25TH SEASON

- In 2024, Steve Jones and Jack Ham are set to team up for their 25th season as the play-by-play voice and color analyst, respectively, on the Penn State Sports Network.
- The pair began working on Penn State football radio broadcasts in 2000.
- The 2023 Peach Bowl against Ole Miss was the duo's 300th
- Jones is a 1980 Penn State graduate and also serves as the playby-play voice of Penn State Men's Basketball.
- Jones began his time with the Penn State Radio Network in 1983 and worked on Penn State football pregame, halftime and postgame shows before taking over as play-by-play announcer in 2000.

- Ham, an All-American in 1970, became the 10th Nittany Lion to be enshrined in the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in 1990.
- Ham was the first Penn state product in both the College Football and Pro Football Halls of Fame after a nine-time All-Pro career as a linebacker for the Pittsburgh Steelers.

TRUSTEES APPROVE BEAVER STADIUM **RENOVATION PLANS**

- The Penn State Board of Trustees on May 21 approved in investing in the renovation of Beaver Stadium, which will grow revenue-generating opportunities, transform the fan and community experience, and fuel the future funding for all 31 athletics programs at Penn State.
- The approved renovations will enable year-round use of Beaver Stadium, further driving economic growth and development in the surrounding region.
- Since January 2024, when the initial expenditure for the Beaver Stadium renovation was approved, steps have been underway at the stadium and will continue leading up to the 2024 college football season.
- Initial construction has prioritized safety and accessibility through the widening of select concourses and the installation of new escalators, as well as field lighting performance and videoboard replacements.
- Winterization work also is ongoing, which entails the insulation of pipes and other upgrades to allow the building to be occupied when temperatures are below freezing, giving Penn State the ability to host a College Football Playoff game beginning in 2024 and other potential events beyond Penn State football games in the winter months.
- After the 2024 season, the project plans encompass three distinct phases over the course of the next three football offseasons and will offer a new mix of seating options and improved amenities, such as restrooms and concessions.
- A new welcome center is planned for the community that will include a 21,000-square-foot facility for events and many other uses, serve as a connection point for all in the community, and augment enrollment efforts for prospective students and future student-athletes.
- The campus visit experience continues to be one of the most important drivers for prospective students, and the new center enables customization by leveraging technology to create visits that are personalized, immersive and showcase Penn State's areas of distinction.

- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.18; 2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.36; 5th) and holds fourth in 40-plus (1.91; 20th), 50-plus (0.96: 34th) and 60-plus (0.51; 32nd) and sixth in 20-plus (7.49; 27th) and 30-plus (3.44; 34th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 offensive plays of 20 or more yards in seven of the last nine seasons (67 in 2022; 57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (9-game schedule)
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are fifth in the Big Ten and 21st nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.16 percent).
- Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing 46 times in the **James Franklin** era. PSU is 41-5 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has recorded 200 passing yards on 85 occasions. Penn State is 64-21 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has tallied 400 total yards on 72 occasions. Penn State is 59-13 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State is 47-1 when leading by 10+ points at halftime
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is first in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.03 margin (1.90 gained per game; 0.87 lost per game).
- Over the last three seasons, Penn State is averaging 7.79 points per game off turnovers, ranking first in the nation.
- Against West Virginia, Penn State rushed for 222 yards, and threw for 235 yards, tallying seven pass plays of 15+ yards and eight run plays of 10+ yards.

- In the second quarter, Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a quarter since Trace McSorley in 2016 against Michigan State (third quarter).
- Against Bowling Green, PSU had two 100-yard rushers (Singleton, 119; RB Kaytron Allen, 101).
- Penn State's +652 yard differential in the Kent State game (718 gained, 66 allowed) is a school record and, according to ESPN Stats & Info, is the highest in any game in the last decade and the highest against an FBS opponent in the last 20 seasons.
- Penn State had a school record 718 yards of offense, topping the previous record of 711 yards vs. Susquehanna in 1926.
- The Nittany Lions had a school record 40 first downs. The previous record was 38 vs. West Virginia in 1962.
- Penn State's 409 passing yards against Kent State are the fifthhighest total in school history.
- PSU had eight different players score a touchdown in a game for the first time since eight scored against Georgia State in 2017.

- Between the second and third quarters, Penn State scored four touchdowns in a 7:36 span, while covering 319 yards.
- Penn State had three different players (Allar, QB Beau Pribula, TE Tyler Warren) throw a passing touchdown in the same game since 2008 vs. Syracuse (QB Daryll Clark, QB Pat Devlin, OB Paul Cianciolo).
- On the season, Penn State has 19 plays of 20+ yards (13 passes, six rushes).
- Penn State (282.7 passing; 255.0 rushing) and Tennessee (275.8 passing; 290.0 rushing) are the only two FBS teams averaging 250+ passing yards and 250+ rushing yards.

- Kotelnicki's offenses are second in the nation in rushing touchdowns per game (2.18) and third in yards per rush (4.75), rushing yards per game (194.22), rushing yards per season (2,059.2) and rushing touchdowns per season (23.3) over that span.
- Over the last 10 seasons as an OC, Kotelnicki's offenses are tiedfirst in points per play (0.47), second in yards per play (6.26), third down conversion percentage (46.38) and 40+ yard play percentage (1.96), third in touchdown percentage (30.02) and fourth in red zone touchdown percentage (65.84).

- Junior quarterback Drew Allar is on watch lists for the Davey O'Brien Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award and Maxwell Award.
- Allar was selected honorable mention All-Big Ten by the coaches and media in 2023.
- In his career, the Ohio native has completed 60.9 percent of his passes (309-of-507) for 3,704 yards and 37 touchdowns (three interceptions) and added 335 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.
- He ranks first in school history in career interception percentage (0.59), second in completion percentage (60.9) and pass efficiency (145.2) and third in touchdown pass percentage (7.29)
- He also sits 10th in school history with 37 career touchdown passes, 11th with 44 touchdowns responsible for, 14th with 507 career pass attempts and 3,704 career passing yards and 15th with 4.039 career total vards.
- Since 1956, Allar is the only FBS quarterback with 500+ pass attempts, 35+ passing touchdowns and 3 or less interceptions in their career.
- Before an interception on his 29th pass attempt of the Indiana game in 2023, Allar tallied 311 passing attempts without an interception to start his career. Allar's 311 pass attempts without an interception to start his career is an FBS record, bettering Baylor's Robert Griffin III's 209 attempts in 2008.
- In 2024, Allar has completed 70.7 percent of his passes for 729 yards and eight touchdowns, while rushing for two scores.
- He has completed 13 passes of 20+ yards this season.
- Through three games, Allar ranks fifth in the nation and second in the Big Ten with a 90.3 quarterback rating (QBR).
- He also ranks second in the nation in passing efficiency (218.3; 1st in B1G), second in yards per completion (17.78; 1st), second in yards per attempt (12.57; 1st).
- Allar's also 12th in points responsible for per game (20.0; 1st), 15th in completion percentage (70.7; 7th), 20th in passing touchdowns (8; 2nd) and 34th in total offense (268.7; 5th).
- Against West Virginia, Allar completed 11-of-17 passes for 216 yards and three touchdowns.
- All three of Allar's touchdown passes came in the second quarter, a 50-yard touchdown to Harrison Wallace III early in the frame, a 20-yard touchdown pass to Kaytron Allen and an 18-yard touchdown toss to Wallace on the final drive of the first half.
- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a quarter since Trace McSorley in 2016 against Michigan State (third quarter).
- He also connected with **Omari Evans** on a 55-yard pass, one of six completions over 15 yards on the day.
- In the first quarter, Allar went over the 3,000 career passing vards mark.
- Allar added six carries for 44 yards (7.3 ypc), including one run of 15 yards and two 10-yard runs.
- Allar was tabbed to the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8.
- Against Bowling Green, Allar threw for 204 yards on 13 completions.
- He scored on a 5-yard rush in the first quarter and connected with Evans (29 yards) and Nicholas Singleton (14 yards) on touchdown passes.

- Allar completed five passes of 20+ yards.
- Against Kent State, Allar threw for 309 yards, his second career 300-yard game, and three touchdowns, while rushing for a 5-yard score.
- He connected on touchdown passes with Tyler Warren (16 yards), Liam Clifford (14 yards) and Evans (59 yards).
- He completed five passes of 20+ yards, including four passes of 38+ yards.
- It was his fourth career game with 200+ passing yards and 3+ passing touchdowns.
- Allar in 2023 is one of two FBS quarterbacks ever, joining Tennessee's Hendon Hooker in 2022, with 25+ touchdown passes and two or fewer interceptions in a season.
- In the last 10 years, only 12 FBS players (three active) have had 2,800+ total yards and four or fewer turnovers in a season, including Allar (2023), WVU's Garrett Greene (2023), Coastal Carolina's Grayson McCall (2023), Michigan's JJ McCarthy (2023), Oregon's Bo Nix (2023), Florida State's Jordan Travis (2023), BYU's Zach Wilson (2020), Kent State's Dustin Crum (2019), Arizona State's Jayden Daniels (2019), Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa (2019), Alabama's Jalen Hurts (2017) and Memphis' Paxton Lynch (2015).
- Allar began the 2023 season with 251 pass attempts without an interception. Since 2000, his 251 pass attempts without an interception are the sixth-most to start a season, trailing only Louisiana Tech's Colby Cameron (428; 2012), Oregon's Marcus Mariota (285; 2013), Western Kentucky's Tyrrell Pigrome (278; 2020), NC State's Ryan Finley (274; 2017) and West Virginia's Geno Smith (273; 2012).
- He is the only Big Ten quarterback, since 2000, to start a season with 175+ pass attempts and no interceptions.
- Allar finished second in the country in touchdown-tointerception ratio (12.5-to-1).
- Allar has 12 career games with multiple touchdown passes, seven games with three or more touchdown passes and two games with four touchdown passes.
- He has 10 career 200-yard passing games and two 300-yard passing games.
- The Ohio native owns six career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown.
- Quarterback Beau Pribula also enters his third season with the Nittany Lions. He has played in 14 games at Penn State.
- Pribula has 18 completions for 251 yards and six touchdowns as a Nittany Lion, while adding 411 rushing yards and seven scores.
- He ranks 11th all-time among Penn State quarterbacks with 411 rushing yards.
- · He has three games with both a passing and rushing touchdown.
- At WVU, Pribula connected on a 19-yard touchdown pass with Tyler Warren in the fourth quarter.
- He added three rushes for 25 yards, including runs of 11 and 12 vards
- Against Kent State, Pribula completed six-of-nine passes for 83 yards and a touchdwon, while adding 45 yards and a 1-yard score on the ground.
- Redshirt freshman Jaxon Smolik made his collegiate debut in the Delaware contest in 2023.

- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- A loaded running back room is led by dynamic juniors Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton.
- Singleton is on watch lists for the Doak Walker Award, Maxwell Award, Paul Hornung Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- · Allen was tabbed to the Doak Walker Award watch list.
- In 2023, Allen earned All-Big Ten second team (coaches) and third team (media honors), while Singleton was voted third team as a running back and honorable mention as a return specialist.
- Singleton (2,127) and Allen (1,956) each have over 1,950 career rushing yards.
- Penn State is one of eight FBS teams with at least two career 1,950-yard rushers on its roster.
- Penn State is the only FBS team with two career 1,950-yard rushers who have played their whole career at one school.
- Allen and Singleton are two of 12 Big Ten players with at least 1,950 career rushing yards.
- Singleton is one of 21 FBS players with 2,100+ career rushing yards and 22+ career rushing touchdowns.
- Singleton's 5.8 career rushing average is eighth among active FBS players (2nd in Big Ten) with 360+ rushing attempts.
- Singleton (5.8) and Allen (5.2) career rushing averages are second and fourth, respectively, among Big Ten players with 360+rushing attempts.
- Against Bowling Green, Singleton (119) and Allen (101) each had over 100 rushing yards, marking the second time in their career that both have gone over 100 rushing yards in the same name
- With 3,287 career all-purpose yards, Singleton ranks 22nd among active FBS players and sixth among Big Ten players.
- Singleton owns 2,127 career rushing yards, ranking 16th alltime at PSU, and 22 career rushing touchdowns, sitting 17th at PSU
- His 3,287 career all-purpose yards are good for 17th at Penn State.
- Singleton owns 20 career runs of 20+ yards, including 10 runs of 40+ yards.
- He also has 41 career receptions for 442 yards and five touchdowns.
- The PA native has seven career 100-yard rushing games and six career games with multiple rushing touchdowns.
- Singleton began his 2024 campaign by rushing for 114 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries at West Virginia.
- He averaged 8.8 yards per carry, while earning his sixth career 100-yard rushing game.
- Singleton scored on a 40-yard run in the third quarter and added another 40-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- Singleton added a 13-yard reception and 56 kick return yards to total 183 all-purpose yards.
- On a 4-yard run in the third quarter, Singleton surpassed the 3,000 career all-purpose yards mark, becoming the 21st Penn State player to reach that milestone.
- In the Bowling Green game, Singleton ran for 119 yards on 13 carries, averaging 9.2 yards per rush.
- On the day, Singleton went over 2,000 career rushing yards, becoming the 20th Penn State player to do so.
- He had two rushes of 20+ yards. including a 24-yard rush in the second quarter and a 41-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.
- Singleton added a 14-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter.

- Against Kent State, Singleton rushed for 81 yards on 11 carries, averaging 7.4 yards per rush, and had a 17-yard touchdown reception.
- Through three games, Singleton ranks fifth in the nation in yards per carry (8.49; 2nd in B1G), 15th in all-purpose yards per game (139.67; 4th) and 22nd in rushing yards per game (104.7: 5th).
- Singleton is sixth in the Big Ten in total rushing yards (314) and seventh in receiving touchdowns (2).
- He is tied-third in the nation in 40+ yard runs (3), while tying seventh in 30+ yard runs (3).
- In 2023, Singleton ranked third in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards per game (105.6) and tied-fifth in rushing touchdowns (8).
- In his third season in Happy Valley, Allen has 1,956 career rushing yards, ranking 21st all-time at Penn State, 16 career rushing touchdowns and 2,282 career all-purpose yards.
- He also owns 35 career receptions for 289 yards and three scores.
- He has three career games with multiple rushing touchdowns and five career 100-yard rushing games.
- Allen hauled in a 20-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter.
- · He added 20 yards on the ground.
- Allen finished the Bowling Green game with 101 yards on 14 carries, averaging 7.2 yards per rush.
- He had a 26-yard run on Penn State's opening drive and added a 26-yard rush in the third quarter.
- He averaged six yards per carry, totaling 66 yards on 11 carries against Kent State.
- In 2023, Allen ranked fourth in the Big Ten in yards per carrry (5.2), fifth in rushing yards (902) and tied-ninth in rushing touchdowns (6).
- Redshirt freshman Cam Wallace made his collegiate debut at West Virginia, gaining 24 yards on nine carries, including an 11-yard rush.
- He rushed for 39 yards on nine carries and scored on a 1-yard run against Kent State.
- True freshman Quinton Martin Jr. made his debut against Kent State, tallying 24 yards on seven carries.
- Redshirt junior Tyler Holworth has played in seven career games and owns nine career carries.

- In his four seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped 18 offensive linemen earn All-Big Ten honors, including six in 2023.
- Last season, Olumuyiwa Fashanu was the 2023 Big Ten Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year and a William V. Campbell Trophy Finalist.
- Fashanu was named a first-team All-American by the Associated Press, AFCA, Sporting News and the Walter Camp Football Foundation, becoming Penn State's first offensive lineman to be named a consensus All-American since Jeff Hartings in 1995.
- Fashanu (11th overall), Caedan Wallace (third round) and Hunter Nourzad (fifth round) each heard their name called in the 2024 NFL Draft, marking the first time since 1996 the Nittany Lions had three linemen drafted.
- Redshirt senior Sal Wormley has started 29 games in 33 appearances.
- He is on the Outland Trophy watch list.
- Wormley is a preseason All-America second-team selection by the Action Network.
- Redshirt senior JB Nelson, voted All-Big Ten honorable mention selection by the coaches and media in 2023, has appeared in 17 games, making eight starts.
- Redshirt sophomore Olaivavega loane, named All-Big Ten honorable mentionn selection by media in 2023, has made eight career starts in 20 appearances.
- loane is on the Polynesian Player of the Year Award watch list.
- Junior Drew Shelton has appeared in 23 games and made nine starts.
- Redshirt senior Nick Dawkins is on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and is a semifinalist for the Wuerffel Trophy. He has played in 29 career games, including three starts.
- Redshirt freshman **Anthony Donkoh** has made three starts.
- Redshirt junior Nolan Rucci made his Penn State debut in the WVU game and has played in nine collegiate games.
- Cooper Cousins and Eagan Boyer are two of 14 true freshmen who have played this season.
- Penn State did not allow a sack against West Virginia.
- The Nittany Lions gained 457 yards, averaging 7.6 yards per play, and 222 rushing yards.
- PSU had eight runs of 10+ yards vs. WVU, including a pair of 40-yard runs (one for a touchdown) by Nicholas Singleton.
- Against Bowling Green, Singleton (119) and Kaytron Allen (101) rushed for 100 yards in the same game for the second time in their careers.
- The offensive line helped PSU to set school records with 718 total yards and 40 first downs against Kent State.
- PSU notched 409 passing yards and 309 rushing yards against the Golden Flashes, while posting five passes of 20+ yards.



WINNINGEST PROGRAMS

In its 138th season of varsity football, Penn State has posted 933 victories to rank No. 7 in the nation. The Lions' success is not solely due to longevity though, as Penn State also ranks in the top 10 in all-time winning percentage.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 32 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2023.
- Olumuyiwa Fashanu was a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman", and an National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete. He was the 20th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2023, Penn State posted a program-record 93% graduation success rate. The 93% mark tops the previous high GSR of 91% set in 2005 and is just the second time in program history topping 90%. This is the 14th consecutive year the football team has surpassed the national average GSR for its sport.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increased Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Marques Hagans is in his second season on the Penn State staff.
- Hagans joined the Penn State staff after serving as the associate head coach/wide receivers coach at Virginia for the previous 11 years. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach for the Cavaliers prior to the 2022 season.
- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 yards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams. He spent three seasons with the Rams before being picked up by the Kansas City Chiefs and Indianapolis Colts in 2008. Hagans spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns with Washington.
- Redshirt junior Harrison Wallace III has appeared in 27 career games, making nine starts, as a Nittany Lion.
- He owns 46 catches for 647 yards (14.1 average) and four touchdowns in his PSU career with a long reception of 50 yards.
- Wallace registered his first career 100-yard receiving game in the win at West Virginia.
- He hauled in five catches for 117 yards and a career-best two touchdown receptions.
- Wallace had a 50-vard catch-and-run touchdown on the first play of the second quarter.
- · He added an 18-yard touchdown reception right before halftime.
- · Junior Omari Evans has 17 receptions for 354 yards and four touchdowns in 27 career games.
- He had two catches at West Virginia, including a 55-vard reception to setup a touchdown on the final drive of the second quarter.
- Evans hauled in a 29-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter against Bowling Green.
- Evans earned his first career 100-yard receiving game with four catches for 116 yards and a touchdown against Kent State. He had a 59-yard touchdown grab in the third quarter and a 38-yard reception in the second quarter.
- Evans (25.6) and Wallace (18.3) are first and eighth in the Big Ten in yards per reception. Evans ranks sixth nationally.
- Senior Julian Fleming transferred to Penn State from Ohio State and made his PSU debut against West Virginia.
- He has appeared in 42 games, including 24 starts, in his college
- Fleming has collected 82 receptions for 1,026 yards (12.1 average) and seven touchdowns in his career.
- The Pennsylvania native made his first reception at Penn State against Bowling Green and had catches of 39 and 21 yards against Kent State.
- Redshirt junior **Liam Clifford** has appeared in 28 career games, including three starts, with 24 receptions for 283 yards, one touchdown and a long reception of 38 yards.

- Co-offensive coordinator and tight ends coach Ty Howle is in his fourth season coaching the Penn State tight ends and his fifth season overall on the staff.
- He was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Theo Johnson, selected by the New York Giants in the fourth round of the 2024 NFL Draft, was Penn State's fifth tight end drafted since 2015, tied for the third-most in the FBS.
- Senior Tyler Warren, named All-Big Ten third team in 2023 and a member of the Mackey Award watch list, has played in 43 games with 18 starts.
- He owns 65 receptions for 832 yards and 13 touchdowns, while adding two rushing scores and a passing touchdown, in his career. Warren has 11 career receptions of 20+ yards and two career 100-yard games.
- He has 13 career touchdown receptions, good for 16th all-time at Penn State and third among PSU tight ends, trailing only Mike Gesicki (15; 2014-17) and Pat Freiermuth (16; 2018-20).
- He is 11th among PSU tight ends with 832 career receiving yards and 65 career receptions.
- Warren is one of five FBS tight ends (two Big Ten) with 65+ receptions, 830+ receiving yards and 13+ touchdown receptions in his career.
- Among active FBS tight ends, Warren is tied-fourth in career touchdown receptions (13; 2nd in B1G), while sitting third among Big Ten tight ends in career receptions (65) and fourth in career receiving yards (832).
- He's also third among active FBS tight ends, averaging 12.8 yards per reception (minimum 65 receptions).
- He currently has a 19-game reception streak and has at least one 14-yard catch in each of his last nine games.
- He has 16 receptions for 226 yards and two touchdowns in 2024, while adding a passing touchdown and a 16-yard rush.
- Among FBS tight ends, in 2024, he ranks second in receiving yards per game (75.3; 1st in B1G), third in yards per catch (14.1; 1st) among TEs with 15+ receptions, fourth in total receiving yards (226; 1st) and sixth in receptions (16; 2nd) and receiving touchdowns (2; T-1st).
- Warren leads FBS tight ends with a 94.1 catch percentage among TEs with 15+ targets and ranks fourth in percentage of catches for first downs (75%) among TEs with 10+ catches.
- The senior sits third among FBS tight ends in 10+ yard receptions (11; 1st in B1G) and 15+ yard receptions (7; T-2nd) and sixth in 25+ yard receptions (2; T-2nd).
- Warren had a 19-yard touchdown reception at WVU.
- Against Bowling Green, Warren posted a career-high 146 yards on a career-best eight receptions. He hauled in catches of 22, 30, 29 and 23 yards.
- His 146 receiving yards are a Penn State tight end record in a game, topping Matt Kranchick's 136 yards against Wisconsin in 2003.
- With his second career 100-yard receiving game, Warren is now tied-second among Penn State tight ends, trailing only Ted Kwalick (1966-68). He is tied with Mickey Shuler (2; 1975-77) and Pat Freiermuth (2; 2018-20).
- He was Mackey Award Tight End of the Week after the BGSU game.
- Warren tallied a 16-yard touchdown reception, a 17-yard touchdown pass and a 16-yard rush against Kent State.
- He threw a 17-yard touchdown pass, the first of his career, to Nicholas Singleton in the second quarter.
- Warren is PSU's first non-QB with a passing and receiving touchdown in the same game since KeAndre Lambert-Smith against Michigan State in 2022.
- Redshirt junior Khalil Dinkins has played in 24 career games, making 10 catches for 123 yards and four touchdowns.
- Dinkins caught a 13-yard touchdown pass against Kent State.
- Redshirt freshman Andrew Rappleyea made his first career start against West Virginia and true freshman Luke Reynolds made his first career reception against Kent State.

- Tom Allen enters his first season as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Penn State.
- Allen, the 2020 AFCA National Coach of the Year and Big Ten Coach of the Year, brings 32 years of coaching experience to Happy Valley after spending the last eight years at Indiana, including seven as head coach.
- Allen coached four defensive All-Americans and 35 All-Big Ten honorees at Indiana.
- Thirteen Nittany Lions on defense earned All-Big Ten honors in 2023. Among the returners are DE Abdul Carter (1st as LB), DE Dani Dennis-Sutton (3rd), DT Zane Durant (HM), DT Dvon J-Thomas (HM), LB Kobe King (HM), S Jaylen Reed (HM) and S Kevin Winston Jr. (HM).
- Carter, making the switch from linebacker to defensive end, has been tabbed to Preseason All-America honors by the Action Network (1st team), Associated Press (2nd), CBS (2nd), ESPN (2nd), the Athletic (2nd) and the Walter Camp Award.
- Carter is on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy, Nagurski Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- Dennis-Sutton has also been tabbed to the Lott IMPACT Trophy watch list
- J-Thomas is on the Polynesian Player of the Year Award watch liet
- · King has been named to the Butkus Award watch list.
- · Winston is on the Bednarik Award watch list.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has held 21 opponents under 100 rushing yards, most in the FBS.
- Over the last three seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in 10 games, the nation's eighth-most in that span.
- Over the last three seasons, the Nittany Lions have allowed under 10 completions in seven games, tied second-most in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has forced 55 turnovers (29 interceptions, 26 fumbles), fifth in the nation and fourth among Power Four teams.
- Penn State's 26 fumbles recovered over the last three seasons are tied fourth-most in the nation and are most in the Big Ten, while the 29 interceptions are tied 30th.
- Penn State has recorded three or more takeaways in 11 games over the last three seasons, second-most among FBS teams.
- Over the last three seasons, Penn State is 15-0 when forcing multiple takeaways in a game.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is first in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.03 margin (1.90 gained per game; 0.87 lost per game).
- Against West Virginia, the Nittany Lions forced three takeaways, including two fumbles and an interception.
- · Reed recovered a fumble in the first quarter.
- Dennis-Sutton recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter after a strip-sack by DE Smith Vilbert.
- Later in the fourth quarter, CB Elliot Washington II recorded his first career interception.
- The Nittany Lions added a fourth-down stop and a red zone stop in the first quarter.
- Penn State limited West Virginia to 246 yards on 66 plays (3.7 yards per play).
- The Nittany Lions held the Mountaineers to 85 rushing yards and 161 passing yards.
- PSU limited WVU to 4-of-14 on third down, including 1-of-5 on third-and-short (4 or less yards).
- Winston led PSU with 12 tackles (7 solo) and added a forced fumble to earn Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week and Bednarik Award National Player of the Week honors.
- Reed added a career-high nine tackles, a tackle for loss and a career-best two pass breakups.
- Penn State stopped Bowling Green on a fourth down conversion in the second quarter.

- The Nittany Lions held Bowling Green to six total yards in the third quarter (1 rushing, 5 passing) and 89 in the second half (27 rushing, 62 passing).
- PSU grabbed two interceptions in the fourth quarter vs. BGSU on picks by LB Tony Rojas and S Zakee Wheatley.
- Penn State held Kent State to 66 yards of offense (48 rushing, 18
 passing), tied for the seventh-fewest since 1947. It is the fewest
 yards allowed by the Nittany Lions since holding Michigan State
 to 53 yards of total offense in 2023.
- Penn State's +652 yard differential in the Kent State game (718 gained, 66 allowed) is a school record and, according to ESPN Stats & Info, is the highest in any game in the last decade and the highest against an FBS opponent in the last 20 seasons.
- The Nittany Lions held Kent State to 20 total yards in the first quarter (0 pass, 20 rush) and 40 total yards in the first half (18 pass, 22 rush).
- Penn State held Kent State to 26 yards in the second half (0 pass, 26 rush).
- The 18 passing yards allowed are the fewest allowed by Penn State under James Franklin.
- Penn State only allowed six first downs, the fewest since allowing five at Michigan State in 2023.
- The six first downs are the sixth-fewest allowed under Franklin.
- The two passing completions allowed are the second-fewest allowed under Franklin and the lowest number of completions allowed since Army had one completion in 2015.
- Twenty-two of Kent State's 43 plays went for no gain or negative yards.
- · Penn State tallied six tackles for loss against the Golden Flashes.
- Through three games, Penn State ranks ninth in the country in total defense (229.3) and first downs allowed (45), while sitting 10th in completion percentage allowed (51.2).
- The Nittany Lions sit 16th in the nation in rushing defense (85.0), 22nd in pass defense (144.3) and 15th in pass efficiency defense (96.31).
- Penn State is 21st in the country in scoring defense (13.0) and 28th in third down conversion defense (30.8).
- Reed is eighth in the Big Ten, averaging 7.3 tackles per game.
- Penn State's 49 sacks in 2023 were a school record, bettering 47 sacks in 2018, 1999, 1998 and 1979.
- The Nittany Lions earned three shutouts in the 2023 season (31-0 vs. lowa; 63-0 vs. UMass; 42-0 at Michigan State). The last time PSU posted three shutouts in a season was 1978 (19-0 at Ohio State; 58-0 vs. TCU; 30-0 at Kentucky).
- The Nittany Lions had two shutouts against Big Ten teams in 2023 (31-0 vs. lowa; 42-0 at Michigan State).
- In 2023, PSU limited Maryland to -49 rushing yards. Since 1947, the -49 rushing yards are the second-lowest allowed by a Penn State defense. The -49 rushing yards allowed were the fewest by an FBS team in a game last season. The -49 rushing yards are Penn State's lowest allowed under Franklin.
- Since 2014, Penn State is one of four FBS teams that have allowed -49 or fewer rushing yards in a game joining San Diego State (-66 vs. Middle Tennessee State, 12/24/22), Michigan State (-73 vs. Tulsa, 8/30/19) and Arizona State (-52 vs. Washington State, 10/22/16).
- Penn State held Michigan State to 53 total yards, marking the second time in the 2023 season holding an opponent to 76 or fewer yards (76 vs. lowa; 53 at MSU).
- Penn State limited Michigan State to -35 rushing yards. The Nittany Lions held two opponents under -35 rushing yards last season (-49 at Maryland), the two-lowest single-game totals in the FBS in 2023.
- Since 2000, Penn State is the only FBS school to hold multiple opponents to -35 rushing yards or fewer in a single season.
- Over the last 10 seasons, PSU sits third nationally in sacks per game (3.07), QB hurries (997), tackles for loss percentage (11.00), total pressures generated (1,538) and fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.01), sixth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.24) and eighth in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.43).

- Penn State's 359 sacks over the last nine years (2015-24) are fourth behind Clemson (411), Alabama (397) and Pitt (374).
- Over the last 10 years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.79 percent sack percentage (359 sacks on 4,057 pass plays), which ranks second in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 31 times, sixth-most among FBS teams. Twenty-two of those 31 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- Since 2015, Penn State has recorded 12 shutouts, tied-most among FBS teams with Alabama. PSU is also tied for the second-most shutouts (17) in the FBS since 2007.
- The Nittany Lions lead the FBS with eight shutouts against conference opponents since 2015.
- Penn State joins Tennessee and Fresno State as the only FBS teams with shutouts in each of the last four seasons.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents without a touchdown in 20 games, sixth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, PSU has held an opponent under 300 total yards 61 times, tied-sixth among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200 passing yards in 74 games, eighth-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 100 passing yards in 23 games in that span, tied fifth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 60 occasions, ninth-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 50 rushing yards in 23 games, eighthmost among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 33 times since 2014, second-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has collected six or more sacks in a game 18 times, most among FBS teams.

- Junior Abdul Carter, an All-Big Ten first team selection in 2023, is making the transition to defensive end after spending his first two seasons at linebacker.
- · Carter is on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- · He was also named a Preseason All-American by the Action Network (1st team), Associated Press (2nd team), CBS (2nd team), ESPN (2nd Team), The Athletic (2nd team) and the Walter Camp Award.
- Following the 2023 season, Carter was tabbed a second-team All-American by Sports Illustrated.
- Carter owns 116 tackles (69 solo), 18.5 tackles for loss, 12 sacks, three forced fumbles, an interception and 10 pass breakups in his third season in Happy Valley.
- He has three career games with 2+ tackles for loss and two games with 2+ sacks.
- Carter recorded seven tackles (five solo), one tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Bowling Green.
- Against Kent State, Carter tallied four tackles (2 solo) including 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack.
- · According to Pro Football Focus, Carter had a 24.1 pass rush win percentage in 2023, ranking third in the FBS among players with at least 100 pass rush snaps.

- Dennis-Sutton has tallied 48 tackles (31 solo), 10.5 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks, three forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, an interception and three pass breakups as a Nittany Lion.
- He owns two career games with multiple tackles for loss and one game with multiple sacks.
- Dennis-Sutton recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter at West Virginia, while adding a solo tackle and a pass breakup.
- He notched a strip-sack in the first quarter against Kent State for his third career forced fumble.
- Redshirt senior+ DT Hakeem Beamon owns 19 career starts and 40 career appearances. Beamon has totaled 39 tackles, 9 tackles for loss, one sack and four pass breakups at Penn State.
- · He had a half-tackle for loss in the win at WVU.

- He recorded three tackles at West Virginia and five stops against Bowling Green.
- Miller ranked second among FBS cornerbacks with three sacks in 2023, including two against UMass to become Penn State's first defensive back to record multiple sacks in a game since Derek Bochna had two for the Nittany Lions at West Virginia in 1992.
- Redshirt senior Jalen Kimber transferred to Penn State from Florida.
 He has appeared in 28 career games, making 13 starts.
- He owns 45 tackles (33 solo), one fumble recovery, one interception and seven pass breakups in his career.

- As a player, Poindexter, a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020.
- Junior Kevin Winston Jr., voted All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media, has seen playing time in 27 games in his first three years in Happy Valley. He was voted a captain for the 2024 season.
- · He is a member of the Bednarik Award Watch List.
- Winston has 90 tackles (53 solo), 3.5 tackles for loss, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, one interception and five pass breakups as a Nittany Lion.
- Against West Virginia, Winston tied a career high with 12 tackles (7 solo) and earned his third career game with 10+ tackles. Eight of his 12 stops came in the first half.
- The junior registered his first career forced fumble in the first quarter and added a solo tackle for loss.

- Associate head coach/cornerbacks coach Terry M. Smith was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91.
- Co-offensive coordinator and tight Ends Coach Ty Howle
 was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive
 line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making
 13 starts.
- Defensive line coach **Deion Barnes** made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Defensive graduate assistant Torrence Brown was a threeyear letterman on the defensive line for the Nittany Lions (2015-17). He appeared in 30 career games, making seven starts.
- Defensive graduate assistant Jordan Lucas was a reliable member of the defensive backfield during his Penn State career, appearing in 46 games (2012-15).
- Defensive analyst Dan Connor was a two-time first-team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- Director of performance science Andrew Nelson was a four-year letterwinner on the offensive line for Penn State (2014-17) and appeared in 33 games, making 28 starts.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement Tyrone Smith was a defensive tackle for Penn State and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Director of life skills Jordan Hill lettered at Penn State from 2009-12 and finished his Penn State career with 171 total tackles, including 9.5 sacks. He posted a 64-tackle, 4.5-sack season his senior year and was named first-team All-Big Ten for his efforts in 2012.
- Recruiting coordinator Alan Zemaitis was a three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05.
 Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of Football Academic Services Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the Football Letterman's Club Wally Richardson
 was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and
 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with
 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with
 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown
 passes.
- Assistant athletic director for the brand academy Omar
 Easy lettered for the Nittany Lions from 1999 to 2001
 and spent time in the NFL with the Kansas City Chiefs and
 Oakland Raiders.
- Associate director of development Michael Mauti was a four-year letterwinner fo the Nittany Lions and the Big Ten Linebacker of the Year and a first-team All-American in 2012.
- Assistant AD for Premium Seating Bobby White was Co-Captain of the 1986 National Championship Penn State Football team.
- Assistant director of high performance Dan Vasey was a defensive end with the Nittany Lions (2017-21).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Justin Lustig is in his first season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebackers/nickels coach.
- A 2022 Broyles Award nominee, Lustig served the last three seasons at Vanderbilt. In 2023, Vanderbilt was one of 20 programs in the country to block multiple punts and finished 11th nationally in net punting.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks second in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (74.6; 2nd in B1G), fifth in the nation in touchback percentage (70.7; 1st), sixth in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned (17.8; 1st) and 13th in average opponent field position (25.4; 6th).
- Since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is ranked fifth in the country in punts inside the 10 (16.9 percent; 4th in B1G), eighth in punts inside the 20 (41.9; 3rd) and sixth in net punting (41.7; 2nd).
- Since 2017, Penn State has scored nine special teams touchdowns (four kick return, five punt return), ranking second in the Big Ten, and is one of three FBS schools that has not allowed a special teams touchdown since the start of the 2019 season (63-straight games).

- His 45.4 punt average at Penn State ranks first all-time at PSU (minimum 50 punts)
- Thompson averaged 44.0 yards per punt on four boots against WVU. He landed a 46-yard punt at the WVU 11 in the third quarter.
- He averaged 47.0 yards per punt on four kicks against Bowling Green. Thompson blasted a 56-yard punt and landed two punts inside the 20.
- He was named Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week following the BGSU game.
- His 45.8 punt average in 2023 ranked fourth in the Big Ten, while he helped Penn State to sit sixth in the nation (second in the Big Ten) with a 42.9 net punting average.
- Thompson's 45.8 punt average last season ranks second at Penn State behind only Jordan Stout's 46.01 average in 2021.
- KR Nicholas Singleton, an All-Big Ten honorable mention honoree as a return specialist, is averaging 23.9 yards per kick return in his career, 11th all-time at Penn State, with one touchdown.
- Singleton is on the Paul Hornung Award watch list for the most versatile player in the country.
- He had three returns for 56 yards against WVU.
- Redshirt junior SN Tyler Duzansky has appeared in 23 career games.
- Duzansky is a member of the Patrick Mannelly Award watch list.
- He led FBS long snappers with six tackles in 2023.
- Redshirt junior P Gabriel Nwosu landed two kickoffs for touchbacks at WVU.
- Nwosu blasted four touchbacks against BGSU and five against Kent State.
- LB Dominic DeLuca has been voted as a captain for the second-straight year and was awarded No. 0 as the team's special teams leader.
- Redshirt freshman LB Ta'Mere Robinson had two tackles on kickoff returns against West Virginia.
