**MINNEAPOLIS** - After picking up its second-straight sweep over an in-state foe, the No. 4 Minnesota men's hockey team turns its attention to Big Ten Conference play. The Golden Gophers host No. 18 Penn State to begin league play at 3M Arena at Mariucci Nov. 1-2.

Puck drop for both games is set for 7 p.m. live on FOX9+ and streaming on B1G+ presented by Affinity Plus Federal Credit Union, while an audio broadcast is available via the Gopher Radio Network 103.5 FM/AM-1130 KTLK.

### LAST TIME OUT

Minnesota secured its second-straight sweep over an in-state foe, this time over its closest opponent St. Thomas by a combined 13-3 score, last weekend. The Gophers picked up goals from seven sources, including the first collegiate hat trick from Brody Lamb as part of a four-goal weekend by the junior, and points via 13 different skaters. The blue line chipped in 12 points during the two games as both Ryan Chesley and Sam Rinzel put up four points behind multi-point efforts each night. Jimmy Snuggerud and Matthew Wood each distributed four assists to help the offense, while netminders Nathan Airey (20 saves Friday) and Liam Souliere (16 saves Saturday) backstopped the sweep of the Tommies.

### WATCH THE PRIDE ON ICE

For the second-straight year, Minnesota and FOX9 have partnered for a local television broadcast deal that will air 16 home games and four road games during the 2024-25 campaign presented by Affinity Plus Federal Credit Union. This year's home broadcasts on FOX9 and FOX9+ will feature a 30-minute Pride on Ice pre-game show presented by M Health Fairview as well as a post-game show recapping the action presented by RBC Wealth Management. This is in addition to the six games picked by the Big Ten Network and one airing on FS1 during the year. Other FOX affiliates around the area have added Gopher hockey to their coverage with games available in Duluth (KQDS) and Fargo (KVRR) markets.

### NEW NUMBER, SAME SAM THE STAR

While he may have changed from No. 5 to No. 2 during the offseason, the game of Sam Rinzel has remained unchanged following an All-B1G Second Team selection in 2023-24. After recording multi-point performances in both games against St. Thomas last weekend, the sophomore landed B1G First Star of the Week honors. That extended his career-long point streak to all six games this season, while his eight points are tied for second among NCAA defensemen. Rinzel's four goals are part of a three-way tie for the top spot nationally, teammate Ryan Chesley one of the others in the tie, and he's already doubled his goal total from his rookie campaign when he scored twice.

### LAMB LIGHTS UP AS A STAR

Brody Lamb was a key factor in Minnesota's offensive success in 2023-24 as he more than tripled his offensive output from his freshman campaign, setting career highs in goals (12), assists (15), and points (27). The Byron, Minn., native has continued that production into his junior year with a point in five of six outings and thanks to a four-goal weekend against the Tommies, including his first NCAA hat trick, was named the B1G Second Star of the Week. All three goals of his natural hat trick Saturday versus UST were on the power play and he has scored four of the Gophers' five total goals on the man advantage this year. Lamb's four power-play markers are tied for the NCAA lead, while he also tallied his fifth-career game-winning goal Saturday.

### SUCCESSFUL STARTS

The Maroon and Gold have consistently found success in beginning a campaign, holding a 65-37-2 all-time record in the first game of the year. That total includes a 32-18-2 mark away from home following

last week's 7-1 win over Air Force. The Gophers have even more success in their home openers behind a record of 70-31-3, which contains a 22-8-2 mark in home openers at 3M Arena at Mariucci.

## ALL OUT OFFENSE

In six games this season, the Gophers have picked up 33 total goals from 14 different players and 89 total points via 17 skaters, showcasing their offensive depth in 2024-25. The balanced scoring from Minnesota has helped the team lead the nation in scoring offense, while also holding the second-best scoring margin at plus-3.5. The Maroon and Gold have lit the lamp seven times in each of the three Friday outings, a goal total it never reached a season ago, and have scored five or more goals in all four victories during its current win streak.

## BLUE LINE SCORING

With a combined 15 points from Sam Rinzel and Ryan Chesley, the Gophers are getting an offensive boost from their blue line in 2024-25. The skaters have both surpassed single-season career highs in goals through just six games, totaling four apiece. Minnesota's defensemen are one goal shy of matching last season's nine-goal production and the seven players to have dressed this year have totaled 22 points.

## READY TO SEE MORE PUCKS

Goaltender Nathan Airey is fully healthy entering his second year of college hockey after missing nearly the entire first half of last season with an injury and ready to make an impact in the Minnesota net. He earned his first win during his college hockey debut last January at home against Robert Morris (Jan. 12) and won all three of his starts to begin his sophomore campaign. The Cochrane, Alberta, native closed his freshman campaign with just three appearances and will be tasked with an expanded role following the departure of netminder Justen Close.

## FROM FOE TO FRIEND

Graduate transfer goaltender Liam Souliere is ready to enjoy a change of scenery as he joined the Gophers during the summer after playing four seasons as the starting netminder at Big-foe Penn State. He made 16 saves in his first game for Minnesota against Omaha (Oct. 12), a 2-1 overtime loss, before turning away 31 shots in a 5-1, road win at Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 19) that secured a series sweep. He added another 16-save victory in front of more than 10,000 fans at Xcel Energy Center last Saturday to pick up his second-straight win. Before joining the Maroon and Gold, he ranked second all-time in wins (39), third in saves (2,067) and shutouts (3), fifth in goals-against average (2.95), and seventh in save percentage (.897) with the Nittany Lions. The Montréal, Québec, native was named to the NCAA Allentown Regional All-Tournament Team as a junior in 2022-23 after backstopping PSU to within an overtime goal of reaching the Frozen Four.

## WOODY, YOUR FAVORITE DEPUTY

No stranger to putting up points in college hockey, junior transfer Matthew Wood has kept that trend going since donning the Maroon and Gold uniform. He burst onto the scene opening night behind a three-assist effort versus Air Force (Oct. 11) and registered multi-point performances in each of his last four appearances, all victories for the Gophers. The product of Nanaimo, B.C., scored his first goal at Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 18), starting a three-

game, goal-scoring streak. Wood joins linemate Connor Kurth with a team-leading 12 points, which sits third in the country, while his nine total assists are also third among all NCAA skaters.

## KURTH STARS IN SEASON OPENER

Connor Kurth was named the BIG Second Star of the Week (Oct. 15) thanks to his career-best, four-point outing in the Gophers' season opener against Air Force in Las Vegas. The forward scored a goal in all three periods versus the Falcons and remains one of six skaters in the country with a four-point outing this year, and the lone player from the Big Ten Conference to hit that mark. His six goals are tied for the most in the NCAA this year and is just one shy of reaching his single-season high of seven set in each of his first two collegiate campaigns. The nation's plus-minus leader at plus-13, Kurth tied his career-long, goal-scoring streak when he found the back of the net for the third-consecutive outing Saturday at Xcel Energy Center against St. Thomas.

## CAPTAIN CHESLEY DOUBLES DOWN

In a matter of just six games to start the 2024-25 campaign, junior Ryan Chesley has already doubled his career goal output. The captain has scored four times this year, tying for the most of any defenseman in the nation, after recording two goals in each of his first two college seasons. A native of Mahtomedi, Minn., he scored twice on opening night versus Air Force (Oct. 11) before getting the game-tying goal in the first period against St. Thomas during back-to-back outings last weekend. Chesley also ranks seventh in the country after blocking 10 shots through six outings and is one point shy of matching his total of eight from a season ago.

## HISTORY WITH THE NITTANY LIONS

Minnesota holds a 29-18-1 (.615) record in the all-time series against Penn State that dates back to the first meeting in 2014, the year the Big Ten Conference was founded for men's hockey. The Gophers have won eight of the last nine meetings versus the Nittany Lions, including each of the last five matchups inside 3M Arena at Mariucci, following a best-of-three series sweep in the 2024 Big Ten Conference Quarterfinals. Last season, Minnesota used a pair of shutouts by Justen Close in the season series as the netminder limited Penn State behind a 1.51 goals-against average and a .957 save percentage in six starts. Aaron Huglen, Jimmy Snuggerud, and Luke Mittelstadt each had five points in the series, combining for six goals and nine assists.

## INSIDE LOOK AT PENN STATE

Through five games, the Nittany Lions are one of five NCAA teams to have not allowed a single power-play goal as the team has killed off all 23 opposing chances on the man advantage. Not only is it stopping power plays, but Penn State is also scoring at the other end, tying for the top spot in the country by scoring three times shorthanded. That has helped the team earn the nation's 10th-best scoring defense as it is holding opponents to just 1.8 goals per game, leading to wins in four of five outings this season. Sophomore Aiden Fink continues his impressive offensive numbers from a season ago and paces the Nittany Lions with nine points in 2024-25. Danny Dzhaniyev and Reese Laubach have each scored three goals to lead the team, while UConn transfer goaltender Arsenii Sergeev has played every minute this season with a 1.79 goals-against average and

a .928 save percentage.

## POWERING UP

After being held without a power-play goal during the 2024 Ice Breaker Tournament, the Gophers scored on the man advantage in both outings at Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 18-19) before tacking on three power-play tallies versus St. Thomas at Xcel Energy Center last Saturday. Brody Lamb scored the first of the year for Minnesota less than five minutes into Friday's outing at UMD before Jimmy Clark tacked on one in the third period Saturday against the Bulldogs. Despite failing to convert any of three chances on the man advantage in their home opener against the Tommies, the Gophers responded in a big way with three power-play goals, all coming off the stick of Lamb, on Saturday as they went 3-for-7. That pushed the team's success rate to 23.8 percent, ranking 19th in the country.

## STARTING IN SECOND

Following its back-to-back Big Ten Conference regular season titles in 2021-22 and 2022-23, Minnesota finished in third place in the league standings a year ago. With a league-leading six BIG titles already under their belt, the Gophers are looking to get back to the top of the conference this season and were picked to place second in the preseason poll as voted upon by the BIG's seven head coaches. Defending champion Michigan State holds the top honor after claiming its first-ever regular season and tournament titles last season.

## BIG PRESEASON HONORS TO FOUR

Four players representing the Maroon and Gold were recognized by the league's head coaches and named to one of the Preseason All-BIG Teams for 2024-25. Jimmy Snuggerud was a unanimous selection to the All-BIG First Team where he was joined by Sam Rinzel. Mike Koster and newcomer Matthew Wood earned spots on the All-BIG Second Team.

## COMFORTS OF HOME

Only once in the 31-year history of 3M Arena at Mariucci has Minnesota not posted a winning record inside its home building and that happened in 2010-11 when the team was 9-10-3. Since that year, the Gophers own a 174-69-16 record (.703) and have won double-digit home games each of

the last 13 years. That includes a mark of 14-6-1 from last season, aided by the Maroon and Gold winning eight-straight games from Jan. 8 and Mar. 1, the longest home win streak since 2017. Under Coach Motzko's guidance, the Gophers hold a 77-39-6 (.656) record on home ice, including a 44-17-1 (.718) mark across the previous four years. That stretch of quality play is aided by Minnesota dominating Big Ten foes, going 28-10-1 (.731) in conference outings inside 3M Arena at Mariucci since the start of 2021.

## STAYING DISCIPLINED

A strength over the last six years for Minnesota has been playing a disciplined brand of hockey and avoiding trips to the penalty box. The Gophers ended the 2023-24 season as the nation's leader in penalty minutes, averaging just 6.6 per game, and currently rank second at 5.0 a night through six games. It was the third time over the last five seasons the Maroon and Gold finished a season as the NCAA's least penalized team, and they have ended inside the top five every year since 2018-19. Under Coach Motzko's direction, the team has never averaged double-digit penalty minutes per game for an entire season with the highest of 9.8 minutes in his first year behind the Gophers' bench.

## DRAFTED THE SWEET 16

The Gophers have more NHL draft picks on their roster than any other NCAA hockey program in 2024-25. Minnesota's 16 players are the most for the team since 2011-12 when it had 17. From that roster more than a decade ago, four players (Nick Bjugstad, Travis Boyd, Erik Haula, Justin Holl) are still playing in the NHL. This year's roster features four first-round selections in Matthew Wood (15th overall), Oliver Moore (19th overall), Jimmy Snuggerud (23rd overall), and Sam Rinzel (25th overall). Minnesota has had the most all-time draft selections (242) by any NCAA men's hockey program after adding three over the summer. At least one Gopher has been drafted in 50 of the last 51 NHL Entry Drafts dating back to 1974, with 2001 being the only exception.

Tournament, the most of any college hockey program. The Gophers own a 62-42 record (.596) in 41 trips to the national stage since 1953 and have made four-consecutive appearances. Under the guidance of head coach Bob Motzko, the Maroon and Gold own a mark of 7-4 in the postseason event, including at least one win in each of the last four years.

### LET'S GO WATCH

Fans continue to pile into arenas to catch college games in person as attendance for NCAA Division I men's hockey was up eight percent nationwide in 2023-24, with 36 of 62 (58 percent) programs that competed in both 2023-24 and 2022-23 experiencing attendance gains. That follows a 15-percent increase between 2021-22 and 2022-23. The Big Ten Conference had five of the top 10 teams in the country for total attendance a year ago and Minnesota ranked third nationally with nearly 200,000 people coming to campus. An average of 9,225 fans entered 3M Arena at Mariucci across 21 home contests, and the Gophers closed the year with seven sellouts, including the second-highest attendance in arena history (10,750) against Penn State on Feb. 9, 2024. The 'U' also set a new series attendance record as 21,310 fans came to the arena for that weekend versus the Nittany Lions.

### SNUGGERUD STILL RISING

While his goal total sits at one through six games, the offensive production from Jimmy Snuggerud has never wavered. The junior continues to average more than a point per game in his Minnesota career with 91 points in 85 career appearances. That was bolstered over the weekend where he posted four assists, increasing his point total to seven in six games during 2024-25, aided by the second three-assist effort of his career Saturday at Xcel Energy Center. A two-time All-B1G selection, Snuggerud recorded a hat trick in each of his first two years with the Maroon and Gold and now put together 24 multi-point performances. He posted 21 goals in each of his first two college hockey seasons and is one of just six Gophers to score 20 or more goals in back-to-back seasons since 2000.

### WELCOME TO GOPHER HOCKEY

In just six games to begin the season, the Gophers have utilized newcomers to support their offense with five players joining the list to light the lamp in 2024-25. Freshman Beckett Hendrickson found the back of the net in the third period versus Air Force (Oct. 11) to make it a memorable debut with the Maroon and Gold, scoring his first collegiate goal. On the road at Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 18), freshmen Erik Pålsson and Brodie Ziemer scored their first NCAA goals, while transfer Matthew Wood put away his first in the new uniform. In Minnesota's home opener against St. Thomas (Oct. 25), it was freshman August Falloon that found the back of the net for the first time in his third appearance.

### CLARK CATCHING ON

For the first time in his career, Jimmy Clark was named a B1G Star of the Week (Oct. 22) after leading the Gophers with five points during the road sweep at Minnesota Duluth, earning Second Star honors. He recorded the first three-point effort of his career in the series opener, all three points coming via an assist in the first period. The Edina, Minn., native went on to score his first power-play goal with the Maroon and Gold on Saturday in a game where he also had an assist. The sophomore has three multi-point outings, with a point in four of six games this season, totaling one goal and seven assists.

### ZIEMER ZIPPING BY

After he was held off the scoresheet during the opening-weekend trip to Las Vegas, Nev., freshman Brodie Ziemer scored the first goal of the game in both outings at Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 18-19). The Chaska, Minn., product used a highlight-reel toe-drag to evade a Bulldog defenseman before zipping home a shot 94 seconds into the contest. On Saturday night, he slipped into space in the slot and buried the opening tally mid-way through the first period. Ziemer is one of seven Gophers to record multiple goals this season, while his two tallies rank second among freshmen in the Big Ten Conference.

### BACK FOR YEAR FIVE

Mainstays in the Gophers' lineup over the past four years, Mike Koster and Mason Nevers are back on campus and healthy as team captains for their fifth and final seasons in 2024-25. Entering the year with the most active games played by any NCAA defenseman, Koster has taken the ice 146 times and again will be asked to anchor the team's defensive corps. The Chaska, Minn., product finished last year recording two goals and 12 assists for 14 total points, despite missing the entire first month due to an injury. Nevers has skated in 144 career games, totaling 60 points on 22 goals and 38 assists. A native of Edina, Minn., he posted a career-best, plus-16 rating to go with his third-consecutive campaign reaching double-digit scoring after returning to the lineup following an early-season injury.

### NEW SCORING PUNCH

With 55 goals and a third of their total points lost from a season ago, the Gophers turn to their five incoming forwards for an added scoring punch in 2024-25. The addition of UConn transfer and first-round pick Matthew Wood aids that cause after the junior led the Huskies in scoring each year behind 62 points in 70 games. While the four remaining newcomers may be fresh to the collegiate scene, they are no stranger to reaching the scoresheet. August Falloon, Beckett Hendrickson, Erik Pålsson, and Brodie Ziemer combined to put up 238 points for their respective junior teams in 2023-24.

### BOLSTERED THE BLUE LINE

Minnesota returns seven defensemen to the lineup, including four with more than 75 games of college hockey experience, as the backbone of the roster. The team welcomed two freshmen over the summer as Leo Gruba and John Whipple will bolster the blue line, giving the team depth at every turn. Gruba was named the USHL Defenseman of the Year after helping the Fargo Force win the Clark Cup last season. He led all USHL defensemen in scoring with 57 points in 60 games, setting a single-season franchise record for points by a blue liner. Whipple comes to campus as a 2024 fifth-round draft pick of the Detroit Red Wings following a 17-point campaign with the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

### DEFENSEMAN 'U'

Minnesota was the lone college hockey program in the country with double-digit blue liners in the NHL last year. A total of 12 former Gopher defensemen took the ice in the NHL during the 2023-24 season, accounting for more than 750 games played. Highlighting the group was Nick Leddy as he reached the 1,000-game milestone with the St. Louis Blues in March, becoming the eighth former Gopher to hit the mark.

## GOPHER NOTES CONTINUED

### HITTING THE 20-WIN MARK

After winning 23 games in 2023-24, the Gophers secured their fourth-consecutive season with at least 20 wins and the 10th time over the past 13 campaigns. The sustained success of the Gophers has been a point of emphasis as the program has reached the 20-win mark 41 times in 51 years dating back to 1973-74, a year when the Maroon and Gold claimed the first of its five national championships.

### TESTED EVERY NIGHT

With four Big Ten Conference teams entering 2024-25 ranked in the top 10 of the preseason national polls, and the other three league teams in the top 20 or receiving votes, Minnesota's schedule will again be a challenge the entire way through. The Gophers batted the nation's No. 4 strength of schedule in 2023-24 after facing the second toughest the previous year. This season, the team is scheduled to play all but five games against a team that has its name in the preseason polls.

### WE ARE THE STATE OF HOCKEY

According to data from College Hockey Inc., 249 NCAA Division I men's hockey players hail from the state of Minnesota, nearly a quarter of all student-athletes, and more than double the next closest state. That total is bolstered by the Gophers lineup as 22 of their players this season will skate in their home state, including five of their eight newcomers. Even more impressive is the fact that 20 of the 22 Minnesotans on the team are from within 70 miles of campus.

### INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Minnesota's lineup has a more international flavor than years past as the team has four players from outside the country in 2024-25. The last time that many international players were on the Gophers' roster in a single season was 1951-52. Two of the team's goaltenders are from Canada in Nathan Airey (Cochrane, Alberta) and Liam Souliere (Montréal, Québec), while fellow Canadian Matthew Wood joins the group as a native of Nanaimo, British Columbia. For the first time since 2018, a Swedish-born player will don the Maroon and Gold as Erik Pahlsson begins his collegiate career. Leon Bristedt was the most recent Swedish skater for the Gophers, as he played 144 games between 2014-18.

### SEVEN-YEAR AGE GAP

When the puck drops for its season opener on Oct. 11, the average age of each player on the Minnesota roster will be 21 years and 137 days old (21.38 years), making it the fifth-youngest roster in the nation, per stats from College Hockey Inc. Nick Michel and Liam Souliere are the lone players born before 2000 and share a March birthday. Born a month apart in 2006, John Whipple and Brodie Ziemer represent the Maroon and Gold as the youngest skaters.

### LUCKY SEVEN FOR COACH MOTZKO

The 2023 Spencer Penrose Coach of the Year award winner, Minnesota head coach Bob Motzko currently owns a 141-72-17 record after leading the Gophers to four-straight, 20-plus-win campaigns. In five of the six seasons with Coach Motzko at the helm, the program has been ranked in the top five of the national polls at some point. He is the seventh coach in program history to

reach the 100-win milestone and has earned the title of BIG Coach of the Year three times in the last five seasons.

### COUNT THAT HIGH

In a unique twist this season, a player will wear the No. 72, No. 74, and No. 91 sweaters for the first time in the program's more than 100-year history. Freshmen Erik Pahlsson and Brodie Ziemer will don the No. 72 and 74 uniforms, respectively, while transfer Matthew Wood chose the No. 91 for the Gophers. Fellow newcomer Leo Gruba is set to be just the third to ever wear No. 55, following Matt Staudacher and John Amatuzio.

### FAMILY TIES TO THE 'M'

Minnesota men's hockey remains deep-rooted in family history as four current members of the team have a relative that also wore the Maroon and Gold in some fashion. Jimmy Snuggerud is a third-generation Gopher joining his father, Dave, an All-American in 1989, and maternal grandfather, James Westby. The three have combined to score 135 goals in a Minnesota uniform. Brothers John and Luke Mittelstadt followed in the footsteps of their older brother, Casey, in attending Minnesota after the eldest was on campus for one season in 2017-18. The three Mittelstadt brothers have combined for 78 points in 174 career appearances. Freshman Beckett Hendrickson's father, Darby, and uncle, Dan, recorded 124 Gopher points as they each wore the 'M' sweater for at least two seasons. Newcomer Matthew Wood also has a connection to the Maroon and Gold as his father, Jamie, was an assistant coach for the Gopher women's hockey team from 2008-10 under head coach Brad Frost.

### FROM 'U' TO THE LEAGUE

Thirty-one former Gophers took part in National Hockey League training camps for the 2024-25 season, representing 21 different NHL organizations. Included in the group that spans more than 15 years of the program are 13 former captains and nine All-Americans. Minnesota had 26 former skaters in the NHL last season, increasing the all-time number of Gophers in the NHL to an NCAA-best 125. Brock Faber finished second in the 2024 Calder Memorial Trophy voting, the highest ever for a Gopher, while Logan Cooley was fifth, and both guys were named to the NHL's All-Rookie Team in 2023-24. In the final game of the season, Kyle Okposo joined Ben Clymer and Jordan Leopold as the only former Gophers to play in Game 7 of a Stanley Cup Final. Clymer's Tampa Bay Lightning defeated Leopold's Calgary Flames back in 2004. Okposo also made it three-straight seasons with a Gopher hoisting the Stanley Cup after his Florida Panthers won in June, a feat that had never been done in program history.

### VIA THE NATIONAL TEAM

The Gophers' roster in 2024-25 is full of national team experience as six former USA Hockey National Team Development Program alumni are on the roster, bringing the total from the USNTDP that have suited up for Minnesota to 39. Eighteen of the 33 previous Gophers from the national team have gone on to skate in the NHL.

### SIGHTS SET ON ST. LOUIS

The end goal of the 2024-25 campaign is to be skating on the ice of the Enterprise Center in St. Louis, Mo., the host site of the NCAA Frozen Four, set for April 10 and 12. Minnesota has reached the Frozen Four 23 times in program history, the fourth-most of any team, including two trips in the past three years.

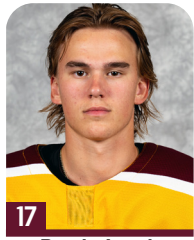

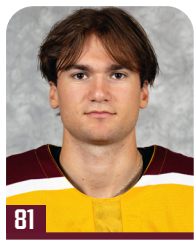
