MINNEAPOLIS - The University of Minnesota men's hockey team has its sights set on a Big Ten Conference championship as it travels to red-hot No. 15/16 Penn State to close the regular season Feb. 28-Mar. 1.

The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers enter the final weekend of play searching for their record seventh regular season title, holding a two-point lead in the league standings. The series gets underway at 7:30 p.m. (CT) Friday night and continues Saturday at 7 p.m. (CT) with both games airing live on Big Ten Network and the Fox Sports app. Wally Shaver and Tanner Hoops will provide audio coverage via the Gopher Radio Network 103.5 FM/AM-1130 KTLK.

LAST TIME OUT

Minnesota put together a complete weekend to claim all six possible points during a home sweep of No. 7/6 Ohio State in front of sold-out crowds both nights at 3M Arena at Mariucci. Ryan Chesley broke a 1-1 tie in the second period Friday for the eventual game-winning goal of a 4-1 victory, while Brody Lamb matched a career high with three points, including two goals. The Gophers built a 3-0 advantage Saturday but needed to fend off a surging Buckeyes' squad to the finish getting a pair of empty-net tallies to secure a 6-3 win. Twelve players registered a point in the series finale led by Jimmy Clark's three assists that tied his career best. Goaltender Liam Souliere stopped 41-of-45 shots during the weekend to record a pair of wins and picked up his first assist with the Maroon and Gold Friday night.

LOOKING AT THE STANDINGS

Coming off their home sweep of Ohio State, the Gophers begin the final series of the regular season in first place in the B1G standings with a two-point lead over Michigan State. Minnesota can potentially clinch the championship Friday and will finish no lower than second place heading into its series at Penn State, while the Spartans close the campaign at Notre Dame. The No. 1 seed for the B1G Tournament earns a bye into the semifinals on Mar. 15 and the second-place finisher will host the Fighting Irish in the best-of-three quarterfinals Mar. 7-9.

LAMB LIGHTS LAMP FOR ANOTHER STAR

Brody Lamb found his scoring touch again during the sweep of No. 7/6 Ohio State, totaling four points on three goals and an assist and was named the B1G Second Star of the Week (Feb. 25). It was the junior's third time earning a weekly award this season. He matched a career high with three points Friday, including his third multi-goal effort this season, and snapped an 11-game goal drought that stretched back to Jan. 3. The Gophers are now 10-1-1 this season when Lamb lights the lamp and his three-goal series pushed him back into the top 20 nationally among all goal scorers with 16 tucks. He previously was named a star of the week on Dec. 3 following a three-point series versus Alaska and thanks to a four-goal weekend against St. Thomas, including his first NCAA hat trick, earned the honor on Oct. 29. All three goals of his natural hat trick versus the Tommies were on the power play, and his eight goals on the man advantage this year rank fifth in the NCAA.

SNUGGERUD STOCK RISING

After a four-point performance versus Wisconsin, Jimmy Snuggerud was named the B1G First Star of the Week for the third time this season and sixth time during his career, the most of any non-goaltender in B1G history, while also landing HCA Co-Player of the Month honors for the month of January. His 43 points rank fifth among the NCAA's scoring leaders, including a B1G-best 18 goals in 22 league appearances. The junior posted two goals and two assists in the series opener against the Badgers (Jan. 31), extending his career-long goal streak to six games and the team owns a 12-2-1 record when he scores a goal this year and 33-9-3 in his three-year career. Snuggerud has tallied exactly 21 goals in all three campaigns and became the third player in Gophers' history to score 20 or more goals in three-consecutive seasons to

begin a career, joining M Club Hall of Famers John Mayasich and Dick Dougherty, who both hit the milestone more than 70 years ago in 1953-54. He has reached the scoresheet in 25 of 34 appearances this year with a team-best 14 multi-point outings, while his 63 career goals rank 34th in program history. Snuggerud is just two points away from reaching the top 50 all-time scorers in Maroon and Gold as he currently has 127 to his credit.

HOBEY BAKER FAN VOTING CONTINUES

Sam Rinzel and Jimmy Snuggerud from the Maroon and Gold are two of more than 90 players representing all 64 NCAA Division I programs nominated for the 2025 Hobey Baker Memorial Award. The fan-voting portion began Jan. 22 and goes until Mar. 9 and can be found by going to hobeybaker.com/vote. Phase two of fan balloting will feature the Top Ten Hobey Baker finalists beginning Mar. 19 and closes Mar. 30. The fan vote accounts for a percentage of the total ballot in each phase in selecting this year's award recipient.

SHOWING OFF THE BALANCE

The Gophers have lit the lamp an NCAA-best 135 times this season with 20 different players scoring at least one goal, including six that have eclipsed double-digit goals. Minnesota's offensive depth in 2024-25 has shined through as its 363 points have come via 21 of their 22 total skaters, and two goaltenders. A total of 14 players have surpassed double-digit points, while six have 25 or more points. The team has found the back of the net five or more times in 16 appearances and hold a 21-3-2 record when scoring at least three goals. More importantly, the Gophers are putting in the work on the defensive end, holding the NCAA's fourth-best scoring margin at plus-1.62 as they have surrendered 80 goals all season, a 2.35 goals per game average.

WINNERS FROM EVERYONE

The Gophers offensive balance is showcased by the fact that 14 different skaters have accounted for their 23 game-winning goals. Connor Kurth's four game winners pace the team as he has put away two of Minnesota's last three, while six others are tied with two apiece. A year ago, only 10 Minnesota players recorded a winning goal in the team's 23 total victories.

MITTELSTADT BROTHERS SURGING

As he did last season, Luke Mittelstadt has increased his offensive production in the second half of the campaign and has 10 points over his last 14 outings, including both of his goals and points in all four outings against Ohio State, to reach 18 points in 2024-25. He is averaging 0.68 points per game (23 points in 34 games) over the last two seasons after the calendar switched to a new year, while recording 0.39 points per game (15 points in 38 games) at the start of the year. Luke's 15 points in 22 league appearances ranks third in the B1G for defensemen scoring. Meanwhile, his brother John scored his first goal of the season and second-career game-winning goal in a home win over Bemidji State (Nov. 14) that snapped a goal drought of 26 games. He added the first multi-point effort of his tenure with two assists at home versus Mercyhurst (Jan. 4) to extend his career-long scoring streak to three games and picked up another game winner versus Notre Dame (Jan. 17).

KEEP WATCHING WOOD

No stranger to putting up points in college hockey, junior transfer Matthew Wood has kept that trend

going since donning the Minnesota uniform. He burst onto the scene opening night behind a three-assist effort versus Air Force (Oct. 11) and registered five multi-point performances in his first six appearances. He scored his first goal at Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 18), starting a three-game, goal-scoring streak before recording his first multi-goal outing as a Gopher against Michigan (Dec. 6). Wood has tallied a goal and an assist in three-straight Saturday outings, pushing his point total to 33, which is one point behind his career best of 34 set as a freshman at UConn and ranks 30th in the NCAA.

KURTH REMAINS THE NCAA'S BEST

Connor Kurth was named the B1G Second Star of the Week (Oct. 15) thanks to his career-best, four-point outing in the Gophers' season opener against Air Force in Las Vegas where he scored a goal in all three periods. The nation's plus-minus leader at plus-29, he leads Minnesota with six outings of three or more points this year after posting his second multi-goal outing this season to finish off the Border Battle sweep of the Badgers (Feb. 1). Kurth has surpassed his offensive production in both goals and points from his first two seasons combined as his current total of 15 goals ranks 25th in the NCAA and his 33 points are 30th nationally.

FANS FILING IN

The 3M Arena at Mariucci ticket scanners got a workout during Minnesota's Border Battle with Wisconsin as the program set a new series attendance record with 21,641 fans purchasing tickets for the Jan. 31-Feb. 1 matchup. That included an all-time arena record in the series finale Saturday where the Gophers had an announced attendance of 10,894, the most in the 30-plus-year history of the arena. The Maroon and Gold have played in front of six-straight sellout crowds at home and pushed its average attendance to 9,853, the third highest in the NCAA this season and most since the 2015-16 campaign. The Big Ten Conference has five of the top nine teams in the country for total attendance this year, while all seven are in the top 20 overall.

HISTORY WITH THE NITTANY LIONS

Minnesota holds a 31-18-1 (.630) record in the all-time series with Penn State after winning twice on home ice to begin the B1G season in November but are just 11-10-1 at Pegula Ice Arena. The Gophers have now won 10 of the last 11 meetings, including a 5-1 mark in the last three trips to Pegula Ice Arena. The sweep at 3M Arena at Mariucci came during the middle of the team's nine-game win streak earlier this year as it limited the Nittany Lions to one goal in the series. Jimmy Clark and Jimmy Snuggerud combined to score all four goals for the Maroon and Gold with Snuggerud potting a pair Friday before Clark's game winner with 26 seconds remaining in regulation of the 1-0 victory Saturday. Liam Souliere stopped all 28 shots he saw in the first time facing his former team to record his first shutout at Minnesota.

INSIDE LOOK AT PENN STATE

After starting 0-8 in the B1G with a pair of losses at 3M Arena at Mariucci, the second half of the season has been a complete turnaround for the Nittany Lions. The team is 9-1-3 in its last 13 outings and claimed 17 of a possible 18 points in the conference over the past three weeks, including five of six at No. 1 Michigan State last weekend. PSU is third in the NCAA at the faceoff dot, winning

55 percent of draws, and ranks ninth in scoring offense, averaging 3.4 goals per game. Sophomore Aiden Fink currently is tied for the national scoring lead at 45 points behind 23 goals and 22 assists, including 15 goals in 16 games since the calendar switched to 2025. Netminder Arsenii Sergeev has been at the top of his game the last two months and been named B1G First Star of the Week three times in the past eight weeks. The junior owns a 2.50 goals-against average and a .920 save percentage and is unbeaten in his last six starts.

HITTING THE 20-WIN MARK

After winning their 20th game of the season on Jan. 31 against Wisconsin, the Gophers secured their fifth-consecutive 20-win campaign and reached the mark during the month of January for just the second time since 2012. It's also the 11th time over the past 14 years Minnesota has eclipsed 20 wins. The sustained success of the Gophers has been a point of emphasis as the program has reached the 20-win mark 42 times in 52 years dating back to 1973-74, a year when the Maroon and Gold claimed the first of its five national championships.

SKATING IN 100

The current roster of Gophers is riddled with college hockey veterans as 10 different players have all reached the century mark for career games played after Matthew Wood joined the list at Michigan. Mike Koster and Mason Nevers led the way as they have appeared in 174 and 165 games with the Maroon and Gold, respectively, while Aaron Huglen has 145 games to his credit. This season, six members of the junior class hit the milestone in the last month with two more players six games or less away.

EXTRA MANPOWER OFFENSE

Minnesota's 24 goals on the man advantage are fourth in the B1G and rank 14th in the NCAA as it has converted at least one power play in 17 outings this season, but only three in the last 10. The team has converted 22.9 percent of its chances overall (24-of-105), sitting 17th in the country for power-play efficiency, but are an impressive 33.3 percent (14-of-42) on the man advantage while on the road. The Gophers have three games with three goals coming versus St. Thomas (Oct. 26), Notre Dame (Nov. 22), and Ohio State (Jan. 11). It's been goal contributions from 11 different players on the man

advantage this season, while 13 players have a power-play point, led by 11 from Jimmy Snuggerud and 10 via Sam Rinzel. Lamb's eight goals on the power play rank fifth in the NCAA and just one off the national leader.

STARRING ROLE FOR RINZEL

While he may have changed from No. 5 to No. 2 during the offseason, the game of Sam Rinzel has remained unchanged following an All-B1G Second Team selection in 2023-24. After recording multi-point performances in both games against St. Thomas, the sophomore landed B1G First Star of the Week honors (Oct. 29). He extended his career-long point streak to eight games, dating back to the final game of last season, with an assist in the series opener versus Penn State (Nov. 1). Rinzel has a point in 19 of 34 appearances this year, including the first two power-play goals of his tenure at Notre Dame (Nov. 22) and another versus Michigan (Dec. 7). He leads the B1G in both goals and points from the blue line, while he ranks fifth among all NCAA defensemen with nine goals and is fourth behind 27 points, thanks to seven multi-point performances.

FRIDAY NIGHT HUGLEN

Coming off a career year in 2023-24 where Aaron Huglen reached double-digit goals (13) for the first time as a Gopher, he has continued to put his name on the scoresheet this season, especially in Friday night outings. The senior has a point in 11 of 16 Friday games this year, totaling 13 of his 18 points. He has reached double-digit scoring in four-consecutive campaigns thanks to eight points over an eight-game stretch from Nov. 22 to Jan. 3. Since becoming a father to his daughter Evelyn in early February, the Roseau, Minn., native has four points in four appearances, including the 11th multi-point effort of his career versus Ohio State on Senior Night (Feb. 22). Last year, Huglen became the 15th player in program history to score a goal in three different NCAA Tournaments, a feat that had not been accomplished in more than 15 years, when he found the back of the net against Boston University in the 2024 NCAA Sioux Falls Regional Final.

MOORE PRODUCTION INCREASES

After enduring a career-long, six-game scoring drought through early November, Oliver Moore responded with 11 points over a nine-game stretch and has added goals in four of the past five

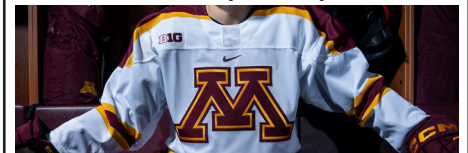

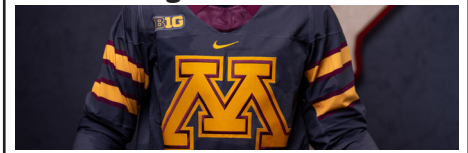

outings. On Saturday versus Ohio State (Feb. 21), he tied a career-long goal streak of three games to reach double-digit goals for the first time as a Gopher. The sophomore matched a career high with three points versus Wisconsin (Feb. 1) and has tallied at least one point in each of the last 11 series played to reach 26 total points. Moore has six multi-point outings this season and 15 for his college career with Minnesota winning all 15 of those contests.

PUCK STOPS AT SOULIERE

Graduate transfer goaltender Liam Souliere is enjoying a change of scenery as he joined the Gophers after playing four seasons at B1G-foe Penn State. On the road at Ohio State in mid-January, he stopped all six shots he saw in relief Friday before making 32 saves during Saturday's win to pick up the third B1G Star of the Week honor of his career and first since coming to Minnesota. He has not lost a game in regulation in 10-straight years since Dec. 14 and recorded shutout victories over Penn State (Nov. 2), his first appearance versus his former team, and Michigan (Dec. 7) this year. He has tallied double-digit victories in three-straight years and picked up the 50th win of his NCAA career against Ohio State (Feb. 21). Souliere has allowed 41 goals in 21 appearances this season for a 2.05 goals-against average and a .925 save percentage that rank 10th and 13th in the nation, respectively.

AIREY AVOIDING SOPHOMORE SLIDE

Goaltender Nathan Airey is fully healthy entering his second year after missing nearly the entire first half of last season with an injury and is making a significant impact in the Minnesota net. After picking up his first collegiate shutout against Michigan (Dec. 6) behind a career-best 32 saves, he was named the B1G Second Star of the Week, the first weekly award of his young tenure. Airey has lost twice in all 15 of his starts to begin his sophomore campaign at 11-2-2 with a 2.50 goals-against average and a .901 save percentage, giving up two or fewer goals in eight of 15 outings. A native of Cochrane, Alberta, he is one of three NCAA goaltenders with more than 10 appearances to have dropped two or fewer games this season.

HENDRICKSON LENDS HELPING HAND

Since the start of the 2025 calendar year, Beckett Hendrickson has found his stride and recorded seven points in 13 appearances, including assists in three of his last four outings. The freshman became the Gophers' 14th player to reach double-digit scoring when he picked up an assist versus Ohio State (Feb. 21) before adding his 11th point of the campaign the next night.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

With an assist at Notre Dame (Nov. 22), Jimmy Snuggerud became the 89th player in program history to reach 100 career points and the second member of the family to do so. It took the junior 92 career appearances to reach the mark, one game fewer than his father, Dave, who recorded his 100th-career point in game number 93 back in 1988. The Snuggeruds are the only father-son duo in Minnesota men's hockey history to both eclipse the century mark. Dave finished with 140 points, which ranks 38th all-time for the Maroon and Gold, while Jimmy's 127 points currently ranks 51st all-time.

COMFORTS OF HOME

Only once in the 31-year history of 3M Arena at Mariucci has Minnesota not posted a winning record inside its home building and that happened in 2010-11 when the team was 9-10-3. Since that year, the

Gophers own a 187-71-18 record (.710) and have won double-digit home games each of the last 14 years. That includes a mark of 14-2-2 this season, aided by the Maroon and Gold winning seven of its last eight on home ice. Under Coach Motzko's guidance, the Gophers hold a 90-41-8 (.676) record at home, including a 57-19-3 (.741) mark across the previous four years. That stretch of quality play is aided by Minnesota dominating Big Ten foes, going 37-12-2 (.745) in conference outings inside 3M Arena at Mariucci since the start of 2021.

FEELING GOLDEN AGAIN

Oliver Moore and Brodie Ziemer along with associate head coach Steve Miller helped the United States to a gold medal at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship on Jan. 5 in Ottawa. Ziemer finished fifth on the team in scoring behind seven points in seven games, including an assist on the gold-medal-clinching goal against Finland. The freshman tallied two goals in his tournament debut against Germany (Dec. 26), starting a three-game point streak. Moore put together a five-point event with a goal and four assists and had points in four of five games leading up to the finals. Three of Moore's five points came during the medal round aided by a two-assist game versus Switzerland (Jan. 2) in the quarterfinals. The Maroon and Gold have been represented by at least one player at the tournament in 46 of the 49 years it has been played, including now 11 players that have claimed a gold medal with Moore as the only Gophers' skater to win the event twice.

BLUE LINE SCORING

With a combined 95 points from eight skaters along their blue line, the Gophers are getting an offensive boost from the defense in 2024-25. The defensive group in 2022-23 totaled 147 points on 30 goals and 117 assists, aided by three now-NHL skaters, and that number dipped to 83 points last season. Sam Rinzel (9) and Ryan Chesley (8) have both more than doubled their single-season high for goals and rank fifth and seventh among NCAA defensemen in goals, respectively. The duo has helped Minnesota surpass last season's nine-goal production, totaling 24 tallies as a group this year, including four of the team's seven goals at Ohio State in January. The group also accounted for nine points during the series sweep of the Buckeyes last weekend.

STAYING OUT OF THE BOX

A strength over the last six years for Minnesota has been playing a disciplined brand of hockey and avoiding trips to the penalty box. The Gophers ended the 2023-24 season as the nation's leader in penalty minutes, averaging just 6.6 per game, and currently rank third at 6.8 a night after committing just one minor infraction versus the Buckeyes. Three times over the last five seasons, the Maroon and Gold have finished a campaign as the NCAA's least penalized team, and they have ended inside the top five every year since 2018-19. Under Coach Motzko's direction, the team has never averaged double-digit penalty minutes per game for an entire season with the highest of 9.8 minutes in his first year behind the Gophers' bench.

TESTED EVERY NIGHT

With four Big Ten Conference teams entering 2024-25 ranked in the top 10 of the preseason national polls, and the other three league teams in the top 20 or receiving votes, Minnesota's schedule will again be a challenge the entire way through. The Gophers battled the nation's No. 4 strength of schedule in 2023-24 after facing the second toughest the previous year. This season, the team has faced the 15th-toughest

schedule in the country behind five-consecutive series against a nationally-ranked opponent when it travels to Penn State this weekend.

BIG PRESEASON HONORS TO FOUR

Four players representing the Maroon and Gold were recognized by the league's head coaches and named to one of the Preseason All-BIG Teams for 2024-25. Jimmy Snuggerud was a unanimous selection to the All-BIG First Team where he was joined by Sam Rinzel. Mike Koster and newcomer Matthew Wood earned spots on the All-BIG Second Team.

WE ARE THE STATE OF HOCKEY

According to data from College Hockey Inc., 249 NCAA Division I men's hockey players hail from the state of Minnesota, nearly a quarter of all student-athletes, and more than double the next closest state. That total is bolstered by the Gophers lineup as 22 of their players this season will skate in their home state, including five of their eight newcomers. Even more impressive is the fact that 20 of the 22 Minnesotans on the team are from within 70 miles of campus.

DRAFTED THE SWEET 16

The Gophers have more NHL draft picks on their roster than any other NCAA hockey program in 2024-25. Minnesota's 16 players are the most for the team since 2011-12 when it had 17. From that roster more than a decade ago, four players (Nick Bjugstad, Travis Boyd, Erik Haula, Justin Holl) are still playing in the NHL. This year's roster features four first-round selections in Matthew Wood (15th overall), Oliver Moore (19th overall), Jimmy Snuggerud (23rd overall), and Sam Rinzel (25th overall). Minnesota has had the most all-time draft selections (242) by any NCAA men's hockey program after adding three over the summer. At least one Gopher has been drafted in 50 of the last 51 NHL Entry Drafts dating back to 1974, with 2001 being the only exception.

SEEKING THE NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

Minnesota's win over Omaha in the 2024 NCAA Sioux Falls Regional opener last season was the program's 62nd all-time victory in the NCAA Tournament, the most of any college hockey program. The Gophers own a 62-42 record (.596) in 41 trips to the national stage since 1953 and have made four-consecutive appearances. Under the guidance of head coach Bob Motzko, the Maroon and Gold own a mark of 7-4 in the postseason event, including at least one win in each of the last four years.

VETERANS BACK FOR YEAR FIVE

Mainstays in the Gophers' lineup over the past four years, Mike Koster and Mason Nevers are back on campus as team captains for their fifth and final seasons in 2024-25. Entering the year with the most active games played by any NCAA skater, Koster has taken the ice 174 times and again is anchoring the team's defensive corps, chipping in 17 points. His 174 career games played are seventh all-time in program history and he continues to climb up the list. Nevers has skated in 165 career games, totaling 63 points on 25 goals and 38 assists, including the game winner at Ohio State (Jan. 11) after returning from a month-long injury.

BOLSTERED THE BLUE LINE

Minnesota returned seven defensemen to the

lineup, including four with more than 75 games of college hockey experience, as the backbone of the roster. The team welcomed two freshmen over the summer as Leo Gruba and John Whipple will bolster the blue line, giving the team depth at every turn. Gruba was named the USHL Defenseman of the Year after helping the Fargo Force win the Clark Cup last season. He led all USHL defensemen in scoring with 57 points in 60 games, setting a single-season franchise record for points by a blue liner. Whipple comes to campus as a 2024 fifth-round draft pick of the Detroit Red Wings following a 17-point campaign with the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

DEFENSEMAN 'U'

Minnesota was the lone college hockey program in the country with double-digit blue liners in the NHL last year. A total of 12 former Gopher defensemen took the ice in the NHL during the 2023-24 season, accounting for more than 750 games played. Highlighting the group was Brock Faber as he finished second in voting for the Calder Trophy given to the NHL's rookie of the year. Nick Leddy and Erik Johnson both reached the 1,000-game milestone, becoming the eighth and ninth former Gopher to hit the mark.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Minnesota's lineup has a more international flavor than years past as the team has four players from outside the country in 2024-25. The last time that many international players were on the Gophers' roster in a single season was 1951-52. Two of the team's goaltenders are from Canada in Nathan Airey (Cochrane, Alberta) and Liam Souliere (Montréal, Québec), while fellow Canadian Matthew Wood joins the group as a native of Nanaimo, British Columbia. For the first time since 2018, a Swedish-born player will don the Maroon and Gold as Erik Pahlsson begins his collegiate career. Leon Bristedt was the most recent Swedish skater for the Gophers, as he played 144 games between 2014-18.

LUCKY SEVEN FOR COACH MOTZKO

The 2023 Spencer Penrose Coach of the Year award winner, Minnesota head coach Bob Motzko currently owns a 159-78-21 record after leading the Gophers to five-straight, 20-plus-win campaigns. In six of the seven seasons with Coach Motzko at the helm, the program has been ranked in the top five of the national polls at some point, including the No. 1 spot in four of the past five years. He is the sixth coach in program history to reach the 150-win milestone and has earned the title of BIG Coach of the Year three times in the last five seasons.

COUNT THAT HIGH

In a unique twist this season, a player will wear the No. 72, No. 74, and No. 91 sweaters for the first time in the program's more than 100-year history. Freshmen Erik Pahlsson and Brodie Ziemer will don the No. 72 and 74 uniforms, respectively, while transfer Matthew Wood chose the No. 91 for the Gophers. Fellow newcomer Leo Gruba is set to be just the third to ever wear No. 55, following Matt Staudacher and John Amatuzio.

SIGHTS SET ON ST. LOUIS

The end goal of the 2024-25 campaign is to be skating on the ice of the Enterprise Center in St. Louis, Mo., the host site of the NCAA Frozen Four, set for April 10 and 12. Minnesota has reached the Frozen Four 23 times in program history, the fourth-most of any team, including two trips in the past three years.

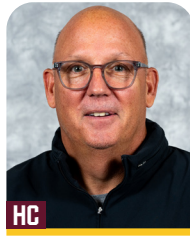
