SAINT FRANCIS QUICK HITS

- » Olivia Ulam has returned for her senior season after leading the team in runs with 44, RBIs with 55 and 445 putouts in 2024. She holds the program record for career putouts at 1486 and has the top two single season putouts with 450 in 2022 and 445 in 2024. She currently leads the team with 246 putouts.
- » Savannah Nash was named to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's Third Team All-Region last season, tallying 41 runs, eight home runs, 43 RBIs, 14 stolen bases and 30 putouts, appearing in 54 games. She was second on the team in both runs and home runs last year. She currently leads the team in batting average (.412), slugging (.731), on base percentage (.462), on base plus slugging (OPS) (1.193), home runs (9), and hits (49).
- » Allie Braly and Olivia Kolowitz are stepping up this season as the only two returning pitchers. They made a combined 25 appearances last season, with Kolowitz starting in four games. They are joined by Madelynn Bates and Addison Deal to round out this year's pitching staff. All four pitchers have started at least two games so far this season.
- » Saint Francis currently leads the Northeast Conference in hits (241), doubles (49) and total bases (365). The Red Flash pitching staff have an ERA of 4.75, good for third in the NEC. Defensively, the team leads the conference in assists (296).

Last Time Out

The Red Flash went 0-3 against LIU in Brooklyn, N.Y. on April 4 and 5. The first game was 7-6 in extra innings before falling 10-5 and 9-2. Savannah Nash went 5-for-11 with one double, two home runs, three RBIs, five runs scored and went 1-for-1 in stolen base attempts. She was joined by Olivia Ulam and Sofia Zielinski hitting home runs in the series.

Scouting Penn State

Penn State is 18-18 overall with a 5-5 record in the Big Ten, sweeping Rutgers at home on April 4 and 5. The Nittany Lions set a new single-season record for home runs at 54 in Saturday's 15-11 win over the Scarlet Knights. Brooke Klosowicz leads the Nittany Lions with a .480 batting average, 34 RBIs and 38 runs scored. Penn State's bullpen is led by Mady Volpe with a 3.69 ERA and seven wins in 32 appearances.

Last Time We Met the Nittany Lions

The Red Flash are 9-39 against Penn State, dropping a late comeback to the Nittany Lions in a 3-2 extra-innings loss. Penn State took a 2-0 lead before Saint Francis tied the game in the top of the seventh inning with runs scored by Ashley Wruble and Savannah Nash. The Nittany Lions won in the bottom of the ninth on a wild pitch.

Up Next for Saint Francis

Saint Francis will host FDU on April 14-15. The Knights are currently second in the Northeast Conference, but the Red Flash are 33-18 against FDU. Last season, Saint Francis shut out FDU in a road series.

The Red Flash are returning two All-NEC First Team selections in Savannah Nash (Outfield) and Olivia Ulam (First Base), one All-NEC Second Team selection in Annabelle Farmer (Catcher) and one NEC All-Rookie Team member in Aliya Garroway (Utility).

Sophomores Have a Chance to Stand Out

Hannah Bendle (Utility), Allie Braly (Pitcher), Madelynn Kessler (Catcher) and Olivia Kolowitz (Pitcher/Utility) round out the team's returners and complete the sophomore class with Aliya Garroway. Garroway earned NEC Player of the Week, Rookie of the Week and a Prime Performer last season. Kolowitz was named NEC Rookie of the Week on Feb. 20, 2024.

Fresh Faces Join 2025 Team

Saint Francis has seven freshman players this season. This year's freshman class includes: catcher/outfielder AB Cipalla, pitcher/infielder Addison Deal, outfielder Morgan Pasternak, catcher/infielder Addie Smith and utility players Zoey Nussbaum, Ally Pearce and Sofia Zielinski.

Transfers Add Talent

The Red Flash added two transfers to the roster this year. Madelynn Bates (Pitcher) is a graduate student who previously played at Randolph-Macon and Haley Brag (Infield) enters her junior year after two years at Clarks Summit. Bates appeared in 78 games, pitching in 12 for the Yellow Jackets. Brag started in 44 games in her career with the Defenders.

Ulam Sets Program Record in Putouts

Senior infielder Olivia Ulam broke the previous career program record of 1,073 putouts, set by Taylor Darneille from 2010-13, on March 21, 2024 at Stonehill. Ulam also holds the single-season program record with 450 putouts in 2022 and her 383 putouts in 2023 were two shy of tying fifth in single-season program history. At the time of her record-breaking putout, Ulam started all-135 games for the Red Flash at first base since her collegiate debut in 2022. In 2024, she was five shy of her own record in single-season putouts.

Nash and Ulam Earn National Fastpitch Coaches Association Recognition Last season, Olivia Ulam was named to the NFCA Second Team All-Region with Savannah Nash earning Third Team All-Region distinction. Nash tallied 41 runs, eight home runs, 43 RBIs, 14 stolen bases and 30 putouts, appearing in 54 games. Ulam started in all 55 games last season, tallying 44 runs, 55 RBIs and 445 putouts.

Changes to NEC Membership

The NEC added Chicago State to its membership starting in 2024-25, but the Cougars do not sponsor softball. The NEC later also added Mercyhurst ahead of this academic year, who does sponsor softball.

Nash Receives National Recognition, Joined by Zielinski for NEC Honors

Nash earned her fourth NEC Player of the Week and her second NFCA Top Performance this week. Zielinski was named NEC Rookie of the Week, making her one of two freshmen this season to be a repeat Rookie of the Week. Braly and Ulam joined Nash and Zielinski as Prime Performers.

Garroway and Smith Earn Weekly Recognition

Garroway was named NEC Player of the Week after batting .636 with a double, a home run (walk-off grand slam) and 6 RBIs, picking up an NFCA Top Peformance for the wins over Stonehill. Smith received her second NEC Rookie of the Week. Both were named Prime Performers.

Zielinski Named NEC Player and Rookie of the Week

Zielinski earned her first conference weekly awards after going 4-for-12 with two doubles and a home run in the team's 2-3 weekend in the FIU Classic, good for a .750 slugging percentage and a team-most .467 on-base percentage. In left field, she recorded 12 putouts. She was joined by Addison Deal as Prime Performers.

Nash and Smith with Weekly Awards, Four Earn Prime Performer

Nash earned her third consecutive NEC Player of the Week and first NFCA Top Performance of her career, going 10-for-16 with six RBIs against George Mason and UMBC. Smith went 7-for-13 as the designated player, including her first collegiate home run in the second win against George Mason. Braly, Garroway, Nash and Smith were named Prime Performers.

Savannah Nash Nabs Spot on D1Softball Outfield Player Power Rankings

Nash has earned the No. 18 spot in Division I in the D1Softball's Outfield Player Power Rankings on Feb. 27 after wins over George Mason and UMBC.

Nash Earns Second Consecutive NEC Player of the Week

Nash went 4-for-11 in the Spiro Classic with a .636 slugging percentage. In Sunday's game against UNCG, she hit a two-run home run. She also had seven putouts and one assist at center field. She was also named a Prime Performer that week.

Nash and Cipalla Receive Major NEC Weekly Awards

After the first week of the season, Savannah Nash was named NEC Player of the Week. AB Cipalla earned NEC Rookie of the Week. Both were also named Prime Performers.

Olivia Ulam Makes D1Softball Player Position Rankings

Ulam was named No. 14 in D1Softball's Player Position Rankings for first basemen. The senior is coming off a stellar junior season, earning NFCA Second Team All-Region and First Team All-NEC. She also received NEC Player of the Week five times and Prime Performer seven times last season.

Saint Francis Picked Third in NEC Preseason Poll

Receiving two first-place votes, the Red Flash were named third in the conference's preseason poll. CCSU earned the top spot with four first-place votes. LIU was picked second with two first-place votes. FDU, Le Moyne, Stonehill, Wagner and Mercyhurst were picked after Saint Francis, in that order.

In her first season at the helm of the program, Krysiak led Saint Francis to the NEC Tournament title and NEC Regular Season title behind a perfect 27-0 record against Northeast Conference teams. As a result, Krysiak and assistant coaches Mel Savala and Ry Godde were named the third NEC Coaching Staff of the Year in program history.

Saint Francis finished the conference season with a 24-0 conference record, its most conference wins in a season, followed by victories all-three NEC Tournament games by a 29-4 scoring margin. The Red Flash earned a No. 3 seed in the Austin Regional and defeated Siena 1-0 on May 18 to earn its second NCAA Tournament Regional win in program history.

The Red Flash finished second in program history with 41 wins overall. Saint Francis also tied its best 10-game start to a season in program history with a 9-1 record. The non-conference schedule featured a 6-3 extra-inning victory over Big Ten opponent Nebraska on March 9.

In the program rankings as a team, Saint Francis finished first in strikeouts thrown (352), second in batting average (.303) and stolen bases (100), third in ERA (1.81), fourth in hits (440) and runs scored (313) and fifth in RBIs (280) and doubles (76).

Grace Vesco set a program record with 201 strikeouts and ranked third with 20 wins and a 1.28 ERA. She finished the 2024 season atop the NCAA Division I with 2.97 hits allowed per seven innings and her ERA ranked third. Kaylie Walters set a program record with 29 stolen bases and finished tied for second with 45 walks. She led Division I freshmen in walks and ranked 15th overall, while her stolen bases ranked 17th overall.

Ashley Orischak set a program record with a .550 on-base percentage that ranked sixth in Division I. She also led the nation with a program-record 28 hit by pitches. Olivia Ulam finished second with 445 putouts and tied for fifth with 19 doubles. Rachel Marsden finished the season tied for fifth in program history with 19 wins

Under Krysiak's guidance, Saint Francis earned a program-record four NFCA All-Region and 11 All-NEC selections. Vesco was named NFCA First Team All-Region (P), NEC Pitcher of the Year, First Team All-NEC (P) and CSC Academic All-District. Marsden earned NFCA Second Team All-Region (UTIL/P), First Team All-NEC (P and DP) and CSC Academic All-District. Ulam earned NFCA Second Team All-Region (1B), First Team All-NEC (1B) and CSC Academic All-District. Savannah Nash was named NFCA Third Team All-Region (OF) and First Team All-NEC (OF). Orischak earned First Team All-NEC (2B) and CSC Academic All-District. Walters was named First Team All-NEC (SS) and NEC All-Rookie Team. Ashley Wruble earned Second Team All-NEC (OF) and CSC Academic All-District, while Annabelle Farmer was named Second Team All-NEC (C). Aliya Garroway earned NEC All-Rookie Team honors.

Before Saint Francis


Krysiak joined Saint Francis after she spent four seasons at Columbia University, where she worked primarily with pitching. During her tenure, she coached 2023 All-Ivy Second Team selection pitcher Raquel Reyes and 2022 All-Ivy Honorable Mention pitcher Jordan Hill. Columbia totaled 11 All-Ivy selections during Krysiak's stint with the program.

Prior to her time at Columbia, Krysiak spent the 2019 season at Carnegie Mellon as the pitching coach after a five-year stint at the University of Dallas as the head coach. During her tenure with Dallas, she brought the Crusaders on its deepest Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Tournament run in program history in 2016. Dallas was a two-time 20-win program under Krysiak.

She began her coaching career in 2010 as a graduate assistant at Ottawa University and spent time as an assistant at Buena Vista University and Prairie View A&M before Dallas.

Krysiak earned her Master of Education in Curriculum and Instruction from Ottawa in 2012 and earned her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology and Bachelor of Science in Health and Exercise Science in 2010 from Centenary College of Louisiana. She was a five-year member of the softball team at Centenary.

ASSISTANT COACH MEL SAVALA



Saint Francis University softball announced the hiring of Mel Savala as the program's assistant coach in September 2023. The hire was head coach Beth Krysiak's first with Saint Francis after she was announced as the 13th head coach in program history on Aug. 8, 2023.

In her first season, Savala assisted Saint Francis to NEC Tournament and NEC Regular Season titles. She was part of the NEC Coaching staff of the Year alongside Krysiak and volunteer assistant Ry Godde. She worked primarily with hitting and the outfield and helped Saint Francis rank second in program history in batting average (.303), fourth in hits (440) and fifth in RBIs (280) and doubles (76).

Under her guidance, Savannah Nash earned NFCA Third Team All-Region (OF) and First Team All-NEC (OF), while Ashley Wruble added Second Team All-NEC (OF) honors.

She also assisted the hitting of Olivia Ulam, who earned NFCA Second Team All-Region (1B) and First Team All-NEC (1B), Rachel Marsden, who earned NFCA Second Team All-Region (P/UTIL) and First Team All-NEC (P and DP), Kaylie Walters, who earned First Team All-NEC (SS) and NEC All-Rookie Team, Ashley Orischak, who earned First Team All-NEC (2B), Annabelle Farmer, who earned Second Team All-NEC (C) and Aliya Garroway, who earned NEC All-Rookie Team.

Savala joined Saint Francis after she spent the 2023 season at NCAA Division II member Wingate University, where the Bulldogs held a 48-17 overall record. She assisted the program to its first regular season title since 2009. Wingate advanced to the 2023 NCAA Super Regionals after winning the Southeast Regional.

Prior to Wingate, Savala spent three seasons at NCAA Division III member Millsaps College from 2020-22. In 2022, she assisted the Majors to an 11-7 conference record, its most wins since 2017, which included a series victory over nationally ranked Berry College.

During her coaching career, Savala has assisted in running outfield and hitting sessions, planning and organizing drills, watching film and building scouting reports, among other responsibilities.

Savala spend four years at Division III member University of Dallas, where she set a career record with 156 games played and single-game record with five stolen bases. She was a 2016 All-SCAC and a 2018-19 All-SCAC Academic selection in her career. Savala played her first three seasons from 2016-18 under coach Krysiak.
