

- No. 18 Penn State women's soccer wraps up its weekend swing through the state of Illinois this Sunday, September 28, as the Nittany Lions prepare to square off against the Northwestern Wildcats in a 2 p.m. (ET) kick from Northwestern Medicine Field at Martin Stadium. The match will stream live to a worldwide audience of authenticated subscribers via B1G+ and the B1G+ app. In a raucous back-and-forth affair from Champaign, Illinois, Penn State dropped a 4-3 decision to the Illinois Fighting Illini on Thursday night, September 25. The final statistics told a wildly different story than the final score would indicate, with Penn State dominating the run of play throughout. The Nittany Lions racked up an eye-popping 18 total shots with a team season-high 13 shots on goal, surpassing the previous high of 10 set against Saint Louis in the second match of the year. PSU secured an additional statistical win in the corner kick competition, amassing seven corners against four allowed for the Fighting Illini. Penn State's attack was led by a trio of goal scorers, including sophomore forward Aubrey Kulpa, senior midfielder Olivia Borgen and graduate forward Kaitlyn MacBean. Kulpa, a native of Cromwell, Connecticut, found the back of the net for a Big Ten-best eighth time on Thursday, marking her first tally since potting her first B1G goal of the league slate against Maryland on September 11. The Hanson, Massachusetts, native Borgen celebrated her first goal in the Blue & White this season in addition to her first score since logging the match-winner on the road at Princeton on September 5, 2024. MacBean, meanwhile, continued her torrid stretch in conference action with her fifth goal in four league fixtures, finding the back of the net for the sixth time in her final collegiate season. In the passing game, Penn State saw a quartet of student-athletes record a helper, with redshirt senior midfielder Julia Raich logging an assist in her second-straight match, while freshmen Riley Cross and Hannah Jordan, as well as junior defender Kaelyn Wolfe mustered one-point outings of their own. In the most recent United Soccer Coaches poll of the 2025 campaign, released on September 23, Penn State garnered the No. 18 national ranking, joining fellow B1G
- programs UCLA (#4), Iowa (#8), Wisconsin (#20) and Ohio State (#23). PSU was also rated as the No. 18 team in the nation per TopDrawerSoccer, joining fellow Big Ten Conference competitors in UCLA (#4), Iowa (#10), Illinois (#23) and Wisconsin (#24). PSU also features a pair of non-conference opponents in the national top 25 with No. 1/2 Virginia and No. 9/7 Duke also joining Penn State in the polls.

### **WATCHING THE WILDCATS**

- Under the direction of head coach Michael Moynihan in his 14th season with the Wildcats, Northwestern enters the weekend battle boasting a 4-1-6 overall record coupled with an 0-0-4 start to Big Ten Conference competition.
- In one of the more fascinating starts to conference play in recent program history, the Wildcats enter Sunday's matchup coming off four consecutive ties in conference play. Northwestern opened the league slate with back-to-back 1-1 road results against Iowa and Washington before registering consecutive scoreless draws against Oregon and then-No. 23 Ohio State most recently on Thursday, September 25.
- The pairing of Alex Fallon and Kennedy Roesch are off to strong sevenpoint starts through the early going this season, with Fallon boasting two goals and three assists while Roesch owns three tallies and a lone helper on the campaign. Between the pipes, Nyamma Nelson has played all but 19 minutes and has mustered an .876 save percentage with 38 stops in 2025.

#### **STORY OF THE SERIES**

- Penn State and Northwestern prepare to square off in women's soccer for the 36th time in program history this weekend in Evanston, with the Nittany Lions boasting a decisive 29-5-1 overall record coupled with an 11-3-1 record in matches played on the campus of Northwestern University.
- The Blue & White are unbeaten against the Wildcats in each of the last three meetings, with Penn State booking a pair of wins and a draw against Northwestern dating to the last NU win in Happy Valley on September 23, 2021, a 2-1 final score. In Evanston, PSU is unbeaten in each of the last two fixtures taking place in the spring of 2021 and fall of 2023. Northwestern's last win at Martin Stadium over the Nittany Lions came on September 20, 2018, a 1-0 finish.
- Last year's meeting on Jeffrey Field saw the Nittany Lions publish a 1-0 win thanks to another highlight-reel tally from forward Kaitlyn MacBean, who notched her 10th goal of the year a season ago in the win over the Wildcats. MacBean's score in the 49th minute of play marked her fourth match-winning goal of the 2024 season, a statistic she would eventually rank seventh nationally in with six result-clinching scores.

#### **READING THE RPI**

- The most recent NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Ratings Percentage Index (RPI), released on Monday, September 22, saw the Nittany Lions garner the No. 14 position nationally with an adjusted RPI value of 0.654.
- The RPI is one of the most critical tools in evaluating NCAA soccer programs for selection to the 64-team national postseason field, with the system ranking teams based on wins, losses and strength of schedule. RPI is formulated by including a team's winning percentage, the winning percentage of the team's opponents, and the winning percentage of the team's opponent's opponents.
- Penn State's non-conference schedule was once again heralded by the NCAA's RPI calculation, with the Blue & White boasting the nation's No. 9 non-conference RPI rating with a 4-2-1 mark outside of B1G play. PSU's non-conference opponents in, Virginia (#1), Duke (#6), West Virginia (#10), Santa Clara (#56), Saint Louis (#65), Liberty (#81) and James Madison (#94) all rank inside the national top-100. The Nittany Lions are the only program in women's college soccer to not play a match against a team outside the national top 100.

### **KULPA'S KILLIN IT**

- Sophomore forward Aubrey Kulpa has been the star of the show for Penn State early on in the 2025 campaign, pacing the Nittany Lion roster with eight goals and 20 points. The Cromwell, Connecticut, native booked the highest-scoring performance of her collegiate career two weeks ago, dropping five points with a goal and three assists in the win over Maryland on September 11.
- The second-year sensation ranks prominently in both the Big Ten Conference and Division I in multiple statistical categories. Kulpa owns 0.73 goals per match (first in B1G, 23rd in DI), eight total goals (first in B1G, eighth in DI), two match-winning goals (sixth in B1G, 70th in DI), 20 total points (first in B1G, 10th in DI), 1.80 points per match (first in B1G, 10th in DI) and a shot-on-target percentage of 0.552 (third in B1G).
- Kulpa has participated in 34 matches at the collegiate level to date, starting in 12 of those opportunities. In that span, she owns 37 total points split between 15 goals and seven assists, all the while maintaining a dominant .576 shot-on-goal percentage in her pair of seasons at PSU.
- Hailing from Cromwell, Connecticut, Kulpa arrived in Happy Valley as one of Penn State's premier attacing prospects ahead of the 2024 season. Kulpa was a 2022 Youth All-American and was named the MVP of the GA U17 National Championship after leading her team to the title in 2022.

### **ROCKIN' WITH RILEY G**

- Redshirt senior midfielder Rilev Gleason has been a revelation for the Nittany Lions in her fifth and final season with the Blue & White, leading the PSU roster with eight assists on the 2025 campaign. Gleason's eight assists rank first in the Big Ten Conference and second in all of college soccer. Additionally, her 0.73 assists per match stand first in the league and rank eighth in the sport.
- Gleason, a native of Mission Viejo, California, is in her fifth season of competition in Happy Valley, redshirting during the 2022 fall campaign. The veteran holding midfielder has played in 61 total matches with 28 starts to her credit, amassing 19 total points split between a pair of goals and 15 combined assists highlighted by her career-defining start to 2025.
- Gleason has found the back of the net twice in her career, with one goal apiece coming in the 2021 and 2023 seasons. In the passing game, Gleason has already surpassed her single-season career-best mark from 2023, in which she logged four helpers in a career-high six-point scoring season.

#### **NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE**

- Penn State put a bow on its 2025 non-conference schedule on Sunday, September 7, as the Nittany Lions closed out a 4-2-1 non-B1G slate with a decisive 3-0 road victory over the Liberty Flames.
- The Blue & White constructed one of the most challenging non-conference schedules in the nation yet again in 2025, with PSU taking on four opponents who were either ranked or receiving votes in the United Soccer Coaches Poll on the day of the contest. PSU faced a pair of nationally ranked opponents on the road, with both of those matches coming in the form of top 10 road clashes at then-No. 4 Duke and No. 8 Virginia.
- Highlighted by a breakout early campaign from sophomore forward Aubrey Kulpa and redshirt senior midfielder Riley Gleason, the Nittany Lions were able to register a quartet of multi-goal victories in the nonconference slate, highlighted by a 4-1 win over then-No. 23 Saint Louis, a 3-1 result over RV West Virginia, a 2-0 win over Santa Clara and 3-0 road win over Liberty to close out the non-B1G portion of the 2025 PSU schedule.

### **BIG TIME RECOGNITION**

- Penn State saw a pair of student-athletes land Big Ten Player of the Week honors on August 26, with sophomore forward Aubrey Kulpa earning Offensive Player of the Week accolades while freshman defender Hannah Jordan garnered Freshman of the Week status. Additionally, redshirt senior midfielder and captain Julia Raich secured TopDrawerSoccer National Team of the Week accolades.
- Highlighted by the program's trio of weekly honorees, Penn State kicked off its 2025 home slate five weeks ago with a pair of marquee victories against then-No. 23 Saint Louis and West Virginia. Penn State kicked off the home portion of its schedule with a resounding 4-1 victory against the Billikens to mark the third straight win in the all-time series. Later in the week on Sunday, August 24, PSU toppled the West Virginia Mountaineers by a 3-1 margin to extend the team's winning streak in the all-time series to six in a row while remaining unbeaten against WVU in the last nine meetings.
- Both Kulpa and Raich impressed with five-point outings in their two combined starts, while Jordan found the back of the net for her first tally on Jeffrey Field after starting both matches as an outside back.

#### WHO 2 WATCH 4

- The Nittany Lions saw a trio of student-athletes selected by United Soccer Coaches as preseason Players to Watch, with the defender pairing of junior Kaelyn Wolfe and sophomore Bella Ayscue securing the first of those honors on Tuesday, August 5, in a release by the organization.
- On Tuesday, August 12, United Soccer Coaches officially named graduate forward Kaitlyn MacBean as a Forward to Watch ahead of the 2025 campaign, recognizing the veteran star following an All-America campaign in 2024 that featured 16 goals and 34 total points.
- Penn State last secured multiple United Soccer Coaches Player to Watch accolades in 2022, when Penelope Hocking and Ally Schlegel each found their names on the preseason list ahead of PSU's B1G Tournament Championship campaign and sixth consecutive run to the NCAA Sweet 16.

- On an individual basis, graduate forward Kaitlyn MacBean secured a pair of preseason accolades, earning an appearance on the TopDrawerSoccer Preseason Best XI Second Team, the only forward from the Big Ten Conference recognized by the TDS Best XI teams.
- MacBean also secured the second-highest ranking of any B1G athlete in the organization's Preseason Top 100 Player Rankings, landing the No. 18 position nationally. MacBean was the highest-ranked forward in the league according to TDS and picked up the second-highest overall ranking in the Big Ten behind Ohio State midfielder Amanda Schlueter.
- On the back line, redshirt junior defender Kayleigh Herr picked up the No. 80 player ranking to round out PSU's list of preseason accolades from TopDrawerSoccer.

### O CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- The Nittany Lion women's soccer program announced their 2025 team captains on Tuesday, August 12, with redshirt senior midfielder Julia Raich being joined by a pair of redshirt juniors in goalkeeper Mackenzie Gress and midfielder Molly Martin.
- Raich, a native of Camp Hill, Pennsylvania, has served as the team's vocal leader on and off the field since the spring, and returns following an eight-point season split between two goals and four assists from the attacking midfield. Raich appeared in a single-season career-best 24 matches last season, making nine starts.
- Gress, hailing from Lyndhurst, New Jersey, continues her first full season as PSU's starting goalkeeper after spending a majority of last year's regular season with the U20 USYNT at the FIFA U20 World Cup in Colombia. Martin, meanwhile, returns following a prolific 2024 season in which she recorded the most minutes on PSU's roster outside the back three.

### **NATIONAL NITS**

- Penn State's 2025 roster boasts nine current student-athletes who have participated with their respective Women's Youth National Team systems over the offseason, with U.S. U20 team members Bella Ayscue, Kealey Titmuss and Kaelyn Wolfe, U19 member Kieryn Jeter, U18 selections Riley Cross and Kennedy Ring and U17 member Marlee Raymond. PSU boasts a German YNT selection in Sophia Weixler, and a Danish team member in Dikte Bang.
- The Blue & White boast alumane on Senior Women's National Teams as well, with current USWNT athletes Kerry Abello and Sam Coffey being joined by Irish National Team star Marissa Sheva. German midfielder Laura Freigang is fresh off her first career appearances in the UEFA Women's European Championships this summer, while Raquel Rodriguez continues her stint with the Costa Rican national team.

Over the course of the 2025 Penn State women's soccer season, the Nittany Lions wil honor the program's "First Star," the 2015 NCAA Champion PSU women's soccer team. The Nittany Lions will don warm-up shirts with the team's 10th Anniversary Logo this season, and will honor members of Penn State's first national championship roster in an alumni day ceremony on September 21 against Wisconsin. Penn State's run to the 2015 national title was littered with historic

Anchored by the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy winner and unanimous National Player of the Year, Raquel "Rocky" Rodriguez, the Nittany Lions marched through the 2015 campaign with a final overall record of 22-3-2, claiming the Big Ten Conference regular season and tournament championships en route to the program's first and only national crown. The Blue & White, spearheaded by head coach Erica Dambach in her ninth season at the helm in Happy Valley, shut out every opponent faced in the NCAA Tournament, outscoring the opposition by a 20-0 margin en route to an unblemished national championship that has stood the test of time as one of the greatest in women's college soccer.

### **NEWCOMER CORNER**

- In the final 2025 recruiting rankings released by TopDrawerSoccer.com in early August, Penn State earned the No. 5 national ranking. The Nittany Lions were the highest ranked program in the Big Ten Conference in addition to boasting the highest-rated class outside of the ACC.
- The Nittany Lions welcomed one forward in Nicole Crane, four midfielders in Riley Cross, Hannah Jordan, Lily Ann Phillips and Kennedy Ring, as well as a pair of defenders in Emma Fassora and Marlee Raymond. PSU's seven signees hail from six different states, including Colorado, Delaware, Georgia, New Jersey, New York and Texas, with all seven members boasting individual player rankings inside the national top 160 per TopDrawerSoccer.
- PSU added a single transfer athlete ahead of 2025, with UCLA transfer and junior forward Taylor Cheatham joining PSU this year.

#### **THE B1G LEAGUES**

- In a preseason poll submitted by all 18 Big Ten Conference women's soccer coaches, the Nittany Lions were tabbed to finish third in the nation's largest league behind recent California additions in USC and UCLA.
- The Blue & White are the highest-touted B1G legacy program for the second year in a row, falling one spot behind their second-place projection in 2024. The Trojans picked up the top spot in the preseason coaches poll, with UCLA ranking second. Behind Penn State's third-place nod, the league's coaches selected Michigan State, Ohio State, Iowa, Wisconsin, Rutgers, Washington and Minnesota to round out the 10-team Big Ten Tournament field, respectively. The coaches completed the poll with Purdue, Nebraska, Michigan, Northwestern, Illinois, Oregon, Indiana and Maryland to round out the 18-member listing.
- Graduate forward Kaitlyn MacBean, redshirt junior midfielder Molly Martin and senior forward Amelia White picked up preseason recognition from the league office as Big Ten Players to Watch. MacBean is a two-time All-Big Ten Conference selection, while White secured her first individual recognition from the league office since being named an All-Freshman Team selection in the 2022 postseason.

### THE STRENGTH IS THE SCHEDULE

- Penn State boasts the No. 5 non-conference strength of schedule in women's college soccer and the No. 9 non-conference RPI after facing four teams that were ranked or receiving votes during the non-conference slate.
- The Nittany Lions have already played or will play against four opponents that were either ranked or receiving votes in the latest United Soccer Coaches poll, released on September 23, with Virginia (#1), Duke (#9), Wisconsin (#20), Ohio State (#23) appearing on the 2025 Nittany Lion schedule.
- The Blue & White scheduled 10 fixtures against teams that reached the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Tournament a year ago. Six of PSU's seven non-conference challengers made the NCAA field. Of PSU's 11 B1G competitors, four reached the NCAA Tournament with Ohio State and Wisconsin headlining the group by reaching the Sweet 16.

### **UP NEXT**

No. 18 Penn State women's soccer prepares for the third stop on its threematch Big Ten Conference road trip next Saturday, October 4, as the Nittany Lions face off against the Rutgers Scarlet Knights from Yurcak Field. Kickoff is slated for 4 p.m. (ET) with streaming available to a worldwide audience of authenticated subscribers via B1G+ and the B1G+ app on connected devices.

# JEFFREY FIELD THE HOME OF THE NITTANY LIONS



Jeffrey Field, the home of Nittany Lion soccer, was dedicated on Sept. 29, 1972. Located in the heart of the Penn State athletic facilities complex with a picturesque view of Mount Nittany, the stadium was named in honor of the late Bill Jeffrey, legendary head coach of the men's soccer program from 1926-52. Jeffrey Field has been the host site for numerous NCAA and conference contests in men's and women's soccer. Games are frequently televised from Jeffrey Field, allowing a nationwide audience to view Penn State in action. Widely regarded as one of the finest grass surfaces in the country, Jeffrey Field was honored as the 2006 Collegiate Soccer Field of the Year by the SportsTurf Managers Association.

### SOCCER PERFORMANCE CENTER | OPENING NOVEMBER 2025





This \$21.25 million project includes a new soccer operations facility, stadium renovation, parking and an entry plaza. The Penn State Soccer Performance Center will house spaces for the men's and women's coaching staffs, locker rooms for both programs, as well as team meeting spaces. The Jeffrey Field stadium renovations will include the creation of indoor bathrooms, concession stands, entry plazas and standing room only areas to improve fan experience and allow for the ability to host large-scale events.



Currently, both programs are housed in Rec Hall across campus and are transported by bus to Jeffrey Field on match day. Once at Jeffrey Field, the teams are housed in temporary facilities. This project will allow the teams to have all facets of their program housed in one area, while also improving the student-athlete experience with permanent purpose-built facilities.

Penn State women's soccer has placed 17 program alumnae on National Women's Soccer League rosters ahead in the league's 13th season, highlighted by a pair of players from the 2024 Nittany Lion roster who have already made their professional debuts in Racing Louisville FC rookie Katie Scott, and San Diego Wave FC first-year pro Jordan Fusco.

The 17 Nittany Lions participating in the highest level of professional women's soccer on earth extends the program's longstanding tradition of professional development, with Penn State boasting the second-most alumnae in the league among all Division I women's soccer programs. PSU saw 15 alumnae return from last year's nationally acclaimed campaign, highlighted by a pair of former Nittany Lions playing for defending NWSL Champion Orlando Pride FC in Kerry Abello and Cori Dyke. Nittany Lion goalkeeping alumna Katherine Asman continues her professional career after transferring to the Pride's roster ahead of the new year for their 2025 title defense.

League runners-up from 2024, the Washington Spirit, welcome the return of second-year professional Kate Wiesner to the shores of the Potomac looking to build on an impressive second-place finish in the league table. Last year's fourth-place finisher in the Kansas City Current features three Nittany Lions, with former USWNT skipper Vlatko Andonovski's side welcoming the return of Elizabeth Ball and Ellie Wheeler to KC, while introducing a marquee offseason signing from the Nittany Lion alumna ranks in national championship-winning goal-scorer and 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy Award winner Raquel Rodriguez.

Legendary USWNT goalkeeper and long-time NWSL veteran Alyssa Naeher is celebrating her final season of professional soccer in the 2025 campaign with Chicago Stars FC, ushering in her last campaign in the league as one of the organization's most dominant individual performers. Joining Naeher in Chicago is third-year pro Ally Schlegel, who looks to continue building on her impressive professional start with the club. Schlegel's old running mate in Happy Valley, Penelope Hocking, is in the midst of her first full year in the San Fransisco Bay Area with Bay FC after being traded mid-year in 2024 from Chicago. Highlighed by team captain Sam Coffey, Portland Thorns FC features a pair of Nittany Lions, including Coffey alongside Morgan Messner. North Carolina Courage made a midfield signing of PSU alumna Payton Linnehan earlier during the NWSL campaign. Racing Louisville FC enters its second year with Ellie Jean on the roster, and recently added 2024 Penn State freshman and first-year pro Katie Scott to their organization during the 2025 campaign. Utah Royals FC welcomes back Kaleigh Riehl for her second campaign in Salt Lake City following the organization's inaugural NWSL run last year. Finally, Fusco rounds out the list of 17 Nittany Lions in the NWSL, as she is midway through her inaugural campaign in sunny San Diego.

"Camryn embodies all of these characteristics in so many ways, and I could not be more proud to welcome her, and the entire Villagrana family into our Penn State women's soccer program. Team IMPACT is such a special organization that provides an unparalleled experience for children battling illness and their families, and we are beyond blessed to have Camryn on this incredible journey with us."

Villagrana, a native of State College, Pennsylvania, is a sevenyear-old battling leukemia who will enter a multi-year partnership with the Nittany Lion women's soccer program as she continues her battle. The Nittany Lions officially welcomed Villagrana into the Penn State women's soccer family at Hawbaker Pavilion and the Penn State Golf Courses, hosting a signing ceremony featuring Camryn, her father, Mike, her mother, Tiffany, and her older brother Dominic. The Penn State coaching staff and Nittany Lion roster joined in the festivities, which culminated in Villagrana signing her official letter of intent to join the program.

Team IMPACT is a non-profit organization dedicated to matching children battling severe illness or disabilities with collegiate athletic programs. The organization's mission is to guide children and teams alike in a mutually beneficial relationship of belonging, empowerment, and resilience, with the core values of empathy, camaraderie, resilience, boldness, and championing children at its heart. Founded in the spring of 2011, Team IMPACT has matched hundreds of children with college sport programs in the 14-plus years of its existence.

Penn State women's soccer is the seventh Nittany Lion Athletics program to partner with Team IMPACT. The Nittany Lion women's soccer team joins PSU football, men's soccer, baseball, field hockey, women's lacrosse and the defending national champion women's volleyball program as one of seven teams that either currently partner with the organization or have partnered with the organization in the past.

The leadership of Penn State women's soccer head coach Erica Dambach continues to produce incredible success season after season. While trophies, academic awards and international achievements line the walls as evidence of a championship program, her impact on Nittany Lion student-athletes stands as the truest testament to her teams' culture of excellence. Dambach is in the midst of her 19th season at the helm in University Park during the 2025 campaign, Penn State's 32nd varsity season.

The numbers that document PSU's success are staggering. A two-time National Coach of the Year and five-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, Dambach has led her teams to 18 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, 11 Big Ten regular season titles, five Big Ten Tournament titles and the 2015 NCAA National Championship. Through 23 years as a head coach and 19 seasons leading the Nittany Lions, Dambach has accumulated 334 career wins with a .702 winning percentage, one of the most dominant marks in all of college athletics.

Dambach needs just six wins to reach her 300th career victory at the helm of the Penn State program, with her 294 victories in Blue & White standing as more than her two predecessors combined. In the 2023 campaign, Dambach collected her 300th career head coaching victory with a 2-1 result on the road against the West Virginia Mountaineers. Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics, Dr. Patrick Kraft, as well as Deputy Athletic Director Brandi Stuart presented the Dambach family with a game ball commemorating the accomplishment prior to Penn State's next home match against TCU on August 27, 2023, a 1-0 Nittany Lion win.

The Blue & White published a strong 2024 campaign in Dambach's 18th season at the helm, lifting the Nittany Lions to the national quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament for the 15th time while extending the nation's longest active streak of Sweet 16 appearances to six straight. Under Dambach's tutelage, PSU secured its 30th bid to the NCAA Tournament to mark the second-longest national postseason streak in women's college soccer history behind North Carolina. The Blue & White landed their 66th all-time victory in the national postseason and now boasts a 66-28-3 record in the NCAA Tournament since the program's initial tournament run in 1995.

Dambach earned her Bachelor of Science degree with a concentration in biology from William & Mary in 1997. The Huntingdon Valley, Pennsylvania, native holds a United Soccer Coaches Advanced National Degree and a USSF "A" Coaching License.

The former Erica Walsh married Jason Dambach in January 2016, and they currently reside in State College, Pennsylvania. Erica and Jason have two daughters, Addie and Kylie.

## **Associate Head Coach** William & Mary '97 19th Season



#### **COACH BIO**

Ann Cook enters her 19th season with the Penn State women's soccer program ahead of the 2025 campaign. Cook was brought aboard at PSU as a part of head coach Erica Dambach's inaugural coaching staff in 2007, officially joining the Nittary Lion family on March 6, 2007.

As longtime teammates and friends, Cook and Dambach combined for numerous wins on the field at William & Mary and have taken their on-field success into the coaching ranks, leading the Nittany Lions to the program's first NCAA Championship in 2015, two Women's College Cup appearances, five Big Ten Tournament titles and 11 Big Ten regular season titles.

As Associate Head Coach, Cook is the director of player development and oversees the Nittany Lion attack. Since she has been with the Blue & White, Penn State has had one of the most prolific offenses in the country. Under the Cook's guidance, five Nittany Lions have scored 100 or more points over their Penn State careers. Maya Hayes finished her historic career in Happy Valley with 163 points (7ig, 2ta), which ranks third-best in school history. As Director of Player Development, Cook has mentored 25 players to NWSL draft selection or signing, making Penn State one of the top producers of professional talent across all of women's college soccer.

As PSU's attacking coach in the 2024 season, Cook helped lead the Nittany Lions to the Big Ten Conference's statistical championship in total assists (54), total goals (52), total points assists per match (2.16), goal differential (+30), points per match (6.23), and scoring offense (2.08). Cook's offense generated the 10th most goals in the nation and amassed the 11th-most assists and points, helping the Blue 8 White excele no route to their second consecutive Elite Eight appearance.

Throughout her time at Penn State, Cook has been involved in the organization Soccer Without Borders and currently serves as a member of its advisory board. SWB's mission is to use soccer as a vehicle for positive change in the lives of under-served youth around the world and has project sites in the US. as well as in Africa and Central America. Cook's primary involvement has been with its project for girls in Granada, Nicaragua.

A three-time All-American, Cook played for the College of William & Mary from 1993-97. In the mix for the Hermann Trophy in both 1995 and 1997, she was the 1997 CAA Player of the Year and CAA Tournament MVP. The Tribe made appearances in the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals two of Cook's four seasons and concluded the seasons ranked in the top five nationally.

# TIM **WASSELL**

### **Associate Head Coach** Penn State Altoona '06 16th Season



#### **COACH BIO**

One of the nation's premier recruiting coordinators and goalkeeping coaches, Tim Wassell returns to Happy Valley for his 16th season ahead of the 2025 campaign. Head Coach Erica Dambach name Wassell to the Nittany Llon coaching staff on June 2, 2010, and promoted him to Associate Head Coach in recognition of his stellar efforts on the pitch and recruiting trail on July 15, 2021.

Wassell has attracted nationally ranked recruiting classes to Happy Valley year after year, with seven top-five classes since 2014 according to Top Drawer Soccer, including the top-ranked recruiting classes in the nation in both 2019 and 2022. Wassell's reputation as one of the sport's top ecruiters, paired with the elite tactical and developmental staff in Happy Valley, routinely churns but some of the most successful professional prospects both in the NWSL and abroad.

Penn State published a strong 2024 campaign in Wassell's 16th season serving as an assistant under Dambach, helping steer PSU to the Elite Eight of the NOAA Tournament for the 15th time while extending the nation's longest active streak of Sweet 16 appearances to six consecutive. PSU secured its 30th straight bid to the NCAA Tournament to mark the second-iongest national postseason streak in women's college soccer history behind North Carolina.

The Blue & White landed their 66th all-time victory in the national postseason last year and now boast a 66-28-3 record in the NoAA Tournament since the program's initial tournament in 1995. The Nittrany Lions published a 15-7-3 overall record in 2024 and racked up a 5-42 finish in Big Ten Conference regular season action, adding the program's 41st all-time victory in the BIQ Tournament after reaching the quarterfinals with a win over Minnesota on the road.

Wassell's track record of goalkeeper development was crucial in Penn State's success in recent years Wassell's track record of goalkeeper development was crucial in Penn State's success in recent year with veteran shot-stopper Katherine Asman blossoming into one of the top keepers in the nation under his watch. Asman managed to improve her win total in net each season of her collegiate career, finishing her five years as a player in Happy Valley with a career-best O.64 goals-against average, the eighth-best GAA for a single-season in Nittany Lion women's soccer history. Asman was an All-BIG keeper under Wassell's watch and helped guide the Blue & White to at least the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament every year in which she was a regular starter. Additionally, 2022 transfer goalkeep Morgan Messen cultivated her skills under Wassell's usdeartship and leveraged her Penn State experience to kick off a career in the NWSL with San Diego Wave FC in the spring of 2024.

Wassell, a native of Holidaysburg, Pennsylvania, earned his bachelor's degree in business at PSU Altoona. He also has gained NSCAA National and Goalkeeping Coaching Diplomas during his coaching career.

Penn State women's soccer head coach Erica Dambach announced the addition of Declan Doherty to the program's staff on Wednesday, June 12, 2024, completing the Nitrany Lion coaching roster ahead of the team's 2024 campalign. Doherty enters his second year in Happy Valley in 2025.

Penn State booked a strong 2024 campaign in Doherty's inaugural season with the Blue & White, with the first-year assistant helping guide the Nittany Lions to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the 16th time in program history while extending the nation's longest active streak of Sweet 16 appearances to six consecutive. PSU secured its 30th bid to the NCAA Tournament to mark the second-longest national postseason streak in women's college soccer history behind North Carolina. The Blue & White landed their 66th all-time victory in the national postseason and now boast a 66-28-3 record in the NCAA Tournament since the program's initial tournament run in 1995. The Nittany Lions published a 15-7-3 overall record in 2024 and racked up a 5-4-2 finish in Big Ten Conference regular season action, adding the program's 1st all-time victory in the BIG Tournament after reaching the quarterfinals with a win over Minnesota on the road.

Doherty arrived in Happy Valley with a wealth of experience at the professional, collegiate and academy levels, both in the United States and his native Northern Ireland. In the collegiate ranks, Doherty served as a performance analyst for the Louisville women's soccer program from 2019 to 2023, helping the Cardinals make an NCAA Tournament appearance in his inaugural campaign while leading multiple student-athletes to Ali-ACC accolades. Doherty played a key role in the development of 2021 ACC Player of the Year and fifth overall NWSL Draft choice Emina Ekic during his time with the Cardinals, marking both the first ACC Player of the Year and NWSL Draft selection in Louisville program history.

Doherty, a native of Belfast, Northern Ireland, was the head coach of the Ulster University Jordanstown women's team in his native country, leading the squad to a 7-3-1 overall record and a National League championship in 2013. Otherty, who also played for the Rosario Youth Football Club before pursuing a coaching career, graduated from Ulster Jordanstown in 2013 with a degree in sport and exercise science. Doherty also boasts a pair of Master's Degrees, including a Master's in Public Service Administration from the University of Evansville and a Master's in Sport Administration from the University of Louisville

Kara Cook enters her 13th season with the Penn State women's soccer program in 2025 and enters her second season as the program's Chief of Staff and Performance Leadership this year. Cook previously served nine seasons as Penn State's Director of Operations and Performance Leadership, working as PSU's Director of Operations for her first three years in Happy Valley.

Cook has been in a coaching or mentoring role in collegiate athletics for over two decades, and her primary role with the women's soccer team at Penn State includes directing the team culture, leadership and player development programming. Cook is instrumental in the year-over-year growth and development of the program, playing a crucial role in preparing student-athletes for careers in the National Women's Soccer League, international competition and life after soccer.

Building a high-performance culture that can sustain success over time in a highly competitive environment takes a 360-degree approach. Establishing a culture that fosters growth and excellence begins with authenticity, vision, connection, ownership, and intentionality. Cook has built a unique approach to prioritizing team culture and periodizing effective leadership and player development programming throughout the year to make sure Nittany Lon student-athletes are able to perform at their highest levels on the pitch and in the classroom.

Since arriving at Penn State ahead of the 2013 season, Cook has helped create an elite highperformance culture that has led to the highest team GPA in Penn State women's soccer history,
as well as four Big Ten Tournament Championships, five Big Ten Regular Season Championships,
12-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, nine Sweet 16 appearances, skiltite Eight appearances
as well as the program's first NCAA National Championship in 2015. Through the 2024 campaign,
Cook has helped extend the second-longest active NCAA Tournament appearance streak in
the nation to 30 consecutive berths, while leading the Blue & White to back-to-back National
Quarterfinal appearances in 2023 and 2024.

Under the leadership of head coach Erica Dambach and with Cook's assistance, the Penn State women's soccer program has reached new heights each year while continuing to uphold three pillars of success. Attitude of a Champion, Blue Collar and United Familly, PSU's culture supports the growth of Nittany Lion student-athletes while building championship habits and fostering genuine team cohesion.




