# **INSIDE** THE GAME

# NO. 7/6 PENN STATE TRAVELS TO LOS ANGELES TO TAKE ON UCLA

- OPENING KICK: No. 7/6 Penn State meets UCLA on Saturday for its first Big Ten road contest of the 2025 campaign. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on CBS.
- SERIES HISTORY: Penn State meets UCLA for the eighth time in program history. PSU trails the series,
   4-3, and is 1-2 in road matchups. However, Penn State won its last road matchup in the series, 21-6, in
   1968. Last year, Penn State earned a 27-11 win. Drew Allar threw for 237 yards and a touchdown and added a rushing touchdown, while Kaytron Allen added 78 rushing yards and a score.
- TACKLE MACHINE: Linebacker Amare Campbell added to an impressive start to his 2025 campaign with a career-high 15 tackles (8 solo) against Oregon. He tallied 11 tackles in the first half. He also had a career-high three tackles for loss and one sack against Villanova. Campbell has been Penn State's leading tackler in three of four games this season. Through four games, he ranks fifth in the Big Ten in total tackles (37), while tying for the Big Ten lead with 24 solo tackles (tied-ninth nationally). He sits third in the nation averaging six solo tackles per game and 22nd in total tackles per game (9.3).
- ROSS MAKES CLUTCH PLAYS: Wide Receiver Devonte Ross had a pair of clutch catches in the fourth
  quarter of Penn State's battle against Oregon. Early in the fourth quarter, Ross hauled in a 35-yard
  touchdown grab to help bring PSU within seven points. In the final minute of regulation, Ross took a
  short pass for seven yards into the end zone to help send the game into overtime. Ross leads PSU with
  three receiving touchdowns this season, including a 42-yard touchdown against FIU.
- ALLEN SCORES IN FOURTH-STRAIGHT GAME: With a 4-yard touchdown rush in overtime against Oregon, Kaytron Allen has scored on a rushing touchdown in all four games this season. He has scored on runs of 12, 67, 18 and 4 yards this year. Allen sits 11th in the nation averaging 7.11 yards per carry and has nine rushes of 10+ yards on the year.
- THE OPPOSITION: UCLA is 0-4 this season after dropping its Big Ten opener against Northwestern, 17-14, last Saturday in Evanston. The Bruins closed out the game with 14 unanswered points, but the Wildcats held on for the win. Nico lamaleava threw for 180 yards and a touchdown, while rushing for 65 yards. UCLA recorded seven tackles for loss on defense.

# **HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN**

## **CAREER AT A GLANCE**

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- With his 104th win at Penn State, in the victory over Villanova, Franklin tied Rip Engle (104; 1950-65) for second all-time at Penn State.
- He reached the 100 win milestone at Penn State in the Nittany Lions' CFP First Round game against SMU. Franklin reached 100 wins at Penn State in 141 games.
- He is one of seven FBS coaches with 100+ wins at their current school (Kirk Ferentz, Iowa; Dabo Swinney, Clemson; Mike Gundy, Oklahoma State; Kyle Whittingham, Utah; Troy Calhoun, Air Force; Kirby Smart, Georgia). Among current FBS coaches with 100+ wins at their current school, Franklin was the third-fastest to 100 wins behind only Smart (117) and Swinney (129).
- Since 2016, Franklin's 74.3% winning percentage (87-30) ranks fourth among current FBS head coaches.
- In the last nine seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of four teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least seven times, joining Alabama, Georgia and Ohio State.
- He joins Ryan Day (Ohio State), Smart and Swinney as the only active coaches in college football to have won at least five New Year's Six or College Football Playoff games during the CFP era.
- Penn State has posted three consecutive 10-win seasons for the first time since 1980-82 and six 10-win seasons in the last nine years for the first time since 1978-86.
- The Nittany Lions have won 34 games over the last three seasons (2022-24), marking the first time in program history that Penn State has won at least 34 games over a three-year span.
- With PSU's victory in the 2022 Rose Bowl Game, Franklin became the fifth coach to win the Rose, Fiesta and Cotton Bowls at the same institution, joining Joe Paterno (Penn State), Bob Stoops (Oklahoma), Mack Brown (Texas) and Terry Donahue (UCLA).
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African
  American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- Franklin has led his teams to six Top 10 finishes (all at Penn State) and nine Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 7 at Penn State).
- Franklin has 30 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 14 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 116 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin has coached 18 All-American selections, 32 national major award winners or finalists and 59 NFL Draft picks at Penn State.
- Franklin is first all-time in total wins and winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins) and became the first (and only) African American FBS head coach to reach 100 career wins.

## **NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD**

- In 2024, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to their first-ever College Football Playoff appearance. Penn State earned a CFP First Round win over SMU (38-10) and a VRBO Fiesta Bowl Quarterfinals win over Boise State (31-14) to claim a berth into the CFP Semifinals. The Nittany Lions reached 13 wins in a season for the first time in program history. The 13-wins marked at least 10 wins in three-straight seasons for the fourth time in program history, first time as a Big ten member, and first time since 1980-82. Penn State tallied 12+ wins in a season for the fourth time in program history, joining the 1973, 1986 and 1994 teams. Defensive end Abdul Carter became the program's 15th Unanimous Consensus All-American. Tight end Tyler Warren, also voted an All-American, was the Nittany Lions' first ever recipient of the John Mackey Award, given to the nation's top tight end, while finishing seventh in the Heisman Trophy voting, the highest finish by an FBS tight end since 1977.
- In 2023, Penn State posted a 10-win season for the second-straight year and reached the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl after finishing 10th in the College Football Playoff Rankings. PSU put together one of its top defensive performances in school history, leading the country in sacks (49) and rushing defense (75.5), while finishing second in total defense (246.7), tackles for loss (111) and fewest first downs allowed (13.9) and third in scoring defense (13.5). The 49 sacks were a school record.
- Penn State defeated No. 8/7/10 Utah, 35-21, in the 109th Rose Bowl Game to cap off the 2022 season. The Nittany Lions reached the 11-win
  plateau for the 19th time in program history.
- Penn State earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in 2021. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- In 2020, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear
  Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked
  ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear"
  Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO
  Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
  over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
  program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
  and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall
  record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway
  Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first
  outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as
  Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the
  Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in 2014 was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

## NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Olumuyiwa Fashanu (2023), Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th, 19th and 20th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.

- PSU won 13 consecutive games against Big Ten opponents from 2016-17, breaking its record of 12 from 1993-94.
- Penn State owns a 264-133-3 mark against Big Ten Conference teams since the Nittany Lions first opposed Ohio State in 1912.
- The Nittany Lions began play as a member of the Big Ten Conference in 1993 and have a 168-97 mark.
- Penn State played 132 games vs. the current Big Ten alignment when either or both Penn State itself (prior to 1993) or the opponent (Nebraska prior to 2011; Maryland and Rutgers prior to 2014; Oregon, UCLA, USC and Washington prior to 2024) was not yet a member of the Big Ten. # **LETTERMEN ON STAFF**

- Seventeen members of the Penn State coaching staff, support staff and athletic department played at Penn State.
- Associate head coach/cornerbacks coach Terry M. Smith was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91.
- Co-offensive coordinator and tight Ends Coach Ty Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making
- Defensive line coach **Deion Barnes** made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Linebacker coach **Dan Connor** was a two-time first-team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- Defensive graduate assistant Jordan Lucas was a reliable member of the defensive backfield during his Penn State career, appearing in 46 games (2012-15).
- Assistant quarterbacks coach Trace McSorley was a threetime All-Big Ten selection and helped Penn State to a Big Ten Championship in 2016.
- Director of performance science Andrew Nelson was a four-year letterwinner on the offensive line for Penn State (2014-17) and appeared in 33 games, making 28 starts.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement Tyrone Smith was a defensive tackle for Penn State and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Assistant director of high performance Dan Vasey was a defensive end with the Nittany Lions (2017-21).
- Senior defensive analyst **Greg Gattuso** was a defensive lineman at Penn Sate from 1981-83.
- Director of player development **Jordan Hill** lettered at Penn State from 2009-12 and finished his Penn State career with 171 total tackles, including 9.5 sacks. He posted a 64-tackle, 4.5-sack season his senior year and was named first-team All-Big Ten for his efforts in 2012.
- Recruiting coordinator for personnel and recruitment Alan **Zemaitis** was a three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Associate director of football academic support services & Academic Counselor Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the football letterman's club Wally Richardson was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown
- Assistant athletic director for the brand academy Omar Easy lettered for the Nittany Lions from 1999 to 2001 and spent time in the NFL with the Kansas City Chiefs and Oakland Raiders.
- Associate director of development Michael Mauti was a four-year letterwinner fo the Nittany Lions and the Big Ten Linebacker of the Year and a first-team All-American in
- Assistant AD for premium seating Bobby White was Co-Captain of the 1986 National Championship Penn State Football team.

# **ACADEMIC SUCCESS**

- The Nittany Lions had 34 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2024.
- Olumuyiwa Fashanu was a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman", and an National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete. He was the 20th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2024, Penn State posted a program-record 93% graduation success rate. The 93% mark tops the previous high GSR of 91% set in 2005 and is just the second time in program history topping 90%. PSU's 89% in 2024 is the 15th consecutive year the football team has surpassed the national average GSR for its sport.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increased Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

# **TEAM NOTES**

## **SERIES HISTORY VS. UCLA**

- Penn State and UCLA will meet for the eighth time with PSU trailing 4-3 in the all-time series.
- The Nittany Lions are 1-2 in road matchups, but won its last road game in the series, 21-6, in 1968.
- PSU won the last two contests in the series.
- Penn State earned a 27-11 win over the Bruins in 2024.
- Drew Allar threw for 237 yards and a touchdown, and added a rushing touchdown, while Kaytron Allen rushed for 78 yards and a score.
- Liam Clifford caught three passes for 107 yards and Tyler Warren hauled in a 5-yard touchdown.
- The Nittany Lion defense recorded seven tackles for loss.

## **STREAKING**

- Penn State has not allowed a special teams touchdown in 81-straight games, dating back to the start of the 2019 season.
- Penn State has won 25-consecutive games over non-conference opponents during the regular season, dating back to a win over Temple in 2016.
- Penn State has won 31-straight non-conference home games, dating back to a win over Kent State in 2013.
- Penn State has won 34-straight games against teams unranked in the AP Poll.

# **OREGON NOTES**

- · Penn State is now 3-3 all-time against Oregon.
- PSU is now 9-8 in overtime games, falling in OT for the first time since a 20-18 loss to Illinois in nine overtimes in 2021.
- Penn State is now 2-4 in multiple-overtime games.
- Penn State welcomed 111,015 fans, its largest Penn State White
  Out attendance and second-largest crowd in West Shore Home
  Field at Beaver Stadium history.
- The Nittany Lions are 11-7 all-time in full-stadium White Outs.
- WR Devonte Ross hauled in a 35-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter, followed by a 7-yard touchdown grab late in the fourth quarter, marking his third career game with multiple receiving touchdowns.
- LB Amare Campbell recorded 11 tackles in the first half and finished the game with a career-high 15 stops.
- Campbell's 15 tackles are Penn State's most since Zakee Wheatley's 16 stops against Notre Dame in the 2025 Orange Bowl.
- K Ryan Barker hit a 49-yard field goal, matching a career long.

# **VILLANOVA NOTES**

- Head Coach James Franklin earned his 104th win at Penn State, tying Rip Engle (104; 1950-65) for second all-time at Penn State.
- QB Ethan Grunkemeyer and TE Joey Schlaffer (19-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter) are the first Penn State teammates to combine on their first career touchdown pass and first career reception as a touchdown reception since Drew Allar and Omari Evans against Ohio in 2022.
- Penn State held opponents scoreless for seven-straight quarters until Villanova's touchdown as time expired. This marked the first time since 2019 that the Nittany Lions have shut out an opponent for seven consecutive quarters.
- CB Jahmir Joseph picked off a pass in the fourth quarter and returned it 49 yards for a touchdown. He is the first Nittany Lion with an interception return for a touchdown this season and the first Nittany Lion with an interception return for a touchdown since Dominic DeLuca (23 yards) and Tony Rojas (59 yards) against SMU in 2024.

### FILL NOTES

- Penn State has outscored FIU, 93-0, in two all-time matchups.
- RB Kaytron Allen's 144 rushing yards rushing moved him to 3,064 for his career, while RB Nicholas Singleton's 76 rushing yards moved him to 3,007 career rushing yards. They became the first Penn State teammates with 3,000 career rushing yards at the same time
- Allen and Singleton are the first FBS teammates with 3,000 career rushing yards at the same time since Louisiana's Trey Ragas and Elijah Mitchell in 2020 and the first Power 4 teammates since Georgia's Nick Chubb and Sony Michel in 2017.
- Penn State has shut out an opponent in each of the last five seasons. The last time Penn State recorded a shutout in fivestraight seasons was 1972-76.
- DT Alonzo Ford Jr. intercepted a pass in the second quarter, joining Zane Durant (vs. Nevada) as Penn State defensive tackles with interceptions this season. The Nittany Lions have interceptions by multiple defensive tackles in a season for the first time since 1990 (Jim Deter vs. Notre Dame; Frank Giannetti vs. Alabama).
- LB Dominic DeLuca blocked a punt in the second quarter. It was his third career blocked punt.

## **NEVADA NOTES**

- The Nittany Lions have won 21 of its last 24 season-opening contests and nine of its last 10. Penn State is 115-22-2 all-time in season openers and 122-13-1 all-time in home openers.
- The 46 points scored by Penn State marked the most points scored by the Nittany Lions in a season opener since notching 79 against Idaho in 2019.
- Penn State scored on its first nine possessions of the game and of the season, alternating touchdowns and field goals (5 TD, 4 FG).
- Penn State scored on its first nine possessions to open the season for the first time since at least 1952.
- In the fourth quarter, Penn State scored a touchdown on a 15-play, 94-yard drive, the longest drive by the Nittany Lions in terms of yards since a 97-yard drive against Oregon in last season's Big Ten Championship Game.
- Penn State forced a takeaway on Nevada's opening drive. DE Dani Dennis-Sutton forced a fumble, which was recovered by CB A.J. Harris.
- Penn State had a takeaway on its first defensive possession of the season for the first time since 1994 vs. Minnesota (Terry Killens recovered).
- Dennis-Sutton recorded his first career game with two forced fumbles. He is the first Nittany Lion with two forced fumbles in a game since Micah Parsons in the 2019 Cotton Bowl against Memphis.

# FRANKLIN CLIMBING WINS LIST AT PSU

- Head Coach James Franklin has tallied 104 wins at Penn State.
- With PSU's win over Villanova, Franklin tied Rip Engle (104; 1950-65) for second all-time at Penn State.
- Franklin earned his 100th win at Penn State in the victory over SMU in 2024, reaching 100 wins in 141 games at Penn State.
- Among current FBS coaches with 100+ wins at their current school, Franklin was the third-fastest to 100 wins behind only Smart (117) and Swinney (129).

# **TEAM NOTES**

## KNOWLES RETURNS TO HOME STATE

- Jim Knowles enters his first season in Happy Valley as defensive coordinator for the Nittany Lions.
- Knowles, a native of Philadelphia and an alum of St. Joseph's Prep, joins the Nittany Lions after spending three seasons as Ohio State's defensive coordinator.
- He played a key role in Ohio State's 2024 National Championship run, as he led a defense that ranked first nationally in total defense and scoring defense.
- Knowles is a 37-year college football coaching veteran.
- A native of Philadelphia, Knowles brings 17 years of experience as a defensive coordinator.
- He brings six years of head coaching experience (all at Cornell) and has made defensive coordinator stops at Ohio State (2022-24), Oklahoma State (2018-21), Duke (2011-17) and Western Michigan (1997-2002).
- Knowles led Ohio State's defense the last three seasons, winning a National Championship with the Buckeyes this past season where his defense ranked first nationally in scoring defense, total defense, yards allowed per play, touchdowns allowed per play and opponents touchdowns scored in the red zone.
- Ohio State's defense also ranked second in sacks, passing touchdowns allowed per game and opponent red zone score percentage, and third in rushing defense, passing defense and sacks per game.

# **DRAYTON JOINS STAFF AS RB COACH**

- Penn State Football added **Stan Drayton** as the program's new running backs coach this offseason.
- Drayton, a native of Cleveland, Ohio, joins the Nittany Lions after spending three seasons as the head coach at Temple.
- He is a 32-year coaching veteran with 25 years of experience coaching running backs. Drayton has been a part of two national championship coaching staffs and brings five years of NFL coaching experience.
- During his coaching career, Drayton has tutored prominent running backs, including Brian Westbrook, Jerious Norwood, Carlos Hyde, Ezekiel Elliott, Bijan Robinson, Matt Forte and Jordan Howard.
- He has coached seven 1,000-yard rushers, five NFL Draft picks and two All-Americans.
- Prior to Temple, Drayton was the associate head coach, running backs coach and run game coordinator at Texas for five seasons under Tom Herman (2017-20) and Steve Sarkisian (2021).
- Prior to Texas, Drayton served as running backs coach for the Chicago Bears from 2015-16, where he led rooms consisting of Jordan Howard, Matt Forte and Jeremy Lanford.
- Before joining the Bears, Drayton coached at Ohio State where he won the 2014 National Championship. He joined OSU as a wide receivers coach in 2011, before leading the running backs for the next three seasons.
- Drayton spent the 2010 season as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Florida for his second stint with the Gators, while also making stops at Syracuse (2009) and Tennessee (2008).

# IN THE CFP RANKINGS

- Penn State opened the 2024 College Football Playoff rankings at No. 6 and was ranked No. 4 in the December 8 poll.
- Penn State is one of six FBS teams who have appeared in each of the last 18 CFP rankings.
- With appearances in the last 18 CFP rankings, Penn State is tied for the fifth-longest active streak among FBS teams.
- · The Nittany Lions have appeared in the CFP rankings 42 times since the College Football Playoff was introduced in 2014.
- Penn State has ranked among the CFP Top 10 on 26 occasions.
- Penn State has finished in the CFP Top 12 seven times, ranking fourth-most among FBS teams and second among Big Ten teams.

## THREE-STRAIGHT 10 WIN SEASONS

- Penn State joins Georgia, Ohio, Ohio State and Oregon as the only FBS teams who posted 10+ win seasons in 2022, 2023 and 2024.
- PSU has posted three-straight 10+ win seasons for the fourth time in program history and its first time as a Big Ten member.
- The Nittany Lions reached 10 wins for the sixth time since 2016.
- Penn State is one of nine FBS teams with at least 10 wins in at least six of the last nine seasons (2016-25), joining Alabama (8), Boise State (6), Clemson (8), Georgia (7), Michigan (6), Notre Dame (7), Ohio State (8) and Oklahoma (6).
- PSU earned 34 wins over the last three seasons (2022, 2023, 2024). It marked the most wins in any three-year span, bettering 1971-73 (33 wins).
- Penn State joins Georgia (39), Michigan (36), Ohio State (36) and Oregon (35) among FBS teams with 34+ wins over the last three seasons.
- In 2024, the Nittany Lions reached 13 wins in a season for the first time in program history.
- PSU tallied 12+ wins for the fourth time in program history, first time under James Franklin, 11 wins for the 20th time and 11 regular season wins for the seventh time.
- The Nittany Lions have won 11 games in a season for five times under Franklin (2016, 2017, 2019, 2022, 2024).
- In 2024, Penn State won eight Big Ten games in a season for the third time in program history and earned 10 wins and five road wins in a season for the ninth time in school history.

## ON TV

- Penn State has had 379 of its last 381 games televised, including 279 consecutive games.
- Over the last 21 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on ABC, BTN, CBS, NBC, Peacock or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 356 regular season TV appearances since
- The Nittany Lions averaged 4.59 million viewers in 2024.

# **PENN STATE WHITE OUT**

- A tradition stretching back to a student section White Out in 2004, Penn State White Outs have created an unrivaled atmosphere inside Beaver Stadium.
- Penn State's CFP First Round game vs. SMU marked the 17th time the Nittany Lions hosted a full-stadium Penn State White Out.
- Penn State holds a 11-7 record when the full stadium wears
- Six of Penn State's Top 10 most-attended games have been White Outs, including 111,015 fans against Oregon in 2025, which ranks second all-time.
- Penn State's first full-stadium White Out was against Notre Dame in 2007.

## **OVERTIME OVER TIME**

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 17 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Eleven of the 17 overtime tilts have come at home, four in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 9-8 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-6 record at Beaver Stadium, 2-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

- Penn State is set to battle Oregon at 7:30 p.m. on NBC on September 27. The 2025 season marks the 25th-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State is 66-36 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 23-12 at home, 30-15 on the road and 13-9 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-7 in bowl games and 1-1 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the then-longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.
