**MINNEAPOLIS** - The No. 6 seed Minnesota men's hockey team begins its postseason journey presented by Affinity Plus Federal Credit Union on Wednesday. The Maroon and Gold take the ice for a Big Ten Conference Tournament Quarterfinal matchup with the third-seed Nittany Lions of Penn State.

The Golden Gophers need to win three games to capture the tournament title and extend their NCAA Tournament streak to six years. That starts Wednesday at Pegula Ice Arena at 6 p.m. (CT), streaming live on B1G+ and featuring audio coverage through the Gopher Radio Network on AM-1130 KTLK.

### LAST TIME ON THE ICE

Minnesota closed the regular season at home against No. 2/3 Michigan State, falling 7-1 Thursday as the Spartans broke the game open with four second-period goals to clinch their third-straight B1G regular-season title. On Friday, the Gophers responded on Senior Night with a 3-3 tie before claiming the shootout victory after erasing a two-goal deficit. Brodie Ziemer and Mason Moe led the charge with a goal and an assist each. LJ Mooney had a pair of assists, while he and fellow freshman Javon Moore scored in the shootout. Luca Di Pasquo turned aside two attempts to secure the team's third-consecutive shootout win.

### GOPHERS IN THE B1G TOURNEY

Minnesota holds an all-time record of 15-12 during the B1G Tournament, winning titles in 2015 and 2021, and are 3-3 when facing Penn State in the postseason. The two teams last met in the 2024 quarterfinals where the Gophers won both games of the three-game series and have won three-consecutive meetings during the conference event. This year marks the first time the 'U' enters the tournament as a seed lower than fifth and just the third time ever being lower than a No. 3 seed. Wednesday also will be the first true road tilt for the Maroon and Gold since losing in overtime at Notre Dame in the 2019 championship game, holding a 0-2 record on the road.

### THANK YOU SENIORS

Minnesota's 2026 senior class of Brody Lamb, John Mittelstadt, Luke Mittelstadt, Cal Thomas and Zach Wiese have all spent the last four seasons proudly wearing the Maroon and Gold, providing experience and stability across every position. The group includes leaders who have contributed in every situation, from power-play goals and game winners to blocked shots and ironman durability. Together, they have totaled 220 career points while anchoring the blue line, delivering in clutch moments and setting the standard in the locker room. As they played their final weekend at 3M Arena at Mariucci, the class leaves behind a legacy defined by leadership, consistency and an unwavering commitment to the Gopher men's hockey program.

### ZIEMER KEEPS LIGHTING THE LAMP

Brodie Ziemer is operating at a more than point-per-game pace and is leading the Gophers in scoring with 36 points in 35 games, while his 11 power-play goals still owns the NCAA's top spot. The sophomore closed 2025 on a blistering run, lighting the lamp in six of the final seven outings with a pair of three-game goal streaks and piled up eight goals and 11 points across that stretch. The Chaska, Minn., native delivered back-to-back multi-goal efforts at Ohio State in December to earn B1G First Star honors (Dec. 9). Ziemer has continued that trend in 2026, finding the back of the net 11 times in

## GOPHER NOTES CONTINUED

16 games for a career-best 23 goals, which ranks fourth in the country and tied for the most of any B1G skater. His two-goal effort in the upset win at No. 2 Michigan on Feb. 26 stretched his point streak to a career-best eight games and gave him 18 goals in a 21-game span since Nov. 14.

**MOONEY MAGIC**

LJ Mooney's breakaway goal to close the sweep of the Fighting Irish on Nov. 8 highlighted the speed and skill of the Gophers' rookie. It was the first multi-point night of his young career, and he has taken off down the stretch, tallying eight more multi-point performances to put up 23 points in the last 20 games. He has more outings of multiple points than times being left off the scoresheet during that stretch. The West Mifflin, Pa., native has at least one point in 15 of 17 series played, totaling seven goals and a team-leading 23 assists, which ranks fourth among NCAA freshmen. Eighteen of those points have come during Minnesota's 27 total power-play goals where his vision and creativity are on full display. His two points in the series opener versus Ohio State (Feb. 6) stretched Mooney's point streak to seven games, the third-longest of any Gopher this season.

**LAMB PILES ON POINTS**

Senior captain Brody Lamb has been a driving force behind the Gophers' offense, tying for second on the team with a career-best 30 points on 14 goals and 16 assists. He reached double-digit goals for the third-straight season with the 15th power-play tally of his career versus Michigan (Jan. 17). The Byron, Minn., native posted consecutive three-point outings at Denver (Nov. 29) and Ohio State (Dec. 4), recording four multi-point performances over the final eight games of 2025 before adding his team-leading eighth multi-point effort of the season against Wisconsin (Jan. 31). By reaching the scoresheet in both outings at Notre Dame, Lamb pushed his point streak to a career-long nine games, the 10th-longest in the NCAA this season, and had five goals and six helpers during that stretch.

**LUKE DOING IT ALL**

In the late stages of his final college hockey campaign, captain Luke Mittelstadt continues to bear a heavy workload while playing at an exceptionally high level. He's put up 21 points this season in nearly 27 minutes of ice time per game against the nation's top forward groups. The Eden Prairie, Minn., native is second for the Gophers with 19 assists, leading the B1G and 13th among all NCAA defensemen, with 15 of those points coming while running the blue line on the man advantage. His first goal of the year, a power-play game winner against Notre Dame (Nov. 8), ended a 23-game scoring drought and capped the series sweep, while his second goal was also the winner to finish a B1G sweep of No. 8/7 Wisconsin (Jan. 31). Behind his two-assist effort in the upset over No. 2 Michigan on Feb. 26, the senior crossed the 20-point mark for the third time in his four-year career, becoming the 15th defenseman to record such a feat in program history.

**LUDTKE PROVIDES LATE SPARK**

Junior Tanner Ludtke has provided a timely boost to the Gophers' offense down the stretch, finding a rhythm as the regular season closed. The forward recorded two goals in the last four games and carried a three-game point streak into the season finale, helping generate momentum in the lineup. The Lakeville, Minn., native finished the final nine games of the regular season with five points, showcasing an uptick in production at a key moment, adding scoring depth heading into the postseason, while all six of his goals scored this season have come against top-10 opponents.

**OVERTIME HERO EARNS MOORE B1G STAR**

Javon Moore played the role of overtime hero for the Maroon and Gold in its upset at the fourth-ranked Pioneers in late November, scoring with just 35 seconds left in the extra session. The freshman's first collegiate game winner capped a two-point night and earned him B1G Second Star of the Week honors. A native of Carver, Minn., Moore had points in eight of 10 appearances between Nov. 8 and Jan. 10, totaling 11 points in that stretch, including three of his four multi-point efforts, two of which sparked top-five upsets of Penn State (Nov. 21) and Denver (Nov. 29). He has picked up his offense late in the campaign, reaching the scoresheet in each five of the last six regular-season outings, setting a season-long point streak of five games, to push his point total to 20 for the season.

**LUCA A SHUTOUT STAR**

Luca Di Pasquo stopped 52-of-53 shots he faced to lead the Gophers to a series sweep of Notre Dame and was named the B1G Second Star of the Week (Nov. 11). The Livonia, Mich., native recorded his first shutout with the Maroon and Gold, third of his career, and also added an assist in the third period for the first point of his NCAA tenure. The junior continued that trend by making 33 saves in the series finale against the Irish before backstopping Minnesota with a brilliant, career-best 47-save performance to secure an upset over No. 4 Denver (Nov. 29). He was at the top of his game again during the Feb. 26 upset of the second-ranked Wolverines where he stopped 37-of-39 shots and collected his second assist of the year. Di Pasquo's .920 save percentage in league play ranks second among all B1G netminders.

**AN INSIDE LOOK AT PENN STATE**

The Nittany Lions closed the regular season at home getting swept by Wisconsin and have struggled down the stretch, holding a 2-5-3 record over their last 10 outings with five of those contests going into overtime. Penn State continues to produce at a high level offensively, averaging 3.7 goals per game thanks to a power play that converts 27.3 percent of its chances, both of which rank seventh in the country. The team remains the NCAA leader in penalty minutes per game at 19.3 a night and 656 total minutes, which is nearly 400 minutes more than the Gophers' total of 276. Freshman Gavin McKenna sits second nationally at 48 points to pace the B1G and his 34 helpers are the most in the nation.



## GOPHER NOTES CONTINUED

Matt DiMarsico leads the team with 17 goals and has totaled 40 points this year. Goaltenders Joshua Fleming and Kevin Reidler continue to split the minutes with Fleming holding the statistical edge behind a 2.59 goals-against average and a .924 save percentage, but Reidler has 11 victories.

### HISTORY WITH THE NITTANY LIONS

Minnesota holds a 33-22-1 (.598) record in the all-time series versus Penn State that dates back to the 2013-14 campaign. The Gophers dropped the final three meetings in the 2025-26 season series after claiming an upset in the first matchup back on Nov. 21. Under Coach Motzko, the Maroon and Gold are just 6-7-1 in games at Pegula Ice Arena having lost four of the last five road games with the only win coming in the regular-season finale a year ago that clinched a share of the B1G title for Minnesota. This season, Brodie Ziemer is the only Gopher to record multiple goals versus PSU, while Javon Moore has a team-best three points in the four games. Goaltender Luca Di Pasquo owns a remarkable .941 save percentage and a 2.46 goals-against average when facing the Nittany Lions in two appearances.

### STREAK FINALLY SNAPPED

After more than 2,000 days without a shootout goal or victory, Minnesota ended both droughts against Boston College on Oct. 10 thanks to a pair of newcomers. LJ Mooney and Tanner Ludtke each converted in the shootout, while goaltender Nathan Airey turned aside both Eagles' attempts to secure the Gophers' first shootout win since Feb. 14, 2020, at Notre Dame. The victory snapped an 11-shootout skid during which Minnesota had gone 28 consecutive attempts without a goal. The Maroon and Gold have kept that winning trend with victories at Notre Dame on Feb. 13 and Mar. 6 against Michigan State to close the regular season. Mooney and fellow freshman Javon Moore provided the goals in both of those shootout wins where the Gophers converted 2-of-3 attempts.

### POWER PLAY POTENCY

After striking just four times in the first 13 games of the season, the power play has now converted a total of 27 times for the year, including goals in seven straight before the streak ended against Ohio State (Feb. 7). That has risen the Gophers to ninth nationally at 27.0 percent as the 5-on-4 unit has surged thanks to Brodie Ziemer's NCAA-best 11 goals. The 22 goals between Nov. 15 and Feb. 7 were the most by any team in the NCAA as Minnesota converted at a 47.8 percent clip (22-for-46) during that span. Freshman LJ Mooney leads the team with 18 points on the man advantage this year, while Ziemer (17), Brody Lamb (15) and Luke Mittelstadt (15) have also reached double-digit points.

### TOP-10 VICTORIES

Thanks to a sweep of No. 8/7 Wisconsin at home to close January and another road upset of No. 2 Michigan last Thursday, the Gophers have now logged six victories over top-10 opponents, accounting for more than half of their total wins this season. The stretch began with a road triumph at No. 8 North Dakota on Oct. 18 and continued with a home victory over No. 5 Penn State on Nov. 21. Minnesota then delivered an upset of No. 4 Denver in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game on Nov. 29 to close the first half of the season, before the wins against the Badgers snapped a seven-game skid. The victory over the Wolverines marked the 53rd top-10 win of Head Coach Bob Motzko's tenure.

### ROAD CHALLENGES IN LEAGUE PLAY

Minnesota struggled on the road during B1G play, going 2-9-1 and suffered sweeps at No. 14 Wisconsin, No. 9 Penn State, and No. 2 Michigan State. In those league outings, the Gophers were outscored 43-28, scoring more than two goals just three times, while opponents converted 31.0 percent of their power-play chances to average 3.6 goals per game. Slow starts and possession have been key factors, as Minnesota fell behind in eight of the 12 contests and won just 42.1 percent of faceoffs overall.

### YOUNG GOPHERS MAKING MAJOR IMPACT

Minnesota's rookies have made a significant impact, accounting for more than 30 percent of the team's offense, posting 81 points on 27 goals and 54 assists. The group combined for six points in the upset of Denver, including three goals and the overtime winner, and contributed offensively in 29 of 35 games. LJ Mooney leads the class and is second on the team with 30 points, including 18 on the power play. Moore's hot streak down the stretch increased his total to 20, ranking fifth for the Gophers, while Moe and Tate Pritchard have also reached double digits with 12 and 10 points, respectively. Townsend and Jacob Rombach recorded their first collegiate points against Long Island (Nov. 15) and Finn McLaughlin tallied an assist in his NCAA debut versus Michigan Tech (Oct. 3).

### BUILT ON SACRIFICE

The Maroon and Gold continue to turn defensive sacrifice into a national best, ranking second in the country with 567 blocked shots, averaging 16.2 per game, which is more than 100 higher than the next closest team from the Big Ten. The Gophers' commitment to getting sticks and bodies in shooting lanes is led by sophomore John Whipple and senior captain Cal Thomas, who rank third and fourth in the country with 79 and 76 blocks, respectively, while senior Luke Mittelstadt also ranks 19th nationally behind 63. Brody Lamb's 38 blocks rank eighth among all forwards in the country, showcasing his dedication at both ends of the ice.

### GAUNTLET RUN FROM START TO FINISH

Minnesota's 2025-26 regular-season slate was once again daunting from start to finish. Of the Gophers' 35 games, 23 were against teams that were ranked in the national polls, including 11 versus top-five foes, with six more against opponents that received votes at the time of the matchup. The schedule is the most difficult in the country after facing six top-10 opponents during the final eight weeks. Minnesota is no stranger to difficult schedules, having battled the nation's No. 4 strength of schedule in 2023-24 and the No. 2 schedule the year before. Even last year's "dip" to the No. 19 toughest schedule still placed the Gophers among the most battle-tested teams in the country.

### PUTTING THE GOLD IN GOPHERS

In the early hours of Feb. 22, former Gophers Brock Faber and Jackson LaCombe were awarded gold

medals with Team USA after an epic, overtime victory over rival Canada to cap the 2026 Olympic Winter Games in Milan, Italy. They became the 13th and 14th skaters from Minnesota men's hockey to claim Olympic gold following previous wins in 1960 and 1980. Another former Maroon and Gold player made a major impact overseas as Erik Haula claimed a medal thanks to his six points in six games that helped Finland earn bronze. He scored the eventual medal-clinching tally during a two-goal effort in the victory against Slovakia on Saturday. Gophers' strength and conditioning coach Cal Dietz also helped the Americans win a gold medal on the women's side where five current and former Minnesota skaters were on the team.

### LEFTY HEAVY LINEUP

Minnesota's 2025-26 roster features 17 left-handed skaters out of 22, nearly 80 percent of the team, including seven of the team's eight defensemen. That figure is well above the norm in hockey, where left-handed shooters account for between 60-65 percent left-handed, while most college programs fall even closer to a 60-40 split. With such a skew, Minnesota will regularly ice entire forward lines and defensive pairs comprised solely of left-handed shooters this season.

### DEPARTED FIREPOWER

Losing its top five scorers via early departure to the National Hockey League, Jimmy Snuggerud (51 pts), Connor Kurth (39 pts), Matthew Wood (39 pts), Oliver Moore (33 pts), and Sam Rinzel (32 pts), leaves a massive void in Minnesota's offensive production heading into the 2025-26 season. Those five skaters combined for 194 of the team's 415 points, nearly 47 percent of the total. Their departure also strips out a wealth of experience, as all were among the most consistent producers in goals, assists, and special teams contributions. The Gophers will turn to their younger players to step into primary roles and increase secondary scoring.

### EXPERIENCE IN THE CENTURY CLUB

Four-year seniors Brody Lamb and Luke Mittelstadt took to the ice for the 150th time in their careers on Feb. 26 at Michigan and on Mar. 5 versus Michigan State, respectively. Two others from the Gophers' senior class, Cal Thomas and John Mittelstadt, have reached the 100-career-game milestone, playing in 135 and 133, respectively. Junior Jimmy Clark joined the group when he skated in his 100th game versus Michigan (Jan. 16). Luke's games are tied for the most among all active NCAA defensemen, and Lamb's appearances are tied for fourth among all active players. Beyond the numbers, this experienced core has helped Minnesota capture two B1G regular-season titles and earn three NCAA Tournament berths, providing a steady presence for the team this season.

### WE ARE THE STATE OF HOCKEY

The state of Minnesota continues to lead college hockey, with 223 NCAA Division I men's players coming from the state, nearly a quarter of all American-born student-athletes and more than double any other state, per data from College Hockey Inc. The Gophers contribute heavily to that total with 20 homegrown players on this year's

roster, including seven of their 10 newcomers. Remarkably, 19 of those 20 players are from within 70 miles of 3M Arena at Mariucci.

## LUCKY 13 VIA THE NHL DRAFT

Minnesota begins the campaign with 13 NHL-drafted players on its roster, the fourth-most of any NCAA program, but will take the ice without a first-round draft pick for the first time since the 2018-19 season. After being selected in the second round over the summer, Jacob Rombach is the highest-drafted prospect for the Gophers this season, while Mason Moe (2025), Brodie Ziemer (2024), and Tanner Ludtke (2023) were all picked in the third round of their respective draft class. The Maroon and Gold lead all NCAA men's hockey programs with 248 total draft selections, a number boosted by five more in June 2025, including two future signed prospects. Dating back to 1974, at least one Gopher has been chosen in 51 of the last 52 NHL Entry Drafts, with 2001 standing as the lone exception.

## SIZE BECOMES A STRENGTH

With the additions of Jacob Rombach (6-6) and Javon Moore (6-4), Minnesota brings an added size element to its 2025-26 roster. The Gophers' eight defensemen now average just over 6-2, while the full roster checks in at an average of 6-1. By combining size with speed and skill, Minnesota has the versatility and physical presence to match up with any team in the country.

## DIPPED INTO THE PORTAL

With 11 letterwinners from last season no longer on the roster, Minnesota turned to the transfer portal to add three players with NCAA experience. Forward Tanner Ludtke looks to bounce back after an injury-shortened sophomore season at Omaha in 2024-25 and return to form when he paced the Mavericks with 28 points during his first collegiate campaign. Goaltender Luca Di Pasquo will compete for the starting job following two years at Michigan State where he tallied a 9-1-1 record, 1.95 goals-against average and a .925 save percentage. The Gophers also welcomed Minnetonka graduate Graham Harris, who led Augsburg in scoring as a freshman last year behind 22 points in 25 games.

## STANLEY CUP RUN CONTINUES

When the final seconds of the 2024-25 National Hockey League season ran off the clock, a Minnesota program record was established. For the fourth-consecutive season, a former Gophers' skater won the Stanley Cup as Nate Schmidt became the 14th player or coach representing the Maroon and Gold to hoist the prestigious trophy. He followed Erik Johnson (Colorado Avalanche-2022), Phil Kessel (Vegas Golden Knights-2023), and Kyle Okposo (Florida Panthers-2024) in that stretch of champions.

## DEFENSEMAN 'U'

Minnesota was the lone college hockey program

in the country with more than 10 blue liners in the NHL last season. A total of 12 former Gopher defensemen took the ice in the NHL during the 2024-25 campaign, accounting for more than 600 games played. Highlighted in that group was Erik Johnson becoming the ninth former Minnesota skater to reach the 1,000-game milestone when he hit the mark last November and capped by Nate Schmidt's Stanley Cup victory with the Florida Panthers. At the collegiate level, Minnesota has dominated the Big Ten Conference's postseason awards dedicated to defensive play, winning six of the 12 Defensive Player of the Year awards distributed, including three of the last four.

## PROVEN PATH TO THE PROS

Minnesota continues to make its mark on professional hockey, as 36 players with ties to the program participated in NHL training camps for the 2025-26 season, representing 20 different organizations. The group, which spans back to the 2009 roster, features 15 former team captains and 10 All-Americans. The Gophers' NHL presence remains unmatched across college hockey. A total of 25 alumni skated in the league last season, pushing the all-time number of Minnesota players to reach the NHL to an NCAA-best 131. Four more joined the list in 2024-25, as Oliver Moore, Sam Rinzel, Jimmy Snuggerud, and Matthew Wood each made their professional debut following their collegiate seasons in Maroon and Gold.

## MOTZKO DEALING CRAZY EIGHTS

Minnesota head coach Bob Motzko, the 2023 Spencer Penrose Coach of the Year, enters his eighth season behind the bench and owns a 172-103-24 record after guiding the Gophers to five consecutive 20-win seasons. In six of his first seven years at the helm, Minnesota was ranked in the top five nationally at some point, including holding the No. 1 spot in four of the last five seasons. Motzko is the sixth coach in program history to reach 150 wins and has been named BIG Coach of the Year three times. His win over No. 4 Denver on Nov. 29 was the 50th top-10 win he's secured and after another upset at No. 2 Michigan, has taken down a top-five opponent 20 times with the Gophers.

## HOCKEY IN THE FAMILY

Family ties run deep in Minnesota men's hockey, with four current players continuing the Gophers tradition. John and Luke Mittelstadt followed their older brother, Casey, who played at Minnesota during the 2017-18 season. Together, the three Mittelstadt siblings have totaled 104 points across 249 career games. Sophomore Beckett Hendrickson also carries on a legacy, his father, Darby, and uncle, Dan, combined for 124 points while each spending at least two seasons in the Maroon and Gold. Beckett is also making a uniform change this year and will wear the same No. 7 sweater as his dad. Freshman LJ Mooney adds to the lineage as well, joining his cousin, Logan Cooley, as two of the program's three Pennsylvania-born players. Cooley left his mark as a First Team All-American after a 60-point freshman season in 2022-23.


