

Career Preparation: 4-Year Plan

Engage: All student athletes will engage in their studies and their career preparation.

Reflect: All student athletes will reflect on their career preparation through: (1) their career coach in the Career Engagement Office, (2) follow-up surveys via the Qualtrics software, and (3) workshops.

Serve: Student athletes will join Redhawk Landing. Alumni will return to campus for the annual Student Athlete Career Event and serve as mentors through Redhawk Landing.

Prepare: All student athletes will complete their digital footprint (e.g., Redhawk Landing, LinkedIn, Handshake), resume, meet with a career coach, and attend the student athlete career event in their career preparation.

Freshmen: In the Fall, freshmen would attend a workshop led by the Career Engagement Office related to: "engaging with new confidence: how to make an engaging introduction in different social settings - how to ask engaging questions in a conversation - how to engage a room full of people you have never met ... "

In the Spring, freshmen complete a survey to reflect on the skills learned at this workshop and how they have applied those skills.

Sophomores, Juniors & Seniors: Attend the Redhawk Student Athlete Career Event.

Sophomores: Prior to the career event, join Redhawk Landing and complete at least one informational interview with an alum. Additionally, meet with a career coach in the Career Engagement Office.

Juniors & Seniors: During the Fall Quarter, attend a workshop led by the Career Engagement Office regarding Redhawk Landing. The juniors and seniors will join the platform and the Student Athlete Alumni & Students Group.

Juniors: Prior to the career event, begin to fully utilize Redhawk Landing, complete Digital Footprint (LinkedIn, Handshake), resume, meet with career coach, etc.





Seniors: At the start of senior year (preferably in August or September before school starts), seniors will check in describing their career plans for after Seattle U so that the Career Engagement Office and Student Athlete Services can best assist the senior. With their career coach, the student athletes will create three-to-five action steps which they will communicate to their coaches. Seniors will complete their action steps prior to the career event.

Redhawk Student Athlete Career Event (second Monday of the Spring Quarter)

Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors will receive a different "Bingo Card" to be completed that evening with specific tasks to be completed. Seattle U stickers will be used as bingo "chips." The teams will compete against each other for completing their Bingo Cards.

Networking/Speed Interviewing

- 1. After the keynote speaker, introduce the recruiters, alumni and guests to the studentathletes.
- 2. Describe "how to" network/interview.
- 3. Hand out bingo cards to the student-athletes.
- 4. Bistro Tables/Tables + Signs Showing the Profession/Employer + Name tags
