ABOUT THE CARDINAL

Stanford returns two starters and nine letterwinners overall from last season's squad that won 19 games overall and reached the postseason for the first time in three years. Headlining the group are sophomores Daejon Davis and KZ Okpala. Davis, who started all 33 games he played in, was named to the five-member All-Pac-12 Freshman Team last season after averaging 10.7 points and 4.8 assists. He broke Brevin Knight's freshman assist record with 160 last season. Okpala, who started 2I of the 23 games he played in, averaged 10.0 ppg last year. The forward poured in a career-best 23 points against UCLA in the Pac-12 Tournament. The Cardinal also returns senior center Josh Sharma, who owns 87 career blocks, including 27 last season.

PRESEASON HONORS

Redshirt junior Matej Kavas, a Ljubljana, Slovenia native, who has been named a preseason All-WAC First Team selection by both the league's nine head coaches and the WAC media. The 6-8 guard was the Redhawks' leading scorer in 2017-18, averaging 15.2 points per game. He also averaged 5.1 rebounds and 1.2 assists, led the team in scoring II times and scored 20 points or more nine times. Kavas led the WAC with 9I three-pointers and finished the year ranked eighth in the nation, hitting 46.4 percent from beyond the arc. Kavas was named the WAC Freshman of the Year in 2016-17.

WAC PRESEASON POLLS

In a vote of the Western Athletic Conference men's basketball head coaches, the Redhawks were picked to finish third during the 2018-19 season. The Redhawks earned 45 points and edged out fourth-place pick, Utah Valley, who earned 43 points in the coaches voting. Reigning WAC champion New Mexico State is the 2018-19

preseason favorite, earning 63 points and seven first-place votes. Grand Canyon followed with 58 points and two first-place votes.

In the simultaneously released WAC media poll, Seattle U was selected to finish fourth (150 points) behind preseason media favorite New Mexico State (214 points), Grand Canyon (180 points) and Utah Valley (162 points).

TRIO OF TRANSFERS

A trio of transfers who spent the 2017-18 season redshirting at Seattle U will immediately infuse the Redhawk line-up this winter. Myles Carter, a 6-9 forward from Seton Hall, and Delante Jones, a 6-5 guard from American, will both be redshirt juniors in 2018-19, while Dashawn McDowell, a 6-5 guard from SMU.

Jones comes with the most notable credentials of the three. The Chantilly, Va., native was named Patriot League Rookie of the Year in 2015-16 after averaging 12.0 points, 3.6 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game. He started all 30 games in 2016-17, averaging 11.5 points, 3.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game.

CARDINAL CONNECTION

Seattle U assistant coach Nick Robinson is not only a 2004 graduate of Stanford University, but also the author of "The Shot" or more aptly known as the "The Miracle at Maples." On Feb. 7, 2004, Robinson hit a 35-foot running shot as time expired to cap a six-point comeback in the final 25 seconds and give No. 2 Stanford an 80-77 win over No. 12 Arizona at Maples Pavilion.

During his collegiate career, the Cardinal to an impressive 92-34 record, four trips to the NCAA Tournament, a Pac-IO championship, and a No. I national ranking during the 2003-04 season. Robinson went on to serve two seasons as an assistant coach at his alma mater.. He contributed to the development of three future NBA players and assisted the team as they reached the 2007 NCAA Tournament and the 2008 NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the Sweet I6.

YEAR ONE UNDER HEAD COACH JIM HAYFORD

The 2017-18 Redhawks finished 20-14 overall, 16-3 on their home court and 8-6 in Western Athletic Conference play. The win total marked a program high since returning to Division I in 2008-09, and marked the first 20-win DI season since 1963-64 when Seattle U finished 22-6. The 16 home victories was also a



modern-day DI record, while the eight WAC wins was the most since joining the league in 2012-13. The fourth-place finish ties the best finish during the Redhawks six years competing in the WAC.

The season culminated in the program's third national postseason tournament appearance in the past four seasons — a berth in the Collegiate Basketball Invitational (CBI).

Hayford's up-tempo style of play saw the Redhawks set numerous modern-day DI program records including total points (2,589), field goals (881), field goal percentage (44.6), three-point field goals (312), free-throw percentage (73.8), rebounds (1,298) and blocks (123). The team would finish ranked in the top three in the WAC in scoring (2nd, 76.1 ppg), free-throw percentage (3rd, 73.8), field goal percentage (3rd, 44.6), field goal percentage defense (3rd, 40.7), three-point field goal percentage (2nd, 37.0), rebounding offense (3rd, 8.2 rpg), blocks (3rd, 123), three pointers (1st, 312).

Three Redhawks earned postseason honors from the WAC, including Aaron Menzies (Second Team All-WAC, All-Defensive Team), Matej Kavas (Second Team All-WAC) and Jordan Hill (All-Newcomer Team).

Menzies would set an all-time program record with 79 blocks and a modern-day DI record with 302 rebounds.

HOME HEAVY 2018-19 SLATE

The Redhawks will play a 19-game home schedule in 2018-19, and host 22 total contests as the schedule includes a three-team, six-game tournament. The Redhawk Center, located on the Seattle U campus, will serve as the primary venue for the 2018-19 season due to the renovation and shutdown of KeyArena, scheduled to take place in 2019 and 2020. Seattle U is excited to partner with the Oak View Group and return to the newly-renovated \$700 million Seattle Center Arena in 2020-21.

"Bringing games back on campus in recent years has reinvigorated the campus community," said Head Coach Jim Hayford. "An engaged campus and excited student body creates a rowdy home-court atmosphere. We are also look forward to returning to a world-class arena in the heart of Seattle as soon as it's completed."

This season, Seattle U will also take advantage of the unique opportunity to engage the greater South Sound community during Veteran's Day weekend and Nov. 14 with two key dates at the accesso ShoWare Center in Kent, Wash.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Seattle U has compiled a 22I-I44 (.605) record in North Court, including a I5-game winning streak that began Nov. 5, 2008 with a perfect I0-0 mark during the 2008-09 season. In 20I7-I8, the Redhawks went 9-I at the Redhawk Center.

HAYFORD EARNS CONTRACT EXTENSION
Head Coach Jim Hayford received a contract extension through 2023, Director of Athletics Shaney Fink announced Sept. 12, 2018.

"Coach Hayford has proven to be the right leader for our program as he propelled the team forward in his first year, leading us to the most successful season in recent history," said Fink. "We are excited to announce the extension of his contract and look forward to the continued development of the program under his guidance."

In his first season at the helm of the program, Hayford revitalized the Redhawks on the court, in the classroom and in the community.

The 2017-18 Redhawks finished 20-14 overall, 16-3 on their home court and 8-6 in Western Athletic Conference play. The win total marked a program high since returning to Division I in 2008-09, and marked the first 20-win DI season since 1963-64 when Seattle U finished 22-6. The 16 home victories was also a modern-day DI record, while the eight WAC wins was the most since joining the league in 2012-13.

"I believe in the vision that the Seattle University leadership has for our men's basketball program," Hayford said. "And I am grateful for their belief in the leadership of my staff and I as we continue to pursue the lofty goals we share for Seattle U basketball."

The Redhawks achieved a team cumulative GPA of 3.012 for the 2017-18 academic year, earning them

a Team Academic Excellence Award by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). Five players concluded the year with a 3.2 cumulative GPA or higher while four Redhawks – Mattia Da Campo, Morgan Means, Matej Kavas and Jake Spurgeon – were also named to the 2017-18 Winter All-Western Athletic Conference Academic Team.

The squad also spent ample time engaging in the local community, including multiple volunteer activities at Bailey Gatzert Elementary School.

ALUM RETURNS TO COACHING STAFF

Sam Kirby has returned to his alma mater, joining the Redhawks' coaching staff as an assistant coach. Kirby was a member of the Seattle U squad for the 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons, the latter year resulting in a 20-9 overall record, a Great Northwest Athletic Conference title and the program's first NCAA Division II Tournament berth in 38 years.

"Having an alum of Seattle U on our staff is a tremendous asset and we're happy to welcome Sam back to campus," said Hayford. "Sam is recognized as one of the up-and-coming assistant coaches on the West Coast and we're excited that he chose to return to Seattle U."

Kirby returns to the Redhawk program following seven seasons of serving as an assistant coach at Cal Poly under Joe Callero, who also served as the head coach at Seattle U from 2001-09. Kirby was involved in floor coaching, game planning and scouting, while also serving as the program's recruiting coordinator during his final three years.

"It's been truly an amazing experience to be able to come back to the school, community and city that helped turn me into the man I am today," said Kirby. "This is a dream come true. Not many college coaches get to go back to their alma mater. Thank you to Head Coach Jim Hayford and the rest of the Redhawk staff for being so gracious during this process. I'm excited to be back and cannot wait to get to work."

A Sacramento native, Kirby served as a student assistant coach at Seattle U during the 2007-08 campaign while completing a bachelor's degree in liberal studies with a minor in psychology.

Inheriting a program that went 13-17 in 2016-17, Hayford led the 2017-18 Redhawks to finish 20-14 overall, 16-3 on their home court and 8-6 in Western Athletic Conference play. The win total marked a program high since returning to Division I in 2008-09, and marked the first 20-win DI season since 1963-64 when Seattle U finished 22-6. The I6 home victories was also a modern-day DI record, while the eight WAC wins was the most since joining the league in 2012-13. The fourth-place finish ties the best finish during the Redhawks six years com-

peting in the WAC. The season culminated in Hayford's 10th national postseason appearance as a head coach as the Redhawks earned a berth in the Collegiate Basketball Invitational (CBI).

Hayford's up-tempo style of play saw the Redhawks set numerous modern-day DI program records including total points (2,589), field goals (881), field goal percentage (44.6), three-point field goals (312), free-throw percentage (73.8), rebounds (1,298) and blocks (123). Three Redhawks earned postseason honors from the WAC, including junior center Aaron Menzies (Second Team All-WAC, All-Defensive Team), sophomore guard Matej Kavas (Second Team All-WAC) and graduate guard Jordan Hill (All-Newcomer Team). Menzies would set an all-time program record with 79 blocks and a modern-day DI record with 302 rebounds.

Hayford has 19 total seasons as a head coach, amassing an overall record of 380-189 (.668). Prior to Seattle U, he had stints at EWU, Whitworth (NCAA DIII) and Sioux Falls (NAIA). He has coached in IO national postseason tournaments, including six (2003, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011) at NCAA Division III Whitworth, three at EWU (2015, 2016, 2017) and one at Seattle U (2018).

In 2016-17, Hayford completed his sixth season as the head coach at EWU, leading the Eagles to a 22-12 overall record and a 13-5 mark in Big Sky Conference play. In six seasons with Hayford at the helm, the Eagles went to the NCAA Tournament (2015), the CBI Tournament (2016, 2017), earned a Big Sky regular season co-championship (2015) and won the Big Sky Tournament title (2015). Under Hayford, the Eagles had one Big Sky Conference Player of the Year (Jacob Wiles, 2017), two Big Sky Freshmen of the Year, 12 All-Big Sky selections, seven National Association of Basketball (NABC) All-District selections, two Associated Press honorable mention All-Americans and one NBA Draft pick (Tyler Harvey, 2015).

The building process at EWU hit its stride in 2014-15 when Hayford led the Eagles to a 26-9 mark. including a 14-4 Big Sky record. EWU went on to win the Big Sky Conference Tournament and earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament - the first postseason appearance for the program since 2003-04. The team featured Tyler Harvey, who was the nation's leader in scoring (23.1 ppg) and three-pointers made per game (4.0), and went on to be the program's third all-time NBA Draft pick. For his efforts, Hayford was named Big Sky Co-Coach of the Year.

Before taking over at Eastern Washington in March of 2011, Hayford spent 10 seasons building Whitworth University in Spokane, Wash., into a NCAA Division III powerhouse. In his tenure at the helm of the Pirates, Hayford had a record of 217-57 and a winning percentage of .792. He was the Northwest Conference Coach of the Year five times, and twice was honored by the NABC as the West Region Coach of the Year.

Taking over a program that went 25-24 in the two seasons prior (1999-01), Hayford coached the Pirates to eight 20-win seasons, six appearances in the NCAA Division III Tournament (including the last five seasons in a row), five Northwest Conference titles, three NCAA DIII Sweet 16 appearances (2008, 2010, 2011) and one Elite Eight appearance (2011). At the time he left Whitworth, his career winning percentage ranked among the top IO among all active NCAA Division III coaches.

Prior to Whitworth, Hayford was head coach at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), where he compiled a 37-27 record in two seasons. During his inaugural season (1999-2000), he led the Cougars to their first conference playoff appearance in five years. Hayford's Cougars finished the 2000-OI season at 22-I2, setting a school record for wins in a season. Prior to Hayford's arrival, USF was 9-17 in 1998-99.

Hayford served as the top assistant coach at Azusa Pacific University (Calif.) from 1990-99, including eight seasons under Bill Odell. APU won seven consecutive Golden State Athletic Conference titles during that time and advanced to the NAIA Division I Final Four in each of his final two seasons there.

Hayford earned his bachelor's degree in social science from Azusa Pacific in 1989. He earned a master's degree in education from Claremont Graduate School in 1991. Hayford and his wife, Robin, have two adult children, daughter, Jayme, and son, Joseph.
