UTSA names Karen Aston head women's basketball coach

Karen Aston, the 2017 Big 12 Coach of the Year and a finalist for Naismith National Coach of the Year honors, on Monday was named the 10th women's basketball head coach in UTSA history.

Aston has a career record of 285-146 [.661] which includes head coaching positions at Charlotte, North Texas and Texas. In her 13 seasons as a head coach, Aston's teams have averaged 22 wins per year and have made a combined 10 postseason appearances.

"I could not be more delighted to welcome Karen Aston to lead the UTSA women's basketball program," UTSA Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics Lisa Campos said. "Karen is a winner with a proven record of success. Her breadth of experience and ability to connect with students will position UTSA women's basketball to compete at a high level. Karen is committed to the student-athlete experience and their personal growth on and off the court. We are thrilled to welcome Karen into our UTSA family."

Aston is regarded as one of the top coaching minds in collegiate basketball and brings a decorated background to San Antonio, with a wealth of experience in the state and in Conference USA.

She is the second-winningest coach in Texas history — averaging 24.6 wins per year over her last seven seasons, leading her team to six NCAA Tournament appearances — and had five players picked in the WNBA Draft during her time in Austin.

"I am beyond thrilled to be the coach at UTSA," Aston said. "The vision and enthusiasm of Dr. Lisa Campos and President Taylor Eighmy made this such an easy decision for me and my family. They are committed to the student-athlete experience and to women's basketball and I share their commitment. I'm so excited to get back on the floor and help this program grow and to engage with the San Antonio community. I witnessed their passion for basketball and sports during my time in Texas and know that our program will blossom with their support. I want to thank the administration again for this opportunity. I am ready to roll up my sleeves and get to work. Go Runners!"

Aston comes to the Alamo City after serving as the head coach at the University of Texas from 2012-20 where she led the Longhorns to a 184-83 (.689) record in eight seasons. From 2015-18, her squads made four consecutive NCAA Sweet 16 showings, marking the first time that had been accomplished at Texas since 1990. Aston also directed the 2015-16 Longhorns to the program's first NCAA Elite Eight appearance since 2003.

She was named Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2017 and was one of four finalists for Naismith Women's Coach of the Year. In 2018, she was one of 10 semifinalists for the Naismith coaching honor. Known as a tireless recruiter, Aston signed five top-11 classes at Texas, including three ranked in the top five.

Aston, who also spent eight years (1998-06) as an assistant and associate head coach at Texas for Naismith Hall of Fame head coach Jody Conradt, stands as Texas' second-winningest coach all-time behind Conradt's 783 victories. Five of her players (Ariel Atkins, Nneka Enemkpali, Joyner Holmes, Imani McGee-Stafford and Sug Sutton) were drafted by WNBA teams.

Prior to Texas, Aston was the head coach at North Texas for the 2011-12 season where she tripled the Mean Green's victory total in one season. UNT went 15-16 that season after winning just five games the previous year.

Before her stint in Denton, Aston led another C-USA foe, Charlotte, from 2007-11. With the 49ers, Aston led the program to record-breaking heights, with 86 victories in four seasons, including a school-record 27 wins in 2010-11.

Aston led Charlotte to four consecutive postseason appearances and the 2009 Atlantic 10 Tournament Championship en route to the school's second ever NCAA Tournament appearance. In her final season with the 49ers, Aston's squad advanced to the WNIT Final Four.

Aston began her collegiate coaching career as an assistant coach at Baylor from 1994-96 before serving in the same role at North Texas for two seasons (1996-98). She then entered her first stop at Texas as an assistant from 1998-2000 before being promoted to associate head coach in 2000.

Before entering the collegiate coaching ranks, Aston was recognized as one of the top high school coaches in the nation. She coached five years at Vilonia High School [1988-93] in Vilonia, Ark., and one year at Fort Smith Northside [1993-94] in Fort Smith, Ark. She guided Fort Smith Northside to a 24-10 record and a fifth-place finish in Class 4A. For her efforts, she was named the Arkansas Northwest Region Coach of the Year.

While at Vilonia, Aston was not only the head basketball coach but also the head cross country and track & field coach. In 1992-93, she was named the Arkansas Basketball Coach of the Year after leading Vilonia to a 36-1 record and a Class 2A State Championship. Aston's cross country teams also claimed back-to-back state titles in 1991 and 1992.

A native of Benton, Ark., Aston was a two-time first-team all-state selection at Bryant High School. She capped her high school career by leading Bryant to the 1982 Arkansas Class 4A State Championship. Aston earned a bachelor of arts degree in physical education from Little Rock in 1987. She played two seasons of basketball at Little Rock after transferring from Ouachita Baptist.

In 2019, Aston was inducted into the Trojan Athletics Hall of Fame at Little Rock and the Bryant [Ark.] High School Athletic Hall of Honor.

Carey, Davenport join Aston's staff

Former Texas standouts Jamie Carey and Empress Davenport join the UTSA women's basketball staff, head coach Karen Aston announced on Friday.

Carey will serve as the associate head coach and Davenport as the recruiting coordinator.

Carey comes to Military City USA after spending the 2020-21 season at conference foe North Texas in the same position.

Prior to her short stint in Denton, Carey spent four years on the coaching staff of her alma mater, Texas, under Aston from 2014-20. She was an assistant coach from 2016-18 before being promoted to associate head coach for the final two years.

At Texas, Carey's was responsible for instructing players at the guard position, coordinating the team's offensive schemes and coordinating the team's recruiting efforts. During her time in Austin, the Longhorns complied as 95-37 (.720) record for an average of 24 wins per season. Texas earned three NCAA Tournament appearances and advanced to a pair of NCAA Sweet 16s. The Longhorns won 53 Big 12 Conference games during that stretch with two second-place finishes in league standings.

Before joining the staff at her alma mater, Carey served as an assistant coach at Colorado from 2014-16.

Carey has top-caliber experience at every level of basketball, including four years at USA Basketball as the assistant women's national team director. She worked with all levels of the women's team program, helping to identify coaches and athletes for participation. Carey also assisted with organizing logistics for trials, training camps and international competitions, supported the athletes and staff on-site internally and assisted with practice for all national teams.

While working with USA Basketball, Carey was the head coach at Sand Creek High School in Colorado Springs, from 2011-14, leading the program to a 62-17 overall record, three Colorado Class 4A Great 8 State appearances and a pair of Pikes Peak Athletic Conference titles. She was named the 2014 Pikes Peak Athletic Conference Coach of the Year.

Prior to Sand Creek, Carey served as head coach at Legacy High School in Broomfield, Colo., from 2008-10, leading the team to a Colorado Class 5A runner-up finish in 2010.

Cary ranks 43rd in Texas history with 1,074 career points, where she was a two-time All-Big-12 selection and set the program standard for 3-point field goal percentage (.418). She was the 31st pick in the 2005 WNBA Draft and played four years with the Connecticut Sun.

She was named the 1999 Miss Colorado Basketball and was the 2000 Pac-10 Conference Freshman of the Year at Stanford, before transferring to finish her career at Texas. She was the 2004 recipient of the Jim Valvano Comeback Player of the Year Award.

Carey holds a bachelor of arts degree in sociology from Texas in 2004 and completed her master's of education in sport management at UT in 2006.

Empress Davenport

Davenport joins the Roadrunner staff after spending the last three years at Lamar.

Davenport recently completed her third year as an assistant coach at Lamar, where she worked with a pair of head coaches, including Robin Harmony (2018-19) and Aqua Franklin (2019-21).

Davenport helped Lamar to a historic 2018-19 season, with the Cardinals going 17-1 in the Southland and 24-7 overall. Six players earned all-conference honors under Davenport, with Miya Crump earning Southland Freshman of the Year honors and Chastadie Barrs claiming a pair of defensive player of the year accolades.

She was a four-year standout for the Longhorns, averaging nearly eight points, four rebounds and better than two assists per game during her collegiate career.

The Horns advanced to three NCAA Championships during Davenport's time on campus and recorded three 20-win seasons, including 31 wins in 2015-16. Davenport was a huge part in the Horns' 10-game turnaround as a sophomore.

Following her time in Austin, Davenport signed a contract with Alvik Basket, a professional team in Sweden. During her one season with Alvik, Davenport was the starting point guard where she guided her squad to the semifinals.

After a professional career overseas, Davenport returned to the U.S. to serve as an assistant coach with the Nike ProSkills EYBL. During her two years with EYBL, she conducted drills that helped improve athlete stamina, skills and performance. In addition to her work with EYBL, Davenport also served as a trainer for Full Throttle Basketball, where she created fitness plans for clients.

Davenport graduated from Texas with a bachelor's degree in applied learning and development in May 2016.

Aston adds Cameron Miles to coaching staff

UTSA women's basketball head coach Karen Aston announced the hiring of Cameron Miles as an assistant coach for the Roadrunners.

Miles comes to the Alamo City after spending the last two seasons at the College of Charleston in the same position.

Prior to working with the Cougars, Miles spent the 2016-19 seasons at Lamar where he served as the director of operations before being promoted to assistant coach in April of 2018.

With the Cardinals, Miles helped established one of the most success women's basketball programs in the Southland Conference. In the 2018-19 season, Lamar posted a 24-7 overall record, won the regular-season title and made its second-straight Women's NIT appearance. Miles was part of a staff that led the Cardinals to national postseason tournaments for three consecutive seasons.

Miles comes from a family of basketball players. His sister, Ashlan, played at Lamar and is now the

girl's head basketball coach at McKinney Christian Academy. His brother, C.J., is in his 15th season in the NBA and his older sister, Andrea, played basketball at Rogers State.

The Dallas, Texas, native played for four years at the University of San Diego where he netted a career-high 15 points against San Francisco and made an appearance in 114 games.

Miles played high school basketball at Dallas Skyline High School, earning all-state honors as a senior after averaging 15.5 points, 3.8 rebounds and 8.0 assists per game.

He also served on the coaching staff of Heroes Elite, an AAU team in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.

Miles earned a degree in ethnic studies from USD.

Lauren Fruits joins Aston's staff

UTSA women's basketball head coach Karen Aston announced the hiring of Lauren Fruits as the new director of operations for the Roadrunners.

Fruits was previously on Aston's staff at the University of Texas from 2018-20 in two different roles.

For the 2019-20 season, Fruits served as the special assistant in which her duties included overseeing and administering the Longhorns' recruiting efforts and served as the director of summer camps for the team.

Prior to serving in that role, Fruit was the team's graduate manager for the 2018-19 season where she coordinated schedule for managers and practice players, assisted with game and opponent scouting, coordinated community service appearances and was involved in on-campus recruiting.

From 2011-18, Fruits coached and taught business education at Lee's Summit North High school – her alma mater – in Lee's Summit, Mo. She was the head junior varsity girls basketball coach from 2014-18 and the varsity girls golf coach from 2016-19. She also served as an assistant for the junior varsity and varsity basketball teams from 2009-14 and for golf from 2013-15.

Fruits played basketball at Central Methodist University in Fayette, Mo. She was named the team's Most Valuable Player in 2006 and earned the Eagle Award in 2007. She earned a bachelor's degree in business with a minor in education in 2006 and a Masters of Education in 2009 from Central Methodist. In 2019, she earned a Masters of Education in sport management from Texas.
