UTSA to travel to the Valley to face Stephen F. Austin (6-8), Sam Houston State (8-5) and Texas-Pan American (5-11)

ROADRUNNERS HIT THE ROAD AGAIN **THIS WEEKEND:** UTSA (3-7), winners of three of its last four games, is back on the road again this weekend when it travels south to Edinburg for the fifth annual Al Ogletree Classic. Fresh off victories against St. Mary's and Houston to start the week, the Roadrunners open play against a pair of Southland Conference opponents in non-league matchups. UTSA plays Stephen F. Austin (6-8) at 2 p.m. on Friday, followed by a meeting with Sam Houston State (8-5) at 3 p.m. on Saturday. The Roadrunners wrap up the three-day event at 5 p.m. on Sunday against tournament host Texas-Pan American (5-11).

SCOUTING THE LUMBERJACKS: Stephen F. Austin, in its second season after suspending its program in 1995, enters Friday's contest with a 6-8 record. The Lumberjacks swept Youngstown State at home last weekend and have won four of their past five contests overall. The Roadrunners lead the all-time series that dates back to 1992, 11-4. UTSA swept last year's three-game set at Roadrunner Field and has won the last six meetings between the two programs dating back to Feb. 18, 1995.

Before losing to #6 Rice, 6-3, on Tuesday night, the Bearkats had reeled off seven consecutive victories after starting the season 1-4. The Roadrunners hold a narrow 26-25 advantage in the all-time series that dates back to 1993. UTSA swept last year's three-game set at Roadrunner Field and has won seven of the past nine matchups.

2-2 record in one-run tilts, an 0-1 mark in two-run games and 1-1 record in contests decided by three runs.

CHASING 400: UTSA won its 400th game in school history when it defeated St. Mary's, 8-5, on Monday night. In 15-plus years of action, the Roadrunners have compiled 401 all-time wins, an average of nearly 27 per season.

2007 CAPTAINS: Senior starting pitcher Josh Ruffin, junior catcher Zach Etheredge and junior shortstop Marshal Davis will serve as the Roadrunners' team captains this season.

PRESEASON POLLS: UTSA was picked to finish second in the West Division by the sports information directors and third by the league's coaches in the Preseason SLC Polls. The Roadrunners received five first-place votes in the SID rankings and three

in the coaches poll. They were six points (51) behind co-favorites Texas-Arlington and Texas State in the coaches poll and only three (58) behind UTA in the SID poll. Defending regular season champion McNeese State was the consensus choice to defend its regular season title in the East.

TRIO NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-SLC TEAMS: Three Roadrunners were named to the preseason All-SLC teams, as senior pitcher Josh Ruffin and sophomore outfielder Michael Rockett were first-team selections and senior third baseman

outfielder Michael Rockett were firstteam selections and senior third baseman Ryan Saltzgaber was named to the second team. Ruffin earned first-team accolades a year ago, while Rockett was a secondteam honoree and Saltzgaber was an honorable mention selection.

The team welcomes back 17 letterwinners — including five position starters and six pitchers — in addition to 19 newcomers this season. Topping the list of returnees are 2006 first-team All-SLC starting pitcher Josh Ruffin, a senior, and Freshman All-America center fielder Michael Rockett. Also back are sophomore second baseman James Keithley and senior third baseman Ryan Saltzgaber, both of whom earned honorable mention accolades a year ago.

RUFFIN ON THE CAREER CHARTS: Senior Josh Ruffin's name can be found all over the Roadrunners' career record book. Friday's starter is UTSA's all-time record holder with four career shutouts and he also ranks fifth in victories (15), sixth in innings pitched (253.0), seventh in appearances (68) and complete games (six) and ninth in ERA (4.73) and strikeouts (154).

TOUGH SCHEDULE: The Roadrunners' 55-game schedule is highlighted by six opponents that qualified for the 2006 NCAA Tournament — Baylor, The College of Charleston, Houston, Rice, Texas and Texas-Arlington.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: A fixture on the Roadrunners' home schedule for more than a decade, UTSA is scheduled to play five games at Wolff Stadium this season. After victories against St. Mary's and Houston this week, the Roadrunners now have won seven consecutive games at the facility. UTSA returns to the park when its hosts the College of Charleston for a three-game series from March 9-11. Built in 1994, it also is home to the San Antonio Missions, the Double A affiliate of the San Diego Padres.

HOME COOKING: Roadrunner Field and Wolff Stadium were tough places for the opposition to play in 2006, as UTSA registered a school-record 24 home victories. That broke the previous UTSA record of 23 home wins set in 1994. The Roadrunners have posted a 245-173 (.586) all-time home record.

HIT THE LIGHTS: For the first time in school history, UTSA will play night games at Roadrunner Field this season. Nine of the team's 22 contests at the facility will be played under the lights. The Feb. 16 home opener against Louisiana-Lafayette kicked off the night-time action at the "Bird Bath."

SLICK FIELDING: Under the direction of seventh-year associate head coach Jason Marshall, who mentors the team's infielders, UTSA has become one of the best fielding teams in the Southland Conference. Last season, the Roadrunners led the league with a school-record .969 fielding percentage on the strength of just 70 errors, the second-fewest in school history. UTSA has recorded four of the top five fielding seasons in school annals under Marshall's guidance.

innings streak and extended that stretch to 30 before giving up run against Louisiana-Lafayette on Feb. 16 ... tossed three shutouts a year ago, the second-most in school annals, and went 8-6 with 3.77 ERA in 100.1 innings of work.

HEAD COACH SHERMAN CORBETT: With more than 20 years of playing and coaching experience, Sherman Corbett is in his seventh season at the helm of UTSA's baseball program. The winningest coach in school history (176 victories), Corbett led the Roadrunners to 37 victories a year ago, the second-most in school history. In his first six seasons, he has coached a pair of 30-win squads and 24 All-SLC players, including seven first-teamers. Corbett also has mentored the 2001 SLC Pitcher of the Year (Jared Howton), 2002 SLC Player and Hitter of the Year (Mark Schramek), 2003 SLC Freshman of the Year (Ryan Crew) and two Freshman All-Americans - Crew (2003) and Michael Rockett (2006). Twelve of his Roadrunners have gone on to professional careers, including eight being selected in the MLB Draft.
