The Roadrunners jump out of conference play to host future Southland Conference member Texas A&M-Corpus Christi this Tuesday, May 2 at Roadrunner Field, first pitch slated for 12 p.m.

All-Time Series

The Islanders lead the all-time series 11-10 against the Roadrunners. UTSA and TAMU-CC met earlier in the season in Corpus Christi, Texas, with the Islanders winning two of three.

Last Outing

Junior Blake Brannon tossed a gem to complete the sweep over Stephen F. Austin with a 4-3 win in Southland Conference action Sunday afternoon at Roadrunner Field. Sophomore Marshal Davis led UTSA's offense with two hits on the day, while junior Ryan Saltzgaber drove in two of UTSA's four runs. Seven different Roadrunners collected one hit apiece. Brannon picked up his fourth win of the season and improved to 4-6 on the year. He tossed eight-plus innings, allowed three runs off six hits, struck out six Lumberjacks and walked five. Senior Noah Tritz collected his eighth save of the season. He struck out the one batter he faced in the ninth.

Sherman Corbett
Sixth Season 167 Career Wins
UTSA's Winningest Coach**

With more than 20 years of playing and coaching experience, Sherman Corbett now enters his sixth year at the helm of the UTSA baseball program.

With 167 career victories, Corbett became the all-time winningest baseball coach in UTSA history last season (167-164). He also guided the

Roadrunners to their second Southland Conference (SLC) Tournament Championship and NCAA Regionals in 2005.

Three of Corbett's players went on to play professionally in 2005. Shortstop Ryan Crew, who was selected to the 2005 All-SLC third team and SLC Tournament MVP, was drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers, while pitcher Jason Vecchio was selected in the 16th round by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2005 draft. Sean Danielson was the third Runner to sign a big league contract when he signed with the St. Louis Cardinals.

In his first season in 2001, he guided the Roadrunners to their first 30-win season since 1995. The same year he coached four players to all-SLC honors including the 2001 SLC Pitcher of the Year in Jared Howton. In 2002, five players were selected to the all-conference squad under Corbett's tutelage along with Mark Schramek being the SLC Player and Hitter of the Year. Schramek went on to become UTSA's first-ever baseball all-American and the highest major league draft pick in UTSA history (first round, 40th overall by the Cincinnati Reds).

Corbett produced again in 2003 with Crew being named the 2003 SLC Freshman of the Year and a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American. In 2004, the Roadrunners led the SLC in home runs.

A San Antonio native, Corbett garnered all-city honors during his prep days at Samuel Clemens High School before beginning his collegiate career at Texas A&M.

Over three seasons as an Aggie, Corbett posted a career record of 14-11. Corbett was then drafted in the third round of the 1984 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft by the California Angels.

In his inaugural season with the Angels, the southpaw appeared in 34 games, posting a 2-1 record with one save and a 4.14 ERA. He made his major league debut against the Baltimore Orioles, then picked up his first major league victory against the Chicago White Sox at Old Comiskey Park.

He remained in the California organization for seven seasons. After his time with the Angels, Corbett spent one season with the Detroit Tigers organization and a final season with the Chicago Cubs organization before retiring in 1993.

Corbett comes from a highly respected baseball family in the San Antonio area, with his father, Raymond, Sr., serving as an administrator in the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District for 23 years. He also was an associate scout for the Cincinnati Reds and assisted with numerous camps and all-star games in the San Antonio area.

Corbett's brother, Raymond, Jr., who was a high school all-American and all-State catcher at Clemens High School, played over seven seasons in the Cincinnati organization. He is currently an area scout for the New York Mets.

In 2001 all three Corbetts were inducted into the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District Sports Hall of Honor.

Corbett graduated Cum Laude from Texas A&M with a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 1991. In 1995 he remained in College Station to earn a master of business administration degree.

After completing his master's degree, Corbett coached and taught at A&M Consolidated High School and was an instructor at Texas A&M baseball camps. In addition to his coaching and playing experience, Corbett also served as the NCAA Regional Baseball Tournament field coordinator for the 1993, 1998 and 1999 Regional and Super Regional games played at Texas A&M.

Corbett is the third baseball coach in UTSA history, following Jimmy Shankle (1992-95) and Mickey Lashley (1996-2000).

Corbett and his wife, Julie, have a seven-year old son, Mason.

Scouting Texas A&M-Corpus Christi

Texas A&M-Corpus Christi enters tomorrow's twinbill with a 20-27 overall record. The Islanders have won six of their last nine games, but dropped three contests in a row to New York Tech over the weekend. Senior Ruben Munoz leads the team with a .325 batting average. Senior top slugger Miguel Mercado ranks first with nine home runs and 44 RBI.

Offensive Explosion

In Friday's game against Stephen F. Austin, the Roadrunners punished SFA's pitching staff with 14 runs off a season-high 18 hits. Junior Ryan Saltzgaber paced the Runners offense with four hits, including a solo blast and drove in three Runners. Also going yard was freshman Michael Rockett.

Nothing New For The Birds

The Roadrunners played in their seventh extra inning ball game this season. Three of the seven games have gone into the 12th inning, with UTSA winning them all.

Finally A Win On Sunday

The 4-3 win over the Lumberjacks on April 30th, gave the Runners their first Sunday win this season. Before Sunday's win, UTSA was 0-5.

RPI Ranking

At one point in time, the UTSA baseball team was ranked 43 in the RPI's polls, according to Boydsworld.com web site. Heading into this weekend series against SFA, the Runners currently stand 56, but after sweeping the Lumberjacks, UTSA dropped to 63 in the RPI polls.

Runners Among Nation's Best

UTSA has three players nationally ranked this season. Senior Noah Tritz is 13th in the nation with eight wins and is 42nd with eight saves. Sophomore Marshal Davis is 40th in the country in walks per game with a 0.77 average. Junior Michael McKennon ranks 14th in hit-by-pitch category at 0.41. UTSA's .667 winning percentage is 36th best in the nation.

Reaching 30 Something

In the 14-year history, the UTSA baseball program has only had three 30-win seasons. This year's ball club is on pace of becoming the fourth team to reach 30. The last time the Roadrunners reached 30 wins was during coach Corbett's first year at UTSA (2001).

Aggie Pitching Stops UTSA's Offense

In Tuesday's game against the Aggies, the Roadrunners were outscored 9-3 and out hit 15-9. UTSA left 13 runners on base, including six in scoring position. Texas A&M's pitching staff collected 10 strike outs on the night.

Ruffin's Haltered Mavs Offense

Josh Ruffin tossed his SLC leading third shutout on April 22 against UTA. Ruffin scattered six hits in nine innings, struck out five Mavericks and allowed two walks. He also went the distance for the fourth time this season, which also leads the conference. Ruffin is 6-1 on the year and 4-0 in SLC play. All of his shutouts have come on the road.

Josh Collects Pitcher of the Week Honors

In a week's span, the Humble, Texas native, got the start against then No. 5 Texas Longhorns, where he went three innings, fanned three batters and allowed one run off two hits. He helped UTSA win the series versus UTA with a stellar outing on April 22. His performance gave Ruffin his second Aeropostale/SLC Pitcher of the Week honor.

Take That Texas!!!

UTSA ended a 13-game losing streak against the Texas Longhorns with a 14-10 win on April 18 at Wolff Stadium. The Roadrunners manage to overcome three deficits, none bigger than the four-run lead (10-6) UT had after six innings. The Runners scored eight runs in the last two innings to complete the rally and score the biggest win in UTSA baseball history.

Streak Come To An End

Voyles 23-game hitting streak came to an end on April 22. The Tomball, Texas native had an 0-for-4 night. His streak spanned over two and a half months. During his hitting streak, he upped his batting average from .216 to .303.

Slugfest II

UTSA couldn't get enough of its recent slugfest against Nicholls State, that they decided to add a sequel. UTSA and UT combined for 24 runs and 26 hits. The Roadrunners have scored over 10 runs and collected doubles digits in hits, in the last three games. The Runners are batting .409 with 47 hits and scored 40 runs during those three contests.

Slugfest I

UTSA and Nicholls State slugged it out this weekend. Both team combined for 76 hits and 57 runs, including a wild one on Friday, April 14, were both squads compelled 30 runs off 31 hits and 20 walks. For the weekend, UTSA batted .394 as a team.

Walk The Line

Second baseman J.R. Voyles set a single-game school record with five walks in his first five plate appearances. He was one walk shy of tying a NCAA and SLC record for most free passes in a game (6).

Rockett Power

Freshman Michael Rockett is having a terrific rookie season for UTSA. In 36 games played, Rockett is batting .341, which is sixth best in the league and leads the team. He also has 45 hits in 132 at-bats, 21 RBI and is slugging .477.
