SERIES: UTSA leads series 8-4

LAST MEETING: April 7, 2015 in Houston, Texas (W, 6-2)

UTSA AT A GLANCE: UTSA is coming its first Conference USA series win of the season as they took two away from Old Dominion. Junior Karl Craigie pitched a complete game shutout on Saturday and blanked the Monarchs 3-0. On Sunday, Chance Kirby threw six innings of two-run baseball and was helped with an offense that contributed 12 hits for the 7-2 win. The Roadrunners are now 14-21 on the season and 5-10 in C-USA, to tie them for 11th in the standings. Over the weekend, Matt Hilston (.216 BA) drew a walk five times and moves into fourth in the NCAA in walks. He is also five away from matching his mark last season. Leading the Roadrunners offense after a successful weekend is freshman Bryan Arias. The San Antonio product is batting a .308 clip with 37 hits, 19 runs, five doubles and two triples. On the bump, Karl Craigie has now taken the top spot with a 3.59 ERA. The southpaw is 3-0 on the year in 42.2 innings of work. He's struck out 27, issued 14 walks and allowed 17 unearned runs.

HOUSTON BAPTIST AT A GLANCE: Houston Baptist heads the Alamo City with an 18-17 overall record and 9-6 mark in the Southland Conference. The Huskies are coming off a SLC series win over Stephen F. Austin. HBU won the first two games and lost the finale 15-3. Austin Zillweger leads the Huskies offense batting a .321 clip and owns the team's third best slugging percentage of .420. He is one of two players in the lineup with single digit strikeouts with nine. Only two players this season have seen action in all 35 games - Louie Payetta and Brandon Bintz. Greg Espinosa, who sports a .319 batting average, leads the team in hits (43), runs (22), doubles (9) and is second with 15 RBI.

UP NEXT: UTSA will head back on the road for a three-game road swing in Bowling Green, Ky. against WKU. The weekend tilt begins Friday, April 22, at 6 p.m.

Last Time Out

NORFOLK, Va. — Chance Kirby threw six innings of two-run baseball while the offense contributed 12 hits to lead UTSA to a 7-2 victory at Old Dominion on Sunday afternoon at the Bud Metheny Baseball Complex.

The Roadrunners (14-21, 5-10 C-USA) earned their first Conference USA series win of the season by winning the final two games of the weekend set

Kirby went six innings and allowed two runs on eight hits for the win. He struck out three and walked three.

Kirby's counterpart, Adam Bainbridge, took the loss for the Monarchs (24-12, 7-8 C-USA) after throwing 3.1 innings. The southpaw gave up four runs on four hits, recorded two strikeouts and walked one.

Four Roadrunners had multiple hits with all but one recording at least one hit. Bryan Arias, J.T. Gilmore, Tyler Straub and Skyler Valentine each had two hits on the day.

UTSA scored in the second inning with a pair of runs. A throwing error by shortstop Zach Rutherford allowed Trent Bowles to reach second safely and he moved up a base, while Arias and C.J. Pickering crossed the plate on the play.

The Roadrunners added to their lead with another two runs in the top of the fourth on a pair of miscues by Old Dominion.

Arias and Ryan Stacy reached on back-to-back errors to start off the frame. Two batters later with bases loaded, Gilmore singled to right and scored Arias. On the next at-bat, a passed ball allowed for Stacy to touch the plate.

In the fifth, the Roadrunners added another run on Arias' sacrifice fly, which scored Straub.

The Monarchs answered back with a run in the home half to avoid another shutout and scored their last run in the seventh.

UTSA scored its last two runs of the day in the sixth on back-to-back atbats. Valentine crossed home first on Straub's RBI single and Matt Hilston followed on Mason George's sacrifice fly.

The Roadrunners will return to the Bird Bath on Tuesday, April 19, when they will host Houston Baptist at 6 p.m.

Diamond Notes

Two of the biggest names in UTSA history were drafted in the 2015 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Senior catcher **John Bormann** had his name called out for a second time and was selected in the 24th round by the Pittsburgh Pirates. Junior right-hander **Brock Hartson** also had his name called and was selected in the 21st round by the Cleveland Indians.

Roadrunners were selected **sixth** in the **Conference USA preseason poll**. Rice was the unanimous preseason favorite receiving all 12 votes. The Owls have won either the regular season or tournament title in each of its 10 years as a member of Conference USA.

UTSA will have another tough schedule ahead of them when they face **six** teams (Houston, Houston Baptist, Florida Atlantic, FIU, Rice, Texas) that earned a **regional berth** in 2015 with half of those hailing from **Conference USA**.

The City of Hattiesburg and **Southern Miss** will host the **2016 Conference USA Baseball Tournament**. Eight teams will make the trip to play in the double-elimination tournament.

Head coach Jason Marshall will return a core of his starting lineup with the exception of three players - John Bormann, Jesse Baker, Kevin Markham. Markham will sit out the 2016 season due to injury.

The **2016** season will mark the **fifth consecutive season** that the UTSA baseball team **opens at home**. The last time the Roadrunners hit the road for Opening Day was back in 2011 when the team opened at Louisiana Monroe.

In **season openers**, UTSA is **10-19** in school history and has won each of its last three Opening Days under the direction of Jason Marshall. He is the fastest coach in program history to reach 100 wins. He currently owns a 103-76 career record.

UPDATE: UTSA is now 11-19 in season openers with a 2-1 victory over UConn.

UTSA wins its fourth straight season opener with a 2-1 victory over UConn (2/19). Skyler Valentine scored the game-winning run on a wild pitch. Valentine hit a solo home run in the bottom of the second for the Roadrunners first run of the game to tie the score at one.

Sophomore **Chance Kirby** got the **starting nod** on **Opening Day** and was **masterful** in his 7.1 innings of action. Kirby recorded six strikeouts and **retired 10 straight** after allowing a home run in the top of the second. The long ball was the only hit given up by the right-hander.

The Roadrunners **won** their first **two** games of the 2016 season in **walk-off fashion**. Skyler Valentine led UTSA to victory in the season opener as he crossed home on a wild pitch. The following day, the Roadrunners defeated UConn by a score of 6-5 and used Ben Brookover's RBI double to drive in the winning run.

UTSA **rallied** from a **4-0 deficit** to **defeat** Sam Houston State 8-5 in the Roadrunners' first midweek game. Andre Shewcraft pitched three scoreless innings and was backed by a three-run eighth for the win.

In the second series of the season, UTSA pulled out a **series win** over **McNeese** after getting swept in Louisiana the previous year. The Roadrunners **outscored** the **Cowboys 32-24** and scored 24 of its runs in the last two games of the series.

Although only seven games have gone down in the books, UTSA has yet to score first in any game.

UPDATE: UTSA scored first against No. 21 Houston and won 3-2 for the first win of the season against a ranked opponent.

Tuesday's **win** against **No. 21 Houston** (3/1) **improves** the Roadrunners record to **6-2** on the year. The mark is **identical** to the **start** the Roadrunners had **last season** and finished 33-25 and 17-13 in Conference USA. It was also the third straight 30-plus win season for head coach Jason Marshall.

UTSA will open Conference USA action with the Rice Owls on Friday, March 18, at 6 p.m. In the last meeting, UTSA walked away with a 7-1 victory behind the splendid performance of then-freshman Chance Kirby. The Roadrunners opened Conference USA play with Rice and went 1-2. In UTSA's only win against the Owls, senior RHP Aaron Burns led the Roadrunners to a 6-1 victory behind a stealthy offense. Burns' only run given up went unearned and improved his ERA from 5.56 to 3.68. After a spectacular performance against Rice, Aaron Burns was tabbed C-USA Pitcher of the Week. Burns pitched a complete game and fanned a season-best six over the course of the game. He retired eight of his final nine batters and scattered only four hits. His only run went unearned.
