Blakley tossed a scoreless eighth inning, while Tritz got out of a bases loaded jam to end the game. UTSA dominated the series with 28 runs scored, hammering 36 hits. J.R. Voyles and Lee Todesco and James Keithley (left) went 2-for-4 on day. Keithley drove in a game-high three runs and scored twice. Voyles and Todesco each scored once. Freshman Michael Rockett went deep for the fourth time this season, with a two-run homer.

Head Coach Sherman Corbett Sixth Season 173 Career Wins UTSA's Winningest Coach

With more than 20 years of playing and coaching experience, Sherman Corbett now enters his sixth year at the helm of the UTSA baseball program.

With 173 career victories, Corbett became the all-time winningest baseball coach in UTSA history last season (173-165). He also guided the

Roadrunners to their second Southland Conference (SLC) Tournament Championship and NCAA Regionals in 2005.

Three of Corbett's players went on to play professionally in 2005. Shortstop Ryan Crew, who was selected to the 2005 All-SLC third team and SLC Tournament MVP, was drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers, while pitcher Jason Vecchio was selected in the 16th round by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2005 draft. Sean Danielson was the third Runner to sign a big league contract when he signed with the St. Louis Cardinals.

In his first season in 2001, he guided the Roadrunners to their first 30-win season since 1995. The same year he coached four players to all-SLC honors including the 2001 SLC Pitcher of the Year in Jared Howton. In 2002, five players were selected to the all-conference squad under Corbett's tutelage along with Mark Schramek being the SLC Player and Hitter of the Year. Schramek went on to become UTSA's first-ever baseball all-American and the highest major league draft pick in UTSA history (first round, 40th overall by the Cincinnati Reds).

Corbett produced again in 2003 with Crew being named the 2003 SLC Freshman of the Year and a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American. In 2004, the Roadrunners led the SLC in home runs.

A San Antonio native, Corbett garnered all-city honors during his prep days at Samuel Clemens High School before beginning his collegiate career at Texas A&M.

Over three seasons as an Aggie, Corbett posted a career record of 14-11. Corbett was then drafted in the third round of the 1984 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft by the California Angels.

In his inaugural season with the Angels, the southpaw appeared in 34 games, posting a 2-1 record with one save and a 4.14 ERA. He made his major league debut against the Baltimore Orioles, then picked up his first major

league victory against the Chicago White Sox at Old Comiskey Park.

He remained in the California organization for seven seasons. After his time with the Angels, Corbett spent one season with the Detroit Tigers organization and a final season with the Chicago Cubs organization before retiring in 1993.

Corbett comes from a highly respected baseball family in the San Antonio area, with his father, Raymond, Sr., serving as an administrator in the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District for 23 years. He also was an associate scout for the Cincinnati Reds and assisted with numerous camps and all-star games in the San Antonio area.

Corbett's brother, Raymond, Jr., who was a high school all-American and all-State catcher at Clemens High School, played over seven seasons in the Cincinnati organization. He is currently an area scout for the New York Mets.

In 2001 all three Corbetts were inducted into the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District Sports Hall of Honor.

Corbett graduated Cum Laude from Texas A&M with a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 1991. In 1995 he remained in College Station to earn a master of business administration degree.

After completing his master's degree, Corbett coached and taught at A&M Consolidated High School and was an instructor at Texas A&M baseball camps. In addition to his coaching and playing experience, Corbett also served as the NCAA Regional Baseball Tournament field coordinator for the 1993, 1998 and 1999 Regional and Super Regional games played at Texas A&M.

Corbett is the third baseball coach in UTSA history, following Jimmy Shankle (1992-95) and Mickey Lashley (1996-2000).

Corbett and his wife, Julie, have a seven-year old son, Mason.

Scouting Texas-Pan American

Texas-Pan American had its three-game winning streak snapped on May 12 with a 4-0 lost to TCU in Fort Worth, Texas. The Horned Frogs rallied to beat the Broncs 5-4 on May 14 to complete the sweep. UTPA is 3-3 in its last six games. Senior Louie Alamia leads the team with a .351 batting average and 68 hits, while junior Patrick Brooks ranks first with six home runs and 36 RBI. Texas-Pan American pitching staff has an overall 5.52 earn run average. Sophomore Tim Haines has team-best 2.16 ERA and is second with four wins. Senior Dane Mason leads the team with seven victories.

Tight Title Race

With the sweep over Sam Houston State, UTSA kept pace with first-place McNeese State over the weekend. The Roadrunners remain one game back out of first place with three SLC games to go. Lamar and Texas State are within site of the Cowboys, as they trail McNeese by two games.

New Mark Set For UTSA

The Roadrunners set a new school record with most wins in conference play. Saturday's win over the Bearkats gave the Runners their 18th SLC victory, which surpassed the previous mark of 17 wins set twice in 1996 and 1999 season.

Shutdowns Mode

Josh Ruffin and Blake Brannon threw complete games shutouts back-to-back against SHSU on Friday and Saturday. It was the third time the Roadrunners had two consecutive shutouts in a season. The last time this was accomplish was during the 1994 season when UTSA blanked Prairie View A&M on Feb. 26 and Texas Southern on Feb. 27, 1994.

Power Dominance

The Runners offense pounded SHSU pitching staff over the weekend. The Roadrunners scored 28 runs on 36 hits, batted .375 and slugged .500. Meanwhile, UTSA's pitching staff clamped down on the Bearkats allowing one run in 23 innings, including 16 scoreless frames and combining for a 0.36 ERA. Ruffin, Brannon and Barton held Sam Houston to a .156 batting average.

Another stellar Performance

Blake Brannon has pitched his way back into the rotation Since returning to the rotation, he is 3-0 with a 1.82 ERA and an .186 opponent batting average. He has allowed five runs

in 24-plus innings and on May 13, Brannon collected his first complete-game shutout.

No Place Like Home

UTSA is an impressive 23-4 at home, including an 8-2 mark at Wolff Stadium this season. The 24 wins at home is the most ever victories.

How They Rank In The SLC

Lee Todesco and Michael Rockett are in seventh with a .366 batting average, while Michael McKennon is ninth with a .356 average and is third with 73 hits. Todesco stands in sixth with 46 run batted in. Josh Ruffin leads the SLC with 103.0 innings pitched, five complete games and four shutouts. His seven wins rank fourth in the league. Noah Tritz tops the conference with eight saves and is second with eight wins.

30 Something Accomplished

The Roadrunners secured its fourth ever 30-win season with a sweep of Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on May 2. The last time UTSA accomplished this fate was during the 2001 season, when the Runners finished 30-29. Coach Corbett is the second coach in UTSA's baseball history to have two 30-win seasons.

Looking For The Best Finish

This year's team has them on pace of having

its best season ever in both wins and winning percentage. With 5 games remaining, the Roadrunners on pace for its first ever 40-win season. The 1994 squad fell one win shy of 40, however, they managed to finish the season 39-18 (.684).

Birds Add A Couple Of Games

UTSA has added single games with Texas-Pan American and Dallas Baptist to the schedule as make-ups for games lost earlier this season. UTSA will travel to Edinburg, Texas, for a game at Texas-Pan American on Tuesday, May 16, at 6 p.m. The Roadrunners end
