Head Coach Sherman Corbett Sixth Season 170 Career Wins UTSA's Winningest Coach With more than 20 years of playing and coaching experience, Sherman Corbett now enters his sixth year at the helm of the UTSA baseball program.

With 170 career victories, Corbett became the all-time winningest baseball coach in UTSA history last season (170-165). He also guided the

Roadrunners to their second Southland Conference (SLC) Tournament Championship and NCAA Regionals in 2005.

Three of Corbett's players went on to play professionally in 2005. Shortstop Ryan Crew, who was selected to the 2005 All-SLC third team and SLC Tournament MVP, was drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers, while pitcher Jason Vecchio was selected in the 16th round by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2005 draft. Sean Danielson was the third Runner to sign a big league contract when he signed with the St. Louis Cardinals.

In his first season in 2001, he guided the Roadrunners to their first 30-win season since 1995. The same year he coached four players to all-SLC honors including the 2001 SLC Pitcher of the Year in Jared Howton. In 2002, five players were selected to the all-conference squad under Corbett's tutelage along with Mark Schramek being the SLC Player and Hitter of the Year. Schramek went on to become UTSA's first-ever baseball all-American and the highest major league draft pick in UTSA history (first round, 40th overall by the Cincinnati Reds).

Corbett produced again in 2003 with Crew being named the 2003 SLC Freshman of the Year and a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American. In 2004, the Roadrunners led the SLC in home runs.

A San Antonio native, Corbett garnered all-city honors during his prep days at Samuel Clemens High School before beginning his collegiate career at Texas A&M.

Over three seasons as an Aggie, Corbett posted a career record of 14-11. Corbett was then drafted in the third round of the 1984 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft by the California Angels.

In his inaugural season with the Angels, the southpaw appeared in 34 games, posting a 2-1 record with one save and a 4.14 ERA. He made his major league debut against the Baltimore Orioles, then picked up his first major league victory against the Chicago White Sox at Old Comiskey Park.

He remained in the California organization for seven seasons. After his time with the Angels, Corbett spent one season with the Detroit Tigers organization and a final season with the Chicago Cubs organization before retiring in 1993.

Corbett comes from a highly respected baseball family in the San Antonio area, with his father, Raymond, Sr., serving as an administrator in the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District for 23 years. He also was an associate scout for the Cincinnati Reds and assisted with numerous camps and all-star games in the San Antonio area.

Corbett's brother, Raymond, Jr., who was a high school all-American and all-State catcher at Clemens High School, played over seven seasons in the Cincinnati organization. He is currently an area scout for the New York Mets.

In 2001 all three Corbetts were inducted into the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District Sports Hall of Honor.

Corbett graduated Cum Laude from Texas A&M with a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 1991. In 1995 he remained in College Station to earn a master of business administration degree.

After completing his master's degree, Corbett coached and taught at A&M Consolidated High School and was an instructor at Texas A&M baseball camps. In addition to his coaching and playing experience, Corbett also served as the NCAA Regional Baseball Tournament field coordinator for the 1993, 1998 and 1999 Regional and Super Regional games played at Texas A&M.

Corbett is the third baseball coach in UTSA history, following Jimmy Shankle (1992-95) and Mickey Lashley (1996-2000).

Corbett and his wife, Julie, have a seven-year old son, Mason.

Scouting Sam Houston State

Sam Houston State enters this weekend series with a 23-24 overall record and a 12-12 SLC mark. The Bearkats have dropped their last five series in a row, including last weekend series against Texas-Alrington. The Bearkats are setting in seventh place in the SLC standings and trail Northwestern State by one game for sixth place. Senior Dustin Martin leads SHSU in batting average (.398), hits (72) and runs scored (44). Junior Karl Krailo tops the team with seven home runs and 58 runs batted in. Martin's .398 ranks first in the conference.

Chasing The Title

UTSA is sitting in a three-way tie for second place in the conference standings, but are one game back of first place McNeese State with six conference games left. Since joining the Southland Conference in 1992, UTSA has never place higher than 3rd place in the conference.

Brannon Stellar Outing

Blake Brannon has pitched his way back into the rotation with back-to-back wins in his last two starts. Brannon went eight and two-third innings against Stephen F. Austin. He also went the distance for the first time last Sunday against Louisiana-Monroe.

How They Rank In The SLC

Lee Todesco and Michael Rockett are in seventh with a .360 batting average, while Michael McKennon is ninth with a .359 average and is third with 70 hits. Todesco stands in sixth with 46 run batted in. Josh Ruffin leads the SLC with 96.0 innings pitched, four complete games and three shutouts. His seven wins rank fourth in the league. Noah Tritz tops the conference with eight saves and is second with eight wins.

30 Something Accomplished

The Roadrunners secured its fourth ever 30-win season with a sweep of Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on May 2. The last time UTSA accomplished this fate was during the 2001 season, when the Runners finished 30-29. Coach Corbett is the second coach in UTSA's baseball history to have two 30-win seasons.

Looking For The Best Finish

This year's team has them on pace of having its best season ever in both wins and winning percentage. With 11 games remaining, the Roadrunners on pace for its first ever 40-win season. The 1994 squad fell one win shy of 40, however, they managed to finish the season 39-18 (.684).

Birds Add A Couple Of Games

UTSA has added single games with Texas-Pan American and Dallas Baptist to the schedule as make-ups for games lost earlier this season. UTSA will travel to Edinburg, Texas, for a game at Texas-Pan American on Tuesday, May 16, at 6 p.m. The Roadrunners end their regular season against Dallas Baptist on Monday, May 22, at 3 p.m. at Roadrunner Field.

Todesco's Belts Islanders

Senior Lee Todesco smacked two home runs against TAMUCC. His first homer was a solo in the fifth inning. Todesco's hammered a three-run shot over the left wall in the sixth inning. He also collected a career-high six RBI.

Plunk Record

Junior Michael McKennon became the hitby-pitch leader with 32 beams. He is two shy of the tying the school record of 19, set by Matt McIntyre in 2001. He also ranks 17th in the nation averaging 0.37 hit by pitch per game.

Offensive Explosion

In Friday's game against Stephen F. Austin, the Roadrunners punished SFA's pitching staff with 14 runs off a season-high 18 hits. Junior Ryan Saltzgaber paced the Runners offense with four hits, including a solo blast and drove in three Runners. Also going yard was freshman Michael Rockett.

Nothing New For The Birds

The Roadrunners played in their seventh extra inning ball game this season. Three of the seven games have gone into the 12th inning, with UTSA winning them all.

Finally A Win On Sunday

The 4-3 win over the Lumberjacks on April 30th, gave the Runners their first Sunday win this season. Before Sunday's win, UTSA was 0-5.

Runners Among Nation's Best

UTSA has three players nationally ranked this season. Noah Tritz ranks 39th in the nation with eight wins and is 53rd with eight saves. Sopho-

more Marshal Davis is 39th in the country in walks per game with a 0.77 average. UTSA's .667 winning percentage is 40th in the nation.

Ruffin's Haltered Mavs Offense

Josh Ruffin tossed his SLC leading third shutout on April 22 against UTA. Ruffin scattered six hits in nine innings, struck out five Mavericks and allowed two walks. He also went the distance for the fourth time this season, which also leads the conference. Ruffin is 6-1 on the year and 4-0 in SLC play. All of his shutouts have come on the road.

Josh Collects Pitcher of the Week Honors

In a week's span, the Humble, Texas native, got the start against then No. 5 Texas Longhorns, were he went three innings, fanned three batters and allowed one run off two hits.
