GAME PREVIEW

- Friday marks the 12th all-time meeting between UTSA and Rice
- The Owls are 10-1 all-time against the Roadrunners
- UTSA's lone victory in the series was a 21-1 rout on May 5, 1994, in only meeting in San Antonio
- Rice has won the last nine matchups, including a 9-1 decision in Houston last season (March 20)
- Two of the last three meetings have been decided by two runs or less
- The Roadrunners will join Rice in Conference USA next spring

GAME NOTES

SCOUTING RICE

Rice enters the week with a 14-7 record and ranked 18th in the Baseball America Top 25 poll. The Owls have won five consecutive games, including a three-game sweep in last weekend's series against Harvard. Rice also owns a pair of wins over then-No. 7 Stanford earlier this season. The Owls are 8-3 at Reckling Park with their only losses coming against the Cardinal, Dallas Baptist and Sam Houston State. Connor Teyki leads Rice at the plate with a .360 average, while Michael Aquino is batting .313 with five home runs and 15 RBIs. The Owls' pitching staff boasts a 2.71 ERA and has limited opposing hitters to a .223 batting average this spring.

HEAD COACH JASON MARSHALL FIRST SEASON (13TH OVERALL AT UTSA)

After serving as an assistant and associate head coach at UTSA for 12 years, Jason Marshall was named the fourth head coach in Roadrunners baseball history on June 18.

"We are thrilled to promote Jason to lead our baseball program," Athletics Director Lynn Hickey said when she announced his hiring. "He has shown his commitment to the program over the last 12 years and has established himself as one of the top coaches in the country. He is a great communicator and teacher of the game and I am excited for what he will bring to the future of UTSA baseball."

"First and foremost, I want to thank Sherman Corbett for his leadership of the program for the past 12 years," Marshall said. "It has been an honor to share the dugout with one of the great character men in college baseball. Also, I want to thank Athletics Director Lynn Hickey and Senior Associate Athletics Director Ross Cobb for giving me this opportunity at such a pivotal juncture in the program's history

"It has been an honor to influence the lives of so many young men over the last several years and it is humbling to be asked to lead the Roadrunners baseball team. I can't thank enough of the people who have invested in my life at some point along the way. This is a huge honor for me and I carry them with me daily in this job. I am looking forward to leading this program back to championship caliber."

Marshall has spent 12 years on the Roadrunners' coaching staff, including the last nine as the associate head coach, under Corbett.

The Abilene native was hired at UTSA prior to the 2001 season and spent three campaigns as an assistant before being promoted to associate head coach. He has served as both the infielders coach and recruiting coordinator while running the Roadrunners' camps.

His efforts on the recruiting trails have resulted in a pair of All-Americans, five Freshman All-Americans, 55 Southland Conference performers (including 11 first teamers), the 2007 and '08 Southland regular season championships and 2005 Southland Tournament title.

Meanwhile, 26 UTSA players have gone on to play professionally, including 16 who have been selected in the Major League Basebalf First-Year Player Draft. In 2002, Mark Schramek became the first player in school history to be selected in the first round when he was the 40th overall selection by the Cincinnati Reds and Matt Crocker became the third-highest pick in program history in June 2010 when he was taken by the Colorado Rockies in the 12th round.

A standout performer at Texas A&M from 1989-92, he was named the Aggies' Most Valuable Player after leading the team in games played (61), hits (66), runs scored (35) and RBIs (40) as a senior.

Following his collegiate career, he was drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the 13th round of the 1992 MLB Draft. Marshall went on to play four seasons in the Royals organization before finishing his professional career in 1995.

He then entered the coaching ranks as a student assistant at his alma mater in 1996 and was a member of Texas A&M's staff for two seasons. In summer 1997, Marshall coached with the Cotuit Kettleers in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

The following fall, he was hired as the assistant in charge of defense and recruiting at McMurry University. Marshall helped lead the Indians to postseason play in two of his three seasons and, in 1998, McMurry won the American Southwest Conference regular season and tournament championships.

Marshall, who earned a bachelor of science degree in kinesiology from Texas A&M in 1996, and his wife, Ashleigh, have two sons, Cooper and Jackson, and a daughter, Kate.

RECAPPING LAST WEEKEND'S SERIES

UTSA dropped two of three games at Tulane last weekend. The Birds won Friday night's opener, 3-2, but lost the final two contests, 2-1 and 8-3, respectively. UTSA's offense sputtered against the Tulane pitching staff, as the Roadrunners hit only .230 and scored just seven runs. Meanwhile, UTSA's pitching staff limited the Green Wave to only a .244 batting average and allowed only runs in four separate innings during the set. However, all of Tulane's scoring frames were multi-run panels.

UTSA AGAINST CONFERENCE USA

UTSA is 11-27 all-time against two opponents (Houston and Rice) affiliated with Conference USA. The Roadrunners' last victory against a C-USA foe came against the Cougars, an 8-6 decision on May 17, 2011.

UTSA IN THE NCAA RANKINGS

The Roadrunners rank among the nation's best in several categories, as announced by the NCAA in the third statistics update on March 18. UTSA ranks sixth in batting average (.322), seventh in hits (228), 14th in triples (9) and 17th in walks allowed per nine innings (2.37).

CALL TO THE PEN

UTSA's bullpen ranks among the nation's best. Through 20 games, Roadrunners relievers are 9-0 with a 2.89 ERA, 70 strikeouts and only 16 walks allowed in 84 innings this spring

SIMS TO THE RESCUE

Junior reliever Matt Sims is off to a dominating start this spring. The right-hander has not allowed a run in his last six appearances, spanning 7.1 innings. In eight appearances this season, Sims is 2-0 with two saves, a 0.79 ERA and 17 strikeouts in 11.1 stanzas. He also is limiting opponents to a .158 batting average and has only allowed one extrabase hit.

CLOSING TIME

Since 2007, UTSA is 141-7 when leading after the eighth inning. The Roadrunners are 12-0 when entering the ninth with a lead this season.

RUN AT YOUR OWN RISK

Sophomore catcher John Bormann has limited opposing teams on the basepaths this season. The 6-foot, 200-pounder has thrown out 14 of 19 potential base stealers (73.7%) and has picked off nine others, including six at first base. Opponents have stolen only one base in the last 11 games against Bormann, while he has gunned down eight potential thieves in that span.

HOME SWEET HOME

UTSA is 11-1 at home in 2013, which includes eight wins at Roadrunner Field. The Roadrunners have netted four wins against Air Force, three against Washington State and one apiece against Omaha, Penn State, Stephen F. Austin and Texas-Pan American. UTSA has outscored its opponents 100-43 in the Alamo City.

SCORING WITH TWO OUTS

The Roadrunners have scored 70 of their 139 runs with two outs this season. UTSA scored four of its seven runs with two outs in last weekend's series at Tulane.

RAMIREZ TIES SCHOOL RECORD WITH FIVE HITS

Junior utilityman Tony Ramirez became the 11th player (second this season) in program history to record five hits in a game. Ramirez was 5-for-5 with a double and three RBIs in UTSA's 13-3 victory over Stephen F. Austin on March 3.

BUB SOME DIRT ON IT

UTSA has been hit 34 times this season and junior infielder Mike Warren has been beaned 13 times, which is tied for tops in the nation. The local product out of Alamo Heights HS was hit in three consecutive plate appearances against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Feb. 20.

UTSA SWEEPS AIR FORCE TO OPEN SEASON

UTSA opened the 2013 season in grand fashion with a four-game sweep of Air Force (Feb. 15-17) at Roadrunner Field. The Roadrunners batted .417 and scored 40 runs in the series. It marked UTSA's first four-game series sweep since completing the task against Sacred Heart nearly five years ago (Feb. 29-March 2, 2008).

ROCKETT NAMED WAC HITTER OF THE WEEK TWICE

Senior outfielder Daniel Rockett has been named the Western Athletic Conference Hitter of the Week twice this season (Feb. 18 and March 4). Rockett earned his first award after leading the Roadrunners to a four-game sweep of Air Force. During the series, Rockett batted .733 (11-

of-15) with two doubles, a homer, four RBIs and scored six runs. His 16 total bases translated to a 1.067 slugging percentage and he reached base at a .762 clip. Two weeks later, he again was named WAC Hitter of the Week while pacing the Roadrunners offense in a three-game sweep during the UTSA Classic, During UTSA's 4-0 week, Rockett hit .538 (7-of-13) with two doubles, a homer, three RBIs, a stolen base and scored twice during the week. The Sugar Land native slugged .923 and reached base at a .571 clip.

COX TABBED WAC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Junior reliever Wesley Cox was tabbed the Western Athletic Conference Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 18. Cox, a native of Rockwall, Texas, appeared in both ends of UT-SA's doubleheader last Saturday against Air Force. In the opener, he picked up the win in relief and posted a save in the nightcap. For the week, Cox was 1-0 with a save, a 1.50 ERA and six strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work.

MARSHALL COLLECTS FIRST VICTORY

First-year head coach Jason Marshall picked up his first win last Friday as the Roadrunners topped Air Force, 9-2, in the season opener on Feb. 15. Marshall, who is in his 13th season as a member of the Birds' coaching staff, became the first head coach in program history to win his debut. The three previous head coaches did not pick up their first win until at least the third game of their careers (Jimmy Shankle [3]/Mickey Lashley [5]/Sherman Corbett [5]).

UTSA'S BULLPEN AGAINST AIR FORCE

UTSA relied heavily on its bullpen in the season-opening series against Air Force (Feb. 15-17). Seven pitchers combined for a 4-0 record with one save, a 1.89 ERA and 34 strikeouts in 19.0 innings. The bullpen gave up only four runs and walked three batters. Four of the seven pitchers did not give up a run, while two of those did not yield a hit.

ROADRUNNERS TABBED 8TH IN WAC POLL

In its first and only season in the Western Athletic Conference, UTSA was picked to finish eighth in the 10-team league. Dallas Baptist earned eight first-place votes and was selected to win the league by the circuit's coaches.

ON TAP THIS SEASON

The Roadrunners' 2013 schedule features 55 games, including 30 at home. Additionally, the Birds will play 10 teams that finished in the RPI top 80 a year ago and seven that advanced to the NCAA Tournament. UTSA also will face eight teams for the first time in program history, including four in Western Athletic Conference action (CSU Bakersfield, Sacramento State, San Jose State and Seattle).

DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS

Thirty-one of UTSA's 33 players call Texas home, including three from San Antonio. The two Roadrunners who hail from outside the Lone Star State are junior utilityman Tony Ramirez (Ferndale, Mich.) and senior infielder Jake Wood (Noblesville, Ind.).

A NEW LEAGUE

UTSA officially joined the WAC on July 1, 2012, after accepting an invitation on Nov. 11, 2010. The Roadrunners are part of a 10-team baseball league that includes CSU Bakersfield, Dallas Baptist, Louisiana Tech, New Mexico State, Sacramento State, San Jose State, Seattle and former Southland Conference rivals Texas State and UT Arlington.

UTSA TO JOIN CONFERENCE USA IN 2013

UTSA will be on the move once again in 2013, as it accepted an invitation from Conference USA (C-USA) last May. The Roadrunners will join the 16-team league on July 1, 2013. The "new" C-USA lineup will feature Charlotte, East Carolina, Florida Atlantic, FIU (Florida International), Louisiana

BLAIR RETURNS FOR SECOND TOUR OF DUTY

Associate head coach Jim Blair returns to UTSA for his second stint on the staff. He was an assistant coach with the Roadrunners for five seasons (2002-06) and was an integral part of the 2005 Southland Conference Tournament Championship club. Since leaving the Alamo City, Blair has gained experience at Sam Houston State and Dallas Baptist and has helped those clubs to four NCAA Regional appearances.

LAWLER MAKES THE SWITCH

Assistant coach Brett Lawler is making the switch from hitting coach to pitching coach this season. Lawler spent the last three seasons as the Roadrunners' hitting coach. He has a background working with pitchers, however. As a collegiate standout at San Jacinto JC and Arkansas-Little Rock, Lawler called pitches as the starting catcher. He then took his talents to the Florida Marlins organization as a signal caller for a year before retiring from playing. His father, Jim, was Mark Johnson's pitching coach at Texas A&M for 21 years.

PACHECO TABBED TOP PROSPECT

Sophomore pitcher Jordan Pacheco had an award-winning summer with the Victoria Generals in the Texas Collegiate League. The Victoria, Texas, native was named the TCL Right-Handed Pitcher of the Year after posting a 7-2 record with a 1.84 ERA and 59 strikeouts in 73.1 innings. In his freshman season with the Roadrunners, Pacheco, who was tabbed the No. 16 prospect in the TCL by Perfect Game, posted a 1-3 mark with a 5.82 ERA and 43 strikeouts in 51.0 innings. Meanwhile, his lone victory came against No. 1 Baylor (4/24), which snapped the Bears' 24game winning streak.

ROCKETT LANDS ON PROSPECT LIST

Senior outfielder Daniel Rockett was named the No. 53 prospect in the Northwoods League last summer by Perfect Game. The Sugar Land, Texas, native hit .279 and led the Battle Creek Bombers with 11 doubles, three triples, nine home runs, 36 RBIs, 41 walks and 33 stolen bases. It marked the third consecutive summer than Rockett had been tabbed a top prospect. He also was named the Northwoods' No. 38 prospect in 2011 and selected fifth in the Hawai'i Collegiate Baseball League in 2010.
