## Setting the Scene

## All-Time Series

## Last Outing

Senior Caleb Barton and Michael Rockett led UTSA past Tex-as-Pan American, 10-8, on April 4 at the Edinburg Baseball Stadium in Edinburg, Texas. Rockett posted a 4 -for- 5 night with three runs batted in and two doubles. Barton came in relief to close the door on UTPA's rally and picked up his first save of the season. Freshman Andy Benedict made his first career start as a Roadrunner and made most of it with his first career win. He tossed five strong innings, fanned three Broncs, allowed three runs and walked three batters.

# Head Coach Sherman Corbett Sixth Season 156 Career Wins UTSA's Winningest Coach 

With more than 20 years of playing and coaching experience, Sherman Corbett now enters his sixth year at the helm of the UTSA baseball program.

With 156 career victories, Corbett became the all-time winningest baseball coach in UTSA history last season (156-161). He also guided the Roadrunners to their second Southland Conference (SLC) Tournament Championship and NCAA Regionals in 2005.

Three of Corbett's players went on to play professionally in 2005. Shortstop Ryan Crew, who was selected to the 2005 All-SLC third team and SLC Tournament MVP, was drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers, while pitcher Jason Vecchio was selected in the 16 th round by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2005 draft. Sean Danielson was the third Runner to sign a big league contract when he signed with the St. Louis Cardinals.

In his first season in 2001, he guided the Roadrunners to their first 30 -win season since 1995 . The same year he coached four players to all-SLC honors including the 2001 SLC Pitcher of the Year in Jared Howton. In 2002, five players were selected to the all-conference squad under Corbett's tutelage along with Mark Schramek being the SLC Player and Hitter of the Year. Schramek went on to become UTSA's first-ever baseball all-American and the highest major league draft pick in UTSA history (first round, 40th overall by the Cincinnati Reds).

Corbett produced again in 2003 with Crew being named the 2003 SLC Freshman of the Year and a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American. In 2004, the Roadrunners led the SLC in home runs.

A San Antonio native, Corbett garnered all-city honors during his prep days at Samuel Clemens High School before beginning his collegiate career at Texas A\&M.

Over three seasons as an Aggie, Corbettposted a career record of 14-
11. Corbett was then drafted in the third round of the 1984 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft by the California Angels.

In his inaugural season with the Angels, the southpaw appeared in 34 games, posting a 2-1 record with one save and a 4.14 ERA. He made his major league debut against the Baltimore Orioles, then picked up his first major league victory against the Chicago White Sox at Old Comiskey Park.

He remained in the California organization for seven seasons. After his time with the Angels, Corbett spent one season with the Detroit Tigers organization and a final season with the Chicago Cubs organization before retiring in 1993.

Corbett comes from a highly respected baseball family in the San Antonio area, with his father, Raymond, Sr., serving as an administrator in the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District for 23 years. He also was an associate scout for the Cincinnati Reds and assisted with numerous camps and all-star games in the San Antonio area.

Corbett's brother, Raymond, Jr., who was a high school all-American and all-State catcher at Clemens High School, played over seven seasons in the Cincinnati organization. He is currently an area scout for the New York Mets.

In 2001 all three Corbetts were inducted into the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District Sports Hall of Honor.

Corbett graduated Cum Laude from Texas A\&M with a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 1991. In 1995 he remained in College Station to earn a master of business administration degree.

After completing his master's degree, Corbett coached and taught at A\&M Consolidated High School and was an instructor at Texas A\&M baseball camps. In addition to his coaching and playing experience, Corbett also served as the NCAA Regional Baseball Tournament field coordinator for the 1993, 1998 and 1999 Regional and Super Regional games played at Texas A\&M.

Corbett is the third baseball coach in UTSA history, following Jimmy Shankle (1992-95) and Mickey Lashley (1996-2000).

Corbett and his wife, Julie, have a seven-year old son, Mason.

## Scouting Southeastern Louisiana

UTSA ended the month of March with an 11-3 record, which included a season-long, eight-game winning streak. The also picked up two SLC series wins in March.

## Extra Extra

This season the Roadrunners have played in six extra-inning games. So far, they have posted a 4-2 mark in those contests. Three of the six games have gone into the 12 th inning, including back-to-back 12-inning outings in the weekend series against McNeese State. UTSA is 3-0 when the game reaches the 12th inning and two of them have been won via walk-off home runs. The last time, UTSA played in at least five or more extra inning games was during the 2002 season.

## Taking One For The Team

Michael McKennon has been beaned 12 times this season, which leads the team and ranks second in the conference.

## Voyles' Streaking

Voyles currently has a career-best 16-game hitting, which started against Dallas Baptist on March 4. For the month of March, Voyles hit safely in every game.

## Multi McKennon

Michael McKennon leads the team with 11 multi-hit games, including eight games with at least two hits.

## Rockett Lift-Off

Michael Rockett posted career numbers in the series against McNeese State. He recorded his first four-hit and four-RBI game. He also hit his first collegiate home run in the 8-7 win over the Cowboys on April 1.

## Ruffin's Stellar Outing

Junior right handed pitcher Josh Ruffin pitched one of his best game in his Roadrunner career. Ruffin tossed UTSA's first solo two-hitter in the 3-0 win against Lamar on March 18. The Humble, Texas native, had no-hitter through seven innings, but Matt Lambeth broke up the no-no with a single.
