Roadrunners to begin four-game road trip this weekend and can set SLC regular season wins record with sweep of Colonels

UTSA TO BEGIN FOUR-GAME ROAD TRIP IN LOUISIANA THIS WEEKEND:

UTSA (30-18, 20-4) hits the road for a four-game road swing this weekend when it travels to Nicholls State for a three-game set. Friday's opener is scheduled for 6:30 p.m., while Saturday and Sunday's contests are slated for 3 and 1 p.m., respectively. The Roadrunners, who have won six games in a row, are coming off a weekend sweep of Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in which they outscored the Islanders 51-21, which was a school-record for runs in a three-game series. UTSA can set the Southland Conference record for regular season league victories with another sweep this weekend. Northwestern State (2005) and McNeese State (2006) currently share the mark with 22 victories.

SCOUTING THE COLONELS: Nicholls State swept Texas-Arlington last weekend and now stand at 9-40 overall and 5-19 in SLC play. The Colonels three-game winning streak is their longest of the year and they have won four of five overall. The Roadrunners lead the all-time series that dates back to 1992, 26-19. UTSA swept last year's three-game set at Roadrunner Field and has won nine of the last 10 meetings overall.

The Roadrunners (20-4) enter this weekend with a three-game lead over both Lamar and Texas State in the race for the overall Southland Conference Regular Season Championship and UTSA's magic number to clinch the first regular season title in school history is four. The Roadrunners lead the Bobcats in the West Division, while Lamar holds a one-game advantage in the East.

year mark the first time in school annals that the program has posted back-to-back seasons with 20 league wins. The Roadrunners were 20-10 a year ago.

BACK-TO-BACK JACK: Sunday's 15-10 victory against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi pushed the Roadrunners' overall record to 30-18, giving them 30 wins in consecutive seasons for the first time in 12 years (1994, 39-18/1995, 31-23) and just the second time in school annals. UTSA now has posted at least 30 wins five times in the program's 16-year history, three of which have come under the direction of seventh-year skipper Sherman Corbett. The Roadrunners were 37-22 a year ago and 30-29 in 2001.

GETTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT: UTSA's success this season can be directly attributed to its solid 11-1 record in series openers. Since dropping their first lid-

lifter of the year to Louisiana-Lafayette (10-2, Feb. 16), the Roadrunners have reeled off 11 consecutive series-opening victories, including eight in a row in SLC play. UTSA has outscored the opposition by 50 runs (84-34) in those 11 wins.

BRING OUT THE BROOMS: The Roadrunners opened the SLC campaign with consecutive sweeps of McNeese State, Central Arkansas and Southeastern Louisiana and has continued that trend the past two weekends at Sam Houston State and against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. The season-opening sweeps marked the first time the program's 16-year history that UTSA swept back-to-back-to-back three-game series against league opponents. The Roadrunners now have swept SLC foes 18 times in school annals, 12 (66.7 percent) of which have come under the direction of head coach Sherman Corbett.

LINEUP CHANGE DOES THE TRICK: Stuck with a 4-9 record and averaging just 4.2 runs per game, head coach Sherman Corbett decided to shuffle his lineup on March 9. The seventh-year skipper moved sophomore James Keithley into the leadoff spot and since that switch, the Roadrunners have posted a 26-9 (.743) record, hit .327 as a team and averaged 11.3 hits and 8.3 runs per game.

RED HOT OFFENSE: After starting the year slowly, the UTSA offense has exploded the past 31 games, 23 of which have resulted in victories (.742 pct.). The Roadrunners have scored 271 times (8.7 pg) and outscored the opposition by 118 runs during that time. UTSA has posted a .334 batting average on the strength of 372 hits (12.0 pg), slugged .564 (628 total

bases) and reached base at .400 clip. Nearly 38 percent of the squad's 372 hits (140) have gone for extra bases, including 73 doubles, 18 triples and 49 home runs. The Roadrunners also have stolen 33 bases.

BLAKLEY THROWING STRIKES: Senior Josh Blakley has been as good as it gets coming out of the UTSA bullpen this season. The Lorena native has a perfect 5-0 record with one save and leads the staff with a 2.59 ERA (fourth SLC). Blakley has appeared in 22 contests and has a sterling 48/10 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 55.2 innings. His 1.50 ERA in Southland Conference games leads the league and he currently is riding an 11.2 scoreless innings streak (seven games). The right-hander picked up his fourth victory of the season on March 31 against Southeastern Louisiana after tossing a career-high 5.2 scoreless innings. He has gone at least four innings in eight of his appearances this season.

HOME COOKING: Roadrunner Field and Wolff Stadium were tough places for the opposition to play in 2006, as UTSA registered a school-record 24 home victories. That broke the previous mark of 23 home wins set in 1994. This year has been no different, as the Roadrunners are 18-6 at home this year, including wins in 13 of their last 14 games played at Roadrunner Field. UTSA now has posted a 261-176 (.597) all-time home record in the program's 16-year history.

HIT THE LIGHTS: For the first time in school history, UTSA is playing night games at Roadrunner Field this season. Eight of the team's 21 contests at the facility are being played under the lights. The Feb. 16 home opener against Louisiana-Lafayette kicked off the night-time action at the "Bird Bath" and UTSA has a 6-1 record under the lights at Roadrunner Field this year. The Roadrunners have posted six night victories in a row since dropping the home opener.

ROADRUNNERS COLLECT 400TH ALL-TIME VICTORY: UTSA won its 400th game in school history when it defeated St. Mary's, 8-5, on Feb. 26. In 16 years of action, the Roadrunners have compiled 428 all-time wins, an average of nearly 27 per season.

2007 CAPTAINS: Senior starting pitcher Josh Ruffin, junior catcher Zach Etheredge and junior shortstop Marshal Davis will serve as team captains this season.

They were six points (51) behind co-favorites Texas-Arlington and Texas State in the coaches poll and only three (58) behind UTA in the SID poll. Defending regular season champion McNeese State was the consensus choice to defend its regular season title in the East.

TRIO NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-SLC TEAMS: Three Roadrunners were named to the preseason All-SLC teams, as senior pitcher Josh Ruffin and sophomore outfielder Michael Rockett were first-team selections and senior third baseman Ryan Saltzgaber was named to the second team. Ruffin earned first-team accolades a year ago, while Rockett was a second-team honoree and Saltzgaber was an honorable mention selection.

WHAT'S BACK IN 2007: UTSA is coming off a season that saw it finish with a 37-22 record (20-10 SLC). The team welcomes back 17 letterwinners — including five position starters and six pitchers — in addition to 19 newcomers this season. Topping the list of returnees are 2006 first-team All-SLC starting pitcher Josh Ruffin, a senior, and Freshman All-America center fielder Michael Rockett. Also back are sophomore second baseman James Keithley and senior third baseman Ryan Saltzgaber, both of whom earned honorable mention accolades a year ago.

SP • Josh Ruffin, Sr. - Preseason first-team All-SLC pick is one of the top pitchers in school history ... is team-best 6-2 with 4.52 ERA in his 13 starting assignments ... leads team with 57 strikeouts in a staff-best 81.2 innings ... also has team-high seven quality starts, three complete games and one shutout ... a perfect 4-0 with a 2.52 ERA and 22 punchouts in last five starts (35.2 IP) ... tossed five-hit shutout with six strikeouts last Friday against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi to extend his career school record to five ... collected fifth win of season on April 27 at Sam Houston State (6.2 IP, 1 ER, 5 K) ... allowed three runs (two earned) on eight hits and fanned four in complete game win against Northwestern State (April 13) ... went 7.2 innings, allowing three runs, in earning win at Texas Arlington (April 5) ... tossed a four-hitter for first complete game of year and struck out seven, as UTSA won its SLC opener at McNeese State (March 16) ... allowed just one run on five hits and fanned six in seven innings vs. the College of Charleston (March 9) ... struck out career-high nine and picked up first victory of year vs. Gonzaga (Feb. 23) after allowing just three runs on six hits in eight-plus innings ... perfect 5-0 with 3.53 ERA, three complete games and a shutout in eight Southland Conference starts ... 2006 first-team All-SLC.

SP • Bradley Chovanec, Jr. - Third on squad with 46 strikeouts in 74.1 innings ... has appeared in 16 games, including 12 starts, and has a 2-4 record ... tossed a complete-game five-hitter (one run) and struck out five against Southeastern Louisiana (March 31) ... gave up two runs and fanned six in seven innings vs. Central Arkansas (March 24) to collect first UTSA victory ... allowed three runs in 6.1 innings, while striking out five vs. Sam Houston State (March 3) ... made first career start on Feb. 17 vs. Louisiana-Lafayette (5 IP, 5 H, 3 ER, 4 K) ... has allowed just one run and fanned six in four relief appearances (9 IP).

SP • Ryan Proudfoot, Fr. - Has 4-2 record, 3.07 ERA and three quality starts in 11 games (eight starts) ... has allowed just 33 hits (.205 BAA) and struck out 39 in 44 innings of work ... collected fourth win of year against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (May 6) after allowing three runs on five hits and striking out three in six innings ... defeated Texas-Pan American

(April 17) in his first start since April 1 ... gave up just one run on four hits and struck out three in seven innings in that contest ... picked up a pair of wins during the week of March 19-25 ... tossed five hitless innings with four strikeouts vs. Lamar (March 20) and then allowed just one run on four hits and punched out a career-high 11 in six innings vs. Central Arkansas four days later (March 25) ... has a 2-0 mark with 2.20 ERA in 16.1 innings (four games/three starts) in SLC action.

SP • Blake Brannon, Sr. - Third on the team with 43 punchouts in 53.2 innings of work (12 starts) ... has a 1.02 ERA and nine strikeouts in his last three starts (17.2 IP) ... went the distance but was tagged with loss at Stephen F. Austin (April 22), allowing just one run on three hits with four strikeouts ... collected third win of season against Texas-Pan American (April 18) ... allowed an unearned run on just three hits in five innings ... tossed five scoreless frames and fanned five at Texas-Arlington (April 7) ... allowed two runs and struck out six in seven innings at McNeese State (March 18) ... registered first quality start of year vs. the College of Charleston (March 11) ... allowed pair of runs (one earned) on just six hits in seven-plus innings, while tying career high with eight strikeouts ... entered senior season riding UTSA-record 29 scoreless innings streak and extended that stretch to 30 before giving up run vs. Louisiana-Lafayette (Feb. 16) ... needs just two more appearances to tie the UTSA career record.

RP • Josh Blakley, Sr. - Has appeared in 22 games and has a perfect 5-0 record with one save and a team-best 2.59 ERA (fourth SLC) ... owns a sterling 48/10 strikeout-to-walk ratio (nearly 5-to-1) in 55.2 innings of work ... has not allowed a run in his last seven outings, which covers a span of 11.2 innings ... has given up just seven hits (.184 BAA) and fanned 12 during that scoreless streak ... went the final 4.1 innings on April 29 at Sam Houston State for his fifth win of the year ... tossed 5.2 scoreless innings, a career high, against Southeastern Louisiana (March 31) ... fanned a career-high six in a victory against St. Mary's (Feb. 26) ... has gone at least four innings in eight contests and 3.1 innings in another ... is 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA and 26/8 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 30 innings of work (11 appearances) in Southland Conference games.

RP • J.T. Mackey, Jr. - Sports a team-best 6-2 mark with three saves ... has recorded a 4.62 ERA in 23 games (one start) and struck out 29 in 37 innings of work ... made first career start on April 10 at No. 13 Texas A&M ... picked up team-best sixth victory of season with three scoreless frames at Sam Houston State (April 28) ... fifth win of year came after 2.2 scoreless frames against Northwestern State (April 15) ... collected fourth victory with a career-high five scoreless innings at McNeese State (March 17) ... got out of a bases-loaded jam with nobody out in the eighth to keep Roadrunners within one run in that contest ... earned both of team's victories vs. the College of Charleston ... first UTSA victory came after two scoreless innings against Stephen F. Austin (March 2) ... earned first save against St. Mary's (Feb. 26) ... saved the Roadrunners' 6-3 victories at Texas-Arlington (April 5) and against Southeastern Louisiana (March 31).

RP • Zach Calhoon, Fr. - Has posted a 3-2 record with a UTSA freshman record six saves in 20 appearances ... has a 2.70 ERA and allowed just 18 hits (.191 BAA), while striking out 41 in 26.2 innings ... struck out a career-high six and picked up his team-leading sixth save of the year on May 6 vs. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi ... named SLC Pitcher of the Week on March 5 after

Austin) ... struck out a then-career-high five in 4.2 innings vs. Cougars (Feb. 27) ... picked up a win and a loss in three-game series at Stephen F. Austin (April 20-22) ... collected his second victory of the season vs. Southeastern Louisiana (April 1) ... fanned final two batters against Gonzaga (Feb. 23) to earn first collegiate save ... has a 2-1 mark, four saves and 1.50 ERA and fanned 19 in 12.1 innings (10 games) in Southland Conference play.

HEAD COACH SHERMAN CORBETT: With more than 20 years of playing and coaching experience, Sherman Corbett is in his seventh season at UTSA. The winningest coach in school history (205 victories), Corbett led the Roadrunners to 37 victories a year ago, the second-most in school history. In his first seven seasons, he has coached three of the five 30-win squads in school history and 24 All-SLC players, including seven first-teamers. Corbett also has mentored the 2001 SLC Pitcher of the Year (Jared Howton), 2002 SLC Player and Hitter of the Year (Mark Schramek), 2003 SLC Freshman of the Year (Ryan Crew) and two Freshman All-Americans — Crew (2003) and Michael Rockett (2006). Twelve of his Roadrunners have gone on to professional careers, including eight being selected in the MLB Draft.
