Texas-Pan American Comes To Town For Two-Game Series: UTSA, winners of seven of its last eight home contests, wraps up a five-game home stand this week when Texas-Pan American visits Roadrunner Field for a two-game set that begins at 6 p.m. on Tuesday. The Roadrunners are coming off a weekend series victory against Northwestern State and now stand at 21-15 overall and 13-2 in Southland Conference play. Wednesday's finale is scheduled for 3 p.m. at the "Bird Bath."

Scouting The Broncs: TexasPan American, an NCAA Division I independent program, enters Tuesday's contest with a 15-28 mark on the year. The Broncs, who have dropped five of their last seven games, are coming off a weekend series victory against Prairie View A\&M. UTSA picked up a 7-3 victory three weeks ago (March 27) and leads the all-time series, 43-29. The Roadrunners have won seven of the last nine matchups between the two programs. UTPA collected a 3-2 win earlier this season at the Al Ogletree Classic and its 5-4 victory at home on May 16 a year ago snapped the Roadrunners' six-game winning streak in the series. Head coach Sherman Corbett is 25-7 all-time against the Broncs.

UTSA Dominating SLC Series Finales: The Roadrunners, off to a program-best 13-2 start in Southland Conference play (previous: 10-5/1995, 2006), has built that impressive record on the strength of five victories in series finales this season. UTSA - which has scored in double figures in nine of its 15 league games, outscored the opposition by 73 runs (139-66) and is averaging 9.3 runs per contest - has three run-rule triumphs in series finales this year. The Roadrunners defeated McNeese State, 16-2 (eight innings), on March 18; Central Arkansas, 14-1 (seven), on March 25; and

Texas-Arlington, 12-1 (seven), on April 7. The Roadrunners' lone non-run-rule wins were a nine-run triumph (14-5) against Southeastern Louisiana on April 1 and 12-10 victory against Northwestern State on Sunday.

## Ten-Run Third A First Since 2005:

 In their 12-0 victory at Texas-Arlington on April 7, the Roadrunners scored 10 runs in the third inning, which was the first time since April 20, 2005, that UTSA crossed the plate 10 times in a frame. The Roadrunners sent 15 batters to the dish and had seven hits in the stanza, including a school-record-tying two by both junior Trent Lockwood and sophomore Michael Rockett.Perfect Start Best Ever: UTSA began the 2007 Southland Conference season a perfect 10-0, which was its best SLC start in school history and tied
for the second-best in league history. Lamar started 14-0 in 1984, while TexasArlington was 10-0 a year ago. UTSA's previous best start was 4-0 in both 1994 and '96.

Bring Out The Brooms: UTSA opened the SLC campaign with consecutive sweeps of McNeese State, Central Arkansas and Southeastern Louisiana. The sweeps marked the first time the program's 16-year history that the Roadrunners swept back-to-back-to-back three-game series against league opponents. UTSA now has swept SLC foes 16 times in school annals, 10 of which have come under the direction of head coach Sherman Corbett.

You Dropped A Bomb On Me: Thirtytwo of UTSA's 37 home runs (86.5 pct.) this season have been hit during the past 19 contests. Leading the long

ball parade is junior Zach Etheredge, who has slugged all eight of his homers this year during that time. Senior Ryan


Saltzgaber has launched six homers, while sophomore James Keithley, junior Trent Lockwood and sophomore Michael Rockett have each have hit four bombs. Lockwood, Rockett and Saltzgaber have grand slams among their homers. Also on the board are redshirt freshman Tim Palincsar and senior Mitch Ponza, who have left the yard three times.

UTSA Leaves Yard Four Times: The Roadrunners launched four home runs in their 11-3 victory against Northwestern State last Friday and it was the first time in more than two years that the program has done so. The last time UTSA hit four long balls in a contest was a 14-3 victory against Texas-Pan American on March 30, 2005.

More Homer Notes: With 37 home runs this season, UTSA already has tied its season total from a year ago and it is the second-highest total of the Sherman Corbett era (highest: 55, 2004). The school home run record is 66 set in 1999.

Lineup Changes Do The Trick: Stuck with a 4-9 record and averaging just 4.2 runs per game, head coach Sherman Corbett decided to shuffle his lineup on March 9. The seventh-year skipper moved sophomore James Keithley and redshirt freshman Tim Palincsar into the top two spots in the lineup and junior Zach Etheredge to the six hole. Since those switches, the Roadrunners have posted a 17-6 record, hit . 323 as a team, averaged 11.7 hits per game and scored eight runs per contest.

Red Hot Offense: After starting the year slowly, the UTSA offense has exploded the past 19 games, 14 of which have resulted in victories. The Roadrunners have scored 166 times (8.7 pg ) and outscored the opposition by 64 runs during that time. UTSA has posted a .333 batting average on the strength of 231 hits ( 12.2 pg ), slugged .581 (403 total bases) and reached base at .398 clip. Forty-one percent of the squad's 231 hits (94) have gone for extra bases, including

48 doubles, 14 triples and 32 home runs. The Roadrunners also have stolen 19 bases in 25 attempts, which translates to an 76 percent success rate.

Close Games: In addition to scoring runs in bunches this year, the Roadrunners have shown the knack of playing close games. Nineteen of the club's 36 contests (52.8\%) this year have been decided by three runs or less and it has a 12-7 mark in those games. UTSA has a 4-3 record in one-run tilts, a 4-3 mark in two-run contests and 4-1 record in games decided by three runs.

Home Cooking: Roadrunner Field and Wolff Stadium were tough places for the opposition to play in 2006, as UTSA registered a school-record 24 home victories. That broke the previous mark of 23 home wins set in 1994. The Roadrunners are 13-6 at home this year and now have posted a 256-176 (.593) alltime home record.

Hit The Lights: For the first time in school history, UTSA is playing night games at Roadrunner Field this season. Eight of the team's 21 contests at the facility are being played under the lights. The Feb. 16 home opener against LouisianaLafayette kicked off the night-time action at the "Bird Bath" and UTSA has a 4-1 record under the lights at Roadrunner Field this year.

Tough Schedule: The Roadrunners' 55 -game schedule is highlighted by six opponents that qualified for the 2006 NCAA Tournament - Baylor, College of Charleston, Houston, Rice, Texas and Texas-Arlington. UTSA has a 5-6 record against those squads this season.

Ruffin On The Career Charts: Senior Josh Ruffin's name can be found all over the Roadrunners' career record book. The Humble native is UTSA's all-time record holder with four career shutouts and he also ranks third in innings pitched (298.1); fourth in appearances (75), victories (18), and complete games

season. The Lorena native is a perfect 4-0 record and leads the staff with a 3.27 ERA. Blakley has appeared in 15 contests and has a sterling 36/7 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 44 innings. The right-hander picked up his fourth victory of the season on March 31 against Southeastern Louisiana after tossing a career-high 5.2 scoreless innings. He has gone at least four innings in seven of his appearances this season.

## Roadrunners Collect 400th All-

Time Victory: UTSA won its 400th game in school history when it defeated St. Mary's, 8-5, on Feb. 26. In 15 -plus years of action, the Roadrunners have compiled 419 all-time wins, an average of nearly 27 per season.

2007 Captains: Senior starting pitcher Josh Ruffin, junior catcher Zach Etheredge
and junior shortstop Marshal Davis will serve as team captains this season.

Preseason Polls: UTSA was picked to finish second in the West Division by the sports information directors and third by the league's coaches in the Preseason SLC Polls. The Roadrunners received five firstplace votes in the SID rankings and three in the coaches poll. They were six points (51) behind co-favorites Texas-Arlington and Texas State in the coaches poll and only three (58) behind UTA in the SID poll. Defending regular season champion McNeese State was the consensus choice to defend its regular season title in the East.

Trio Named To Preseason All-SlC Teams: Three Roadrunners were named to the preseason All-SLC teams, as senior
pitcher Josh Ruffin and sophomore outfielder Michael Rockett were firstteam selections and senior third baseman Ryan Saltzgaber was named to the second team. Ruffin earned first-team accolades a year ago, while Rockett was a secondteam honoree and Saltzgaber was an honorable mention selection.

What's Back In 2007: UTSA is coming off a season that saw it finish with a 37-22 record (20-10 SLC). The team welcomes back 17 letterwinners - including five position starters and six pitchers - in addition to 19 newcomers this season. SP • Blake Brannon, Sr. - Fourth on the team with 34 punchouts in 36 innings of work (nine starts) ... tossed five scoreless frames and fanned five at Texas-Arlington (April 7) ... allowed two runs and struck out six in seven innings at McNeese State (March 18) ... registered first quality start of year vs. the College of Charleston (March 11) ... allowed pair of runs (one earned) on just six hits in seven-plus innings, while tying career high with eight strikeouts ... entered senior season riding UTSA-record 29 scoreless innings streak and extended that stretch to 30 before giving up run vs. Louisiana-Lafayette (Feb. 16).

RP • Josh Blakley, Sr. - Has appeared in 15 games and is a perfect 4-0 record with a team-best 3.27 ERA ... also has one save and a $36 / 7$ strikeout-to-walk ratio in 44 innings of work ... fanned a career-high six in victory against St. Mary's (Feb. 26) ... tossed 5.2 scoreless innings, a career high, against Southeastern Louisiana (March 31) ... has gone at least four innings in seven contests and 3.1 innings in another.

RP • J.T. Mackey, Jr. - Sports a 5-2 mark with three saves ... has recorded a 4.11 ERA in 19 games (one start) and has struck
out 25 in 30.2 innings of work ... made first career start at No. 13 Texas A\&M ... picked up team-best fifth win of season with 2.2 scoreless frames against Northwestern State (April 15) ... collected fourth victory with a career-high five scoreless innings at McNeese State (March 17) ... got out of a bases-loaded jam with nobody out in the eighth to keep Roadrunners within one run in that contest ... earned both of team's victories vs. the College of Charleston ... first UTSA victory came after two scoreless innings against Stephen F. Austin (March 2) ... earned first save against St. Mary's (Feb. 26) ... saved the Roadrunners' 6-3 victories at Texas-Arlington (April 5) and against Southeastern Louisiana (March 31).

RP • Zach Calhoon, Fr. - Has a 2-1 record with squad-best four saves in 16 appearances ... has a 2.33 ERA and allowed just 10 hits ( 159 BAA), while striking out 28 in 19.1 innings ... named SLC Pitcher of the Week on March 5 after posting a win (vs. Houston) and a save (vs. Stephen F. Austin) ... struck out careerhigh five in 4.2 innings vs. Cougars (Feb. 27) ... collected his second victory of the season vs. Southeastern Louisiana (April 1) ... fanned final two batters against Gonzaga (Feb. 23) to earn first collegiate save.

Head Coach Sherman Corbett: With more than 20 years of playing and coaching experience, Sherman Corbett is in his seventh season at UTSA. The winningest coach in school history (196 victories), Corbett led the Roadrunners to 37 victories a year ago, the second-most in school history. In his first six seasons, he has coached a pair of 30 -win squads and 24 All-SLC players, including seven first-teamers. Corbett also has mentored the 2001 SLC Pitcher of the Year (Jared Howton), 2002 SLC Player and Hitter of the Year (Mark Schramek), 2003 SLC Freshman of the Year (Ryan Crew) and two Freshman All-Americans - Crew (2003) and Michael Rockett (2006). Twelve of his Roadrunners have gone on to professional careers, including eight being selected in the MLB Draft.
