Roadrunners to conclude five-game road swing on Tuesday against third ranked opponent of year

UTSA WRAPS UP FIVE-GAME ROAD TRIP ON TUESDAY NIGHT: UTSA concludes its five-game road swing on Tuesday night when it travels to College Station to face No. 13 Texas A&M in a 6:30 p.m. contest at Olsen Field. The Roadrunners enter the midweek tilt with a 19-13 overall record and 11-1 mark in Southland Conference play. UTSA picked up a pair of victories last weekend at Texas-Arlington, including a 12-0 run-rule victory in Saturday's finale. The Roadrunners, who scored in double figures just twice in their first 17 games, now have done so in seven of the last 15 contests. UTSA also has registered double-digit hits in 11 of its last 12 games (12.8 per game) to raise its season batting average to .304.

Scouting The Aggies: Texas A&M split a pair of games at Texas Tech last weekend and now stands at 27-7 this season. The Aggies are ranked 13th in this week's edition of the *USA Today*/ESPN Top 25 Coaches Poll. Texas A&M leads the all-time series that dates back to the 1993 season, 15-8, but the Roadrunners have posted wins in two of the past three matchups. The two teams split two meetings a year ago. UTSA registered a 4-2 victory on March 12 in the Baseball Express Collegiate Classic and the Aggies posted a 9-3 win on April 25 in College Station.

UTSA Dominating SLC Series FINALES: The Roadrunners, off to a program-best 11-1 start in Southland Conference play (previous: 9-3, 1995), has built that impressive record on the strength of four victories in series finales this season. UTSA — which has hit double digits in seven of its 12 league games, outscored the opposition by 67 runs (115-48) and is averaging 9.6 runs per league contest — has three run-rule triumphs in series finales this year. The Roadrunners defeated McNeese State, 16-2 (eight innings), on March 18; Central Arkansas, 14-1 (seven), on March 25; and Texas-Arlington, 12-1 (seven), last Saturday.

The Roadrunners' lone non-run-rule win was a nine-run triumph (14-5) against Southeastern Louisiana on April 1.

TEN-RUN THIRD A FIRST SINCE 2005:

In their 12-0 victory at Texas-Arlington on Saturday, the Roadrunners scored 10 runs in the third inning, which was the first time since April 20, 2005, that UTSA crossed the plate 10 times in a frame. The Roadrunners sent 15 batters to the plate and had seven hits in the stanza, including a school-record-tying two by both junior Trent Lockwood and sophomore Michael Rockett.

PERFECT START BEST EVER: UTSA began the 2007 Southland Conference season a perfect 10-0, which was its best SLC start in school history and tied for the secondbest in league history. Lamar started 14-0 in 1984, while Texas-Arlington was 10-0 a year ago. UTSA's previous best start was 4-0 in both 1994 and '96.

BRING OUT THE BROOMS: UTSA opened the SLC campaign with consecutive sweeps of McNeese State, Central Arkansas and Southeastern Louisiana. The sweeps marked the first time the program's 16-year history that the Roadrunners swept back-to-back to-back three-game series against league opponents. UTSA now has swept SLC foes 16 times in school annals, 10 of which have come under the direction of head coach Sherman Corbett.

HE'S GOING STREAKING: Redshirt freshman Tim Palincsar is riding a careerhigh 12-game streak in which he is hitting .429 (21-49) with six doubles, one triple, three home runs (.776 slugging pct.) and 18 RBIs. Palincsar also has scored 20 runs, reached base at a .509 clip and stolen five bases during the last 12 contests.

LINEUP CHANGES DO THE TRICK: Stuck with a 4-9 record and averaging just

freshman Tim Palincsar into the top two spots in the lineup and junior Zach Etheredge to the six hole. Since those switches, the Roadrunners have posted a 15-4 record, hit .328 as a team and scored an average of 8.4 runs per contest. With the improved offense putting up runs in bunches, the pitching staff has responded with a 4.02 ERA, struck out 141 hitters in 170 innings of work and allowed opponents to hit just .269.

RED HOT OFFENSE: After starting the year slowly, the UTSA offense has exploded the past 16 games, 13 of which have resulted in victories. The Roadrunners have scored 143 times (8.9 pg) and outscored the opposition by 64 runs during that time. UTSA has posted a .334 batting average on the strength of 198 hits (12.4 pg), slugged .575 (341 total bases) and reached base at .401 clip. Forty-one percent of the squad's 198 hits (82) have gone for extra bases, including 45 doubles, 13 triples and 24 home runs. The Roadrunners also have stolen 17 bases in 21 attempts, which translates to an 81 percent success rate.

YOU DROPPED A BOMB ON ME: Twentyfour of UTSA's 29 home runs (82.8 pct.) this season have been hit during the past 16 contests. Leading the long ball parade is junior Zach Etheredge, who has slugged six in the past 15 games. Sophomore James Keithley has launched four, while junior Trent Lockwood, redshirt freshman Tim Palincsar, sophomore Michael Rockett and senior Ryan Saltzgaber each have hit three bombs. Lockwood, Rockett and Saltzgaber have grand slams among their three homers. Also on the board is senior Mitch Ponza, who has left the yard twice during the past 16 contests.

CLOSE GAMES: In addition to scoring runs in bunches this year, the Roadrunners have shown the knack of playing close games. Eighteen of the club's 32 contests (56.2%) this year have been decided by three runs or less and it has an 11-7 mark in those games. UTSA has a 4-3 record in one-run tilts, a 3-3 mark in two-run contests and 4-1 record in games decided by three runs.

No Freebies From Chovanec: Junior Bradley Chovanec has been the Roadrunners' most consistent starter this season and that is best seen in his 37/11 strikeout-to-walk ratio in his 50.2 innings (11 games/eight starts). Chovanec, who has a 2-3 record and 4.44 ERA this season, is averaging just 1.4 walks per start and the Burton native has yet to issue a free pass or allow a run in any of his three relief outings this year (six innings). Four of his last six starting assignments have resulted in quality starts. He has earned both his victories this season, posted a 3.89 ERA and recorded a 22/8 strikeoutto-walk ratio during that stretch.

BLAKLEY THROWING STRIKES: Senior Josh Blakley has been as good as it gets coming out of the UTSA bullpen this season. The Lorena native leads the team with a perfect 4-0 record and 3.20 ERA. Blakley has appeared in 14 contests and has a sterling 33/7 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 39.1 innings. The right-hander picked up his fourth victory of the season on March 31 against Southeastern Louisiana after tossing a career-high 5.2 scoreless innings.

RUFFIN ON THE CAREER CHARTS: Senior Josh Ruffin's name can be found all over the Roadrunners' career record book. The Humble native is UTSA's all-time record holder with four career shutouts and he also ranks fourth in victories (17), innings pitched (289.1) and complete games (seven); fifth in appearances (74); sixth in strikeouts (177), eighth in games started (34) and ninth in earned run average (4.73).

HOME COOKING: Roadrunner Field and Wolff Stadium were tough places for the opposition to play in 2006, as UTSA registered a school-record 24 home victories. That broke the previous mark of 23 home wins set in 1994. The Roadrunners are 11-5 at home this year and now have posted a 254-175 (.592) alltime home record.

HIT THE LIGHTS: For the first time in school history, UTSA is playing night games at Roadrunner Field this season.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: The Roadrunners' 55-game schedule is highlighted by six opponents that qualified for the 2006 NCAA Tournament — Baylor, College of Charleston, Houston, Rice, Texas and Texas-Arlington. UTSA has a 5-6 record against those squads this season.

2007 CAPTAINS: Senior starting pitcher Josh Ruffin, junior catcher Zach Etheredge and junior shortstop Marshal Davis will serve as team captains this season.

PRESEASON POLLS: UTSA was picked to finish second in the West Division by the sports information directors and third by the league's coaches in the Preseason SLC Polls. The Roadrunners received five first-place votes in the SID rankings and three in the coaches poll. They were six points (51) behind co-favorites Texas-Arlington and Texas State in the coaches poll and only three (58) behind UTA in the SID poll. Defending regular season champion McNeese State was the consensus choice to defend its regular season title in the East.

TRIO NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-SLC

TEAMS: Three Roadrunners were named to the preseason All-SLC teams, as senior pitcher Josh Ruffin and sophomore outfielder Michael Rockett were first-team selections and senior third baseman Ryan Saltzgaber was named to the second team. Ruffin earned first-team accolades a year ago, while Rockett was a second-team honoree and Saltzgaber was an honorable mention selection.

What's Back In 2007: UTSA is coming off a season that saw it finish with a 37-22 record (20-10 SLC). The team welcomes back 17 letterwinners — including five position starters and six pitchers — in addition to 19 newcomers this season. Topping the list of returnees are 2006 first-team All-SLC starting pitcher Josh Ruffin, a senior, and Freshman All-America center fielder Michael Rockett. Also back are sophomore second baseman James Keithley and senior third baseman Ryan Saltzgaber, both of whom earned honorable mention accolades a year ago.

Mackey, Jr. - Sports a 4-1 mark with team-leading three saves ... has recorded a 3.60 ERA in 17 games and has struck out 22 in 25 innings of work ... collected fourth win of year with a career-high five scoreless innings at McNeese State (March 17) ... got out of a bases-loaded jam with nobody out in the eighth to keep Roadrunners within one run in that contest ... earned both of team's victories vs. the College of Charleston ... picked up first UTSA victory with two scoreless innings against Stephen F. Austin (March 2) ... earned first save against St. Mary's (Feb. 26) ... saved the Roadrunners' 6-3 victories at Texas-Arlington (April 5) and against Southeastern Louisiana (March 31).

RP • Zach Calhoon, Fr. - Has a 2-1 record with squad-best three saves in 13 appearances ... has a 2.12 ERA and allowed just eight hits (.143 BAA), while striking out 26 in 17 innings ... named SLC Pitcher of the Week on March 5 after posting a win (vs. Houston) and a save (vs. Stephen F. Austin) ... struck out career-high five in 4.2 innings vs. Cougars (Feb. 27) ... collected his second victory of the season vs. Southeastern Louisiana (April 1) ... fanned final two batters against Gonzaga (Feb. 23) to earn first collegiate save.

HEAD COACH SHERMAN CORBETT: With more than 20 years of playing and coaching experience, Sherman Corbett is in his seventh season at UTSA. The winningest coach in school history (194 victories), Corbett led the Roadrunners to 37 victories a year ago, the second-most in school history. In his first six seasons, he has coached a pair of 30-win squads and 24 All-SLC players, including seven first-teamers. Corbett also has mentored the 2001 SLC Pitcher of the Year (Jared Howton), 2002 SLC Player and Hitter of the Year (Mark Schramek), 2003 SLC Freshman of the Year (Ryan Crew) and two Freshman All-Americans — Crew (2003) and Michael Rockett (2006). Twelve of his Roadrunners have gone on to professional careers, including eight being selected in the MLB Draft.
