### Setting the Scene

The UTSA baseball team returns to Southland conference action this weekend with a pivotal three-game series against Texas-Arlington on April 21-23 at Clay Gould Ballpark in Arlington, Texas.

### All-Time Series

The Mavericks lead the all-time series 29-19 over the Roadrunners. Last season, UTSA took the series against UTA and ended a 10-game losing streak to the Mavs with a 12-4 pounding on April 15 at Roadrunner Field.

### Last Outing

The Runners ended a 13-game losing streak to the Texas Longhorns in a 14-10 slugfest at Wolff Stadium Tuesday evening. UT came into game ranked fifth in the country. The win over No. 5 Texas is the biggest upset in UTSA's baseball history. Senior Noah Tritz came into the game for the Runners and picked up his team leading eighth win of the season. The Spring, Texas, native, tossed two and two-thirds innings, allowing one run while punching out two Longhorns. For the third straight game, the Runners managed to score over 10 runs and collect double digit hits (16). The Roadrunners were led by sophomore Marshal Davis and J.R. Voyles with three RBI apiece, while senior Lee Todesco and sophomore Zach Etheredge paced UTSA with three hits apiece. With the 1-for-3 night, Voyles extended his career best hitting streak to 23 games. Junior Michael McKennon and freshman Michael Rockett added two hits apiece. McKennon also tagged on two RBI. Etheredge scored a season-high four runs.

**Head Coach  
Sherman Corbett  
Sixth Season 162 Career Wins  
UTSA's Winningest Coach**

With more than 20 years of playing and coaching experience, Sherman Corbett now enters his sixth year at the helm of the UTSA baseball program.

With 162 career victories, Corbett became the all-time winningest baseball coach in UTSA history last season (162-162). He also guided the

Roadrunners to their second Southland Conference (SLC) Tournament Championship and NCAA Regionals in 2005.

Three of Corbett's players went on to play professionally in 2005. Shortstop Ryan Crew, who was selected to the 2005 All-SLC third team and SLC Tournament MVP, was drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers, while pitcher Jason Vecchio was selected in the 16th round by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2005 draft. Sean Danielson was the third Runner to sign a big league contract when he signed with the St. Louis Cardinals.

In his first season in 2001, he guided the Roadrunners to their first 30-win season since 1995. The same year he coached four players to all-SLC honors including the 2001 SLC Pitcher of the Year in Jared Howton. In 2002, five players were selected to the all-conference squad under Corbett's tutelage along with Mark Schramek being the SLC Player and Hitter of the Year. Schramek went on to become UTSA's first-ever baseball all-American and the highest major league draft pick in UTSA history (first round, 40th overall by the Cincinnati Reds).

Corbett produced again in 2003 with Crew being named the 2003 SLC Freshman of the Year and a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American. In 2004, the Roadrunners led the SLC in home runs.

A San Antonio native, Corbett garnered all-city honors during his prep days at Samuel Clemens High School before beginning his collegiate career at Texas A&M.

Over three seasons as an Aggie, Corbett posted a career record of 14-11. Corbett was then drafted in the third round of the 1984 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft by the California Angels.

In his inaugural season with the Angels, the southpaw appeared in 34 games, posting a 2-1 record with one save and a 4.14 ERA. He made his major league debut against the Baltimore Orioles, then picked up his first major league victory against the Chicago White Sox at Old Comiskey Park.

He remained in the California organization for seven seasons. After his time with the Angels, Corbett spent one season with the Detroit Tigers organization and a final season with the Chicago Cubs organization before retiring in 1993.

Corbett comes from a highly respected baseball family in the San Antonio area, with his father, Raymond, Sr., serving as an administrator in the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District for 23 years. He also was an associate scout for the Cincinnati Reds and assisted with numerous camps and all-star games in the San Antonio area.

Corbett's brother, Raymond, Jr., who was a high school all-American and all-State catcher at Clemens High School, played over seven seasons in the Cincinnati organization. He is currently an area scout for the New York Mets.

In 2001 all three Corbetts were inducted into the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School District Sports Hall of Honor.

Corbett graduated Cum Laude from Texas A&M with a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 1991. In 1995 he remained in College Station to earn a master of business administration degree.

After completing his master's degree, Corbett coached and taught at A&M Consolidated High School and was an instructor at Texas A&M baseball camps. In addition to his coaching and playing experience, Corbett also served as the NCAA Regional Baseball Tournament field coordinator for the 1993, 1998 and 1999 Regional and Super Regional games played at Texas A&M.

Corbett is the third baseball coach in UTSA history, following Jimmy Shankle (1992-95) and Mickey Lashley (1996-2000).

Corbett and his wife, Julie, have a seven-year old son, Mason.

### Scouting Texas-Arlington

Texas-Arlington is coming off a 6-3 win over Hawii-Hilo on April 18 at Clay Gould Ballpark. In their last five games, the Mavs are 302 including a win over Texas on April 11 in Austin, Texas. Last weekend, UTA dropped the series to McNeese State in Lake Charles, La. The Mavericks are ahead in percentage points over the Roadrunners for second place in the SLC standings. UTA is sporting a 17-22 overall record and a 11-5 in conference play. Junior Adam Moore leads the team in four offensive categories. He tops the team with a .374 batting average, 55 hits, 14 double and five home runs.

### Slugfest II

UTSA couldn't get enough of its recent slugfest against Nicholls State, that they decided to add a sequel. UTSA and UT combined for 24 runs and 26 hits. The Roadrunners have scored over 10 runs and collected doubles digits in hits, in the last three games. The Runners are batting .409 with 47 hits and scored 40 runs during those three contests.

### Slugfest I

UTSA and Nicholls State slugged it out this weekend. Both team combined for 76 hits and 57 runs, including a wild one on Friday, April 14, were both squads compelled 30 runs off 31 hits and 20 walks. For the weekend, UTSA batted .394 as a team.

### Swinging A Hot Bat

In his last nine games, Todesco increased his batting average from .297 to .359, which ranks seventh in the conference and second on the team. He also has drove in 14 RBI, scored seven times and collected 19 hits, while batting .514. In the weekend series against the Colonels, the Buda, Texas native, collected eight hits in 14 at-bats, scored four runs, recorded four doubles and a triple, while collecting five RBI. He also slugged 1.000 and had a on-base percentage of .533.

### Walk The Line

Second baseman J.R. Voyles set a single-game school record with five walks in his first five plate appearances. He was one walk shy of tying a NCAA and SLC record for most free passes in a game (6).

### Freshman Shines

Freshman James Keithley stepped it a notch over the weekend. He went 7-for-13, batted .538, collected five RBI, legged out two doubles, scored four times and blasted a walk-off two-run homer.

### Taking One For The Team

Michael McKennon has been beamed 16 times this season, which leads the team and ranks second in the conference.

### Voyles' Streaking

Voyles currently has a career-best 23-game hitting, which started against Dallas Baptist. During his hitting streak, Voyles has upped his average to .303 from .216.

### Touch'em All

McKennon has belted a team-best eight home runs this season, including two walk-off homers. His eight bombs are fourth best in the conference. He already surpass his home run total of three from last season. In his freshman season, he smacked two homers.

### Multi McKennon

Michael McKennon leads the team with 17 multi-hit games, including 12 games with at least two hits.

### Rockett Power

Freshman Michael Rockett is having a terrific rookie season for UTSA. In 29 games played, Rockett is batting .363, which is sixth best in the league and leads the team. He also has 37 hits in 102 at-bats, 17 RBI and is slugging .490.

### Going the Distance

Josh Ruffin pitched his third complete game of the season, which tops the SLC. The Humble, Texas native, has two shutouts under his belt and is first in that category. On the year, Ruffin is 5-1 overall and 3-0 in conference play.

### Win Number 20

With the win on April 8th, UTSA picked up its 20th win of the season. Last season, the Roadrunners didn't reach the 20-win mark until April 26, 2005, when UTSA defeated Texas A&M, 4-2, in College Station.

### Extra Extra

The Roadrunners have played in six extra-inning games this season. They have posted a 4-2 mark in those contests. Three of the six games have gone into the 12th inning, UTSA going 3-0, including two of them being won via walk-off homers. The last time, UTSA played in at least five or more extra inning games was during the 2002 season.

### Ruffin's Stellar Outing

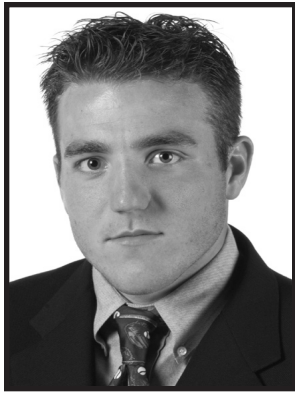

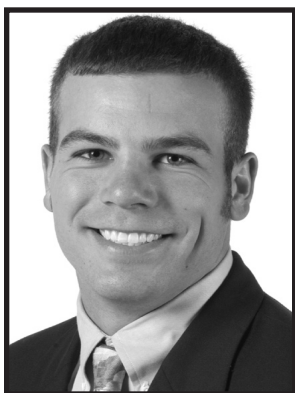
