Entering the halfway mark of Conference USA action, UTSA will welcome Old Dominion to Roadrunner Field for a three-game series set to begin Friday, April 10, at 6 p.m.

Old Dominion will be making the trek to the Lone Star State for the first time. In 2014, the two squared off in Norfolk, Va. where the Monarchs won the series, 2-1. The Roadrunners won the first-ever matchup, blanking the Monarchs 5-0.

UTSA (19-14, 7-5 C-USA) heads into the series off a midweek victory over Houston Baptist. Cody Brannon was the pitcher of record as he hurled five innings in relief. Jesse Baker came up big as his three-run homer in the top of the ninth secured the win.

Winners of its last two, UTSA is hitting .284 and leads the league in doubles (77) and home runs (28). The Roadrunners' 77 doubles is also best for eighth in the NCAA.

A new name sits atop the Roadrunners' season box with Baker leading the squad with a .359 average. The junior leads the team with nine home runs, 12 doubles and 29 RBIs, and is slugging .738 on the year. He is also fourth in hits (37).

Meanwhile, on the mound, Brock Hartson will get the starting nod Friday night. The junior right-hander leads the pitching staff with 42 strikeouts and has a 3.69 ERA through 53.2 innings of work.

Aaron Burns (1.39 ERA) will get the call for Saturday's contest, while Nolan Trabanino (5.29 ERA) will start Sunday.

Old Dominion (17-14, 5-7 C-USA) heads to the Alamo City off a midweek loss to VCU on Wednesday. The Monarchs also faced Liberty on Monday and picked up a 5-1 win.

In its last conference tilt, ODU took the series against Charlotte in Norfolk.

The Monarchs are led by P.J. Higgins as he's batting a .366 clip and leads the team in hits (48) and runs (23).

LAST TIME OUT

UTSA 6, Houston Baptist 2

HOUSTON — Cody Brannon pitched five innings of two-hit baseball and Jesse Baker hit a home run for the fourth consecutive outing to lead UTSA past Houston Baptist, 6-2, on Tuesday afternoon.

Brannon's (3-1) relief appearance earned him the win, as the senior did not allow a run, walked one and struck out three.

Baker blasted a three-run homer in the ninth to secure the win for the Roadrunners (19-14). The junior second baseman now has a nine-game hitting streak and he was a triple shy of hitting for the cycle after finishing the contest 3-for-5 with a double, home run, two runs and three RBIs.

Kevin Markham also had a multiple hit game with his 2-for-4 performance.

The midweek contest was tied early on after UTSA evened the score in the third.

Tyler Straub laced a two-out double down the right-field line to score Markham and Baker.

Both teams went quietly in the fourth, but, in the following frame, Logan Kinder crossed home on Markham's sacrifice fly for the lead.

Three innings later, Baker blasted a three-run homer with two outs to secure the win.

Weston Wick was charged with the loss for Houston Baptist (16-15). He gave up three runs on four hits and struck out four in his five innings of work.

UTSA will return to the Bird Bath this weekend for a three-game Conference USA series against Old Dominion (17-13, 5-7 C-USA). Friday's opener is slated for 6 p.m.

Diamond Notes

UTSA had **four** players selected in the 2014 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Justin Anderson was selected in the 14th round by the Los Angeles Angels, John Bormann in the 19th round by the Angels, Matt Sims in the 28th round by the Atlanta Braves and Michael Kraft in the 37th round by the Toronto Blue Jays.

Two Roadrunners agreed to free agent deals after four were selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. Wes Cox and Ryan Talley agreed to deals with the Milwaukee Brewers and LA Angels respectively.

Roadrunners were selected **fifth** in the **Conference USA preseason poll**. Rice was the unanimous preseason favorite receiving all 12 votes. The Owls have won either the regular season or tournament title in each of its nine years as a member of Conference USA.

Senior catcher **John Bormann** returns for his final season as a Roadrunner after being selected by the Los Angeles Angels in the 19th round of the MLB Draft. Bormann returns to the diamond as the team's top hitter, batting a .288 clip. The Seguin native picked off a league-best 13 runners and had the 12th best fielding percentage in Conference USA.

UTSA will play one of its toughest schedules in quite some time when they face a total of **seven teams** (Bryant, La.-Lafayette, Old Dominion, Rice, Texas, Texas A&M and UC Irvine) that earned a **regional berth** in 2014, including two that made a College World Series appearance (Texas, UC Irvine).

UTSA will hit the airwaves twice in 2015 on the **American Sports Network**. The Roadrunners' first televised game on ASN will be on April 4 when the Roadrunners take on FIU at 3:30 p.m. CT. Two weeks later, UTSA will take on Rice in Houston on April 18.

UTSA opened the 2015 campaign with a **series win** over Louisiana-Lafayette. The Birds took the season opener 8-5 but lost game 2 on a 8-2 decision. UTSA returned for the rubber match and came from back from a 3-2 deficit to win 11-5.

BOMBS AWAY! The Roadrunners hit **six** home runs over a three-game span after only hitting 27 during the 2014 season. **John Bormann** and **Kevin Markham** each had two homers against Louisiana-Lafayette.

The Roadrunners first road test of the season came up IH-35 in Austin against the **No. 6 Texas** Longhorns. UTSA kept pace with the Horns through six innings before a costly error in the bottom seventh with two outs allowed UT to clear the bases. UT took the 14-2 win.

UTSA has opened the 2015 slate with **three** straight opponents that earned a berth to an NCAA regional. Bryant went 42-16 in 2014 and trekked to Louisiana for the Baton Rouge Regional and lost back-to-back game to end the season.

With a 12-0 victory over Incarnate Word, UTSA improves to **6-2** on the season. The last time the Roadrunners had a start like that was back in 2008 when it finished the year 39-19 and 22-8 in the Southland Conference. UTSA was the **regular season champions** in the SLC.

UTSA traveled for its first road series of the season against former Southland Conference foe **McNeese State** and dropped all three games. This was the **first series loss** of the season for the Roadrunners. The series was also altered due to possible inclement weather where UTSA and McNeese played a doubleheader on Saturday, which was also a first for the Roadrunners this season.

UTSA opened up its 2015 slate against four teams that made an appearance in the **2014 NCAA Tournament**. Against those teams, the Roadrunners have posted a **5-5** record. UTSA opened with **Louisiana-Lafayette** and went 2-1 to win the series and then followed with then-**No**. **6 Texas** dropped a 14-2 decision. **Bryant** visited the Alamo City and the Roadrunners were able to take all three from the Bulldogs and most recently faced **UC Irvine** and dropped that series 1-2.

Bormann had the fourth-best bating average on the team with a .288 clip and tied for second in doubles (12) and registered 60 hits. He was also drafted in the 19th round of the MLB First Year Player Draft by the Los Angeles Angels but decided to forgo his final season at UTSA.

The City of Hattiesburg and **Southern Miss** will host the **2015 Conference USA Baseball Tournament**. Eight teams will make the trip to play in the double-elimination tournament. In 2014, UTSA made it all the way to the championship game but lost to Rice.

Brock Hartson earned the Roadrunners' first **Conference USA player of the week award** after logging 8.1 innings of scoreless baseball against Marshall in the series opener. Hartson struck out six, walked four and allowed four hits in his first win of the season.

Despite only seeing action in two games this season, **Grant Gibbs** came up big against the top-ranked Texas A&M Aggies. The senior drove in the Roadrunners' **only run** and then came back the following day to **coach first base** through the first five innings.

As of late, UTSA has struggled to hold leads late in the game. Through 32 games this season, the Roadrunners have only **scored three runs** in the **seventh inning** and have allowed 30 from its opponents. Of those three runs, **two** came against **Louisiana-Lafayette** and the other against **McNeese**. Trent Bowles, John Bormann (HR) and Geonte Jackson have been the only Roadrunners to record runs in the seventh.

Junior **Aaron Burns** has transitioned himself out of the bullpen and into a starter role. The right-hander pitched his second complete game of the season against No. 25 Florida Atlantic en route to a 14-3 victory. Burns now leads the Roadrunners pitching staff with a **1.49 ERA**, which is best for second in Conference USA. The Jerrell, Texas native has only allowed six earned runs.

Not only is UTSA leading Conference USA in **doubles** with **74** but rank **10th** amongst all Division I programs. The Roadrunners are averaging 2.31 per game, which ranks 14th in the NCAA. Freshman Trent Bowles leads the charge with 12 of his own through 25 games.

Despite struggles out of the bullpen, UTSA has **shutout** its opponent **four times**. The first came in a 12-0 decision against Incarnate Word. The Roadrunners then recorded back-to-back shutouts against Houston Baptist and Marshall and followed with a 12-0 blanking of Western Kentucky. The four shutouts of the year ranks **11th** in the **NCAA**.

Senior **John Bormann** was recently recognized by the University of Texas at San Antonio as **UTSA's Outstanding Male Athlete**. Bormann, a steady leader behind the plate as one of the top catchers in the nation, has helped lead the Roadrunners to reach their conference tournament championship in each of the last three seasons.

C.J. Pickering hit a solo home run in the top of the ninth against FIU on Sunday, April 5, for the team's **27th homer** of the year. That total matches the team's home run total of 2014 through 32 games.

The Roadrunners have been a doubles machine in 2015 and have amassed 77 on the year through 33 games. Freshman **Trent Bowles** and **Jesse Baker** each have a team-leading 12. The duo combine for **31 percent** (24-of-77) of the team's **doubles** this year.
