

2023 UTSA Roadrunners Football UTSA 20, Texas State 13 Saturday, Sept. 9 Alamodome · San Antonio Postgame Notes · Attendance: 49,342

TEAM RECORDS AND SERIES NOTES

- With the win, UTSA moves to 5-0 in the series against Texas State and 3-0 when the series is played in San Antonio.
- The win provides UTSA its first victory since beginning competition as a member of the American Athletic Conference.
- UTSA is 31-11 (.738) under Jeff Traylor, the best record and winning percentage for a UTSA head coach through 42 games in program history.
- UTSA is 8-5 all-time in home openers, including 3-1 under Jeff Traylor.
 - The Roadrunners have wins in four of the last five home openers.
- The Roadrunners have won seven straight and 17 of their last 18 at home, making UTSA 45-29 in the Alamodome.
- Under Jeff Traylor, UTSA is 13-4 against teams from the state of Texas, and 33-20 in the history of the program.
- Today's attendance was 49,342, marking the second-largest home crowd in program history behind only the inaugural game attendance of 56,743 on Sept. 3, 2011.
 - This marks the second straight home game with more than 40,000 in attendance as the 2022 Conference USA Championship Game against North Texas drew 41,412
 - UTSA now has drawn 40,000-plus in a home game in three consecutive years, as 41,148 attended the 2021 Conference USA Championship Game versus Western Kentucky

TEAM NOTES

- UTSA kept the offense relatively balanced for the second consecutive game, passing for 214 yards and rushing for 158.
- The Roadrunners registered seven sacks to break the record for most sacks in a game.
- UTSA posted 10 total tackles for loss.
- UTSA held Texas State to just 31 rushing yards on 29 attempts, the fewest rushing yards allowing since Nov. 19, 2022 at Rice.
- The Roadrunners limited Texas State to only 242 yards, the fewest total yards allowed since the 2022 Cure Bowl in Orlando against Troy, when UTSA allowed just 164 yards.
- The Roadrunners converted on 12 of 22 third-down attempts and went 2 for 2 on fourth-down conversions.
- UTSA collected five pass breakups against the Bobcats.
- The Roadrunners were tagged with just one penalty for five yards, tied for the fewest penalties in a game and breaking the school record for fewest penalty yards in a game.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Sophomore OLB **Trey Moore** recorded 3.0 sacks to tie Robert Singletary (2014) for the second most in program history in a single game tying for the most in program history against an FBS opponent.
 - Moore's team-high seven tackles is the most since Army West Point last season (Sept. 10, 2022), when he had a career-best eight stops.
- Junior ILB Martavius French turned in five tackles.
- Junior OLB Jimmori Robinson posted a sack, two quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.
- Senior DL Trumane Bell II had two tackles for loss, including a sack.
 - Bell II now has 12.5 career sacks, which is tied with Clarence Hicks for third in school history.
- Senior ILB Avery Morris logged three tackles including one sack.
- · Junior DL Nick Booker-Brown registered one sack and a QB hurry.
- Sophomore RB Kevorian Barnes rushed for 115 yards on 26 carries, extending his streak of 100-yard rushing games to four dating back to the 2022 Conference USA Championship vs North Texas.
 - Barnes has reached the 1,000-yard milestone, as he now has 1,067 career yards with today's performance.
 - o Barnes has 206 yards on 42 carries this season, averaging 4.9 yards per carry.
- Senior WR Tykee Ogle-Kellogg caught six passes for 78 yards, his most since going for 142 yards against UTEP on Nov. 26, 2022.
- Senior QB Frank Harris completed 26 for 37 passes (.703) for 214 yards and a TD.
- Sophomore transfer RB Rocko Griffin scored his first touchdown in a UTSA uniform when he dashed 20 yards to the end zone early in the second guarter.
- Junior transfer WR Willie McCoy hauled in his first touchdown pass as a Roadrunner on a 20-yard reception in the corner of the end zone late in the third quarter to give UTSA a 17-10 lead.
- Junior transfer PK Chase Allen recorded his first points as a Roadrunner when he drilled a 46-yard field goal at the 3:01 mark of the first quarter.

UTSA's captains were Joshua Cephus, De'Corian Clark and Frank Harris.
