## ARMY CARRIES MOMENTUM INTO PRIMETIME GAME

Army (1-1) defeated Delaware State, 57-0 last week, Army's largest margin of victory in a shutout win since defeating Columbia (60-0) on Oct. 27, 1956. The shutout win also marked Army's first shutout win while scoring 50+ points since defeating Fordham, 55-0 in 2011.

Army totaled 525 total yards, the first time posting 500+ yards in a game since 2021, while scoring seven offensive touchdowns on the day, led by junior QB Bryson Daily who had three passing touchdowns and two on the ground.

Junior WR Isaiah Alston set a career-high with 135 receiving yards with two touchdowns on three receptions. Alston became the first Army receiver with 130+ receiving yards and two TDs since Jeremy Trimble did so twice in the 2007 season.

UTSA (1-1) enters off a Week 2 win, 20-13 vs. Texas State. The win was their first victory as a member of the American Athletic Conference in front of the second-largest home crowd in program history. UTSA posted 10 total tackles for loss, including a school record-breaking seven sacks.

## 1ST AND 10

- Army has four team captains for the 2023 season. Seniors, **LB Jimmy Ciarlo**, **DL Austin Hill**, **LB Leo Lowin**, and **OL Connor Finucane** lead the team.
- Army is 2-1 all-time vs. UTSA.
- Last season, UTSA defeated Army 41-38 in OT at Michie Stadium.
- Army has twice defeated UTSA in San Antonio (2019, 2020).
- UTSA have won seven straight and 17 of their last 18 home games.
- Army is 17-14 all-time in games played in the state of Texas.
- WR Isaiah Alston set a career-high with 135 receiving yards last week, which was also the most in any game in the Jeff Monken era.
- Alston was named to the PFF College Team of the Week.
- QB Bryson Daily became the second Army QB to throw three touchdowns in a game under Jeff Monken (Jabari Laws, vs. Wake Forest, 10/23/21).
- Daily also became the first Army QB since at least 1956, with three passing TDs and two rushing touchdowns in the same game.
- According to Phil Steele, Army has the 24th toughest schedule in college football based off of win/loss record and winning percentage of each team's 2023 opponents as Army's opponents equate to an 88-65 (57.5%) record.
- Army will play in dome stadiums in back-to-back weeks, as they will play Syracuse next week for the first time since 1996 in the JMA Wireless Dome.

## NEW COACHES

**Drew Thatcher, Offensive Coordinator** -- Joins Army from offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Nebraska-Kearney (2019-22). In 2022, guided quarterback TJ Davis to repeat as MIAA Offensive Player of the Year in 2022 as he had 2,506 combined yards over 11 games. The Lopers finished with an 8-3 record and averaged 33 points and 402 yards per game.

**Darren Paige, Running Backs** -- Spent the last two seasons (2021-22) as the running backs coach at the University of Cincinnati. In 2021, he aided in the development of then junior Jerome Ford, who had one of the best seasons ever for a Cincinnati running back, rushing for 1,319 yards and a school-record-tying 19 touchdowns.

**Danny Verpaele, Safeties** -- Coached at Kennesaw State (2019-22). Was at Army before serving as a quality control coach for Monken (2014-15).

**Justin Weaver, Inside Linebackers** -- Was the Head Coach of the United States Military Academy Preparatory School (USMAPS) this past season (2022), and also served as the USMAPS defensive coordinator from 2019-21.

- Helped Army win its first Commander-in-Chief's Trophy as a senior in 2017 since 1996. Has played in 17 career NFL games with one start for the Philadelphia Eagles (2020-21).

#### Cole Christiansen, LB, 2020-Pres.

- Signed with the Los Angeles Chargers as an undrafted free agent in 2020, after receiving a waiver that allowed him to serve in the reserves and delay his active duty commitment until after his playing career is over. Was a member of the 2022 Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs. Has played in eight NFL games and has logged four tackles. Finished his Army career with 275 tackles which ranks 20th most in school records.

#### Elijah Riley, DB, 2020-Pres.

- In his four-year career at Army, Riley accumulated 201 tackles, seven interceptions, and 6.5 sacks. His seven interceptions rank second most by an Army defender since 2000. In the NFL, Riley has played for the Philadelphia Eagles, New York Jets and Pittsburgh Steelers playing in 17 games with seven starts. In 2021 with the Jets, logged a career high 45 tackles, one sack, and three tackles for loss.

#### Jon Rhattigan, LB, 2021-Pres.

- Did not become a starter for Army until his senior season in 2020 where he finished with 78 total tackles, nine tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, two interceptions, two pass break ups and two fumble recoveries. ## ARMY DROPS HOME OPENER IN OT THRILLER

**WEST POINT, N.Y.** - Army West Point football fell in overtime in its home opener, 41-38 against UTSA at Michie Stadium.

In the first quarter, a pair of pass breakups from S Marquel Broughton, the Roadrunners were set up with a fourth and short at the Black Knights 28-yard line, with Army stuffing the run up the middle with Broughton making the stop. UTSA would return the favor on Army's opening possession, forcing a turnover on downs after Tyrell Robinson got the ball across midfield with an 11-yard run.

OLB Andre Carter would wreak havoc on UTSA's next drive, with his sack helping Army force a three and out. Army's big play prowess continued on the next drive, with QB Tyhier Tyler connecting over the middle with RB AyJaun Marshall for a 77-yard touchdown. It was the second linkup between Tyler and Marshall, after the two had a 53-yard touchdown in the first half last week against Coastal Carolina.

QB Cade Ballard came in at quarterback on the Black Knights next drive, moving the chains with a 15-yard completion to Robinson after Buchanan converted a fourth and one from the Black Knights' own territory to keep the drive alive. The Black Knights were unable to score on the drive, with the Roadrunners eventually tying the score at seven with a one-play, one-yard drive following a muffed punt by the Black Knights midway through the second quarter.

The Black Knights were able to drive down quickly on its ensuing drive, with Ballard hitting WR Isaiah Alston for a 48-yard gain and Josh Lingenfelter for 25 yards to set up a first and goal. RB Jakobi Buchanan punched in a 1-yard touchdown run on a pivotal fourth and goal to give Army back its seven-point lead at 14-7. UTSA would find the end zone to tie the score with a 29-yard touchdown pass from Frank Harris to WR Zakhari Franklin.

Getting the ball back with under 90 seconds remaining in the half, Ballard was able to drive down quickly to set up another first and goal, highlighted by a 42-yard completion to RB Braheam Murphy down to the one-yard line. Army went to its goal-to-go connoisseur in Buchanan, who promptly notched his second touchdown of the game and fifth multi-score game of his career as the Black Knights took a 21-14 lead into half.

Receiving the second half kickoff, Army put together its most time-consuming drive of the afternoon with a 12 play, 75-yard drive that took 8:11 off the clock, culminating in a 16-yard rushing touchdown by Tyhier Tyler. After a Roadrunners answer, Army took a 28-21 lead into the final quarter.

After an Army punt, UTSA put together an 11-play touchdown drive to tie the score at 28 with 9:49 remaining. The Roadrunners would continue their second-half scoring run, punching in a one-yard touchdown run to take its first lead of the game with just over seven minutes remaining. On Army's ensuing drive, Alston drew a key pass interference call to set up the Black Knights in opposition territory with less than two minutes remaining. Needing a big play, Ballard was able to connect with Tyrell Robinson for a 42-yard touchdown pass up the seam to tie up the score, 35-35, with 1:03 remaining followed by K Quinn Marezki's fifth extra point of the contest.

With the Roadrunners getting the ball back with just over a minute remaining, they were able to set up a 41-yard field goal attempt on the final play of the game. UTSA's Jared Sackett's attempt went wide right, sending the game into overtime, the Black Knights first overtime affair since its victory over Air Force last season.

Army opened overtime with possession and struck first by a Quinn Marezki 28-yard field goal to give Army a three-point lead. Once UTSA gained possession, the Roadrunners were able to strike a seven-yard touchdown pass from Frank Harris to De'Corian Clark to secure the win at West Point, 41-38. UTSA QB Frank Harris finished the contest 32-45 passing, for 359 yards and three TDs.

### HIGHLIGHTS AND GAME NOTES

- Army's quarterback duo of Tyhier Tyler and Cade Ballard combined for 13-18 passing for 307 yards and two TDs (RB Tyrell Robinson also completed a pass, 1-1 for six yards). It was Army's first 300-yard passing game since 11/17/2007 vs. Tulsa.

## 2023 TEAM NOTES

### DOMINANT HOME WIN

Army's Week 2, 57-0 win vs. Delaware State was Army's largest margin of victory in a shutout win since defeating Columbia (60-0) on Oct. 27, 1956.

The shutout win also marked Army's first shutout win while scoring 50+ points since defeating Fordham, 55-0 in 2011.

It was also Army's first shutout victory since 2020, when defeating Navy, 15-0.

### NOT EVERY "DAY"-ILY

Making his second career start in Week 2 vs. Delaware State, junior QB Bryson Daily totaled five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) on 8-11 passing for 193 yards, adding nine carries for 65 yards on the ground.

Daily became the second Army QB to throw three touchdowns in a game under Jeff Monken (Jabari Laws, vs. Wake Forest, 10-23-21).

Daily also became the first Army QB since at least 1956, with three passing TDs and two rushing touchdowns in the same game.

### 500 YARDS / 8 TOUCHDOWNS

Army totaled 525 total yards, the first-time posting 500+ yards in a game since 2021, while scoring eight offensive touchdowns vs. Delaware State. It was the ninth time in the Monken era, posting over 500 total yards and scoring 8+ touchdowns. Army is 8-1 in such games.

### FRESHMAN FINDING THE ENDZONE

Freshman QB Larry Robinson and RB Kayne Udoh made their collegiate debuts in Week 2 vs. Delaware State, eaching finding the endzone. Robinson scampered in from 23 yards, and Udoh pushed in from five yards out.

### NEW FACES TO THE LINEUP

WR Noah Short, WR Liam Fortner, RB Miles Stewart, OL Lucas Scott and LB Jackson Powell all logged their first career starts in Week 2 vs. Delaware State.

### JIMMY SACKS

Senior LB Jimmy Ciarlo has logged two sacks through the first two games, the first two sacks of his career. He has 2.5 TFLs and has totaled nine tackles.

### NOT SO "SMALL" FEAT

Freshman Brady Small started at center in the Week 1 game at ULM, marking the first freshman to start in his first game since WR Kevin Waites started in in the season opener vs. Fordham in 2017. Small is a 6-0, 309-pound center, who played at St. Augustine Preparatory School in Mt. Ephraim, NJ and then spent the 2022 season at USMAPS.

### BO KNOWS

Senior DB Bo Nicolas-Paul intercepted ULM QB Jiya Wright and returned it 44 yards for Army's first TD of the season in the second quarter of the season opener. It was Army's first interception returned for a touchdown since Jabari Moore did so vs. Mercer in 2020. It was Nicolas-Paul's second career INT.

### PICK CITY

DB Max DiDomenico also intercepted a pass at ULM. It was the first of his career.

In the Jeff Monken era, Army is now 19-2 when recording 2+ defensive interceptions in a game, including the loss to ULM.

Since 2020, when Defensive Coordinator Nate Woody arrived, Army has nine multi-interception games, ranking in the top 30 nationally, in multi-INT games in that span.

### THE PRIDE OF HAWAII

Special teams coordinator Sean Saturnio, K Quinn Maretzki and DL Isaiah Filisi ran out with Hawai'i state flags, as all three are Hawaiian born players, showing support for the Hawaiian community following the wildfires that destroyed parts of Maui.

### BLOCK PARTY

DB Cam Jones blocked a 24-yard field goal try in Week 1 at ULM. Under Saturnio, the Army special teams unit have 13 combined field goal and punt blocks since 2020.

P Cooper Allan, WR Isaiah Alston, OL Connor Finucane, LB Leo Lowin, RB Tyson Riley and PR Tyrell Robinson were named to the first team. RB Jakobi Buchanan, LB Jimmy Ciarlo, OL Jackson Filipowicz, DB Quindrelin Hammonds, LB Austin Hill, OL Jordyn Law and DB Jabari Moore were named to the second team. Three Black Knights on the 2023 preseason list (Finucane, Lowin and Robinson) were named to the 2022 Phil Steele All-Independent Team.

### 2022 SEASON SUMMARY: ARMY BLACK KNIGHTS (6-6)

Army West Point overcame a difficult 1-4 start to its season by winning five out its last seven games to finish 6-6, culminating with a double-OT victory over rival navy. With the win over Navy, Army has beat its rivals in five of the last seven meetings since 2016. In Week 3 win vs. Villanova, Head Coach Jeff Monken reached a significant milestone, logging his then 59th victory with Army and moving past legendary Army Head Coach Charles Daly for 2nd place on Army's all-time coaching wins list. The offense was led by Senior QB Tyhier Tyler, who posted a career high 12 rushing touchdowns, which was second in the FBS by all quarterbacks. He also was the first Army quarterback with 10+ rushing touchdowns since Kelvin Hopkins Jr totaled 17 in 2018. The Senior quarterback finishes his Army career with 24 rushing touchdowns, T-3rd most by an Army QB, which is also good for T-10th on Army's all-time rushing TD list. With Tyler primarily at the helm, the Black Knights ranked second in the country rushing for 289.4 yards per game. Army's 38 rushing touchdowns were tied for second most only behind Tennessee (39). The defense saw consistent improvement throughout the season, behind third-year Defensive Coordinator Nate Woody. During Army's 5-2 finish, the defense only gave up 15.0 points per game. During this span of the season, Army's 105 points allowed was tied for sixth fewest in the country. Sean Saturnio's special teams units made big plays throughout the season, including a punt return touchdown by Tyrell Robinson and two blocked punts for touchdowns against UConn and Navy. Army's three special teams TDs were second most in the FBS. Army sees a senior class that will graduate 19 players who went 21-5 at Michie Stadium over their four years (2019-22). 21 home wins ranks tied for ninth in the FBS during that span. Seven Black Knights were selected to Phil Steele's Postseason All-Independent Team in first-team selections, C Connor Bishop, LB Andre Carter II, S Marquel Broughton and Tyrell Robinson who was selected as a punt returner. QB Tyhier Tyler, OL Connor Finucane and LB Leo Lowin were named to the second-team. Additionally, Andre Carter participated in the Reese's Senior Bowl, a post-season college all-star game for top NFL prospects.

### BRYSON DAILY, QB

#### **The Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award**

Recognizes the top offensive player in Division I football who also exhibits the enduring characteristics that define Earl Campbell: integrity, performance, teamwork, sportsmanship, drive, community and tenacity; specifically, tenacity to persist and determination to overcome adversity and injury in pursuit of reaching goals. In addition, the nominee must meet one or more of the following criteria: born in Texas and/or graduated from a Texas High School and/or played at a Texas-based junior college or currently playing at Texas D1 four-year college.

### TYRELL ROBINSON

The senior RB returns after being limited to playing in just five games due to injury last season. He rushed for 321 yards and a touchdown while also hauling in seven passes for 135 yards and a touchdown and returning five punts for 67 yards and a touchdown. Robinson was named a First Team Special Teams Phil Steele All-Independent selection following the 2022 season.

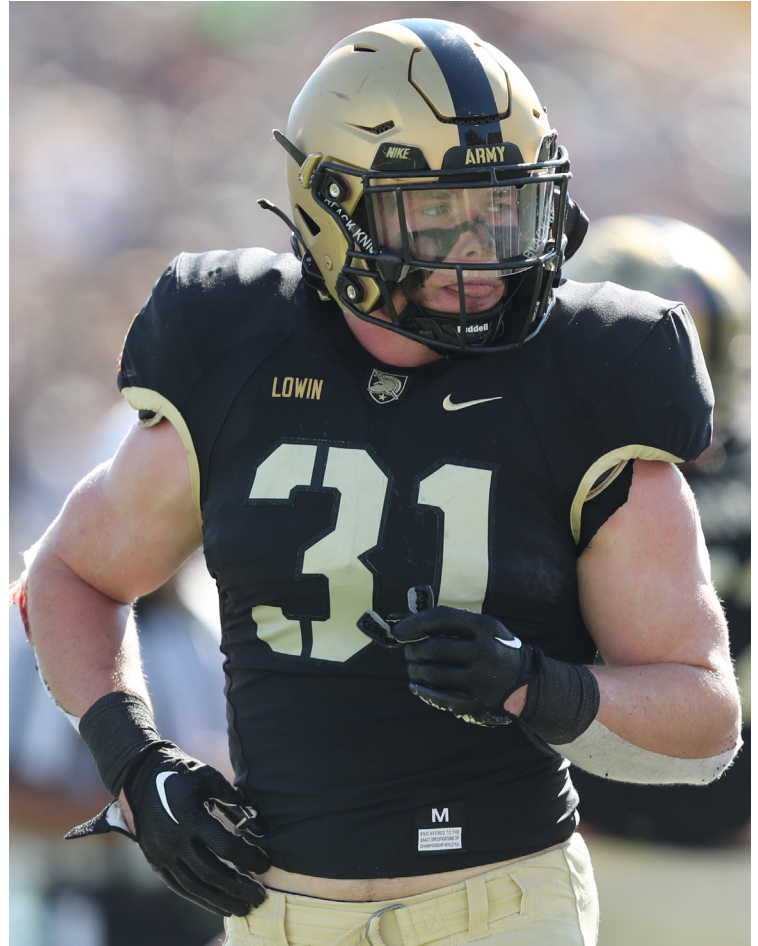

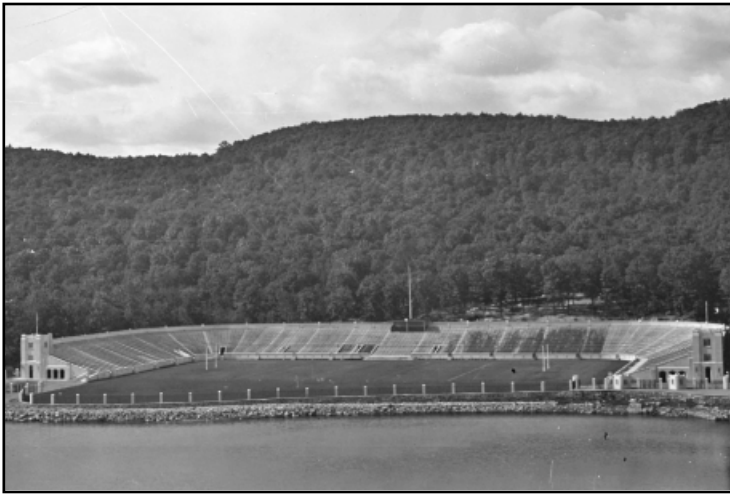

Michie Stadium, splendid in its scenic beauty and long recognized as one of the most popular stadiums in the nation, will celebrate its 100th season as the home of Army football during the 2023 campaign. Over the years, the venerable stadium has received its share of plaudits as one of the most desired locations in which to watch a college football game. Recently, noted football analyst Mel Kiper Jr. of ESPN.com hailed the Academy's game day atmosphere as among the most inspirational in the country.

Realizing the need for a permanent athletic field as Army's football program continued to assert itself nationally, West Point officials selected a patch of meadow land adjacent to Lusk Reservoir and within the shadow of historic Fort Putnam. Construction of Michie Stadium was completed in 1924, just in time for Army's 35th football campaign.

The original stadium structure was formally dedicated to the memory of Dennis Mahan Michie, who was instrumental in starting the game of football at the U.S. Military Academy in 1890. It was Michie who organized, managed and coached the first football team in history at West Point.

There have been several facelifts since that first game in 1924 when Army defeated Saint Louis University 17-0.

In honor of legendary mentor Earl "Red" Blaik, Army christened the Michie Stadium playing surface "Blaik Field" in 1999. Blaik, a gridiron innovator, compiled an 18-year Army record of 121-33-10 and brought Army its only three national championships (1944, 1945, 1946). The winningest coach in Army annals, Blaik is enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

## ARMY DROPS OPENER AT LOUISIANA-MONROE

**MONROE, La.** -- Army West Point football kicked off its 2023 season with a 17-13 defeat at Louisiana-Monroe on Saturday night. The game began in an unorthodox way, as a power outage at Malone Stadium caused the videoboard to be off as the game started without a functional videoboard as the referees kept the official clock on the field. The videoboard and power were restored midway through the second quarter.

On Army's first offensive drive of the season under new offensive coordinator Drew Thatcher, QB Bryson Daily, who was making his first career start, completed his first career pass, a 53-yard reception to sophomore WR Liam Fortner, also his first career reception. From the ULM 17-yard-line threatening to score, Daily was strip sacked by ULM's Norman Massey which was recovered by the Warhawks and took away Army's scoring opportunity.

The Army offense pieced together another drive moving 47 yards on 11 plays, but senior K Quinn Maretzki missed a field goal try from 37 yards out, as Army failed to get on the board for the second straight drive. The Warhawks got into Army territory for the first time on their third drive after converting on a pair of third down conversions. They were eventually forced into a third straight punt after Brett Gerena sniffed out a QB draw on third-and-ten from the Army 43. Two plays after a 20-yard pickup on a slant to WR Isaiah Alston, Daily threw an interception on an attempt over the middle that ULM LB Ja'Terious Evans picked off. The Warhawks were able to capitalize on Army's second turnover, converting a 24-yard field goal by Derek McCormick, to take a 3-0 at the 6:20 mark in the second quarter.

Army found the spark it needed when DB Bo Nicolas-Paul intercepted ULM QB Jiya Wright and returned it 44 yards for Army's first TD of the season with 2:33 remaining in the second quarter. It was Army's first interception returned for a touchdown since Jabari Moore did so vs. Mercer in 2020. It was Nicolas-Paul's second career INT.

On the next ensuing drive, DB Max DiDomenico picked off Wright and gave the offense the ball at the 35 yard-line. Army would capitalize on the turnover when Maretzki converted a 22-yard field goal, to give Army a 10-3 lead with seven seconds to go in the half. In the third quarter, each team was stalled offensively as each punted twice.

To begin the fourth quarter, Army pieced together a nine play, 58-yard drive which was capped off on a 28-yard field goal by Maretzki to give the Black Knights a two-score lead, 13-3. The Army defense remained stout, forcing the sixth ULM punt of the night with 8:19 left to play. Army was pinned inside its own ten-yard line following the Warhawks' punt, with Cooper Allan then booting a career-best 52-yard punt from his own end zone. Starting from its own 38-yard line, ULM was able to break its largest gain of the day with Hunter Smith taking a rush up the middle to the house for the first touchdown of the night for the home team. A McCormick PAT made it a 13-10 contest.

Army faced a third-and-long on its ensuing drive, with Daily hitting Marshall over the middle for a big gain. However, Car'lin Vigers was able to force the ball loose and ULM took over with its second fumble recovery of the evening. Isaiah Woullard was then able to break free for a 33-yard gain, setting up a nine-yard touchdown pass from Hunter Herring to Tyrone Powell which gave ULM a 17-13 lead with 2:48 remaining.

Army got the ball back trailing by four but turned it over for the fourth time on the night on the second play of the drive as A.J. Watts came down with the interception. ULM's drive stalled with under a minute left, with Cameron Jones then blocking a 24-yard field goal attempt on fourth down with 29 seconds remaining. Army got the ball back at its own 15-yard line, but with no timeouts, the Black Knights were unable to move the ball downfield with ULM recovering a last-ditch lateral as time expired.

**ARMY BLANKS DELAWARE STATE, 57-0 IN HOME OPENER**

WEST POINT, N.Y. -- The Army West Point football team kicked off the 100th season of Michie Stadium with a statement victory, defeating Delaware State in the home opener 57-0.

It marked Army's largest margin of victory in a shutout win since defeating Columbia (60-0) on Oct. 27, 1956. It was also Army's first shutout victory since 2020, defeating Navy, 15-0.

Army totaled 525 total yards, the first-time posting 500+ yards in a game since 2021, while scoring eight offensive touchdowns on the day, led by junior QB Bryson Daily who had three passing touchdowns and two on the ground. Daily finished passing 8-11 for 193 yards and added nine carries for 65 yards. Junior WR Isaiah Alston set a career high with 135 receiving yards with two touchdowns on three receptions. Alston became the first Army receiver with 130+ receiving yards and two TDs since Jeremy Trimble did so twice in the 2007 season. Alston joins only Trimble (twice), William White (2003), and Aaron Alexander (2003), as Army players to eclipse these totals in a single game since 1996.

On the opening drive of the game, Army's OLB Trey Sofia sacked Delaware State QB Aaron Angelos on third-down to complete an opening drive three and out for the Black Knights defense, Sofia's first full sack of his career.

On Army's opening drive offensively, sophomore Zach Mundell made his collegiate debut, recording a reception for seven yards. On the drive, the Army offense faced a fourth-and-2 from the Delaware State 17-yard line, which RB Jakobi Buchanan plunged forward for a gain of three and a first down. The 10-play drive was capped off on a 13-yard touchdown run by QB Bryson Daily. Army would line up for the extra point but fake it with a direct snap which was converted on a run by RB Hayden Reed, to take an 8-0 lead with 8:00 in the first quarter.

On Army's second offensive drive, Daily connected with WR Isaiah Alston on a double-move down the right sideline for a 59-yard touchdown, Alston's fifth career receiving touchdown and Daily's first career passing touchdown to take a 15-0 into the second quarter. Army would find the endzone again with 8:01 in the second quarter, on Daily's second rushing touchdown of the game, from four yards out to extend the Black Knights lead 22-0. The Hornets moved the ball into Army territory on the ensuing drive, before being faced with a fourth-and-one from the Black Knights 30-yard line. On the play, Chris Frey and Spencer Jones were able to get into the backfield and force the turnover on downs on an attempted dive play.

Army got all 70 yards on one play to find the end zone on its ensuing drive, with Daily hitting Alston on a quick slant where the Army receiver burned through the secondary for a career-long 70-yard touchdown catch. The Army defense continued its dominant first half, with Jack Latore pouncing on a loose ball in the backfield to give the Black Knights an immediate red zone opportunity. The Cadets converted on the first play of the drive once again, with Daily hitting Tyson Riley in stride for a 16-yard touchdown connection. Mareztki knocked in his fourth PAT of the ballgame to make it a 36-0 Army advantage.

Getting the ball back with just under three minutes to play, Delaware State moved the ball deep into Army territory, eventually setting up a first and goal from the seven-yard line. Eventually and third and long with the goal to go, Kyle Lewis broke free from the right edge to complete a strip-sack and recovery to give Army the ball back and secure the first half shutout. Freshman QB Champ Harris made his Army debut in the closing seconds of the half, completing a pair of passes to Casey Reynolds for 20 yards. Cole Talley attempted a 58-yard field goal as time expired, with it missing wide right.

In the second half, Army kept the gas on scoring three more touchdowns, one in the third quarter and two in the fourth quarter. Freshman QB Larry Robinson made his collegiate debut and scored his first touchdown on a 23-yard run. Another freshman, RB Kayne Udoh also scored his first touchdown on a five-yard run.

Daily paced all Army rushers (9-65) followed by Robinson (4-63), Ay'Jaun Marshall (2-44), Markel Johnson (6-32), and Udoh (5-32).
