Things to Look For This Week...

Temple's Week 6 matchup against UTSA marks the first time the two schools have ever faced off in football.

The Owls are 7-3 in their last 10 conference home openers.

LB Jacob Hollins' 15 tackles against Tulsa was the most by an Owl this season, and the most by a Temple player since Yvandy Rigby's 16 against Navy in 2022.

LB Jordan Magee's start in the Week 5 loss to Tulsa marked his 30th consecutive game played.

UTSA is the first of three consecutive matchups against schools from Texas, marking the first time Temple has played three straight schools from the same state outside of Pennsylvania.

Game 6: Temple (2-3, 0-1) vs. UTSA (1-3, 0-0)

Philadelphia, Pa. | Lincoln Financial Field | October 7, 2023 | 2 p.m.

THIS WEEK

Temple returns home to host UTSA at Lincoln Financial Field on October 7. The game is set to kick off at 2 p.m. and will air on ESPN+ and 97.5 The Fanatic.

LAST WEEK

The Owls lost to Tulsa Golden Hurricane, 48,26, on a Thursday night matchup in Oklahoma. Despite taking an early 3-0 lead, the game became an uphill battle as Temple trailed by as much as 30 points in the loss. The story of the game was the Golden Hurricane's offense, which totaled 533 net yards from scrimmage.

LB Jacob Hollins impressed for Temple, tallying 15 total tackles and 10 solo tackles. Hollins' total tackles set a season high for any Owl, and are the most by a Temple player since Yvandy Rigby recorded 16 total tackles against Navy last season. On offense, Temple's tight ends had a strong showing. David Martin-Robinson (48), Jordan Smith (49) and Reese Clark (8) combined for 105 of the team's 269 passing yards. WR Amad Anderson Jr. tallied 75 yards and scored one touchdown, which marked the third time in as many games in his career that he has scored against Tulsa. The Owls received a spark on special teams, as SAF Sam Martin Jr. returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter to cut Temple's deficit to two scores. The kickoff return for a touchdown was the first by an Owl since Isaiah Wright did so in 2018.

TEMPLE-UTSA HISTORY

The matchup between the Owls and Roadrunners will mark the first time that the two schools have ever faced each other in football.

The addition of six new teams into the American Athletic Conference has created new matchups for Temple that are unique to past seasons. Not only is the UTSA matchup a first, but Temple's eventual conference games against Florida Atlantic, Alabama Birmingham, and North Texas will all be the first matchups between the respective schools. The Owls' Week 3 win against Norfolk State was also the first time that Temple ever matched up against the Spartans.

UP NEXT

Up next, Temple will hit the road to Texas to match up against the North Texas Mean Green on Saturday, Oct. 14. The game is set to kickoff at 12 p.m. ET, airing on ESPNU and 97.5 The Fanatic.

THIS WEEK

IN REMEMBRANCE OF JOANNE A. EPPS

Temple University mourns the loss of President JoAnne A. Epps, who passed away on September 20. A champion for the entire Temple Owls community, Epps was also a consistent advocate for the student-athlete experience and a passionate supporter of Temple Athletics. The Temple Football team will be sporting "JAE" stickers on their helmets in memory of President Epps.

NATIONALLY RANKED

On September 18, U.S. News & World Report announced its annual "Best Colleges" ranking of national universities. Temple ranked 89th on this year's list, which is the highest ranking ever achieved and marks the first time Temple was included in the top 100 of the report. The ranking takes into account student outcome measures and the quality of university faculty, among other factors.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Both UTSA and Temple have quarterbacks whose fathers played in the NFL. Temple QB E.J. Warner is the son of Kurt Warner and UTSA QB Owen McCown is the son of Josh McCown. If McCown were to start for UTSA, Saturday's matchup would mark the first time in the FBS era that two sons of NFL quarterbacks started against each other in a game. Josh McCown was a third-round pick in the 2002 NFL draft and totaled 17,731 passing yards and 82 passing touchdowns over a 16-year NFL career. Kurt Warner, an NFL Hall of Famer and four-time Pro Bowler, finished his career with 32,244 passing



yards and 208 passing touchdowns. Not only did the competing players' fathers have successful NFL careers, but the two quarterbacks played as teammates on the Arizona Cardinals during the 2005 NFL season.

LONE STAR STREAK

Temple's Week 6 matchup against UTSA is the first of three consecutive games against schools located in Texas. After hosting UTSA this week, the Owls head to North Texas in Week 7 and play SMU in Week 8. The span of games in the 2023 season marks the first time Temple has played three straight games against teams from the same state outside of Pennsylvania.

A NEW SINGLE-DIGIT TRADITION

This season, Temple started a new tradition by awarding the single-digit numbers 4 and 9 to two deserving players on a weekly basis (OL Victor Stoffel wears #78 in games). SAF Tywan Francis has earned the #4 in four weeks of the 2023 season and has not disappointed since joining the Owls from Colorado State this offseason. Francis recorded the game-sealing interception in a Week 1 win over Akron and has tallied a team-high 37 total tackles, which is good for fifth in the AAC. DL Tra Thomas (Week 1), DL Jerquavion Mahone (Week 2), and LB Jacob Hollins (Week 4) earned the #9 jersey this season.

SHIFTING GEARS

The Owls will be competing in a new-look American Athletic Conference this season, following the departure of Cincinnati, Central Florida, and Houston. The conference shifted from 11 total teams to 14 in 2023, with the addition of Charlotte, Florida Atlantic, North Texas, Rice, UAB, and UTSA. Temple's eventual conference matchups with Florida Atlantic, North Texas, UAB, and UTSA will mark the first time in school history the two teams have faced off.

DO I KNOW YOU FROM SOMEWHERE?

UTSA SAF Bryce Grays and CB Ben Osueke are both from Richmond, Texas. Osueke also played at Blinn Junior College with UTSA LB Darrius Govan, where they were teammates on the same defensive unit for two seasons. UTSA DL Brandon Brown made his collegiate debut as a freshman with Tulane in a matchup against Temple in 2020. LB Jacob Hollins, SAF Elijah Deravil, and UTSA SAF Marcellus Wilkerson all played at Garden City CC before their respective schools. SAF Brenyen Scott and UTSA CB Zah Frazier both transferred from Coffeyville CC, where they were teammates in the same secondary for two seasons. UTSA LB Nnanna Anyanwu also played at Coffeyville CC before transferring to the Roadrunners. UTSA OL Ayomikun Daniel Ogunpide and OL Richard Rodriguez are both offensive line products of Iowa Central CC. Ogunpide hails from Upper Darby, PA and went to Imhotep, the same high school as DL Zymir Cobbs.

Temple HC Stan Drayton, UTSA HC Jeff Traylor, and UTSA OC Justin Burke all made stops at Texas before their current positions. LS Andrew McIlquham played under UTSA Asst. OL coach Jarrett Anderson, when Anderson was a coach at TCU.

Team

TEMPLE TUFF

The phrase "Temple Tuff" is synonymous with the fight and grit of Temple's football team. However, it was coined by legendary Temple basketball coach John Chaney whose teams also were noted for their hard-nosed, lunch-pail passion by which they played. An ever-present figure on Temple's campus, Chaney passed away on January 29, 2021.

POWER 5 PIECES

All three of Temple's coordinators this season have coaching experience at the Power 5 level. OC Danny Langsdorf has coached at Oregon State, Nebraska, Oregon, and Colorado. DC Everett Withers has coached at Texas, North Carolina, Minnesota, and Ohio State. STC Adam Scheier has coached at Wake Forest, Ohio State, Texas Tech, Mississippi, and Rutgers. Temple is the only school in the AAC to have its three coordinators all previously hold their coordinator position at the Power 5 level. In addition to the coordinators, 19 players on Temple's 2023 roster have played at Power 5 schools (WR Amad Anderson Jr., DT Joseph Appiah Darkwa, OLB Diwun Black, DL Zymir Cobbs, DL Allan Haye, CB Dominick Hill, LB Jacob Hollins, RB Darvon Hubbard, DL Jerquavion Mahone, WR D'Wan Mathis, LS Andrew McIlquham, DL K.J. Miles, TE Landon Morris, QB Quincy Patterson, K Camden Price, WR Ian Stewart, DL Lancine Turay, K Chris Van Eekeren, and SAF Kamar Wilcoxson).

UNITED NATIONS

Temple has 10 countries represented on this year's roster, the most foreign countries represented by any school in the FBS. Australia (Dante Atton), Bahamas (Kaleb Barnett), Canada (Melvin Siani), England (Peter Clarke and James Faminu), Germany (Joseph Appiah Darkwa), Liberia (Edward Saydee), Nigeria (Ben Osueke), Sweden (Victor Stoffel), Turks and Caicos (Yvandy Rigby), and the United States.

JUCO JAM

Temple features 11 former junior college players on its 2023 roster, with many expected to receive significant playing time: OL Diego Barajas, CB Christian Bell, OLB Diwun Black, QB Forrest Brock, SAF Elijah Deravil, LB Jacob Hollins, CB Ben Osueke, OL Richard Rodriguez, SAF Brenyen Scott, OL Chris Smith, and OLB Tra Thomas.

VETERAN X2

OL Victor Stoffel, a veteran of the Cherry and White since 2019, is one of the oldest players in college football this season. The Stockholm, Sweden native turned 25 (1/8/98), which makes him the 16th oldest FBS player, and the fifth oldest non-kicker [DL Tyrone Taleni, USC (6/10/96); DB DeAngelo Gibbs, South Carolina (9/23/97); DL David Marshall, Baylor (11/30/97); and WR Devaughn Vele, Utah (12/12/97)]. Stoffel's fellow offensive lineman, Kevin Smithwick, is a veteran in the traditional sense. Smithwick proudly served in the United States Marine Corps for five years before enrolling at Temple.

SILVER LININGS PLAYBOOK

Temple holds a 5-5 home record against ranked teams since 2014. Five of Temple's losses in 2022 were against bowl eligible teams and five were to teams who will play Power 5 football in 2023. Through five weeks of the 2023 season, two out of Temple's three losses both came against Power 5 opponents with a combined record of 8-1. The lone loss came in Week 4, when Rutgers was defeated by No. 2 Michigan on the road.

STAN DRAYTON

STAN THE MAN

Stan Drayton, after serving as an assistant coach at the collegiate and NFL level for 28 years, became the 29th head coach in Temple history on December 15, 2021. Drayton's notable stops include Texas, Ohio State, Florida, Green Bay Packers, and Chicago Bears. He won national championships at Florida in 2006 and Ohio State in 2014.

CULTIVATING GREATNESS

Stan Drayton has coached many NFL players during his career, including former Cowboys' RB Ezekiel Elliott and former 49ers' RB Carlos Hyde. One of his earliest and most popular players is former Eagle Brian Westbrook, who he coached at Villanova.

PHILLY PHILLY

Drayton also has strong Philly roots. He attended and played at Allegheny College, located in Meadville. He has experience coaching at Penn and Villanova, as well. Drayton and his wife, Monique, also got engaged in Philadelphia.

GROOMED BY CROOM

Stan Drayton first worked with Sylvester Croom when the former was a quality control coach for Green Bay from 2001-03 and the latter was the Packers running back coach. In 2004, when Croom was hired at Mississippi State as the first black head coach in SEC history, Drayton joined him as the running back coach. "I've had a lot of influences in the coaching ranks but Sly is like a father figure to me. He showed me it was possible to become a head coach as a black man and as a running back coach."

CLIMBING THE LADDER

Despite only being in his second season as the Owls head coach, Stan Drayton is tied with SMU's Rhett Lashlee for the fourth longest tenured head coach in the American Athletic Conference. Only Tulane's Willie Fritz (8), East Carolina's Mike Houston (5), and Memphis's Ryan Silverfield (4) have been in the American and at their schools for more seasons than Drayton. While Rice's Mike Bloomgren (6) and UTSA's Jeff Traylor (4) have been the head coach at their school for more years than Drayton, they are new to the AAC in 2023.

BUILDING THE WHOLE MAN

Stan Drayton, with the help of Director of Player Development, Arkeem Byrd, preaches the importance of building the whole man. This includes work on and off the football field. Six Owls took that message to heart, working over the summer prior to the 2023 season. OL Wisdom Quarshie worked for the Philadelphia 76ers as a Ticket Sales Intern. OL Bryce Thoman worked for Vivint as a Smart Home Security Sales Intern. TE David Martin-Robinson worked for Grassroots Health as a Training Fellow. OL Jackson Pruitt worked for Adobe as a Student Ambassador.

Offense

LANGS LOVES OFFENSE

Danny Langsdorf was named offensive coordinator and quarterback coach for Temple Football in January, 2022. He came to Temple after serving two

OWL SCHOLARS

In an effort to recognize the outstanding academic accomplishments of Temple University's student-athletes, Temple Athletics introduced the Owl Scholars Program in the Fall of 2016. Through team apparel, student-athletes on all of Temple's 19 sports regularly have the opportunity to wear items that represent their athletic lives while on campus or in the classroom; the Owl Scholars Program aims to accomplish the reverse - provide an easily identifiable symbol of academic success for student-athletes to wear on their respective field or court of competition.

The Owl Scholars Patch has been designed to pay homage to the rich history of the Temple

Owls, while invoking images of the infamous speech of Temple University's founder Russell Conwell, Acres of Diamonds. The three stars above the regal owl symbolize the three different ways a student-athlete can earn the honor of having the patch included on their uniform/game warm-up:

- 1) 3.0 semester GPA in previous term
- 2) 3.0 cumulative GPA prior to beginning of semester
- 3) Successfully completed his/her undergraduate degree at Temple

- 51 football players will wear the patch this season.



seasons as pass game coordinator and quarterback coach at Colorado. In 2022, Langsdorf oversaw true freshman starting quarterback, E.J. Warner who registered one of the best campaigns in Temple history. Langsdorf has 26 years of experience on the collegiate and professional levels, all on the offensive side of the ball augmented by some extensive special teams coaching. He has 16 years of Power 5 conference experience, including 12 as an offensive coordinator.

WARNER'S CORNER

Sophomore quarterback E.J. Warner made his collegiate debut against Lafayette last season in relief of D'Wan Mathis, and led the Owls to a victory, throwing for 173 yards and two touchdowns while completing 74% of his passes. Warner, the son of NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Kurt Warner, passed P.J. Walker for most passing yards all-time by a freshman in Temple history (Warner, 2,501, Walker, 2,084). Warner also becomes the sixth quarterback in Temple history to throw for 2,000 yards in a single season. In the season finale vs. ECU, Warner also threw for the most passing yards (527) and completions (45) in a game in Temple history.

FRESH WORDS

It's not a leap to get from P.J. Walker to E.J. Warner. There are a lot of similarities between Temple's all-time leader passer and the 2022 true freshman. Here are their passing numbers through their true freshman season:

THE REAL SLIM SAYDEE

Running back Edward Saydee decided to stand up against USF last season. He set career-highs in multiple rushing and receiving categories including rushing yards (265), longest rush (75), rushing touchdowns (3), receiving yards (69), and longest reception (69). Both the rushing yards and longest rush are the best by a Temple player since Ryquell Armstead in 2018. Overall, his 334 all-purpose yards were the fourth most in a single game in school history. Saydee's 265 rushing total ranked fifth on The American's single-game chart since the conference was established in 2013.

OSCILLATING O-LINE

Last season, Temple started a different offensive line combination from the previous week in all 12 games. In fact, former left tackle Isaac Moore was the only player to start each game at the same position. In all, Temple started 10 different combinations, but never the same five in consecutive weeks. Temple's offensive lines in Weeks 2 and 3 against Rutgers and Norfolk State marked the first consecutive identical starting five since Week 4 of the 2021 season.

Defense

EVERETT'S ELITE D

Everett Withers heads the defensive unit for the Owls this season being named both defensive coordinator and outside linebackers coach. He brings 35 years of coaching experience to Stan Drayton's staff. Withers' pedigree includes coaching stops at Texas, North Carolina, Ohio State, Minnesota and Louisville, as well as time with multiple NFL teams. Additionally, Withers has experience as a head coach, holding that position at Texas State, James Madison, and North Carolina.

LIMITING THE OPPONENT

Temple's 41-9 victory over Norfolk State was a statement win for the Owls defense. The game marked the 30th consecutive time that Temple has come away victorious when holding its opponent to 10 points or less, dating back to the 2008 season.

BALL-HAWKING BACKER

OLB Layton Jordan set a school record with three defensive TDs last season. Only 11 teams in the country had more defensive TDs last season than Layton Jordan. Jordan also led the AAC in forced fumbles. Jordan finished the year with 18.5 TFLs and 9.0 sacks. Those marks are the sixth and ninth best marks in school history for a single season.

JORDAN²

Linebackers Layton Jordan and Jordan Magee are two of the leaders for the Owls defense. In 2022, Jordan was first on the team in sacks with 9.0 and led with 18.5 tackles for loss, while Magee led the team in total tackles with 86 and set a career-high of 4.5 sacks. Both earned 2023 preseason first-team All-AAC recognition.

WILD BOYZ

Temple's defensive line has been dubbed with the nickname "Wild Boyz" over the past decade and the unit has lived up to the special billing. Two NFL first round draft choices - Muhammad Wilkerson (2011, NY Jets) and Haason Reddick (2016, Cardinals) - and a handful of other pro players have learned their trade at Temple. Four Wild Boyz are currently employed in the NFL: Arnold Ebiketie (Atlanta), Jacob Martin (Indianapolis), Michael Dogbe (Houston), Haason Reddick (Philadelphia).

Special Teams

ISN'T THAT SPECIAL

Adam Scheier joined the Temple Football staff in January, 2022, as the Special Teams Coordinator and Tight Ends Coach. A native of Bronx, N.Y., Scheier brings 27 years of collegiate coaching experience into 2023, including the last 23 working with special teams. In 2022, Scheier's tight end room produced a bounce-back campaign for David Martin-Robinson. Martin-Robinson had a breakout season despite missing the season's first three games. He finished with a career-best 33 receptions for 366 yards and two scores. On the special teams side, punter Mackenzie Morgan landed on the Ray Guy Award watch list, and scored a trick play touchdown, the first ever by an Australian player for Temple. Kicker Camden Price had a great year in his first season as the Owls' place kicker. The grad transfer from Miami went 13-14 on field goal attempts, leading Temple in scoring with 57 points.

WHAT'S THIS

Freshman punter Dante Atton comes to Temple from Australia. The unique part of Atton's story is that he has never played a snap of organized football in his life. When he takes the field for the Owls this season, it will be the first time he has ever punted in a football game.

THE PRICE IS RIGHT

Kicker Camden Price made his career-long 49 yard field goal against UCF last season. The kick was tied for the longest made field goal in the AAC last season, until Cincinnati K Ryan Coe hit a 52-yarder. Along with Price's 47-yarder at Memphis, he owned two of the four longest FGs in the conference. His four field goals against USF marked the first time a Temple kicker had four field goals in a game since Brandon McManus in 2010.

ANIMAL HOUSE

National Lampoon's Animal House movie was based on writer Chris Miller's fraternity experiences at Adam Scheier's alma mater Dartmouth College. It's title can also describe Scheier's residence. Due in part to his wife, Erica, being a veterinarian and his family's love of animals, the Scheier compound has nearly 20 animals. This menagerie includes dogs, cats, pigs, hedgehog, lizards, turtles, hamsters, rabbits, and birds. Most of the aforementioned critters have been named after players along Scheier's coaching journey. Edward Saydee is the first Temple player to have an animal named after him, as the Scheier family adopted a dog named Saydee after the win over USF in 2022.

KICKING FOR A CAUSE

Temple kicker Camden Price is making an impact off the field, embarking on an initiative to raise money for ALS research and patient care. Donors have the option of making one-time donations, or pledging monetary contributions per point scored on field goals and extra points by Price this season. Donations will go to the ALS Hope Foundation at the Temple University Lewis Katz School of Medicine, with the goal of raising \$25,000. Temple quarterback E.J. Warner is the son of NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Kurt Warner, who was a two-time NFL MVP and four-time Pro Bowl player. DL K.J. Miles is the son of Keith Miles, who played professionally for the Seattle Seahawks.

BROTHERLY LOVE

Temple's 2023 roster includes two players with brothers who are in the NFL.

Safety Ihsim Smith-Marsette's brother Iimir was a fifth round pick for the Minnesota Viking in the 2021 NFL Draft and won a Super Bowl with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2023. He currently plays for the Carolina Panthers. Defensive lineman Lancine Turay's brother Kemoko, a linebacker, was a second round draft pick by the Indianapolis Colts in the 2018 draft and is currently a member of the Atlanta Falcons.

Miscellaneous

DIVERSITY UNIVERSITY

Temple and Maryland are the only FBS school that has an African American president (JoAnn Epps), athletic director (Arthur Johnson), and football coach (Stan Drayton).

JUST DO IT.

In the summer of 2020, Temple Athletics signed a three-year deal with Nike which makes it the official outfitter of Temple Athletics. The agreement, which was extended in 2023, makes Nike the exclusive athletics footwear, apparel and accessories provider for the football team as well as the other 18 varsity sports.

HEAD COACH U

NFL head coach Todd Bowles (Tampa Bay) used Temple as stepping stone on his path to the NFL. Bowles played for the Owls from 1981-1985, From 2010-2018, Temple placed five straight head coaches into higher paying jobs: Al Golden, Steve Addazio, Matt Rhule, Geoff Collins, and Manny Diaz. Ohio State's Ryan Day, one of the top FBS head coaches, was part of the Owls staff for the 2006 and 2012 seasons. Matt Rhule, who spent the past two and a half seasons as the head coach of the Carolina Panthers, was hired by Nebraska last November.

A NEW ERA

On July 31, 2023, Temple University officially unveiled its new athletics logo, signaling a reinvigorated era in North Philadelphia. The cherry and white logo incorporates Temple's traditional "T" above a new Owl mark, encased in a diamond outline. The new athletics logo is Temple made, originating from designs conceived by students and professors at the Tyler School of Art and Architecture.

DID YOU KNOW...

Temple holds an 86-year-old NCAA college football record? In 1937, Temple played in an NCAA-record four scoreless tie games in one season. No school has matched that since.

GOLD JACKET

Temple Football experienced a historic feat on Saturday, August 5, as Joe Klecko became the first former player to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Klecko was a star defensive lineman for the Owls from 1973 to 1976, leading the team in tackles for his last three seasons and earning various collegiate honors. During his 12 seasons in the NFL with the New York Jets and Indianapolis Colts, Klecko earned four Pro Bowl selections, All-Pro selections in 1981 and 1985, and 1981 NFL Defensive

TEMPLE AT A GLANCE...

Temple is in the 4th largest media market in the country, with over 2.9 million TV homes according to Nielsen. The designated market area (DMA) is 7.6 million.

Temple is located in a region of 6.53 million people, and is only 95 miles from NYC and 120 miles from Washington, D.C. In fact, more than 40% of the US population is within a day's drive from Philadelphia.

Temple is the 26th largest public University in the country with over 36,000 students founded in 1884 and has 404 academic programs including five professional schools of law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and podiatry.

Temple is a Research I institution, a Carnegie Classification in 2015 as the highest level and ranked by US News and World Report at 115 (6th) with an overall graduation rate of 70%, and has a full time retention rate for undergraduate students at 89%.

Temple is one of 11 institutions in the country with multi-year APR scores of 970 or greater for all teams including a 2015 multi-years APR score of 971.

Temple has over 300,000 alumni around the world including over 170,000 alumni that live in the Philadelphia DMA.

Temple's athletic department has 19 sports and 500 student-athletes.

Temple has been bowl eligible nine out of the last 12 years. The Owls finished 10-4, won the AAC Eastern Division and were ranked in the Top 25 twice in the past five seasons. They won the AAC Championship in 2016 and the Gasparilla Bowl in 2017.

Temple posted the largest attendance gain during the 2015 season, playing in front of an average home crowd of 44,159, an increase of 20,789 per game. This excitement led ESPN to bring their popular pregame show, College Gameday, to Philadelphia.

The Temple game played against Notre Dame in 2015 had a 3.9 national rating and an 18.1 local rating. It was ABC's highest ranking game ever in the Philadelphia area which is impactful given the market is the 4th largest in the country.

Temple's athletic facilities are among the finest in the country. The football team plays its games in the NFL stadium operated by Super Bowl 52 Champion Philadelphia Eagles and there are ongoing discussions to build an on campus football stadium as well. The basketball arena is a state-of-the-art facility with a capacity crowd of 10,000. Over the last five years Temple has spent over \$50 million for athletics multipurpose facilities with all the athletic facilities being state-of-the-art.

The University itself has over \$400 million planned for capital projects over the next five years including a \$170 million state of the art library that opened in 2020.

Much has been made since the 2023 NFL Draft that the Philadelphia Eagles have built their defense with the University of Georgia roster from the 2021-22 seasons. Those familiar with the Temple Football program could argue that the Owls have something to do with the Eagles defensive success. Coordinator Sean Desai worked on the Temple staff from 2006-10. Additionally, Taver Johnson (2017), Ronell Williams (2017-18), Tyler Yelk (2019-21) and D.J. Eliot (2022), all called 10th & Diamond home in the last decade. Ironically only Johnson and Williams worked on the same staff at Temple.



Temple had a school record four players get drafted into the NFL in 2020: Matt Hennessy (Falcons), Harrison Hand (Vikings), Shaun Bradley (Eagles), and Chappelle Russell (Buccaneers) - with four more players getting signed as undrafted free agents. Temple is the only team outside of the Power 5 conferences to have multiple players drafted to the NFL from 2016-2020. In all, Temple has 19 current players in the NFL, the most of any school outside of the

Power 5. Fifteen of the league's 32 teams will sport some Cherry and White this season. Furthermore, when adding coaches and team personnel into the equation, there are nearly 70 people in the NFL with ties to Owl Nation.



HEAD COACH

2nd season at Temple Allegheny '93

STAN DRAYTON

Stan Drayton, who has won college national championships and coached at the NFL level during his 28-year career, returned to Philadelphia as the 29th head football coach of Temple University on December 15, 2021. In his first season with the Owls, Drayton led the team to a 3-9 (1-7) record on the year.

Drayton came to Temple from the University of Texas where he was the associate head coach and run game coordinator for both Tom Herman (2017-20) and Steve Sarkisian (2021). During his time with the Longhorns, Drayton guided the development of a trio of young running backs - Bijan Robinson, Roschon Johnson and Keaontay Ingram. All three made immediate impacts as true freshmen.

Robinson had breakout performances as the 2020 season progressed and tallied 703 rushing yards on just 86 carries to break the school's single-season yards per carry average record at 8.2. He amassed a team-high 915 all-purpose yards (703 rush/196 rec/16 KR) during the 2020 season, making him the first freshman to lead the Longhorns in all-purpose yards since Cedric Benson in 2001.

In year three at UT, Drayton was influential in the growth of Ingram, who totaled 1,095 yards from scrimmage (853 rush/242 rec). Ingram averaged 5.9 yards per carry - nearly a full yard better than his 2018 total (5.0 ypc). He also rushed for more than 100 yards on four occasions.

Drayton also oversaw Johnson's seamless transition from quarterback to running back as a true freshman, a move that took place just one week prior to the season opener versus Louisiana Tech. Under Drayton's eye, Johnson racked up 807 all-purpose yards (649 rush/158 rec) on 146 touches (123 rush/23 rec). He was the ninth true freshman in school history to rush for at least 600 yards. Johnson posted two 100-yard games (121 at WVU, 105 vs. TTU) and was twice named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week in 2019.

In his second season, Drayton mentored two newcomers in graduate transfer Tre Watson and true freshman Keaontay Ingram. The duo combined for 1,494 rushing yards and six touchdowns on the ground, while adding 313 yards receiving with five more touchdowns.

Drayton led a young room of running backs during the 2017 season, as the Longhorns top two backs in 2017 were both true freshmen in Daniel Young and Toneil Carter. Young started the final five games of the season, and rushed for 373 yards and three scores. He also caught 13 passes for 153 yards and a touchdown. Carter started two games in 2017 and rushed for 252 yards and three touchdowns. He caught six passes for 31 yards and a score. True sophomore Kyle Porter finished fourth on the team in rushing with 261 yards and four touchdowns.

Prior to Texas, Drayton coached at Ohio State where he won a BCS National Championship in 2014. He joined OSU as a wide receivers coach in 2011, before leading the running backs for the next three seasons. He had previously won a BCS National Championship (2006) while coaching running backs at Florida (2005-07, 2010).

Drayton spent four seasons (2011-14) at Ohio State, including the last two as assistant head coach on offense and running backs coach. In 2014, Drayton helped the Buckeyes win the National Championship as Ezekiel Elliott, who was a sophomore, finished third in the nation and second in single-season school history with 1,878 rushing yards.

Under Drayton's guidance, Elliott capped the 2014 season with three-straight 200-yard rushing games (tied for the most in single-season school history with Eddie George, 1995). Drayton's work with Elliott helped him to be named College Football Playoff National Championship Offensive MVP with 246 rushing yards (tied for third most in single-game school history) and four touchdowns on 36 carries against Oregon. Elliott was also named Offensive MVP of the Sugar Bowl (230 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries) versus Alabama.

In 2013, Drayton helped senior running back Carlos Hyde finish eighth in the nation with an average of 126.8 rushing yards per game (1,521 yards and 15 touchdowns on 208 carries in 12 contests). Hyde was named the Big Ten's Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year as his 1,521 rushing yards were eighth most in school history and his 7.3 yards per carry was the highest in single-season average in school history. Hyde's 246 yards at Illinois that season are tied for third most in single-game school history.

In his first season as Ohio State's running backs coach in 2012, Drayton guided the Buckeyes running backs to 1,536 yards, 21 touchdowns and an average of 5.44 yards per carry during the team's 12-0 campaign. He came to Ohio State in 2011 as the team's wide receivers coach.

During his college coaching career, Drayton has also served as running backs coach at Florida (2005-07, 2010), Syracuse (2009), Tennessee (2008), Mississippi State (2004), Bowling Green (2000, also serving as special teams coach), Villanova (1996-00), Pennsylvania (1995, assistant running backs/director of football operations) and his alma mater Allegheny (Pa.) College (1993). He has also served as a graduate assistant at Eastern Michigan (1994).

Prior to his time at Ohio State, Drayton spent the 2010 season as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida, his second stint at the school after serving as the Gators running backs coach from 2005-07. In 2006, Florida won the BCS National Championship as the Gators averaged 160 rushing yards per game. That season, running backs DeShawn Wynn and Kestahn Moore combined for 981 yards and an average of 5.0 yards per carry while losing only two fumbles. Wynn scored his 25th career rushing touchdown, which was the second-most in school history, against Ohio State in the title game. He went on to become a seventh-round draft pick by the Green Bay Packers in 2007.

At Mississippi State, Drayton helped guide Jerious Norwood to a 1,000-yard rushing season in 2004 before he went on to be chosen in the third round of the 2006 draft by the Atlanta Falcons. Another prominent pupil was Villanova two-time All-American Brian Westbrook, who became the first collegiate player on any level to record more than 1,000 yards both rushing and receiving in the same season. He was the winner of the 2001 Walter Payton Award as the Offensive Player of the Year in NCAA Division I-AA and was a third-round pick by the Philadelphia Eagles in the 2002 draft.

On the professional side, Drayton served as running backs coach for the Chicago Bears from 2015-16. He also served as offensive quality control coach/special teams of the Green Bay Packers (2001-03).

In 2016 under Drayton, Jordan Howard, a fifth-round pick out of Indiana, set the Bears single-season rookie rushing record with 1,313 yards, breaking the previous mark held by Matt Forte despite only having 12 carries in the team's first three games. It was also the second-best rushing total of any player in the NFL regular season, trailing only Ezekiel Elliott (1,631), who was coached by Drayton at Ohio State. Another of Drayton's Buckeye protégés, Carlos Hyde finished 14th in the league with 988 rushing yards. After working with Drayton, Elliott went on to be the fourth overall pick of the 2016 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys, while Hyde was a second-round selection by the San Francisco 49ers in 2014.

In 2015, the Bears rushing offense was 11th in the NFL averaging 115.9 yards per game, a 16-spot improvement from their ranking of 27th (90.1 ypg) a year prior to his arrival. Drayton helped running back Jeremy Langford, a fourth-round draft pick, finish fifth among all NFL rookies with seven touchdowns and ninth among rookies with 816 yards from scrimmage. Langford joined Pro Football Hall of Famers Walter Payton and Gale Sayers as the only Bears rookies since at least 1960 with a rushing touchdown in four-straight contests and, along with Payton and Sayers, the only rookies in franchise history to have 100 receiving yards, one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown in a single game.

The list of head coaches Drayton has worked under is a who's who of coaching. From his early years in Philadelphia with Penn's Al Bagnoli and Villanova's Andy Talley to successful college coaches such as Urban Meyer, Jim Tressel, Luke Fickell, Tom Herman, and Phil Fulmer, to the NFL's Mike Sherman and John Fox.

Drayton has always been a strong recruiter both in evaluating talent and getting the best players to join him. Among his most high-profile recruits, he is credited with bringing Cam Newton, Mike and Maurice Pouncey to Florida, Robinson to Texas, and he was responsible for bringing Westbrook to Villanova.

A three-time first-team All-America selection as a running back at Allegheny, Drayton is second in the school's record book for rushing (3,272 yards), rushing touchdowns (54) and scoring (336 points) and was a part of the 1990 Division III national championship team. He was also a two-time All-American in track, competing in the 100 and 200 meter dashes. A 1993 graduate with a bachelor's degree in English, Drayton was inducted into the Allegheny College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005.

Drayton, a native of Cleveland, and his wife Monique, a native of Detroit, have two daughters, Amari and Anaya, who are both elite gymnasts. Amari is a member of the U.S. women's national gymnastics team.

QUARTERBACKS

Quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator **Danny Langsdorf** oversees the unit in his second season with the Owls. He came to Temple by way of Colorado, where he served as the pass game coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and has NFL experience with the Giants and Saints..

E.J. Warner was part of the 2022 recruiting class and made the most of his true freshman season. He won the AAC Rookie of the Year and earned Freshman All-America honors. Warner had a record-breaking year, setting the single-game passing record for yards (527) and completions (45), while throwing for a career-high five touchdowns against East Carolina to close out the season. He became the first quarterback in school history to throw for over 500 yards in a game, the first to post two 400-yard games in a season, and the first to post three 300-yard games in one season. The ECU performance came just two weeks after Warner set the record for passing yards (486) and completions (42) in a shootout at Houston. At the end of his first season, Warner owned many Temple single-season records. His 3,028 passing yards were the most by a freshman in Temple history, and ranked second to P.J. Walker's 2016 total of 3,295 for most by any quarterback. He is the son of Pro Football HOFer Kurt Warner.

Last year, the Owls added redshirt senior **Quincy Patterson**. Patterson spent three seasons at Virginia Tech (2018-2020) before spending the 2021 season at NDSU. He led the Bison to a 7-0 record before suffering an injury. The Bison finished 14-1 and won the FCS Championship. In 2022, he was incorporated into the offense as a dual-threat quarterback.

Tyler Douglas [Oakhurst, NJ / Ocean Township] was part of the 2023 recruiting class and was a mid-year enrollee who participated in spring practice.

Forrest Brock and **Patrick Keller** [Abington, PA / Central Bucks East] joined the team in the 2023 summer. Brock, from Topanga, Calif., was a JUCO transfer who racked up over 2,000 yards and 16 TDs for Santa Monica CC in 2022.

WIDE RECEIVERS

Pass game coordinator and wide receivers coach **Jafar Williams** heads the unit in his second season at Temple. The Philadelphia native joined the Owls after coaching wide receivers at Virginia Tech for three seasons.

The Owls lost their primary two wideouts a year ago - Jose Barbon (Dallas Cowboys) and Adonicas Sanders. However, they do return four experienced pass catchers and added **Dante Wright** from Colorado State. A Freshman All-American in 2019 when he had 57 catches for 805 yards and four touchdowns, Wright started 22 games over three seasons with the Rams.

Wright joins **Amad Anderson Jr.**, **D'Wan Mathis**, **Ian Stewart**, and **Zae Baines**. Redshirt senior Anderson transferred to the Owls in December 2020 from Purdue. In his first two seasons at Temple he has been an explosive weapon as both a receiver and return man. Redshirt junior Mathis was the incumbent QB having started seven games in 2021. With the emergence of E.J. Warner, Mathis was shifted to receiver. Another Big Ten transfer is Stewart, who came to Temple from Michigan State in 2022 but missed most of the season due to injury. Stewart has impressed on and off the field, earning a single-digit for the 2023 season. Baines, a redshirt sophomore, gained valuable experience late in the 2022 season.

Three valuable walk-ons - **John Adams** (2021), **Shekuna Ka-**

mara and **Elias Collins** (2022), add depth to the position.

The Owls invested heavily in the position adding much needed speed during the 2023 recruiting cycle. **Zyheem Coleman-Frazier** [Sicklerville, NJ / Timber Creek], **Richard Dandridge** [Homestead (FL) Senior], **Preston Everhart** [Dublin, OH / The Hun School], and **Xavier Irvin** [Miami, FL / Booker T. Washington] were added in the winter months. However, only Everhart was with the team in the spring. **Kian Johnson** [Loxchatchee, FL / Inlet Grove] was a summer addition.

JoJo Huntley, **Nyzir Johnson**, and **Cole Sprague** all joined the Owls as walk-ons during 2023 summer. **Xavier Bryan-Boothe** and **Kyle Madden** joined Temple as walk-ons in the fall of 2023

RUNNING BACKS

Running backs coach **Tyree Foreman** returns to Temple after stops at Tennessee Tech and Towson. Foreman spent the 2007-14 seasons at Temple helping Bernard Pierce rewrite the Temple rushing record book.

Joquez Smith [Tampa, FL / Jesuit] joined the Owls in the 2023 recruiting class and saw his first game action against Rutgers in Week 2, when he carried nine times for 45 yards. He earned his first start in Week 3 against Norfolk State, rushing for 142 yards.

Edward Saydee, who led the team in rushing in each of the last two seasons, returns as the leader of a group that had speed injected during the offseason. The redshirt junior finished the 2022 season with 639 rushing yards and six touchdowns, while adding 262 receiving yards. Against South Florida, he set career highs in multiple rushing and receiving categories including rushing yards (265), longest rush (75), rushing touchdowns (3), receiving yards (69), and longest reception (69). Overall, his 334 all-purpose yards were the 4th most in a single game in school history.

Redshirt junior **Darvon Hubbard** arrived from Texas A&M in January, 2022. He served as Saydee's primary backup a year ago, tallying 206 rushing yards and two touchdowns.

Temple tapped the transfer portal and added **E.J. Wilson** from Florida International. The junior provides an injection of speed and quickness in the backfield and as a returner.

Qwentin Rose joined the team as a walk-on in 2021 and **Kyle Williams** [Harrisburg (PA) High] was added in the 2023 recruiting class.

TIGHT ENDS

The tight end group is coached by special teams coordinator **Adam Scheier**. He came from Rutgers in 2022 where he was their special teams coordinator from 2020-21.

David Martin-Robinson is a four-year starter whose career has been inconsistent due to COVID protocols and injuries. After starting seven games in 2019, was limited to four in 2020 two in 2021, and nine in 2022. In 2022, Martin-Robinson had a breakout season despite missing the season's first three games. He finished with a career-best 33 receptions for 366 yards and two scores. He enters the season on the Mackey Award watch list alongside college football's best at the position.

Redshirt senior **Jordan Smith** was a wide receiver but converted to tight end throughout the beginning of the 2021 season. He became Temple's tight end receiving threat in Martin-Robinson's absence and finished 2021 with 18 catch-

es for 186 yards. He topped that in 2022 with 25 receptions for 346 yards and four scores.

Peter Clarke [London, England / NFL Academy] was part of the 2023 recruiting class. He received the 2023 Efe Obada Community Impact Award which is the NFL Academy equivalent of the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year.

Junior **James Della Pesca** has been a solid contributor at tight end and on special teams since his arrival in 2020.

Reese Clark was the first commitment for the 2022 class.

Kendell Gordon [Burlington, NJ / George School] in 2022, joined the team as a walk-on.

Landon Morris is a two-time transfer having spent the 2021 season with Indiana and 2022 at Utah. The redshirt sophomore will have to sit out during the 2023 season but will have two years remaining to play at Temple.

OFFENSIVE LINE

For the second consecutive season and sixth of the last 10 years, the offensive line unit is mentored by **Chris Wiesehan**. He coached at Temple under Matt Rhule and Geoff Collins for five seasons before following Collins to Georgia Tech.

Injuries in 2022 - the unit started 10 different combinations and never started the same group in consecutive games - may pay dividends in 2023. While the group lost leadership from four-year starters Adam Klein and Isaac Moore, a quintet of redshirt juniors gained valuable experience.

Victor Stoffel is the oldest (25) and longest tenured of the five. He started seven games at right tackle a year ago. **Richard Rodriguez** transferred to Temple in 2021 from Iowa Central CC. Temple signed **Diego Barajas** out of Laney CC in the early signing period and he made an impression during spring practices often lining up with the first unit. He enters 2023 with 12 starts under his belt.

Wisdom Quarshie is another experienced lineman who played in 29 in the past three seasons. He was originally recruited as a defensive tackle. **Bryce Thoman** has seen action for the Owls at each of the interior line positions including eight starts in 2023.

Luke Watson [Wilmington, DE / Saint Mark's] and **Melvin Siani** [Ontario, Canada / Wyoming Seminary] are promising freshman linemen who joined the Owls in the 2023 recruiting class and will see substantial time on the line this year.

Following spring practice the Owls went right back to Laney and signed Barajas' linemate **Chris Smith** who has experience at all five line positions.

Recent recruits include: Redshirt juniors **Jermaine Donaldson** (2019) and **Jackson Pruitt** (2022).

Jon Fagley joined the team as a walk-on in the 2021 summer, while **Kevin Smithwick** walked-on in the 2022 summer.

Temple added **James Faminu** via the transfer portal in 2022. He had five starts last season at three different line positions (LT, LG, RG).

The following players were part of the 2023 freshman recruiting class: **Eric King** [Jersey City, NJ / St. Peter's Prep], **Kevin Terry** [Palm Harbor, FL / Clearwater Central Catholic],

DEFENSIVE LINE

Leading the defensive line in 2023 is **Larry Knight** who returned to Temple after coaching at Georgia Tech. Knight first came to Temple under Geoff Collins in 2017-18 and followed Collins to GT in 2019.

No position at Temple has had a bigger facelift than the d-line with the change of coaches, the loss of its captain (Xach Gill, graduation), and its leading sacker (Darian Varner, Wisconsin).

Redshirt sophomore **Tra Thomas** transferred from Independence Community College before last season, where he made 58 tackles, 10.0 TFLs, 3.0 sacks, in 17 games in 2021 but missed most of 2022 at Temple due to injury.

Jerquavion Mahone, who transferred to Temple in the summer of 2021 from Kentucky, quickly became a force playing all 24 games since his arrival and starting more than half. He led all returning Temple defensive linemen with 24 tackles.

Demerick Morris was part of the 2020 recruiting class and has seen plenty of action in the previous two seasons. He suffered an injury late in the 2023 fall camp.

Lancine Turay transferred to the Owls in January 2021 from North Carolina but missed the entire season due to injury. He earned his way onto the field in 2022 and provided a solid pass rush from the interior position.

The Owls are looking for contributions from a trio of transfer portal additions. Redshirt sophomores **Allan Haye** (Miami) and **Davion Hood** (East Tennessee State), and redshirt freshman **K.J. Miles** (Georgia Tech) all come to Temple with limited on-field experience but add size to the group.

Redshirt-sophomore **Chevez Trask** joined Temple in the 2020 recruiting class as an offensive lineman, but switched to defensive line ahead of the 2023 season.

Redshirt senior **Joseph Appiah Darkwa** transferred last summer from Penn State and saw limited action. Originally from Germany, he continues to develop his knowledge of American football.

Zamar Grove, part of the 2022 recruiting class, and **Zymir Cobbs**, a redshirt senior, used the 2022 season to develop. Cobbs was a standout high school player at Imhotep and returned to Philadelphia after a stint at Penn State.

The 2023 freshman recruiting class included: **Gensley Augustine** [West Orange (NJ)], **Conlan Greene** [Irwin, PA / Penn Trafford], and **Tyrese Whitaker** [Philadelphia, PA / Northeast]. **Hugo Gil** [Manchester, NH / Cheshire Academy] was added as a walk-on and benefited from being an early enrollee.

Lamine Karamoko [Philadelphia, PA / South Philadelphia] joined the Owls as a walk-on in the fall of 2023.

OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS

The position is coached by **Everett Withers** who also served as the defensive coordinator. Withers replaced D.J. Eliot who was hired by the Philadelphia Eagles. Last season, Withers served as Temple Football's chief of staff but left after the season for FAU before returning a few months later as defensive coordinator.

Layton Jordan began his career as a linebacker before transitioning to defensive end and back to linebacker in 2022. Jordan reacted well to the change becoming the team leader in sacks (9.0), TFLs (18.5), interceptions (two), forced fumbles

(three) and set the school record in defensive touchdowns in a season (three).

Temple added redshirt-junior **Diwun Black** (Florida) into the mix for the 2023 season. Black starred at Mississippi Gulf Coast in 2019 leading them to a NJCAA championship. Thomas made 58 tackles, 10.0 TFLs, 3.0 sacks, in 17 games in 2021 but missed most of 2022 at Temple due to injury.

Traditional high school recruiting landed **Jordan Montgomery** [Philadelphia, PA / Roman Catholic] in 2023. **Brandon Enarusai** [Burlington, NJ / George School] was added in 2023 as a walk-on.

INSIDE LINEBACKERS

The Inside linebackers are led by **Chris Woods** for the second consecutive season.

Redshirt juniors **Jordan Magee** and **Yvandy Rigby** enter their fifth season in cherry and white. Magee, recognized as the team's captain and a returning single-digit, led the team with a career-best 86 tackles in 2022. Rigby was not far behind with 82 tackles.

Jacob Hollins, a redshirt senior transfer who has played at Illinois, Fresno State, and Garden City CC, shared playing time with that duo in 2022 before being sidelined with an injury.

D.J. Woodbury was part of the 2020 recruiting class and focused on outside linebacker before making the switch inside this spring. Magee, Rigby and Hollins all missed time this spring and Woodbury emerged as a veteran presence for the unit.

The 2022 recruiting class featured **London Hall**, **Antwone Santiago**, and **Corey Yeoman**. All three redshirted a year ago.

Reggie Jones [Leesburg, VA / DeMatha Catholic] was added as freshman walk-ons this summer. **Korre Kerrin** [Voorhees, NJ / Eastern / Lackawanna CC] joined Temple as a walk-on in the fall of 2023.

SAFETIES

The safeties are led for the second year in a row by **Marvin Cleidor** who joined the staff following his two seasons at Western Michigan.

Alex Odom was a part of the 2020 recruiting class. He was one of two true freshmen that year to earn a start on the defense. His 147 tackles over the previous three seasons leads all Owls.

Elijah Deravil (Coffeyville) and **Brenyen Scott** (Garden City) were JUCO transfers signed in the 2022 summer. Both played in all 12 games on defense and as core members of the special teams units.

Redshirt senior **Tywan Francis** (Colorado State) and redshirt sophomore **Kamar Wilcoxson** (Florida) add experience to the unit.

Sam Martin was an early enrollee in 2022 who spent the spring with the Owls. By season's end he became the primary kick returner.

Muheem McCargo was part of the 2020 recruiting class and made the transition to safety in 2022 after playing linebacker a year ago. He is expected to miss the season due to an injury suffered in spring practice.

The Owls added two freshmen to the position: **Zyil Powell** [Newark, NJ / Paramus Catholic] was part of the 2023 recruiting class and **Shamar Williams** [Toms River, NJ / Long Branch] was a walk-on.

Ihsim Smith-Marsette [Newark, N.J. / Weequahic] joined the Owls as a walk-on in the summer of 2023.

CORNERBACKS

Dominique Bowman enters his first year coaching the cornerbacks after leading Arkansas' unit last season.

Jalen McMurray, who was part of the 2021 recruiting class, came into his own a year ago earning himself a single-digit and Freshman All-America recognition. He started in all 12 games for Temple in 2022, recording 49 tackles, one TFL, one interception, seven pass breakups, one fumble recovery, and two forced fumbles.

Junior **Dominick Hill** transferred to Temple in the winter of 2022 after playing two seasons with South Carolina. He earned the bulk of the starting assignments opposite McMurray last season.

Redshirt senior **Elijah Clark** played in current team-high 39 games in the previous four seasons for Temple.

A pair of JUCO transfers - **Ben Osueke** (Blinn CC) and **Christian Bell** (Hudson Valley CC) - were added this spring.

Redshirt sophomores **Corey Cuascut-Palmer** (2021) and **Daiyaan Hawkins** (2020) are recent recruits who have mostly seen their action on special teams.

Bryce Lambeth and **Calian Scott** walked on in the 2022 summer and **Aaron Anderson** [Washington, DC / McKenley Tech] was added in the 2023 spring.

The 2023 freshman recruiting class included: **Kaleb Barnett** [Nassau, Bahamas / Miami Jackson] and **Darrell Sweeting** [North Palm Beach, FL / The Benjamin School].

SPECIALISTS

The unit is led by **Adam Scheier** who joined Temple in 2022 after coaching nationally ranked specialists at Rutgers.

Graduate transfer kicker **Camden Price** joined the team in the summer of 2022, after spending four seasons at Miami (Fla.). He earned the primary kicker duties midway through 2022 and held the highest field goal percentage (92.7%) in the AAC.

Although he has never played a down of American football, **Dante Atton** [Melbourne, Australia / ProKick Australia] has the upper leg on the punting competition. Scheier has always been a proponent of rugby-style punting and has employed Aussie punters throughout his career.

Joining Price is **Chris Van Eekeren**, a transfer from Purdue and serves as Temple's primary kickoff specialist. **Carl Hardin** [Raleigh, NC / Broughton] is a walk-on who can provide depth at both kicker and punter.

Andrew McIlquham joined Temple as a walk-on in 2022 after spending a season at TCU. McIlquham is the teams primary longsnapper. Junior **Brylan Noonan** joined the Owls after two seasons at Wagner. By season's end a year ago,

SAF **Sam Martin** emerged as the Owls primary kick returner, while WR **Dante Wright** will take punt return duties.

AMERICAN BOWL LINEUP

American Athletic Conference teams are guaranteed at least seven bowl appearances annually as part of the conference's new postseason lineup, which began with the 2020 season and is in place through 2025. The American, as it has done seven times in the last nine seasons of the postseason structure, will continue to send its champion to a New Year's Six bowl if that team finishes higher than the champions of four other conferences in the final College Football Playoff rankings. American Athletic Conference teams are also eligible for the College Football Playoff if they are among the top four teams in the final CFP rankings.

As part of the current bowl cycle, The American will annually send teams to the Military Bowl against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent, the Wasabi Fenway Bowl in Boston, also against an ACC team, and a third annual spot which will alternate between the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl and the EasyPost Hawaii Bowl.

In the 2023 season, The American will additionally fill four spots from a group of nine bowls: the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl, the Birmingham Bowl, the Cure Bowl, the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl, the RoofClaim Boca Raton Bowl, the Scotter's Coffee Frisco Bowl, the ServPro First Responder Bowl, the New Mexico Bowl and the Myrtle Beach Bowl.
