HEADLINES AND STORYLINES

- UTSA is back at home in back-to-back days for the first weekend of the season.
 Friday's game with Jacksonville State was the first since the Western Illinois season opener on Nov. 6 of UTSA's 43rd season.
- This is the second meeting of the series, with UTSA winning the first in 2022.
- Heading into the weekend, UTSA snapped a three-game losing skid in Houston on an 89-87 Monday win over Houston Christian, wrapping up three games in six days.
- The Roadrunners are still looking for a steady standout, with four different scoring leaders through six games.
- The 2022-23 Roadrunners saw 12 players depart in the offseason. That group accounted for 88 percent of UTSA's minutes, 91.6 percent of points, 89.5 percent of rebounds, 87.4 percent of assists and 87.6 percent of steals.
- Grad guard/forward Dre Fuller Jr. went off in the second half on Monday vs.
 Houston Christian, scoring 18 of his career-high 24 points after halftime.
 Fuller shot 8-for-15 with three from long range and also accounted for four rebounds, two assists and two blocks in the win.
- Junior guard Christian Tucker had 15 points and 8 assists (matching career high) at HCU and led the team with a career-high 19 points vs. Jax State.
 Registering at least three assists in every game this year, Tucker sits atop the American Athletic Conference leader boards in both assists (33) and assists per game (5.5), ranking 26th and 35rd in the NCAA, respectively. He also ranks 36th nationally and fourth in the AAC with a 4.29 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- As a team, UTSA is only committing 11.0 turnovers per game, which is fourth in the AAC and 81st in the NCAA.







SETTING THE STAGE

- The Roadrunners will face the UIW Cardinals for only the second time in program history in the second UTSA game of the Roadrunner/Cardinal Classic on Saturdat afternoon.
- Saturday's matchup will mark only the third UTSA home game of the 2023-24 season.
- UTSA opened up the event on Friday at noon but succumbed to a 77-62 loss to Jacksonville State in the opener.
- The game will air on UTSA radio and be streamed live on ESPN+.

SERIES WITH INCARNATE WORD

- Despite less than 20 miles of cross-town separation, UIW and UTSA are meeting for only the second time in history as regularseason opponents on the hardwood.
- The Cardinals are relatively new to Division I, beginning their upward transition in the 2013-14 academic year.
- The Roadrunners and Cardinals faced off previously last season with a 68-62 UTSA win on Nov. 28 at the Convocation Center.

NEW SEASON, NEW LOOK ROADRUNNERS

- Entering the eighth year under head coach Steve Henson, UTSA's roster features a completely new look this season, as the Roadrunners bring 12 new players to the floor, complementing two returners from last season - junior guard Christian Tucker and sophomore forward Massal Diouf — and another player returning to San Antonio after a season at Pacific — junior guard Jordan Ivy-Curry. Diouf heads into the season as UTSA's lone returning starter from a year ago, taking the floor in 27 games/21 starts last year. Tucker saw 30 games/6 starts and lvy-Curry started 19-of-21 appearances in 2021-22 with a team second-best 13.9 ppg.
- Having lost significant production from last season's squad, the Roadrunners will look to throw the newcomers right into the action. The most prominent of the group was expected to join UTSA last season, but 7-foot center Carlton Linguard Jr. required a year in residence following his transfer from Kansas State. The Roadrunners are seeing early contributions from 6-6 guard Dre Fuller Jr., who averaged 5.7 points, 3.4 rebounds and 1.5 assists per outing through 67 games at UCF. In addition, UTRGV sophomore transfer point guard Adante' Holiman averaged 7.5 points and 3.0 assists on 44.7 percent shooting for the Vagueros down in Edinburg, and a was a four-star prospect coming out of high school as the No. 1 player in Oklahoma. Providing a twin-towers presence inside complementing Linguard, Utah Tech transfer Trey Edmonds' physical game will be a handful for opponents, while Odessa College transfer Chandler Cuthrell has already proven ability scoring and on the glass. UTSA has also added DI transfers Justin Thomas (Milwaukee) and Juan Reyna (Campbell), DII transfer Isaiah Wyatt (Chadron State) and junior college transfers Blessing Adesipe, (Miles), PJ Carter (Georgia Highlands), Josh Reid (Gulf Coast College) – along with freshman guard Nazar Mahmoud out of Plano's Spring Creek Academy.
- The revamped UTSA roster hails from nine different states, one from the Netherlands. Featuring 10 juniors, one senior and one grad student. The Roadrunners have also gained some height on the roster, moving the team average to 6' 6.77".

SAN ANTONIO – The UTSA men's basketball team (2-4) dropped its first game at home after the Jacksonville State Gamecocks' (2-4) lead got away from the Roadrunners in the second half. Despite shooting 50 percent from the field in the second half, UTSA's late rally came up short in the 77-62 loss on Friday at the Convocation Center.

Though Jacksonville State moved out to an early lead, point guard Adante' Holiman rounded the paint, creating his own space to get UTSA moving. Trey Edmonds and Christian Tucker went back-to-back on steals that ended in coast-to-coast dunks for the Roadrunners' first lead at 6-4 — kicking off an early shootout to open up play at the Roadrunner/Cardinal Classic.

With the teams trading scores, a Mason Nicholson hookshot inside brought the game to the game's fourth tie at 10-10 with 15:07 on the clock, amidst an 8-0 Gamecocks scoring run. Spreading scoring around, UTSA battled back to a single possession five times over the subsequent eight minutes. Five of the final points belonged to the Gamecocks across a dry final four minutes to grow the JSU advantage to eight for their largest lead of the half. However, junior guard Tucker dropped a three at 38 seconds to slice the deficit to five in the closing seconds. Jax State Kyky Tandy missed an attempted buzzer-beater and UTSA trailed 31-26 at half.

The immediate returns looked like UTSA offense lit a fire after the break, as graduate guard/forward Dre Fuller Jr. drained a three from the corner just 17 seconds into the period – but the Roadrunners stalled while the Gamecocks launched into a 17-7 run. Jax State reached a double-figure advantage on Nicholson's putback dunk at the midpoint of the half, growing their lead to 13 on the next possession.

After being held to no points at the half, Tandy came to life and hurt the Roadrunners down the stretch, scoring 16 points in the second half off 6-of-10 shooting, while forward Marcellus created a leverage point inside with 10 second-half points.

Under five minutes to go, back-to-back scoring plays for Fuller sparked the Roadrunners via a fade-away jumper and a Tucker-assisted alley-oop dunk — drawing UTSA within single digits for the first time in seven minutes. The Gamecocks reversed the scoring trend but Tucker dropped the deficit to eight with a hoop-and-harm, followed by a putback two on the following possession. However, the Gamecocks took control over the final two minutes, outscoring UTSA 10-3 en route to a 77-62 Jax State win.

SCOUTING INCARNATE WORD

- The Cardinals hosted Jacksonville State at home in Alice P. McDermott Convocation Center on Wednesday night, squeezing out a 67-66 win over the Gamecocks. UIW is 2-2 to start the season under first-year head coach Shane Heirman after losses at Texas and Tulsa. Heirman arrived in San Antonio after assistant stops at Central Michigan and DePaul. UIW was 12-19 last year.
- Junior college transfer Sky Wicks from State College of Florida is lighting up the stat boards, averaging a team-best 22.5 ppg on 47.8 percent shooting from the field and 43.5 shooting from three — while also leading the Cardinals with 8.3 rpg. Wicks opened the season with a 26-point, 11-rebound double-double at Texas.
- Another addition from the junior college ranks, junior guard Josiah Hammons is averaging 15.8 ppg.
- A graduate transfer from Austin Peay, forward Shon Robinson chips in 14.5 ppg and 8.0 rpg.
- As a team, UIW is shooting 43.6 percent, but only 33.3 percent from three while averaging 82.8 ppg with a lead margin of 3.5. The Cardinals have a 44.5 to 35.8 rebounding advantage so far. UIW averages 15.8 turnovers per game.

HENSON EARNS HIS 100TH

- The Nov. 6 season-opening victory marked the 100th career win for eighth year head coach Steve Henson leading the Roadrunners.
- Henson earned his first win in his third game and first at home, defeating Prairie View A&M, 69-59, on Nov. 19, 2016 in San Antonio.
- His 50th win came on the 29th game of his third season, a 76-70 home win over UAB on March 3, 2019.

CONSENSUS LOCAL HALL OF FAMER, AND NOW, ON THE AIR

- Beginning with the first 2023-24 exhibition against Trinity, Devin Brown has joined UTSA's ESPN+ team as an analyst on the streaming telecast of UTSA men's basketball games. This leans on his experience as a legendary player at UTSA, eight seasons in the NBA and as a coach/athletic director at Proskills San Antonio.
- As part of UTSA's Homecoming festivities, Brown was inducted as a member of the inaugural UTSA Athletics Hall of Fame class, adding to his honors as the first of just two players with their jersey ascended into the rafters of the Convocation Center and his induction earlier this year into the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame. In uniform, Brown garnered honors as a three-time first-team all-conference selection and four-year starter for the Roadrunners from 1998-2002 earning 1998 Southland Conference Freshman of the Year and second-team all-league accolades before being named to the first team for his final three seasons.
- He is a San Antonio native and West Campus High School product, helping lead UTSA to the 1999 Southland Tournament title and a berth in the NCAA Tournament the second appearance in school history. The first Roadrunner to register a triple-double with a 33-point, 11-rebound, 11-assist performance against Louisiana-Monroe in 2001, he finished his career as the program's all-time scoring leader with 1,922 points, which has since been broken. He also registered a 7.2 career rebounds-per-game average and he ranks in the top five in school history in rebounds (751), free throws (478), steals (184) and scoring average (18.3). Brown began his professional career in the USBL and National Basketball Development League before making his NBA debut as the first Roadrunner to play for the San Antonio Spurs in 2002. He was a member of the franchise's 2005 NBA Championship team and also played for the Nuggets, Jazz, Hornets, Warriors, Bulls and Cavaliers. He scored 3,352 points in 465 career NBA games from 2002-10, highlighted by his 2006-07 season with the Pelicans in which he averaged 11.6 points and 4.3 rebounds, while shooting 42 percent from the floor.
- He was enshrined on May 13, 2023 in the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame at the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center as the first UTSA student-athlete to achieve that honor.

DEFENDING HOME COURT

- Under head coach Steve Henson, UTSA has posted a 73-39 (.6521) record at the Convocation Center. The Roadrunners went 11-3 at home in 2016-17, 12-4 in 2017-18, 11-4 in 2018-19, 10-5 in 2019-20,12-2 in 2020-21 and 8-10 in 2021-22, 8-10 in 2022-23 and 1-0 so far in 2023.
- Prior to the Henson era, UTSA last posted consecutive 11-win home campaigns when the program went 11-3 in 2008-09, 2009-10 and 2010-11 as members of the Southland Conference.
- The 1991-92 team was the last Roadrunners squad to win more than 12 games at home, finishing 14-1.

SAFE DELIVERY

- One of only two players back from last year, junior guard Christian Tucker has already proven himself early in two facets, finding teammates for the score and protecting the basketball.
- Over 3 games in the last week, Tucker delivered 20 assists to bring his season total to 33 the
 most in the American Athletic Conference and 26th-most in the NCAA, an 35th-ranked 5.5 apg.
- After 4 turnovers against Jax State, Tucker has 11 turnovers on the year and ranks 62nd nationally and 4th in the AAC with a 3.00 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- In total on his career, Tucker is a consistent distributor of the ball, averaging 1.66 assists per outing and accruing 103 to date. He allowed only a 1.16 turnover average through 62 games.

TUCKER ON THE LINE

- On the season, Tucker is 32-of-37 at the free throw line, an .865 free throw percentage. He has the 2nd-most free throws in the AAC (25th nationally) and ranks 138th in FT shooting percentage.
- Tucker is shooting 79.6% for his career (117-147), a trajectory that would be fourth in UTSA records.

PROTECTING THE BALL

- Despite setbacks in the past couple games, UTSA still averages just 11.0 turnovers so far, which ranks them 81st in the NCAA and fourth in the American Athletic Conference.
- The national lead in turnovers allowed goes to Houston at 8.1, while Temple leads the AAC at 9.2.
- UTSA ranked 280th nationally last season with an average of 13.7 turnovers per game.

THE AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

- Among the 12 new players this year for UTSA, former UCF guard Dre Fuller Jr. has shown immediate impact in the non-conference games, but his playing experience against familiar foes could be invaluable.
- Taking a redshirt as a true freshman in 2018-19, Fuller played 20 games, missing 10 due to injury, and started 13 times in first season of competition, averaging 6.3 points, 3.1 rebounds and 1.5 assists while playing 19.0 minutes per game.
- His second season was a breakout, as he appeared in all 23 games, starting 14 times, including
 each of the last three games of the season. That year, Fuller averaged 7.0 points and 4.7
 rebounds per game, while playing 27.6 minutes per contest and shooting 41.4 percent. He also
 added 24 steals, seven blocks and 44 assists.
- In his third year, he logged a 43.9 field goal percentage and played in 24 games.

BUILDING UP SOME NEW DIGS

- The first of many facilities under UTSA's Go Bold fundraising initiative, the Roadrunners
 moved into the RACE (Roadrunner Athletic Center of Excellence) building, a \$45.4 million facility,
 in the August 2021. Now the central nervous system of UTSA Athletics, the building features
 among others, an academic center, football practice fields, centralized sports medicine and strength
 and conditioning centers, meeting rooms, student-athlete lounges and coaching/staff offices.
- In the move, the UTSA basketball staff took over the former football building/Intercollegiate



Athletics Building (IAB) and Go Bold is working on a new state-of-the art basketball/volleyball facility, marking yet another big moment for UTSA athletics, which has been around just since 1981, with the university celebrating a 50th anniversary in 2019-20. The new facility is slated to house two full-size NCAA regulation hardwood practice courts with eight goals on each court, striped for both basketball and volleyball, a 3,000 SF weight room with dedicated cardio with 1,000 SF athletic training room with separate consultation room and hydrotherapy. The facility will also feature locker rooms and coaches offices, moving teams out of IAB and Convocation Center spaces.

UTSA just finished the latest round of construction

at Park West, the home of UTSA soccer and T&F. Officially opened in July 2023, the Park West Fieldhouse facility is another milestone in UTSA's strategic vision to further promote the academic success, health, wellness and performance of its student-athletes - another in a long

run of improvements UTSA has scheduled. The newly-minted \$8 million, 14,325 square-foot facility located just off Loop1604 houses locker rooms for soccer and men's and women's track & field, featuring a 1,500 SF athletic training room, 2,500 SF Community Room with a 120-seat capacity, dedicated nutrition center and a 700 SF equipment and multi-team laundry room.

NEW TO THE BENCH

- The Roadrunners are not only welcoming 12 newcomers to the court, but are also welcoming three newcomers to the bench.
- Brought aboard in late May, Kurtis Darden is the newest assistant coach for the Roadrunners
 and brings a variety of successful basketball experiences to the UTSA squad for an immediate
 impact. Darden joined the Roadrunners staff after one season as the director of basketball
 operations at Campbell in Buies Creek, N.C. The Camels reached the Big South Championship
 Game last season.
- Prior to taking on his first operations role, Darden built up an extensively successful coaching career at the high school level in his hometown of Fayetteville, N.C. Over the course of 12 seasons, Darden's teams racked up a 243–83 record. He joined the Campbell staff fresh off two seasons as head coach at Freedom Christian Academy. Prior to FCA, Darden led Village Christian Academy as head coach since 2010, producing back-to-back NCISAA 2-A state titles in 2016 and 2017 along with a pair of state runner-up finishes. Darden has been named the 2017 Cape Fear Region Coach of the Year and was a three-time conference Coach of the Year, also selected as head coach of the East squad in the 2019 NCISSA Private School All-Star Game.
- As an active-duty commissioned Air Force officer, Darden continued his basketball journey by
 playing for the All-Air Force team from 2005-08. His teams won the Armed Forces Championship
 in 2006, 2007 and 2008. That's where Darden first cut his teeth in the coaching world, serving as
 an assistant coach of the 2011 All-Air Force team that also won the Armed Forces Championship.
- Lt. Col. Darden is a veteran who continues to serve his country as an Individual Mobilization Augmentee (IMA) reservist assigned to Air Force Services Center at Joint Base Lackland.
- Under new NCAA rules in place as of this season, certain administrative roles are allowed a specific amount of coaching duties and interactions.
- Coming to UTSA after four seasons on the other side of San Antonio at UIW, Chris Artis is the new director of operations, a role he served for the Cardinals before moving into an assistant coach position. Artis brings extensive basketball history as a player in the collegiate and professional ranks, and as a high school, post-graduate and college coach. Artis came to UIW from Calumet College of St. Joseph in Whiting, Indiana, marking his second stint with the program. From 2015-19, Artis served as the associate head coach for the Crimson Wave, assisting the team in reaching new heights, as the 2016-17 team earned its second Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference (CCAC) regular-season title and its first NAIA Division II tournament bid. During the 2018-19 campaign, Calumet started with a 12-0 record, earning its highest national ranking at 20th during the campaign. He also was head high school boys basketball coach at Don Bosco Institute in Crown Point, sending 9 players to NCAA Division I and 2 more to Division II schools.
- Taking over video coordinator duties for the UTSA program, J.R. Harris was among the first Roadrunners to play under Henson; his senior season coinciding with Henson's first at the helm. Harris returned to San Antonio after spending the 2022-23 school year as the head boys basketball coach at Istrouma High School in his hometown of Baton Rouge, La. Following his playing career, Harris returned home to teach and work in athletic administration at Inspire Academy, then transitioning to the coaching world as the assistant coach at Hillsboro, Texasbased Hill College during the 2021-22 season. Harris helped the team achieve a 21-10 regular season record and 9-5 in conference.

THE POSTSEASON SET TO RETURN TO SAN ANTONIO

- UTSA last hosted the NCAA South Regional in March 2022 at the AT&T Center where (2) Villanova
 defeat (5) Houston on its way to the Final Four. (11) Michigan and (1) Arizona were the other
 schools that competed in the Regional.
- UTSA also served as the host institution for all 64 teams in the women's NCAA Tournament with
 the entirety of the tournament moved to the Alamo City for COVID precautions in 2021.
- San Antonio has been the host site of seven Regionals and four Final Fours.
- The Roadrunners will host the Final Four again in 2025, scheduled for April 5 and 7 at the Alamodome and hosted by UTSA and UIW.
- San Antonio and UTSA have also been awarded the 2029 Women's Final Four at the Alamodome.
 San Antonio previously hosted the Women's Final Four three times, in 2002 and 2010.
- The Alamodome was the site of the Women's Final Four when Stanford claimed the 2021 title
 in front of a limited capacity audience but was also the site in 2002 when the all-time Women's
 Final Four attendance record was set when 29,619 were at the national semifinal games and the
 National Championship game.



EXHIBITIONS OUTING SUMMARY

UTSA racked up 225 points in the two exhibition games, defeating Trinity 100-70 and McMurry 125-84 — a combined 225-154 with all the starters averaging under 23 minutes.

- The McMurry total was the most points scored since 2017 and would have tied for the secondhighest-scoring game in the program records, if not an exhibition.
- UTSA shot .514 (90-175) from the floor, but .342 from three on a pop-happy 26-76, with the Roadrunners producing a 54.4 percent assist average (48-of-90).
- The Roadrunners struggled at the free throw line, shooting just .515 (19-37).
- Overall, UTSA forced the two opponents into 17.0 turnovers, with 13.0 steals per outing.
- Led by Carlton Linguard Jr.'s four rejections, UTSA logged 34 blocks over the course of two nights.
- The 69-rebound effort against McMurry would have been the school record in a regular-season contest – in total, UTSA out-rebounded exhibition foes, 129-65.
- With plenty of contenders, as UTSA registered 14 double-figure scoring performances across the
 two games, Linguard registered the top scoring output. Setting the scoreboard ablaze in the
 opening exhibition with Trinity, Linguard put up 20 points on 8-of-12 shooting, hit four from
 the perimeter, grabbed nine rebounds and made three assists.
- Center Carlton Linguard Jr. averaged 14.5 points and 10.5 rebounds in just 21 mpg of exhibition action, shooting .522 from the floor.
- Against McMurry, Christian Tucker was on fire with 16 points on 7-of-9 shooting, grabbing four boards and doling out five assists — he averaged 11.5 points and a team-high 5.0 assists.
- Chandler Cuthrell was steady in his pair of debuts, collecting a double-double in each contest
 and averaging 11.5 points, 11.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists throwing down a trio of dunks.
- Nazar Mahmoud averaged 13.0 points and 6.5 rebounds, while shooting .529 with a team-best five threes as the only first-year freshman on the floor for UTSA.
- Dre Fuller Jr. provided an all-around exhibition effort for the Roadrunners, going 11-for-25 with 13.0 ppg, 9.0 rpg, 4.0 apg and 1.5 steals per game.
- Trey Edmonds was a physical interior presence, putting up 13.0 ppg on .647 shooting and 7.5 rpg.
- PJ Carter was solid beyond the arc with 50 percent shooting from three and a 10.0 ppg average.
- Massal Diouf topped UTSA with .857 shooting, going 6-for-7 for 6.0 ppg.

AMERICAN MUSCLE

- UTSA's 43rd season on the basketball court is also the Roadrunners first year as a member
 of the American Athletic Conference, joining the league on Saturday, July 1, as one of six
 institutions welcomed to form the AAC's new lineup of 15 schools in The American's 10th year.
 The conference has 14 programs that compete in men's basketball: Charlotte, East Carolina,
 Florida Atlantic, Memphis, North Texas, Rice, SMU, South Florida, Temple, Tulane, Tulsa, UAB
 and Wichita State compete with UTSA in the new-look league.
- As a member of The American, UTSA will enjoy greater national media exposure, enhanced brand recognition, more Texas team matchups and expanded recruiting opportunities, furthering the university's ability to compete at the highest level.
- A league presence in four of the top 10, six of the top 25 and 12 of the top 52 Nielsen media
 markets allows The American to enjoy a lucrative and comprehensive media rights partnership
 with ESPN, giving the conference a significant presence on the Worldwide Leader's primary
 television networks (ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU) and an all-sports presence on ESPN+, the
 industry's leading streaming service with more than 25.3 million subscribers.
- This marks the fifth conference that UTSA has been a full-fledged member of since first joining the Trans America Athletic Conference (now Atlantic Sun) in 1986 after five years as an NCAA Division I Independent. UTSA was a member of the Southland Conference from 1992 to 2012, and spent one year in the Western Athletic Conference before joining Conference USA in 2013.

UNDERESTIMATING THE ROADRUNNERS

- With UTSA coming off a 10-22 season and making the move to a stronger basketball conference, the preseason predicted order of finish in the AAC doesn't reflect UTSA's potential. During the AAC Media Days on Oct. 8-9, the announcement came that the Roadrunners were picked 14th.
- Returning a solid roster from last year's Final Four run, Florida Atlantic was picked as the preseason
 favorite with 11 of the league's head coach votes, while reigning AAC Tournament champion
 Memphis was chosen second with three first-place votes. Next on the list were Tulane, UAB, East
 Carolina, North Texas, SMU, Wichita State, South Florida, Tulsa, Rice, Temple, Charlotte and UTSA.

YOUNG TALENT

Freshman guard Nazar Mahmoud is the only high school recruit in this year's class. Born in
July 2005, Mahmoud is the 11th-youngest player to be on an NCAA roster this season and the
youngest player set to take the court in the American Athletic Conference. Topping the list is Iowa
State's JT Rock, who was born March 1, 2006 and still four months under 18 to open the season.

WHO'S NEW?

- Junior guard/forward Blessing Adesipe hasn't seen the court for the Roadrunners just yet, but the expectations are high for the Texas-native JUCO product who got his start in Montana. Adesipe played two seasons at Miles College in Miles City, Montana, where he put up 1,132 points in just two prolific scoring seasons playing under coach Chase Tait. He started all 30 games for the Pioneers as a sophomore in 2022-23 en route to an NJCAA All-America Honorable Mention and NJCAA All-Star selection by the NJCAA Men's Basketball Coaches Association. At Miles in 2022-23, he averaged 21.6 ppg to lead the team, rank second in the Mon-Dak Athletic Conference and 14th in NJCAA Division I. He shot 41.8 percent from the floor and racked up double-figures in 28 games, topped by a 39-point performance against Dakota-Bottineau 1-of-5 outings in excess of 30 points. Also averaged 9.9 rebounds per game with 16 double-digit rebounding performances, along with 2.3 assists and 1.3 steals per contest.
- Junior guard PJ Carter was an effective shooter for the Roadrunners in the exhibitions, leading UTSA with 50-percent shooting from long range (4-8). He also delivered five assists. A former Georgia Region 5-6A Player of the Year and 6A All-State honoree from Atlanta, Carter played the 2022-23 season at Georgia Highlands College under coach Jonathan "JJ" Merritt. He earned first-team All-GGCAA honors while helping the Chargers to a 23-10 season that went all the way to the GCAA Championship final. Carter led the team with 16.3 ppg despite coming off the bench in 29 of the 33 games he played. Logged double-figure scoring in 29 contests while shooting 46.6 percent from the floor, 43 percent from the perimeter and 79.5 percent
- A well-rounded performer who has come off the bench in both exhibition games, junior forward Chandler Cuthrell earned a double-double in both outings and averaged 11.5 ppg and 11.0 rpg, while also contributing eight assists to the effort.

from the free throw line. Before GHC, he played two years at Campbell.

- Cuthrell played two seasons in the Texas Panhandle at Odessa College under coach Kris "Bucket" Baumann, helping the Wranglers to a 30-4 record in 2022-23, a Western Junior College Athletic Conference title and an appearance in the NJCAA DI National Quarterfinals ranking third in the final NJCAA DI rankings. Cuthrell played 34 games last year with a 7.2 ppg, 3.0 rpg, shooting 48.8 percent from the floor and 40.8 percent from three.
- Making his physical presence felt in the post, junior forward/center Trey Edmonds averaged 13.0 points with 7.5 rpg in the exhibitions, including 11 boards on the offensive glass.
- Edmonds played two seasons at Utah Tech, the former Dixie State, in St. George, Utah, appearing in 33 games with one start last year. Limited to just over 8.3 mpg in two years with the Trailblazers, Edmonds averaged 2.5 ppg on 46.8 percent shooting, 2.3 rpg.
- The most diversified performer of exhibition season, graduate student guard/forward Dre
 Fuller Jr. shot .440 through the exhibitions to average 13.0 ppg, 9.0 rpg, 4.0 apg and 1.5 spg.
 One of the most experienced transfers to join the Roadrunners this season, Fuller played three seasons at UCF in Orlando, logging 67 games and 27 starts for the Knights. Fuller averaged 5.7 ppg on 42.2-percent shooting, with 3.4 rpg and 1.5 apg.
- Immediately taking charge in leading the UTSA offense, sophomore point guard Adante'
 Holiman was a scorer and a distributor in the exhibitions, putting up 11.5 ppg with 2.5 apg.
- A former four-star high school recruit and the No. 1-rated player in Oklahoma, Holiman registered 2,392 prep points and ranked among the top 50 in Oklahoma history after wrapping a 32-ppg, 5.0 apg senior season. He comes to San Antonio after an outstanding rookie season at UT Rio Grande Valley, playing 24 games with 11 starts for the Vaqueros. As a freshman, Holiman averaged 7.5 ppg on 44.7-percent shooting, doling out 3.0 apg.
- One of the most anticipated players to take the court, seven-foot redshirt senior center
 Carlton Linguard Jr. has not disappointed. His debut saw the agile big man score 20 on 8-of12 shooting, registering nine boards with three assists in the opening exhibtion. Across the two
 preseason contests, Linguard averaged a team-high 14.5 ppg with 10.5 rpg, 2.0 apg and 2.0
 blocks per outing.
- The homegrown Kansas State transfer had to sit last season for a year in residence, playing 32 games with two starts with the Wildcats. He averaged 1.8 ppg and 1.3 rpg while coming off injuries. Before KSU, he was the 12th best junior college prospect at Temple College on the I-35 corridor, where he put up 13.3 ppg on 51.4-percent shooting with 9.5 rpg and 3.6 rpg logging 12 double-doubles with double-figure scoring in 25-of-30 and double-digit boards in 13.
- The lone freshman among the 12 newcomers, guard Nazar Mahmoud averaged 13.0 ppg, 6.5 rpg and 2.0 apg, knocking down a team-best 5-for-10 from three against Trinity and McMurry. Mahmoud rated as a three-star player and the No. 37 shooting guard coming out of Spring Creek Academy in Plano, Texas, helping the Spartans to a 26-4 record during his senior year. Mahmoud scored 20.6 ppg on 42-percent shooting, with nearly five (5) rpg and two (2) apg. Earned All-SWAIC honors as a senior and was named the District 25-5A Offensive MVP and TABC All-State as a junior at Leander's Rouse High.



WHO'S NEW? (cont'd)

- Junior forward Josh Reid saw limited time in the exhibitions, averaging 1.5 ppg and 0.5 rpg.
 Reid joined the Roadrunners after two seasons at Gulf Coast College in Panama City, Florida, playing 28 games with 20 starts for the Commodores last year. Reid shot 45 percent from the floor for 10.3 ppg, logging 6.4 rpg with 42 assists and 34 steals.
- Former Antonian Prep standout junior guard Juan Reyna is returning home after one season
 each at Campbell and Alabama State. At Campbell, Reyna averaged 5.3 ppg in 30 games with
 the Camels. Put up 8.7 ppg 26 games at Bama State. Graduated from Duncanville High after
 leaving San Antonio, where he helped lead DHS to back-to-back UIL 6A State Championships
 (2020, '21) and surpassed 2,000 career points. As a senior, Reyna averaged 20.8 ppg and 3.2 apg.
- Junior guard Justin Thomas helped Milwaukee to the best record in seven years, playing in 33 games with 7.3 ppg, 4.4 rpg and 3.0 apg. Thomas shot 43.2 percent (82-of-190) from the field overall, 42.9 percent (24-of-56) and led the team with 98 assists. Began his collegiate career at Division II Queens University of Charlotte.
- A former All-District 4-6A and All-Region player from Fort Worth's North Crowley High, redshirt
 junior guard Isaiah Wyatt registered 7.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg through the exhibitions. Wyatt
 arrived at UTSA after one season at NCAA Division II Chadron State in northwestern Nebraska.
 Wyatt earned All-RMAC honors after leading the Eagles with 15.2 ppg through 29 starts,
 scoring in double-figures in 25 outings after shooting 45.1 percent. Hit 46.9-percent beyond
 the arc and was second in the RMAC with 2.8 threes per contest. Also grabbed 5.3 rpg. Also
 played at Texas JUCOs, Southwestern Christian and McClennan.

RETURNING FROM THE 2022-23 ROSTER

- UTSA lost 12 players from last year's squad and returns only two contributors from 2022-23.
 The pair accounted for just 8.4 percent of the points, 10.5 percent of rebounds, 12.4 percent of assists and 12.6 percent of steals last season.
- Junior guard Christian Tucker is in the mix for a steady starting spot for the Roadrunners, playing in 30 games last season with six starts. In 2022-23, Tucker averaged 4.8 points, 1.4 assists and 1.5 rebounds per game. Through the two exhibitions, Tucker led UTSA with 16 points in the second contest vs. McMurry en route to a 11.5 ppg 3.0 rpg preseason leading the team with 5.0 assists per contest. In total, Tucker has played 56 games with 12 starts for the Roadrunners, averaging 4.1 ppg and 1.3 apg. Tucker was a first-team All-Region and All-State honorable mention at Gilbert Perry High School in Chandler, Ariz., averaging 16 points, five assists and five rebounds while leading Gilbert Perry to a Regional Championship.
- A starter at forward last year in his rookie season, sophomore Massal Diouf appeared in 27 games and started 21 contests a year ago. Diouf shot 42.5 percent and averaged 2.0 ppg, 2.7 rpg in 10.9 mpg. In the exhibitions, Diouf led the team with an .856 shooting average, putting up 6.0 ppg with 3.5 rpg. Diouf prepped at Western Canada Prep Academy and played with the U-16 and U-18 Dutch National Team. He earned Canadian Junior Basketball Team first-team All-Star honors while leading Western Canada to a third-place finish.

BACK ON CAMPUS BUT WAITING TO PLAY

- Last November, former Roadrunner **guard Jordan lvy-Curry** was suiting up for Pacific the first time and went on to finish with 33 games and seven starts for the Tigers, logging 10.3 points and 2.6 rebounds per game while shooting 42.2 percent from the field. He was a career-best 86.4 percent at the free throw line, leading Pacific with a 70-for-81 charity stripe performance.
- Just 12 months later, Ivy-Curry is right back where he started the first two years of his career
 and looking for the opportunity to join the new-look Roadrunners. A 2020-21 Conference USA
 All-Freshman teamer, Ivy-Curry has played 47 games for the Roadrunners, logging 19 starts
 in 21 games as a sophomore for 13.9 ppg the second-best individual UTSA mark. Ivy-Curry
 scored in double-figures 15 times, topping out at 27 points. He also added 2.3 rpg and 1.9 apg.
- In early November, the NCAA denied lvy-Curry's appeal and he will need to sit for 2023-24.

FINALLY CARLTON'S TIME

- UTSA's roster got considerably taller last season when center Carlton Linguard Jr. announced
 his pledge to the Roadrunners in the offseason. The 7-foot San Antonio native, played his high
 school ball at Stevens and returned to the Alamo City hoping to be eligible for the second
 semester but his opportunity never materialized while he finished re-establishing residency.
- The 14.5 ppg and 9.0 rpg he averaged in the exhibition games was an optimistic indicator, albeit against lower-division opposition.
- If his regular season debut is a representation (at a 12 point/10 rebound double-double), Linguard could be one of the most exciting players for the Roadrunners and in the American Athletic Conference this season due to his mix of size, reach and mobility.

HENSON'S EIGHTH YEAR AT THE HELM

- The Roadrunners are led by eighth-year head coach Steve Henson, the 2017-18 Conference
 USA Coach of the Year. UTSA's Nov. 6 victory pushed him on to the next milestone as a 100game winner at UTSA.
- Henson, a former star player at Kansas State (1986-90), took over at UTSA for the 2016-17 season and quickly transitioned the Roadrunners into an up-tempo, high-scoring offensive unit.
- The Kansas native took over at UTSA after five years as an assistant at Oklahoma for Lon Kruger. Henson was also on the staff with Kruger for seven seasons at UNLV after a season at South Florida and scouting then coaching with the Atlanta Hawks.
- A member of the Kansas State Athletics Hall of Fame who led K-State to four straight NCAA
 Tournaments, Henson still holds all-time program records for career assists (582), assists per
 game (4.58), assists in a season (186), assists in a game (12), free throw percentage (.900),
 minutes played (4,474), minutes per game (35.2), starts (118) and consecutive starts (118).
- A two-sport standout at K-State, he was a decathlete and placed third as a sophomore and junior at the Big Eight Championships.
- He was a second-round pick of the Milwaukee Bucks in the 1990 NBA Draft going 44th overall

 and played seven years in the NBA and two seasons in Italy and Greece.
- Henson earned Mr. Basketball honors while playing for his legendary father at McPherson High School.
- Henson has a knack for coaching elite scoring guards, including former Oklahoma standout Buddy Hield and former UTSA standouts Jhivvan Jackson and Keaton Wallace.
