« OPENING DRIVE »

- UTSA will make its fourth straight and fifth overall bowl appearance on Tuesday when it faces Marshall in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl.
- This will mark the Roadrunners' second showing in the Frisco Bowl in the past three years, as they played San Diego State in the 2021 game.
- UTSA is 0-4 in bowl games with three of the contests decided by seven or fewer points.
- UTSA and Marshall will meet for the fourth time on Tuesday in a series led by the Thundering Herd, 2-1.
- The Roadrunners are 38-14 (.731) in the Jeff Traylor era, the most wins and best winning percentage by a UTSA head coach.
- UTSA is 8-7 all time in weekday games including 0-1 on Tuesday.
- A total of 16 Roadrunners earned All-American Athletic Conference accolades this season including five first-team selections.
- UTSA was one of 13 FBS teams to receive the 2023 AFCA Academic Achievement Award for posting the highest Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in the nation.

SETTING THE SCENE

UTSA will make its fourth straight and fifth overall bowl appearance on Tuesday when it faces Marshall in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. at Toyota Stadium and the game will be televised nationally on ESPN and ESPN Deportes. UTSA is 8-4 overall and finished third in the American Athletic Conference with a 7-1 mark in its debut campaign in the league. The Roadrunners and Thundering Herd (6-6), members of the Sun Belt Conference, will meet for the fourth time in a series led by Marshall, 2-1, with all three previous meetings during their time as members of Conference USA. UTSA is 0-4 in bowl games with three of the contests decided by seven or fewer points.

TUNING IN

Tuesday night's game will be televised nationally on ESPN and ESPN Deportes and it also can be streamed on Watch ESPN / Watch ESPN Deportes and via the ESPN mobile app. Jorge Sedano (play-by-play), Rocky Boiman (analyst) and Dawn Davenport (reporter) will call the action, while Eitan Benezra (play-by-play) and Ramiro Pruneda (analyst) will handle the ESPN Deportes broadcast. UTSA Sports Media Network will air the game live in the San Antonio area on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at ticket760.iheart.com and via the free iHeartRadio app. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Pat Evans (reporter) have the call. There will be a two-hour pregame and 45-minute postgame show. Bowl Season Radio will provide a national broadcast of the game, which can be heard on SiriusXM 84 with Toby Rowland (play-by-play), Elvis Gallegos (analyst) and Chris My-coskie (reporter) on the call.

GOING BOWLING

UTSA will make its fourth consecutive and fifth all-time bowl appearance when it faces Marshall in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl on Dec. 19. The Roadrunners now have been bowl eligible six times overall, including in each of the first four seasons under head coach Jeff Traylor. UTSA is 0-4 in bowl games with three of the contests decided by seven or fewer points. UTSA dropped a 31-24 decision to No. 16 Louisiana in the 2020 First Responder Bowl, a 38-24 contest to No. 24 San Diego State in the 2021 Frisco Bowl and an 18-12 matchup against No. 23 Troy in last year's Cure Bowl. The Roadrunners made their first bowl appearance in the 2016 New Mexico Bowl, falling to New Mexico, 23-20. UTSA was bowl eligible in 2017 with a 6-5 regular season record but was left out of the postseason picture. Additionally, the Roadrunners were 7-5 in 2013 during their second year of reclassifying to FBS, but all bowl slots were filled by full-fledged FBS teams.

SCOUTING MARSHALL

The Thundering Herd enter the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl with a 6-6 record. Marshall is averaging 23.3 points and 357.8 yards of offense per game while allowing 28.2 points and 375.8 yards per contest. Rasheen Ali is the top rusher with 1,043 yards and 14 touchdowns on 203 attempts (5.1 ypc), while Caleb Coombs has a team-high 39 receptions for 310 yards and a pair of scores. Defensively, Eli Neal paces the team with 85 tackles, including 8.5 for loss and two sacks, while Owen Porter owns 57 tackles, 15 TFLs and five sacks. Head coach Charles Huff is 22-16 in his third season at the helm.

SERIES HISTORY

Tuesday will mark the fourth meeting on the gridiron between UTSA and Marshall. The Thundering Herd lead the series, 2-1, with the Roadrunners' lone win a 9-7 home triumph on Nov. 18, 2017. All three previous meetings occurred when both teams were members of Conference USA.

LAST MEETING

Marshall tallied 505 yards of offense and held UTSA to 137, including minus-26 on the ground, in a 23-0 victory on Nov. 17, 2018, in Huntington, West Virginia. Isaiah Green completed 19-of-36 passes for 387 yards and two touchdowns, Tyre Brady caught six balls for 162 and a TD and Obi Obialo had five grabs for 103 to lead the Thundering Herd air attack. Bryce Rivers came off the bench and threw for 158 yards on 16-of-31 passes for UTSA. Greg Campbell Jr. was his favorite target with seven catches for 84 yards. C.J. Levine posted 14 tackles while Josiah Tavaefa turned in 12 stops to pace the defense. After falling behind by 20 at halftime, the Roadrunners yielded just three points and 179 yards in the second half but could not find the end zone all afternoon in suffering the second shutout in program history. One current Roadrunner saw action in that last meeting, as defensive lineman Brandon Matterson registered three tackles as a true freshman.

WHO'S COUNTING?

Now in their 13th season of play, the Roadrunners will play the 159th game in program history on Tuesday when they face Marshall in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl. UTSA is 83-75 all-time and 0-3 in neutral-site contests. By comparison, Marshall started playing football in 1895 and owns an all-time record of 605-555-35.

UTSA IN WEEKDAY GAMES

With the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl falling on a Tuesday, UTSA will play on a weekday for the fourth time this season and 11th time under fourth-year head coach Jeff Traylor. The only previous Tuesday contest in program history was two years ago in the Frisco Bowl, a 38-24 setback to No. 24 San Diego State on Dec. 21, 2021. The Roadrunners have played 15 non-Saturday games in their 13-year history and they tote an 8-7 mark in such games.

LAST TIME OUT

Frank Harris accounted for 226 yards of offense but No. 18 Tulane took advantage of five UTSA turnovers in a 29-16 victory in American Athletic Conference action on Nov. 24 in New Orleans. The Roadrunners outgained the Green Wave with 375 yards compared to 352, but the defending AAC champions scored 17 points off UTSA turnovers to snap the Roadrunners' conference winning streak at 17 games. Harris passed for 198 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 28 to lead the offense, while Joshua Cephus caught six balls for 83 yards to get to 1,049 receiving yards for the season. Kevorian Barnes paced the ground game with 92 yards on 12 attempts. Defensively, Jamal Ligon registered seven tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble, while Rashad Wisdom posted seven stops, including six unassisted.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

UTSA is no stranger to close contests in the Jeff Traylor era, as 30 of the 52 have been one-score ballgames in the fourth quarter. The Roadrunners own a 21-9 record in those games. Dating back to the 2021 campaign, UTSA has seen 17 of the last 30 contests decided in the fourth quarter or later. Additionally, the Roadrunners are 13-4 in games decided by eight points or less since 2021.

WORKING OVERTIME

The Roadrunners were working overtime in 2022, with a program-record three contests needing extra periods to determine the outcome. UTSA played the first back-to-back overtime games in program history to open the campaign. The Roadrunners dropped a 37-35 decision to No. 24 Houston in triple overtime in the opener. One week later, UTSA rallied from a 14-point, second-half deficit to score a 41-38 road triumph over Army West Point in one extra period. On Nov. 5 in Birmingham, the Roadrunners outlasted UAB 44-38 in double overtime to improve to 2-1 last season and 5-3 overall in overtime games. UTSA played overtime, double-overtime and triple-overtime games last season and joined Houston, Navy and Texas Tech as the only FBS teams to have played three overtime contests last year.

TRAYLOR TAKING ROADRUNNERS TO NEW HEIGHTS

Head coach Jeff Traylor has guided UTSA to new heights since taking over the program prior to the 2020 campaign. The Gilmer, Texas, native has turned around the program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, producing results on and off the field. Taking over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, he has led the Roadrunners to a 38-14 record through 52 games, the most wins all-time and best winning percentage (.731) by a UTSA head football coach. In the Jeff Traylor era, the Roadrunners own a 27-4 (.871) record in regular season conference games and are 29-4 (.879) against league competition when including the 2021 and 2022 Conference USA Championship Games. Under Traylor's direction, UTSA has won back-to-back conference championships, has been nationally ranked in all three major polls in 2021 and 2022 and is now slated to appear in a bowl game for the fourth year in a row. The two-time conference coach of the year has coached six All-Americans, three national award finalists, 13 national award semifinalists, seven conference superlative award recipients, 83 all-conference selections, two academic All-Americans and a pair of NFL Draft picks during his UTSA tenure. He was the 2021 AFCA Region 4 Coach of the Year and he has been a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year twice in addition to being a finalist for the 2022 Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year, 2021 AFCA National Coach of the Year and the 2021 George Munger College Coach of the Year.

SEASON 13

One of the newest FBS programs and now in its first year as a member of the American Athletic Conference, UTSA is wrapping up its 13th season of football with the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl on Dec. 19. The Roadrunners started their program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played their first season as an FCS Independent in 2011 before joining the Western Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign. UTSA moved into Conference USA in 2013 and became a full-fledged FBS member starting with the 2014 season. The Roadrunners set NCAA modern startup program records

in 2011 by drawing 56,743 fans to their inaugural game against Northeastern State and by averaging 35,521 fans for their six home contests that season. UTSA made its first postseason appearance at the 2016 New Mexico Bowl in its sixth season of play and registered its first win against a team from the Big 12 Conference the following season with a 17-10 victory over Baylor. The Roadrunners made history in 2021, opening the fall with a road win against Illinois of the Big Ten Conference, capturing their first conference championship with a 49-42 decision against WKU and capping a 12-2 ledger with their third bowl game. They repeated as league champions with a 48-27 win over North Texas in 2022 and made their third straight and fourth overall bowl appearance, ending the year with an 11-3 mark. UTSA now has posted at least six wins in eight of the 13 seasons in program history and it has reached the seven-win plateau six times, including in each of the first four years of the Jeff Traylor era. The Roadrunners reached double-digit wins in back-to-back seasons (2021-22), joining Baylor and TCU as the only Texas-based FBS teams since 2012 to notch at least 10 wins in consecutive years.

NATIONAL HONORS

A trio of Roadrunners have received national honors this season. Frank Harris was tabbed a semifinalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award for the third consecutive year, an award in which he was a finalist for in 2022. The senior also landed on the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2023, his fourth career appearance on that list. Harris also collected a pair of national player of the week honors from the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose and Davey O'Brien Awards on Nov. 21 following his record-setting showing in the win over South Florida. Trey Moore earned second-team AFCA All-America accolades to become the eighth All-American in program history. Lucas Dean was chosen as a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, marking the seventh consecutive year a Roadrunner landed on that list. On Dec. 8, UTSA was one of 13 FBS teams named as a recipient of the 2023 AFCA Academic Achievement Award for posting the highest Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in the nation.

ROADRUNNERS REEL IN AAC ACCOLADES

A total of 16 Roadrunners were honored by the American Athletic Conference with the unveiling of the league's superlative awards and all-conference teams. Making their debut in The American this season, UTSA's 16 all-conference selections trailed only Tulane and SMU, who each had 17 honorees in a vote by the league's 14 head coaches. Five Roadrunners landed on the first team, giving the program 24 first-team all-conference selections in its history, including 21 in the Jeff Traylor era.

SIX ROADRUNNERS COLLECT DAVE CAMPBELL'S TEXAS FOOTBALL PLAUDITS

Six UTSA players were honored with the unveiling of the 2023 Dave Campbell's Texas Football All-Texas College Teams and postseason awards. Frank Harris was named Best Quarterback and a first-team honoree and wide receiver Devin McCuin was voted Offensive Freshman of the Year. Additionally, wide receiver Joshua Cephus and edge rusher Trey Moore joined Harris on the first team, while cornerback Kam Alexander and safety Rashad Wisdom made the second team.

AAC WEEKLY AWARD RECIPIENTS

UTSA garnered five American Athletic Conference Player of the Week honors during its debut campaign in the league. On Nov. 20, senior quarterback Frank Harris was named AAC Offensive Player of the Week following his record-setting showing in the 49-21 win over South Florida. Outside linebacker Trey Moore earned the honor three times, picking up the AAC Defensive Player of the Week certificate following wins against Texas State, UAB and East Carolina. Chase Allen garnered the AAC Special Teams Player of the Week accolade following the Texas State win.

HIGH-SCORING ROADRUNNERS

UTSA has emerged as one of the top scoring offenses in the FBS under head coach Jeff Traylor. In his second season at the helm in 2021, the Roadrunners set school records for scoring, tallying 516 total points in 14 contests for a program-record 36.9 points per game to rank 11th nationally. Last year, the Roadrunners came up just shy of the school record with 515 points in 14 games for an average of 36.8 per game, good for 14th in the FBS. UTSA scored 30-plus points in 12 of the 14 contests, and they topped the 40-point barrier seven times and the 50-point plateau twice. The Roadrunners have scored 380 points through 12 games in 2023, good for an average of 31.7 per contest. UTSA posted 34-plus points during a seven-game winning streak to start American Athletic Conference play against Temple (49), UAB (41), Florida Atlantic (36), East Carolina (41), North Texas (37), Rice (34) and South Florida (49) before dropping a 29-16 decision to Tulane in the regular season finale. UTSA has scored 20-plus points in 40 of the last 44 games dating back to the 2020 campaign. The Roadrunners have tallied 1,750 points in 52 games under head coach Jeff Traylor, good for an average of 33.7 points per game.

CONVERTING ON THIRD DOWN

The Roadrunners have emerged as one of the best in the nation when it comes to converting on third down. UTSA has earned a first down on 85 of 179 third-down attempts this season. That

equates to a 47.5% clip, good for first in the American Athletic Conference and 13th in the FBS. The Roadrunners converted a season-high 12 of 21 third-down tries in the 20-13 victory over Texas State on Sept. 9 and they have gained a first down on seven-or-more third-down attempts eight times overall, including in six of the last seven outings.

QUICK-STRIKE ATTACK

UTSA's offensive attack has proven it can reach the end zone quickly this season. The Roadrunners boast nine touchdown drives that have taken one minute or less, marking the third-best total in the FBS behind four teams — Florida State, Old Dominion, Oregon and UNLV — who have 11 such drives and one squad — Rice — that owns 10.

HARRIS ON HISTORIC RIDE

Frank Harris is on a historic ride as UTSA's starting quarterback. The Schertz Clemens High School product owns 38 school records, including 14 career marks, and he also has the top performance in a bowl game in six different categories. The first-team All-American Athletic Conference performer boasts a 39-13 record as UTSA's starting QB, and despite missing two games in September, he still ranks fourth among active signal-callers with 52 starts behind only Oregon's Bo Nix (60), Notre Dame's Sam Hartman

(57) and LSU's Jayden Daniels (55). A member of the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2023 and a semifinalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, he opened the campaign by throwing for 209 yards and a TD and rushing for 45 yards against Houston, and he followed that by completing 26 of 37 passes for 214 yards and a score in the 20-13 victory over Texas State before missing his first start and game (vs. Army) since 2020 to snap a streak of 36 consecutive starts. He returned to the lineup in the 49-34 win at Temple and threw for 338 yards and three touchdowns on 25-of-33 passing. Harris piled up 395 passing yards and four touchdowns in the 41-27 victory against East Carolina, earning a spot on the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8, Manning Award Stars of the Week list and AAC Weekly Honor Roll for his performance. He turned in a career performance in the 49-21 win over South Florida, passing for 411 yards — just three shy of his own UTSA record — and rushing for 112 to total a school-record 523 yards of offense, collecting Davey O'Brien Co-National QB of the Week, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Player of the Week, Manning Award Star of the Week and AAC Offensive Player of the Week accolades. His yardage output is the third most by an FBS player this season, and he became just the 15th player in FBS history to throw for 400-plus yards and rush for over 100 in the same game. For his career, Harris has thrown for 11,862 yards and 92 touchdowns on 1034-of-1,547 passing to go with 2,145 rushing yards and 28 scores on 458 attempts to give him UTSA's total offense record with 14,007 yards, which ranks fifth among active FBS quarterbacks. Additionally, he stands fifth in touchdowns responsible for (121), seventh in touchdown passes (92) and completion percentage (.668) and eighth in passing yards (11,862) among active signal-callers. He and LSU's Jayden Daniels, the 2023 Heisman Trophy winner, are the only two active FBS quarterbacks with at least 11,000 passing yards and 2,000 rushing yards.

EXPERIENCE UP FRONT

UTSA once again boasts one of the most experienced offensive lines in the FBS this fall. The Roadrunners own more than 200 combined games played within the unit, a total that ranks in the top 25 nationally. Additionally, UTSA's returning starters of Terrell Haynes, Makai Hart, Ernesto Almaraz, Walker Baty and Venly Tatafu had combined for 76 starts entering the season, the 14th-best tally in the FBS. Since the start of conference play, UTSA has settled on the starting lineup of Tatafu at left tackle, Haynes at left guard, Luke Lapeze at center, Cory Godinet at right guard and Almaraz at right tackle. Following the regular season finale at Tulane on Nov. 24, Haynes, a second-team All-American Athletic Conference pick this year, now owns 42 career starts, while Almaraz, a third-team all-league selection, and Tatafu have made 20 and 19 starts, respectively.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER

The Roadrunners boast a three-headed monster in the backfield this season. Running backs Kevorian Barnes, Rocko Griffin and Robert Henry have combined to rush for 1,689 yards and 20 touchdowns on 334 attempts, a combined average of 5.06 yards per carry. Barnes, a redshirt sophomore from San Augustine, Texas, paces the unit with 698 yards and six TDs on 139 carries, while Henry, a junior transfer from Lumberton, Mississippi, has tallied 551 yards and a team-best nine TDs on 113 totes. Griffin, a sophomore transfer from Vanderbilt, has rushed 80 times for 440 yards and five scores and is averaging a team-best 5.5 yards per carry. The trio is responsible for 80.5% of the Roadrunners' rushing yards and 83.3% of their rushing TDs this fall.

BARNES BACK AFTER BREAKOUT CAMPAIGN

Kevorian Barnes enjoyed a breakout campaign in 2022 that saw him collect Conference USA Freshman of the Year honors after rushing for 845 yards and six touchdowns on 135 carries. The San Augustine, Texas, native had just six rushes for 20 yards through the first five contests last fall before his breakout game of 128 yards and two touchdowns on 20 rushes in the 30-10 victory at FIU on Oct. 14. In fact, 825 of his yards were accumulated over the final eight contests. He topped the 100-yard mark on the ground five times and averaged 6.3 yards per rush, capping the year with a 132-yard output against No. 23 Troy in the Cure Bowl. Barnes' 2022 rushing total ranks sixth on UTSA's single-season list. The Doak Walker Award Watch

List member opened his redshirt sophomore season with another 100-yard contest, piling up 103 yards and a TD on 16 carries against Houston. He matched that with 103 yards on 26 totes in the 20-13 win over Texas State to also eclipse the 1,000-yard plateau for his career. Barnes posted his third 100-yard game of the fall and eighth of his career with a season-high 129 and two scores in the 37-29 win at North Texas, earning a spot on the American Athletic Conference Honor Roll. After missing the Rice game and only playing three snaps versus South Florida, Barnes tallied 92 yards on 12 carries versus Tulane and now has rushed for 698 yards and six TDs this season and 1,559 and 12 scores in 26 career contests.

SURE-HANDED CEPHUS

Joshua Cephus has built a reputation as a wide receiver who does not drop anything thrown his way. The senior from Houston has been tagged with only nine drops in 423 targets during his career for a drop rate of 2.9% according to Pro Football Focus. A graduate of Dekaney High School, the first-team all-conference performer is enjoying a record-setting final campaign, as he has taken down the program's career records for receptions and receiving yards while piling up 1,049 yards and nine TDs on 82 catches, good for an average of 12.8 per reception and 87.4 per contest. He opened the season by catching nine balls for 123 yards and a touchdown against Houston, and he was named to the American Athletic Conference Weekly Honor Roll for his performance. He piled up 84 receiving yards and a TD on eight grabs versus Army before hauling in seven passes for 58 yards and a score at No. 20 Tennessee. He was on the receiving end of seven passes for 81 yards and a touchdown in the 49-34 win at Temple and he collected seven balls for 55 yards and a pair of scores in the 41-20 triumph over UAB, taking down the program mark for career receptions on his first TD grab. He had seven receptions for 57 yards in the 36-10 win at Florida Atlantic and then turned in a career day with 183 yards on only four catches, including a program-record 84-yard TD, in the 41-27 victory against East Carolina. After making six grabs for 69 yards in the 37-29 road triumph over North Texas and five for 53 yards and a TD in the win against Rice, Cephus notched his seventh career 100-yard game with 163 yards and a 64-yard score — which gave him UTSA's all-time receiving yardage record — on nine receptions in the 49-21 win over South Florida. After making six grabs for 83 yards versus Tulane, he currently stands second in the American Athletic Conference and 16th nationally in receiving yards (1,049), third in the AAC and 13th in the FBS in receptions per game (6.8) and third in the league and 23rd in the country in receiving TDs (9). He also ranks among the nation's best when it comes to consecutive games with a reception, as he has caught a pass in 51 straight contests, the third-longest active stretch in the nation behind only Sam Pinckney of Coastal Carolina (57) and Jacob Cowing of Arizona (56). Among active FBS players, he currently stands third in career receptions (306), third in receiving yards (3,537) and sixth in receiving TDs (27).

CARDENAS IS CLUTCH

UTSA tight end Oscar Cardenas has built a reputation for making clutch catches in key moments of games during his career. The San Antonio Brandeis High School product played a role in one of the iconic moments in program history, hauling in the game-winning TD reception after a tipped pass with three seconds left in the 34-31 victory over UAB in 2021. He also had a 28-yard catch on that game-winning drive versus the Blazers to help the Roadrunners clinch the Conference USA West Division title. Last year, Cardenas caught two balls in the opener against No. 24 Houston, including a key 25-yard reception that set up the game-tying field goal as time expired. He also made a one-handed grab and then hurdled a defender for a 35-yard play on the final drive of the 31-27 victory over North Texas last October to set up the game-winning touchdown pass on the following play. A third-team All-American Athletic Conference selection this season, he has 32 catches for 280 yards and a pair of touchdowns this season, including four receptions for 31 yards versus No. 20 Tennessee, five grabs for 51 yards in the 49-34 win at Temple and four catches for 37 yards in the 49-21 victory against South Florida. He now owns 82 receptions for 997 yards and six touchdowns as a Roadrunner.

SACK ATTACK

UTSA has spent much time in the opposing backfield this season with 90 tackles for loss — six shy of the school record — and a program-record 40 sacks. The Roadrunners have registered five or more tackles for loss in 10 games, including 10-plus in four contests, headlined by a season-high 13 — one shy of the program standard — in the 36-10 road triumph over Florida Atlantic. UTSA has recorded four-plus sacks five times, headlined by a school-record seven in the 20-13 victory over Texas State. Over the last seven games, UTSA has tallied 53 TFLs and 27 sacks, good for averages of 7.6 and 3.9 per contest during that stretch. The Roadrunners lead the American Athletic Conference and rank seventh in the FBS with 7.5 tackles for loss per game and they stand second in the league and seventh nationally in sacks per contest (3.3).

TOUGH AGAINST THE RUN

The Roadrunners have emerged with a stout rush defense this fall, as they have held four opponents to fewer than 100 yards on the ground. After surrendering just 101 rushing yards to Houston in the season opener, UTSA allowed only 31 against Texas State, the lowest total for the Bobcats this year. In the American Athletic Conference opener on Oct. 7, Temple gained only 70 yards on the ground. Two weeks later, Florida Atlantic was limited to a season-low 20, the fewest allowed since UTSA held Rice to five rushing yards on Nov. 19, 2022. UTSA limited Rice to only 47 rushing yards and 229 total yards on Nov. 11, the Owls' lowest total since the season opener versus Texas. Overall, UTSA has held seven opponents to fewer than 400 yards of total offense, including 162 by Florida Atlantic, the fewest yards allowed this year, and 242 by Texas State, season-low yardage outputs for both teams.

TURNING THE TIDE FOR TAKEAWAYS

After going through the first three games without a takeaway, the Roadrunners have forced 16 turnovers over the past nine contests. UTSA came up with its first turnover of the year on a muffed punt return that was recovered by Kelechi Nwachuku against No. 20 Tennessee. On Oct. 7 in the American Athletic Conference-opening win at Temple, UTSA forced a pair of fumbles to push their season tally to three. The Roadrunners doubled their takeaway total by coming up with three in the 41-20 victory over UAB, as Trey Moore registered a strip-sack that he recovered in the first quarter, while Kam Alexander and Elliott Davison each had an interception. Owen Pewee and Nicktroy Fortune each picked off passes in the 36-10 road triumph at Florida Atlantic, while Davison posted his second pick of the year against East Carolina. Moore and Donyai Taylor recorded interceptions and Trumane Bell II recovered a fumble in the 37-29 road triumph over North Texas, Ronald Triplette pounced on a fumble against Rice, Fortune and Dywan Griffin picked off passes in the 49-21 victory over South Florida and Taylor had a 19-yard fumble return versus Tulane to up the takeaway total to 16, nine interceptions and seven recoveries.

D-LINE DEPTH KEEPS ROADRUNNERS FRESH

UTSA utilizes a deep rotation on the defensive line to keep players fresh throughout the course of a game. The Roadrunners have rotated in at least nine defensive linemen in each game in 2023, including 12 in the wins over East Carolina, Rice and South Florida, 11 versus UAB and 10 in five additional games. UTSA's front features third-team all-conference performers Brandon Brown, Joe Evans and Brandon Matterson, Nick Booker-Brown, Jameian Buxton, Christian Clayton, Tai Leonard, Asyrus Simon, Ronald Triplette and Trumane Bell II, who is tied for fourth in school history with 12.5 career sacks.

LINEBACKER LEADER

Jamal Ligon is back for his fourth season as one of UTSA's two starting inside linebackers. The Tyler, Texas, native has tallied 56 stops, 6.5 TFLs, five quarterback hurries, one forced fumble and a PBU en route to honorable mention All-American Athletic Conference honors this year. He is coming off arguably his strongest performance of the fall after logging seven stops, 2.5 TFLs, one sack and a forced fumble against Tulane. He also had seven tackles in the 34-14 victory over Rice and four tackles, a TFL and a hurry in the 49-21 win against South Florida. Ligon set the program's single-game standard with 19 tackles as a true freshman in the 37-35 win over Middle Tennessee in 2020. He currently shares the program record for assisted tackles at 144 with Drew Douglas and he ranks third in school history with 279 stops in 49 career games.

OURS (TAYLOR'S VERSION)

UTSA senior Donyai Taylor is following in the footsteps of former teammate and older brother, Dadrion, who started his career in 2018 and donned the number *seven* jersey for the 2020 through 2022 seasons as a standout at the Roadrunners' "Money" outside linebacker position. Donyai, who has played the same nickel/outside linebacker spot as his sibling since his true freshman campaign in 2020, earned the coveted single-digit jersey in a vote by his teammates prior to this season, choosing the same number *seven* that Dadrion wore. The younger brother and Shiner High School product has started all 12 games this fall and registered 45 total tackles, *seven* tackles for loss, two sacks, six quarterback hurries, two pass breakups, a 78-yard interception return and a 19-yard fumble return en route to second-team All-American Athletic Conference honors.

WISDOM IN THE SECONDARY

Rashad Wisdom is back for his fifth and final season in a UTSA uniform as one of the most productive defensive backs in program history. The Converse Judson High School product started six games last fall but suffered a season-ending injury and shut it down after the road win over FIU on Oct. 14. Now a three-time first-team all-conference safety after garnering those honors this fall, he has totaled 58 tackles, two sacks, five pass breakups and a forced fumble in 2023. Wisdom opened his final campaign with five total tackles — including four unassisted — versus Houston before posting three stops in the 20-13 win over Texas State. He turned in five solo and seven total stops

against Army, four tackles plus a pair of PBUs at No. 20 Tennessee and five unassisted tackles in the 49-34 win at Temple. He took down Triston Wade's program record for career tackles after posting five in the 37-29 road triumph over North Texas. He added three tackles in the 34-14 victory against Rice before tallying eight in the 49-21 win against South Florida and seven versus Tulane, giving him 312 as a Roadrunner, good for 21st on the active FBS list. He also upped his UTSA mark for solo stops to 226 — third among active FBS players — with 14 over the past two contests, giving him 57 more than any other Roadrunner in school annals. The Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Chuck Bednarik Award Watch List member also has five interceptions, 14 pass breakups, 13 tackles for loss, five forced fumbles, four sacks and a pair of fumble recoveries in 56 games as a Roadrunner.

DEFENSIVE CORNERSTONES

UTSA's cornerbacks rotation of Kam Alexander, Nicktrov Fortune and Dywan Griffin has provided the Roadrunners with cornerstones on the defense. Alexander has played in all 12 games with seven starts, totaling 33 tackles, 31 solo stops, a team-high 13 pass breakups, one interception and a quarterback hurry en route to first-team All-American Athletic Conference honors. The junior transfer from Manvel, Texas, by way of Sam Houston, leads UTSA with a Pro Football Focus (PFF) coverage grade of 78.9, 13 forced incompletions and an 80.9 NFL passer rating against. Fortune has played in all 12 contests with 11 starts and shares the team lead with two interceptions to go with seven PBUs, 24 tackles, 19 unassisted stops and a pair of hurries. He has earned a 73.2 coverage grade and a 72.1 NFL passer rating against from PFF. Griffin has appeared in all 12 games with five starts, and the New Orleans native has logged 25 tackles, 17 solo stops, three PBUs, a pair of forced fumbles, one interception and a PFF 94.3 NFL passer rating against.

PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER

Lucas Dean will wrap up his final season in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl as one of the best to ever punt for UTSA. A product of Prokick Australia and the first Roadrunner from Down Under, he has used an Australian Rules Football background to help provide UTSA with a weapon in the kicking game since his arrival on campus in 2019. The four-time all-conference performer owns the program standard for career punting average with a 43.7 mark, which places him in a tie for 21st among active FBS players. He recently moved past Yannis Routsas to the top of the program's career punts chart, as he now has 256. This season, he is averaging 42.0 yards on 46 punts with 19 inside the 20-yard line and nine that have gone 50-plus yards en route to second-team All-American Athletic Conference accolades. Dean has registered the top three marks on the school's single-season chart with a 45.98 average in 2020, 45.23 in 2021 and 45.05 last fall. He also boasts seven of the eight longest punts in UTSA annals, highlighted by his school-record 76-yard kick against Texas Southern in 2022. The 2020 Conference USA Special Teams Player of the Year was a second-team All-American by the Sporting News and a fourth-team selection by Phil Steele that season. Also an excellent student who has been named Academic All-District twice and to the 2021 Conference USA All-Academic Team, Dean was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy and appeared on the watch list for the Ray Guy Award this year.

ALLEN'S AIM IS ACCURATE

Chase Allen has developed into a reliable place-kicker in his first season with the Roadrunners. The junior transfer from Alabama has made 13 of 15 field goals and all 44 extra-point attempts in 2023, leading the American Athletic Conference and ranking 17th in the FBS in field-goal percentage (.867). After not kicking in the opener versus Houston, he drilled 46- and 43-yard field goals in the 20-13 victory over Texas State, earning AAC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. The Colleyville Heritage High School graduate tied the school record with a 53-yard make — to go with a 46-yarder — in the 41-20 triumph over UAB on Oct. 14, and he connected from 34 and 37 yards in the 36-10 victory at Florida Atlantic a week later. A second-team all-conference selection this year, split the uprights on all three attempts in the 37-29 road triumph over North Texas and has made two or more in five contests this fall. Currently riding a streak of six consecutive

makes, his 13 made field goals this fall have put him sixth on UTSA's single-season list, while his 44 PATs stand third in program history. In fact, Allen has continued the Roadrunners' stretch of consecutive extra points made, which is now sitting at 189 dating back to a win over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020.

CARPENTER MAKES HISTORY

UTSA junior Chris Carpenter has made history once again in the return game. The junior from Jacksonville, Texas, returned a punt 50 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter of the 34-14 home triumph over Rice on Nov. 11, becoming the first Roadrunner to record a punt and kickoff return for a

TD. Last season, he brought back a kickoff 97 yards for a score against Texas Southern, the first kickoff return touchdown in program history. This season's punt return TD versus the Owls was the third in school annals, as he joined Kenny Harrison (79-yard TD vs. Texas State, 2012) and Sheldon Jones (76-yard return vs. Lamar in 2021). Carpenter ranks fifth in the league and 33rd nationally in punt return average (7.9) and he is one of only six American Athletic Conference players with a punt return touchdown this season.

TV BIRDS

Friday's game will air on ESPN, marking 137 straight televised/streamed appearances for the Roadrunners. The last UTSA game that was not broadcast was the 2012 season finale against Texas State.

A FOCUS ON RECRUITING TEXAS

UTSA's 113-man roster features 88 players — 78% — who hail from the state of Texas. Georgia and Louisiana stand second with four players apiece, while there are three from Mississippi and two each from Florida and Tennessee. Alabama, California, Hawai'i, Iowa, New Jersey, Oregon, Pennsylvania and Virginia each have produced one current Roadrunner. Lucas Dean is the lone UTSA player from Australia and Cory Godinet is the first Roadrunner from American Samoa.

UTSA's 210 TRIANGLE OF TOUGHNESS

Since his arrival in December 2019 head coach Jeff Traylor has instilled into the program his 210 Triangle Of Toughness — run the football, be physical on defense and be sound on special teams — and its Culture Pillars: Integrity, Passion, Mental & Physical Toughness, Selfless and Perfect Effort. As part of that culture, the players voted during fall camp on who would earn single-digit jersey numbers, a reward for representing mental and physical toughness on and off the field. The numbers 2, 1 and 0 — San Antonio's area code — were chosen for the players voted to represent the 210 Triangle of Toughness brand. PRO 'RUNNERS

UTSA currently has five players on NFL active rosters and a pair on practice squads. Marcus Davenport became the first Roadrunner to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft when the Saints picked him 14th overall in 2018. The sixth-year veteran defensive end is in his first season as a starting outside linebacker for the Vikings. Tariq Woolen was selected by the Seahawks in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft. Now in his second year as a starter at cornerback, he led the league with six interceptions and was a Pro Bowl selection as a rookie. Spencer Burford was a fourth-round pick by the 49ers in 2022 and is in his second year as a starter at offensive guard in San Francisco. Kevin Strong Jr. is in his fifth year in the NFL and first season as a starting defensive lineman for the Arizona Cardinals. Former UTSA tight end Leroy Watson, who converted to an offensive tackle for his professional career, was signed to the Cleveland Browns' active roster in November. Additionally, Eric Banks (Cardinals) and Sincere McCormick (Raiders) are on practice squads.





Named UTSA's third head coach on Dec. 9, 2019, Jeff Traylor has had an immediate impact on the program, university and city of San Antonio in a short period of time.

Traylor has turned around the UTSA football program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, which has led to positive results on and off the field. The Gilmer, Texas, native took over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival and has led the Roadrunners to a 38-14 record in his first three years at the helm, already the most wins and best winning percentage (.731) by a coach in program history.

This season, Traylor has led the Roadrunners to an 8-4 record, a 7-1 mark in their debut campaign in the American Athletic Conference and a fourth straight bowl appearance with a matchup against Marshall set for Dec. 19 in the Frisco Bowl. UTSA now has won at least seven games and advanced to a bowl game in each year of the Traylor era.

A total of 16 Roadrunners collected All-American Athletic Conference honors in 2023, led by five first-team honorees in Defensive Player of the Year and outside linebacker Trey Moore, quarterback Frank Harris, wide receiver Joshua Cephus, cornerback Kam Alexander and safety Rashad Wisdom.

In 2022, Traylor guided UTSA to an 11-3 record, a second straight Conference USA title after defeating North Texas 48-27, a top-25 ranking in all three major polls for the second consecutive season and the third bowl appearance in a row with the Cure Bowl matchup against Troy. He repeated as C-USA Coach of the Year and was chosen as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson and Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year, as well as a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award.

Under Traylor's guidance, UTSA collected a school-record 30 C-USA postseason honors, as 27 made the 2022 all-conference teams—including six first-team and five second-team selections—while 16 received honorable mention and three landed on the C-USA All-Freshman Team. Frank Harris was voted the league's MVP and Kevorian Barnes was tabbed C-USA Freshman of the Year. Harris (4) and Jared Sackett (5) combined to earn nine C-USA Player of the Week accolades that season.

Also in 2022, wide receiver Zakhari Franklin was named an honorable mention All-American by Phil Steele, the sixth Roadrunner to receive All-America accolades in the Traylor era. Additionally, Harris was named a finalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

Under Traylor's tutelage, UTSA enjoyed a record-setting campaign in 2021. The Roadrunners won their first 11 games, were nationally ranked (as high as No. 15) for the first time in school history and captured the program's first league title by winning the C-USA Championship with a 49-41 victory over Western Kentucky. UTSA capped the season with its second straight and third overall bowl appearance against San Diego State in the Frisco Bowl.

Traylor was honored as the 2021 C-USA Coach of the Year, the AFCA FBS Regional Coach of the Year for Region 4 and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, AFCA National Coach of the Year and George Munger College Coach of the Year Award. A member of the Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year watch list, he was chosen as the 2021 San Antonio Express-News Sportsman of the Year.

A total of 23 Roadrunners received recognition on the all-conference and C-USA All-Freshman teams in 2021 with Sincere McCormick earning C-USA Offensive Player of the Year accolades for the second straight season.

McCormick garnered All-America accolades from three different organizations in 2021, while Spencer Burford and Clarence Hicks were tabbed honorable mention

All-Americans by Phil Steele. McCormick also was an Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award finalist and a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award for the second straight year. Harris landed on semifinalist lists for the Davey O'Brien and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Awards, while Hunter Duplessis was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy for the second year in a row. Harris and McCormick each collected Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award National Player of the Week honors, while Harris also was a Manning Award Quarterback of the Week. Additionally, UTSA collected nine C-USA weekly awards during the 2021 season.

Traylor guided the Roadrunners to a 7-5 overall record, a runner-up finish in Conference USA's West Division with a 5-2 mark and an appearance in the 2020 First Responder Bowl in his first season at the helm. The Roadrunners received votes in a national poll (AP Top 25) for the first time in program history after a 3-0 start and the seven wins mark the most by a first-year UTSA head coach.

Lucas Dean, Duplessis and McCormick received All-America accolades, while McCormick also was a finalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. Additionally, Duplessis (Campbell Trophy, Lou Groza) and McCormick (Doak Walker) were national award semifinalists, while Harris made the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2020. Dean was tabbed C-USA Special Teams Player of the Year and McCormick was named C-USA Offensive Player of the Year, while a total of 23 Roadrunners were recognized by the league's head coaches, including 19 as all-conference and four on the all-freshman team. The Roadrunners collected a program-record 11 C-USA Player of the Week certificates and a trio of national player of the week accolades in McCormick (Earl Campbell Tyler Rose National Player of the Week), Dean (Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week) and Rashad Wisdom (Jim Thorpe Award Player of the Week).

Traylor has overseen the development of several Roadrunners who have moved on to the professional ranks. In April 2022, UTSA doubled the number of NFL draft picks on one afternoon, as the 49ers selected Spencer Burford in the fourth round while the Seahawks picked Tariq Woolen one round later. Burford has earned the starting spot at right guard and Woolen has picked off half a dozen passes in his rookie campaign en route to being selected to the Pro Bowl. Additionally, Clarence Hicks (Bengals), Sincere McCormick (Raiders), Charles Wiley (Ravens, Giants) and Leroy Watson (49ers) all signed free-agent deals in 2022.

UTSA student-athletes have been honored for their work in the classroom under Traylor, as well. Ahofitu Maka became the third Roadrunner to be named a finalist

for the William V. Campbell Trophy and the second to be selected as a College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-American when he landed on the first team in 2022. He also earned spots on the CSC Academic All-District Team for a third time and the C-USA All-Academic Team for the second straight season. Duplessis was a two-time C-USA Football Scholar Athlete of the Year, a 2021 CSC Academic All-American, a two-time C-USA All-Academic Team selection and a two-time CSC Academic All-District pick. Dean earned 2021 C-USA All-Academic Team recognition and CSC Academic All-District Team accolades in 2021 and 2022.

Traylor has more than 30 years of coaching experience including a highly successful 15-year career as head coach at Gilmer High School, where he led teams to three state championships and two state runner-up finishes and won more than 87% of his games, a winning percentage that ranks 10th all-time in Texas high school history.

Prior to coming to the Alamo City, the Gilmer native served as associate head coach and running backs coach for two seasons at Arkansas, where he helped sign the school's first top-20 recruiting class. Prior to that, he served in the same role at SMU for the 2017 season. He began his collegiate coaching career as the special teams coordinator and tight ends coach at Texas in 2015 before becoming the Longhorns' associate head coach for offense and wide receivers coach the following year.

Traylor's impact on the offense was felt immediately in his first season at Arkansas, as his running backs corps racked up 1,721 yards and 11 touchdowns in 2018. The unit was led by Rakeem Boyd, who rushed for more than 100 yards in three different SEC games, including a season-best 113 against Vanderbilt. The Houston Stratford High School product took over the starting tailback role in the fifth game of the season and his most impressive stretch of the season came during a four-game stretch against Alabama, Ole Miss, Tulsa and Vanderbilt, as he topped the century mark three times and totaled 423 yards. His 102 yards against Alabama made him the first Arkansas running back to eclipse 100 yards against the Crimson Tide since Darren McFadden in 2007.

In Traylor's second season coaching the Arkansas running backs, Boyd rushed for 1,133 yards and eight touchdowns on 184 carries (6.2 avg.) to spearhead a ground game that accumulated 1,766 yards. Boyd topped 100 yards in five contests,

including a season-best 185 and two scores on just eight attempts against Western Kentucky. He also rushed for 100-plus against Portland State (114), Colorado State (122), Kentucky (134) and Mississippi (114).

Prior to his time at Arkansas, Traylor spent the 2017 season as associate head coach and running backs coach at SMU under Chad Morris. He also served as the Mustangs' interim coach before joining Morris' staff at Arkansas.

During his one year at SMU, Traylor's running backs piled up 2,223 yards on the ground. Three players rushed for 500-plus yards, with Xavier Jones leading the group at 1,075. The Mustangs topped the 200-yard mark on the ground six times, including a season-best 311 in a win against Arkansas State. SMU ranked in the top 20 nationally in several offensive categories, including 12th in scoring offense and 15th in total offense.

Prior to his time in Dallas, Traylor spent two seasons at Texas. He was the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator in 2015 and then the associate head coach for offense and wide receivers coach in 2016, when the Longhorns boasted the nation's No. 16-ranked offense that averaged 491.3 yards per game. During his time as the lead recruiter, he helped the Longhorns sign the No. 7-ranked recruiting class in the country in back-to-back years and was named Scout.com's Big 12 Recruiter of the Year. He recruited punter Michael Dickson, who went on to earn multiple All-America honors, win Big 12 Conference Special Teams Player of the Year in 2016 and 2017 as well as the 2017 Ray Guy Award, and currently punts for the Seattle Seahawks.

Traylor built his hometown program into a prep powerhouse during his 15-year tenure leading the Buckeyes.

A four-time Texas High School Coach of the Year, he posted a 175-26 record (.871 winning percentage) and led Gilmer to five state championship game appearances, three state titles (2004, '09, '14) and 12 district crowns. The Buckeyes turned in a pair of perfect 16-0 seasons, won 10-or-more games 11 times and registered seven 13-win seasons and three 15-win campaigns during his career.

In 2014, his undefeated Class 4A Division II state championship team boasted one of the most prolific offenses in Texas prep history. Gilmer scored 950 points, the second-most in state history, averaging 59.4 points and 536.1 yards over the 16-game season. The Buckeyes topped 60 points nine times, including two 80-point performances. Gilmer also averaged 536.1 total yards per game (8,577 yards) behind a balanced 293.9 passing yards and 242.1 rushing yards per contest. The defense was equally dominant, allowing only 276 points (17.3) with five single-digit efforts and two shutouts, while recording 23 interceptions and forcing 17 fumbles. Gilmer closed out the season with a win over West Orange-Stark and had eight different players earn 4A All-State honors from either the Associated Press or Texas Sports Writers Association.

Gilmer's two other state titles under Traylor both came in Class 3A in 2004 (Division II) and 2009 (Division I), before the change in class structure in Texas high school football moved the school into 4A. After 15 years on its sidelines, Gilmer renamed Buckeye Stadium to Jeff Traylor Stadium to honor his successful career.

Inducted into the East Texas Coaches Association Hall of Honor in 2019, Traylor has received numerous coaching honors, including being named Coach of the Decade (2000s) by the Tyler Morning Telegraph. He is a 12-time District Coach of the Year, four-time East Texas Coach of the Year and a four-time Ted Jeffries Award winner. He has received the Carl Padilla Coach of the Year, KYKX Coach of the Year and Old Coach Network Coach of the Year awards twice each.

Traylor began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Big Sandy High School in 1990-93 before a seven-year stint (1994-2000) at Jacksonville High School where he served as passing coordinator, defensive backs coach, receivers coach and special teams coordinator. There, he helped coach future NFL quarterbacks Josh McCown and Luke McCown and former Texas A&M standout signal-caller Randy McCown.

A 1986 graduate of Gilmer High School, Traylor earned both undergraduate (1990) and graduate (2002) degrees in education from Stephen F. Austin while playing football as a walk-on.

He and his wife, Cari, have three children: Jordan, Jacob and Jaci.

SATURDAY, SEPT. 2 HOUSTON 17, UTSA 14 HOUSTON (TDECU STADIUM)

SAN ANTONIO — Kevorian Barnes posted his sixth career 100-yard rushing game, Joshua Cephus had a career-high 123 receiving yards and Trey Moore and Donyai Taylor combined for five tackles for loss, but it was not enough as UTSA dropped a 17-14 decision at Houston in the season opener on Saturday night at TDECU Stadium.

Playing in their first game as a member of the American Athletic Conference, the Roadrunners displayed a balanced offense with 208 rushing yards and 209 passing yards against the Cougars, who were making their Big 12 Conference debut. Barnes rushed for 103 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries, averaging 6.4 yards per tote. Dating back to last season, it marked the third straight 100-yard output for the redshirt sophomore from San Augustine, Texas.

Cephus caught nine passes in registering his top receiving yardage total and fifth 100-yard game as a Roadrunner. The senior from nearby Dekaney High School hauled in a pass over the middle late in the contest, juke a defender and found the end zone to help pull UTSA within 17-14 with 5:42 left to play.

Taylor, a senior from Shiner, Texas, recorded five total tackles with three behind the line, including one of three sacks turned in by the visitors. Moore, a sophomore out of Smithson Valley High, also made five stops with two TFLs and one sack.

Kam Alexander paced the defense with six tackles along with a pass breakup and quarterback hurry in his UTSA debut, while Avery Morris, Ken Robinson and Rashad Wisdom contributed five stops apiece. The Roadrunners held the Cougars to 334 yards of offense, including only 101 on the ground.

Cephus' score brought UTSA within three points after trailing by 10. Houston converted a third-down-and-three with a 6-yard pass from Donovan Smith to Mike O'Laughlin. Faced with another third-and-three with the clock winding down to fewer than three minutes, Smith scrambled up the middle and initially was ruled short of the line to gain. However, replay review changed the spot of the ball and the Cougars were awarded a first down following a chain measurement to seal the win.

Houston got on the board first after Smith found Joseph Manjack open in the end zone for an 8-yard touchdown reception. The score was set up by 48-yard punt return by Malik Fleming down to the UTSA 22-yard line.

UTSA answered with an eight-play, 80-yard drive to knot the score at 7-7. Frank Harris completed passes of 16 yards to Chris Carpenter and 17 to Dan Dishman on back-to-back plays before a David Amador II jet sweep around the left end for 20 yards set up a 4-yard TD plunge by Barnes.

The two teams traded missed field goals early in the second quarter, but Jack Martin gave Houston a 10-7 halftime advantage when he split the uprights from 31 yards as time expired in the half.

Houston upped its lead to 10 points late in the third quarter when Matthew Golden hauled in a 6-yard touchdown pass from Smith at the 3:54 mark.

SATURDAY, SEPT. 9 UTSA 20, TEXAS STATE 13 SAN ANTONIO (ALAMODOME)

SAN ANTONIO — Trey Moore registered three sacks and Frank Harris passed for 214 yards to help lead UTSA to a 20-13 victory over Texas State in front of 49,342 fans on Saturday afternoon at the Alamodome.

With the win, the Roadrunners improved to 1-1 on the season and notched their first victory as a member of the American Athletic Conference in front of the second-largest home crowd in program history, trailing only the inaugural game attendance of 56,743.

Moore totaled five tackles and his three sacks are tied for the second most recorded by a Roadrunner in a game. The outside linebacker from Smithson Valley High School helped lead a defense that limited the Bobcats to 242 total yards, including just 31 rushing yards.

UTSA posted 10 total tackles for loss including six sacks, as Nick Booker-Brown, Avery Morris and Jimmori Robinson contributed one apiece.

The Roadrunners took a 10-0 lead in the first half only to see the Bobcats rally to tie things up by halftime.

UTSA grabbed the lead for good when Willie McCoy made a highlight-reel catch on the sideline for a 20-yard touchdown reception with 3:14 left to play in the third quarter. Chase Allen's extra point made it 17-10 in favor of the Roadrunners.

Texas State cut it to 17-13 on a 43-yard field goal from Mason Shipley with 10:37 left to play, but UTSA answered with a 43-yard field goal from Allen at the 5:47 mark of the fourth quarter.

The UTSA defense forced a punt on the Bobcats' next possession and the Roadrunners ran out the clock with a pair of first downs to seal the win.

TJ Finley completed 16 of 30 passes for 211 yards to lead Texas State's offense, while Brian Holloway paced all players with 16 tackles.

Allen put UTSA on the board first when he split the uprights from 46 yards at the 3:01 mark of the opening period.

Rocko Griffin helped the Roadrunners pad their lead with a 20-yard dash to paydirt early in the second stanza to cap a six-play, 57-yard drive.

Texas State pulled within 10-7 on Jahmyl Jeter's 3-yard plunge that ended an 11-play, 66-yard march.

A pair of UTSA starters went down with injuries on the ensuing possession, and the home team was forced to punt the ball back to the visitors with 1:28 left in the half. The Bobcats drove 64 yards in eight plays, the last a 42-yard field goal by Shipley that knotted the score with fewer than 20 seconds left in the half.

SATURDAY, SEPT. 15 ARMY 37, UTSA 29 SAN ANTONIO (ALAMODOME)

SAN ANTONIO — Eddie Lee Marburger passed for 239 yards and three touchdowns in his first career start and Martavius French posted a career-high 10 tackles, but Army West Point held off a second-half UTSA rally in a 37-29 decision on Friday night in front of 27,138 fans at the Alamodome.

The Black Knights (2-1) built an early 14-0 lead and kept the Roadrunners (1-2) at bay in winning for the third time in three visits to the Alamodome for the four-game series. Army used a 44:25-15:35 edge in time of possession and ran 83 offensive plays compared to 49 for UTSA, rushing for 254 yards on 65 attempts — the most by an opponent in school history.

Marburger completed 17 of 25 passes in starting under center for the first time in his career for the injured Frank Harris, who missed his first game and start since the 2020 season to snap a stretch of 36 consecutive starts. The redshirt sophomore signal caller from Sharyland Pioneer High School completed passes to seven different receivers, paced by Joshua Cephus' eight catches for 84 yards.

Facing a 20-7 deficit with time running out in the first half, Marburger and Tykee Ogle-Kellogg connected on a 46-yard, Hail Mary pass to make it a one-score contest at the break.

Army kicker Quinn Maretzki drilled his third field goal of the night from 36 yards to make it 23-14 with 9:13 on the clock.

UTSA answered when Cephus turned a short screen pass in the right flat into a 44-yard scoring play. Chase Allen's extra point pulled the home team within 23-21 with 7:04 left in the third.

However, the Black Knights covered 80 yards in only two plays, a 55-yard pass from Markel Johnson to Isaiah Alston on a trick play followed by a 28-yard TD catch by Noah Short, to push the lead back out to nine less than one minute later.

Army increased its advantage to 16 when Bryson Daily scored on a 3-yard quarterback keeper with 6:45 left to play, only to have UTSA respond quickly on a 72-yard touchdown reception by true freshman Devin McCuin. Marburger then found McCuin open for a successful two-point conversion to make it 37-29 with just over six minutes to play.

UTSA's defense came through with a three-and-out on the next possession, forcing a punt. However, Army returned the favor with a sack on a third-down play to force a UTSA punt. The Black Knights then ran out the clock with a pair of first downs to secure the victory.

SATURDAY, SEPT. 23 TENNESSEE 45, UTSA 14 KNOXVILLE (NEYLAND STADIUM)

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — UTSA redshirt freshman quarterback Owen McCown completed 18 of 20 passes for 170 yards and two touchdowns, all in the second half, but No. 20 Tennessee stormed out to an early lead and never looked back in a 45-14 decision on Saturday afternoon in front of 101,915 fans at Neyland Stadium.

The Volunteers (3-1) built a 14-point lead through the first five minutes and withstood a third-quarter push from the Roadrunners (1-3) in the first meeting between the two schools on the gridiron.

McCown came off the bench and completed his first 10 pass attempts to spark the UTSA offense and cut the deficit to 31-14 with a little more than five minutes remaining in the third quarter.

Trailing by 31 points at the break, UTSA marched 75 yards in 15 plays on the opening possession of the second half to get on the board. McCown completed all eight pass attempts on the drive capped by a 3-yard touchdown to Joshua Cephus.

The UTSA defense then came up with a three-and-out to force a punt. McCown kept his completions streak alive with two more, including a 43-yard catch-and-run by Tykee Ogle-Kellogg, who played at nearby Alcoa High School, to help pull the visitors within 31-14.

The Vols pushed their lead back out to 24 early in the fourth quarter with Jabari Small's 1-yard plunge that put an end to a 12-play, 66-yard drive.

Dylan Sampson broke loose for a 41-yard touchdown dash later in the final frame to provide the final margin.

It did not take long for Tennessee to strike first, as Joe Milton scampered 81 yards on a quarterback keeper on the first play from scrimmage to put the home team up 7-0.

The Vols forced a three-and-out and a punt, then drove 62 yards in nine plays, the last a 10-yard TD rush up the middle by Sampson to push the lead to 14 at the 10:05 mark of the opening period.

UTSA had to settle for another punt on its next possession. Tennessee partially blocked the kick and then tried to pick up the loose ball for a return but fumbled, resulting in a recovery by Kelechi Nwachuku for the Roadrunners' first takeaway of the season. UTSA then marched to the Vols 19-yard line but a fourth-down pass attempt sailed incomplete to end the drive.

Tennessee tacked on a pair of touchdowns and a field goal in the second quarter on an 18-yard reception by Kaleb Webb, a 48-yard grab by Ramel Keyton and a 29-yard field goal by Charles Campbell with 3:21 left in the half.

SATURDAY, OCT. 7 UTSA 49, TEMPLE 34 PHILADELPHIA (LINCOLN FINANCIAL FIELD)

PHILADELPHIA — Frank Harris returned to the lineup to throw for 338 yards and three touchdowns to help lead UTSA to a 49-34 victory over Temple in the Roadrunners' inaugural American Athletic Conference game on Saturday afternoon at Lincoln Financial Field.

UTSA scored on back-to-back drives to take a 21-14 lead at the 10:17 mark of the second stanza. Harris found Cephus open in the end zone on a 17-yard pass to put an exclamation point on an 11-play, 65-yard march. The defense then forced a punt and UTSA drove 57 yards on seven snaps, the last a 1-yard quarterback sneak by Harris to give the Roadrunners their first lead of the afternoon.

The Owls tied things up again with a 31-yard touchdown pass on a flea-flicker from Warner to John Adams with 6:14 left until halftime.

The Roadrunners reclaimed the lead thanks to a second takeaway of the half when Jimmori Robinson's strip-sack led to a fumble recovery by Ronald Triplette at the Temple 6-yard line. On the next play, Robert Henry dashed six yards up the middle, while Chase Allen's extra point made it 28-21 with three minutes remaining until the break.

Temple threatened to trim the deficit just before halftime but Camden Price's 41-yard field goal attempt sailed wide left.

UTSA wasted little time extending the lead to start the second half, as Ogle-Kellogg hauled in a 40-yard touchdown pass from Harris over the middle to help make it 35-21 in favor of the visitors to cap a six-play, 92-yard drive to open the third quarter.

The Owls pulled within one score early in the fourth quarter when Warner found Peter Clarke open in the end zone on a fourth-and-goal play from the 2-yard line. Temple chose to go for two points and was stopped short of the goal line, leaving the score at 35-27 with 10:15 on the clock.

The Roadrunners responded on the next drive, as Henry broke loose for a 43-yard touchdown run to push the lead back to two scores, 42-27.

Temple scored again on a 13-yard touchdown reception by Smith with 6:29 left to play, but UTSA iced it with a 29-yard TD catch by McQuin followed by a defensive stop in the red zone in the final minutes.

SAN ANTONIO — Trey Moore posted a career-high 3.5 sacks and Joshua Cephus became UTSA career receptions leader, as the Roadrunners ran away from UAB, 41-20, on Saturday night in American Athletic Conference action at the Alamodome.

The Roadrunners stormed out to a 14-0 lead through the first four minutes and nine seconds. Henry capped an eight-play, 75-yard drive with a 19-yard touchdown dash on the opening possession. UTSA then came up with a takeaway on Moore's strip-sack and fumble recovery at the UAB 10-yard line. Harris then connected with Cephus over the middle on the next play to put the home team up by two touchdowns and give the senior wide receiver the school record with his 263rd career catch.

The Roadrunners responded by covering 65 yards in 10 plays, the last a 1-yard plunge by Kevorian Barnes. Allen's PAT made it 31-20.

In the fourth, Kam Alexander came up with an interception in plus territory to set up UTSA at the 17-yard line. Five plays later, Barnes found paydirt for the second time to push the lead to three touchdowns with 8:40 remaining.

SAN ANTONIO — Frank Harris threw for 395 yards and four touchdowns and Trey Moore had three sacks to break the program's single-season record and help UTSA to a 41-27 victory over East Carolina in American Athletic Conference action on Saturday afternoon at the Alamodome.

ECU trimmed the deficit to 31-20 at the half on a 51-yard field goal by Conrad.

Allen split the uprights from 36 yards at the 12:03 mark of the third quarter to increase the lead to 14, while Ogle-Kellogg's 43-yard touchdown catch early in the fourth made it 41-20.

The Pirates avoided a second-half shutout with a 4-yard TD pass from Flinn to Sowell with 15 seconds left to play.

SATURDAY, NOV. 4 UTSA 37, UNT 29 DENTON (DATCU STADIUM)

DENTON, Texas — UTSA forced three turnovers and Kevorian Barnes rushed for 129 yards and two touchdowns to help the Roadrunners become bowl eligible for the fourth straight season with a 37-29 victory over North Texas in American Athletic Conference action on Saturday afternoon at DATCU Stadium.

Armed with a 27-13 halftime advantage, UTSA withstood a rally to win its third straight against North Texas (3-6, 1-4).

Moore came up with his first interception of the season on a pass that was deflected by Nick Booker-Brown at the line of scrimmage in plus territory. That pick ended an interception-free streak of 288 consecutive passes thrown by UNT quarterback Chandler Rogers. Allen then knocked through his third field goal of the afternoon from 28 yards to push the lead to 30-13 with 4:03 left in the third quarter.

The Mean Green opened the final frame by pulling to within 30-21 after Blair Conwright hauled in a 20-yard TD pass followed by a two-point conversion reception by Trey Cleveland with 14:01 left to play.

Later in the fourth, UNT was driving deep into UTSA's side of the field, but the defense again came up with an interception off a deflected pass, this time a batted ball by Martavius French that was collected in midair by Taylor and returned 78 yards to the Mean Green 9-yard line. Two plays later, Barnes bulled his way into the end zone for his second TD of the afternoon and Allen's PAT made it 37-21 with 9:32 on the clock.

Cleveland caught a TD pass with just under six minutes left to play and the two-point conversion attempt was good on a QB keeper by Rogers to cut the deficit to 37-29, but the Roadrunners ran out the clock on the ensuing possession to secure the win.

UTSA flexed its muscle on the ground on its opening possession, marching 62 yards for the game's first touchdown with Barnes supplying 51 of the yards, the last three on a dash up the middle to paydirt.

The Mean Green got on the board on the first play of the second stanza when Noah Rauschenberg drilled a 25-yard field goal to cap a 14-play, 67-yard drive.

The Roadrunners responded with a 75-yard scoring drive that ended with an 11-yard TD scamper by Henry. Allen's PAT made it 17-3 with 12:09 left in the opening half.

UTSA pushed its advantage back to two scores with 3:38 left to play in the second quarter when Griffin reached paydirt from seven yards to put an exclamation point on a 12-play, 75-yard drive.

SAN ANTONIO — Bolstered by a stiff defense and balanced offensive attack, UTSA remained in a tie atop the American Athletic Conference standings with a 34-14 victory over Rice on Saturday night at the Alamodome.

Tykee Ogle-Kellogg hauled in a 33-yard touchdown pass from Harris to knot the score at 14-all before Cephus' record-setting reception, which he caught at the USF 38-yard line and turned into a 64-yard scoring play.

UTSA's defense came up with a three-and-out to force a punt with 2:21 left in the first half. Harris then guided the home team on an 11-play, 88-yard march that ended on a 15-yard keeper by the senior signal-caller with 20 seconds on the clock to push the lead to two touchdowns.

The Roadrunners opened the second half with another score, as Harris busted loose up the middle for 40 yards to paydirt to make it 35-14.

UTSA opened up a 42-14 lead when Robert Henry plunged into the end zone from two yards out with 5:14 left in the third quarter.

USF cut the deficit to 21 on a 5-yard TD run by Brown late in the third, but Harris answered with his third rushing touchdown of the evening, scoring untouched on a 25-yard scamper to put the final exclamation point on his record-setting night.

FRIDAY, NOV. 24 TULANE 29, UTSA 16 NEW ORLEANS (YULMAN STADIUM)

NEW ORLEANS — Frank Harris accounted for 226 yards of offense but No. 18 Tulane took advantage of five UTSA turnovers in a 29-16 victory in American Athletic Conference action on Friday afternoon at Yulman Stadium.

Tulane struck first thanks to an interception deep in UTSA territory when a tipped pass was grabbed by Bailey Despanie at the 10-yard line. Three plays later, Michael Pratt found Chris Brazzell II open over the middle for a 7-yard touchdown pass.

The Roadrunners responded with a touchdown of their own off a turnover. Ligon's strip-sack forced a fumble that was scooped up by Donyai Taylor and returned 19 yards to the Green Wave 30-yard line. Two plays later, Rocko Griffin dashed untouched 23 yards to the end zone to help knot the score at 7-all.

UTSA took a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter when Chase Allen split the uprights from 40 yards.

Tulane tied things up again on a 47-yard field goal by Valentino Ambrosio. He later connected from 26 yards to give the Green Wave a 13-10 advantage with 5:40 left until halftime.

Tulane took advantage of another takeaway to push its lead to 20-10 with 3:27 remaining in the half after a 2-yard TD rush by Makhhi Hughes.

Ambrosio added another field goal as time expired in the half to provide a 13-point edge for the Green Wave.

Following a scoreless third quarter, both teams traded touchdowns in the final frame. Tulane claimed a 29-10 lead after a 3-yard TD catch by Brazzell with a little more than five minutes remaining.

Harris hit Oscar Cardenas on a 9-yard touchdown pass with 1:33 left to cap a 14-play, 75-yard drive, but the two-point conversion attempt failed and Tulane recovered the ensuing onside kick to seal the win.

2016 NEW MEXICO BOWL Saturday, Dec. 17 New Mexico 23, UTSA 20 Albuquerque, N.M. (University Stadium)

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) — Richard McQuarley ran for two short touchdowns and New Mexico posted its second bowl victory in a half-century, topping UTSA, 23-20, on Saturday in the Gildan New Mexico Bowl.

The Lobos' only bowl win since taking the 1961 Aviation Bowl had been a 2007 victory against Nevada in the New Mexico Bowl.

New Mexico (9-4) gave head coach Bob Davie his first bowl win, as he lost three times at Notre Dame and also last year with New Mexico in this bowl against Arizona.

Jarveon Williams ran for 125 yards for the Roadrunners (6-7), who lost in their first bowl appearance in the program's six-year history.

Despite the hype around New Mexico's triple-option threat and the Lobos leading the nation in rushing, the Roadrunners ran for more yards than the Lobos.

Lamar Jordan rushed for 81 yards and threw a 34-yard pass to Dameon Gamblin that set up McQuarley's 1-yard burst for a 23-13 lead with 2:22 left.

Dalton Sturm threw two TD passes for UTSA to match the program's single-season record of 20, including a 4-yard toss to JaBryce Taylor with 25 seconds remaining, but the Roadrunners failed to recover an onside kick.

Six Lobos combined for 219 yards rushing, which was nearly 142 yards below their FBS-leading 360.9-yards-per-game average, and UTSA held them to a season-low 296 yards.

However, New Mexico was able to keep the Roadrunners big-play receivers mostly in check amid windy conditions that saw gusts of nearly 30 miles per hour throughout the contest.

2020 FIRST RESPONDER BOWL Saturday, Dec. 26 #16 Louisiana 31, UTSA 24 Dallas, Texas (Gerald J. Ford Stadium)

DALLAS — Frank Harris passed for 208 yards and two touchdowns and ran for 91 yards and another score, but No. 16 Louisiana rode a strong ground game to hold on for a 31-24 victory in the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl on Saturday at Gerald J. Ford Stadium.

Harris completed 13 of 21 passes to lead an offense that piled up 431 yards with 223 coming on the ground. Sincere McCormick totaled 122 yards on 23 carries to move back into the national lead with 1,467 rushing yards and also surpass Jarveon Williams' UTSA career rushing yardage record.

Meanwhile, Zakhari Franklin led all receivers with five catches for 115 yards and a TD — his fourth 100-yard game this season — to help UTSA (7-5) mount a wild comeback in the second half against the Ragin' Cajuns (10-1), who were led by Elijah Mitchell's 127 rushing yards.

Trailing 24-7 early in the third quarter, the Roadrunners reeled off 17 unanswered points to tie the game early in the fourth.

UTSA started the rally after turning a fumble that was forced by De'Marco Guidry and recovered by Trevor Harmanson at the 40-yard line into points. Harris had a 15-yard run that helped set up a 29-yard touchdown pass to Franklin. The Cedar Hill High School product's seventh TD catch of the season helped pull the Roadrunners back to within 10.

The Harris-to-Franklin connection worked again on the Roadrunners' next possession, as the two hooked up for a 52-yard pass play that helped set up a 10-yard TD pass from Harris to Joshua Cephus, which pulled the sophomore into a tie atop the program's single-season receptions list. Duplessis' PAT made it 24-21 with 4:09 left in the third.

Duplessis split the uprights from 20 yards early in the fourth to knot the score at 24-all. The senior's 17th field goal of the year capped a nine-play, 82-yard march that was keyed by a 29-yard run from McCormick that put the sophomore from Converse Judson over the century mark for the seventh time this season and 10th for his career.

Louisiana reclaimed the lead midway through the final frame on a 1-yard TD plunge by Trey Ragas. The PAT made it 31-24 with 7:16 left to play.

UTSA made its way into Louisiana territory once again, but facing a 4th-and-7 at the 35 with 4:40 left, an incomplete pass turned it over on downs.

2021 FRISCO BOWL Tuesday, Dec. 21 #24 San Diego State 38, UTSA 24 Frisco, Texas (Toyota Stadium)

FRISCO, Texas — No. 24 San Diego State scored 17 unanswered points over the midway point of the game to erase a 14-7 deficit and cruise to a 38-24 victory over No. 24/25 UTSA in the Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl on Tuesday night at Toyota Stadium.

Under the direction of Conference USA Coach of the Year Jeff Traylor, the shorthanded Roadrunners saw their most successful season in the program's 11-year history come to an end in their second straight bowl appearance, finishing with a 12-2 record for the most wins and best winning percentage by any UTSA team.

The Aztecs (12-2) rode the right arm of quarterback Lucas Johnson, who completed 24 of 36 passes for 333 yards and three touchdowns to lead SDSU to 489 yards of offense on the night. Jesse Matthews had 11 receptions for 175 yards and a pair of scores and Greg Bell rushed for 101 yards and a TD on 26 carries.

Playing without more than a dozen regulars, UTSA took an early lead before the Aztecs reeled off 10 unanswered points to close the first half with a three-point lead and then push their advantage to 17 after a score on the first drive of the second half.

Brady rushed for 76 yards and a TD on 16 carries while Clark hauled in six passes for 72 yards to help pace the UTSA offense.

Defensively, Denzel Feaster and Jamal Ligon posted eight tackles apiece, while Ken Robinson and Antonio Parks pitched in with seven and six, respectively.

2022 CURE BOWL Friday, Dec. 16 No. 23 Troy 18, #22 UTSA 12 Orlando, Florida (Exploria Stadium)

ORLANDO, Fla. — Trey Moore posted 3.5 tackles for loss and a pair of sacks and Kevorian Barnes rushed for 132 yards, but No. 22 UTSA committed five turnovers as 23rd-ranked Troy rallied for an 18-12 victory on Friday in the Duluth Trading Cure Bowl at Exploria Stadium.

The loss snapped the Roadrunners' 10-game winning streak and dropped them to 11-3 on the season and 0-4 all-time in bowl games.

Moore totaled six tackles and the Smithson Valley High School product finished his redshirt freshman campaign with 18 TFLs to break Marcus Davenport's previous single-season school record of 17.5. He and Trevor Harmanson paced UTSA in stops to help the defense hold the Trojans (12-2) to 166 yards of offense. Jamal Ligon added five tackles, including 1.5 for a loss and a sack, as the Roadrunners totaled 14 TFLs and a program record-tying six sacks.

Meanwhile, Barnes led a ground game that churned out 147 yards with his fifth 100-yard output of his redshirt freshman season. The San Augustine, Texas, native finished the year with 845 yards, the second-most by a freshman in school history.

The Roadrunners held a 12-0 lead but Troy held UTSA scoreless over the final 36 minutes and 21 seconds to pull out the comeback win.

UTSA got on the board first with its first safety since 2018 after the Troy center snapped the ball early and through the back of the end zone at the 3:58 mark of the opening period.

The Roadrunners then marched 75 yards on 15 plays, capped by a 2-yard touchdown pass from Frank Harris to Zakhari Franklin. Jared Sackett's extra point made it 9-0 with 12:30 left in the second stanza. Six minutes later, the senior kicker split the uprights from 42 yards to push the UTSA advantage to 12-0.

Troy took advantage of three UTSA penalties that extended a drive in the final minutes of the first half, pulling to within 12-7 after a 2-yard TD plunge by Kimani Vidal with 50 seconds on the clock.

The Trojans took their first lead of the day late in the third quarter after coming up with their fifth takeaway, as a 61-yard interception return by KJ Robertson set up a 12-yard TD pass from Gunnar Watson to RaJae Johnson. Watson then hit Clayton Ollendieck for a successful two-point conversion attempt to make it 15-12 at the 2:43 mark of the third.

Troy tacked on three more points with a 27-yard field goal at the 9:18 mark of the fourth quarter.

UTSA threatened to reclaim the lead when Barnes broke loose for a 53-yard dash down the right sideline to the 3-yard line. However, Troy held stiff by forcing an incompletion on fourth down to help seal the win.

Harris finished 23 of 42 for 198 yards and a TD for UTSA, completing eight passes to Franklin for 41 yards and seven to Chris Carpenter for 59 yards.
