TULANE INJURY NOTABLES

- After missing five games from Jan. 6-24, Tulane starting guard Kyren Whittington returned to the floor on Jan. 28 and led the team with 14 points in nearly 22 minutes off the bench.
- The team earlier lost expected starting guard Kierra Middleton for the season to an injury sustained during the first game of the season against Stetson on Nov. 6.
- Kaylah Rainey, after missing games on Jan. 2 and Jan. 6, returned to play in each of the last three games and tied for the team lead with five assists against Rice on Jan. 20.

A LOOK AT THE RECORD BOOK

- Irina Parau is quickly moving up the career record books for games played.
- She has now played in 138 games in her career to rank fifth all-time.
- She is three from reaching Krystal Freeman for fourth.
- Hannah Pratt's eight threes against ECU on Jan. 13 are tied for the second-most in school history behind the nine made by current Tulane television color commentator Tiffany Aidoo during the 2011 campaign.
- Her eight threes are the most for the program since the 2013 season.

SLOWER START THAN TYPICAL IN LEAGUE PLAY

- Tulane is 1-7 in conference play this season for the first time since the 2007-08.
- This is only the fifth time since 1989 that the program has won 1 or fewer of the first eight conference games (1-7 in 2023-24, 1-7 in 2007-08, 1-7 in 2003-04, 1-7 in 1990-91 and 1-7 in 1989-90).
- Tulane's seven conference losses this season are already as many or more than the team had in 22 different seasons since 1994.

LOSING STREAK NOTABLES

- Tulane enters the week having lost a season-low four consecutive games with all the games being AAC contests.
- The four straight losses is the longest losing streak since the program also lost four consecutive games from Jan. 25 - Feb. 9 of last year.
- The current four-game losing streak is only the 13th time since 1994 (a span of 922 games) that the program has lost four or more consecutive games.
- Tulane's opponents in league play are a combined 38-27 in AAC contests and sport an overall mark of 96-65 so far this season.
- The only Green Wave opponent that is currently below .500 overall this season in conference play is Wichita State at 6-15 overall with a 2-7 mark in AAC contests

- Charlotte has raced out to an 12-8 record and 5-3 mark in the AAC in their first year as part of the conference.
- The 49ers have lost three of the last four games after starting league with four straight wins.
- The program fell to Tulsa at home on Jan. 27 by an 65-55 score.
- Dazia Lawrence leads the team at 17.7 points per game.
- She also has a team-high 39 steals.
- Lawrence has been even better once league play started as she is averaging 20 points per game.
- Tracey Hueston is also averaging in double figures on the season at 13.10 points per game.
- In league-only play, she has upped her points per game to 15.1
- Keanna Rembert is picking up 7.4 points and 5.4 rebounds per game.
- Rembert leads the team in rebounds with 107.
- Olivia Porter has a team-high 59 assists.
- Charlotte and Tulane have six common opponents as the 49ers defeated Mercer 65-58 on Nov. 29 and North Texas on Dec. 31, 74-64, before beating South Florida 66-61 on Jan. 3 and Rice 61-54 on Jan. 11 and then losing to Temple, 73-68, on Jan. 21 and Tulsa 65-55 on Jan. 27.
- Cara Consuegra is in her 13th year leading the program and is the school's all-time wins leader.

SERIES HISTORY – CHARLOTTE

- Tulane leads the all-time series with Charlotte 15-10.
- The first game of the series was a 63-41 victory by the 49ers over the Green Wave in 1992.
- Charlotte won the last two games of the series including a 66-64 victory earlier this month on Jan. 17.
- The 49ers have won five of the last six meetings between the schools.
- The longest streak of victories was by Tulane as they won 12 in a row from 1995-2002.

SCOUTING THE ROAD RUNNERS

- UTSA is 10-9 on the season including a mark of 4-4 in AAC play.
- The team lost to SMU, 78-55, on Jan. 27.
- The Road Runners have lost two in a row after winning four straight conference games.
- Alysia Porter was named the AAC's Freshman of the Week on Jan. 22
- Elyssa Coleman leads a balanced attack with her average of 11.4 points and 7.5 rebounds per game.
- Coleman is also the leading shot blocker with 30.
- Kyra White is also putting up 11.3 points and 5.9 rebounds per game.
- White also leads the team with 97 assists.
- Sidney Love is also reaching double figures at 10.7 points per game.
- She also leads the club with 25 steals.

- The streak is the longest in the history of the series as UTSA won the first two games in 1987 and 1991.
- This will be the third straight game hosted by UTSA in the series.

LAST TIME OUT

- Tulane fell to Temple at home on Jan. 28 by a 68-50 margin.
- Kyren Whittington made her return from injury and led the team with 14 points on 6-for-7 shooting.
- Amira Mabry also reached double figures with 10 points.
- Irina Parau totaled 12 rebounds including five offensive boards for Tulane.
- The program was limited to 33.3 percent shooting from the field and 10 percent from three-point range.

- Tulane had a 15-point lead in the third quarter and held a 10-point advantage midway through the fourth before seeing North Texas storm back to tie the game in regulation and then outscore the Green Wave 10-3 in the extra period.
- The meeting with UNT was the first for the program since 2014.
- The loss was the first for Tulane this season when they took a lead heading to the fourth quarter.
- The loss dropped Tulane's record to 0-5 when the opponent scores 70 or more points in a game.
- The loss was the second for Tulane when outshooting the opposition from three-point range (27.3 percent vs. 19 percent).
- Tulane's lone victory in a road or neutral site game this season came against Mercer on Nov. 19 in the first game away from home.
- The overtime game was the first for the Green Wave since Dec. 7, 2022 when the team defeated Troy in double overtime.
- The loss to North Texas in overtime was the first for the Green Wave since falling to Wichita State on the road in March 2022.
- UNT's Tommisha Lampkin was the first opposing player to get 15 or more rebounds against Tulane since Feb. 28, 2023 when Jillian Haynes of Cincinnati also snagged 15 rebounds.
- Marta Galic led Tulane with 21 points for her third time scoring 20+ this season and the ninth time that a Tulane player has done it (Kyren Whittington 4x, Marta Galic 3x, Hannah Pratt 1x and Amira Mabry 1x).
- Hannah Pratt (16 points) and Amira Mabry (14 points) also reached double figures in the contest.

- Tulane started the week with a 66-64 loss to Charlotte on the road on Jan. 17
- The loss dropped Tulane's record to 15-10 against Charlotte in the first meeting between the schools since 2019.
- The 49ers have won two in a row and five of the last six meetings with Tulane.
- Amira Mabry scored a career-high 23 points against Charlotte.
- It was her first 20+ performance of her career.
- She also led the team in rebounding.
- Marta Galic scored 19 points against the 49ers.
- Chiara Grattini totaled eight points and career-highs of eight assists and four steals against Charlotte.
- As a team, Tulane shot 46 percent from the field, 40.9 percent from three-point range and 81.8 percent from the free throw.
- The game marked Tulane's first loss of the season when shooting 40 percent or better from three-point range.
- The game was also Tulane's first loss when outshooting the opponent (46 percent from Tulane vs. 43.9 percent for Charlotte).



- The Green Wave lost to Rice at home by a 61-44 margin on Jan. 20.
- The loss dropped Tulane to 17-13 all-time to the Owls in the first meeting between the schools since 2014.
- The loss ended Tulane's four-game winning streak over Rice.
- The win by Rice at Tulane was the first for their program since 2011 and first win against Tulane since 2012.
- Lisa Stockton is now 12-8 all-time against Rice.
- Tulane's two free throw attempts in the game were the lowest number of attempts for the program since also only having two attempts against Memphis during the 2017 season.
- Amira Mabry led the team with 14 points and seven rebounds.
- It was her eighth time in double figures this season and the eighth time she led the team in rebounding.

- Hannah Pratt became the third member of the team recognized by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSWA) on Jan. 16 as it's Women's Basketball Player of the Week.
- Pratt was honored for averaging 26 points and seven rebounds a game, while shooting 52.9 percent from the field, 53.3 percent from three-point range in leading Tulane to a 81-55 victory over ECU.
- Pratt nearly broke the school record for threes with eight against the Pirates

PRATT HONORED BY AAC

- For the fourth time this season a Tulane player was honored by the league office as Hannah Pratt was selected for the Weekly Honor Roll by the American Athletic Conference (AAC) on Jan. 15.
- Pratt was recognized for averaging 26 points and seven rebounds a game, while shooting 52.9 percent from the field, 53.3 percent from three-point range in leading Tulane to a 81-55 victory over ECU.
- Pratt nearly broke the school record for threes with eight against the Pirates

WEEK 9 - ECU NOTABLES

- Tulane defeated East Carolina 81-55 on Jan. 13 to end a three-game losing streak.
- Hannah Pratt had a near historic shooting night in hitting eight threes.
- Her eight threes are tied for the second-best in the school record books behind the nine from Tiffany Aidoo in 2011.

- Her eight threes are the most for the program since the 2013 season when Danielle Bragg hit eight against Marshall.
- The eight threes were tied for the eighth-most ever in the AAC.
- Pratt scored a career-high 26 points in the win.
- Her 26 points are tied for the most scored by a Tulane player this season along with Kyren Whittington's 26 against Virginia Tech (11/25/23).
- Pratt also grabbed her 500th career rebound between her time at Columbia and Tulane in the victory over ECU on Jan. 13.
- Amira Mabry recorded her first career double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds.
- It was the team's second double-double of the season after Irina Parau's against Nicholls on Nov. 8.
- ECU was held to 55 points in the game and it was the sixth time that Tulane has held an opponent below 60 points this season.
- Tulane's 13 made threes were tied for the fourth-best in school history.
- It was the third time that Tulane has made 12 or more threes in a game this season.
- Tulane's 44 rebounds were a season-high
- The home team in the Tulane - ECU series have won each of the last 10 home games with Tulane winning seven straight at Devlin over the Pirates.
- The 26-point victory was the program's largest in league play since Jan. 20, 2021 against Temple (80-44).
- The 25+ win against ECU was Tulane's third such victory this season.
- The win was the 650th in the coaching career of Lisa Stockton.

- She was one of four players in double figures in the contest for the Green Wave along Marta Galic (18), Amira Mabry (13) and Irina Parau (11).
- Galic recorded a career-high six assists in the contest.
- The win was sixth straight for Tulane in the series and the 13th victory in the last 14 games against the Privateers since 1994.
- The victory improved Coach Stockton to 46-3 all-time against opponents from the Southland Conference.
- Tulane's 27 assists were tied for the seventh-most ever in a single game for the program.
- The Green Wave's 14 made threes were the second-most in program history.

- It was her 11th career game with 20 or more points.
- Hannah Pratt totaled 16 points including four made threes.

- The two losses to Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) programs dropped Tulane to 35-56 all-time against the current members in that league.

- Following the action at the Cayman Islands Classic, Hannah Pratt was named to the All-Tournament Team on Nov. 25
- For the two games, Pratt averaged 15.5 points per game while totaling eight rebounds, two steals and two blocks.
- She hit seven threes while shooting 38.9 percent from the field.

WHITTINGTON HONORED

- Kyren Whittington was recognized by the AAC Office on Nov. 20 and named to the AAC's Weekly Honor Roll.
- Whittington averaged 15.5 points per game, while shooting 42.1 percent from the field, 50 percent from three-point range and 75 percent from the free throw line in leading Tulane to a 2-0 record from Nov. 13-19.
- She is the first Tulane player recognized by the AAC with a weekly honor since Feb. 27 of last season when she also earned the honor.

- Tulane defeated Prairie View A&M by a 71-46 score at home on Nov. 14.
- Kyren Whittington led the team with her 20 points.
- It was her 10th career 20 point or more game.

- Amira Mabry had a career day with a near double-double of 14 points and nine rebounds.
- Marta Galic chipped in with 12 points.
- Tulane shot a season-high 50 percent from three-point range (12-for-24).
- The team's defense allowed a season-low 46 points and limited the Panthers to

just 14 points over the final 20 minutes of action.

- Tulane defeated Mercer 64-58 in the team's first road contest of the season in Macon, Georgia on Nov. 19.

- The Green Wave are 26-4 under Coach Stockton since 1994 in season openers and 28-2 in home openers.
- The last time that the Green Wave lost a season opener was on Nov. 19, 2004 at Howard, 67-59.

- The Green Wave will be replacing the top scorer in Dynah Jones (12.6 pts per game) and the leader in assists in Rachel Hakes (153)
- Those key contributors plus Anijah Grant and Kahia Warmseley accounted for 978 points, 477 rebounds, and 308 assists a season ago.

KEEP IT IN LOUISIANA

- The Green Wave have made it a habit of keeping talent in the state of Louisiana.
- Tulane currently has two players and four staff members who hail from Louisiana.
- Kyren Whittington and Jaylee Womack are both from Louisiana.
- The staff features four members from the state in Alan Frey, Olivia Grayson, Janet Butler and Moon Ursin.

OVERSEAS CONNECTION

- The 2023-24 Tulane roster boasts three players from overseas in graduate student Marta Galic, redshirt senior Irina Parau, and redshirt junior Chiara Grattini.
- Parau, a native of Romania, joined the Green Wave in 2019 and has appeared in 138 games in the Olive and Blue while averaging 3.7 points and 3.6 rebounds per game in her career.
- Grattini, a native of Italy, joined the Olive and Blue in 2020 and has appeared in 48 games.
- Galic, a native of Croatia, joined Tulane prior to the 2021 season and is averaging 9.9 points and 4.9 rebounds in 70 games with the Green Wave.

NEW ARRIVALS

- Tulane added three signees during the early signee period in November 2023 in Ana Baker, Kendall Sneed and Karma Wynn
- Baker is a 6'1 shooting guard from Vandegrift High School in Texas
- Sneed is 5'9" guard from Hardin-Jefferson High School in Texas
- Wynn is a 5'4" guard out of Pelham High School in Alabama
- All three guards will be on the 2024-25 roster.

WINNINGEST WOMEN'S COACH IN LOUISIANA

- In her 30-year stint with the Green Wave, head coach Lisa Stockton has tallied 587 victories making her the winningest women's college basketball coach in Louisiana.
- Stockton surpassed former Louisiana Tech head coach Leon Barmore for the record in Tulane's 65-54 win over Cincinnati on Feb. 18, 2023

MORE THAN A QUARTER CENTURY WITH COACH

- Now in her 30th year with the Green Wave women's basketball program in 2023-24 it's hard to imagine anyone else at the helm besides Coach Lisa Stockton.
- Her numbers are staggering: three different conferences, five conference tournament championships, four conference regular-season championships, seven All-Americans, 11 NCAA Tournament berths, 10 WNIT spots and 586 wins.
- No one in the history of Tulane women's basketball is even close to Stockton's

career numbers.

STOCKTON THE LEGEND

- Tulane head coach Lisa Stockton has amassed 650 NCAA wins in her 33-year coaching career.
- This number currently ranks 14th among all active Division I women's coaches. She also has the most wins of any coach in the AAC.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Tulane finished the 2022-23 season with an 11-6 mark at Fogelman B. Arena in the Devlin Fieldhouse.
- The Green Wave outscored its opponents 69.6-55.5 and won the rebound battle 39.7-32.8 in the friendly confines in Uptown.
- The program ended the year on a two-game winning streak at home.
- Tulane has started the 2023-24 season with a 7-4 record at home.
- Since head coach Lisa Stockton took over as the leader of the program, prior to the start of the 1994-95 campaign, Tulane is 335-127 (72.5%) in home games.
- The program has only finished with an under .500 record at home only once in the last 29 years plus has 11 seasons with three or fewer losses in home games.

POST-SEASON APPEARANCE

- Tulane is coming off a season that saw the program go 18-14 overall with a post-season WNIT appearance against Auburn.
- The WNIT appearance was the third consecutive for the program and the 22nd post-season appearance overall under the leadership of Coach Stockton.
- It was the 16th time in the last 18 years that Coach Stockton had finished at .500 or better.

STOCKTON IN HER 30TH SEASON AT TULANE

- The 2023-24 season marks Coach Stockton's 30th season leading the Green Wave. In her 29 previous seasons, Stockton has finished with a winning record 24 times including 20 or more victories 17 times.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS IN STATE

- The program went 3-1 last season against in-state competition with the only loss coming to eventual NCAA National Champion LSU in 2022-23.
- Overall, since 1994-95, Tulane sports a 77-25 record against schools based in the state.

STOCKTON ELECTED TO CONFERENCE USA HALL OF FAME

- Coach Stockton was elected to the 2023 Conference USA Hall of Fame Class. She amassed a record of 397-193 (67.2%) in her 19 years leading Tulane in Conference USA.
- Her 397 wins were most in the league during her time in CUSA. Coach Stockton becomes the fourth member of Tulane inducted into the CUSA Hall of Fame and the second Green Wave coach to earn the honor.
