« OPENING DRIVE »

- UTSA and Texas State will renew the I-35 Showdown on Saturday in San Marcos in a series the Roadrunners lead, 5-0.
- The Roadrunners scored a 20-13 victory over the Bobcats in the last meeting on Sept. 9, 2023, at the Alamodome.
- UTSA won both previous games played in San Marcos, posting a 44-14 victory on Sept. 23, 2017, and a 51-48 triumph in double overtime on Sept. 12, 2020, in what was head coach Jeff Traylor's UTSA debut.
- Jeff Traylor coached Texas State head coach G.J. Kinne during his senior year (2006) at Gilmer High School.
- The Roadrunners are 35-20 all-time and 15-4 under Jeff Traylor against teams from the state of Texas.
- UTSA is 7-6 all-time in road openers, including 3-1 in the Jeff Traylor era, which includes the 51-48 double-overtime win over Texas State in 2020.
- Jeff Traylor is in his fifth season at UTSA and boasts a 40-14 overall record, the most wins and best winning percentage (.741) in program history.
- UTSA improved to 10-4 all-time in season openers and 24-3 (.889) at home under Jeff Traylor with the 28-16 victory over Kennesaw State last Saturday at the Alamodome, the program's 50th home win.
- The Roadrunners have won nine of their last 10 games dating back to last October.
- UTSA has won nine or more games in each of the past three seasons.

SETTING THE SCENE

UTSA and Texas State will renew the I-35 Showdown on Saturday, Sept. 7, in San Marcos. Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. at UFCU Stadium and the game will be televised nationally on ESPNU. The Roadrunners have won all five previous meetings with the Bobcats, including a 20-13 victory last year at the Alamodome and a 51-48 double-overtime thriller in 2020 in what was head coach Jeff Traylor's UTSA debut. The Roadrunners are coming off a 28-16 home win over Kennesaw State in the season opener last Saturday. The Bobcats outlasted Lamar, 34-27, in their 2024 debut last Saturday night in San Marcos.

TUNING IN

Saturday's game will be televised nationally on ESPNU and it also will be available via the ESPN mobile app. Doug Sherman (play-by-play) and Tyoka Jackson (analyst) will call the action. UTSA Sports Media Network will air the game live in the San Antonio area on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at ticket760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Ed Suarez (reporter) have the call. There will be a two-hour pregame show hosted by Pat Evans and a 45-minute postgame show.

LAST TIME OUT

Owen McCown passed for 340 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another and UTSA held Kennesaw State to 253 total yards in a 28-16 season-opening win last Saturday in front of 25,911 fans at the Alamodome. The Roadrunners notched their 50th all-time home victory and improved to 24-3 in San Antonio under fifthyear head coach Jeff Traylor, who ran his overall record to 40-14. Making his second start as a Roadrunner, McCown directed three first-half scoring drives that helped UTSA build a 21-3 lead over the Owls in the first meeting between the two teams. The redshirt sophomore connected with 10 different pass-catchers, led by Devin McCuin, who caught a career-high 11 balls for 79 yards and two TDs. Willie McCoy had four receptions for 59 yards with a long of 45, Patrick Overmyer and Houston Thomas had three catches apiece for 31 and 28 yards, respectively, and Oscar Cardenas surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards with a pair of grabs for 38 yards and a TD. Meanwhile, the defense was near-dominant at times, holding the Owls' dangerous ground game to only 51 rushing yards and a 1.3 yards-percarry average. The Roadrunners racked up 10 tackles for loss, including three sacks with one apiece by Jimmori Robinson, Martavius French and James Walley Jr. Ken Robinson led UTSA with seven tackles and a TFL, while Owen Pewee and Elliott Davison made six and five stops, respectively.

SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

With the 28-16 home victory over Kennesaw State last Saturday, UTSA improved to 10-4 all-time in season openers and 4-1 in season openers that have occurred at the Alamodome. The lid-lifter against Kennesaw State marked just the second time in the last five years and fifth time overall that the Roadrunners opened a season at home.

ROADRUNNERS STAY HOT IN AUGUST

UTSA remained undefeated in the month of August with the 28-16 season-opening victory over Kennesaw State last Saturday at the Alamodome. This marked the fourth August game and the first since 2019 when the Roadrunners beat UIW, 35-7, on Aug. 31 at the Alamodome. The Roadrunners also defeated New Mexico, 21-13, on

Aug. 31, 2013, in Albuquerque and they scored a 27-7 road triumph over Houston on Aug. 29, 2014, in what stands as the earliest date that UTSA has played a game. Additionally, the Roadrunners were scheduled to play the 2012 season opener at South Alabama on Aug. 29, but that game was moved to Sept. 1 due to Hurricane Isaac's impacts on the Mobile area.

HOME SWEET DOME

UTSA has been tough to beat at the Alamodome during the Jeff Traylor era. The Roadrunners have won 22 of their last 24 home contests and are 24-3 (.889) at the facility since his arrival prior to the 2020 season. UTSA reeled off a school-record 10-game win streak at home that started with a 27-26 victory over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020, and ran through the 49-41 win against WKU in the 2021 Conference USA Championship Game before it was snapped in triple overtime against No. 24 Houston in the 2022 season opener. The Roadrunners have won 12 of the last 13 at home and are 50-30 (.625) all-time in the Alamodome.

SCOUTING TEXAS STATE

The Bobcats outlasted Lamar, 34-27, in their season opener last Saturday night in San Marcos. Jordan McCloud passed for 238 yards and three touchdowns and Ismail Mahdi rushed for 156 yards to lead an offensive output of 486 yards. The defense held the Cardinals to 288 total yards and 51 on the ground. Kalil Alexander, Ben Bell and Tunmise Adeleye each had 1.5 sacks to pace the unit. Head coach G.J. Kinne is in his second season at the helm after guiding the Bobcats to an 8-5 record and a 45-21 win over Rice in the First Responder Bowl in 2023.

FAMILIAR FACE

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor will see a familiar face across the field on Saturday at UFCU Stadium. Texas State head coach G.J. Kinne played quarterback under Traylor as a senior at Gilmer High School in 2006, helping lead the Buckeyes to a 10-0 record and the district title. The two also worked together on the same staffs in 2017 at SMU and in 2018 at Arkansas.

SERIES HISTORY

This will mark the sixth meeting between UTSA and Texas State on the gridiron. The Roadrunners have won all five previous matchups with the Bobcats. The I-35 Showdown has been contested twice before in San Marcos with UTSA posting a 44-14 victory on Sept. 23, 2017, and a 51-48 triumph in double overtime on Sept. 12, 2020, in what was head coach Jeff Traylor's UTSA debut.

LAST MEETING

Frank Harris passed for 214 yards and UTSA limited Texas State to 242 total yards in a 20-13 victory over Texas State in front of 49,342 fans on Sept. 9, 2023, at the Alamodome. Harris fought back from an injury in the second quarter to complete 26 of 37 passes for 214 yards and a touchdown and help the Roadrunners remain perfect against Texas State in five meetings. Kevorian Barnes rushed for 103 yards on 26 carries, Tykee Ogle-Kellogg grabbed six passes for 78 yards and Joshua Cephus added six catches for 38 yards, as UTSA piled up 372 yards of offense. UTSA's defense posted 10 total tackles for loss with seven sacks and limited the Bobcats to just 31 rushing yards in the win. The Roadrunners took a 10-0 lead in the first half only to see the Bobcats rally to tie things up by halftime. UTSA grabbed the lead for good when Willie McCoy made a highlight-reel catch on a 20-yard touchdown with 3:14 left to play in the third quarter.

WHO'S COUNTING?

Now in their 14th season of play, the Roadrunners will play the 161st game in program history on Saturday when they face Texas State in San Marcos. UTSA is 85-75 all-time and 34-42 in true road games, including a 15-8 mark under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor. By comparison, Texas State has played football since 1904 and has an all-time record of 565-523-33.

Everett also will host "The Jeff Traylor Radio Show", from 7-8 p.m. each Wednesday (subject to change) live from Chicken N Pickle (5215 UTSA Blvd.) beginning on Aug. 28. The show will air live on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at *Ticket*760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app.

IT'S A HOOT

The Roadrunners will face all four FBS teams that use the nickname Owls during the 2024 season. UTSA opened the campaign on Aug. 31 against the Kennesaw State Owls, who are making their debut in Conference USA this year. The Roadrunners also will meet three American Athletic Conference teams who are the Owls: Rice (Oct. 12), Florida Atlantic (Oct. 19) and Temple (Nov. 22).

TRAYLOR TABBED TOP AAC COACH BY ATHLON SPORTS

Athlon Sports picked UTSA's Jeff Traylor as its top head coach in the American Athletic Conference for the 2024 season. Traylor tops the list of the league's 14 head coaches as selected by senior college football writer and editor Steve Lassan. A two-time conference coach of the year, the Gilmer, Texas, native has led the Roadrunners to a 40-14 record in his first four seasons at the helm, the most wins and best winning percentage (.741) by a coach in program history. UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned four straight bowl berths and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls under his leadership. Under Traylor's guidance, UTSA student-athletes have collected awards and honors at a record-breaking pace. During his time in San Antonio, he has coached seven All-Americans, three national award finalists, 83 all-conference selections and a pair of NFL Draft picks. That success is not limited to just the gridiron. The Roadrunners also have received numerous honors for their work in the classroom during the Traylor tenure, including three College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, 12 CSC Academic All-District Selections and four conference all-academic team selections. Additionally, UTSA was one only 13 FBS programs to receive the 2023 AFCA Academic Achievement Award for graduation success.

BURKE CHOSEN FOR 40 UNDER 40 LIST

UTSA offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Justin Burke was chosen for the Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40, as the publication recognized 40 of the rising stars in the coaching ranks in the state of Texas. This marks the fourth consecutive year a UTSA coach has been honored, as Burke joins running backs coach/NFL liaison Julian Griffin (2021), associate head coach/pass game coordinator/wide receivers coach Joe Price (2023) and former co-offensive coordinator Will Stein (2022). A veteran of the UTSA staff since 2020, Burke is in his second season as the Roadrunners' offensive coordinator and his first coaching the quarterbacks. He served as associate head coach, special teams coordinator and tight ends coach during the 2022 regular season before being promoted to co-offensive coordinator for the Cure Bowl.

TRAYLOR TAKING ROADRUNNERS TO NEW HEIGHTS

Head coach Jeff Traylor has guided UTSA to new heights since taking over the program prior to the 2020 campaign. The Gilmer, Texas, native has turned around the program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, producing results on and off the field. Taking over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, he has led the Roadrunners to a 40-14 record through 54 games, the most wins all-time and best winning percentage (.741) by a UTSA head football coach. In the Jeff Traylor era, the Roadrunners are 24-3 (.889) at home, and they own a 27-4 (.871) record in regular season conference games and are 29-4 (.879) against league competition when including the 2021 and 2022 Conference USA Championship Games. Under Traylor's direction, UTSA has won back-to-back conference championships, has been nationally ranked in all three major polls in 2021 and 2022 and has played in a bowl game in each of his four seasons, including defeating Marshall, 35-17, in the 2023 Frisco Bowl for the program's first bowl win. The two-time conference coach of the year has coached eight All-Americans, three national award finalists, 13 national award semifinalists, seven conference superlative award recipients, 83 all-conference selections, two academic All-Americans and a pair of NFL Draft picks during his UTSA tenure. He was the 2021 AFCA Region 4 Coach of the Year and he has been a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year twice in addition to being a finalist for the 2022 Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year, 2021 AFCA National Coach of the Year and the 2021 George Munger College Coach of the Year.

HISTORY MADE IN FRISCO

The Roadrunners made history on Dec. 19, 2023, registering the school's first bowl win with a 35-17 victory over Marshall in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl. UTSA trailed 14-0 early in the contest but outscored the Thundering Herd, 35-3, the rest of the way to improve to 1-4 all-time in bowl games. The Roadrunners have made four consecutive bowl games and five appearances overall dating back to the 2016 New Mexico Bowl.

SEASON 14

One of the newest FBS programs and now in its second year as a member of the American Athletic Conference, UTSA is in its 14th season of football in 2024. The Roadrunners started their program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played their first season as an FCS Independent in 2011 before joining the Western Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign. UTSA moved into Conference USA in 2013 and became a full-fledged FBS member starting with

the 2014 season. The Roadrunners set NCAA modern startup program records in 2011 by drawing 56,743 fans to their inaugural game against Northeastern State and by averaging 35,521 fans for their six home contests that season. UTSA made its first postseason appearance at the 2016 New Mexico Bowl in its sixth season of play and registered its first win against a team from the Big 12 Conference the following season with a 17-10 victory over Baylor. The Roadrunners made history in 2021, opening the fall with a road win against Illinois of the Big Ten Conference, capturing their first conference championship with a 49-42 decision against WKU and capping a 12-2 ledger with their third bowl game. They repeated as league champions with a 48-27 win over North Texas in 2022 and made their third straight and fourth overall bowl appearance, ending the year with an 11-3 mark. Last fall, the Roadrunners notched their first bowl victory with a 35-17 decision over Marshall in the Frisco Bowl to cap a 9-4 ledger that include a 7-1 mark in their debut in The American. UTSA now has posted at least six wins in eight of the 13 full seasons in program history and it has reached the sevenwin plateau six times, including in each of the first four years of the Jeff Traylor era.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

UTSA is no stranger to close contests in the Jeff Traylor era, as 31 of the 54 have been one-score ballgames in the fourth quarter. The Roadrunners own a 22-9 record in those games. Dating back to the 2021 campaign, UTSA has seen 18 of the last 32 contests decided in the fourth quarter or later. Additionally, the Roadrunners are 13-4 (.765) in games decided by eight points or less since 2021, the most wins and top winning percentage among FBS teams who have played 15 or more one-score games during that stretch.

WORKING OVERTIME

UTSA is 5-3 all-time in overtime games. The Roadrunners had played just four overtime games during their first nine seasons, going 2-2 in those contests. UTSA has played in four more OT games in the Jeff Traylor era, going 3-1. In fact, the Roadrunners played three overtime games in 2022, defeating Army in one extra frame (41-38) and UAB in double OT (44-38) after dropping the season opener to Houston in triple overtime (37-35). Traylor made his UTSA debut with an overtime game, outlasting this week's opponent, Texas State, 51-48, in two extra periods.

HIGH-SCORING ROADRUNNERS

UTSA has emerged as one of the top scoring offenses in the FBS under head coach Jeff Traylor. In his second season at the helm in 2021, the Roadrunners set school records for scoring, tallying 516 total points in 14 contests for a program-record 36.9 points per game to rank 11th nationally. The following year, the Roadrunners came up just shy of the school record with 515 points in 14 games for an average of 36.8 per game, good for 14th in the FBS. UTSA scored 30-plus points in 12 of the 14 contests, and they topped the 40-point barrier seven times and the 50-point plateau twice. The Roadrunners scored 415 points in 13 games in 2023, good for an average of 31.9 per contest. In fact, those three seasons rank as the top three scoring totals and averages in program history. UTSA has scored 20-plus points in 42 of the last 46 games dating back to the 2020 campaign. The Roadrunners have tallied 1,813 points in 54 games under head coach Jeff Traylor, good for an average of 33.6 points per game.

EXPERIENCE UP FRONT

UTSA once again boasts one of the most experienced offensive lines in the FBS this fall. Entering the season, the Roadrunners owned a combined 238 career games played and 116 career starts

up front, figures that ranked seventh and 13th, respectively, among all FBS teams. After the season-opening win over Kennesaw State, those numbers have increased to 245 games and 121 starts. Redshirt junior Walker Baty has played in a team-high 38 games with 11 starts, while senior transfer CJ James Jr., who appears on the Rimington Trophy Watch List, paces the unit with 33 starts, 32 coming during his previous stops at New Mexico and Abilene Christian. Venly Tatafu totes 26 appearances and 21 starts, Makai Hart has 24 career starts in 25 games and junior Luke Lapeze has 27 games and 11 starts under his belt. Honorable mention all-conference performer Cory Godinet made 10 starts in 13 appearances last fall and earned the start at right guard in the opener. Transfers Kamar Missouri and Jaylen Garth started at both tackle spots against Kennesaw State and now have played in 20 and 10 games, respectively. Sixth-year senior Demetris Allen owns four starts in 20 career games as a Roadrunner, while Deandre Marshall has 17 games on his resumé, Buffalo Kruize has seen action in 13 contests and Ben Rios has played in four.

CARDENAS IS CLUTCH

Senior tight end Oscar Cardenas has developed a reputation for making clutch catches during his career. The San Antonio Brandeis High School product played a role in one of the iconic moments in program history, hauling in the game-winning TD reception after a tipped pass with three seconds left in the 34-31 home victory over UAB in 2021. He also had a 28-yard catch on that game-winning drive versus the Blazers to help the Roadrunners clinch the Conference USA West Division title. In 2022, Cardenas caught two balls in the opener against No. 24 Houston, including a key 25-yard reception that set up the game-tying field goal as time expired. He also made a one-handed grab and then hurdled a defender for a 35-yard play on the final drive of the 31-27 victory over North Texas to set up the game-winning touchdown pass on the following play. Last season, the John Mackey Award Watch List member caught 32 passes for 280 yards and a pair of touchdowns en route to third-team All-American Athletic Conference accolades. A sixth-year senior, Cardenas became the ninth Roadrunner and just the second tight end to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards after catching two passes for 38 yards and a touchdown in the 28-16 season-opening win over Kennesaw State. He now has 84 receptions for 1,035 yards and seven touchdowns in 58 career games as a Roadrunner.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER

The Roadrunners featured a three-headed monster in the backfield last season and that is expected to be the same in 2024. Running backs Kevorian Barnes, Rocko Griffin and Robert Henry combined to rush for 1,786 yards and 23 touchdowns on 365 attempts last fall. Barnes, a native of San Augustine, Texas, who earned a spot on this year's Doak Walker Award candidate list, paced the unit with 715 yards on 147 carries to go with six TDs, while Henry, who hails from Mississippi, tallied 588 yards and a team-best 11 TDs on 127 totes. Griffin, a Georgia native, rushed 91 times for 483 yards and six scores and averaged a team-best 5.3 yards per carry. The trio was responsible for 80% of the Roadrunners' rushing yards and 85% of their rushing TDs last fall. In the season-opening win over Kennesaw State, Henry rushed for 30 yards, Barnes added 22 and Griffin had 12 to pace the UTSA ground game.

MCCUIN EMERGES AS RECEIVING THREAT

UTSA wide receiver Devin McCuin emerged as one of the team's top receiving threats as a true freshman last year and he has started off his sophomore season on the right foot. The Jacksonville, Texas, native nearly broke a freshman record that has stood since UTSA's inaugural season in 2011, as he piled up 546 receiving yards and three touchdowns on 42 catches to come up only 32 yards shy of Kam Jones' freshman standard of 578. He had a 72-yard TD reception against Army that now ranks as the eighth-longest pass play in program history and he nearly notched his first career 100-yard game with 94 in the 49-34 win at Temple and again with 91 in the 49-21 home triumph over South Florida. McCuin opened the 2024 campaign with a career night, catching 11 passes — one shy of the school record and the second-best total in the FBS this fall — for 79 yards and two touchdowns in the 28-16 win over Kennesaw State.

BORN TO PLAY QB

UTSA redshirt sophomore Owen McCown was born to play quarterback. The lefthander is the son of Josh McCown, who was a third-round draft pick in 2002 and played 18 seasons in the NFL after a collegiate career at SMU and Sam Houston. Two of his uncles also played the position. Luke McCown starred at Louisiana Tech before he was selected in the fourth round of the 2004 NFL Draft and enjoyed a 12-year NFL career. Randy McCown played quarterback at Texas A&M from 1996-99, helping the Aggies to the 1998 Big 12 Conference Championship. Those three McCown brothers all played for UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor when he was an assistant coach at Jacksonville High School in the 1990s. Owen won the starting guarterback job coming out of training camp this season and he made the best of his second start as a Roadrunner. He completed 28 of 38 passes for 340 yards and three touchdowns and also ran for another score to help lead UTSA to a 28-16 victory over Kennesaw State last Saturday, earning Manning Award QB of the Week and American Athletic Conference Honorable Mention Player of the Week accolades for his performance. In his first start at UTSA last December, the transfer from Colorado threw for 251 yards and two TDs on 22-of-31 passing to help guide the Roadrunners to a 35-17 triumph over Marshall in the 2023 Frisco Bowl for the program's first-ever bowl win. He made a splash in his UTSA debut last September by breaking the school's single-game completion percentage record against No. 20 Tennessee, connecting on 18 of 20 passes (90%) for 170 yards and a pair of TDs.

SACK ATTACK

UTSA enjoyed a record-setting season in 2023 for tackles for loss and sacks, and the defense has started the 2024 season with the same impressive numbers. Last fall, the Roadrunners registered 99 tackles behind the line of scrimmage to eclipse the previous standard of 96 set in 2019. UTSA also shattered the program mark for sacks with 46, 13 more than the previous record established in 2021 with the benefit of one more game. The Roadrunners led the American Athletic Conference in both categories and they ranked second in the FBS in sacks per game (3.54) and fifth in

tackles for loss per contest (7.6). Individually, Jimmori Robinson returns after recording 11 TFLs, 4.5 sacks and a program-record 10 quarterback hurries. In the season-opening win over Kennesaw State, the Roadrunners racked up 10 tackles for loss, including a sack each by Robinson, Martavius French and James Walley Jr. That marked the fifth time UTSA has tallied double-digit TFLs in a game over the past two seasons and the ninth time to record three-plus sacks during that stretch.

TURNING THE TIDE FOR TAKEAWAYS

After going through the first three games of the 2023 season without a takeaway, the Roadrunners finished with 17 turnovers over the last 10 contests. UTSA tallied 10 interceptions, led by two apiece from Elliott Davison, Nicktroy Fortune and Kam Alexander, while the Roadrunners recovered seven fumbles, paced by two from Ronald Triplette. The Roadrunners will not have to wait four games for their first takeaway this season, as Jimmy Wyrick forced a key fumble that was recovered by Syrus Dumas in the fourth quarter of the 28-16 win over Kennesaw State last Saturday.

D-LINE DEPTH KEEPS ROADRUNNERS FRESH

UTSA has taken advantage of a deep defensive line room with a rotation aimed to keep players fresh throughout the game. The Roadrunners played at least nine d-linemen and as many as a dozen in three different games in 2023. UTSA rotated nine players up front in the 28-16 season-opening victory over Kennesaw State, as Brandon Brown, Jameian Buxton, Christian Clayton, Joe Evans, Tai Leonard, Chidera Otutu, Asyrus Simon, Ronald Triplette and Daemian Wimberly all saw action last Saturday. UTSA welcomed back eight players at the position who saw action last fall, led by veterans Brown, a member of the Outland Trophy Watch List, and Evans, who has earned a spot on watch lists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Shrine Bowl 1000, Reese's Senior Bowl. Brown logged 4.5 tackles for loss, two quarterback hurries and a sack en route to third-team all-conference honors in 2023. Evans posted 2.5 TFLs, a pair of sacks and a safety last season while also collecting third-team all-league accolades.

LINEBACKER LEADER

A starter at inside linebacker since he stepped foot on campus in 2020, Jamal Ligon has developed into one of the team leaders. The fifth-year senior from Tyler, Texas, who landed on this year's Shrine Bowl 1000 already owns the UTSA career mark for assisted tackles with 149 and is on pace to become the Roadrunners' all-time leader in total tackles, as he boasts 288 after logging three in the win over Kennesaw State. He now sits only 27 stops shy of Rashad Wisdom's school record of 315. The three-time all-conference selection also is on track to become the program's record holder in starts, as he now has 47, only nine short of the mark held by Joshua Cephus and Wisdom. Additionally, he set the school standard — as a true freshman — for total tackles in a game with 19 in a win over Middle Tennessee in 2020. Last season, Ligon posted 62 total tackles, 35 unassisted stops, seven tackles for loss, five quarterback hurries, one sack, one forced fumble and a pass breakup while earning honorable mention all-conference honors.

OURS (TAYLOR'S VERSION)

UTSA senior Donyai Taylor is following in the footsteps of former teammate and older brother, Dadrian, who started his career in 2018 and donned the number <code>seven</code> jersey for the 2020 through 2022 seasons as a standout at the Roadrunners' money backer position. Donyai, who has played the same spot as his sibling since his true freshman campaign in 2020, earned the coveted single-digit jersey in a vote by his teammates last season, choosing the same number <code>seven</code> that Dadrian wore. The younger brother and Shiner High School product, who will keep that number in 2024, started all 12 games last fall and registered 46 total tackles, <code>seven</code> tackles for loss, two sacks, six quarterback hurries, two pass breakups, a 78-yard interception return and a 19-yard fumble return en route to second-team All-American Athletic Conference honors.

STEADY SAFETIES

UTSA's secondary is led in part by the steady senior safety duo of Elliott Davison and Ken Robinson. Despite playing in only 12 of the 13 games

last fall, Robinson, a South Grand Prairie High School product, led the Roadrunners in total tackles with 66 to go along with four pass breakups and a quarterback hurry. Davison, a native of Tyler, registered 40 stops and a pair of interceptions, including one that was returned 76 yards, in his first season at UTSA after transferring from UIW. In the season-opening win over Kennesaw State last Saturday, Robinson paced the Roadrunners with seven stops, including one behind the line of scrimmage, while Davison made five tackles and broke up a pass to help UTSA limit the Owls to 253 total yards, including only 51 on the ground.

ALLEN'S AIM IS ACCURATE

Last fall, Chase Allen developed into a reliable place-kicker in his debut campaign with the Roadrunners that saw him earn second-team All-American Athletic Conference accolades. The transfer from Alabama made 13 of 15 field goals and all 49 extra-point attempts in 2023, as he led the league and ranked 14th in the FBS in field-goal percentage (.867). After not kicking in the opener versus Houston, he drilled 46- and 43-yard field goals in the 20-13 victory over Texas State, earning AAC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. The Colleyville Heritage High School graduate tied the school record with a 53-yard make in the 41-20 triumph over UAB on Oct. 14. His 13 made field goals put him sixth on UTSA's single-season list, while his 49 PATs rank third in program history. This season, Allen made all four extra-point tries in the season-opening win over Kennesaw State to continue the Roadrunners' stretch of consecutive PATs made to 200 — which is now tied with Tulane for the second-longest streak in the FBS — dating back to the win over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020.

CARPENTER MAKES HISTORY

UTSA junior Chris Carpenter has stamped his name in the school record book as one of the top returners in program history. In 2022, he brought back a kickoff 97 yards for a score against Texas Southern, the first kickoff return touchdown in program history. Last season, the Jacksonville, Texas, native returned a punt 50 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter of the 34-14 home triumph over Rice to become the first Roadrunner to record a punt and kickoff return for a TD. The punt return TD versus the Owls was the third in school annals, as he joined Kenny Harrison (79-yard TD vs. Texas State, 2012) and Sheldon Jones (76-yard return vs. Lamar in 2021). Carpenter finished 2023 ranked sixth in the league and 34th nationally in punt return average (6.8).

TV BIRDS

Saturday's game will air on ESPNU, marking 139 straight televised/ streamed appearances for the Roadrunners. The last UTSA game that was not broadcast was the 2012 season finale against Texas State.

A FOCUS ON RECRUITING TEXAS

UTSA's 118-man roster features 93 players — 79% — who hail from the state of Texas. Georgia and Mississippi stand second with four players apiece, while there are two each from Alabama, Florida and Louisiana. Arizona, Arkansas, Hawai'i, Iowa, Maryland, Massachusetts, Oregon, Tennessee and Virginia each have produced one current Roadrunner. Caile Hogan is the lone UTSA player from Australia and Cory Godinet is the first Roadrunner from American Samoa.

« KEEPING THEM HOME »

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor and his staff have placed an emphasis on recruiting the city of San Antonio and surrounding area. This year's roster includes 16 players from the San Antonio area.

Since his arrival in December 2019 head coach Jeff Traylor has instilled into the program his 210 Triangle Of Toughness — run the football, be physical on defense and be sound on special teams — and its Culture Pillars: Integrity, Passion, Mental & Physical Toughness, Selfless and Perfect Effort. As part of that culture, the players voted during fall camp on who would earn single-digit jersey numbers, a reward for representing mental and physical toughness on and off the field. The numbers 2, 1 and 0 — San Antonio's area code — were chosen for the players voted to represent the 210 Triangle of Toughness brand. Offensive linemen (51) CJ James Jr., (53) Cory Godinet, (75) Venly Tatafu and (77) Makai Hart also received the necessary votes but cannot change to a single-digit number due to their position.

BROTHERLY DUOS

UTSA is one of 30 FBS teams that have at least two sets of brothers. The Roadrunners list junior wide receiver Elliott Brow and junior cornerback Errionn Brow along with senior inside linebacker Fred Lewis and junior safety Jermarius Lewis. Colorado leads the way with six sets of brothers.

PRO 'RUNNERS

UTSA currently has three players on NFL active rosters and four on practice squads. Marcus Davenport became the first Roadrunner to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft when the Saints picked him 14th overall in 2018. The defensive end is in his first season with the Lions after spending 2023 on the Vikings roster. Tariq Woolen was selected by the Seahawks in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft. Now in his third season, the cornerback led the league with six interceptions and was a Pro Bowl selection as a rookie and has twice been voted by his peers to the NFL's Top 100 list. Spencer Burford was a fourth-round pick by the 49ers in 2022 and is in his third year as an offensive guard in San Francisco. Additionally, Joshua Cephus (Jaguars), Sincere McCormick (Raiders), Leroy Watson (Titans) and Rashad Wisdom (Buccaneers) are on practice squads.

UP NEXT

The Roadrunners will head to Austin to face No. 4 Texas on Saturday, Sept. 14. Kickoff is slated for 6 p.m. at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium and the game will be televised nationally on ESPN.

SATURDAY, Aug. 31 UTSA 26, KENNESAW STATE 16 SAN ANTONIO (ALAMODOME)

SAN ANTONIO — Owen McCown passed for 340 yards and three touchdowns and the UTSA defense held Kennesaw State to 253 total yards in a 28-16 win in the season opener on Saturday in front of 25,911 fans at the Alamodome.

With the win, the Roadrunners notched their 50th all-time home victory and improved to 24-3 in San Antonio under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor, who ran his overall record to 40-14.

Making his second start as a Roadrunner, McCown directed three first-half scoring drives that helped UTSA build a 21-3 lead over the Owls in the first meeting between the two teams. The redshirt sophomore connected with 10 different pass-catchers, led by Devin McCoin, who cought a career-high 11 balls for 79 yards and two TDs. Willie McCoy cought four passes for 59 yards with a long of 4.5, Patrick Overmyer and Houston Thomas had three receptions opiece for 31 and 28 yards, respectively, and Oscar Cardenas surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards with a pair of grabs for 38 yards.

Meanwhile, the defense was near-dominant at times, holding the Owls' dangerous ground game to only 51 rushing yards and a 1.3-yards-per-carry average. The Roadrunners racked up 10 tackles for loss, including three sacks with one apiece by Jimmori Robinson, Martavius French and James Walley Jr. Ken Robinson led UTSA with seven tackles and a TFL, while Owen Pewee and Elliott Davison made six and five stops, respectively.

UTSA marched 53 yards on the game's opening possession to put points on the board first. McCown completed passes for 16 yards to McCuin and 18 yards to Thomas on back-to-back plays to help set up a 2-yard TD pass to McCuin. Chase Allen's extra point made it 7-0.

The Owls answered with a 44-yard field goal by Austin Welch to cap a 44-yard drive that chewed 5:48 off the clock

The Roadrunners tacked on a second touchdown in the opening frame as McCown found paydirt on a 5-yard run to put an exclamation point on an 11-play, 75-yard march and gave the home side a 14-3 advantage. That drive was highlighted by a 29-yard reception from DI Allen.

McCown connected with McCuin again for a score early in the second stanza, this time on a 4-yard pass over the middle that extended the lead to 21-3. Robert Henry Jr.'s 61-yard reception down to the 6-yard line keyed the drive.

Welch drilled a 34-yard field in the final minute of the opening half to provide the 21-6 halftime margin

Welch hit his third field goal of the day with a 31-yarder at the 2:06 mark of a low-scoring third quarter that pulled the visitors within 21-9.

 $Kennes aw State \ made things \ interesting in the fourth quarter when Carson Kent hauled in a 25-yard touchdown pass over the middle. Welch's PAT pulled the Owls within five points with 9:23 remaining.$

UTSA put the game away when McCown found Cardenas wide open in the end zone on a 3-yard pass with 3:52 left to play.

Davis Bryson completed 14 of 28 passes for 202 yards and a touchdown for the Owls, while Baron Hopson recorded a game-best 13 tackles.

The Roadrunners will hit the road to face Texas State next Saturday, Sept. 7, in San Marcos. Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. and the game will be televised nationally on ESPNU.
