USE OF AUDIO/VIDEO COVERAGE

Any accredited media entity using "video or audio materials" (film, traditional video or audio, digital video or audio, photos, etc.) from University of Texas Athletics events (games, practices, post-practice/postgame interviews and press conferences) may use that material only for traditional television newscasts, web-based or print coverage (see note below regarding policy on game video on web), or other electronic transmission as approved by The University in writing, with a limitation of up to three (3) minutes in length from any single event. That three (3)-minute package may contain no more than two (2) minutes of game highlights. Its usage must be only as supporting edited video/audio for a reported video/audio story and not simply as a raw video post/rebroadcast/ streamed highlights or interview sessions. Accredited media entities may not offer any live video, audio or other coverage of the event (or tape delay rebroadcast coverage in its entirety) without the advance written permission of The University of Texas athletics department. Video is for news usage only and may not be sponsored or sold. This policy includes all games, matches, practices and events involving any of Texas' athletics programs. It includes all media events — press conferences, pre/post-practice interviews and pre/post-game interviews.

NOTE REGARDING USE OF GAME VIDEO: Policy permits entities to use up to two (2) minutes of video on air (whether taken from the network feed or shot themselves) or on the entity's website. Reports and features must be filed postgame and not during the game. If a game/event is contracted to a network television partner, all highlights may remain on a website no longer than 48 hours following the game/event's conclusion. Highlights may not be used via social media platforms except as a link back to the website/URL hosting the highlights.

EXCEPTION: With advance written permission from the UT Athletics department, media entities will be permitted to rebroadcast the Steve Sarkisian weekly Monday press conferences in its entirety. Video from that 20-minute press conference can be used for either over the air rebroadcast or web postings. Live distribution of the weekly Monday press conference is not permitted. If posted on a website, it must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of the press conference.

THE OPENING KICKOFF

• Texas continues its 132nd season of football at 6 p.m. CT Saturday, Sept. 14, when it takes on UTSA inside Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium. The game will broadcast on ESPN with Mark Jones (play-by-play), Roddy Jones (analyst) and Quint Kessenich (sideline) on the call.

• Texas and UTSA square off for just the second time in history and first time since 2022. The Longhorns won 41-20 at home in the lone matchup.

• The Longhorns are coming off an AP Top-10 ranked road win after defeating No. 10/9 Michigan, 31-12, on Sept. 7.

• The victory in Ann Arbor clinches the secondstraight season in which Texas picked up an AP Top-10 non-conference road win. In 2023, Texas defeated then ranked No. 3/3 Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

• Texas currently boasts 950 all-time wins, the fourth-most in college football history. UT holds an all-time record of 950-392-33 (.702). The Longhorns' 950 wins are the second most by an SEC team following Alabama's 966 victories.

• Under head coach Steve Sarkisian, Texas has now started 2-0 in back-to-back seasons.

• The Longhorns look to move to 3-0 for the second-consecutive year.

SERIES HISTORY VS. UTSA

• Despite the University of Texas and UTSA being 82.7 miles away from one another, the programs clash on the gridiron for just the second time in history on Saturday.

• Texas leads the all-time series, 1-0. In their lone meeting, the Longhorns defeated the Roadrunners, 41-20, inside Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium on Sept. 17, 2022.

• In the first meeting, former Texas RB Bijan Robinson became the 20th Longhorn in school history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards while he finished the game with 20 carries for 183 yards on the ground with three touchdowns.

Texas outgained UTSA on the ground, 299-139.
DB Jahdae Barron recorded an interception and returned it 44 yards for a touchdown.

BIG WIN AT THE BIG HOUSE

• UT is fresh off a road victory at No. 10/9

Michigan, 31-12, at Michigan Stadium on Sept. 7. • Texas' 19-point win at Michigan (31-12) was the Longhorns' largest margin of victory against a top-10 team on the road since 1979. That year, UT knocked off No. 5 (AP)/7 (Coaches Poll) Missouri, 21-0, in Columbia. It also was the Longhorns' biggest point differential over a top-10 team overall since 2005 when the UT knocked off No. 10/8 Texas Tech in Austin, 52-17.

• Texas' 31-12 victory at No. 10/9 Michigan, coupled with its 34-24 win at No. 3/3 Alabama in 2023, marks the first time since 1990-91 that the Horns have knocked off top-10 ranked non-conference opponents in consecutive regular seasons. UT defeated No. 4 OU 14-13 in 1990 &No.

5 OU 10-7 in 1991.

- Texas moves to 2-0 all-time against the
- Wolverines and 1-0 in regular season matchups.
- The victory by Texas marks the 140th all-time victory for the Longhorns against a ranked opponent with 37 coming on the road and the 950th all-time victory for UT.
- The Texas offense combined 246 passing yards with 143 rushing yards to outgain the Wolverines, 389-284.
- It was the Longhorns' first win on the road against a reigning national champion since Oct. 13, 1998, when UT beat Nebraska, 20-16, to end the Cornhuskers' 47-game home winning streak.
- The Longhorns sport a 140-165-8 (.460) all-time record against ranked foes, including a 37-50-0 (.425) record on the road.
- UT holds a 67-32-2 record when its the higher ranked team in an top-25 matchup.

YEAR FOUR OF THE SARKISIAN ERA

• Texas Football Head Coach Steve Sarkisian is in his fourth season at the helm of the Longhorns and his 11th season as a head coach overall.

• Sarkisian and the Longhorns turned in a historic season in 2023 with a 12-2 record, a Big 12 Championship, No. 3 final ranking and College Football Playoff semifinal appearace. He has also compiled top-5 recruiting classes over the past three years.

• Sarkisian was named a finalist for the Bear Bryant, George Munger and Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year awards after leading Texas to its first Big 12 Championship since 2009, winning 12 games for the first time since that season and reaching the College Football Playoff for the first time in program history.

• The 2023 Longhorns became just the fourth team in program history to amass 12 or more victories in a single season after going 12-2.

• Last season, the Texas offense ranked 15th in the nation and third in the conference averaging 35.8

• The Longhorns were one of only five Power-5 programs that ranked among the top 15 in scoring offense (35.8 ppg) and scoring defense (18.9 ppg), finishing 15th nationally in both.

• The offensive showing also marked the ninth top-25 scoring offense in Sarkisian's career.

Last season marked the eighth time a Sarkisian offense averaged at least 34 points per game.
RB Jonathon Brooks rushed for 1,139 yards in 2023 marking the 12th consecutive year a Sarkisian offense has had a 1,000-yard rusher.

SNAPPING STREAKS

The Longhorns snapped Michigan's 23-game home winning streak with the victory last Saturday.
Texas snapped UM's 16-game winning streak which dated back to the 2022 season.

• The Longhorns snapped the Wolverines' Big Ten record 29-game regular season win streak.

• It also solidified Michigan's first regular season, non-conference home loss in a decade (2014-23 games).

TALKIN' TURNOVERS

 UT has posted four interceptions this season which leads the SEC and ranks sixth nationally. The Longhorns intercepted two passes in each of their first two games this season.

• Four different Longhorns have recorded an interception: DB Jadae Barron vs. Colorado State, DB Wardell Mack vs. Colorado State, DB Andrew Mukuba vs. Michigan and DB Derek Williams Jr. vs. Michigan.

• Texas forced three Michigan turnovers last Saturday - two interceptions and a fumble.

• DB Andrew Mukuba intercepted Michigan QB Davis Warren with 7:37 remaining in the second guarter, returning it three yards to the UM37.

• DB Jahdae Barron recorded a fumble recovery and returned it two yards to the UM42.

• DB Derek Williams Jr. intercepted Michigan QB Davis Warren with 2:31 left in the third quarter at the UM48.

• The Longhorns did not turn over the ball and have only recorded one turnover, a deflected interception, in eight quarters this season.

BIG PLAYS IN THE BIG HOUSE

• The Longhorns had seven plays for 20 or more yards throughout the ballgame, including one for a touchdown.

• Texas had five plays for 20 or more yards in the first half.

• 1Q: Isaiah Bond 33-yard reception from Quinn Ewers for a first down.

• 1Q: Gunnar Helm 22-yard reception from Quinn Ewers for a first down.

COACHING CONTINUITY

• Texas is the only program among the Power 4 conferences with the same head coach and offensive & defensive coordinators for the last four years.

• Texas has had only five total coaching changes in three seasons under Steve Sarkisian. RB Coach Stan Drayton left after year one (2021) to be head coach at Temple, and WR Coach Andre Coleman moved on as well that year; WR Coach Brennan Marion left after one season (2022) to become the offensive coordinator at UNLV; following the 2023 season, DL Coach Bo Davis returned to his alma mater to coach the defensive line at LSU; and co-defensive coordinator Jeff Choate left to become the head coach at Nevada.

• In the decade prior to Sarkisian's arrival on the Forty Acres, Texas had three head coaches, seven offensive coordinators and six offensive line coaches.

• 2024 marks the fourth year with the same offensive play caller (Sarkisian)/OC (Kyle Flood) and OL coach in Sarkisian's tenure.

• Marks the first time since Greg Davis and Mac McWhorter's 10-year run together (2001-10) that Texas has had the same play caller/OC and OL coach for more than two years in a row.

• The 2024 season will be the seocnd-straight in which the offensive staff has remained intact.

CLIMBIN' THE LADDER

- The Longhorns moved up to No. 2 in this week's edition of the AP Poll.
- It's Texas' highest regular season ranking in the AP Top 25 since the Longhorns were ranked No. 2 on Oct.10, 2009.
- The Longhorns then earned a No. 2 ranking heading into the 2009 BCS National Championship game and finished the season ranked No. 2 in the AP Poll.

• During the entire 2009 season, Texas remained at No. 2 in the Coaches Poll.

• The Longhorns' AP Top 25 history includes 57 preseason poll appearances (35 top-10), 45 total weeks at No. 1 and 51 appearances in the final poll (28 top-10).

• Texas has been ranked in 65 of the last 96 AP Polls, dating back to week five of the 2018 season. That stretch includes the current active streak of 23-straight appearances as well as a streak of 23 consecutive appearances in the AP Top 25.

• A 162-week run that covered 11 years (2000-10) ranks as UT's longest consecutive streak of being ranked in the AP Top 25 in program history.

• Texas earned its highest preseason ranking in the Associated Press (AP) Top 25 since 2009 after checking in at No. 4 in this year's preseason poll. The Longhorns were also ranked preseason No. 4 in the Coaches Poll poll earlier this month.

In his collegiate football debut, true freshman WR Ryan Wingo hauled in four receptions on four targets for a team-high 70 yards. Wingo made his first career reception on a 1st-and-10 play from the Texas 26-yard line with five minutes left in the game's opening quarter as quarterback Quinn Ewers found the St. Louis native for a 16-yard reception. Ewers and Wingo connected for a 9-yard pitch-and-catch on the very next play as well.
True freshman Jerrick Gibson capped Texas' first drive of the third quarter with a 5-yard rushing touchdown, marking the first career score for the Gainesville, Fla., native on the Forty Acres. Gibson finished the game with 10 carries for a team-high 67 rushing yards (6.7 ypc) and a score.

• With 2:23 remaining in the third quarter, redshirt freshman QB Arch Manning found WR Silas Bolden in the right flat for a 5-yard touchdown, marking the first career collegiate touchdown pass for the New Orleans native. Manning also found the end zone again on a quarterback keeper, a 1-yard run, in the fourth quarter.

• Five different student-athletes scored their first career touchdowns as a member of the Texas football program: WR Silas Bolden, WR Matthew Golden, WR Isaiah Bond, RB Jerrick Gibson and QB Arch Manning.

 As the Colorado State offense was marching towards the end zone during the game's closing minutes, true freshman DB Wardell Mack picked off Rams backup quarterback Jackson Brousseau in the back of the end zone.

SHUT 'EM OUT

• With Texas' 52-0 win over Colorado State in the season opener, it marked the first time the Longhorns have shutout an opponent to begin the season since Sept. 4, 2004, when UT beat North Texas, 65-0.

Courtesy of its defensive effort, Texas recorded its first shutout since Oct. 8, 2022, when the Longhorns knocked off Oklahoma, 49-0, in Dallas.
The 52-point margin of victory marked the highest by the Longhorns since beating Rice, 58-0, on Sept. 18, 2021.

LEADING THE WAY

• Texas' 31-point halftime lead against the Colorado State Rams was the largest for the Longhorns since having a 31-0 lead over Kansas in Lawrence, Kansas on Nov. 19, 2022.

• Per research gathered by Danny Davis of the Austin American-Statesman, sophomore RB Quintrevion Wisner's 3-yard rushing touchdown to cap the Longhorns' second drive of the afternoon was the first rushing touchdown by Texas to open a new season since the 2014 campaign.

• Malcolm Brown scored the first touchdown of the 2014 season with a 1-yard touchdown run during the first quarter of Texas' 38-7 victory over North Texas on Aug. 30, 2014.

• Wisner's first quarter rushing touchdown was the first of the season for the Glenn Heights, Texas native and second in his last four games after scoring on a 10-yard run with 38 seconds left in the Longhorns' 57-7 win over Texas Tech on Nov. 24, 2023.

SPREADING THE LOVE

- 77 Texas players (51 in the first half) saw the field against the Colorado Rams on Aug. 31.
- Five players scored their first touchdowns at Texas.
- Eight players recorded rushing attempts.
- 12 players caught passes (10 in the first half).

QUARTERBACK MAGIC

In the season opener against Colorado State, it marked the first time two Longhorn football student-athletes have tossed at least one touchdown in the same game since Oct. 1, 2022, when Hudson Card (3) and Xavier Worthy (1) combined for four passing touchdowns.
It was also the first time two UT quarterbacks have each thrown a touchdown in the same game since Nov. 13, 2021, when Casey Thompson (6) and Hudson Card (1) totaled seven passing touchdowns against Kansas.

PUTTING UP POINTS

• Texas' 52 points vs. Colorado State marked the most points in a season-opening game for Texas since Sept. 3, 2022, when the Longhorns beat ULM 52-10.

2024 marked the third consecutive even-number season-opening game that Texas has scored 50-ormore points: 2020 (59), 2022 (52) and 2024 (52).
The Longhorns have scored at least 50 points seven times in the Sarkisian era.

QUINN IN COMMAND

• Junior QB Quinn Ewers has led Texas to 18 wins in 24 starts during his first two seasons on the Forty Acres.

• Following Texas' road win at No. 10/9 Michigan last Saturday, Ewers was recognized on Davey O'Brien's Great 8 list for his performance against the Wolverines.

• Ewers completed 24-of-36 passing attempts (67 percent) for 256 yards and three touchdowns at

Michigan.

• Ewers is now the only FBS quarterback in the country since the start of last season to throw three touchdowns without an interception against multiple AP top-10 opponents, according to ESPN Stats & Info; Ewers led Texas to a victory at Alabama last season, as well.

• With the win against No. 10/9 Michigan at the Big House, Ewers has won eight-straight true road games dating back to 2022, and he's thrown 15 TD passes with just one interception in those games. Three of the eight wins have come at top-15-ranked opponents stadiums and in those games, he has completed 63 percent of his passes for 792 yards & eight TDs (0 INTs).

• He currently rides a 15-game streak with at least one passing touchdown, dating back to the 2022 season. That streak is the longest by a Texas guarterback since Colt McCoy from 2007-09.

- Ewers has thrown three touchdown passes in
- each of his first two games of the 2024 season.
- In the season-opening win against Colorado State, Ewers completed 20-of-27 passes (74.1 percent) for 260 yards and three touchdowns.

• With his three passing touchdowns vs. the Rams, Ewers became just the seventh student-athlete in program history to pass for 40-or-more career touchdowns, becoming the first since Sam Ehlinger (2017-20).

- He tossed for 256 yards at No. 10/9 Michigan, pushing his career passing yardage total to 6,162 to pass Vince Young (2003-05) for seventh on the program's career passing yardage list.
- Saturday also marked the 13th career game that Ewers has tossed multiple touchdowns in a single game, seven of which have been three touchdown performances.
- Heading into this weekend's meeting with UTSA, Ewers needs just one touchdown pass to tie with Vince Young for sixth-most career passing touchdowns by a Texas QB.
- Ewers entered the 2024 season as one of the most recognized names in college football, having been selected to multiple preseason watch lists, including: the Davey O'Brien Award, Earl Campell Tyler Rose Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award, Maxwell Award and Walter Camp National Player of the Year Award.

The junior has been named preseason Second-Team All-SEC by the media and league's coaches.
Ewers compiled the fourth-most passing yards in single-season program history with 3,479 yards in 2023. His 10 200-yard passing games last season tied for fith-most in school history and were the most since Sam Ehlinger (13) in 2019.

• The Southlake, Texas, product averaged 296.2 yards of total offense per game last season, which leads all returning SEC quarterbacks in 2024.

• Ewers is one of four returning Power 4 conference quarterbacks to throw for at least 3,400 yards and register 20 or more passing touchdowns in 2023 (Oregon QB Dillon Gabriel, Georgia QB Carson Beck and Miami QB Cam Ward). Ewers and Beck are the only returning SEC quarterbacks to accomplish that feat last season.

• With Quinn in command, the Longhorn offense filed 400+ yards of total offense in 10 games last season, including two games with over 600 yards of total offense (661 vs. Kansas; 662 vs. Oklahoma State).

• With Ewers under center, UT scored 30 or more points in 12 of 14 games last season.

• Ewers has put together eight career games with 300+ passing yards.

• Last season, Ewers ranked amongst the nations best in several categories: 10th in

completion percentage (0.690), 12th in passing yards per game (289.9), 13th in total offense (296.2) and 14th in passing yards (3,479).

 In the College Football Playoff Semifinal against No. 2 Washington, Ewers completed 24-of-43 passes for 318 yards and one touchdown, carding his eighth 300-yard passing game of his career.

Ewers had a career-game against Oklahoma State in the Big 12 Championship on the way to earning the game's Most Outstanding Player honors:
He completed 35-of-46 passes for 452 yards and

four touchdowns. • Broke the Big 12 Championship Game record

and established career-highs for completions and passing yards.

• Equaled the Big 12 Championship Game and his personal best with four touchdown passes.

• Recorded the first 400-yard passing game of his career and eighth in UT history.

Had his fifth 300-yard passing game of the season, tied for second-most by a Longhorn QB -- Colt McCoy (2009), Major Applewhite (1999).
Marked his seventh career 300-yard game, tied for fourth all-time in UT history (James Brown).
Surpassed 5,000 career passing yards, the eighthmost in program history.

• Also moved over 3,000 passing yards for the season, the sixth Longhorn to accomplish the feat.

• In the 2023 regular-season finale against Texas Tech, he was successful on 17-of-26 passes for 196 yards and one touchdown.

• At Iowa State, he connected on 22-of-33 passes for 281 yards and two touchdowns.

• After missing two games due to a shoulder injury, he returned to lead Texas to victory over TCU, completing 22-of-33 passes for 317 yards and one touchdown.

 Against Houston, he completed 23-of-29 passes for 211 yards and two touchdowns, marking his eighth consecutive game with a touchdown pass and the ninth multi-touchdown pass game of his career.

• He had a string of 14 consecutive completions against the Cougars, the eighth-longest streak in program history.

• Ewers surpassed 4,000 career passing yards during the matchup with Houston, the 11th Longhorn to accomplish the feat.

• In the Red River Rivalry against Oklahoma, Ewers threw for 346 yards and one touchdown on 31-of-37 passing.

• He connected on a string of 19 consecutive passes against OU, breaking Colt McCoy's record of 18 straight against Oklahoma State in 2008.

• His 31 completions equaled a career high and are tied for the 10th most in a game in UT history.

• It marked his second consecutive 300-yard passing game, the first Longhorn with back-to-back games of 300 passing yards since Sam Ehlinger in 2009 (vs. Kansas, at TCU).

• Ewers connected on 25-of-35 passes for 325 yards and one touchdown in the Horns' victory over Kansas, while also rushing seven times for 40 yards and two touchdowns, including a career-long 30-yard run.

 He also rushed for a touchdown in his third consecutive game, the first Texas QB to accomplish the feat since Sam Ehlinger in 2018 (Tulsa, USC, TCU).

Tallied his third-straight game with a passing and rushing touchdown and the fourth of his career.
Had his streak of consecutive passes without an interception ended at 245, the second-longest streak in program history (Sam Ehlinger, 308).

In the Horns' win at Baylor, he completed 18-of-23 passes for 293 yards and one touchdown and added five carries for 16 yards and another score.
Surpassed 3,000 career passing yards, the 16th Longhorn to accomplish the feat.

• He had a standout performance in week two at Alabama, earning Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, Maxwell Player of the Week, Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week and Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Week honors after completing 24-of-38 passes for 349 yards and three touchdowns to guide the then-11th-ranked Longhorns to a 34-24 victory over then-No. 3 Alabama in Tuscaloosa.

• In the fourth quarter against the Crimson Tide, Ewers connected on 6-of-7 passes for 135 yards and two touchdowns.

• Ewers opened the 2023 campaign completing 19of-30 passes for 260 yards and three touchdowns, while also rushing for another score in the victory over Rice.

• The four touchdowns accounted for matched his career high, established last season against Oklahoma.

• Ewers had one of the top freshman campaigns for a Texas QB in program history, guiding the Longhorns to six wins in 10 starts.

• In his 10 games in 2022, Ewers completed 172-of-296 passes (58.1%) for 2,177 yards, 15 touchdowns and six interceptions.

• His 2,177 passing yards were the fifth-most all time for a Texas freshman and the 22nd-most in program history, while the 15 touchdown passes were the fourth-most in a season for a Longhorn freshman.

• He led Texas to six victories, tied for third-most by a freshman in program history.

 In the Alamo Bowl against Washington, he connected on 31-of-47 passes for 369 yards and one touchdown, establishing career highs for completions and passing yards.

• The 31 completions and 47 passing attempts were the third-most ever for a Texas quarterback in a bowl game and both marks equaled the 10th-most in any single game in program history.

• Additionally, his 369 passing yards were the third-most ever for a Longhorn in a bowl game and 16th-most in a single game in UT history.

• Ewers threw for 319 yards and two touchdowns on 19-of-49 passing at Oklahoma State, the first 300-yard passing game of his career.

He had a standout performance against Oklahoma in the Red River Showdown, completing 21-of-31 passes for 289 yards and four touchdowns, establishing then-career bests in each category.
The four touchdown passes are tied for third-most in the UT-OU game in series history and are the most-ever by a Texas freshman.

· Ewers' four passing scores are also tied for 10th-

most in a game in program history and tied for third among Texas freshmen.

• His four touchdown passes were the most for a Texas freshman since Shane Buechele had four against UTEP in 2016.

• His efforts earned him Big 12 Conference Newcomer of the Week honors, the first weekly conference honor of his career.

• He started the first two games of the season for the Longhorns, completing 25-of-36 passes (69.4%), for 359 yards and two touchdowns in four total quarters of action.

• Against then-No. 1 Alabama, Ewers passed for 134 yards and connected on 9-of-12 passes before being sidelined with an injury at the end of the first quarter.

• He made his first career start and his Longhorn debut in the season opener against ULM, guiding the Texas to a season-opening 52-10 victory.

• The transfer from Ohio State completed 16-of-24 passes for 225 yards and two touchdowns. After throwing an interception on his second career passing attempt, he bounced back to connect on eight-straight passes and nine of 10, guiding Texas to four touchdowns, a field goal and a field goal attempt on his next six drives.

• Ewers' 225 passing yards were the third-most since 1950 for a freshman starting in the season opener, trailing Shea Morenz's 347 (1993) and Shane Buechele's 280 (2016).

• He was the sixth Longhorn freshman to start the season opener and the fifth to lead Texas to victory.

THE RETURNERS ON OFFENSE

• Texas returns junior quarterback Quinn Ewers, who has started 24 games for the Longhorns in his career. His 6,162 career passing yards rank seventh all-time in Texas history and his 43 career passing touchdowns rank seventh. A semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award in 2023, he completed 272-of-394 passes (69%) for 3,479 yards, 22 touchdowns and just six interceptions, while he rushed 59 times for 75 yards and five touchdowns last season. His 3,479 passing yards were the fifth-most in a season in UT history and his 272 completions rank sixth. Ewers had six 300-yard passing games, which is tied for the most in a season in program history. Redshirt freshman Arch Manning also returns after appearing in two games last season.

 At running back, junior Jaydon Blue returns after finishing third on the team, respectively, in rushing yards last season behind leading Doak Walker Award candidate Jonathan Brooks, who was injured in the second half of the season and went on to be selected in the NFL Draft. Blue ran for 407 yards and three touchdowns on 65 carries (6.1 ypc) and caught 14 passes for 135 yards and one touchdown last season.

• The wide receiver room features a combination of young talent and experienced incoming transfers. The lone returning player at that position to catch a pass in 2023 is sophomore Johntay Cook II, who pulled in eight for 136 yards (17.0 ypr), after the top three wide receivers from last year moved on to the NFL. That trio of Xavier Worthy, Adonai Mitchell and Jordan Whittington accounted for 172 receptions for 2,364 yards and 17 touchdowns. However, joining the team via transfer is another trio of Isaiah Bond from Alabama, Matthew Golden from Houston, and Silas Bolden from Oregon State. Bond played in 27 games with 12 starts during his

career at Alabama, registering 65 catches for 888 yards (13.7 ypr) and five touchdowns, and led the Tide with 48 receptions for 668 yards (13.9 ypr) and four touchdowns in 14 games with 11 starts in 2023. Golden played in 20 career games in two seasons with 76 receptions for 988 yards (13.0 ypc) and 13 touchdowns, while Bolden is a two-time second-team All-Pac 12 selection as a return specialist (2022-23), played in 37 career games with 14 starts in four seasons and compiled 80 receptions for 1,076 yards (13.4 ypr) and nine touchdowns, while rushing 21 times for 202 yards (9.6 ypc) and four touchdowns. In addition to Cook, Texas also returns sophomore DeAndre Moore Jr. and redshirt freshman Ryan Niblett.

• At tight end, the Longhorns will look to fill the shoes of Ja'Tavion Sanders who caught 99 passes for 1,295 yards over the last two seasons before departing for the NFL. Back is senior Gunnar Helm, who caught 14 passes for 192 yards and two touchdowns last year, while also excelling in blocking throughout his career, which has spanned 40 games with 11 starts. Senior Juan Davis also returns after appearing in 28 games, along with redshirt freshmen Spencer Shannon and Will Randle. Meanwhile, Texas also adds incoming transfer Amari Niblack from Alabama who played in 24 career games, registering 21 receptions for 342 yards and five touchdowns with Alabama.

• The Longhorns return four of five starters from last year's Joe Moore Award semifinalist unit with the lone departure being RT Christian Jones, who was selected in the NFL Draft. All-American candidate junior LT Kelvin Banks Jr. (29 games/29 starts) leads the returning group, which includes senior C Jake Majors (44 games/43 starts), senior LG Hayden Conner (37 games/29 starts) and junior RG DJ Campbell (23 games/16 starts). Several other players return with significant playing experience including junior Cameron Williams (24 games/3 starts), junior Cole Hutson (24 games/15 starts), sophomores Malik Agbo (18 games), Connor Robertson (16 games) and Neto Umeozulu (10 games).

VETERAN PRESENCE UP FRONT

Texas returned four starters along the offensive line with Kelvin Banks Jr., Hayden Conner, Jake Majors and DJ Campbell back for the 2024 season.
There are 133 combined starts on the 2024 offensive line.

• The average size of the 2024 anticipated starting five offensive linemen (Banks, Conner, Majors, Campbell, Williams) is 6-4, 324.

• The line has only lost one starter from its previous two seasons in RT Christian Jones, who was drafted into the NFL in April. Four starters are returning from last year in Banks, Conner, Majors and Campbell. While the year before, four starters also returned as Hutson, who is also back this season, started at right guard.

Last season's offensive line finished as a semifinalist for the Joe Moore Award, presented annually to the top offensive line in the country.
It marks 12th time in the last 31 seasons in which at least four starters from the offensive line return.
In 2023, the Texas offensive line helped pave the way for one of the most dynamic offenses in school history. The 2023 Longhorns recorded a program-record 6,685 yards of total offense in 14 games - breaking the previous record of 6,657 (13 games), which was set by the 2005 BCS National Championship team.

• The Longhorns ranked ninth nationally and third in the league in total offense after averaging 477.5 yards per game in 2023. Texas averaged 188.4 yards on the ground and 289.1 yards through the air per game in 2023.

• Texas ranked ninth nationally and second in the Big 12 Conference in offensive first downs with 323.

• Last season, the unit blocked for Doak Walker Award semifinalist Jonathon Brooks and Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist Quinn Ewers. They opened holes for running backs Brooks (1,158 yards), CJ Baxter (659 yards) and Jaydon Blue (398 yards).

• The offensive line helped UT rack up 662 yards of total offense in the Big 12 Championship game versus Oklahoma State - the seventh-most in single-game program history.

HOTTEST TICKET IN TOWN

• 2024 Texas Football season tickets are sold out. This is the third consecutive season the Longhorns have sold out of designated season tickets. The excitement around Texas Football following last season's College Football Playoff appearance is at an all-time high as the Longhorns begin play in the Southeastern Conference with an additional 4,500 account holders on the waitlist for season tickets in future years.

• In addition, the annual Allstate Red River Rivalry game versus Oklahoma is also sold out and no additional tickets will be available for purchase. The game, held at historic Cotton Bowl Stadium, will be played October 12 at 2:30 p.m.

RECORD-SETTING CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Texas had 422 yards of offense and 35 points in the first half of the Big 12 Championship Game.
Texas finished the game with 662 yards of total offense, it is the fifth time they've surpassed 500 total yards of offense this season.

• The 49 combined points in the first half is the most points scored in a half in Big 12 Championship game history. The previous record was 46 (Colorado vs Texas, 2001).

QB Quinn Ewers, the Big 12 Championship Most Outstanding Player, completed 35-of-46 passes for 452 yards and four touchdowns, breaking the Big 12 Championship Game record and establishing career-highs for completions and passing yards, while also equaling the Big 12 Championship Game and his personal best with four touchdown passes.
Texas became the only Power 5 team over the last 20 seasons to put up 400 yards of offense and 35 points in a single half of a conference title game.
Texas' 662 yards of offense in the Big 12 title game were 7th-most ever in a game for Longhorns. Meanwhile, the Longhorns defense held an OSU offense that was averaging 433 yards per game to 281 (89 of which came on the Cowboys final drive

SCORING IN BUNCHES

• UT opened the sesaon with 52 points, including 24 points in the second quarter, vs. Colorado State. The Longhorns scored three touchdowns in just over five minutes to close the first half.

• Texas has scored over 30 points in its last five games, dating back to 2023.

• Texas scored 30 points or more points in each of the first nine games of the 2023 season for the first time in program history. With the 31-12 win over Michigan last week, Texas has scored at least 30 points in both of its first two games this season.

• The Longhorns were one of three teams to score at least 30 points in each of their first nine games last season. The other two were Michigan and Oregon.

• UT scored at least 30 points in 12 of 14 games in 2023, 16 of the last 19 games and 23 of 29 games since the start of the 2022 season.

• The Longhorns scored at least 21 points in a quarter in each of the first four games last season with two of those occurrences taking place in the fourth quarter.

• Texas has scored in seven of eight quarters so far this season.

• The Longhorns are averaging 41.5 points per game through two games this season.

• UT started fast and hot offensively in last week's road win at No. 10/9 Michigan, scoring 24 of its 31 points in the first half against the Wolverines.

TEXAS RANKED NO. 1 IN ESPN'S FPI, COLLEGE EFFICIENCIES RANKINGS

• Following Texas' road triumph at No. 10/9 Michigan, Texas checked in at No. 1 in ESPN's College Football Power Index, followed by No. 2 Georgia, No. 3 Alabama, No. 4 Ohio State and No. 5 Tennessee.

 The FPI is a measure of team strength that is meant to be the best predictor of a team's performance going forward for the rest of the season. FPI represents how many points above or below average a team is. Projected results are based on 20,000 simulations of the rest of the season using FPI, results to date, and the remaining schedule. Ratings and projections update daily. FPI data from seasons prior to 2019 may not be complete.

• In ESPN's 2024 College Efficiencies, Texas leads the nation with an overall rating of 97.5. The Longhorns rank fifth in the country with an offensive efficiency of 92.3 and third nationally with a defensive rating of 96.8.

• UT is the only program to be ranked inside the country's top-five in both offense and defense.

COMPLIMENTARY FOOTBALL

• In 2023, Texas ranked sixth in ESPN's College Efficiencies rankings with an overall rating of 84.5. The Longhorns ranked 17th in offensive efficiency (75.4), eighth in defensive efficiency (80.5) and 13th in special teams efficiency (63.0), joining Alabama as the only teams to rank among the top-20 in all three categories.

• Texas ranked seventh among Power 5 programs in total offense (477.5) and 23rd in total defense

(336.7), one of eight programs to rank among the top-25 in both categories. The others were Oregon, Georgia, Tennessee, Missouri, Notre Dame, Miami (FL) and UCLA.

• The Longhorns were one of eight FBS schools (and six Power 5 programs) scoring at least 36 points (36.2) and allowing 18 or fewer points (17.5) per game. The list also includes Florida State, Georgia, Michigan, Notre Dame, Oregon, Penn State and SMU.

 16 Longhorns were named to the Reese's Senior Bowl watch list on Aug. 21. The Senior Bowl, which takes place in Mobile, Ala., is where elite draft prospects from around the country are selected to showcase their talent and connect with coaches and decision-makers from all 32 NFL teams.

• Texas was one of 11 schools with 16 or more selections to the 2025 Senior Bowl watch list.

DRAWING A CROWD

Texas played in front of capacity crowds in each of the last 14 games, dating back to Week 2 of the 2023 season when the Longhorns hit the road to face the Alabama Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa.
In last weekend's road trip to No. 10/9 Michigan, Michigan Stadium recorded an attendance of 111,170.

• At Alabama on Sept. 9, 2023, 100,077 fans filled Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa.

• The following week, 101,777 Longhorns fans packed Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium against Wyoming.

• In the 2023 conference opener in Waco, Baylor announced a capacity crowd of 49,165, the eighthlargest attendance figure in McClane Stadium history.

• The Longhorns drew 102,986 fans for the conference home opener against Kansas, the fourth-largest crowd in Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium history.

• The 2023 Red River Rivalry against Oklahoma had a capacity crowd of 92,100 fans inside the Cotton Bowl in Dallas.

• In Texas' first game at Houston since 2001, the Longhorns and Cougars drew 42,812 fans to TDECU Stadium.

• The Horns welcomed 101,670 fans back to DKR-

Texas Memorial Stadium for the game against BYU. • The Texas-Kansas State game at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial stadium drew the fifth-largest crowd in stadium history: 102,846.

• Back on the road, Texas played in front of 50,812 fans at TCU inside Amon G. Carter Stadium.

• In the final road game of the season, 61,500 fans packed Jack Trice Stadium in Ames, Iowa for the Longhorns' game against the Cyclones.

• Texas hosted 102,452 fans at DKR-Texas

Memorial Stadium in the regular-season finale against Texas Tech.

• The Big 12 Championship Game had 84,523 fans in attendance at AT&T Stadium.

• The CFP Semifinal vs. Washington drew 68,791 fans inside the Caesars Superdome in New Orleans, La.

SECRET WEAPONS AT TE

Senior TE Gunnar Helm brings leadership and is developed as both a pass catcher and blocker at 6-5, 250 lbs. With the departure of JT Sanders to the NFL, Helm provides extensive experience, having played in 41 career games. Last season, he started six games and caught 14 passes for 192 yards and two touchdowns even with the significant season Sanders produced in receptions.
The Longhorns add junior TE Amari Niblack, who

transferred to Texas from Alabama during spring
2024, to the mix. Niblack, who was named to the
preseason watch list for the John Mackey Award,
played in 24 career games with five starts during
his time with the Crimson Tide. As a sophomore in
2023, Niblack hauled in 20 receptions for 327 yards
and four touchdowns in 14 games of action.
Senior TE Juan Davis adds more veteran
leadership and depth in the tight end room having

played in 30 games across four seasons as a Longhorn, primarily on special teams. • Tight ends at Texas have flourished under Sarkisian. In 2023, Ja'Tavion Sanders (who was

selected in the fourth round of the 2024 NFL Draft by the Carolina Panthers), recorded 45 receptions for 682 yards (15.16 ypc) and two touchdowns. Sanders had a standout 2022 season as well, snatching 54 receptions for 613 yards and five scores.

AT THE HELM OF THE BIG HOUSE

Senior TE Gunnar Helm had a career day in Texas' 31-12 win at No. 10/9 Michigan last Saturday.
Helm set career highs in both receptions with a team-best seven and receiving yards with a team-high 98 (14 ypc). Helm tallied 45 yards after catch as well against the Wolverines. As a team, Michigan only compiled 51 yards after catch agianst Texas.
The Englewood, Colo., product caught a 21-yard receiving touchdown in the first quarter from QB Quinn Ewers. It was Helm's third career receiving touchdown and his first of the 2024 season.
Against Michigan, Helm recorded three receptions for 20+ yards.

• Two weeks into the 2024 season, Helm leads all SEC tight ends with 140 receiving yards and ranks fifth amongst P4 tight ends. Helm's 140 receiving yards rank ninth overall by an SEC pass catcher.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

• Texas exploded for 661 yards of offense against Kansas in the Big 12 Conference home opener last year.

• The 661 yards were the sixth-most in program history and the most since totaling 689 yards against UTEP in 2020.

• UT's 661 yards were the most in a Big 12 game in program history, topping the previous mark of 658 in 2016 against Texas Tech.

• Texas rushed for 336 yards and threw for 325 yards in the victory over Kansas. It marked the seventh time in program history the Longhorns rushed and passed for over 300 yards in the same game and the first time since 2021 against Texas Tech.

• The Longhorns tallied at least 500 yards of offense in three-straight games at Baylor (503), against Kansas (661) and vs. Oklahoma (527), equaling the longest stretch in UT history.

 It marked the sixth time in program history and first time since 2016 that the Longhorns tallied 500-plus yards in three consecutive games with the prior instances occurring in:

NEW GUYS BRING EXPERIENCE TO THE WR ROOM

With the departures of wide receivers Xavier Worthy, Adonai Mitchell and Jordan Whittingon to the NFL, the Longhorns are tasked with replacing their top pass catchers from the 2023 season.
Texas had a successful transfer portal haul and bring in junior WR Isaiah Bond (Alabama), senior WR Silas Bolden (Oregon State) and junior WR Matthew Golden (Houston) to the mix.
UT also returns standout underclassmen in

sophomore Johntay Cook II, DeAndre Moore Jr. and Ryan Niblett, who is also seeing time at running back. True freshman Ryan Wingo, a highly touted five-star recruit, turned heads in the Orange-White spring game after snaring four passes for 81 yards

and two touchdowns.

• Isaiah Bond played in 27 games with 12 starts during his career at Alabama, registering 65 catches for 888 yards (13.7 ypr) and five touchdowns over the past two seasons in helping the Crimson Tide to a College Football Playoff semifinals appearance in 2023 and an Allstate Sugar Bowl Championship in 2022.

• This past season, Bond led Alabama with 48 receptions for 668 yards (13.9 ypr) and four touchdowns in 14 games with 11 starts. He gathered at least three catches in each of the last seven games and pulled in at least four receptions five of the last six. One of his biggest plays came when he hauled in the 31-yard go-ahead touchdown with 32 seconds left to lift Alabama to an Iron Bowl victory over Auburn. Bond also set career highs of seven receptions and 96 yards with one touchdown against Texas A&M.

• Silas Bolden a native of Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., and a two-time second-team All-Pac 12 selection as a return specialist (2022-23), has played in 37 career games with 14 starts in four seasons with the Beavers. During that time, he compiled 80 receptions for 1,076 yards (13.4 ypr) and nine touchdowns, while rushing 21 times for 202 yards (9.6 ypc) and four touchdowns. He also returned 40 kickoffs for 1,008 yards (25.2 ypr) with a long of 80, along with three punts for 97 yards and one touchdown with a long of 65.

· As a junior last year, Bolden led Oregon State in all-purpose yards with 1,319 and was tied for second with eight total touchdowns. As part of that, he caught 54 passes for 746 yards (13.8 ypr) and five touchdowns, rushed nine times for 84 vards (9.3 ypc) and two touchdowns, returned 17 kickoffs for 392 yards (23.1 ypr), and brought back three punts for 97 yards and one touchdown. Bolden notched seven games with at least 100 all-purpose yards and made at least two catches in every game with three in all but one contest. Against Utah. he set his career high with 100 receiving yards, matched his career high of six catches with one touchdown, and set a career high of 53 rushing vards with one touchdown on two carries. He helped the Beavers to an 8-5 record last season and

an appearance in the Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl. • Matthew Golden, played in 20 career games with 17 starts in two years at Houston, starting eight as a true freshman (2022) and starting all nine games he played in before an injury ended his season as a sophomore in 2023. Golden totaled 76 receptions for 988 yards (13.0 ypc) and 13 touchdowns in two seasons. He also brings depth to special teams as he returned 14 kickoffs for 437 yards (31.2 avg) and two touchdowns. He pulled in 38 receptions for 404 vards and six touchdowns, while returning nine kickoffs for 321 yards (35.7 ypr) and two touchdowns, which went for 100 yards and 98 yards, as a sophomore. He was one of five players nationally to return two kickoffs for touchdowns. · Johntay Cook II played in all 14 games and caught eight passes for 136 yards as a true freshman. He

had a season-long 51-yard reception in Texas' win at Baylor. • **DeAndre Moore Jr.** appeared in 10 games as a

true freshman and charted a 15-yard kickoff return at TCU.

WEAPONS AT WIDEOUT

- 11 Texas players have recorded at least one
- reception through two games this season.
- Against Michigan, five different UT players grabbed a reception.
- Freshman WR Ryan Wingo led Texas with 70 receiving yards on four receptions in his Longhorn debut against Colorado State on Aug. 31.
- Junior WR Isaiah Bond snagged a team-high five receptions for 61 yards and a touchdown against the Rams.
- Junior WR Matthew Golden hauled in three receptions for 50 yards with a team-high two receiving touchdowns in the season opener.
- Sophomore WR Johntay Cook II snared three catches for 56 yards in the season opener.
- Wingo, Bond, Golden and Cook II combined for 15 catches, 237 yards and three touchdowns against the Rams.
- In the win at Michigan, WR Isiah Bond had three

receptions for 51 yards with a long of 33 yards.
WR Matthew Golden turned in another standout performance for UT, collecting six catches for 41 yards and a score. Golden leads Texas with three touchdown receptions this season.

SPREADING THE BALL AROUND

- Last season, three different players had 10-reception games: Xavier Worthy (10 at TCU), Jordan Whittington (10 vs. Oklahoma) and Adonai Mitchell (10 against Kansas).
- Texas recorded at least one 100-yard receiver in seven of 14 games last season, including one game with two 100-yard receivers (vs. Oklahoma).
- Xavier Worthy hauled in 10 passes against TCU, the third time last season Texas had a receiver with at least 10 receptions in a game.
- It marked the first time since 2019 the Longhorns had three games with a player catching 10 or more passes.
- The three games are tied with 1999 and 2019 for third-most in a season in program history. The program record is five in 2008, followed by four in 2009.

• Three different players with 10 reception-games in a season is the most in program history. The only other season to feature multiple players with 10plus receptions games was 2008 (Jordan Shipley, three times; Quan Cosby, once).

THE RETURNERS ON DEFENSE

• Texas returns four of its top five and six of its top eight tacklers from last season, although top tackler linebacker Jaylan Ford was one of four defensive players to be chosen in this year's NFL Draft, along the defensive tackle tandem of Byron Murphy and Outland Trophy winner T'Vondre Sweat, who went in the first and second rounds, respectively, and cornerback Ryan Watts.

 Along the defensive front, the Longhorns return two starting edge defenders in junior Ethan Burke and senior Barryn Sorrell. Burke led the team with 5.5 sacks last season and was second with nine tackles for loss, while Sorrell, who has played in 35 games with 26 starts, led the team in pressures with 11 to go along with four sacks and 4.5 tackles for loss. Texas also returns junior Justice Finkley and redshirt freshmen Colton Vasek and

Tausili Akana on the edge, while adding UTSA transfer Trey Moore, who was named the 2023 American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year after posting 45 total tackles, 17.5 tackles for loss and a school-record 14 sacks.

 In the middle of the line, despite the loss of Murphy and Sweat, the Longhorns bring back significant contributors in seniors Alfred Collins (50 games/14 starts) and Vernon Broughton (42 games/4 starts), along with sophomores Aaron Bryant and Jaray Bledsoe and redshirt freshman Sydir Mitchell. In addition, three senior transfers join the unit in Bill Norton and Tiaoalii Savea from Arizona, and Jermayne Lole from Louisville. Norton also previously played at Georgia from 2019-2022 and helped the Bulldogs to back-to-back National Championships in 2021-22, while Savea has played in 30 career games, including 19 at Arizona after one year at UCLA. Lole also previously played at Arizona State and has appeared in 44 career games with 34 starts.

• Freshman All-American linebacker Anthony Hill Jr. comes back as the team's leading returning tackler with 67, including five sacks and eight tackles for loss. He is joined at linebacker by super senior David Gbenda, who was fourth on the team in tackles last year with 50 and has played in 49 career games with 13 starts. Another senior in Morice Blackwell Jr. comes back with 35 games played and five starts, while sophomore Liona Lefau (16 games played) and redshirt freshman Derion Gullette also return.

• Thorpe Award semifinalist senior Jahdae Barron leads the secondary and was third on the team in tackles (60) and second in pass breakups (6), while adding 4.5 sacks, one interception and one fumble recovery. That was on the heels of a 2022 season where he registered a team-leading 11.5 tackles for loss, 78 tackles (43 solo), and an interception return and fumble return for touchdowns. Junior Michael Taaffe led the team with three interceptions, while sophomore Derek Williams Jr. posted 42 tackles as a freshman. Junior Javlon Guilbeau will look to return to form following injury, and sophomore Jelani McDonald played in 12 games as a freshman. Texas also adds Clemson transfer and former Freshman All-American Andrew Mukuba who totaled 149 tackles. 20 pass breakups, two fumble recoveries and one interception in 35 games (31 starts) with the Tigers. At cornerback, sophomore Malik Muhammad played in all 14 games last year with two starts and notched 31 tackles, one interception and four pass breakups and is joined by senior Gavin Holmes, who also played in 14 games with two starts. Redshirt freshman Warren Roberson also returns, and Texas adds San Jose State transfer junior Jay'Vion Cole, who was an All-Mountain West selection and posted team highs of three interceptions and 10 pass breakups.

SEASONED SECONDARY

• Texas is returning a veteran secondary group from last season with the addition of two transfer defensive backs in **Andrew Mukuba** (Clemson) and **Jay'Vion Cole** (San Jose State).

• Senior DB **Jahdae Barron** is back for his final season in the Burnt Orange after a stellar 2023 season. A 2023 Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist and staple in the UT secondary, Barron has hauled in a plethora of 2024 preseason accolades that include: Second-Team All-SEC by the media and league's coaches, the Chuck Bednarik Award watch list and the Bronko Nagurkski Trophy watch list.

Barron opened the 2024 season with his fourth

career interception in the season opener against Colorado State on Aug. 31. Barron turned in another strong performance at No. 10/9 Michigan, acquiring four total tackles (two solo), a fumble return for two vards and one PBU. As a junior in 2023, Barron played in 14 games with 12 starts, registering 61 tackles (32 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss, one interception, one fumble recovery and a career-high six pass breakups. A native of Austin, Texas. Barron tallied four tackles (three solo) and had a 16-yard interception return against No. 3 Alabama that shut down the Crimson Tide's first offensive drive and was named the East-West Shrine Bowl Texas Star of the Week following his dominant performance in the win. In the Red River Rivalry versus Oklahoma, Barron had a team-high 11 tackles (five solo) and one tackle for loss. Barron also posted a 10-plus tackle game with 11 (six solo) to go along with one sack and a 0.5 tackle for loss Week 3 against Wyoming. In the Big 12 Championship versus Oklahoma State, Barron recorded two tackles and two pass breakups to seal the conference crown.

· Sophomore Malik Muhammad is back for his second season after making two starts and playing in all 14 games as a true freshman in 2023. Muhammad totaled 31 tackles (21 solo), one interception, four pass breakups and returned a blocked punt for a touchdown. In his Longhorn debut against Rice, he had five solo tackles and a pass breakup. In the Red River Rivalry against Oklahoma, he scooped up a blocked punt in the end zone for a touchdown. He had three tackles (one solo), one pass breakup and hauled in his first career interception against Texas Tech. Making his first career start in the Big 12 Championship game versus Oklahoma State, he accumulated four solo tackles and one pass breakup. Muhammad had three tackles (two solo) in a start against Washington in the Sugar Bowl. He also picked up 2024 preseason honors after being named secondteam All-SEC by the media and third-team All-SEC by the league's coaches.

• The addition of Andrew Mukuba from Clemson adds more veteran presence to the Longhorn secondary. Against Michigan, Mukuba racked up four total tackles, one interception and two PBUs. Mukuba was credited with 149 tackles (4.5 for loss), one sack, 20 pass breakups, two fumble recoveries and one interception in 35 games (31 starts) from 2021-23. An Austin, Texas, native, Mukuba made an immediate impact in 2021 to earn Freshman All-America selection from nearly every outlet in 2021 and became the first true freshman defensive back to start a season opener for Clemson since freshman eligibility in 1972. He recorded 45 tackles (2.0 for loss), seven pass breakups and a fumble recovery after starting all 10 games in 2023. He posted seven tackles (1.5 for loss) and a pass breakup vs. No. 12 Notre Dame and registered three tackles and two pass breakups (plus an additional pass breakup on a two-point conversion attempt) vs. No. 20 North Carolina. • Junior Michael Taaffe has played in 28 games with 11 starts and was named 2023 honorable mention All-Big 12 and a nominee for the Burlsworth Trophy. He played in all 14 games with nine starts in 2023, compiling 48 tackles (28 solo), 2.5 tackles for loss, three interceptions, two pass

breakups and one blocked punt. He intercepted passes in three consecutive games against Houston, BYU and Kansas State.

• Sophomore **Derek Williams Jr**. saw significant playing time as a true freshman in 2023, appearing in 13 games after registering 42 tackles (24 solo), two tackles for loss and two pass breakups. Williams established a career-high in tackles with seven (three solo) with one tackle for loss against BYU. Williams had an interception at Michigan to go along with five total tackles (three solo).

• Senior **Gavin Holmes** played in all 14 games with two starts in 2023, totaling 16 tackles (13 solo) with two pass breakups.

• Junior Jaylon Guilbeau returned and led Texas with eight tackles against Colorado State in the season opener. Guilbeau also carded five total tackles (two solo), one tackle for a loss of one yard and one PBU at Michigan last Saturday. Guilbeau currently leads Texas in total tackles this season with 13.

• Senior DB **Jahdae Barron** has hauled in the preseason accolades after a standout 2023 season where he was named a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award.

• At Michigan, Barron logged four total tackles, one fumble recovery and one PBU.

Barron filed one tackle and picked off Colorado State QB Brayden Fowler-Nicolosi in the season opener, returning it for 30 yards. It was his fourth career interception and first since Alabama in 2023.
Barron has been named preseason second-team All-SEC by the media and league's coaches while also being tabbed to preseason watch lists for the Chuck Bednarik and Bronk Nagurski Trophy.

Last season, he tallied five tackles (four solo) in the victory at TCU, then collected a trio of tackles in victories at Iowa State and versus Texas Tech, adding a pass breakup against the Red Raiders.
Barron made plays all over the field against BYU on Oct. 28, 2023, collecting six tackles (two solo) with two tackles for Ioss, one pass breakup and a pass deflection that led resulted in a Terrance Brooks interception to set up Texas' second touchdown of the game.

• He was a difference-maker for the Longhorns against Houston in 2023, providing a second-half spark with three timely tackles (two solo) and a pass breakup on the Cougars' final offensive play of the game that halted the drive at the Texas 10-yard line.

 The Austin native registered 11 tackles (five solo) with one tackle for loss in the Red River Rivalry against Oklahoma.

• Barron tallied three solo tackles, including a tackle for loss, and recovered a fumble that led to a Texas touchdown.

 Against Wyoming, Barron had a then-season-high 11 tackles (six solo), 0.5 TFL and one pass breakup in the win, including four third-down plays to force fourth down - three tackles and one pass breakup.
 At Alabama. Barron set the tone for the day.

 At Alabama, Barron set the tone for the day, intercepting a pass to shut down the Crimson Tide's first drive and returning it 16 yards to set up Texas' first score.

• Barron added four tackles (three solo) in the win in Tuscaloosa, including a third-down tackle that

forced an Alabama field goal.

• In 2022, Barron tallied a career-high 78 tackles (43 solo) including a team-leading 11.5 tackles for loss while adding two interceptions, one quarterback hurry, three pass breakups, one fumble recovery and two defensive touchdowns (INT, FR).

• He became the first FBS defensive back since 2000 to register double-digit tackles for loss, one fumble return for a touchdown and one interception return for a touchdown in the same season.

 Posted at least five tackles in eight games in 2022, including three double-digit performances.

• The pair of non-offensive touchdowns gave him three for his career, two shy of Michael Huff's UT record.

• Barron notched seven tackles (three solo) in the Alamo Bowl against Washington.

• He tallied five tackles (two solo) with two tackles for loss and his first career sack in helping Texas to a win in the season finale against Baylor.

• The Austin native had a career day against TCU, recording 11 tackles with a career-high nine solo and 3.5 tackles for loss, while also collecting his first fumble recovery and returning it 48 yards.

• Barron posted a critical PBU to prevent a TD and create a turnover on downs at Kansas State.

• He had a standout game against Oklahoma State, recording a career-best 12 tackles (six solo) with

1.5 tackles for loss.

• Against Oklahoma in the Red River Showdown, Barron picked off a pass to shut down a Sooner drive, and also tallied six tackles (three solo) and had half a tackle for loss.

• Versus West Virginia, he posted six tackles (five solo) and had one tackle for loss.

• He had a career day at Texas Tech, establishing career bests with 10 tackles, six solo tackles and two tackles for loss.

Barron recorded his first career interception against UTSA and took it 44 yards for the first picksix of his career. He also added six tackles (three solo) in the victory over the Roadrunners.
His effort against UTSA earned him Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors.

• Had four tackles (two solo) against Alabama.

DESTRUCTIVE D-LINE

• With the departures of Byron Murphy II and T'Vondre Sweat to the NFL, the Longhorns turn to other standout defensive lineman to lead the defense in 2024.

• Texas added four defensive linemen via transfer portal in the spring, bringing in Trey Moore (UTSA), Bill Norton (Arizona), Jermayne Lole (Louisville) and Tiaoalii Savea (Arizona).

• Senior EDGE **Barryn Sorrell** brings a veteran presence to the defensive line. The New Orleans,

La., native has played in 35 games with 26 starts and was named honorable mention All-Big 12 by the conference's coaches in 2023. He started all 14 games and totaled 37 tackles (17 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss and four sacks.

• Junior EDGE **Ethan Burke**, a third-year standout from Austin, has played in 26 career games with nine starts. An honorable mention All-Big 12 honoree in 2023, Burke recorded 41 tackles (21 solo), nine tackles for loss, a team-leading 5.5 sacks, one forced fumble and one rumble recovery. He had a career day at No. 3 Alabama with four tackles (all solo), two tackles for loss and one sack. Burke then made a career-high six tackles (three solo) with half a tackle for loss in the Red River Rivalry against Oklahoma. In the CFP semifinal vs. No. 2 Washington, he equaled his career high with six tackles (four solo), including half a tackle for loss.

Senior DL Alfred Collins returns for his fifth season on the Forty Acres and has now appeared in 50 games with 14 starts. An honorable mention All-Big 12 selection in 2023, Collins registered 22 tackles (12 solo) with two tackles for loss, two sacks and two pass breakups. Collins posted a season-high five tackles (one solo) with two quarterback hurries against Texas Tech.
Senior DL Vernon Broughton embarks on his fifth season with the Longhorns and has played in 42 games with four starts. Broughton established career highs with 17 tackles (seven solo) 4.5 tackles for loss, one sack, one pass breakup and one fumble recovery in 2023.

• Junior EDGE Trey Moore transferred to Texas from UTSA in spring 2024 and looks to be an immediate spark on the defensive side of the ball. Moore was named the 2023 American Athletic Conference Player of the Year and recognized on the AAC first-team. A three-time AAC Defensive Player of the Week in 2023, Moore posted 45 total tackles, including 30 solo stops, 17.5 tackles for a loss and a school-record 14 sacks - only 0.5 shy of the AAC single-season record - with one forced fumble, one interception and four passes defended. The San Antonio, Texas, product had 3.5 sacks and one forced fumble against UAB. He logged a season-high seven tackles with three sacks each against Texas State and East Carolina. As a freshman in 2022. Moore hauled in Freshman All-America distinguishment from the Football Writers Association of America, The Athletic and College Football News in 2022. He was selected to the Conference USA All-Freshman Team and Honorable Mention All-Conference. Starting all 14 contests at outside backer, he broke the school single-season record for tackles for loss with 18. He tallied 59 total tackles, 30 solo stops, eight sacks, six pass breakups, five quarterback hurries, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.

• Senior DL **Bill Norton**, a graduate transfer from Arizona, who also previously played at Georgia from 2019-2022, appeared in all 13 games for Arizona in 2023, starting all but the Stanford game. The Memphis, Tenn., native collected 32 tackles (14 solo, 18 assists) with 2.5 tackles for a loss of five yards, two fumbles, five pressures and three pass breakups. He helped Arizona finish fifth in the Pac-12 and 25th nationally in rush defense, allowing 118.23 yards per game elped the defense finish fifth in the nation on fourth downs (30.0%) and 17th in the red zone (76.0%). Norton notched at least three tackles in seven games.

• Senior DL Jermayne Lole is a graduate transfer defensive lineman from Louisville, who also previously played at Arizona State from 2018-2021, and has played in 44 career games with 34 starts. The Long Beach, Calif., native appeared in 14 total games for Louisville, including 12 in 2023 and two in 2022 prior to a season-ending injury. In 2023, Lole totaled 19 tackles, including 5.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. He contributed two tackles and sack in a conference win versus No. 20 Duke. In the ACC Championship game against Florida State, he registered four tackles including a half tackle for loss for two yards. Lole collected three tackles against USC in the Holiday Bowl to help Louisville to a 10-win season. In 28 games at Arizona State, Lole recorded 123 tackles, including 20 tackles for loss and 11 sacks, with eight pass breakups, however he missed the 2021 season with an injury after being named a preseason All-American by Pro Football Focus (PFF).

• Senior DL Tiaoalii Savea transferred to Texas from Arizona following the 2023 season and has played in 30 career games, including 19 at Arizona that included two starts after having transferred from UCLA where he spent one season and plaved in 10 games. With the Wildcats, he accumulated 36 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, three pressures, one fumble recovery and one blocked kick in two seasons. Last season, he appeared in 12 games with starts against Stanford at nose guard and against Utah at EDGE, collecting 22 tackles, six tackles for loss for 24 yards, 1.5 sacks and three pressures. He tallied multiple tackles in seven games, and against Washington he posted three tackles with two tackles for loss and one sack. Savea helped Arizona to a 10-3 record last year, including a 38-24 win over No. 12 Oklahoma in the Valero Alamo Bowl. All three loses were by seven points or fewer with one coming by seven in overtime at Mississippi State, another by two in triple overtime at No. 9 USC, and the other by seven against No. 7 Washington, which went on to play in the CFP National Championship Game.

• UT did it, again, in the conference opener at Baylor, holding the Bears to a total of 60 yards on the ground.

• At Houston, the Cougars were only able to muster 14 yards rushing, the fewest surrendered by a Texas defense since 2018 (-5 vs. USC).

• The Horns made it back-to-back games by holding BYU to 95 yards.

• UT notched a third-straight game against Kansas State, limiting the Wildcats to 30 rushing yards in the overtime victory. KING OF THE HILL

• Sophomore LB **Anthony Hill Jr.** comes back after a breakthrough Freshman All-American campaign in 2023.

• He opened the 2024 season with five-tackle effort, including logging one tackle for a loss of three yards, vs. Colorado State.

• Hill Jr. had six tackles (two solo) and a 0.5 tackle for loss against No. 10/9 Michigan last Saturday.

• Hill Jr. is the team's leading returning tackler after logging 67, including five sacks and eight tackles for loss, in 2023.

• Hill Jr. has been named to preseason watch lists for the Dick Butkus Award and Bronko Nagurski Trophy to go along with preseason second-team All-SEC praise by the media and a preseason thirdteam All-SEC nod by the league's coaches.

• Hill Jr. earned a spot on the FWAA's Freshman All-America team to go along with co-Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors. The Denton, Texas, product was also named honorable mention All-Big 12, a Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award semifinalist and a Freshman All-America selection by ESPN, The Athletic and the College Football Network.

• Hill Jr. played in all 14 games with six starts and recorded 66 tackles (40 solo), 8.0 tackles for loss, five sacks, one forced fumble, four quarterback hurries and two pass breakups as a true freshman.

He etched his name into the Longhorn record book after producing five sacks, which ties for the fourth-most by a Longhorn freshman and the thirdmost by a Texas true freshman.

• The eight tackles for loss by Hill Jr. equaled the eighth-most for a UT freshman and sixth-most for a true freshman.

• His 67 total tackles were the ninth-most by a Power 5 conference freshman and seventh-most by a Power 5 conference true freshman in 2023. He led all Big 12 true freshmen in total tackles and only three other SEC true freshmen compiled more tackles (Alabama's Caleb Downs with 107, South Carolina's Jalon Kilgore with 76 and Texas A&M's Taurean York with 74).

• He had a breakout performance in the win at No. 3 Alabama, logging six tackles (four solo stops) with two tackles for loss and two sacks, including one in the Crimson Tide's final offensive play of the game. Following the win at Alabama, Hill Jr. earned Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Week and 247Sports True Freshman of the Week honors.

THE RUNNING BACK ROOM

For the third consecutive season and eighth time in program history, the Longhorn backfield featured a 1,000-yard rusher and 500-yard rusher in 2023.
Jonathon Brooks rushed for a career-high 1,139 yards during the first 10 games of the season, while CJ Baxter has brought his season total to 595 yards including a career-high 117 yards in the win at Iowa State.

With sophomore CJ Baxter out for the 2024 seasaon due to injury, junior Jaydon Blue will carry the load. Blue opened 2024 with 57 yards on 11 carries (5.2 ypc) and caught three passes for 37 yards against Colorado State in the season opener.
Blue rushed 65 times for 398 yards and three touchdowns and caught 14 passes for 135 yards and a score in 2023. He tallied his first-career 100-yard rushing performance after running the ball 10 times for 121 yards and a touchdown vs. Texas Tech.

• The duo combined for seven 100-yard games through the first 12 games of the season, while Jaydon Blue added an eighth 100-yard game against texas Tech.

• As a team, Texas rushed for at least 100 yards in every game in 2023.

• Texas carries a 16-game streak of 100+ rushing yards into this Saturday's game vs. UTSA.

• During the 2021 and 2022 seasons, Bijan Robinson rushed for over 1,100 yards each season, while Roschon Johnson topped 550 rushing yards in both - the first Texas duo to accomplish the feat since 2001 (Cedric Benson, Ivan Williams).

• Texas had a different 100-yard rusher in three of the last four games during the 2023 season, with Jonathon Brooks rushing for 104 yards at TCU, CJ Baxter for registering 117 yards at Iowa State and Jaydon Blue collecting 121 yards against Texas Tech. Jaydon Blue ran for 59 yards on nine attempts (6.6 ypc) and a touchdown in the CFP Semifinal vs.

No. 2 Washington.
RB Jonathon Brooks rushed for 1,139 yards in 2023 marking the 12th consecutive year a Sarkisian offense has had a 1,000-yard rusher.

• UT has had a 100-yard rusher in eight of the last 11games, with Brooks rushing for 99 and 98 yards in the other two.

• Texas posted three games last season with over 200 yards on the ground, including two games with notching 300+ rushing yards (336 vs. Kansas; 302 vs. Texas Tech).

Xavier Worthy returned a punt 74 yards for a touchdown to open the scoring against BYU.
Worthy's return for a touchdown was the first by the Longhorns since 2018 and the 74 yards was the 10th-longest in program history.

• It marked the first punt return for a touchdown allowed by BYU since 2019.

Against Oklahoma, Kitan Crawford blocked a punt in the end zone that was recovered by Malik Muhammad for Texas' first TD of the game.
The blocked punt resulted in the second nonoffensive TD of the season (Jerrin Thompson INT

return vs. Wyoming). • At Iowa State, T'Vondre Sweat blocked a point after try that was scooped up by Austin Jordan and returned 82 yards to pick up two points for the Horns.

 Against Texas Tech, Michael Taaffe blocked a punt in the second quarter, the second blocked punt for the Longhorns this season and the third blocked kick.

• Keilan Robinson returned the opening kickoff of the second half 95 yards for a touchdown, the ninth-longest kickoff return in program history and the first kickoff return touchdown for Texas since 2020.

• Bert Auburn went a perfect 5-for-5 on field goals in the victory, including a career-long 54-yarder.

DRIVING THE FIELD

• In the season opener against Colorado State, Texas posted four scoring drives of 60 yards or more, including an eight-play, 80 yard drive in the third quarter.

 In last Saturday's victory at No. 10/9 Michigan, the Longhorns filed two scoring drives of 75 yards or more.

• Texas registered a scoring drive of 75 yards or more in each game during the 2023 season and in 19-straight games, which dates back to the 2022 season.

• Texas had a scoring drive of at least 82 yards in nine of 14 games in 2023, including five 90-plus yard drives.

• In the CFP Semifinal vs. No. 2 Washington, the Longhorns pieced together four scoring drives of 60+ yards.

• At Alabama, the Horns put together a 14-play, 82-yard drive that concluded with a Bert Auburn 29-yard field goal.

• Texas' first touchdown drive against Wyoming was a 17-play, 90-yard effort that took 8:03 to execute.

On the drive, Texas rushed 11 times for 56 yards and converted two fourth downs before DL Byron Murphy II hauled in a 1-yard touchdown reception.
Eight different players touched the ball during the drive

It marked the Longhorns' first 90-yard scoring drive since last season's victory over Oklahoma.
Texas did it again the following week at Baylor,

driving 95 yards on just seven plays in 3:28, closing out the drive with a 21-yard reception by Xavier Worthy.

• UT's drive started after a Jaylan Ford interception

in the end zone to stop a Bear scoring attempt.
The Horns added an 88-yard touchdown drive against Kansas the next week and posted a 85-yard scoring drive against Oklahoma in week six.
Texas had a 13-play, 85-yard scoring drive in the first half at TCU, closing out the drive with an

Adonai Mitchell 6-yard TD reception from Quinn Ewers.

• At Iowa State, Texas put together a 9-play, 91-yard drive that wrapped up with a Jordan Whittington 23-yard touchdown reception.

• In the final drive of the regular season, the Longhorns chewed up 7:59 of clock time marching 91 yards in 13 plays, capping it off with a 10-yard touchdown run by Quintrevion Wisner.

• The Longhorns had three scoring drives of 82 yards against Oklahoma State, including a 7-play, 95-yard touchdown drive to give the Longhorns a 28-7 lead early in the second quarter.

NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS

• Texas has made scoring non-offensive touchdowns a habit, registering at least one in each of the last seven seasons and in 14 of the last 15 seasons overall.

• The Horns scored five non-offensive touchdowns in 2023, the third time in the last 15 seasons that Texas has tallied at least five in a year and the most since 2017.

• UT picked up two in the win over Texas Tech, earning the first on a 95-yard kickoff return by Keilan Robinson to open the second half of play, then adding a second near the end of the third quarter when Jett Bush hauled in an interception after it bounced off the foot of a Red Raider and taking it 43 yards for the score.

• Xavier Worthy returned a BYU punt 74 yards for a touchdown for the first score of the game in Texas' victory over the Cougars.

• Malik Muhammad opened the scoring for Texas in the Red River Rivalry after recovered a Kitan Crawford blocked punt in the first quarter against Oklahoma.

• Jerrin Thompson clinched the Longhorns' week three victory over Wyoming with a 27-yard interception return.

Auburn established UT single-season records in 2023 for field goals made (29) and points scored by a kicker (143) and set the Texas and Big 12 Conference record with 19 consecutive field goals made. His 29 makes came on 35 attempts (82.9%). That came on the heels of 21 made field goals on 26 attempts (80.1%) in 2022. Stone has handled kickoff duties the last two years and produced 49 touchbacks on 96 kickoffs last season. St. Louis emerged as the primary longsnapper during week four of the 2022 season.

• In the return game, Keilan Robinson was the

primary kickoff returner the last two seasons and was chosen in the NFL Draft this year, however the Longhorns add Oregon State transfer **Silas Bolden**, who was second-team All-Pac 12 last year as a returner and has brought back 40 kickoffs for 1,008 yards (25.2 ypr) with a long of 80, along with three punts for 97 yards and one touchdown with a long of 65.

BURNT ORANGE AUBURN

• Senior K Bert Auburn is currently the fourth-most accurate kicker in Longhorn history, connecting on 81.25% (52-of-64) of his career attempts. He was named to the preseason watch list for the Lou Groza Award while picking up preseason first-team All-SEC honors by the league's coaches.

Auburn nailed a 45-yard field goal five minutes into the second quarter against Colorado State.
Auburn is now 17-of-23 on field goal attempts between 40-49 yards throughout his career on the Forty Acres.

• By finishing the season opener against Colorado State with 10 points, Auburn passed Russell Erxleben (1975-78) for eighth on the program's career points scored list.

• As a result of connecting on all four point after touchdown attempts (PATs) at No.10/9 Michigan last Saturday, Auburn has connected on all 125 PATs during his career which breaks Dusty Mangum's program record of 121.

• The senior had a record-breaking season for the Longhorns in 2023, establishing program records for field goals in a season with 29, while his current streak of 20 successful field goals is the longest in program history.

• His 29 made field goals were second-most in a season in Big 12 history and one shy of the record, set by West Virginia's Josh Lambert in 2014, while his 35 attempts are four shy of Lambert's record established in the same season.

• The Flower Mound, Texas native made 29-of-35 field goal attempts this season (82.9%) and all 56 of his point after tries in 2023.

• His 143 points scored during the 2023 season are the third-most in program history and first among Texas place-kickers.

• Auburn led all kickers nationally last season in field goals made with 29. He ranked second in nation in field goals per game (2.07).

• He led the Big 12 in field goal percentage (82.9 percent), field goals made (29), field goals attempted (35), total points scored (143) and scoring (10.2 ppg).

• Auburn ranked second nationally in total points scored and led all kickers with 143 during the 2023 season.

• It was a record-setting day for Auburn in the 2023 regular-season finale against Texas Tech, establishing a program best with 21 points scored for a place-kicker, equaling the program record with five made field goals in a game, including a career-long 54-yarder, while adding six successful point after tries.

• His 21 points topped the previous UT record of 17, accomplished by four UT kickers, most recently by Anthony Fera at West Virginia in 2013.

• Auburn was the fifth Longhorn to connect on five field goals in a single game and the first since

LONGHORN LEGENDS

Longhorn Football Legends Marquise Goodwin, Colt McCoy and Alex Okafor are three of ten former Texas student-athletes set to be inducted into the Texas Athletics Hall of Honor in September. They will be recognized as the Class of 2024 in an induction ceremony on Friday, Sept. 20. They will receive a special salute during the Texas Football game versus ULM on Saturday, Sept. 21.
Marquise Goodwin (Football and Track & Field, 2009-12), is one of the top wideouts and kick returners in school history who has played 10 seasons in the NFL and also was a two-time NCAA long jump champion, seven-time All-American and five-time Big 12 Champion in track and field who competed in the 2012 London Olympics;

• Colt McCoy (Football, 2006-09), whose number 12 is retired at Texas, is one of only three two-time winners of the prestigious Walter Camp Foundation (WCFF) National Player of the Year award, a twotime consensus first-team All-American, Heisman Trophy finalist and Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year who finished his career as the NCAA's all-time winningest quarterback with a 45-8 record before playing 13 seasons in the NFL. McCoy announced his retirement from professional football in August 2024.

• Alex Okafor (Football, 2009-12), an All-American defensive end and two-time first-team All-Big 12 selection who played nine seasons in the NFL and was a Super Bowl Champion in 2020 with the Kansas City Chiefs.

VICTORY COUNT

• 2023 marked the third time in program history that Texas went to a bowl game with 12 wins (2005, 2009, 2023).

Last season, Texas had three wins over teams in the final College Football Playoff Top-25 rankings: Alabama, Oklahoma State, Kansas State
The Longhorns posted eight wins over bowleligible teams in 2023.

NFL LONGHORNS

• Texas' 11 selections in the 2024 NFL Draft were the most-ever for the Longhorns in a seven-round draft and third-most in any draft (17 in 12 rounds in 1984 and 12 in 12 rounds in 1982). The Longhorns' 11 picks ranked second to Michigan (13). The top five included Michigan (13), Texas (11), Alabama (10), Florida State (10) and Washington (10).

• Texas' 11 picks thorugh the first six rounds of the draft were the most of any program in 2024.

UT's 11 picks in the 2024 NFL Draft tied for seventh most since the draft went to seven rounds in 1994.
Texas posted at least five selections in back-to-back drafts for the first time since accomplishing that for three years in a row from 2006-08.

• The Longhorns had five drafted in the 2023 NFL Draft in addition to two players signing as undrafted free agents. RB Bijan Robinson was selected as the eighth overall pick in the first round by the Atlanta Falcons.

• Texas has had 366 players selected in the NFL Draft.

• There have been 47 Longhorns selected in the first round.

• DT Byron Murphy II (1st Round/16th pick/Seahawks) and WR Xavier Worthy (1st Round/28th pick/Chiefs) were taken in the first round, marking the first time Texas had two first-round picks since 2007 (S Michael Griffin & CB Aaron Ross).

 Three Longhorns heard their names called in the second round: DT T'Vondre Sweat (2nd Round/38th pick/Titans), RB Jonathon Brooks (2nd Round/46th pick/Panthers) and WR Adonai Mitchell (2nd Round/52nd pick/Colts). TE Ja'Tavion Sanders was selected in the fourth round (4th Round/101st pick/Panthers).

 In the fifth round, OL Christian Jones (5th Round/162nd pick/Cardinals), RB Keilan Robinson (5th Round/167th pick/Jaguars) and LB Jaylan Ford (5th Round/175th pick/Saints) were taken. Two Longhorns were drafted in the sixth round: DB Ryan Watts (6th Round/195th pick/ Steelers) and WR Jordan Whittington (6th Round/213th pick/Rams), respectively.

Texas has had the top running back drafted (2024 Jonathon Brooks/2023 Bijan Robinson) in back-to-back drafts, joining Alabama (2012 Trent Richardson/2011 Mark Ingram) as the only program to accomplish that.
Xavier Worthy was the first Longhorn wide receiver taken in the first round since Roy Williams in 2004 (No. 7 Pick/Lions) and just the third Texas WR taken in the first round (Johnny "Lam" Jones/No. 2 Pick/Jets/1980) in the history of the common era draft (since 1967).

LONGHORNS MAKING THEIR MARK

• Currently, the Texas Football program has 42 players on NFL rosters.

• The current crop of Longhorns in the NFL have won a combined four Super Bowl titles, been named to eight All-Pro teams and been selected to appear in seven Pro Bowl games.

COACHING STAFF



One of the nation's premier coaches who has steadfastly returned the Texas football program back to prominence, Steve Sarkisian is in his 24th year of coaching and 11th as a head coach. Entering his fourth season at Texas, his Longhorn head coach. Entering his tourth season at lexas, his Longhorn rebuild has been a patient and deliberate one. Sarkisian's process and efforts included a steady growth of on-field results through player development and recruiting, combined with a strong team culture, both of which has positioned the program for continued long-term success. The Longhorns finished 5-7 in 2021, improved to 8-5 with an Alamo Bowl bid in 2022, before turning in a historic season in 2023 with a 12-2 record, Big 12 Championship, No. 3 final ranking and College Football Playoff semifinal appearance. Sarkisian has also turned in top-5 recruiting classes the past three years. He enters 2024 with a 25-14 record in three seasons at Texas and 71-49 mark in 10 seasons as a head coach, with seven of his teams earning bowl bids.

A former All-American quarterback at BYU whose coaching career includes six years as an offensive coordinator at both the NFL and collegiate levels, Sarkisian was the 2020 Broyles Award winner (best assistant coach in college football) as offensive coordinator at Alabama. The former head coach at USC and Washington, he was named the 31st Head Football Coach at The University of Texas on January 2, 2021.

The 2023 season had Texas Football attain heights not seen on the Forty Acres in over a decade. Sarkisian was named a finalist for the Bear Bryant, George Munger and Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year awards after leading the Longhorns to their first Big 12 Championship since 2009, winning 12 games for the first time since that season and reaching the College Football Playoff for the first time in program history. The 12 wins marked just the fourth time in school history that the Longhorns had 12 or more victories in a season. He was also tabled the Big 12 Coach of the Year by The Associated Press. Texas earned a No. 3 final ranking in The Associated Press. Texas earned a No. 3 final ranking in The Associated Press Poll, its highest finish in 15 years since earning the No. 2 spot in 2009. The Longhorns were one of only five Power-5 programs that ranked among the top 15 in scoring offense (35.8 ppg) and scoring defense (18.9 ppg), finishing 15th nationally in both. Sarkisian's versatile and plagaed equad ranked night patienally in total offense (477.5 prg), finishing 15th nationally in both. Sarkisian's versatile and balanced squad ranked ninth nationally in total offense (477.5 ypg), led the Big 12 in total defense (336.7 ypg/34th FBS) and was bolstered by one of the nation's top special team's units. Led by Outland Trophy winner and unanimous first-team All-American defensive tackle T'Vondre Sweat, Texas ranked third nationally in rushing defense (82.4 ypg). The Longhorns' ground game, which was led by Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award finalist Jonathon Brooks' 1,139 yards in 11 games, and three total backs with 100-yard rushing games, ranked 24th in the FBS (188.4 ypg). Texas averaged 289.1 yards per game passing (17th/FBS). Seven Longhorns earned first-team All-Big 12 honors with Sweat voted the league's defensive player of the year, defensive tackle Byron Murphy II selected defensive The year, defensive tackle Byron Murphy II selected defensive lineman of the year, wide receiver Adonai Mitchell chosen offensive newcomer of the year, and linebacker Anthony Hill Jr. tabbed defensive freshman of the year. The Longhorns had 11 players invited to the NFL Combine in February 2024, the most ways increasen biotecomer ever in program history

In 2022, Sarkisian guided Texas to an 8-5 record with all five defeats coming by seven points or fewer, and it is just the second time in the last nine years the Longhorns reached eight wins in the regular season. Meanwhile, this past season's trip to the Valero Ålamo Bowl marking the sixth bowl game Sarkisian has led his teams to in nine completed seasons as a head coach. The 2022 Longhorns featured a balanced attack that averaged 34.5 points per game (25th FBS) and allowed just 21.6 points per game (28th FBS). Running back Bijan Robinson won the Doak Walker Award and earned first-team All-America honors after leading the nation in tandem yards during the regular season with 1.894 (1,580 rushing, 314 receiving) and ranking second in total touchdowns (20), while averaging a Big 12-best 13.17 rushing yards and 157.83 all-purpose yards per game. Robinson was also a first-team All-Big 12 selection and was joined in that honor by tight end Ja Tavion Sanders and linebackers Jaylan Ford and DeMarvion Overshown. A three-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honoree in 2022, Ford was second in the Big 12 in tackles (119; 9.2 tpg). His four interceptions were tied for the UT linebacker record and were the most among FBS linebackers this year. He was also

the only Power 5 player with four interceptions and three forced fumbles, and the only FBS player with four interceptions, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Additionally, wide receiver Xavier Worthy, true freshman offensive lineman Kelvin Banks Jr. and defensive lineman Keondre Coburn earned second-team All-Big 12 accolades, as a total of 20 Longhorns received all-conference recognition. Five Longhorns were selected in the 2023 NFL Draft, highlighted by the first-round selection of Robinson (8th overall) by the Atlanta Falcons. Also selected were Overshown (Dallas Cowboys - 3rd Round), running back Roschor Johnson (Chicago Bears - 4th Round), Coburn (Kansas City Chiefs - 6th Round) and defensive lineman Moro Ojomo (Philadelphia Eagles - 7th Round).

Year one had its ups and downs as the Longhorns dealt with inconsistency, injuries and adversity in a 5-7 campaign. Texas opened and closed the 2021 season with big victories as the Sarkisian era began with a 38-18 victory over No. 23 Louisiana and ended with a 22-17 win over Kansas State. The Longhorns offense averaged nearly 200 yards rushing and 425 total yards while ranking 18th nationally in scoring at 35.2 points per game on the season. Worthy had a record-setting season on his way to Freshman All-America and Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year honors. Despite missing the final two games with an injury, Robinson compiled 1,127 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns to go with 26 receptions for 295 yards and four more touchdowns. Kicker Cameron Dicker and offensive linearea Deak Karstattor ising Morthy and Pobinson as four lineman Derek Kerstetter joined Worthy and Robinson as four Longhorns who earned first-team All-Big 12 honors. All totaled, 14 Longhorns earned All-Big 12 recognition.

Prior to arriving on the Forty Acres, Sarkisian served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Alabama where he was the architect of 24 straight games in which the Crimson Tide's offense scored 35 or more points, the longest streak in major college football history. Despite coming up just short of that in a 31-14 win over Notre Dame in the College Football Playoff semifinals, the victory propelled Alabama to the National Championship Game where they defeated No. 3 Dhis State 52-24 Ohio State, 52-24

In 2020, Alabama's offense ranked second in the nation in scoring and led all Power 5 schools with 48.5 points per game, which set a school record and included five 50-point games against Southeastern Conference competition. The Crimson Tide became the first team in league history to record five such games in a single season in conference play. The Tide followed that by posting 52 points against Florida in the 2020 SEC Championship to earn the No. 1 seed in the College Football Playoff. They later matched that total in the National Championebin Game Championship Game

Alabama led the nation in third-down conversion percentage Alabaria led the nation in third-down conversion percentage (58.9), team passing efficiency (198.99) and completion percentage (76.2), led by Heisman Trophy finalist and Davey O'Brien Award winner Mac Jones, who posted the top individual ratings in passing efficiency (203.1) and completion percentage (77.4), as well. Rimington Trophy winner C Landon Dickerson. Jones, Smith and Harris have all received first-team All-America honors, as well. As a team, Alabama ranked fourth in the nation in total offense at 541.6 yards per game to break the school record.

The 2019 Alabama offense averaged a school-record 47.2 points per game, which ranked second nationally, while averaging 510.8 yards per game, which was sixth nationally and is currently second on school record. Quarterbacks Tua Tagovailoa and Mac Jones combined to throw for 4,449 yards and 49 touchdowns which equated to a school-record 34.2 passing yards per game that ranked third nationally. Alabama's 199.61 passing efficiency rating was not only a school record, but the second-best mark in NCAA history. Smith ranked fifth nationally with 14 receiving touchdowns and 11th with 1,256 receiving yards. The receiving corps also featured Jerry Jeudy, who was 25th (10) and 20th (1,163) in rushing touchdowns (21st/13) and rushing yards (1,224). Jeudy and Leatherwood both earned first-team All-America honors, while Smith and OT Jedrick Willis were tabbed second-team All-America. Four members of the Crimson Tide offense went on to be drafted in the first 15 picks of the first round, including Tagovailoa (No. 5/Miami), Willis (No. 10/Cleveland Browns), WR Henry Ruggs III (No. 12 Oakland Raiders) and Jeudy (No. 15/Denver Broncos).

The past two seasons marked Sarkisian's second stint at Alabama after serving as an analyst for most of the 2016 season before being promoted to offensive coordinator for the 2017 College Football Playoff National Championship Game.

Prior to his return to Alabama, Sarkisian was the offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons. During his two years coordinating the Falcons' attack, Sarkisian built one of the most dangerous offenses in the NFL. The 2018 unit finished in the top 10 in the NFL in passing yards (fourth – 4,653 yards), total yards (sixth – 6,226 yards) and scoring (10th – 25.9 ppg). Quarterback Matt Ryan was third in the NFL in passing yards (4,924 yards) while tossing 35 touchdowns. Wide receiver Julio Jones caught 113 passes for 1,677 yards and eight touchdowns, and Calvin Ridley added 64 catches for 821 yards and a team-high 10 scores. Jones led the league in receiving yards in Jula Jones (Janger 1018, while Ridley paced all rookies in receiving yards and touchdowns.

In 2017, two pieces of the Falcons offense, Jones and center Alex Mack, were selected to the Pro Bowl. Atlanta led the NFL in third-down percentage in Sarkisian's first season, while finishing eighth in the league in passing offense (249.4) and third in yards per play (5.93).

Sarkisian not only boasts play-calling experience at the highest levels of football, but seven years as an FBS head coach. He guided the Southern California program in 2014-15, and the Washington Huskies from 2009-13. He posted a head coaching record of 46-35 over those seven seasons while leading his teams to five bowl appearances.

During his time as head coach at USC, Sarkisian led the Trojans to a 12-6 overall record including a second-place finish in the Pac-12's Southern Division in 2014. His 2014 offense ranked in the top 25 nationally in passing officiency (fourth -165.35), passing offense (15th -296.6 ypg), third down conversions (19th -46.6 percent) and scoring offense (22nd -35.8 ppg). The Trojans finished 9-4 overall, including wins in four of their last five games, and capped the year with a Holiday Bowl win over Nebraska.

In 2014, Sarkisian produced a pair of first-team All-Americans in DE Leonard Williams and WR Nelson Agholor, a sophomore All-American first teamer in S/LB Su'a Cravens, a quartet of Freshman All-American first teamers in CB/WR Adoree' Jackson, who was the Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year, along with OL Toa Lobendahn, WR JuJu Smith and OG Viane Talamaivao. Quarterback Cody Kessler had the most efficient passing season in USC history (69.7 completion percentage, 39 passing TDs, five interceptions), Agholor had 104 receptions, which was third-best in USC history, and Allen rushed for 1,489 yards, the most by a Trojan since 2005. USC's offense ranked in the national Top 25 in passing efficiency, passing offense, third down conversions and scoring offense, while the defense was in the nation's Top 20 in turnover margin, red zone defense and third down conversion defense. Six Trojans were drafted by the NFL, including a pair of first rounders in Williams and Agholor, along with four players he coached at Washington, including three in the first round in DT Danny Shelton, CB Marcus Peters and LB Shaq Thompson.

At Washington, Sarkisian inherited a program in 2009 that had won just 12 games during the previous five seasons, including a winless season the year prior. Despite that challenge, he guided the Huskies to bowl games in his last four seasons. His eight victories in 2013 were the most at UW since 2000 and the Huskies finished ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press poll. His overall Washington record was 34-29, and his tenure in Seattle resulted in eight wins over Associated Press Top 25 teams (No. 3 USC, No. 19 California in 2009; No. 18 USC, No. 18 Nebraska and No. 24 Oregon State in 2010; No. 7 Oregon State and No. 8 Stanford in 2012; No. 13 Boise State in 2013).

Among the UW players Sarkisian coached were nine additional NFL draftees, including QB Jake Locker, CB Desmond Trufant, LBs Donald Butler and All-American Mason Foster, DE Daniel Te'o-Nesheim and RB Bishop Sankey, plus All-Pac-12 RB Chris Polk.

Sarkisian arrived at Southern Cal as an assistant in 2001 and took over as the quarterbacks coach in 2002, where he tutored quarterback Carson Palmer to the Heisman Trophy and the No. 1 overall pick in the 2003 NFL Draft. After spending the 2004 season as the quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders, Sarkisian returned to the Trojan staff in February of 2005 as the assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach for four seasons (2005-08). He added the offensive coordinator role to his duties in 2007 and 2008 at USC.

At USC, Sarkisian coached Heisman Trophy-winning quarterbacks in Palmer and Leinart, along with NFL signalcallers Mark Sanchez, John David Booty and Matt Cassel. The Trojans went 23-3 during his tenure as the offensive coordinator.

Prior to his start in coaching as quarterbacks coach at El Camino College in 2000, Sarkisian starred at the quarterback position at the prep, collegiate and pro levels. He spent time with the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League for three seasons (1997-99) following his collegiate career at BYU.

While with the Cougars from 1995-96, he completed 549-of-824 passes (66.6 percent) for 7,755 yards and 55 touchdowns. His 162.0 career passing efficiency rating was third on the alltime NCAA list when he finished playing. As a senior in 1996, he led the nation in passing efficiency (173.6, the fourth-best mark in NCAA history at the time), leading the Cougars to the WAC championship and a win in the 1997 Cotton Bowl. He was the WAC Offensive Player of the Year in 1996 and earned second team All-America honors.

Sarkisian earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from BYU in 1997 after getting his associate's degree in general studies from El Camino College in 1994.

He has two daughters, Ashley and Taylor, and a son, Brady.


