## « OPENING DRIVE »

- UTSA and Texas will meet for the second time on Saturday night in Austin.
- The Longhorns pulled away for a 41-20 home victory in the first matchup on Sept. 17, 2022.
- Ranked No. 2 in the AP Top 25 and third in the AFCA Coaches Poll this week, Texas will mark the highest-ranked opponent UTSA has faced in its 14-year history. The previous highest-ranked foe was No. 13 Oklahoma State in 2013.
- The Roadrunners are riding a streak of 12 consecutive games with a takeaway.
- Jeff Traylor is in his fifth season at UTSA and boasts a 40-15 overall record, the most wins and best winning percentage (.727) in program history.
- The Roadrunners are 35-21 all-time and 15-5 under Jeff Traylor against teams from the state of Texas.
- Jeff Traylor was on the coaching staff at Texas for the 2015 (special teams coordinator/tight ends) and 2016 (associate head coach, offense/receivers) seasons.
- UTSA will appear on an ESPN broadcast for the second time in the last four games (2023 Frisco Bowl) and sixth time overall.
- The Roadrunners have won nine of their last 11 games dating back to last October.
- UTSA has won nine or more games in each of the past three seasons.

**SETTING THE SCENE**

UTSA will travel to Austin to face No. 2/3 Texas on Saturday in an ESPN prime-time broadcast. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium. The Roadrunners are 1-1 on the season after defeating Kennesaw State in the opener before falling to Texas State last Saturday in San Marcos. The Longhorns improved to 2-0 this year with a 31-12 win at defending national champion Michigan. This will mark the second meeting on the gridiron between UTSA and Texas. The Longhorns pulled away for a 41-20 home victory in the first matchup on Sept. 17, 2022.

**TUNING IN**

Saturday's game will be televised nationally on ESPN and it also will be available via the ESPN mobile app. Mark Jones (play-by-play), Roddy Jones (analyst) and Quint Kessenich (reporter) will call the action. UTSA Sports Media Network will air the game live in the San Antonio area on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at ticket760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Ed Suarez (reporter) have the call. There will be a two-hour pregame show hosted by Pat Evans and a 45-minute postgame show.

**LAST TIME OUT**

UTSA dropped a 49-10 decision to Texas State in the I-35 Showdown last Saturday in San Marcos, marking the first win in the six-game series for the Bobcats. UTSA saw two different quarterbacks combine to pass for 252 yards, as Owen McCown completed 10 passes for 105 in the first half and Eddie Lee Marburger piled up 147 yards and a touchdown on 14 completions, all after halftime. Marburger also had a career-high 23 rushing yards on five attempts. Marburger connected with Willie McCoy on a 2-yard TD pass in the third quarter, and McCoy also had a 40-yard reception in the fourth, as the senior receiver racked up a team-high 59 receiving yards on three catches. Devin McCuin led all Roadrunners with six receptions for 29 yards, Patrick Overmyer had three grabs for 31 yards and Chris Carpenter hauled in two passes for 43 yards. Defensively, Ken Robinson paced UTSA with seven tackles including one for a loss. Martavius French and Jimmori Robinson made five stops with one TFL apiece, while Jermarius Lewis, Owen Pewee and Brevin Randle also recorded five tackles each.

**UTSA/TEXAS CONNECTIONS**

The UTSA staff has several connections to Texas. Head coach Jeff Traylor was on the Longhorns staff in 2015 as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach and again the following season when he was associate head coach for the offense and receivers coach. UTSA offensive coordinator Justin Burke was a special assistant for the Texas offense in 2014-15 before serving as a quality control assistant for the tight ends in 2016. UTSA quarterbacks coach Pavit Patel was a student assistant on the Texas staff in 2014-16 and also earned his degree from UT. UTSA assistant tight ends coach Tim Yoder played running back at Texas in 2016-18. UTSA offensive assistant Jacorey Warrick was a wide receiver at Texas who played in 34 career games in 2013-16. UTSA general manager Mike Giglio was the Longhorns' director of player personnel and pro liaison in 2014-16.

**SCOUTING TEXAS**

The Longhorns improved to 2-0 on the season with a 31-12 road triumph over defending national champion Michigan last Saturday. Texas also registered a 52-0 home shutout of Colorado State in the opener on Aug. 31. The Longhorns, who are in their first season as a member of the SEC, are averaging 467.0 yards of offense, including 300.5 passing yards, and they have surrendered only 476 total yards (238.0 ypg) through two contests. Quinn Ewers has completed 44 of 63 passes for 506 yards and six touchdowns. Gunnar Helm has a team-high 140 receiving yards and a TD on nine receptions, while Matthew Golden has reached the end zone three times to go along with 91 receiving yards. The top rusher is Jerrick Gibson with 103 yards and a pair of scores on 20 attempts. Jaylon Guilbeau leads the defense with 13 total tackles, while David Gbenda and Anthony Hill Jr. have registered 11 stops and 1.5 tackles for loss apiece. Steve Sarkisian is 27-14 in his fourth season at Texas and 74-49 in his 11th year as a head coach.

**SERIES HISTORY**

This will mark the second meeting between UTSA and Texas on the gridiron. The Longhorns pulled away for a 41-20 victory on Sept. 17, 2022, in Austin in the only previous matchup.

**LAST MEETING**

Brenden Brady rushed for 70 yards and a touchdown and also tossed a TD pass, but Bijan Robinson ran for 183 yards and three scores to lead No. 20 Texas to a 41-20 victory over UTSA on Sept. 17, 2022, before 102,520 fans at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium. The Roadrunners led the Longhorns by 10 points in the first half in a contest that was tied at halftime before Texas pulled away for the 21-point victory. Brady carried 21 times for 70 yards to lead the UTSA ground game, while Frank Harris completed 24 of 35 passes for 222 yards and ran for 38 more to help the Roadrunners pile up 408 yards on the Texas defense. UTSA got on the board first, going 74 yards in 20 plays and taking 8:27 off the clock on a march that was capped by a 24-yard Jared Sackett field goal with 3:28 left in the opening quarter. Texas answered with an 11-yard touchdown pass from Hudson Card to Roschon Johnson early in the second stanza, putting an end to a 10-play, 75-yard drive. The Roadrunners reclaimed the lead on a 2-yard TD plunge by Brady that was set up by a pass interference penalty call in the end zone. UTSA then pulled out the trick plays, going with an onside kick on the ensuing kickoff that was recovered by Jimmori Robinson. After a 17-yard pass from Harris to Joshua Cephus, Brady took a lateral and then threw downfield to Zakhari Franklin for a 35-yard scoring connection to help give the visitors a 17-7 lead. Cephus finished with seven catches for 80 yards and Franklin caught six for 84 yards. The Longhorns cut the deficit to three on a 3-yard TD run by Robinson with 5:20 left until halftime and then knotted things up on a 44-yard field goal by Bert Auburn with 12 seconds on the clock. Texas took its first lead since early in the second half when Robinson got loose for a 78-yard dash on UT's first possession of the second half. Sackett drilled his second field goal of the night, a 30-yarder that made it 24-20 with 3:21 remaining in the third quarter. The Longhorns took advantage of a tipped pass late in the third, as Jahdae Barron returned an interception 44 yards to increase the advantage to 31-20. Robinson found the end zone for a third time with a 41-yard dash with 9:36 left to play and then Auburn split the uprights from 26 yards to provide the final margin.

**WHO'S COUNTING?**

Now in their 14th season of play, the Roadrunners will play the 162nd game in program history on Saturday when they face Texas in Austin. UTSA is 85-76 all-time and 34-43 in true road games, including a 15-9 mark under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor. By comparison, Texas has been playing football since 1893 and owns an all-time record of 950-392-33.

**ROADRUNNERS VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS**

The Roadrunners will play their 15th game against a nationally ranked opponent when they face Texas on Saturday in Austin. The Longhorns are ranked No. 2 in the AP Top 25 and third in the AFCA Coaches Poll this week, marking the highest-ranked opponent the Roadrunners will face in their 14-year history. The previous highest-ranked foe was No. 13 Oklahoma State on Sept. 7, 2013, in a 56-35 loss at the Alamodome. UTSA is 0-14 all-time against ranked foes, including 0-13 versus top-25 FBS teams.

## IT'S A HOOT

The Roadrunners will face all four FBS teams that use the nickname Owls during the 2024 season. UTSA opened the campaign on Aug. 31 against the Kennesaw State Owls, who are making their debut in Conference USA this year. The Roadrunners also will meet three American Athletic Conference teams who are the Owls: Rice (Oct. 12), Florida Atlantic (Oct. 19) and Temple (Nov. 22).

## TRAYLOR TABBED TOP AAC COACH BY ATHLON SPORTS

Athlon Sports picked UTSA's Jeff Traylor as its top head coach in the American Athletic Conference for the 2024 season. Traylor tops the list of the league's 14 head coaches as selected by senior college football writer and editor Steve Lassan. A two-time conference coach of the year, the Gilmer, Texas, native has led the Roadrunners to a 40-15 record in his first four seasons at the helm, the most wins and best winning percentage (.727) by a coach in program history. UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned four straight bowl berths and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls under his leadership. Under Traylor's guidance, UTSA student-athletes have collected awards and honors at a record-breaking pace. During his time in San Antonio, he has coached seven All-Americans, three national award finalists, 83 all-conference selections and a pair of NFL Draft picks. That success is not limited to just the gridiron. The Roadrunners also have received numerous honors for their work in the classroom during the Traylor tenure, including three College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, 12 CSC Academic All-District Selections and four conference all-academic team selections. Additionally, UTSA was one only 13 FBS programs to receive the 2023 AFCA Academic Achievement Award for graduation success.

## BURKE CHOSEN FOR 40 UNDER 40 LIST

UTSA offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Justin Burke was chosen for the Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40, as the publication recognized 40 of the rising stars in the coaching ranks in the state of Texas. This marks the fourth consecutive year a UTSA coach has been honored, as Burke joins running backs coach/NFL liaison Julian Griffin (2021), associate head coach/pass game coordinator/wide receivers coach Joe Price (2023) and former co-offensive coordinator Will Stein (2022). A veteran of the UTSA staff since 2020, Burke is in his second season as the Roadrunners' offensive coordinator and his first coaching the quarterbacks. He served as associate head coach, special teams coordinator and tight ends coach during the 2022 regular season before being promoted to co-offensive coordinator for the Cure Bowl.

## TRAYLOR TAKING ROADRUNNERS TO NEW HEIGHTS

Head coach Jeff Traylor has guided UTSA to new heights since taking over the program prior to the 2020 campaign. The Gilmer, Texas, native has turned around the program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, producing results on and off the field. Taking over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, he has led the Roadrunners to a 40-15 record through 55 games, the most wins all-time and best winning percentage (.727) by a UTSA head football coach. In fact, he is approaching Larry Coker's program standard for most games coached of 58. In the Jeff Traylor era, the Roadrunners are 24-3 (.889) at home, and they own a 27-4 (.871) record in regular season conference games and are 29-4 (.879) against league competition when including the 2021 and 2022 Conference USA Championship Games. Under Traylor's direction, UTSA has won back-to-back conference championships, has been nationally ranked in all three major polls in 2021 and 2022 and has played in a bowl game in each of his four seasons, including defeating Marshall, 35-17, in the 2023 Frisco Bowl for the program's first bowl win. The two-time conference coach of the year has coached eight All-Americans, three national award finalists, 13 national award semifinalists, seven conference superlative award recipients, 83 all-conference selections, two academic All-Americans and a pair of NFL Draft picks during his UTSA tenure. He was the 2021 AFCA Region 4 Coach of the Year and he has been a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year twice in addition to being a finalist for the 2022 Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year, 2021 AFCA National Coach of the Year and the 2021 George Munger College Coach of the Year.

## HISTORY MADE IN FRISCO

The Roadrunners made history on Dec. 19, 2023, registering the school's first bowl win with a 35-17 victory over Marshall in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl. UTSA trailed 14-0 early in the contest but outscored the Thundering Herd, 35-3, the rest of the way to improve to 1-4 all-time in bowl games. The Roadrunners have made four consecutive bowl games and five appearances overall dating back to the 2016 New Mexico Bowl.

## SEASON 14

One of the newest FBS programs and now in its second year as a member of the American Athletic Conference, UTSA is in its 14th season of football in 2024. The Roadrunners started their program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played their first season as an FCS

Independent in 2011 before joining the Western Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign. UTSA moved into Conference USA in 2013 and became a full-fledged FBS member starting with the 2014 season. The Roadrunners set NCAA modern startup program records in 2011 by drawing 56,743 fans to their inaugural game against Northeastern State and by averaging 35,521 fans for their six home contests that season. UTSA made its first postseason appearance at the 2016 New Mexico Bowl in its sixth season of play and registered its first win against a team from the Big 12 Conference the following season with a 17-10 victory over Baylor. The Roadrunners made history in 2021, opening the fall with a road win against Illinois of the Big Ten Conference, capturing their first conference championship with a 49-42 decision against WKU and capping a 12-2 ledger with their third bowl game. They repeated as league champions with a 48-27 win over North Texas in 2022 and made their third straight and fourth overall bowl appearance, ending the year with an 11-3 mark. Last fall, the Roadrunners notched their first bowl victory with a 35-17 decision over Marshall in the Frisco Bowl to cap a 9-4 ledger that include a 7-1 mark in their debut in The American. UTSA now has posted at least six wins in eight of the 13 full seasons in program history and it has reached the seven-win plateau six times, including in each of the first four years of the Jeff Traylor era.

## DOWN TO THE WIRE

UTSA is no stranger to close contests in the Jeff Traylor era, as 31 of the 55 have been one-score ballgames in the fourth quarter. The Roadrunners own a 22-9 record in those games. Dating back to the 2021 campaign, UTSA has seen 18 of the last 33 contests decided in the fourth quarter or later. Additionally, the Roadrunners are 13-4 (.765) in games decided by eight points or less since 2021, the most wins and top winning percentage among FBS teams who have played 15 or more one-score games during that stretch.

## HIGH-SCORING ROADRUNNERS

UTSA has emerged as one of the top scoring offenses in the FBS under head coach Jeff Traylor. In his second season at the helm in 2021, the Roadrunners set school records for scoring, tallying 516 total points in 14 contests for a program-record 36.9 points per game to rank 11th nationally. The following year, the Roadrunners came up just shy of the school record with 515 points in 14 games for an average of 36.8 per game, good for 14th in the FBS. UTSA scored 30-plus points in 12 of the 14 contests, and they topped the 40-point barrier seven times and the 50-point plateau twice. The Roadrunners scored 415 points in 13 games in 2023, good for an average of 31.9 per contest. In fact, those three seasons rank as the top three scoring totals and averages in program history. UTSA has scored 20-plus points in 42 of the last 47 games dating back to the 2020 campaign. The Roadrunners have tallied 1,823 points in 55 games under head coach Jeff Traylor, good for an average of 33.1 points per game.

## EXPERIENCE UP FRONT

UTSA once again boasts one of the most experienced offensive lines in the FBS this fall. Entering the season, the Roadrunners owned a combined 238 career games played and 116 career starts up front, figures that ranked seventh and 13th, respectively, among all FBS teams. Through the first two contests this season, those numbers have increased to 250 games and 126 starts. Redshirt junior Walker Baty has played in a team-high 39 games with 12 starts, while senior transfer CJ James Jr., who appears on the Rimington Trophy Watch List, paces the unit in starts with 34, 32 coming during his previous stops at New Mexico and Abilene Christian. Venly Tatafu totes 26 appearances and 21 starts, Makai Hart has 24 career starts in 26 games and junior Luke Lapeze has 27 games and 11 starts under his belt. Honorable mention all-conference performer Cory Godinet made 10 starts in 13 appearances last fall and earned the start at right guard in each of the first two games this year. Transfers Kamar Missouri and Jaylen Garth have started at both tackle spots and now have played in 21 and 11 games, respectively. Sixth-year senior Demetris Allen owns four starts in 21 career games as a Roadrunner, while Deandre Marshall has 18 games on his resumé, Buffalo Kruize has seen action in 14 contests and Ben Rios has played in five.

## CARDENAS IS CLUTCH

Senior tight end Oscar Cardenas has developed a reputation for making clutch catches during his career. The San Antonio Brandeis High School product played a role in one of the iconic moments in

program history, hauling in the game-winning TD reception after a tipped pass with three seconds left in the 34-31 home victory over UAB in 2021. He also had a 28-yard catch on that game-winning drive versus the Blazers to help the Roadrunners clinch the Conference USA West Division title. In 2022, Cardenas caught two balls in the opener against No. 24 Houston, including a key 25-yard reception that set up the game-tying field goal as time expired. He also made a one-handed grab and then hurdled a defender for a 35-yard play on the final drive of the 31-27 victory over North Texas to set up the game-winning touchdown pass on the following play. Last season, the John Mackey Award Watch List member caught 32 passes for 280 yards and a pair of touchdowns en route to third-team All-American Athletic Conference accolades. A sixth-year senior, Cardenas became the ninth Roadrunner and just the second tight end to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards after catching two passes for 38 yards and a touchdown in the 28-16 season-opening win over Kennesaw State. He now has 84 receptions for 1,035 yards and seven touchdowns in 59 career games as a Roadrunner.

### THREE-HEADED MONSTER

The Roadrunners featured a three-headed monster in the backfield last season and that is expected to be the same in 2024. Running backs Kevorian Barnes, Rocko Griffin and Robert Henry combined to rush for 1,786 yards and 23 touchdowns on 365 attempts last fall. Barnes, a native of San Augustine, Texas, who earned a spot on this year's Doak Walker Award candidate list, paced the unit with 715 yards on 147 carries to go with six TDs, while Henry, who hails from Mississippi, tallied 588 yards and a team-best 11 TDs on 127 totes. Griffin, a Georgia native, rushed 91 times for 483 yards and six scores and averaged a team-best 5.3 yards per carry. The trio was responsible for 80% of the Roadrunners' rushing yards and 85% of their rushing TDs last fall. Through the first two games this season, the trio has combined for 101 yards on 35 carries.

### MCCUIN EMERGES AS RECEIVING THREAT

UTSA wide receiver Devin McCuin emerged as one of the team's top receiving threats as a true freshman last year and he has started off his sophomore season on the right foot. In 2023, the Jacksonville, Texas, native nearly broke a freshman record that has stood since UTSA's inaugural season in 2011, as he piled up 546 receiving yards and three touchdowns on 42 catches to come up only 32 yards shy of Kam Jones' freshman standard of 578. He had a 72-yard TD reception against Army that now ranks as the eighth-longest pass play in program history and he nearly notched his first career 100-yard game with 94 in the 49-34 win at Temple and again with 91 in the 49-21 home triumph over South Florida. McCuin opened the 2024 campaign with a career night, catching 11 passes — one shy of the school record and the second-best total in the FBS this fall — for 79 yards and two touchdowns in the 28-16 win over Kennesaw State. He followed that with a team-high six receptions and 29 yards versus Texas State. He currently leads the American Athletic Conference and ranks fifth nationally with 8.5 receptions per game.

### BORN TO PLAY QB

UTSA redshirt sophomore Owen McCown was born to play quarterback. The lefthander is the son of Josh McCown, who was a third-round draft pick in 2002 and played 18 seasons in the NFL after a collegiate career at SMU and Sam Houston. Two of his uncles also played the position. Luke McCown starred at Louisiana Tech before he was selected in the fourth round of the 2004 NFL Draft and enjoyed a 12-year NFL career. Randy McCown played quarterback at Texas A&M from 1996-99, helping the Aggies to the 1998 Big 12 Conference Championship. Those three McCown brothers all played for UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor when he was an assistant coach at Jacksonville High School in the 1990s. Owen won the starting quarterback job coming out of training camp this season and he made the best of his second start as a Roadrunner. He completed 28 of 38 passes for 340 yards and three touchdowns and also ran for another score to help lead UTSA to a 28-16 victory over Kennesaw State last Saturday, earning Manning Award QB of the Week and American Athletic Conference Honorable Mention Player of the Week accolades for his performance. In his first start at UTSA

last December, the transfer from Colorado threw for 251 yards and two TDs on 22-of-31 passing to help guide the Roadrunners to a 35-17 triumph over Marshall in the 2023 Frisco Bowl for the program's first-ever bowl win. He made a splash in his UTSA debut last September by breaking the school's single-game completion percentage record against No. 20 Tennessee, connecting on 18 of 20 passes (90%) for 170 yards and a pair of TDs. Through two games this season, McCown has thrown for 445 yards and three TDs.

### TAKEAWAY STREAK

UTSA will enter the Texas game with a streak of 12 consecutive games with a takeaway, a stretch that started on Sept. 23, 2023 at No. 20 Tennessee.. After going through the first three games of the 2023 season without a takeaway, the Roadrunners finished with 17 over the last 10 contests. UTSA tallied 10 interceptions, led by two apiece from Elliott Davison, Nicktroy Fortune and Kam Alexander, and recovered seven fumbles, paced by two from Ronald Triplette last year. The Roadrunners have opened 2024 with a takeaway in each of the first two contests. Jimmy Wyrick forced a key fumble that was recovered by Syrus Dumas in the fourth quarter of the 28-16 win over Kennesaw State. On the opening possession against Texas State last Saturday, Zach Morris registered the Roadrunners' first interception of the campaign to extend the streak to a dozen games.

### SACK ATTACK

UTSA enjoyed a record-setting season in 2023 for tackles for loss and sacks, and the defense has started the 2024 season with the same impressive numbers. Last fall, the Roadrunners registered 99 tackles behind

the line of scrimmage to eclipse the previous standard of 96 set in 2019. UTSA also shattered the program mark for sacks with 46, 13 more than the previous record established in 2021 with the benefit of one more game. The Roadrunners led the American Athletic Conference in both categories and they ranked second in the FBS in sacks per game (3.54) and fifth in tackles for loss per contest (7.6). Individually, Jimmori Robinson returns after recording 11 TFLs, 4.5 sacks and a program-record 10 quarterback hurries. In the season-opening win over Kennesaw State, the Roadrunners racked up 10 tackles for loss, including a sack each by Robinson, Martavius French and James Walley Jr. That marked the fifth time UTSA has tallied double-digit TFLs in a game over the past two seasons and the ninth time to record three-plus sacks during that stretch. Robinson added his second sack of the year against Texas State, one of five TFLs on the day for the Roadrunners, and the senior outside linebacker currently leads the American Athletic Conference and stands 21st in the FBS in sacks per game (1.0).

**D-LINE DEPTH KEEPS ROADRUNNERS FRESH**

UTSA has taken advantage of a deep defensive line room with a rotation aimed to keep players fresh throughout the game. The Roadrunners played at least nine d-linemen and as many as a dozen in three different games in 2023. UTSA rotated nine players up front in the 28-16 season-opening victory over Kennesaw State, as Brandon Brown, Jameian Buxton, Christian Clayton, Joe Evans, Tai Leonard, Chidera Otutu, Asyrus Simon, Ronald Triplette and Daemian Wimberly all saw action. Those nine plus Jon Jones played against Texas State last Saturday. UTSA welcomed back eight players at the position who saw action last fall, led by veterans Brown, a member of the Outland Trophy Watch List, and Evans, who has earned a spot on watch lists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Shrine Bowl 1000, Reese’s Senior Bowl. Brown logged 4.5 tackles for loss, two quarterback hurries and a sack en route to third-team all-conference honors in 2023. Evans posted 2.5 TFLs, a pair of sacks and a safety last season while also collecting third-team all-league accolades.

**LINEBACKER LEADER**

A starter at inside linebacker since he stepped foot on campus in 2020, Jamal Ligon has developed into one of the team leaders. The fifth-year senior from Tyler, Texas, who landed on this year’s Shrine Bowl 1000 already owns the UTSA career mark for assisted tackles with 151 and is on pace to become the Roadrunners’ all-time leader in total tackles, as he boasts 290 after logging five through the first two contests this season. He now sits only 25 stops shy of Rashad Wisdom’s school record of 315. The three-time all-conference selection also is on track to become the program’s record holder in starts, as he now has 48, only eight short of the mark held by Joshua Cephus and Wisdom. As a true freshman, he set the school standard for total tackles in a game with 19 in a win over Middle Tennessee in 2020. Last season, Ligon posted 62 total tackles, 35 unassisted stops, seven tackles for loss, five quarterback hurries, one sack, one forced fumble and a pass breakup while earning honorable mention All-American Athletic Conference honors.

**OURS (TAYLOR’S VERSION)**

UTSA senior Donyai Taylor is following in the footsteps of former teammate and older brother, Dadrian, who started his career in 2018 and donned the number *seven* jersey for the 2020 through 2022 seasons as a standout at the Roadrunners’ money backer position. Donyai, who has played the same spot as his sibling since his true freshman campaign in 2020, earned the coveted single-digit jersey in a vote by his teammates last season, choosing the same number *seven* that Dadrian wore. The younger brother and Shiner High School product, who will keep that number in 2024, started all 12 games last fall and registered 46 total tackles, *seven* tackles for loss, two sacks, six quarterback hurries, two pass breakups, a 78-yard interception return and a 19-yard fumble return en route to second-team All-American Athletic Conference honors.

**STEADY SAFETIES**

UTSA’s secondary is led in part by the steady senior safety duo of Elliott Davison and Ken Robinson. Despite playing in only 12 of the 13 games last fall, Robinson, a South Grand Prairie High School product, led the



Roadrunners in total tackles with 66 to go along with four pass breakups and a quarterback hurry. Davison, a native of Tyler, registered 40 stops and a pair of interceptions — including one that was returned 76 yards — in his first season at UTSA after transferring from UIW. Robinson has paced the Roadrunners with seven stops in each of the first two games this year to give him the team lead with 14, including two for loss. Davison has recorded nine total stops and a PBU so far this season.

### ALLEN'S AIM IS ACCURATE

Last fall, Chase Allen developed into a reliable place-kicker in his debut campaign with the Roadrunners that saw him earn second-team All-American Athletic Conference accolades. The transfer from Alabama made 13 of 15 field goals — as well as all 49 extra-point attempts — in 2023, as he led the league and ranked 14th in the FBS in field-goal percentage (.867). After not kicking in the opener versus Houston, he drilled 46- and 43-yard field goals in the 20-13 victory over Texas State, earning AAC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. The Colleyville Heritage High School graduate tied the school record with a 53-yard make in the 41-20 triumph over UAB on Oct. 14. His 13 made field goals put him sixth on UTSA's single-season list, while his 49 PATs rank third in program history. A member of the Lou Groza Award watch list this season, Allen made all four extra-point tries in the season-opening win over Kennesaw State. He was good on a 26-yard field goal and made his only PAT attempt against Texas State to continue the Roadrunners' stretch of consecutive PATs made to 201 — the third-longest streak in the FBS — dating back to the win over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020.

### CARPENTER MAKES HISTORY

UTSA junior Chris Carpenter has stamped his name in the school record book as one of the top returners in program history. In 2022, he brought back a kickoff 97 yards for a score against Texas Southern, the first kickoff return touchdown in program history. Last season, the Jacksonville, Texas, native returned a punt 50 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter of the 34-14 home triumph over Rice to become the first Roadrunner to record a punt and kickoff return for a TD. The punt return TD versus the Owls was the third in school annals, as he joined Kenny Harrison (79-yard TD vs. Texas State, 2012) and Sheldon Jones (76-yard return vs. Lamar in 2021). Carpenter finished 2023 ranked sixth in the league and 34th nationally in punt return average (6.8).

### TV BIRDS

Saturday's game will air on ESPN, marking 140 straight televised/streamed appearances for the Roadrunners. The last UTSA game that was not broadcast was the 2012 season finale against Texas State.

### A FOCUS ON RECRUITING TEXAS

UTSA's 118-man roster features 93 players — 79% — who hail from the state of Texas. Georgia and Mississippi stand second with four players apiece, while there are two each from Alabama, Florida and Louisiana. Arizona, Arkansas, Hawai'i, Iowa, Maryland, Massachusetts, Oregon, Tennessee and Virginia each have produced one current Roadrunner. Caile Hogan is the lone UTSA player from Australia and Cory Godinet is the first Roadrunner from American Samoa.

### « KEEPING THEM HOME »

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor and his staff have placed an emphasis on recruiting the city of San Antonio and surrounding area. This year's roster includes 16 players from the San Antonio area.

### UTSA'S 210 TRIANGLE OF TOUGHNESS

Since his arrival in December 2019 head coach Jeff Traylor has instilled into the program his 210 Triangle Of Toughness — run the football, be physical on defense and be sound on special teams — and its Culture Pillars: Integrity, Passion, Mental & Physical Toughness, Selfless and Perfect Effort. As part of that culture, the players voted during fall camp on who would earn single-digit jersey numbers, a reward for representing mental and physical toughness on and off the field. The numbers 2, 1 and 0 — San Antonio's area code — were chosen for the players voted to represent the 210 Triangle of Toughness brand. Below are the single-digit jersey numbers as voted by their teammates:

Offensive linemen (51) CJ James Jr., (53) Cory Godinet, (75) Venly Tatafu and (77) Makai Hart also received the necessary votes but cannot change to a single-digit number due to their position.

### BROTHERLY DUOS

UTSA is one of 30 FBS teams that have at least two sets of brothers. The Roadrunners list junior wide receiver Elliott Brow and junior cornerback Errionn Brow along with senior inside linebacker Fred Lewis and junior safety Jermarius Lewis. Colorado leads the way with six sets of brothers.

### PRO 'RUNNERS

UTSA currently has three players on NFL active rosters and five on practice squads or the injured list. Marcus Davenport became the first Roadrunner to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft when the Saints picked him 14th overall in 2018. The defensive end is in his first season with the Lions after spending 2023 on the Vikings roster. Tariq Woolen was selected by the Seahawks in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft. Now in his third season, the cornerback led the league with six interceptions and was a Pro Bowl selection as a rookie and has twice been voted by his peers to the NFL's Top 100 list. Spencer Burford was a fourth-round pick by the 49ers in 2022 and is in his third year as an offensive guard in San Francisco. Additionally, Joshua Cephus (Jaguars), Sincere McCormick (Raiders), Leroy Watson (Titans) and Rashad Wisdom (Buccaneers) are on practice squads, while Eric Banks is on the Buccaneers injured list.

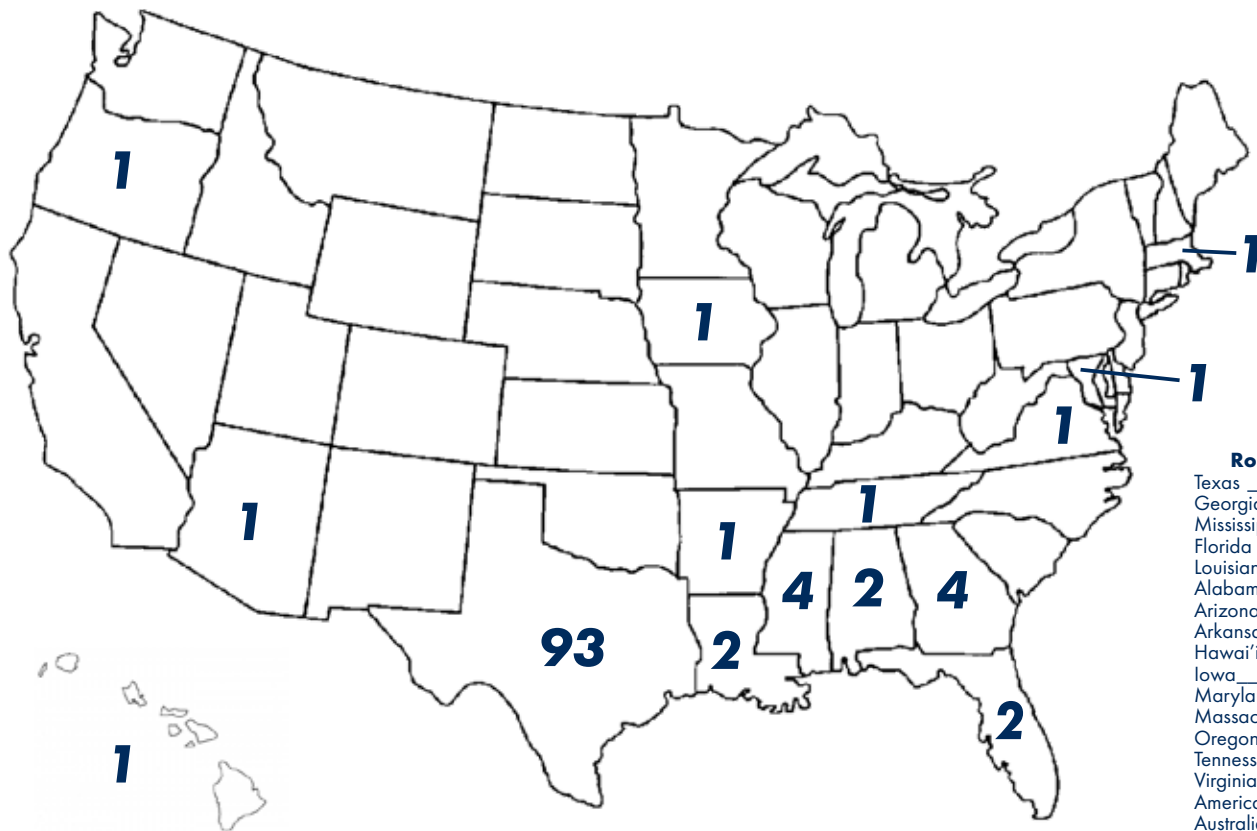

## UTSA 26, KENNESAW STATE 16 Saturday, Aug. 31 San Antonio, Texas (Alamodome)

**SAN ANTONIO** — Owen McCown passed for 340 yards and three touchdowns and the UTSA defense held Kennesaw State to 253 total yards in a 28-16 win in the season opener on Saturday in front of 25,911 fans at the Alamodome.

With the win, the Roadrunners notched their 50th all-time home victory and improved to 24-3 in San Antonio under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor, who ran his overall record to 40-14.

Making his second start as a Roadrunner, McCown directed three first-half scoring drives that helped UTSA build a 21-3 lead over the Owls in the first meeting between the two teams. The redshirt sophomore connected with 10 different pass-catchers, led by Devin McCuin, who caught a career-high 11 balls for 79 yards and two TDs. Willie McCoy caught four passes for 59 yards with a long of 45, Patrick Overmyer and Houston Thomas had three receptions apiece for 31 and 28 yards, respectively, and Oscar Cardenas surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards with a pair of grabs for 38 yards.

Meanwhile, the defense was near-dominant at times, holding the Owls' dangerous ground game to only 51 rushing yards and a 1.3-yards-per-carry average. The Roadrunners racked up 10 tackles for loss, including three sacks with one apiece by Jimmori Robinson, Martavius French and James Welley Jr. Ken Robinson led UTSA with seven tackles and a TFL, while Owen Pewee and Elliott Davison made six and five stops, respectively.

UTSA marched 53 yards on the game's opening possession to put points on the board first. McCown completed passes for 16 yards to McCuin and 18 yards to Thomas on back-to-back plays to help set up a 2-yard TD pass to McCuin. Chase Allen's extra point made it 7-0.

The Owls answered with a 44-yard field goal by Austin Welch to cap a 44-yard drive that chewed 5:48 off the clock.

The Roadrunners tacked on a second touchdown in the opening frame as McCown found paydirt on a 5-yard run to put an exclamation point on an 11-play, 75-yard march and gave the home side a 14-3 advantage. That drive was highlighted by a 29-yard reception from DJ Allen.

McCown connected with McCuin again for a score early in the second stanza, this time on a 4-yard pass over the middle that extended the lead to 21-3. Robert Henry Jr.'s 61-yard reception down to the 6-yard line keyed the drive.

Welch drilled a 34-yard field in the final minute of the opening half to provide the 21-6 halftime margin.

Welch hit his third field goal of the day with a 31-yarder at the 2:06 mark of a low-scoring third quarter that pulled the visitors within 21-9.

Kennesaw State made things interesting in the fourth quarter when Carson Kent hauled in a 25-yard touchdown pass over the middle. Welch's PAT pulled the Owls within five points with 9:23 remaining.

UTSA put the game away when McCown found Cardenas wide open in the end zone on a 3-yard pass with 3:52 left to play.

Davis Bryson completed 14 of 28 passes for 202 yards and a touchdown for the Owls, while Baron Hopson recorded a game-best 13 tackles.

The Roadrunners will hit the road to face Texas State next Saturday, Sept. 7, in San Marcos. Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. and the game will be televised nationally on ESPN.

## TEXAS STATE 49, UTSA 10 Saturday, Sept. 7 San Marcos, Texas (UTCU Stadium)

**SAN MARCOS** — UTSA dropped a 49-10 decision to Texas State in the I-35 Showdown on Saturday afternoon at UFCU Stadium.

The Roadrunners fell to 1-1 on the season with their first setback in the six-game series with the Bobcats, who improved to 2-0 with the win.

UTSA saw two different quarterbacks combine to pass for 252 yards, as Owen McCown completed 10 passes for 105 in the first half and Eddie Lee Marburger piled up 147 yards and a touchdown on 14 completions, all after halftime. Marburger also had a career-high 23 rushing yards on five attempts.

Marburger connected with Willie McCoy on a 2-yard TD pass in the third quarter, and McCoy also had a 40-yard reception in the fourth, as the senior receiver racked up a team-high 59 receiving yards on three catches.

Devin McCuin led all Roadrunners with six grabs for 29 yards, Patrick Overmyer had three receptions for 31 yards and Chris Carpenter hauled in two passes for 43 yards.

Defensively, Ken Robinson paced UTSA with seven tackles including one for a loss. Martavius French and Jimmori Robinson made five stops with one TFL apiece, while Jermain Lewis, Owen Pewee and Brevin Randle also recorded five tackles each.

Texas State used a balanced offense in the win, posting 504 total yards, 309 passing and 195 rushing. Jordan McCloud completed 18 of 27 passes for 309 yards and two touchdowns, while Chris Dawn Jr. had 150 yards and both TDs on only five receptions. Lincoln Pare rushed for a game-high 109 yards and a pair of scores.

UTSA came up with the first big play of the day, as cornerback Zach Morris picked off a pass at the Texas State's 33-yard line on the game's opening possession. However, UTSA could not capitalize on the field position, turning the ball back over to the Bobcats on downs.

Texas State got on the board first when McCloud scrambled for a 17-yard touchdown run at the 6:19 mark of the opening period.

UTSA responded with a 13-play, 66-yard drive that was highlighted by a Houston Thomas 44-yard reception and capped with a 26-yard field goal from Chase Allen.

The Bobcats then reeled off 28 unanswered points over the rest of the first half to take a 35-3 lead into the locker room. McCloud scored on a 2-yard keeper up the middle in the final minute of the first quarter, then connected with Dawn on a 46-yard TD pass early in the second. Deion Hankins had a 2-yard touchdown plunge with 4:39 left in the half and Pare scored on a 45-yard, fourth-down dash up the middle with 1:52 on the clock.

Texas State added to its lead with a 21-yard TD catch by Dawn midway through the third quarter.

UTSA converted a fourth-down-and-goal into a score late in the third quarter when Marburger found McCoy in the end zone for a 2-yard TD reception.

Pare added the final score of the day on a 33-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.
