« OPENING DRIVE »

- UTSA and Houston Christian will meet for the first time on Saturday.
- Since the start of their transition to FBS status in 2012, the Roadrunners are a perfect 8-0 versus FCS opponents, including 3-0 under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor.
- Houston Christian will mark UTSA's third consecutive opponent from the state of Texas.
- The Roadrunners are 35-22 all-time and 15-6 under Jeff Traylor against teams from the state of Texas.
- UTSA is 24-3 (.889) at the Alamodome in the Jeff Traylor era.
- The Roadrunners have won 12 of their last 13 home games.
- Jeff Traylor boasts a 40-16 overall record at UTSA, the most wins and best winning percentage (.714) in program history.
- The Roadrunners have won nine of their last 12 games dating back to last October.
- UTSA has won nine or more games in each of the past three seasons.
- UTSA is riding a streak of 13 consecutive games with a takeaway.

SETTING THE SCENE

UTSA will return to the friendly confines of the Alamodome to host Houston Christian for the annual Hispanic Heritage Game on Saturday, Sept. 21. Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. and the game will air on ESPN+ and Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket. The Roadrunners and Huskies will enter their first meeting on the gridiron with identical 1-2 records. UTSA has won 12 of its last 13 home games and boasts a 24-3 record at the Alamodome under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor.

TUNING IN

Saturday's game will air on ESPN+ and via the ESPN mobile app. Ted Emrich (play-by-play) and Charlie Strong (analyst) will call the action. UTSA Sports Media Network will air the game live in the San Antonio area on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at ticket760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Ed Suarez (reporter) have the call. There will be a two-hour pregame show hosted by Pat Evans and a 45-minute postgame show.

WHO'S COUNTING?

Now in their 14th season of play, the Roadrunners will play the 163rd game in program history on Saturday when they face Houston Christian. UTSA is 85-77 (.525) all-time and 50-30 (.625) at the Alamodome, including a 24-3 (.889) mark under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor.

HOME SWEET DOME

UTSA has been tough to beat at the Alamodome during the Jeff Traylor era. The Roadrunners have won 22 of their last 24 home contests and are 24-3 (.889) at the facility since his arrival prior to the 2020 season. UTSA reeled off a school-record 10-game win streak at home that started with a 27-26 victory over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020, and ran through the 49-41 win against WKU in the 2021 Conference USA Championship Game before it was snapped in triple overtime against No. 24 Houston in the 2022 season opener. The Roadrunners have won 12 of the last 13 at home and are 50-30 (.625) all-time in the Alamodome.

PACKING THE DOME

UTSA fans have packed the Alamodome over the past three-plus seasons, as five of the program's nine-largest home crowds have been recorded during that span. Two of the most recent home games now rank second and fourth on the all-time chart, as 49,342 fans watched UTSA beat Texas State in the 2023 home opener to mark the second-largest crowd in program history. In 2022's final home contest, the Roadrunners raced past North Texas, 48-27, to capture their second straight Conference USA Championship in front of 41,412 fans, which now ranks fourth on the list of largest home crowds. That figure edged the 41,148 fans who watched UTSA outlast WKU, 49-41, in the 2021 CUSA Championship Game, now the fifth-largest home attendance. The 2022 season opener against 24th-ranked Houston drew 37,526 fans, which ranks eighth all-time, just ahead of the thrilling triumph over UAB in front 35,147 fans in 2021. UTSA led CUSA in average home attendance in back-to-back seasons, averaging 28,917 per game in 2022 and 26,643 the previous year. A total of 588,089 fans have filed into the Alamodome to watch the Roadrunners since the return from COVID-19 protocols for the 2021 season. In the season opener against Kennesaw State on Aug. 31, the program eclipsed the two-million mark, as 2,014,342 fans have watched the Roadrunners at the Alamodome. UTSA set NCAA modern startup program records in its first season by drawing 56,743 fans to the inaugural game against Northeastern State on Sept. 3, 2011, and by averaging 35,521 fans for six home contests.

LAST TIME OUT

Robert Henry Jr. rushed for 65 yards and a touchdown and Martavius French had a team-high seven tackles, but it was not enough in a 56-7 setback to No. 2 Texas on Saturday night in front of 101,892 at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium. Henry led the Roadrunners' ground game and scored the lone TD of the day on a 53-yard dash in the second quarter, as UTSA rushed for 128 yards on the day. French paced a defense that came up with two takeaways — an interception by Owen Pewee and a fumble recovery by Brevin Randle — extending the streak of consecutive games with a takeaway to 13 dating back to last September. Jamal Ligon, Brevin Randle, Elliott Davison and Jimmy Wyrick registered five tackles apiece. Arch Manning came off the bench to throw for 223 yards and four touchdowns, rushing for another to help the Longhorns post 614 total yards, including 427 passing. Ryan Wingo had a game-high 127 receiving yards and Isaiah Bond added 103 for Texas.

SCOUTING HOUSTON CHRISTIAN

The Huskies recorded their first victory of the season with a 70-7 rout of Louisiana Christian last Saturday. HCU opened the year with back-to-back setbacks to SMU (59-7) and Tarleton (35-18). The Huskies are averaging 31.7 points and 314.0 yards per game while surrendering 33.7 points and 455.0 yards per contest. Offensively, Cutter Stewart has thrown for 446 yards and four touchdowns on 31-of-71 passing. Aj Wilson is the top receiver with seven catches for 128 yards and a pair of TDs, while the top rusher is Darryle Evans, who has 126 yards and two scores on 16 attempts. Taylor Behl leads the defense with 22 total tackles and Xavier Toliver has two of HCU's five interceptions this season. Head coach Jason Bachtel is in his first season at the helm and he owns a 15-8 career record from his two seasons at Howard Payne.

SERIES HISTORY

This will mark the first meeting on the gridiron between UTSA and Houston Christian, an FCS member of the Southland Conference. UTSA was a previous member institution of the Southland Conference from 1991-92 through 2011-12 but never actually competed in the Southland in football, as its inaugural season in 2011 was as an FCS Independent before joining the Western Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign.

SIMILAR STARTUPS

UTSA and Houston Christian are both modern startup programs. The Roadrunners played their first game in 2011 and are in their 14th season, while the Huskies competed for the first time in 2014 and are in their 11th year.

FIRST-TIME FOES

Houston Christian, an FCS member of the Southland Conference, is the second first-time opponent that UTSA will face in 2024. The Roadrunners opened the season with a 28-16 victory against Kennesaw State, marking the first time the Roadrunners and Owls met on the gridiron.

UTSA VERSUS IN-STATE FOES

The Roadrunners are 35-22 all-time against teams from the state of Texas including a 15-6 mark under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor. Houston Christian is the third consecutive opponent from the Lone Star State on this season's docket, which also includes North Texas, Rice, Texas and Texas State.

ROADRUNNERS AGAINST THE FCS

UTSA is a perfect 8-0 against FCS teams since the Roadrunners began the transition to FBS status in 2012. UTSA has won all three matchups with FCS teams in the Jeff Traylor era, defeating SFA, 24-10, in 2020, blanking Lamar, 54-0, in 2021 and racing past Texas Southern, 52-24, in 2022. As an FCS Independent for their inaugural season in 2011, the Roadrunners went 1-5 against FCS squads.

IT'S A HOOT

The Roadrunners will face all four FBS teams that use the nickname Owls during the 2024 season. UTSA opened the campaign on Aug. 31 against the Kennesaw State Owls, who are making their debut in Conference USA this year. The Roadrunners also will meet three American Athletic Conference teams who are the Owls: Rice (Oct. 12), Florida Atlantic (Oct. 19) and Temple (Nov. 22).

TRAYLOR TABBED TOP AAC COACH BY ATHLON SPORTS

Athlon Sports picked UTSA's Jeff Traylor as its top head coach in the American Athletic Conference for the 2024 season. Traylor tops the list of the league's 14 head coaches as selected by senior college football writer and editor Steve Lissan. A two-time conference coach of the year, the Gilmer, Texas, native has led the Roadrunners to a 40-16 record in his first four seasons at the helm, the most wins and best winning percentage (.714) by a coach in program history. UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned four straight bowl berths and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls under his leadership. Under Traylor's guidance, UTSA student-athletes have collected awards and honors at a record-breaking pace. During his time in San Antonio, he has coached seven All-Americans, three national award finalists, 83 all-conference selections and a pair of NFL Draft picks. That success is not limited to just the gridiron. The Roadrunners also have received numerous honors for their work in the classroom during the Traylor tenure, including three College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, 12 CSC Academic All-District Selections and four conference all-academic team selections. Additionally, UTSA was one only 13 FBS programs to receive the 2023 AFCA Academic Achievement Award for graduation success.

BURKE CHOSEN FOR 40 UNDER 40 LIST

UTSA offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Justin Burke was chosen for the Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40, as the publication recognized 40 of the rising stars in the coaching ranks in the state of Texas. This marks the fourth consecutive year a UTSA coach has been honored, as Burke joins running backs coach/NFL liaison Julian Griffin (2021), associate head coach/pass game coordinator/wide receivers coach Joe Price (2023) and former co-offensive coordinator Will Stein (2022). A veteran of the UTSA staff since 2020, Burke is in his second season as the Roadrunners' offensive coordinator and his first coaching the quarterbacks. He served as associate head coach, special teams coordinator and tight ends coach during the 2022 regular season before being promoted to co-offensive coordinator for the Cure Bowl.

TRAYLOR TAKING ROADRUNNERS TO NEW HEIGHTS

Head coach Jeff Traylor has guided UTSA to new heights since taking over the program prior to the 2020 campaign. The Gilmer, Texas, native has turned around the program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, producing results on and off the field. Taking over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, he has led the Roadrunners to a 40-16 record through 56 games, the most wins all-time and best winning percentage (.714) by a UTSA head football coach. In fact, he is approaching Larry Coker's program standard for most games coached of 58 set from 2011-15. In the Jeff Traylor era, the Roadrunners are 24-3 (.889) at home. They own a 27-4 (.871) record in regular season conference games and are 29-4 (.879) against league competition when including the 2021 and 2022 Conference USA Championship Games. Under Traylor's direction, UTSA has won back-to-back conference championships, has been nationally ranked in all three major polls in 2021 and 2022 and has played in a bowl game in each of his four seasons, including defeating Marshall, 35-17, in the 2023 Frisco Bowl for the program's first bowl win. The two-time conference coach of the year has coached eight All-Americans, three national award finalists, 13 national award semifinalists, seven conference superlative award recipients, 83 all-conference selections, two academic All-Americans and a pair of NFL Draft picks during his UTSA tenure. He was the 2021 AFCA Region 4 Coach of the Year and he has been a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year twice in addition to being a finalist for the 2022 Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year, 2021 AFCA National Coach of the Year and the 2021 George Munger College Coach of the Year.

HISTORY MADE IN FRISCO

The Roadrunners made history on Dec. 19, 2023, registering the school's first bowl win with a 35-17 victory over Marshall in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl. UTSA trailed 14-0 early in the contest but outscored the Thundering Herd, 35-3, the rest of the way to improve to 1-4 all-time in bowl games. The Roadrunners have made four consecutive bowl games and five appearances overall dating back to the 2016 New Mexico Bowl.

SEASON 14

One of the newest FBS programs and now in its second year as a member of the American Athletic Conference, UTSA is in its 14th season of football in 2024. The Roadrunners started their program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played their first season as an FCS Independent in 2011 before joining the Western Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign. UTSA moved into Conference USA in 2013 and became a full-fledged FBS member starting with the 2014 season. The Roadrunners set NCAA modern startup program records in 2011 by drawing 56,743 fans to their inaugural game against Northeastern State and by averaging 35,521 fans for their six home contests that season. UTSA made its first postseason appearance at the 2016 New Mexico Bowl in its sixth season of play and registered its first win against a team from the Big 12 Conference the following season with a 17-10 victory over Baylor. The Roadrunners made history in 2021, opening the fall with a road win against Illinois of the Big Ten Conference, capturing their first conference championship with a 49-42 decision against WKU and capping a 12-2 ledger with their third bowl game. They repeated as league champions with a 48-27 win over North Texas in 2022 and made their third straight and fourth overall bowl appearance, ending the year with an 11-3 mark. Last fall, the Roadrunners notched their first bowl victory with a 35-17 decision over Marshall in the Frisco Bowl to cap a 9-4 ledger that include a 7-1 mark in their debut in The American. UTSA now has posted at least six wins in eight of the 13 full seasons in program history and it has reached the seven-win plateau six times, including in each of the first four years of the Jeff Traylor era.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

UTSA is no stranger to close contests in the Jeff Traylor era, as 31 of the 56 have been one-score ballgames in the fourth quarter. The Roadrunners own a 22-9 record in those games. Dating back to the 2021 campaign, UTSA has seen 18 of the last 34 contests decided in the fourth quarter or later. Additionally, the Roadrunners are 13-4 (.765) in games decided by eight points or less since 2021.

EXPERIENCE UP FRONT

UTSA once again boasts one of the most experienced offensive lines in the FBS this fall. Entering the season, the Roadrunners owned a combined 238 career games played and 116 career starts up front, figures that ranked seventh and 13th, respectively, among all FBS teams. Through the first three contests this season, those numbers have increased to 266 games and 131 starts. Redshirt junior Walker Baty has played in a team-high 40 games with 12 starts, while senior transfer CJ James Jr., who appears on the Rimington Trophy Watch List, paces the unit in starts with 35, 33 coming during his previous stops at New Mexico and Abilene Christian. Venly Tatafu totes 26 appearances and 22 starts, Makai Hart has 25 career starts in 27 games and junior Luke Lapeze has 27 games and 11 starts under his belt. Honorable mention all-conference performer Cory Godinet made 10 starts in 13 appearances last fall and earned the start at right guard in each of the first three games this year. Transfers Kamar Missouri and Jaylen Garth have started at both tackle spots and now have played in 22 and 12 games, respectively. Sixth-year senior Demetris Allen owns four starts in 22 career games as a Roadrunner, while Deandre Marshall has 19 games on his resumé, Buffalo Kruize has seen action in 15 contests and Ben Rios has played in six.

CARDENAS IS CLUTCH

Senior tight end Oscar Cardenas has developed a reputation for making clutch catches during his career. The San Antonio Brandeis High School product played a role in one of the iconic moments in program history, hauling in the game-winning TD reception after a tipped pass with three seconds left in the 34-31 home victory over UAB in 2021. He also had a 28-yard catch on that game-winning drive versus the Blazers to help the Roadrunners clinch the Conference USA West Division title. In 2022, Cardenas caught two balls in the opener against No. 24 Houston, including a key 25-yard reception that set up the game-tying field goal as time expired. He also made a one-handed grab and then hurdled a defender for a 35-yard play on the final drive of the 31-27 victory over North Texas to set up the game-winning touchdown pass on the following play. Last season, the John Mackey Award Watch List member caught 32 passes for 280 yards and a pair of touchdowns en route to third-team All-American Athletic Conference accolades. A sixth-year senior, Cardenas became the ninth Roadrunner and just the second tight end to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards after catching two passes for 38 yards and a touchdown in the 28-16 season-opening win over Kennesaw State. After posting two catches for 14 yards against No. 2 Texas, he now has 86 receptions for 1,049 yards and seven touchdowns in 60 career games as a Roadrunner.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER

The Roadrunners feature a three-headed monster in the backfield. Running backs Kevorian Barnes, Rocko Griffin and Robert Henry combined to rush for 1,786 yards and 23 touchdowns on 365 attempts in 2023. Barnes, a native of San Augustine, Texas, who earned a spot on this year's Doak Walker Award candidate list, paced the unit with 715 yards on 147 carries to go with six TDs, while Henry, who hails from Mississippi, tallied 588 yards and a team-best 11 TDs on 127 totes. Griffin, a

Georgia native, rushed 91 times for 483 yards and six scores and averaged a team-best 5.3 yards per carry. The trio was responsible for 80% of the Roadrunners' rushing yards and 85% of their rushing TDs last fall. Through the first three games this season, the trio has combined for 203 yards and a score on 56 carries.

MCCUIN EMERGES AS RECEIVING THREAT

UTSA wide receiver Devin McCuin emerged as one of the team's top receiving threats as a true freshman last year and he has started off his sophomore season on the right foot. In 2023, the Jacksonville, Texas, native nearly broke a freshman record that has stood since UTSA's inaugural season in 2011, as he piled up 546 receiving yards and three touchdowns on 42 catches to come up only 32 yards shy of Kam Jones' freshman standard of 578. He had a 72-yard TD reception against Army that now ranks as the eighth-longest pass play in program history and he nearly notched his first career 100-yard game with 94 in the 49-34 win at Temple and again with 91 in the 49-21 home triumph over South Florida. McCuin opened the 2024 campaign with a career night, catching 11 passes — one shy of the school record and the sixth-best total in the FBS this fall — for 79 yards and two touchdowns in the 28-16 win over Kennesaw State. He followed that with a team-high six receptions and 29 yards versus Texas State and then added five catches for 27 yards at No. 2 Texas. He currently ranks second in the American Athletic Conference and 13th nationally with 7.3 receptions per game.

BORN TO PLAY QB

UTSA redshirt sophomore Owen McCown was born to play quarterback. The lefthander is the son of Josh McCown, who was a third-round draft pick in 2002 and played 18 seasons in the NFL after a collegiate career at SMU and Sam Houston. Two of his uncles also played the position. Luke McCown starred at Louisiana Tech before he was selected in the fourth round of the 2004 NFL Draft and enjoyed a 12-year NFL career. Randy McCown played quarterback at Texas A&M from 1996-99, helping the Aggies to the 1998 Big 12 Conference Championship. Those three McCown brothers all played for UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor when he was an assistant coach at Jacksonville High School in the 1990s. Owen won the starting quarterback job coming out of training camp this season and he made the best of his second start as a Roadrunner. He completed 28 of 38 passes for 340 yards and three touchdowns and also ran for another score to help lead UTSA to a 28-16 victory over Kennesaw State, earning Manning Award QB of the Week and American Athletic Conference Honorable Mention Player of the Week accolades for his performance. In his first start at UTSA last December, the transfer from Colorado threw for 251 yards and two TDs on 22-of-31 passing to help guide the Roadrunners to a 35-17 triumph over Marshall in the 2023 Frisco Bowl for the program's first-ever bowl win. He made a splash in his UTSA debut last September by breaking the school's single-game completion percentage record against No. 20 Tennessee, connecting on 18 of 20 passes (90%) for 170 yards and a pair of TDs. Through three games this season, McCown has thrown for 577 yards and three TDs on 59-of-90 passing (65.6%).

TAKEAWAY STREAK

UTSA will enter the Houston Christian game with a streak of 13 consecutive games with a takeaway, a stretch that started on Sept. 23, 2023 at No. 20 Tennessee. After going through the first three games of the 2023 season without a takeaway, the Roadrunners finished with 17 over the last 10 contests. UTSA tallied 10 interceptions, led by two apiece from Elliott Davison, Nicktroy Fortune and Kam Alexander, and recovered seven fumbles, paced by two from Ronald Triplette last year. The Roadrunners have opened 2024 with at least one takeaway in each of the first three contests. Jimmy Wyrick forced a key fumble that was recovered by Syrus Dumas in the fourth quarter of the 28-16 win over Kennesaw State. On the opening possession against Texas State, Zach Morris registered the Roadrunners' first interception of the campaign. Owen Pewee had a first-quarter interception and Brevin Randle recovered a fumble in the second half versus No. 2 Texas to push the season takeaway total to four and the streak to 13 games.

ROADRUNNERS AMONG ACTIVE LEADERS IN GAMES PLAYED

Several UTSA players are among active FBS leaders in career games played entering this weekend's game versus Houston Christian. Oscar Cardenas has 60 games under his belt, which stands second in the FBS and seventh on the program's all-time list led by Kelechi Nwachuku's school-record 67 games played. Christian Clayton is tied for fourth among active FBS players with 57 games played, Ken Robinson is 26th (54) and Jamal Ligon and Donyai Taylor are part of a tie for 40th (53).

SACK ATTACK

UTSA enjoyed a record-setting season in 2023 for tackles for loss and sacks, and the defense has started the 2024 season with similar numbers. Last fall, the Roadrunners registered 99 tackles behind the line of scrimmage to eclipse the previous standard of 96 set in 2019. UTSA also shattered the program mark for sacks with 46, 13 more than the previous record established in 2021 with the benefit of one more game. The Roadrunners led the American Athletic Conference in both categories and they ranked second in the FBS in sacks per game (3.54) and fifth in tackles for loss per contest (7.6). Individually, Jimmori Robinson returns after recording 11 TFLs, 4.5 sacks and a program-record 10 quarterback hurries. In the 2024 season-opening win over Kennesaw State, the Roadrunners racked up 10 tackles for loss, including a sack each by Robinson, Martavius French and

James Walley Jr. That marked the fifth time UTSA has tallied double-digit TFLs in a game over the past two seasons and the ninth time to record three-plus sacks during that stretch. Robinson added his second sack of the year against Texas State, one of five TFLs on the day for the Roadrunners, and the senior outside linebacker currently ranks third in the American Athletic Conference in sacks per game (0.67). UTSA totaled six tackles behind the line of scrimmage, including a sack for a 10-yard loss by Donyai Taylor, versus No. 2 Texas to push the season tallies to 21 TFLs and five sacks.

D-LINE DEPTH KEEPS ROADRUNNERS FRESH

UTSA has taken advantage of a deep defensive line room with a rotation aimed to keep players fresh throughout the game. The Roadrunners played at least nine d-linemen and as many as a dozen in three different games in 2023. UTSA rotated nine players up front in the 28-16 season-opening victory over Kennesaw State, as Brandon Brown, Jameian Buxton, Christian Clayton, Joe Evans, Tai Leonard, Chidera Otutu, Asyrus Simon, Ronald Triplette and Daemian Wimberly all saw action. Those nine plus Jon Jones played in each of the last two games. UTSA welcomed back eight players at the position who saw action last fall, led by veterans Brown, a member of the Outland Trophy Watch List, and Evans, who has earned a spot on watch lists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Shrine Bowl 1000, Reese's Senior Bowl. Brown logged 4.5 tackles for loss, two quarterback hurries and a sack en route to third-team all-conference honors in 2023. Evans posted 2.5 TFLs, a pair of sacks and a safety last season while also collecting third-team all-league accolades.

LINEBACKER LEADER

A starter at inside linebacker since he stepped foot on campus in 2020, Jamal Ligon has developed into one of the team leaders. The fifth-year senior from Tyler, Texas, who landed on this year's Shrine Bowl 1000 already owns the UTSA career mark for assisted tackles with 152, which ranks eighth among active FBS players. He is on pace to become the Roadrunners' all-time leader in total tackles, as he boasts 294 after logging nine through the first three contests this season, putting him 10th among active FBS players in total tackles. Ligon has moved past Triston Wade (293) into second place on UTSA's career chart, only 21 stops shy of Rashad Wisdom's school record of 315. The three-time all-conference selection also is on track to become the program's record holder in starts, as he now has 49, only seven short of the mark held by Joshua Cephus and Wisdom. As a true freshman, he set the school standard for total tackles in a game with 19 in a win over Middle Tennessee in 2020. Last season, Ligon posted 62 total tackles, 35 unassisted stops, seven tackles for loss, five quarterback hurries, one sack, one forced fumble and a pass breakup while earning honorable mention All-American Athletic Conference honors.

OURS (TAYLOR'S VERSION)

UTSA senior Donyai Taylor is following in the footsteps of former teammate and older brother, Dadrian, who started his career in 2018 and donned the number *seven* jersey for the 2020 through 2022 seasons as a standout at the Roadrunners' money backer position. Donyai, who has played the same spot as his sibling since his true freshman campaign in 2020, earned the coveted single-digit jersey in a vote by his teammates last season, choosing the same number *seven* that Dadrian wore. The younger brother and Shiner High School product, who is keeping that same number in 2024, started all 12 games last fall and registered 46 total tackles, seven tackles for loss, two sacks, six quarterback hurries, two pass breakups, a 78-yard interception return and a 19-yard fumble return en route to second-team All-American Athletic Conference honors. He made his 2024 debut against No. 2 Texas with three total stops, including a sack of Arch Manning for a 10-yard loss.

STEADY SAFETIES

UTSA's secondary is led in part by the steady senior safety duo of Elliott Davison and Ken Robinson. Despite playing in only 12 of the 13 games last fall, Robinson, a South Grand Prairie High School product, led the Roadrunners in total tackles with 66 to go along with four pass breakups

and a quarterback hurry. Davison, a native of Tyler, registered 40 stops and a pair of interceptions — including one that was returned 76 yards — in his first season at UTSA after transferring from UIW. Robinson paced the Roadrunners with seven stops in each of the first two games this year to give him a share of the team lead with 14, including two for loss. Davison also has recorded 14 total stops and a PBU through three contests in 2024.

CARPENTER MAKES HISTORY

UTSA junior Chris Carpenter has stamped his name in the school record book as one of the top returners in program history. In 2022, he brought back a kickoff 97 yards for a score against Texas Southern, the first kickoff return touchdown in program history. Last season, the Jacksonville, Texas, native returned a punt 50 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter of the 34-14 home triumph over Rice to become the first Roadrunner to record a punt and kickoff return for a TD. The punt return TD versus the Owls was the third in school annals, as he joined Kenny Harrison (79-yard TD vs. Texas State, 2012) and Sheldon Jones (76-yard return vs. Lamar in 2021). Carpenter finished 2023 ranked sixth in the league and 34th nationally in punt return average (6.8).

PAT STREAK SECOND IN FBS

The Roadrunners boast the second-longest streak of consecutive extra points made after starting the 2024 season a perfect 6 for 6 behind the leg of Chase Allen. The stretch of consecutive PATs now stands at 202 dating back to the win over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020. NC State has the longest active streak at 257.

TV BIRDS

Saturday's game will air on ESPN+, marking 141 straight televised/streamed appearances for the Roadrunners. The last UTSA game that was not broadcast was the 2012 season finale against Texas State.

BROTHERLY DUOS

UTSA is one of 30 FBS teams that have at least two sets of brothers. The Roadrunners list junior wide receiver Elliott Brow and junior cornerback Errionn Brow along with senior inside linebacker Fred Lewis and junior safety Jermarius Lewis. Colorado leads the way with six sets of brothers.

A FOCUS ON RECRUITING TEXAS

UTSA's 118-man roster features 93 players — 79% — who hail from the state of Texas. Georgia and Mississippi stand second with four players apiece, while there are two each from Alabama, Florida and Louisiana. Arizona, Arkansas, Hawaii, Iowa, Maryland, Massachusetts, Oregon, Tennessee and Virginia each have produced one current Roadrunner. Caile Hogan is the lone UTSA player from Australia and Cory Godinet is the first Roadrunner from American Samoa.

« KEEPING THEM HOME »

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor and his staff have placed an emphasis on recruiting the city of San Antonio and surrounding area. This year's roster includes 16 players from the San Antonio area.

Since his arrival in December 2019 head coach Jeff Traylor has instilled into the program his 210 Triangle Of Toughness — run the football, be physical on defense and be sound on special teams — and its Culture Pillars: Integrity, Passion, Mental & Physical Toughness, Selfless and Perfect Effort. As part of that culture, the players voted during fall camp on who would earn single-digit jersey numbers, a reward for representing mental and physical toughness on and off the field. The numbers 2, 1 and 0 — San Antonio's area code — were chosen for the players voted to represent the 210 Triangle of Toughness brand. Offensive linemen (51) CJ James Jr., (53) Cory Godinet, (75) Venly Tatafu and (77) Makai Hart also received the necessary votes but cannot change to a single-digit number due to their position.

PRO 'RUNNERS

UTSA currently has three players on NFL active rosters and five on practice squads or the injured list. Marcus Davenport became the first Roadrunner to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft when the Saints picked him 14th overall in 2018. The defensive end is in his first season with the Lions after spending 2023 on the Vikings roster. Tariq Woolen was selected by the Seahawks in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft. Now in his third season, the cornerback led the league with six interceptions and was a Pro Bowl selection as a rookie and has twice been voted by his peers to the NFL's Top 100 list. Spencer Burford was a fourth-round pick by the 49ers in 2022 and is in his third year as an offensive guard in San Francisco. Additionally, Joshua Cephus (Jaguars), Sincere McCormick (Raiders), Leroy Watson (Titans) and Rashad Wisdom (Buccaneers) are on practice squads, while Eric Banks is on the Buccaneers injured list.

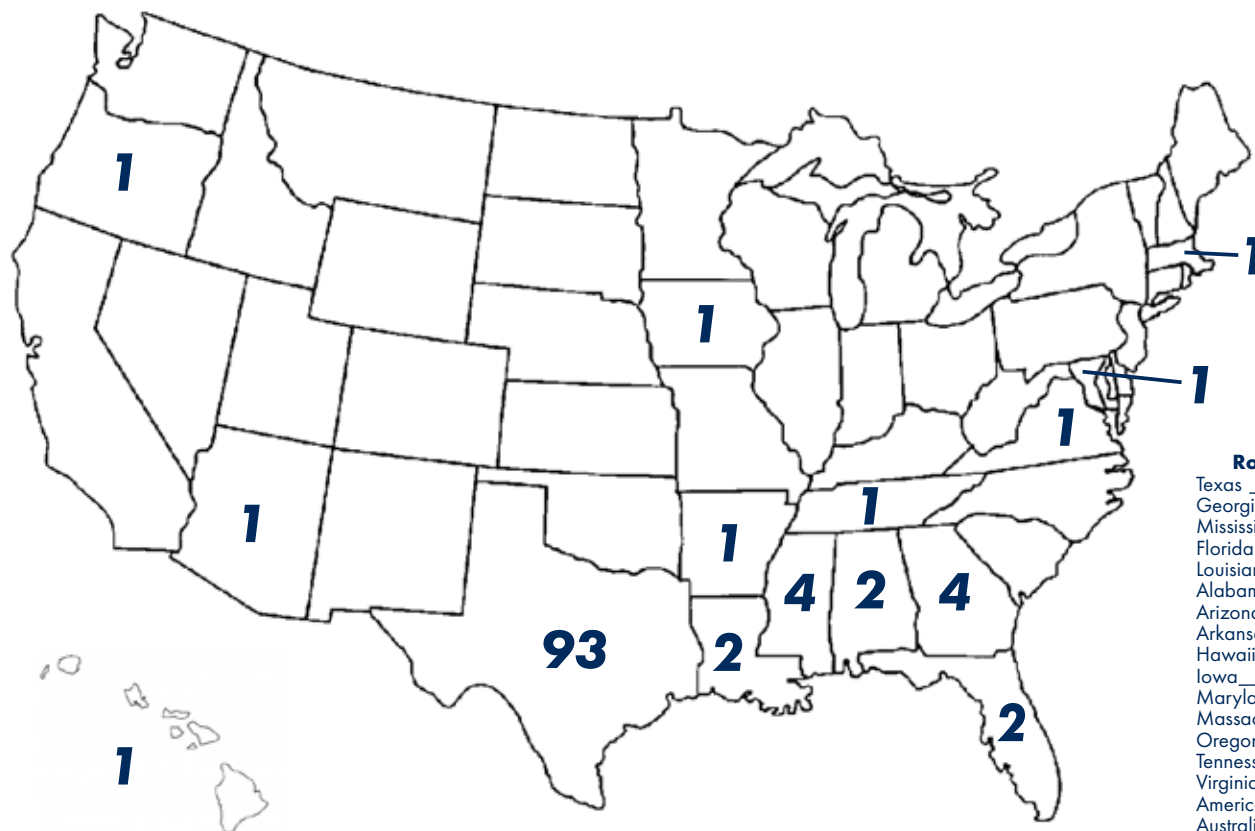

UTSA 26, KENNESAW STATE 16 Saturday, Aug. 31 San Antonio, Texas (Alamodome)

SAN ANTONIO — Owen McCown passed for 340 yards and three touchdowns and the UTSA defense held Kennesaw State to 253 total yards in a 28-16 win in the season opener on Saturday in front of 25,911 fans at the Alamodome.

With the win, the Roadrunners notched their 50th all-time home victory and improved to 24-3 in San Antonio under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor, who ran his overall record to 40-14.

Making his second start as a Roadrunner, McCown directed three first-half scoring drives that helped UTSA build a 21-3 lead over the Owls in the first meeting between the two teams. The redshirt sophomore connected with 10 different pass-catchers, led by Devin McCuin, who caught a career-high 11 balls for 79 yards and two TDs. Willie McCoy caught four passes for 59 yards with a long of 45, Patrick Overmyer and Houston Thomas had three receptions apiece for 31 and 28 yards, respectively, and Oscar Cardenas surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards with a pair of grabs for 38 yards.

Meanwhile, the defense was near-dominant at times, holding the Owls' dangerous ground game to only 51 rushing yards and a 1.3-yards-per-carry average. The Roadrunners racked up 10 tackles for loss, including three sacks with one apiece by Jimmori Robinson, Martavius French and James Welley Jr. Ken Robinson led UTSA with seven tackles and a TFL, while Owen Pewee and Elliott Davison made six and five stops, respectively.

UTSA marched 53 yards on the game's opening possession to put points on the board first. McCown completed passes for 16 yards to McCuin and 18 yards to Thomas on back-to-back plays to help set up a 2-yard TD pass to McCuin. Chase Allen's extra point made it 7-0.

The Owls answered with a 44-yard field goal by Austin Welch to cap a 44-yard drive that chewed 5:48 off the clock.

The Roadrunners tacked on a second touchdown in the opening frame as McCown found paydirt on a 5-yard run to put an exclamation point on an 11-play, 75-yard march and gave the home side a 14-3 advantage. That drive was highlighted by a 29-yard reception from DJ Allen.

McCown connected with McCuin again for a score early in the second stanza, this time on a 4-yard pass over the middle that extended the lead to 21-3. Robert Henry Jr.'s 61-yard reception down to the 6-yard line keyed the drive.

Welch drilled a 34-yard field in the final minute of the opening half to provide the 21-6 halftime margin.

Welch hit his third field goal of the day with a 31-yarder at the 2:06 mark of a low-scoring third quarter that pulled the visitors within 21-9.

Kennesaw State made things interesting in the fourth quarter when Carson Kent hauled in a 25-yard touchdown pass over the middle. Welch's PAT pulled the Owls within five points with 9:23 remaining.

UTSA put the game away when McCown found Cardenas wide open in the end zone on a 3-yard pass with 3:52 left to play.

Davis Bryson completed 14 of 28 passes for 202 yards and a touchdown for the Owls, while Baron Hopson recorded a game-best 13 tackles.

TEXAS STATE 49, UTSA 10 Saturday, Sept. 7 San Marcos, Texas (UTCU Stadium)

SAN MARCOS — UTSA dropped a 49-10 decision to Texas State in the I-35 Showdown on Saturday afternoon at UFCU Stadium.

The Roadrunners fell to 1-1 on the season with their first setback in the six-game series with the Bobcats, who improved to 2-0 with the win.

UTSA saw two different quarterbacks combine to pass for 252 yards, as Owen McCown completed 10 passes for 105 in the first half and Eddie Lee Marburger piled up 147 yards and a touchdown on 14 completions, all after halftime. Marburger also had a career-high 23 rushing yards on five attempts.

Marburger connected with Willie McCoy on a 2-yard TD pass in the third quarter, and McCoy also had a 40-yard reception in the fourth, as the senior receiver racked up a team-high 59 receiving yards on three catches.

Devin McCuin led all Roadrunners with six grabs for 29 yards, Patrick Overmyer had three receptions for 31 yards and Chris Carpenter hauled in two passes for 43 yards.

Defensively, Ken Robinson paced UTSA with seven tackles including one for a loss. Martavius French and Jimmori Robinson made five stops with one TFL apiece, while Jermain Lewis, Owen Pewee and Brevin Randle also recorded five tackles each.

Texas State used a balanced offense in the win, posting 504 total yards, 309 passing and 195 rushing. Jordan McCloud completed 18 of 27 passes for 309 yards and two touchdowns, while Chris Dawn Jr. had 150 yards and both TDs on only five receptions. Lincoln Pare rushed for a game-high 109 yards and a pair of scores.

UTSA came up with the first big play of the day, as cornerback Zach Morris picked off a pass at the Texas State's 33-yard line on the game's opening possession. However, UTSA could not capitalize on the field position, turning the ball back over to the Bobcats on downs.

Texas State got on the board first when McCloud scrambled for a 17-yard touchdown run at the 6:19 mark of the opening period.

UTSA responded with a 13-play, 66-yard drive that was highlighted by a Houston Thomas 44-yard reception and capped with a 26-yard field goal from Chase Allen.

The Bobcats then reeled off 28 unanswered points over the rest of the first half to take a 35-3 lead into the locker room. McCloud scored on a 2-yard keeper up the middle in the final minute of the first quarter, then connected with Dawn on a 46-yard TD pass early in the second. Deion Hankins had a 2-yard touchdown plunge with 4:39 left in the half and Pare scored on a 45-yard, fourth-down dash up the middle with 1:52 on the clock.

Texas State added to its lead with a 21-yard TD catch by Dawn midway through the third quarter.

UTSA converted a fourth-down-and-goal into a score late in the third quarter when Marburger found McCoy in the end zone for a 2-yard TD reception.

Pare added the final score of the day on a 33-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

AUSTIN, Texas — Robert Henry Jr. rushed for 65 yards and a touchdown and Martavius French had a team-high seven tackles, but it was not enough in a 56-7 setback to No. 2 Texas on Saturday night in front of 101,892 at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium.

Henry led the Roadrunners' ground game and scored the lone TD of the day on a 53-yard dash in the second quarter, as UTSA (1-2) rushed for 128 on the day.

French paced a defense that came up with two takeaways — an interception by Owen Pewee and a fumble recovery by Brevin Randle — extending the streak of consecutive games with a takeaway to 13 dating back to last September. Jamal Ligon, Brevin Randle, Elliott Davison and Jimmy Wyrick registered five tackles apiece.

Arch Manning came off the bench to throw for 223 yards and four touchdowns, rushing for another to help the Longhorns (3-0) post 614 total yards, including 427 passing. Ryan Wingo had a game-high 127 receiving yards and Isaiah Bond added 103.

The Longhorns drove 84 yards in eight plays, the last a 7-yard touchdown pass from Quinn Ewers to Bond that put the home team on the board first.

Later in the opening quarter, Pewee came up with his second career interception and returned it 11 yards to the Texas 31-yard line. However, UTSA could not take advantage of field position, turning the ball back over on downs.

Texas pushed its lead to 21-0 after 19-yard TD receptions by Johntay Cook II and DeAndre Moore Jr., but the Roadrunners got on the board when Henry broke loose for his 53-yard sprint to paydirt. Chase Allen's extra point made it 21-7 with 11:39 left in the second quarter.

The Longhorns answered, as Manning, who came on in relief for an injured Ewers, got loose for a 67-yard TD run to extend the lead back to 21.

Texas quickly upped its lead early in the third quarter with a pair of touchdown passes by Manning, one for 51 yards to Bond and a second for 75 yards to Wingo.

Manning added another touchdown pass early in the final frame, connecting with Cook II for a 12-yard score.

Ethan Burke picked off a pass in the final two minutes and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown to provide the final margin.

The Roadrunners will return home to host Houston Christian next Saturday, Sept. 21. Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. at the Alamodome.
