HOMECOMING

THE STORYLINES . . .

- This week's game is the fourth for both Tulsa and UTSA in American Athletic Conference play.
- Tulsa will be looking for its first AAC win, while UTSA is coming off its first league win with a 38-24 home win last week.
- Tulsa is in its 128th season of football with its first year coming in 1895, while UTSA is only in its 14th season of football, with its inaugural year in 2011.
- Tulsa is in its 11th season in the American Athletic Conference while UTSA is in its second year of AAC play.
- The Hurricane has a pretty balanced attack, averaging 203.9 yards and scoring nine touchdowns through the air, and rushing for 167.1 yards.
- For UTSA, the Roadrunners have been more effective through the air, throwing for 267.6 yards to rank third in the AAC, and ninth in rushing with 141.6 yards.



THE SERIES . . .

- This is the second meeting between Tulsa and UTSA.
- The two teams only other meeting came on Nov. 2, 2013, as the Roadrunners claimed a 34-15 victory at Chapman Stadium.
- The last meeting between the two teams was also on Tulsa's Homecoming.

ON HOMECOMING . . .

- Tulsa has posted an overall 54-41-3 record on Homecoming.
- Tulsa's first Homecoming game was in 1926 at McNulty Park against the Arkansas Razorbacks, defeating the visitors 14-7.
- Tulsa's first Homecoming game at H.A. Chapman Stadium (then called Skelly Field) was on Oct. 25 as the Hurricane defeated Phillips University, 25-0.
- The Hurricane has dropped its last two Homecoming games, losing 45-34 against SMU in 2022 and last year in overtime to Charlotte, 33-26.
- Since 2000, Tulsa has a 13-10 Homecoming record.

FIRST & TEN . . .

- Tulsa averaged 29.8 points in its four non-conference games, but in its first three AAC games has averaged just 12.3 points.
- RB **Anthony Watkins** scored his first career receiving TD, coming on a 63-yard pass play at Temple, while leading Tulsa in receiving with 73 yards on three catches.
- Tulsa has used three QBs in six of seven games this year ... the only game not using three QBs came against LA Tech.
- Sixth-year TE **Ethan Hall** has played in the most games (55) and made the most starts (34) on the Tulsa roster.
- Redshirt freshman QB **Kirk Francis** has thrown for 1,217 yards and 7 touchdowns in the first seven games this year, while moving into fifth place on the all-time freshman passing chart.
- Graduate WR/PR **Kamdyn Benjamin** ranks first nationally for punt return TDs (1) and eighth for punt returns (15.5 ypg).

KEVIN WILSON IN SECOND YEAR LEADING THE TULSA FOOTBALL PROGRAM . . .

- Kevin Wilson (North Carolina '84) is in his second season as the Tulsa head coach.
- He was introduced as The University of Tulsa's 34th head football coach on December 6, 2022.
- With Tulsa's season opening 62-8 win over NSU, Wilson's opening day record improved to 7-1 as a head coach.
- He finished his first year with a 4-8 overall record in a year that saw Tulsa take on three top-20 ranked foes, and has a current 6-13 mark at Tulsa.
- Wilson's career head coaching record is 32-60.
- He spent the previous six seasons as the offensive coordinator and tight ends coach at Ohio State.
- In 2022, Wilson was selected as one the inaugural recipients of the GRAPHITE Award, which recognizes excellence in Offensive Play Calling Efficiency, presented by RII Sports Technology.
- His Play Calling Efficiency Rating (PCER) of 80.2% during the 2022 campaign was the highest in the Big 10 Conference and ranked in the 96th percentile among all FBS programs.
- Before his stint at Ohio State, Wilson spent six years as the Indiana head coach, where he posted a 26-47 record and led the Hoosiers to two straight bowl games.
- He also coached at Oklahoma, Northwestern, Miami (Ohio), North Carolina A&T, Winston Salem and his alma mater, North Carolina, as a graduate assistant.
- Wilson has been a part of 13 seasons with 10 or more victories and has coached in four national championship games, including three at Oklahoma and one with Ohio State.

FORMER WALK-ONS TO KEY CONTRIBUTORS . . .

- On the 2024 roster, Tulsa has four former walk-ons making big contributions to the Golden Hurricane roster.
- WR **Kamdyn Benjamin** and OL **Walter Young Bear** had already earned their scholarships before the 2023 season, while QB **Kirk Francis** and SAF **Dayne Hodge** were put on scholarship after the 2023 season.
- This year, all four of these former walk-ons, are in starting roles.
- In his sixth year, **Benjamin** has a team-leading 500 receiving yards on 42 receptions with two TDs, while he ranks eighth nationally for punt returns with a 15.5 average on 10 returns ... last year, Benjamin led Tulsa receiving yards (727) and receiving TDS (6).
- The junior **Hodge** leads the Tulsa defense with 44 tackles in his 7 starts, while adding three pass breakups, one interception and one forced fumble ... last season, Hodge ended the year starting eight games and totaling 57 tackles, 1.5 TFL, one interception and has caused two fumbles.
- **Young Bear** has started all 7 games this year at left guard ... a year ago, Young Bear played in all 12 games and started the final two contests at left guard as a sophomore.
- **Francis** saved his redshirt year as a true freshman in 2023, but did play in the final four games ... this year, he has thrown for 1,217 yards and 7 TDs ... a year ago, he completed 68-of-121 passes for 967 yards with 6 TDs, and just 3 INT, while throwing for the second-most yards in school history as a freshman with 345 yards at Tulane.

TU FOOTBALL BREAKS COLOR BARRIER 60 YEARS AGO . . .

- On Sept. 26, 1964, Willie Townes, Richard Tyson, Charlie Brown, Randy Phillips and Jimmy Brown officially broke the color barrier for TU, suiting up for the Golden Hurricane at Arkansas ... TU finished the season 9-2 with a Bluebonnet Bowl victory over Ole Miss.
- Townes would go on to be one of the best defensive linemen to ever suit up at Tulsa, earning an Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America selection in 1964 and MVP of the Bluebonnet Bowl ... he is a member of the 1986 TU Hall of Fame Class and had a seven-year NFL career.
- Charlie Brown would get drafted by the LA Rams in the 16th round of the 1965 draft.

THE BA BOYS . . .

- Graduate transfer linebackers **Gavin Potter** and **Zach Marcheselli** were reunited this year returning to the area where the two were high school teammates at Broken Arrow High School.
- As prep seniors in 2018, Potter and Marcheselli helped lead Broken Arrow HS to the Class 6A-1 state championship, the school's first state title in 10-8 years of football ... each were also state champion wrestlers.
- Before coming to Tulsa, Potter played four seasons at Kansas and a year at Arkansas State, while Marcheselli spent all his previous five seasons at TCU.
- On the year, Potter is ranked second on the team with 43 tackles, while Marcheselli is next with 28 stops.
- The duo made their Tulsa debut in the season opener by sharing the team lead with five tackles apiece ... Marcheselli also had 2.5 TFL for -7 yards, while Potter had 1.5 TFL for -2 yards on top of a quarterback hurry.
- Potter also has a team-leading 8 TFL for -26 yards, while Marcheselli has 5.5 TFL for -11 yards.

YOUTH INVASION . . .

- This season, Tulsa has had 23 true freshmen and seven redshirt freshmen see playing time.
- Among the 23 true freshmen, five players have been in the starting lineup at least once on the year.
- DB **Elijah Green** has two starts (LA Tech, UNT), while DB **Ashton Williams**, WR **Joseph Williams** (Army), RB **Lloyd Avant** (LA Tech) and OT **Brody Duffel** (Temple) have each started one game.
- On offense, RBs **Lloyd Avant** and **Viron Ellison** have combined to rush for 301 yards on 68 carries for 4.4 yards per carry.
- WRs **Corey Smith**, **Joseph Williams**, **Jacob Emmers** and **Josh Smith** have combined for 17 receptions for 237 yards ... Smith leads the way with 9 catches for 127 yards and one TD.
- Two true freshman offensive linemen – **Brody Duffel** and **Jack Tanner** have appeared in five games each, while Duffel started at left tackle at Temple.
- Defensively, Tulsa has seen the most influx of freshmen in the secondary with **Buddha Garrett**, **Ashton Williams**, **Zach Williams**, **Elijah Green**, **Dax Collins**, **Dedaunte Scott** all seeing action.
- Garrett has 21 tackles and one pass breakup, Ashton Williams has totaled 15 stops, Zach Williams 14 tackles and one pass breakup and Green with 10 stops.
- LB **Maruio White Jr.** has totaled eight stops and defensive ends **Will Smith** and **Jaxon Lee** have three and two stops apiece.

THE RB CORPS . . .

- This season, 15 different Hurricane have carried the ball whether at running back, quarterback or wide receiver.
- Four running backs have carried the load for the Hurricane run game to average 167.3 yards per game.
- Graduate **Anthony Watkins** leads the way with a team-high 271 yards, 4.4 average and three TDs ... he has gained 1,815 career rushing yards and 11 TDs on 351 carries for a 5.2 average at Tulsa.
- Junior **Bill Jackson II** is second behind Watkins in the ground game with 249 yards on 5.8 yards per carry ... Jackson has 849 career yards and a touchdown on 165 carries for a 5.1 average.
- A pair of freshmen, **Lloyd Avant** and **Viron Ellison Jr.**, have each gained over 100 yards per game with Avant rushing for 188 yards and Ellison 113 yards.

ELECTRIC KICK RETURNER . . .

- True freshman **Lloyd Avant** leads Tulsa for kick returns with 209 yards and a 29.9 average on seven returns this year.
- He began his career with a bang when he gained 127 yards on two kickoff returns in his first collegiate game against Northwestern State.
- Avant had a 100-yard house call in the fourth quarter and is one of 18 FBS players to take a kickoff back for a touchdown this season.

COMEBACK WINS . . .

• Since 2015, Tulsa has had 30 games in which the Hurricane has trailed and come back to win . . . in 2016, Tulsa had its biggest come-from-behind win in school history and second-biggest in NCAA Division I history (now 3rd), trailing 31-0 at Fresno State in the second quarter and winning 48-41 in overtime . . . the next largest comeback win was 21 points in 2020 against SMU.

AIR BENJAMIN . . .

- Graduate wide receiver **Kamdyn Benjamin** has been a threat for the Tulsa offense this season, as well as ranking among the American Athletic Conference leaders this season.
- The former walk-on has caught a team-high 42 passes for 500 yards and two TDs.
- Benjamin is second in the AAC for receptions with a 6.0 average per game and fifth for receiving yards per game at 71.4.
- He also ranks third for punt return yardage (15.5 ypg) and eighth for all-purpose yards (96.0 ypg) . . . his 15.5 yards per punt return also ranks eighth nationally.
- Benjamin also had his first career punt return for a TD with a 66-yard return against Northwestern State in the season opener and is one of just 36 FBS players to have a KOR for a touchdown.

THE GAME ON HIS FOOT . . .

- Graduate placekicker **Seth Morgan** played the hero in Tulsa's win at LA Tech, connecting on a clutch 45-yard field goal to send the game into overtime and then hitting the game-winner from 34 yards out.
- He finished the game 3-of-3 on field goals and knocked through his two extra points, making him responsible for 11 of TU's 23 points.
- He was named the Co-American Athletic Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts . . . Morgan joined graduate wide receiver/punt returner **Kamdyn Benjamin** in winning the weekly award this season.
- Morgan was also named a Lou Groza Award Star of the Week for Week 4, which highlights standout performances of three FBS Division I kickers each week.
- Thru seven games, Morgan has converted 8-of-10 field goals and is on a current streak of 7-for-7 . . . he has also made 17-of-18 free throws.

WEARING DADS NUMBER . . .

- On Oct. 27, 2018, Tulsa All-American offensive lineman Jerry Ostroski had his jersey No. 55 retired.
- Amongst his family at the ceremony was son **Owen Ostroski**, who later would sign with the Golden Hurricane to follow his dad's playing career at Tulsa.
- A junior defensive end, Owen, has worn No. 48 in honor of another former TU player – the late New York Jets defensive end Dennis Byrd.
- This year, the number 55 will be put back in action as the younger Ostroski will be wearing his dad's number.
- Through the first 7 games, Ostroski has totaled 20 tackles, 6.5 TFL for -29 yards, one sack for -4 yards, two QB hurries and a 64-yard fumble return to set up Tulsa's winning touchdown vs. LA Tech.

MAKING THE MOVE TO DEFENSE . . .

- After spending his first four seasons at Tulsa as a receiver, senior **Malachai Jones** made the move to safety in spring drills.
- The secondary position is not foreign to Jones, as he played receiver, safety and cornerback at Houston Westfield HS.
- Jones earned the start in the season opener against Northwestern State and has started all 7 games this year.
- He has registered 27 tackles, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.
- Jones had a career-high 7 tackles vs. Temple and added 6 stops at Arkansas State.
- After redshirting in 2020, Jones has played receiver for the next three seasons and caught 49 passes for 630 yards and 4 TDs.

NEW FACES . . .

- Tulsa's 2024 squad consists of 56 total newcomers, making up 45 percent of the roster.
- Among the new faces, 27 are scholarship freshmen, 12 are four-year scholarship transfers, two JUCO scholarship transfers and 15 walk-ons.

A SPECIAL OPENER FOR THE SPECIAL TEAMS . . .

- Part of Tulsa's 62-point outburst in its season opening win over Northwestern State was a pair of special teams touchdowns.
- Midway through the first quarter, graduate wide receiver and punt returner **Kamdyn Benjamin** fielded a punt at the TU 34 and took it 66 yards for pay dirt ... it was Tulsa's first punt return touchdown since Trey Watts returned a punt 54 yards against UCF in the Conference USA Championship Game on Dec. 1, 2012.
- Near the beginning of the fourth quarter **Lloyd Avant** received a kickoff in the endzone and took it straight downfield for a 100-yard touchdown return, the first kickoff return for a TD since Anthony Watkins went 97 yards against Navy in 2021, and first 100-yard return since Ashlan Davis against Boise State in 2004.

KAM AND KIRK PICK UP WEEKLY HONORS . . .

- For their performances in week one, graduate wide receiver **Kamdyn Benjamin** and redshirt freshman **Kirk Francis** garnered The American weekly honors.
- Benjamin was named The American Special Teams Player of the Week, while Francis was tabbed as a The American Weekly Honorable Mention.
- Francis threw for 299 yards and four touchdowns, while Benjamin tallied 85 yards in punt returns, including a 66-yard touchdown return in the first... he finished with 150 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns.

TULSA QUARTERBACKS IN THE SEASON OPENER . . .

- **Kirk Francis** got the starting nod for game one and was the only of Tulsa's quarterbacks to throw a pass, but all three played.
- Francis finished 23-of-30 for 299 yards and four touchdowns, tying Seth Boomer (at UCONN, 2018) for TD passes by a Tulsa freshman ... Francis led all The American quarterbacks with a 204.4 efficiency rating.
- Redshirt sophomore **Cardell Williams** rushed the ball four times, finishing with 35 yards ... he broke off a 22-yard touchdown run in the fourth to cap TU's scoring.
- Graduate transfer quarterback **Cooper Legas** finished with seven yards on two carries as the quarterback.

TULSA RANKS SIXTH AMONG ALL FBS SCHOOLS FOR CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS ...

- Tulsa has won the sixth-most conference championships among FBS schools with a total of 35 league titles.
- Oklahoma (50), Nebraska (46), Michigan (45), Ohio State (39) and Southern Cal (37) are the only schools with more than Tulsa (35). Alabama (34), Texas (31), Fresno State (29) and Utah (28) round out the top 10 teams.
- Tulsa has played in the Oklahoma Collegiate Conference (1914-28; 5 titles), Big Four Conference (1929-32; 3 titles), Missouri Valley Conference (1935-85; 25 titles), Western Athletic Conference (1996-2004; 0 titles), Conference USA (2005-13; 2 titles) and the American Athletic Conference (2014-present; 0 titles).

GRADUATE TRANSFERS HIGHLIGHT LINEBACKER CORPS . . .

- Tulsa lost its four major contributors at linebacker from the 2023 season – graduates Mitchell Kulkin and Coleton Smith and transfers Julien Simon and Dorian Hopkins.
- This year, Tulsa added three graduate transfers at linebacker -- **Zach Marcheselli** from TCU, **Gavin Potter** from Arkansas State via Kansas, and **Chris Thompson Jr.** from USC via Auburn.
- Entering the season, the trio combined to play 14 years between them, playing in 123 games with 27 starts and have totaled 244 career tackles.
- Marcheselli and Potter played their prep football at nearby Broken Arrow High School.



BACK-TO-BACK FIRST ROUND DRAFT PICKS . . .

- **ZAVEN COLLINS** was selected by the Arizona Cardinals with the 16th pick of the first round in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- Collins left school after his junior redshirt season for the NFL after earning consensus and unanimous All-America honors.
- He was named the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Check Bednarik Award winner, two awards that recognize the nation's top defensive player.
- **TYLER SMITH** was the 24th pick in the 2022 NFL First Round by the Dallas Cowboys.
- Smith left school following his third year, He redshirted in 2019 and was a Freshman All-American in 2020.
- Tulsa now has four NFL First Round draft picks – the last was Steve August in 1977 and the first was Glenn Dobbs in 1943.
- Tulsa was the only school in Oklahoma to have a first-round draft pick in the last two NFL drafts.

- Entering this season, his sixth year of college football, **Zach Marcheselli** totaled 20 tackles, one INT and one PBU in 43 games at TCU.
- Also in his sixth year is Marcheselli's high school teammate **Gavin Potter** who entered the 2024 season playing in 48 career games with 25 starts ... Potter came into the season with 195 career tackles in his 4 years at Kansas and one season at Arkansas State.
- **Chris Thomas Jr.** entered his fifth season and brought with him 29 total tackles in 32 games with two starting assignments between his time at Auburn and USC.

CSC ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT SELECTIONS RETURN . . .

- Tulsa returned all three players who were named to the College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-District team for 2023.
- QB/Holder **Stephen Kittleman**, JACK **Zach Neilsen** and defensive end **Owen Ostroski** were tabbed to the 2023 Academic All-District Football Team, selected by the CSC.

FOUR-YEAR TRANSFERS . . .

- Tulsa has 12 four-year college scholarship transfers in their first season on the roster, including 5 on offense, 6 on defense and one specialist.
- The offensive newcomers include lineman **Ender Aguilar** (Cal) and **Jacob Waller** (SMU); receivers **Jeremiah Ballard** (UTEP) and **Zion Steptoe** (Purdue); and QB **Cooper Legas** (Utah State).
- On defense, the 4-year transfers are linebackers **Zach Marcheselli** (TCU), **Gavin Potter** (Arkansas State) and **Chris Thompson, Jr.** (USC); lineman **Amieh Williams** (Angelo State); JACK **Myles Jackson** (Indiana), and CB **Champ Lewis** (TCU).
- The lone specialist is kicker **Seth Morgan** (Memphis).
- Among the transfers, Aguilar, Steptoe, Marcheselli, Potter, Thompson and Jackson are starting for the Hurricane, while Morgan is handling field goals and PATs.
- Ballard and Lewis are out for the season with injuries.

Showbiz Jackson toured for 20 seasons with the Globetrotters, serving as one of the team's top showmen ... he was known for his unbelievable behind-the-back half-court shot that he sank with remarkable accuracy ... Jackson visited more than 75 countries during his standout career.
- **Tai Newhouse**, a defensive lineman, is cousins to former Dallas Cowboys fullback Robert Newhouse.
- Defensive end **Owen Ostroski's** father, Jerry, was an All-America offensive lineman at Tulsa in 1991 and went on to a nine-year NFL career with the Buffalo Bills ... Jerry is a TU Athletic Hall of Famer and has had his TU jersey 55 retired ... Owen changes his number from No. 48 to his dad's No. 55 for this season.
- Purdue transfer **Zion Steptoe** is also a second-generation TU player ... his father Sherman Steptoe was a defensive back at Tulsa (2000-03) and his stepdad, Marshall Gordon, also played in the secondary at Tulsa after starting his career as a receiver (1994-98).

AUSTRALIAN ANGUS DAVIES BACK FOR A SECOND YEAR OF AMERICAN FOOTBALL . . .

- Punter **Angus Davies** made his American football debut in 2023 as a true freshman with the Golden Hurricane.
- Davies is from Torquay, Victoria, Australia and played Australian Rules Football from ages 5-19, never playing American football until his freshman season at Tulsa.
- This year, Davies has continued his strong punting ability with a 42.1 average on 37 punts with 13 placed inside the 20-yard line and nine punts carrying 50+ yards.
- Davies finished the 2023 season averaging 42.7 yards with 23 of his 58 punts inside the 20-yard line.
- In his first collegiate game against UAPB in the 2023 season opener, Davies punted three times for an average of 45.0 yards per punt with a long of 54 yards ... he placed all three of his punts inside the 20-yard line, once at the five and twice at the 12-yard line.

NFL EXPERIENCE ON COACHING STAFF . . .

- Tulsa has four members of its coaching staff who at one time were on an NFL rosters ...
- Assistant Head Coach/Defensive Line Coach **Ron Burton** was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as an undrafted free agent after the 1987 NFL Draft ... he spent four seasons in the NFL ... Burton was converted to LB from a college defensive lineman ... led the team as a rookie with 19 special teams sacks ... started at left OLB in 1988 and had 74 tackles ... in 1989, he was with the Phoenix Cardinals and in 1990 signed as a free agent by the LA Raiders.
- Receivers Coach **Ryan Switzer** was a 2017 fourth round draft choice by the Dallas Cowboys and was with the Oakland Raiders, Pittsburgh Steelers and Cleveland Browns ... he completed his career with the Cleveland Browns in 2021 ... he had career totals of 50 receptions for 321 yards, 1,910 return yards and two touchdowns.
- Cornerbacks Coach **Dominique Franks** was a fifth-round draft (135th overall) choice by the Atlanta Falcons in 2010 ... Franks spent four seasons (2010-13) with the Falcons and part of the 2014 season with the Baltimore Ravens ... he ended his career with 48 tackles, 14 pass deflections and 3 INTs.
- Offensive Quality Control Coach **Lance Dunbar** was signed as an undrafted free agent by Dallas in 2012 and spent five seasons (2012-16) with the Cowboys ... he spent the 2017 campaign with the Rams and finished his pro career with the Dallas Renegades of the XFL in 2020 ... Dunbar finished his NFL career with 473 rushing yards, 647 receiving yards and 2 total TDs.

FRANCIS TO BENJAMIN . . .

- Last season's road trip to Tulane led to a breakout game for now redshirt freshman quarterback **Kirk Francis** and graduate **Kamdyn Benjamin** ... Francis finished 22-of-34 for 345 yards and a touchdown pass ... Benjamin led the team with 157 yards and two touchdowns off eight receptions.
- Including that game, Francis and Benjamin connected through the air for a touchdown in each of the next five games, a streak that ended against OSU.
- In that stretch of games, the pair connected 32 times for 585 yards and five touchdowns, breaking the 100-yard mark in three games ... Benjamin and Francis averaged 18.3 yards per reception together.
- In the streak-ending game, Benjamin and Francis still combined for six catches and 94 yards.
- This season, Benjamin has 42 receptions for 500 yards and two touchdowns ... 38 receptions and 473 yards have come from Francis, making up nearly 41-percent of Francis' 1,217 yards.

GOLDEN HURRICANE IN TULSA?

A year ago (2022) Tulsa celebrated the 100th anniversary of adopting the school's nickname of Golden Hurricane.

In 1922, first-year coach Howard Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Tulsa football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from QB Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION ...

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).

- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.

- Four former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks, Steve Largent and Drew Pearson

- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.

- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium and dedicated before the 2013 spring game.

- Zaven Collins may have staked claim to the greatest Tulsa football player when the consensus All-America linebacker was also named college football's top defender in 2020 by winning the Chuck Bednarik and Bronko Nagurski awards.

- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and now Houston Texans).

- Tulsa has three former players, two former head coaches and two former assistant coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame — the players are Glenn Dobbs (1940-42, 1961-68), who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley (1963-65) and Jerry Rhome (1963-64) — the head coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84) — the assistant coaches are Darrell Royal (1951) and Sammy Baugh (1963).

5 – KEUAN PARKER (5-9, 175, JR) – in his second year at Tulsa ... transferred in the spring 2023 semester after two years at Arkansas ... between Tulsa and Arkansas, has played in 16 games ... has played in 11 games with 9 starts in two years at Tulsa ... has 33 tackles and 5 PBUs in his Tulsa career ... has played in 5 games with 4 starts this season ... has totaled 15 tackles and a team-high 4 PBUs this year ... missed North Texas and Army with injury ... had a career-best 9 tackles vs. Arkansas State ... had 18 tackles and one PBU while playing in 6 games with 5 starts in 2023 ... in 2023, had a season-best 5 tackles vs. #8 Washington in his first Tulsa game played ... played in 5 games at Arkansas in 2022 ... played his prep football at Tulsa's Booker T. Washington HS, where he was rated as the No. 2 player in the state by *Rivals*.

- The American is the sixth conference affiliation for the Tulsa football program, while the previous five include: Oklahoma Collegiate Conference (1914-28), Big Four Conference (1929-32), Missouri Valley Conference (1935-85), Western Athletic Conference (1996-2004) and Conference USA (2005-13).
- Tulsa was an independent for 12 years, coming between the Missouri Valley and its entrance into the WAC in 1996.
- In nine years as a C-USA member, Tulsa compiled a 49-23 regular season league record and a 2-2 mark in C-USA Championship Games – Tulsa was 2-1 against UCF in C-USA title games and 0-1 against East Carolina, both now members of the American Athletic Conference.
- Tulsa made its first AAC Championship game appearance in 2020, falling to No. 6-ranked Cincinnati 27-24 on a field goal as time expired.

GAME 1

Tulsa 62, Northwestern State 28

Aug. 29, 2024 • H.A. Chapman Stadium

TULSA, Okla. — Another football season opener is in the books as the Golden Hurricane roared past Northwestern State 62-28 in front of 16,483 fans Thursday night at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Kirk Francis earned the starting nod and did not disappoint, tossing 299 yards and four touchdowns to three receivers on 23-of-30 passing. He spread the wealth, finding 10 different receivers on the evening.

Kamdyn Benjamin was the favorite target, with five receptions on seven targets for 65 yards and the season's first touchdown midway through the first quarter. On Tulsa's next touch of the ball, he'd give the Hurricane its first lead with an electric 66-yard touchdown return. Zion Steptoe didn't find the endzone but pulled down five passes of his own for 88 yards in his TU debut.

Jeremiah Ballard grabbed his first TU touchdown and redshirt sophomore Connor Vaughn recorded touchdowns on consecutive drives late in the second quarter. The second of which was an athletic toe-touch while falling out of bounds in the south endzone.

Ten Tulsa rushers combined for 323 yards on the night with two surpassing 50 yards. True freshman running back Lloyd Avant led the way with 64 yards on 11 carries. Avant added a brilliant 100-yard kickoff return early in the fourth quarter and finished the night with 191 yards of total offense. Redshirt junior Bill Jackson followed in rushing with 53 yards. Running back Anthony Watkins, quarterback Cardell Williams and wide receiver Braylin Presley each found the endzone on the ground.

Similar to last season's opener, the Hurricane found itself down early, but the offense responded quickly and scored early and often. The game was tied at 14 heading into the second, but TU scored four touchdowns in the second frame to take a 41-14 lead to the lockers.

Tulsa amassed a staggering 622 yards of offense on Thursday night, picking up an average of 8.8 yards per play. The defense did its part on the other side of the ball, holding NSU to 226 yards of total offense. Heading into the fourth, the Hurricane defense had allowed just 129 yards, 55 through the air and 74 on the ground.

Local products and grad transfers Gavin Potter and Zach Marcheselli each had a strong night in their first game in Tulsa uniforms. They, along with Chris Thompson Jr. led the team with five tackles each. Justin Lohrenz had the lone sack of the evening as part of his two tackles for loss. Five different Hurricane dropped an opponent for a loss with Tulsa recording 11 for -40 yards.

Arkansas State 28, Tulsa 24

Sept. 7, 2024 • Centennial Bank Stadium

JONESBORO, Ark. — The Arkansas State Red Wolves held off the Tulsa offense in the fourth quarter to beat the Golden Hurricane 28-24 in front of more than 19,000 fans at Centennial Bank Stadium on Saturday evening.

Tulsa falls to 1-1 on the season, while Arkansas State improves to 2-0 following back-to-back games to the wire. Tulsa will face a top 20 opponent next weekend when TU hosts Oklahoma State at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

After stopping Arkansas State on fourth down to open the game, it was Tulsa who got the board first with a Seth Morgan field goal from 29 yards out.

The Red Wolves responded with an 84-yard drive in five plays to go up 7-3. TU would hold Arkansas State off the scoreboard for the remainder of the opening half.

Arkansas State was threatening to extend its lead entering the second quarter, but Dayne Hodge ended the threat with his first interception of the season.

Kamdyn Benjamin put Tulsa back ahead with a 39-yard touchdown reception from Kirk Francis, capping a 10-play drive that traveled 90 yards. Later in the quarter, Cardell Williams entered as quarterback late in the second and extended Tulsa's lead with a five-yard TD rush to give Tulsa a 17-7 advantage heading to the lockers.

The hosts overturned their deficit early in the third quarter, scoring in three plays and gaining 63 yards after Francis tossed his first interception of the young season. Then, a booming punt from Angus Davies was returned 77 yards for a touchdown to give ASU a 21-17 lead.

TU would respond, however, going down the field 65 yards on three plays and pushing it in with a 2-yard TD from Anthony Watkins to regain the lead.

Arkansas State closed the scoring with a long 14-play, 79-yard drive. Jaylen Raynor found Corey Rucker for a five-yard TD to go back up 28-24, which would hold as the final.

Kirk Francis got the majority of snaps in week two, throwing 16-of-28 for 199 yards, a touchdown and one interception. Cardell Williams threw one pass, but also found success on the ground, taking it in from five yards out on his lone carry. Cooper Legas entered the game, but did not rush or throw a pass.

Kamdyn Benjamin was the main target, recording 131 of the 199 yards through the air Tulsa totaled. Zion Steptoe had three receptions for 18 yards and Luke McGary caught a pass for 18 yards. Eight different receivers caught a pass on Saturday.

For the second consecutive week, freshman Lloyd Avant led the Hurricane in rushing, gaining 61 yards on 14 carries. Anthony Watkins 46 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. Bill Jackson had a 37-yard run en route to 42 yards on the evening.

Keuan Parker and Dayne Hodge led the Hurricane in tackling with nine stops each. Hodge added an interception in the contest. Gavin Potter had eight tackles and 1.5 TFL in his return to Jonesboro. Tai Newhouse also had eight. Tyree Carlisle picked up Tulsa's lone sack of the evening.

#13 Oklahoma State 45, Tulsa 10

Sept. 14, 2024 • H.A. Chapman Stadium

TULSA, Okla. — The nation's 13th-ranked Oklahoma State Cowboys cruised to a 45-10 victory over Tulsa in the Gateway Turnpike Classic Saturday afternoon in front of sellout crowd of 30,915 fans at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

The Cowboys amassed 560 yards of total offense while five of its six touchdowns came through the air as Alex Bowman completed 24-of-31 passes for 396 yards and five scores. The OSU run game only gained 129 yards on the ground.

Tulsa managed 352 total yards with 236 coming through the air and 116 on the ground. Kirk Francis threw for 153 yards, while Kamdyn Benjamin led Tulsa receivers with 94 yards and Anthony Watkins had a team-high 40 rushing yards. Dayne Hodge led the Tulsa defense with 11 tackles as the unit held last year's NCAA leading rusher Ollie Gordon to just 41 yards on 17 carries.

OSU scored 28 unanswered first-half points, all coming on pass plays, while holding a 326 to 187-yard advantage in total yards. The Cowboys added 17 second-half points, while the OSU defense limited the Hurricane to just 10 fourth-quarter points.

Despite controlling possession time in the first period, 10:34 to 4:26, the Cowboys held just a 7-0 lead but exploded for 21 second-quarter points. The first OSU score came at the 8:38 mark on a 75-yard, 16-play drive.

OSU opened the second quarter just as they did a period earlier with seven points on its first second-quarter drive for a 14-0 lead with 12:47 on the game clock. OSU's Bowman connected on a 78-yard pass to Talyn Shettron for a 21-0 lead and a possession later Bowman found Josh Ford for 18 yards and a 28-0 lead with 3:23 left in the first half.

The Cowboys expanded its lead to 35-10 with 10 points in the third period and added a fourth-quarter touchdown for the final margin of victory.

At the 6:15 mark, Seth Morgan put three points on the board for the Hurricane with a 43-yard field goal, his longest of the season. Tulsa scored its first TD at the 1:55 mark as fourth-team QB Stephen Kittleman ran the final nine yards on a 64-yard, four-play drive.

Tulsa will close out its non-conference schedule next Saturday, 6 p.m. at Louisiana Tech before returning home for its American Athletic Conference opener on Oct. 5 against first-year league member Army.

Tulsa 23, Louisiana Tech 20 (OT)

Sept. 21, 2024 • Joe Aillet Stadium

RUSTON, La. — Myles Jackson and Owen Ostroski made the big play on defense, and Seth Morgan drilled the game-winning field goal as the Golden Hurricane outlasted Louisiana Tech 23-20 in overtime of Tulsa's nonconference finale on Saturday night.

In front of 18,152 fans at Joe Aillet Stadium, the Tulsa defense came up with a key turnover on the second play of overtime. Jackson broke through the right side of the line and put a big hit on the unaware quarterback, knocking the ball loose. Ostroski scooped the ball in stride and took off for the endzone. He shed a tackle attempt and dived for the pylon, seemingly getting in, but after review was judged short and the Golden Hurricane offense would need to score to win.

Bill Jackson took the first carry 17 yards down to the eight. After a second play lost six yards, the Hurricane centered the ball and took a knee, putting the game on the foot of Morgan, who had just knocked a 45-yard field goal through to send the game to overtime. Again, the graduate transfer came through, connecting from 34 yards and sending the Hurricane home with a win.

Tulsa took the lead first in the ballgame on Tulsa's third possession of the game. A short punt saw the Hurricane start its drive at the LA Tech 40. Anthony Watkins got the game's first score with a 30-yard run with 4:05 remaining in the quarter.

Louisiana Tech leveled the score early in the second quarter, getting a bit of fortune after a punt hit the returner but bounced into the hands of Cedric Woods, who took the return 49 yards down to the Tulsa 25. Five plays later, the Bulldogs punched it in on fourth and goal from the one to tie the game at seven.

With 9:15 remaining in the second quarter, Kamdyn Benjamin received a LA Tech punt at the Tulsa 32 and got a nice return to the Louisiana Tech 42. Tulsa capitalized on the good field position, taking 4:25 off the clock on a drive that went 28 yards on nine plays. Morgan put Tulsa ahead with his first field goal of the day from 32 yards. The Hurricane would take the 10-7 lead to the lockers.

The third quarter did not see much action with five punts and a turnover on downs between the two schools. With 3:17 on the clock, Tulsa started its final drive of the quarter from its own 15 yard line. What followed was a 5-play, 85-yard drive that took 3:13 off the clock and culminated in Corey Smith's first career touchdown on a 38-yard pass from Francis. It was Tulsa's most effective drive through the air as Francis connected with Benjamin for 21 yards, McGary for 28 and then Smith on the TD pass to go ahead 17-7.

The Bulldogs opened with its best drive to start the fourth, going 79 yards in seven plays, scoring on a Blake Baker QB sneak. The snap on the extra point was far too high for the holder and Tulsa led 17-13.

Louisiana Tech got a big punt return later in the fourth, taking the punt 30 yards to the Tulsa 48. The Bulldogs then went 43 yards in five plays, scoring on fourth and four with a 24-yard touchdown pass from Bullock to Finley, giving the hosts their first lead of the night.

The Hurricane needed a big drive, and the Tulsa offense delivered, picking up 48 yards in nine plays to set up Morgan's season high 45-yard field goal to tie the game at 20. Francis and McGary connected for 20 yards on the first play of the drive. Later in the drive, Francis and Smith matched up again for 11 yards to get Tulsa inside the LA Tech 40. The Hurricane came up just short of another first down at the Bulldogs 27, setting up the field goal that sent the game to overtime.

North Texas 52, Tulsa 20

DENTON, Texas

— North Texas pulled away to beat the University of Tulsa 52-20 in The American opener for both teams inside DATCU Stadium on Saturday night.

Tulsa (2-3, 0-1 The American) held the Mean Green (4-1, 1-0 The American) scoreless for the first 20 minutes of the ballgame, before the hosts rattled off 24 points in the final five minutes of the first half. North Texas scored three touchdowns in the third quarter to extend its streak to 45 straight points, taking a commanding lead.

Tulsa's two touchdowns came in the fourth quarter. Cooper Legas found Jack Wright from 18 yards out with 7:29 remaining. Freshman quarterback Tim Carpenter tossed his first career touchdown, finding Connor Vaughn with six seconds remaining in the ballgame.

Seth Morgan was good on both field goal attempts, a 22-yard field goal early in the second quarter, and a 45-yarder with 12:47 to play, to round out Tulsa's scoring.

The Hurricane amassed 415 yards of offense on Saturday, 186 through the air and 229 on the ground. Kirk Francis finished 13-29 for 101 yards and an interception. Legas passed for 45 yards, Cardell Williams for 32 and Carpenter for eight.

Kamdyn Benjamin was again Tulsa's leading receiver, pulling down seven passes for 68 yards. Freshman Joseph Williams made his first catch of his career reception, finishing with 51 yards on three receptions.

Bill Jackson recorded 77 yards on 16 carries to lead the Hurricane rushing attack. Viron Ellison added 46. Anthony Watkins rushed for 32 and Carpenter carried the ball for 30 yards on his lone drive.

Despite a slow start, the Mean Green threw for 439 yards and rushed for 179, recording 618 yards of total offense, the most by a Hurricane opponent this season. Chandler Morris finished 22-34 and had every yard for the Mean Green, throwing five touchdowns in the process.

With 5:33 remaining in the half, Angus Davies hit a beauty of a punt that pinned North Texas down at its own one. On second down from its own four, Balir Conwright took a screen pass 96 yards to give North Texas the 7-3 lead.

The Mean Green extended its lead on the next drive, moving 40 yards in two minutes and hitting a field goal to go up 10-3. After a Tulsa three and out, Davies had his punt attempt blocked at the Tulsa 26 and recovered at the one-yard line. A play later, Wyatt Young took a direct snap and rushed up the middle to give North Texas a 17-3 lead with 1:28 on the clock.

An interception on the following drive and a two-play TD drive for UNT sent the Mean Green to the locker room up 24-3.

The third quarter was all North Texas as UNT scored on its three possessions in the frame to take a 45-3 lead.

Tulsa would score the final two touchdowns of the game. Legas led the Golden Hurricane on a 9-play, 82-yard drive and found Wright for six. Then Carpenter went on a 12-play 71-yard drive that took 3:31 and ended with him connecting with Vaughn for a touchdown and to bring the score to its final, 52-20.

Army 49, Tulsa 7

TULSA, Okla.

— The Army Black Knights made a big impression in its first-ever visit to H.A. Chapman Stadium with a 49-7 victory over Tulsa in front of 24,409 fans on a hot Saturday afternoon.

Army improved to 5-0 overall and 4-0 in its first season in the American Athletic Conference, while Tulsa fell to 2-4 and 0-2 in league play.

The nation's leading rushing team used its passing game early to establish a 21-7 halftime lead, while its ground game got going in the second half. Army passed for 140 first-half yards and got back to its normal offensive-style with 249 rushing yards in the second half.

After Tulsa knotted the score at 7-7 in the first quarter and held Army on their next possession, the Black Knights scored on their next six possessions, two in the second period, three in the third and one in the fourth quarter for what would be the eventual final score of 49-7.

The Black Knights ended the contest with 481 total yards including 321 on the ground and 160 through the air, while Tulsa was held to a season-low 268 yards. The Hurricane did control possession time by nearly 10 minutes, 34:29 to 25:31.

The game only took an elapsed time of 2:52 from kickoff until the final horn.

Reserve quarterback Cooper Legas led Tulsa in rushing with 81 yards and Tulsa's lone touchdown, while Kirk Francis completed 16-of-22 passes for 84 yards. Army's Kanye Udoh had a game-high 137 yards on the ground with two TDs, while Bryson Short completed all five of his passes for 140 yards while connecting on TD passes covering 37 and 58 yards.

The first quarter ended tied at 7-7 as Army scored on a 37-yard pass play on its first possession, while the Hurricane responded on a one-yard Legas touchdown to cap a 16-play, 75-yard drive.

Tulsa controlled the possession time in the first quarter, 10:25 to 4:35.

After Tulsa opened the second quarter taking the first 6:39 off the clock, the Black Knights held the Hurricane on a fourth down attempt and proceeded to march 70 yards in 3:26 as Bryson Daily ran the final four yards for the score and a 14-7 lead at the 5:02 mark.

Army took its next possession 68 yards in four plays to take a 21-7 lead with just 1:49 remaining before intermission.

For the half, Army had a 212 to 176-yard edge in total offense, while Tulsa controlled possession time, 20:18 to 9:42. The West Point yardage came on 140 yards passing 72 on the ground, while Tulsa rushed for 92 yards and had 84 yards via the air.

The Black Knights took the second-half kickoff 75 yards in three plays as Kanye Udoh sprinted 61 yards for a touchdown and a 28-7 lead with just 1:27 gone in the half.

It took the Knights only 0:50 and two plays to increase its lead to 28 points when Udoh again took the handoff down the middle of the field for 63 yards and a 35-7 lead, capping a two-play, 72-yard drive.

Army added its third straight touchdown run of the quarter for a 42-7 lead when Bryson Daily took it 27 yards with just 0:14 remaining in the third period. Reserve quarterback Dewayne Coleman's four-yard run capped a 49-yard, seven-play drive to go ahead 49-7 at the 7:40 mark of the final stanza for the game's final points.

Temple 20, Tulsa 10

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — The Golden Hurricane was unable to dig itself out of an early hole in a 20-10 loss to the Temple Owls in front of 18,721 fans at Lincoln Financial Field on Saturday afternoon.

Temple improved to 2-5 overall and 1-2 in the American Athletic Conference, while Tulsa fell to 2-5 and 0-3 in league play.

On its homecoming day the Owls jumped ahead to establish a 17-0 halftime lead as the Tulsa offense struggled to get going. The Hurricane accumulated just 88 yards of total offense in the first two quarters, while Temple amassed 242.

The Hurricane came out with a renewed energy in the third quarter, shutting down the Owls and scoring a touchdown and kicking a field goal on its two possessions to cut the deficit to 17-10 entering the fourth. Temple connected on another field goal to extend the lead to two scores at 20-10 early in the fourth, which would serve as the final score as Tulsa failed to respond.

The Owls finished with 397 yards of total offense, including 316 through the air and 81 on the ground, the lowest rushing total by a TU opponent this season. The Golden Hurricane amassed 245 yards, collecting 175 through the air and a season-low 75 on the ground.

Quarterback Kirk Francis was the second QB in the game for Tulsa on Saturday but led the Hurricane with 153 yards and a season-long 63-yard touchdown while connecting on 11-of-23 passes with an interception. Cooper Legas earned the start and had 17 yards through the air and 21 on the ground. Temple's Evan Simon was the game's leading passer, completing 30-of-46 attempts for 297 yards and a touchdown with one pick.

Graduate running back Anthony Watkins led Tulsa in rushing and receiving, picking up 23 yards on the ground and then as a receiver, most of which came on the 63-yard pass from Francis on Tulsa's first possession of the second half.
