- The Roadrunners registered a 34-15 road triumph in the only other meeting on Nov. 2, 2013.
- UTSA will play on the road for the fifth time in the first eight games this season.
- Jeff Traylor boasts a 42-18 overall record at UTSA, the most wins and best winning percentage (.700) in program history.
- UTSA is 28-6 (.824) in regular season conference games in the Jeff Traylor era and 30-6 (.833) against league competition when including the 2021 and 2022 Conference USA Championship Games.
- The Roadrunners have been victorious in 16 of their last 19 regular season league contests.
- UTSA is 11-6 (.647) in conference road games under Jeff Traylor.
- The Roadrunners are riding a streak of 17 consecutive games with both a takeaway and a sack.

SETTING THE SCENE

Fresh off a 38-24 home win over Florida Atlantic, UTSA will hit the road again to face Tulsa on Saturday, Oct. 26. Kickoff is slated for 2:30 p.m. at H.A. Chapman Stadium in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and the game will air on ESPN+ and Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket. The Roadrunners and Golden Hurricane will meet for the second time. UTSA scored a 34-15 road triumph on Nov. 2, 2013, in the only previous meeting.

TUNING IN

Saturday's game will air on ESPN+ and via the ESPN mobile app. James Westling (play-by-play) and Leger Douzable (analyst) will call the action. UTSA Sports Media Network will air the game live in the San Antonio area on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at ticket760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Ed Suarez (reporter) have the call. There will be a two-hour pregame show hosted by Pat Evans and a 45-minute postgame show.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

The Roadrunners will be on the road again this weekend when they face the Golden Hurricane in Tulsa, Oklahoma. The 2024 schedule takes UTSA away from San Antonio for five of the first eight contests. The Roadrunners are still seeking their first road win of the season. They last won away from home with a 35-17 neutral-site victory against Marshall on Dec. 19, 2023, in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl in Frisco, Texas. UTSA's last true road win came on Nov. 4, 2023, in a 37-29 triumph over North Texas in Denton.

LAST TIME OUT

UTSA used a stout defense and efficient offense to rally from a 17-10 first-half deficit for a 38-24 victory over Florida Atlantic in American Athletic Conference action on Saturday afternoon at the Alamodome. Trailing by seven late in the second quarter and with the Owls threatening to add to their lead, Asyrus Simon's strip-sack of FAU quarterback Cam Fancher proved to be a key play in the fifth meeting between the two teams, giving the ball back to the Roadrunners at their own 12-yard line with 3:21 left until halftime. UTSA then marched 88 yards on 11 plays, the last a 10-yard touchdown pass from Owen McCown to Jamel Hardy. Tate Sandell's extra point knotted the score at 17-all going into the break. UTSA's defense surrendered just 32 total yards following Simon's takeaway, including only 29 in the second half. Altogether, the Roadrunners have held the Owls to a combined 365 yards of offense over the last two meetings, as they allowed only 162 in a 36-10 road triumph last year. The Roadrunners outscored FAU, 21-7, over the final 30 minutes, giving up just a fumble return for a touchdown when Wendol Philord scooped up a loose ball on a lateral and sped 49 yards to the end zone with 3:58 left in the third quarter. That score tied the game again at 24-24, but UTSA responded with 14 unanswered points down the stretch to seal the win. UTSA registered 13 tackles for loss, including a school record-tying seven sacks to extend that streak to 17 games. Those totals rank as the sixth-most sacks and eighth-most TFLs recorded in an FBS game this season. The takeaway streak also was extended to 17 games in a row with Simon's strip-sack and Owen Pewee's late interception.

SCOUTING TULSA

The Golden Hurricane fell to 2-5 overall and 0-3 in American Athletic Conference play with a 20-10 road loss to Temple last Saturday. Tulsa is averaging 22.3 points and 371.0 yards per game while allowing 34.6 points and 423.1 yards per contest. Kirk Francis has completed 117 of 199 passes for 1,217 yards and seven touchdowns. Kamdyn Benjamin leads the receivers with 42 catches for 500 yards and a pair of scores, while Anthony Watkins is the top rusher with 271 yards and three TDs on 61 carries. Defensively, Dayne Hodge has a team-high 44 tackles and Owen Ostroski owns a team-best 6.5 tackles for loss. Head coach Kevin Wilson is 6-13 in his second season at the helm.

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday will mark the second meeting UTSA and Tulsa. The Roadrunners registered a 34-15 road victory over the Golden Hurricane on Nov. 2, 2013, in the only previous matchup between the two schools on the gridiron.

LAST MEETING

Triston Wade finished with a pair of interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown, and UTSA's defense shut down Tulsa in a 34-15 road victory on Nov. 2, 2013, in Tulsa, Oklahoma. David Glasco II ran for a then-school-record 135 yards to lead the Roadrunners, who racked up 286 yards on the ground and notched their seventh victory in their last 11 games away from the Alamo City. Trey Watts led the Golden Hurricane with 113 yards on the ground and 40 more on five receptions, but he had a costly fumble on a punt return that led to a UTSA touchdown. Wade got the momentum on UTSA's side by ending Tulsa's first drive with an interception on the Roadrunners' 15-yard line. UTSA ended the next two Golden Hurricane drives with a pair of three-and-outs before a fourth-down stop at the UTSA 3-yard line. Meanwhile, the Roadrunners got on the board with 7:35 to play in the first quarter when Eric Soza found Evans Okotcha for a 5-yard touchdown. The score was set up by a 47-yard run from Glasco II. The lead jumped to 14-0 later in the quarter when Nic Johnston recovered Watts' muffed punt in the end zone for a score. Sean Ianno added a 41-yard field goal in the opening minutes of the second period to push the lead to 17. Tulsa responded with an eight-play, 78-yard drive down to the UTSA 3-yard line. Once again, the defense stepped up and kept the shutout alive when Wade tipped away Cody Green's fourth-down pass to Thomas Roberson in the end zone. The Roadrunners responded with an 84-yard TD run by Kam Jones. Tulsa broke up the shutout late in the third stanza when backup quarterback Dane Evans found Jordan James for a 9-yard score. The two-point conversion was successful to trim the UTSA lead to 24-8. The Roadrunners got another field goal from Ianno for a 27-8 lead and Wade then halted Tulsa's next drive with his second interception of the afternoon, which he returned 82 yards to paydirt and still stands as the longest pick six in UTSA history.

TULSA CONNECTIONS

UTSA's staff has several connections to the Tulsa football program. Assistant head coach and cornerbacks coach Nick Graham was a four-year letterman for the Golden Hurricane in 2003-06, earning all-conference accolades twice. The Oklahoma City native also got his coaching start at Tulsa as a student assistant in 2013 and a defensive analyst the following two seasons. Defensive coordinator and safeties coach Jess Loepp served three different stints on the Tulsa staff. The Turpin, Oklahoma, native was a graduate assistant in 2003-05 and then the recruiting coordinator and safeties coach in 2007 before returning in 2009 to be director of high school relations. He then coached safeties from 2010 to 2014. Defensive pass game coordinator and linebackers coach Galen Scott was Tulsa's outside linebackers and secondary coach in 2008 before mentoring the cornerbacks in 2009.

WHO'S COUNTING?

Now in their 14th season of play, the Roadrunners will play the 167th game in program history on Saturday when they face Tulsa. UTSA is 87-79 (.524) all-time and 34-45 in road games. By comparison, Tulsa has been playing football since 1895 and owns an all-time record of 661-548-32.

IT'S A HOOT

The Roadrunners will face all four FBS teams that use the nickname Owls during the 2024 season. UTSA opened the campaign on Aug. 31 against the Kennesaw State Owls and just faced the Rice Owls last Saturday in Houston. This week's opponent — Florida Atlantic — is the third 2024 opponent that goes by the Owls. The Roadrunners also play the Temple Owls on Nov. 22.

TRAYLOR TABBED TOP AAC COACH BY ATHLON SPORTS

Athlon Sports picked UTSA's Jeff Traylor as its top head coach in the American Athletic Conference for the 2024 season. Traylor tops the list of the league's 14 head coaches as selected by senior college football writer and editor Steve Lissan. A two-time conference coach of the year, the Gilmer, Texas, native has led the Roadrunners to the most wins and best winning percentage (.700) by any coach in program history. UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned four straight bowl berths and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls under his leadership. Under Traylor's guidance, UTSA student-athletes have collected awards and honors at a record-breaking pace. During his time in

San Antonio, he has coached seven All-Americans, three national award finalists, 83 all-conference selections and a pair of NFL Draft picks. That success is not limited to just the gridiron. The Roadrunners also have received numerous honors for their work in the classroom during the Traylor tenure, including three College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, 12 CSC Academic All-District Selections and four conference all-academic team selections. Additionally, UTSA was one only 13 FBS programs to receive the 2023 AFCA Academic Achievement Award for graduation success.

UTSA PICKED SECOND IN AAC PRESEASON POLL

UTSA was picked to finish second in the American Athletic Conference Preseason Media Poll. The Roadrunners received 368 points and four first-place votes to check in at second behind Memphis, which had 409 points and 23 first-place votes.

BURKE CHOSEN FOR 40 UNDER 40 LIST

UTSA offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Justin Burke was chosen for the Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40, as the publication recognized 40 of the rising stars in the coaching ranks in the state of Texas. This marks the fourth consecutive year a UTSA coach has been honored, as Burke joins running backs coach/NFL liaison Julian Griffin (2021), associate head coach/pass game coordinator/wide receivers coach Joe Price (2023) and former co-offensive coordinator Will Stein (2022). A veteran of the UTSA staff since 2020, Burke is in his second season as the Roadrunners' offensive coordinator and his first coaching the quarterbacks. He served as associate head coach, special teams coordinator and tight ends coach during the 2022 regular season before being promoted to co-offensive coordinator for the Cure Bowl.

CARDENAS NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST

UTSA senior Oscar Cardenas was chosen as a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy®, college football's premier scholar-athlete award, as announced on Sept. 25 by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). The award recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the country for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership, and the candidates also comprise the pool of nominees for the 2024 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards Presented by Fidelity Investments. Cardenas is one of 203 semifinalists for the award and this marks

the eighth consecutive year that a Roadrunner has made the semifinalist list. Ahofitu Maka was a finalist two years ago, while Lucas Dean (2023), Hunter Duplessis (2020, '21), Andrew Martel (2019), Yannis Routsas (2018) and Brady Jones (2017) all were semifinalists. Additionally, Nate Leonard was a finalist in 2014 and Eric Soza made the final cut the year prior.

TRAYLOR TAKING ROADRUNNERS TO NEW HEIGHTS

Head coach Jeff Traylor has guided UTSA to new heights since taking over the program prior to the 2020 campaign. The Gilmer, Texas, native has turned around the program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, producing results on and off the field. Taking over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, he has led the Roadrunners to a 42-18 record through 60 games, the most wins all-time and best winning percentage (.700) by a UTSA head football coach. In fact, he eclipsed Larry Coker's program standard for most games coached of 58 set from 2011-15 with the Rice game on Oct. 12. In the Jeff Traylor era, the Roadrunners are 26-3 (.896) at home. They own a 28-6 (.834) record in regular season conference games and are 30-6 (.833) against league competition when including the 2021 and 2022 Conference USA Championship Games. Under Traylor's direction, UTSA won back-to-back conference championships, was nationally ranked in all three major polls in 2021 and 2022 and played in a bowl game in each of his first four seasons, including defeating Marshall, 35-17, in the 2023 Frisco Bowl for the program's first bowl win. The two-time conference coach of the year has coached eight All-Americans, three national award finalists, 13 national award semifinalists, seven conference superlative award recipients, 83 all-conference selections, two academic All-Americans and a pair of NFL Draft picks during his UTSA tenure. He was the 2021 AFCA Region 4 Coach of the Year and he has been a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year twice in addition to being a finalist for the 2022 Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year, 2021 AFCA National Coach of the Year and the 2021 George Munger College Coach of the Year.

SEASON 14

One of the newest FBS programs and now in its second year as a member of the American Athletic Conference, UTSA is in its 14th season of football in 2024. The Roadrunners started their program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played their first season as an FCS Independent in 2011 before joining the Western Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign. UTSA moved into Conference USA in 2013 and became a full-fledged FBS member starting with the 2014 season. The Roadrunners set NCAA modern startup program records in 2011 by drawing 56,743 fans to their inaugural game against Northeastern State and by averaging 35,521 fans for their six home contests that season. UTSA made its first postseason appearance at the 2016 New Mexico Bowl in its sixth season of play and registered its first win against a team from the Big 12 Conference the following season with a 17-10 victory over Baylor. The Roadrunners made history in 2021, opening the fall with a road win against Illinois of the Big Ten Conference, capturing their first conference championship with a 49-42 decision against WKU and capping a 12-2 ledger with their third bowl game. They repeated as league champions with a 48-27 win over North Texas in 2022 and made their third straight and fourth overall bowl appearance, ending the year with an 11-3 mark. Last fall, the Roadrunners notched their first bowl victory with a 35-17 decision over Marshall in the Frisco Bowl to cap a 9-4 ledger that include a 7-1 mark in their debut in The American. UTSA now has posted at least six wins in eight of the 13 full seasons in program history and it has reached the seven-win plateau six times, including in each of the first four years of the Jeff Traylor era.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

UTSA is no stranger to close contests in the Jeff Traylor era, as 34 of the 60 have been one-score ballgames in the fourth quarter. The Roadrunners own a 23-11 record (.676) in those games. Dating back to the 2021 campaign, UTSA has seen 21 of the last 38 contests decided in the fourth quarter or later. Additionally, the Roadrunners are 13-5 (.722) in games decided by eight points or less since 2021.

TAKEAWAY STREAK

UTSA will enter the road game versus Tulsa riding a streak of 17 consecutive games with a takeaway, a stretch that started on Sept. 23, 2023 at No. 20 Tennessee. After going through the first three games of the 2023 season without a takeaway, the Roadrunners finished with 17 over the last 10 contests, tallying 10 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries. The Roadrunners have opened 2024 with 10 takeaways over the first seven contests. Jimmy Wyrick forced a key fumble that was recovered by Syrus Dumas in the fourth quarter of the 28-16 win over Kennesaw State to start the year. On the opening possession against Texas State, Zach Morris registered the Roadrunners' first interception of the campaign. Owen Pewee had a first-quarter interception and Brevin Randle recovered a fumble in the second half versus No. 2 Texas, while Jimmori Robinson

forced a recovered a fumble in the 45-7 victory against Houston Christian. Zah Frazier picked off two passes in the second half of the East Carolina contest, becoming the fifth Roadrunner and first since Clayton Johnson in 2017 to register two interceptions in a game. Elliott Davison recovered a fumble in the first quarter of the Rice game, while Asyrus Simon had a strip-sack and recovery and Pewee picked off his second pass of the year against Florida Atlantic to push the season takeaway total to 10 and the streak to 17 games.

SACK ATTACK

UTSA enjoyed a record-setting season in 2023 for tackles for loss and sacks, and the defense has continued to pile up impressive numbers through the first seven games this season. Last fall, the Roadrunners registered 99 tackles behind the line of scrimmage to eclipse the previous standard of 96 set in 2019. UTSA also shattered the program mark for sacks with 46, 13 more than the previous record established in 2021 with the benefit of one more game. The Roadrunners led the American Athletic Conference in both categories and they ranked second in the FBS in sacks per game (3.54) and fifth in tackles for loss per contest (7.6). UTSA has tallied 55 tackles for loss and 19 sacks through the first seven games in 2024, logging at least four TFLs and a sack in each contest. In the season-opening win over Kennesaw State, the Roadrunners racked up 10 tackles behind the line, including a trio of sacks. In the 45-7 home triumph over Houston Christian, the Roadrunners recorded seven TFLs and four sacks. UTSA totaled 10 tackles behind the line against East Carolina. In the victory against Florida Atlantic, UTSA made 13 TFLs, including a school record-tying seven sacks, to mark the seventh game with double-digit TFLs and the 11th time to register three-plus sacks over the past two seasons. Those totals also rank as the sixth-most sacks and eighth-most TFLs in an FBS game this season. The Roadrunners currently rank third in The American and 12th in the FBS in tackles for loss per game (7.9) and second in the conference and 25th nationally in sacks per game (2.71). UTSA enters Saturday's game riding a stretch of 17 consecutive contests with a sack.

TOUGH ON THIRD DOWN

UTSA has emerged as one of the best in the FBS at getting off the field on third down. Opponents are converting third downs at just a 30.9-percent clip through seven games, a mark that leads the American Athletic Conference and ranks 16th nationally. UTSA has allowed only 29 first downs on 94 total third-down attempts with no more than six third-down conversions in a single game in 2024. The Roadrunners held Texas to only 3 of 10 on third down and they also only surrendered three third-down conversions on 13 tries in the win over Houston Christian. UTSA limited Florida Atlantic, Rice and Texas State to only four conversions apiece.

D-LINE DEPTH KEEPS ROADRUNNERS FRESH

UTSA has taken advantage of a deep defensive line room with a rotation aimed to keep players fresh throughout the game. The Roadrunners have played at least nine d-linemen in each game and as many as a dozen in three different contests in 2023. UTSA rotated nine players up front in the 28-16 season-opening victory over Kennesaw State, as Brandon Brown, Jameian Buxton, Christian Clayton, Joe Evans, Tai Leonard, Chidera Otutu, Asyrus Simon, Ronald Triplette and Daemian Wimberly all saw action. Those nine plus Jon Jones played in each of the next two games, and the Roadrunners went back to a nine-man rotation in each of the last four contests. UTSA welcomed back eight players at the position who saw action last fall, led by veterans Brown, a member of the Outland Trophy Watch List, and Evans, who has earned a spot on watch lists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Shrine Bowl 1000, Reese's Senior Bowl. Brown logged 4.5 tackles for loss, two quarterback hurries and a sack en route to third-team all-conference honors in 2023. Evans posted 2.5 TFLs, a pair of sacks and a safety last season while also collecting third-team all-league accolades. This season, Brown paces the group in tackles behind the line with 4.5 with Simon right on his heels with four, while Triplette has logged two sacks to lead the unit.

LINEBACKER LEADER

A starter at inside linebacker since he stepped foot on campus in 2020, Jamal Ligon has developed into one of the team leaders. The fifth-year senior from Tyler, Texas, who landed on this year's Shrine Bowl 1000 already owns the UTSA career mark for assisted tackles with 157, which ranks 11th among active FBS players. He is on pace to become the Roadrunners' all-time leader in total tackles, as he surpassed 300 in the East Carolina contest and now has 306, good for 12th among active FBS players and only nine shy of Rashad Wisdom's school record of 315. The three-time all-conference selection also is on track to become the program's record holder in starts, as he now has 53, only three short of the mark held by Joshua Cephus and Wisdom. As a true freshman, he set the school standard for total tackles in a game with 19 in a win over Middle Tennessee in 2020. Last season, Ligon posted 62 total tackles, 35 unassisted stops, seven tackles for loss, five quarterback hurries, one sack, one forced fumble and a pass breakup while earning honorable mention All-American Athletic Conference honors. This fall, he has 21 stops, a pair of TFLs, two hurries, one sack, one PBU and a forced fumble.

EDGE THREAT

UTSA senior outside linebacker Jimmori Robinson has emerged as a threat on the edge for the defense. A native of Virginia, he has registered 25 total tackles, including team highs of 8.5 tackles for loss and four sacks, to go with a team-best five quarterback hurries through the first seven games this season. Voted into one of the coveted single-digit jersey numbers (No. 8) during training camp, Robinson opened his final campaign with eight stops, 2.5 tackles for loss, and a pair of sacks over the first three contests. He broke out for seven tackles, two TFLs, a sack, one forced fumble and recovery and a blocked field goal in the 45-7 victory against Houston Christian, earning a nod for American Athletic Conference Honorable Mention Defensive Player of the Week. He notched another sack against Rice that helped extend UTSA's sacks streak to 16 games and added one of the team's 13 TFLs in the win against Florida Atlantic in his last outing. Last fall, Robinson broke Marcus Davenport's school record with 10 quarterback hurries to go along with 40 tackles, 11 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, two PBUs and a forced fumble.

MONEY BACKERS LIVING UP TO THEIR NAME

UTSA's nickel position underwent a name change in the offseason to money backer, and the group is living up to their name so far in 2024. Led by fifth-year senior Donyai Taylor and redshirt sophomore Owen Pewee, five money backers have combined to post 53 tackles, 10.5 tackles for loss, four sacks, five quarterback hurries, two interceptions, five pass breakups and a forced fumble. Coming off a 2023 campaign that saw him earn second-team All-American Athletic Conference accolades, Taylor — despite missing the first two games — has registered 15 tackles, 2.5 TFLs, three PBUs, two hurries and a sack of Texas quarterback Arch Manning that resulted in a 10-yard loss. Pewee paces the money backers with 23 stops, 4.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, two interceptions, two pass breakups and a forced fumble.

STEADY SAFETIES

UTSA's secondary is led in part by the steady senior safety duo of Elliott Davison and Ken Robinson. Despite playing in 12 of the 13 games last fall, Robinson, a South Grand Prairie High School product, still led the Roadrunners in total tackles with 66 to go along with four pass breakups and a quarterback hurry. Davison, a native of Tyler, registered 40 stops and a pair of interceptions — including one that was returned 76 yards — in his first season at UTSA after transferring from UIW. Robinson paced the Roadrunners with seven stops in each of the first two games this season before missing a pair of contests. He has returned to the lineup with 10 tackles over the last three games and now has 198 career stops, including 120 solo and eight for loss. Davison rank second on the team with 30 total tackles to go along with a pair of pass breakups and a fumble recovery, and he has upped his career tallies to 205 tackles, 143 unassisted stops and 19 PBUs.

CARDENAS IS CLUTCH

Senior tight end Oscar Cardenas has developed a reputation for making clutch catches during his career. The San Antonio Brandeis High School product played a role in one of the iconic moments in program history, hauling in the game-winning TD reception after a tipped pass with three seconds left in the 34-31 home victory over UAB in 2021. He also had a 28-yard catch on that game-winning drive versus the Blazers to help the Roadrunners clinch the Conference USA West Division title. In 2022, Cardenas caught two balls in the opener against No. 24 Houston, including a key 25-yard reception that set up the game-tying field goal as time expired. He also made a one-handed grab and then hurdled a defender for a 35-yard play on the final drive of the 31-27 victory over North Texas to set up the game-winning touchdown pass on the following play. Last season, the John Mackey Award Watch List member caught 32 passes for 280 yards and a pair of touchdowns en route to third-team All-American Athletic Conference accolades. A sixth-year senior, Cardenas became the ninth Roadrunner and just the second tight end to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards after catching two passes for 38 yards and a touchdown in the 28-16 season-opening win over Kennesaw State. He now has 12 catches for 132 yards and two touchdowns this season and 94 receptions for 1,129 yards and eight TDs in 64 career games as a Roadrunner. He now has the most catches and receiving yards by any tight end in program history and is tied with former NFL Draft pick David Morgan II for the most receiving TDs at the position.

TIGHT END DEPTH ON DISPLAY

UTSA boasts a deep tight end group with four players in the regular rotation this season. The unit is led by sixth-year senior Oscar Cardenas, who earned the coveted No. 0 jersey in the annual program-wide vote. Redshirt junior Dan Dishman, redshirt sophomore Houston Thomas and redshirt freshman Patrick Overmyer have teamed up with Cardenas for a combined 39 catches, 481 receiving yards and four touchdowns. Thomas has the most receptions (14) and yards (215) to go with a TD, while Cardenas is close behind at 12 catches for 132 yards and a unit-best two touchdowns. Overmyer has grabbed 10 passes for 112 yards and a score and Dishman has made three catches for 22 yards.

MCCUIN EMERGES AS RECEIVING THREAT

UTSA wide receiver Devin McCuin emerged as one of the team’s top receiving threats as a true freshman last year and he has started off his sophomore season on the right foot. In 2023, the Jacksonville, Texas, native nearly broke a freshman record that has stood since UTSA’s inaugural season in 2011, as he piled up 546 receiving yards and three touchdowns on 42 catches to come up only 32 yards shy of Kam Jones’ freshman standard of 578. He had a 72-yard TD reception against Army that now ranks as the eighth-longest pass play in program history and he nearly notched his first career 100-yard game with 94 in the 49-34 win at Temple and again with 91 in the 49-21 home triumph over South Florida. McCuin opened the 2024 campaign with a career night, catching 11 passes — one shy of the school record and the 10th-best single-game showing in the FBS this fall — for 79 yards and two touchdowns in the 28-16 win over Kennesaw State. He followed that with a team-high six receptions versus Texas State, five catches at No. 2 Texas and five grabs for 43 yards in the win over Houston Christian. After catching seven passes for 83 yards and a score against Rice, McCuin has a team-high 37 receptions for 279 yards and four touchdowns in 2024 to push his career totals to 79 catches, 825 yards and seven scores. He currently leads the American Athletic Conference and ranks 25th nationally with 6.2 receptions per game, and he also stands fourth in the league and 41st in the FBS with four receiving TDs.

BORN TO PLAY QB

UTSA redshirt sophomore Owen McCown was born to play quarterback. The lefthander is the son of Josh McCown, who was a third-round draft pick in 2002 and played 18 seasons in the NFL after a collegiate career at SMU

and Sam Houston. Two of his uncles also played the position. Luke McCown starred at Louisiana Tech before he was selected in the fourth round of the 2004 NFL Draft and enjoyed a 12-year NFL career. Randy McCown played quarterback at Texas A&M from 1996-99, helping the Aggies to the 1998 Big 12 Conference Championship. Those three McCown brothers all played for UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor when he was an assistant coach at Jacksonville High School in the 1990s. Owen won the starting quarterback job coming out of training camp this season and he made the best of his second start as a Roadrunner. He completed 28 of 38 passes for a career-best 340 yards and three touchdowns and also ran for another score to help lead UTSA to a 28-16 victory over Kennesaw State, earning Manning Award QB of the Week and American Athletic Conference Honorable Mention Player of the Week accolades for his performance. McCown completed 18 of 25 passes for 226 yards and three TDs in the 45-7 win over Houston Christian and then followed that with 251 yards and a TD on 24-of-49 passing at East Carolina and 256 yards and three TDs on 28 completions against Rice. In his last outing, McCown matched his career high with 340 passing yards to go with a pair of touchdowns in the 38-24 home win against Florida Atlantic. Through seven games this season, McCown has thrown for 1,650 yards and 12 TDs on 155-of-252 passing (61.5%). In his first start at UTSA last December, the transfer from Colorado threw for 251 yards and two TDs on 22-of-31 passing to help guide the Roadrunners to a 35-17 triumph over Marshall in the 2023 Frisco Bowl for the program's first-ever bowl win. He made a splash in his UTSA debut last September by breaking the school's single-game completion percentage record against No. 20 Tennessee, connecting on 18 of 20 passes (90%) for 170 yards and a pair of TDs.

McATTACK

UTSA's offense features a trio of weapons whose last names all start with Mc in senior wide receiver Willie McCoy, redshirt sophomore quarterback Owen McCown and sophomore wide receiver Devin McCuin. McCoy and McCuin have combined for 54 receptions, 621 yards and six touchdowns to lead the receiving corps. McCoy, a senior from Houston, has a team-high 342 yards and two TDs on 17 catches, good for an average of 20.1 yards per reception. McCuin owns a team-best 37 receptions and four scores to go with 279 receiving yards. In his first year as the starting QB, McCown has directed the "McAttack" by throwing for 1,650 yards and 12 TDs on 155-of-252 passing.

SPREADING IT AROUND

UTSA's quarterbacks have spread the ball around to a deep stable of pass-catchers. A total of 17 different Roadrunners have recorded a reception this season, paced by Devin McCuin's 37. UTSA has seen at least 10 players catch a pass in six of the first seven games in 2024 with a season-best 12 registering a reception in the Texas State, Texas and Florida Atlantic contests. UTSA saw 11 players make a catch in the win over Houston Christian, while 10 made grabs against both Kennesaw State and East Carolina.

CARPENTER MAKES HISTORY

UTSA junior Chris Carpenter has stamped his name in the school record book as one of the top returners in program history. In 2022, he brought back a kickoff 97 yards for a score against Texas Southern, the first kickoff return touchdown in program history. Last season, the Jacksonville, Texas, native returned a punt 50 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter of the 34-14 home triumph over Rice to become the first Roadrunner to record both a punt and kickoff return for a TD during their career. The punt return TD versus the Owls was the third in school annals, as he joined Kenny Harrison (79-yard TD vs. Texas State, 2012) and Sheldon Jones (76-yard return vs. Lamar in 2021). Carpenter finished 2023 ranked sixth in the league and 34th nationally in punt return average (6.8). This season, he has returned a pair of kickoffs, including a season-long 43-yarder against Rice, to go with 11 punt returns with a long of nine yards. He also ranks second on the squad with 25 receptions, which he has turned into 231 yards.

O-LINE SHUFFLE

UTSA has seen six different starting lineups take the field on the offensive line in seven games this season within the position group. That currently is tied with Florida State and Middle Tennessee for the most different starting offensive lines in the FBS this season. Right guard Cory Godinet, center CJ James Jr. and left tackle Kamar Missouri have started every game at their respective position. However, the Roadrunners have had to shuffle starters at the other two spots due to injuries. At left guard, Demetris Allen, Walker Baty and Venly Tatafu have started two games apiece with Ben Rios earning his first career start against Florida Atlantic. At right tackle, Jaylen Garth started the first two games before giving way to Makai Hart, who suffered a season-ending injury against Rice which put Garth back in the starting spot in the Florida Atlantic contest.

PAT STREAK SECOND IN FBS

The Roadrunners boast the second-longest streak of consecutive extra points made after starting the 2024 season a perfect 20 for 20 behind the legs of Chase Allen and Tate Sandell. The stretch of consecutive PATs now stands at 216 dating back to the win over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020. NC State has the longest active streak at 273.

TV BIRDS

Saturday's game will air on ESPN+, marking 145 straight televised/streamed appearances for the Roadrunners. The last UTSA game that was not broadcast was the 2012 season finale against Texas State.

BROTHERLY DUOS

UTSA is one of 30 FBS teams that have at least two sets of brothers. The Roadrunners list junior wide receiver Elliott Brow and junior cornerback Errionn Brow along with senior inside linebacker Fred Lewis and junior safety Jermarius Lewis. Colorado leads the way with six sets of brothers.

A FOCUS ON RECRUITING TEXAS

UTSA's 118-man roster features 93 players — 79% — who hail from the state of Texas. Georgia and Mississippi stand second with four players apiece, while there are two each from Alabama, Florida and Louisiana. Arizona, Arkansas, Hawaii, Iowa, Maryland, Massachusetts, Oregon, Tennessee and Virginia each have produced one current Roadrunner. Caile Hogan is the lone UTSA player from Australia and Cory Godinet is the first Roadrunner from American Samoa.

« KEEPING THEM HOME »

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor and his staff have placed an emphasis on recruiting the city of San Antonio and surrounding area. This year's roster includes 16 players from the San Antonio area.

UTSA'S 210 TRIANGLE OF TOUGHNESS

Since his arrival in December 2019 head coach Jeff Traylor has instilled into the program his 210 Triangle Of Toughness — run the football, be physical on defense and be sound on special teams — and its Culture Pillars: Integrity, Passion, Mental & Physical Toughness, Selfless and Perfect Effort. As part of that culture, the players voted during fall camp on who would earn single-digit jersey numbers, a reward for representing mental and physical toughness on and off the field. The numbers 2, 1 and 0 — San Antonio's area code — were chosen for the players voted to represent the 210 Triangle of Toughness brand. Offensive linemen (51) CJ James Jr., (53) Cory Godinet, (75) Venly Tatafu and (77) Makai Hart also received the necessary votes but cannot change to a single-digit number due to their position.

PRO 'RUNNERS

UTSA currently has eight players on NFL active rosters, injured reserve lists or practice squads. Marcus Davenport became the first Roadrunner to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft when the Saints picked him 14th overall in 2018. The defensive end is in his first season with the Lions after spending 2023 with the Minnesota Vikings. Tariq Woolen was selected by the Seattle Seahawks in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft. Now in his third season, the cornerback led the league with six interceptions and was a Pro Bowl selection as a rookie and has twice been voted by his peers to the NFL's Top 100 list. Spencer Burford was a fourth-round pick by the 49ers in 2022 and is in his third year as an offensive guard in San Francisco. Leroy Watson is on the Titans' active roster and earned a start on the offensive line on Oct. 13. Additionally, Joshua Cephus (Jaguars), Sincere McCormick (Raiders) and Rashad Wisdom (Buccaneers) currently are on practice squads, while Eric Banks is on the Buccaneers' injured list.

UP NEXT

The Roadrunners will return home to host Memphis on Saturday, Nov. 2. Kickoff is set for 11 a.m. at the Alamodome and the game will be televised nationally on ESPN2.

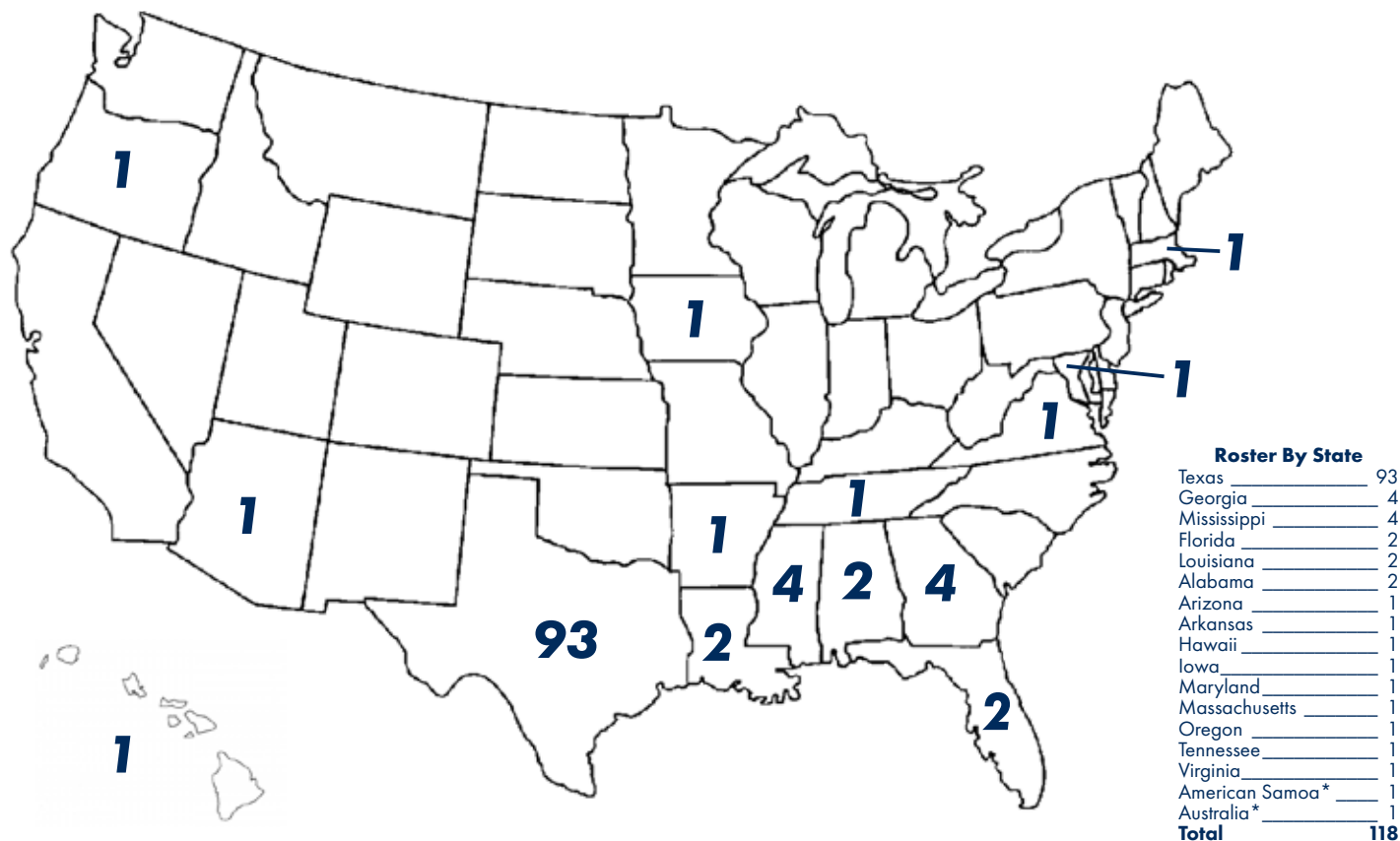

SAN ANTONIO — Owen McCown passed for 340 yards and three touchdowns and the UTSA defense held Kennesaw State to 253 total yards in a 28-16 win in the season opener on Saturday in front of 25,911 fans at the Alamodome.

With the win, the Roadrunners notched their 50th all-time home victory and improved to 24-3 in San Antonio under fifth-year head coach Jeff Traylor, who ran his overall record to 40-14.

Making his second start as a Roadrunner, McCown directed three first-half scoring drives that helped UTSA build a 21-3 lead over the Owls in the first meeting between the two teams. The redshirt sophomore connected with 10 different pass-catchers, led by Devin McCuin, who caught a career-high 11 balls for 79 yards and two TDs. Willie McCoy caught four passes for 59 yards with a long of 45, Patrick Overmyer and Houston Thomas had three receptions apiece for 31 and 28 yards, respectively, and Oscar Cardenas surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards with a pair of grabs for 38 yards.

Meanwhile, the defense was near-dominant at times, holding the Owls' dangerous ground game to only 51 rushing yards and a 1.3-yards-per-carry average. The Roadrunners racked up 10 tackles for loss, including three sacks with one apiece by Jimmori Robinson, Martavius French and James Walley Jr. Ken Robinson led UTSA with seven tackles and a TFL, while Owen Pewee and Elliott Davison made six and five stops, respectively.

UTSA marched 53 yards on the game's opening possession to put points on the board first. McCown completed passes for 16 yards to McCuin and 18 yards to Thomas on back-to-back plays to help set up a 2-yard TD pass to McCuin. Chase Allen's extra point made it 7-0.

The Owls answered with a 44-yard field goal by Austin Welch to cap a 44-yard drive that chewed 5:48 off the clock.

The Roadrunners tacked on a second touchdown in the opening frame as McCown found paydirt on a 5-yard run to put an exclamation point on an 11-play, 75-yard march and gave the home side a 14-3 advantage. That drive was highlighted by a 29-yard reception from DJ Allen.

McCown connected with McCuin again for a score early in the second stanza, this time on a 4-yard pass over the middle that extended the lead to 21-3. Robert Henry Jr.'s 61-yard reception down to the 6-yard line keyed the drive.

Welch drilled a 34-yard field in the final minute of the opening half to provide the 21-6 halftime margin.

Welch hit his third field goal of the day with a 31-yarder at the 2:06 mark of a low-scoring third quarter that pulled the visitors within 21-9.

Kennesaw State made things interesting in the fourth quarter when Carson Kent hauled in a 25-yard touchdown pass over the middle. Welch's PAT pulled the Owls within five points with 9:23 remaining.

UTSA put the game away when McCown found Cardenas wide open in the end zone on a 3-yard pass with 3:52 left to play.

Davis Bryson completed 14 of 28 passes for 202 yards and a touchdown for the Owls, while Baron Hopson recorded a game-best 13 tackles.

The Roadrunners will hit the road to face Texas State next Saturday, Sept. 7, in San Marcos. Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. and the game will be televised nationally on ESPNU.

TEXAS STATE 49, UTSA 10

SAN MARCOS — UTSA dropped a 49-10 decision to Texas State in the I-35 Showdown on Saturday afternoon at UFCU Stadium.

The Roadrunners fell to 1-1 on the season with their first setback in the six-game series with the Bobcats, who improved to 2-0 with the win.

UTSA saw two different quarterbacks combine to pass for 252 yards, as Owen McCown completed 10 passes for 105 in the first half and Eddie Lee Marburger piled up 147 yards and a touchdown on 14 completions, all after halftime. Marburger also had a career-high 23 rushing yards on five attempts.

Marburger connected with Willie McCoy on a 2-yard TD pass in the third quarter, and McCoy also had a 40-yard reception in the fourth, as the senior receiver racked up a team-high 59 receiving yards on three catches.

Devin McCuin led all Roadrunners with six grabs for 29 yards, Patrick Overmyer had three receptions for 31 yards and Chris Carpenter hauled in two passes for 43 yards.

Defensively, Ken Robinson paced UTSA with seven tackles including one for a loss. Martavius French and Jimmori Robinson made five stops with one TFL apiece, while Jermarius Lewis, Owen Pewee and Brevin Randle also recorded five tackles each.

Texas State used a balanced offense in the win, posting 504 total yards, 309 passing and 195 rushing. Jordan McCloud completed 18 of 27 passes for 309 yards and two touchdowns, while Chris Dawn Jr. had 150 yards and both TDs on only five receptions. Lincoln Pare rushed for a game-high 109 yards and a pair of scores.

UTSA came up with the first big play of the day, as cornerback Zach Morris picked off a pass at the Texas State's 33-yard line on the game's opening possession. However, UTSA could not capitalize on the field position, turning the ball back over to the Bobcats on downs.

Texas State got on the board first when McCloud scrambled for a 17-yard touchdown run at the 6:19 mark of the opening period.

UTSA responded with a 13-play, 66-yard drive that was highlighted by a Houston Thomas 44-yard reception and capped with a 26-yard field goal from Chase Allen.

The Bobcats then reeled off 28 unanswered points over the rest of the first half to take a 35-3 lead into the locker room. McCloud scored on a 2-yard keeper up the middle in the final minute of the first quarter, then connected with Dawn on a 46-yard TD pass early in the second. Deion Hankins had a 2-yard touchdown plunge with 4:39 left in the half and Pare scored on a 45-yard, fourth-down dash up the middle with 1:52 on the clock.

Texas State added to its lead with a 21-yard TD catch by Dawn midway through the third quarter.

UTSA converted a fourth-down-and-goal into a score late in the third quarter when Marburger found McCoy in the end zone for a 2-yard TD reception.

Pare added the final score of the day on a 33-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

AUSTIN, Texas — Robert Henry Jr. rushed for 65 yards and a touchdown and Martavius French had a team-high seven tackles, but it was not enough in a 56-7 setback to No. 2 Texas on Saturday night in front of 101,892 at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium.

Henry led the Roadrunners' ground game and scored the lone TD of the day on a 53-yard dash in the second quarter, as UTSA (1-2) rushed for 128 on the day.

French paced a defense that came up with two takeaways — an interception by Owen Pewee and a fumble recovery by Brevin Randle — extending the streak of consecutive games with a takeaway to 13 dating back to last September. Jamal Ligon, Brevin Randle, Elliott Davison and Jimmy Wyrick registered five tackles apiece.

Arch Manning came off the bench to throw for 223 yards and four touchdowns, rushing for another to help the Longhorns (3-0) post 614 total yards, including 427 passing. Ryan Wingo had a game-high 127 receiving yards and Isaiah Bond added 103.

The Longhorns drove 84 yards in eight plays, the last a 7-yard touchdown pass from Quinn Ewers to Bond that put the home team on the board first.

Later in the opening quarter, Pewee came up with his second career interception and returned it 11 yards to the Texas 31-yard line. However, UTSA could not take advantage of field position, turning the ball back over on downs.

Texas pushed its lead to 21-0 after 19-yard TD receptions by Johntay Cook II and DeAndre Moore Jr., but the Roadrunners got on the board when Henry broke loose for his 53-yard sprint to paydirt. Chase Allen's extra point made it 21-7 with 11:39 left in the second quarter.

The Longhorns answered, as Manning, who came on in relief for an injured Ewers, got loose for a 67-yard TD run to extend the lead back to 21.

Texas quickly upped its lead early in the third quarter with a pair of touchdown passes by Manning, one for 51 yards to Bond and a second for 75 yards to Wingo.

Manning added another touchdown pass early in the final frame, connecting with Cook II for a 12-yard score.

Ethan Burke picked off a pass in the final two minutes and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown to provide the final margin.

The Roadrunners will return home to host Houston Christian next Saturday, Sept. 21. Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. at the Alamodome.

UTSA 45, HOUSTON CHRISTIAN 7
Saturday, Sept. 21
San Antonio (Alamodome)

SAN ANTONIO — UTSA piled up a season-high 536 yards of offense and a school-record 35 first downs and held Houston Christian to just 177 yards in a 45-7 victory on Saturday afternoon at the Alamodome.

With their 13th win in the last 14 home games, the Roadrunners evened their record at 2-2 on the season in their first meeting with the Huskies (1-3). UTSA also improved to 25-3 (.893) at the Alamodome and 16-6 versus teams from the state of Texas under fifth-year head coach Jeff Taylor.

UTSA's offensive output added up to the most yards since a school-record 643 against South Florida on Nov. 17, 2023, and featured a balanced attack with 269 rushing yards – the most since 287 versus North Texas on Nov. 4, 2023 – and 267 passing yards. The 35 first downs eclipsed the previous UTSA standard done five times before, most recently in the win against South Florida last fall.

Bryson Donnell and Brandon High Jr. each rushed for a game-high 74 yards, while Kevorian Barnes added 64 yards to lead the ground game, and Owen McCown completed 18 of 25 passes for 226 yards and three touchdowns. Devin McCuin had a team-best five receptions for 43 yards and a TD, and Willie McCoy racked up 85 yards and a score on two catches.

Defensively, Jimmori Robinson had seven tackles, two tackles for loss, one sack, one forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a blocked field goal to help the Roadrunners limit the Huskies to seven points and 50 rushing yards, the fewest allowed since Rice ran for 47 on Nov. 11, 2023.

UTSA totaled seven TFLs, including four sacks, as Joe Evans, Owen Pewee and Ronald Triplette joined Robinson in the sack column. The Roadrunners also kept their turnover streak alive on Robinson's forced fumble and recovery in the first quarter, extending the stretch of consecutive games with a takeaway to 14.

The Roadrunners struck first, marching 61 yards in eight plays for a 26-yard field goal by Chase Allen. They pushed their lead to 10-0 after a 5-yard touchdown pass from McCown to McCuin late in the opening period.

HCU appeared to get on the board initially in the second quarter, but a holding penalty negated a field goal. On the ensuing try, Robinson blocked the kick and Denver Harris recovered it at midfield. That marked the first blocked field goal for the Roadrunners since Tariq Woolen against Marshall on Nov. 17, 2018.

UTSA took advantage of the block, as High ripped off a 28-yard rush to help set up his 9-yard TD run up the middle on third down. Allen's PAT made it 17-0 with 6:14 left to play until halftime.

The Huskies officially broke through for points later in the second stanza, as Jesse Valenzuela got loose around the left side for a 20-yard touchdown scamper.

The Roadrunners responded with back-to-back touchdown drives to close the half.

Willie McCoy got free down the right sideline for a 59-yard TD reception from McCown with just over two minutes remaining in the second quarter. Robert Henry then capped a five-play, 55-yard march with a 17-yard catch and run up the middle to paydirt. Tate Sandell's extra point provided the 31-7 halftime margin.

The Roadrunners picked up where they left off to start the second half, as Kevorian Barnes' 8-yard touchdown rush put an exclamation point on a nine-play, 68-yard drive.

Jamel Hardy made a one-handed grab on the sideline in the end zone on a 5-yard pass from Eddie Lee Marburger to help push the advantage to 45-7 early in the final frame.

HCU's Eli Brickholder passed for 83 yards and AJ Wilson led the Huskies with four catches for 71 yards.

EAST CAROLINA 30, UTSA 20 Saturday, Sept. 28 Greenville, N.C. (Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium)

GREENVILLE, N.C. — Zah Frazier had two interceptions and UTSA posted 456 yards of offense, but East Carolina rallied from a 10-point deficit for a 30-20 victory in the American Athletic Conference opener for both teams on Saturday afternoon at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

The Roadrunners (2-3, 0-1) built a 13-3 first-half lead but the Pirates scored 24 unanswered points and held off a late UTSA rally to improve to 3-2 on the season.

Frazier became the fifth Roadrunner to record two interceptions in a game and the first since Clayton Johnson in 2017 to help UTSA extend its streak of consecutive games with a takeaway to 15. Martavius French paced the defense with eight tackles, including six solo stops and one tackle for loss, while Jamal Ligon became the second UTSA player to reach 300 career tackles after logging five, including a sack, to go with a forced fumble and one quarterback hurry.

Offensively, UTSA passed for 286 yards and rushed for 170. Brandon High Jr. led the ground game with 92 yards and a touchdown on just seven attempts, while Willie McCoy caught four passes for 91 yards. Owen McCown completed 24 of 49 passes for 251 yards and a TD and Chris Carpenter led all receivers with six catches for 61 yards.

The Pirates struck first, converting a UTSA turnover near midfield into a 21-yard field goal by Noah Perez that was set up with a 35-yard pass from Jake Garcia to Yannick Smith.

The Roadrunners responded with a field goal of their own, as Chase Allen split the uprights from 23 yards to cap a 70-yard drive that was highlighted by a Willie McCoy 66-yard reception.

UTSA took a 10-3 lead after Oscar Cardenas hauled in a TD pass on a third-down-and-goal attempt from the 5-yard line late in the opening quarter. That score was set up by a 35-yard reception from Kevorian Barnes on a screen pass from Eddie Lee Marburger, who entered the game for one play after McCown lost his helmet.

Allen pushed the advantage to 13-3 in the second quarter to cap a 14-play, 75-yard march that took more than seven minutes off the clock.

ECU pulled within three points in the final minute of the first half when Garcia scored on a 3-yard quarterback keeper.

The Pirates took their first lead of the day on their opening drive of the second half, as Winston Wright Jr. got loose on the right sideline for a 40-yard score. Perez's PAT made it 17-13.

ECU used another long pass completion to extend the lead to 24-13 late in the third quarter when Garcia found Anthony Smith open down the right sideline for a 53-yard score.

The Pirates tacked on another field goal from Perez, this one from 42 yards that made it 27-13 with 11:51 left to play.

UTSA cut the deficit to seven when Brandon High Jr. broke free on a 66-yard touchdown run on a fourth-and-one play. Allen's extra point put the score at 27-20 with 10:38 remaining.

Garcia threw for 294 yards and a pair of TDs on 17-of-35 passing, while Rahjai Harris rushed for a team-high 60 yards on 25 carries.

RICE 29, UTSA 27 Saturday, Oct. 12 Houston (Rice Stadium)

HOUSTON — Owen McCown passed for 256 yards and three touchdowns but E.J. Warner's TD pass to Matt Sykes with four seconds left lifted Rice to a 29-27 victory over UTSA on Saturday night in American Athletic Conference action at Rice Stadium.

Trailing 23-13 entering the fourth quarter, the Roadrunners (2-4, 0-2 AAC) rallied to reclaim the lead with back-to-back scoring drives. McCown found Devin McCuin on a 6-yard touchdown pass with 5:40 remaining to make it a three-point contest. The redshirt sophomore quarterback then connected with Houston Thomas over the middle on a 38-yard TD pass. Tate Sandell's extra point made it 27-23 with 2:06 on the clock.

However, Warner directed an eight-play, 65-yard scoring march that gave the Owls (2-4, 1-2) the lead for good. A defensive pass interference penalty gave Rice the ball at the UTSA 17-yard line. Following an offensive pass interference call that pushed the line of scrimmage back to the 32, Warner hit Drayden Dickmann on a 14-yard pass play to set up the game-winning, 18-yard touchdown pass to Sykes. Warner then took a knee on the point-after-touchdown attempt to leave the score at 29-27.

UTSA got the ball back for one last play following a touchback on the ensuing kickoff, but the Rice defense came up with the stop to seal the win.

McCown completed 28 of 43 passes and also added 53 rushing yards to help the Roadrunners total 394 yards of offense. McCuin had a team-high seven receptions for 83 yards, Chris Carpenter caught six balls for 36 yards and DJ Allen made three grabs for 38 yards and a TD.

UTSA held Rice to only 42 rushing yards, the third straight opponent to rush for 50 or fewer yards. The Roadrunners also extended a pair of streaks to 16 games with a takeaway and a sack on the night.

Martavius French paced the defense with seven tackles, two tackles for loss, one pass breakup and a quarterback hurry. Donyai Taylor and Owen Peeewe added five stops apiece.

Defenses controlled the first quarter as both teams combined for just 89 total yards over the first 15 minutes. UTSA also extended its takeaway streak to 16 games with a forced fumble by Zah Frazier and recovery by Elliott Davison in the opening period.

The Roadrunners broke through for the first points of the night at the 6:30 mark of the second stanza when Sandell connected on a 45-yard field goal. That kick capped a 15-play, 55-yard drive that took more than six minutes off the clock.

Rice responded with a 5-yard TD run on a quarterback keeper by Warner. The extra point attempt was no good, leaving the score at 6-3.

UTSA reclaimed the lead late in the opening half when Allen took a short pass and raced down the right sideline to paydirt for a 20-yard touchdown reception. Sandell's PAT made it 10-6 with 1:50 remaining.

Enock Gota split the uprights from 46 yards as time expired in the half to pull the Owls within one.

Rice jumped back in front on its opening possession of the second half when Dean Connors hauled in a 69-yard TD pass from Warner. Connors plunged into the end zone on the two-point conversion attempt to give the home team a 17-10 advantage.

Sandell drilled a 52-yard field goal on UTSA's ensuing drive, the second-longest make in program history.

The Owls pushed their lead to 10 points when Connors scored on an 8-yard rush up the middle to put an end to a 75-yard drive.

Warner completed 25 of 39 passes for 347 yards and a pair of TDs, while Connors had 136 all-purpose yards, including 109 receiving, and two scores.

UTSA 38, FLA. ATLANTIC 24

San Antonio (ALAMODOME)

SAN ANTONIO — UTSA used a stout defense and efficient offense to rally from a 17-10 first-half deficit for a 38-24 victory over Florida Atlantic in American Athletic Conference action on Saturday afternoon at the Alamodome.

With the win, the Roadrunners snapped a two-game losing skid to run their record to 3-4 overall and 1-2 in the league. The Owls fell to 2-5 and 0-3. UTSA also improved to 26-3 at home under fifth-year head coach Jeff Taylor with its 14th win in the last 15 contests at the Alamodome.

Trailing by seven late in the second quarter and with the Owls threatening to add to their lead, Asyrus Simon's strip-sack of FAU quarterback Cam Fancher proved to be a key play in the fifth meeting between the two teams, giving the ball back to the Roadrunners at their own 12-yard line with 3:21 left until halftime. UTSA then marched 88 yards on 11 plays, the last a 10-yard touchdown pass from Owen McCown to Jamel Hardy. Tate Sandell's extra point knotted the score at 17-all going into the break.

UTSA's defense surrendered just 32 total yards following Simon's takeaway, including only 29 in the second half. Altogether, the Roadrunners have held the Owls to a combined 365 yards of offense over the last two meetings, as they allowed only 162 in a 36-10 road triumph last year.

The Roadrunners outscored FAU, 21-7, over the final 30 minutes, giving up just a fumble return for a touchdown when Wendol Philord scooped up a loose ball on a lateral and sped 49 yards to the end zone with 3:58 left in the third quarter. That score tied the game again at 24-24, but UTSA responded with 14 unanswered points down the stretch to seal the win.

UTSA registered 13 tackles for loss, including a school record-tying seven sacks to extend that streak to 17 games. The takeaway streak also was extended to 17 games in a row with Simon's strip-sack and Owen Pewee's late interception.

Brandon Brown posted four total tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Pewee added a pair of TFLs and sack that resulted in a 16-yard loss, while Davin Martin, Bryce Grays, Jameian Buxton, Jon Jones, Vic Shaw and Simon all joined in on the sack party.

Offensively, McCown tied his career high with 340 passing yards to go with a pair of TDs through the air and 22 yards on the ground. Brandon High Jr. rushed for a game-high 65 yards, including a 29-yard touchdown scamper with 2:25 left to play that helped put the game away.

Houston Thomas led the UTSA pass catchers with 63 yards on three receptions, while Chris Carpenter had six grabs for 58 yards. Patrick Overmyer and Hardy each posted three catches for 47 yards and a TD.

UTSA scored on its opening possession for the third time in three home games this season, marching 67 yards in 16 plays, the last a 33-yard field goal by Sandell.

Fancher broke loose for a 76-yard dash up the middle to paydirt to get the visitors on the board late in the first quarter.

The Roadrunners responded with a 5-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by Overmyer's first career score, a 42-yard touchdown catch. Sandell's extra point made it 10-7 with 14:51 left until halftime.

Fancher put the Owls back on top later in the second stanza on a 6-yard scramble around the left end that was set up with a 27-yard interception return by Jayden Williams to the UTSA 3-yard line.

Carter Davis tacked on three points with a 50-yard field goal midway through the second quarter making it 17-10 in favor of FAU.

With the game deadlocked at halftime, UTSA reclaimed the lead on the first possession of the second half, as Robert Henry's 1-yard touchdown plunge put an exclamation point on a nine-play, 75-yard drive that was highlighted by a 41-yard catch from Thomas and a 19-yard reception from Carpenter.

Sandell added 41- and 27-yard field goals in fourth quarter to push the lead to 30-24 before High's TD dash and Henry's plunge on the two-point conversion attempt provided the final margin.
