« OPENING DRIVE »

- UTSA will open its six-game, regular-season home slate on Saturday against Texas State riding a school record-tying 10-game home winning streak.
- The Roadrunners are 4-1 in home openers under head coach Jeff Traylor and 9-5 all-time in home debuts.
- UTSA is 29-3 (.906) at home in the Jeff Traylor era, and the 29 wins since 2020 are tied for the third-most in the FBS over that stretch behind only Alabama (32) and Ohio State (31).
- UTSA and Texas State will meet for the third straight season and seventh time overall on Saturday.
- The Roadrunners lead the all-time series, 5-1, including a 3-0 mark in games played at the Alamodome.
- Jeff Traylor coached Texas State head coach G.J. Kinne during his senior year (2006) at Gilmer High School.
- UTSA is 46-21 (.687) overall in the Jeff Traylor era (since 2020), the most wins among FBS teams from both the state of Texas and current American Conference members over that span.
- The Roadrunners are 37-24 versus teams from the state of Texas, including 17-8 under Jeff Traylor.
- Saturday's Battle for I-35 will serve as the annual Orange Out game, as UTSA aims to break the program's all-time home game attendance record of 56,743 fans.

Athletics Communications

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SETTING THE SCENE

UTSA will open its six-game, regular-season home slate on Saturday, Sept. 6, against Texas State in the Battle for I-35. Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. at the Alamodome for the annual Orange Out game. The Roadrunners (0-1), who are riding a school record-tying 10-game home winning streak, and Bobcats (1-0) will meet for the third straight season and seventh time overall in a series that UTSA leads, 5-1. UTSA is aiming to break the program's all-time home game attendance record of 56,743 fans set on Sept. 3, 2011, in the inaugural game versus Northeastern State. The last time these two teams met at the Alamodome on Sept. 9, 2023, the second-largest home crowd of 49,342 fans witnessed a 20-13 victory for the Roadrunners.

TUNING IN

Saturday's game will air on ESPN+ and via the ESPN app. Jack Benjamin (play-by-play) and LaDarrin McLane (analyst) will call the action. UTSA Sports Media Network will air the game live in the San Antonio area on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at ticket760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Ed Suarez (reporter) have the call. There will be a two-hour pregame show hosted by Pat Evans and a 45-minute postgame show.

CELEBRATING CAMPAIGN NO. 15

The Roadrunners are celebrating their 15th season of football in 2025. One of the newer FBS programs and now in its third year as a member of the American Conference, UTSA started its program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played its first season as an FCS Independent in 2011 before joining the Western Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign. UTSA moved into Conference USA in 2013 and became a full-fledged FBS member starting with the 2014 season. The Roadrunners set NCAA modern startup program records in 2011 by drawing 56,743 fans to their inaugural game against Northeastern State and by averaging 35,521 fans for their six home contests that season. UTSA made its first postseason appearance at the 2016 New Mexico Bowl in its sixth season of play and registered its first win against a team from the Big 12 Conference the following season with a 17-10 victory over Baylor. The Roadrunners made history in 2021, opening the fall with a road win against Illinois of the Big Ten Conference, capturing their first conference championship with a 49-42 decision against WKU and capping a 12-2 ledger with their third bowl game. They repeated as league champions with a 48-27 win over North Texas in 2022 and made their third straight bowl appearance, ending the year with an 11-3 mark. The Roadrunners notched their first bowl victory with a 35-17 decision over Marshall in the 2023 Frisco Bowl to cap a 9-4 ledger that include a 7-1 mark in their debut in the American. UTSA collected its second straight bowl win with a 44-15 triumph over Coastal Carolina in the Myrtle Beach Bowl to close out a seven-win campaign in 2024. UTSA now has posted at least six wins in nine of its 14 previous seasons, and it has reached the seven-win plateau seven times, including in each of the first five years of the Jeff Traylor era.

HOME SWEET DOME

UTSA has been tough to beat at the Alamodome during the Jeff Traylor era, boasting a 29-3 (.906) record at the facility dating back to the 2020 season. The 29 wins are tied for the third most among FBS teams over that span behind only Alabama (32) and Ohio State (31). The Roadrunners have won a school record-tying 10 straight and 17 of their last 18 home contests entering Saturday's Battle for I-35 against Texas State. Their last home loss was against Army on Sept. 15, 2023. UTSA first reeled off a 10-game home win streak that started with a 27-26 victory over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020, and ran through the 49-41 win against WKU in the 2021 Conference USA Championship Game before it was snapped in triple overtime against No. 24 Houston in the 2022 season opener. The Roadrunners have been victorious in 27 of their last 29 home contests and are 55-30 (.647) all-time in the Alamodome.

PACKING THE DOME

UTSA fans have packed the Alamodome over the past four seasons, as five of the program's nine-largest home crowds have been recorded during that span. The Roadrunners are aiming to break the program's home game attendance record of 56,743 fans when they host Texas State in the home opener this Saturday. The last time these two teams met in San Antonio, 49,342 fans watched UTSA beat Texas State in the 2023 home opener to mark the second-largest crowd in program history. Since the return from COVID-19 protocols for the 2021 season, 688,533 fans have filed into the Alamodome to watch the Roadrunners, an average of 26,482 per contest. In the 2024 season opener against Kennesaw State, the program eclipsed the two-million fan mark, and now 2,114,786 spectators have watched the Roadrunners at the Alamodome, an average of 24,880 over 85 home contests. UTSA set NCAA modern startup program records in its first season by drawing 56,743 fans to the inaugural game against Northeastern State on Sept. 3, 2011, and by averaging 35,521 fans for six home contests.

TRAYLOR TAKING ROADRUNNERS TO NEW HEIGHTS

Sixth-year head coach Jeff Traylor has taken UTSA to new heights during his time in San Antonio. The Roadrunners are 46-21 (.687) under his direction, the most wins since 2020 among current American Conference teams and among Texas FBS programs. UTSA boasts a 29-3 (.906) home record in the Traylor era, tied for the third-most home wins since 2020 among FBS teams. Only Alabama (32) and Ohio State (31) have more home victories during that span. Since Traylor — the winningest coach in program history — arrived in San Antonio, UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned five straight bowl berths with back-to-back bowl wins and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls. He has coached nine All-Americans, three national award finalists, 91 all-conference selections and a trio of NFL Draft picks at UTSA.

LAST TIME OUT

Robert Henry Jr. rushed for 177 yards and two touchdowns, but No. 19 Texas A&M pulled away in the second half for a 42-24 victory over UTSA on Saturday night in front of 107,521 fans at Kyle Field. Henry topped the century mark on the ground for his third straight game, doing so on a 75-yard TD dash on the first play from scrimmage in the second half, which got the Roadrunners to within four points in the third all-time meeting with the Aggies. The senior running back averaged 11.1 yards on his 16 carries, coming up just one yard shy of his UTSA career high of 178 posted in

the win over Temple last November. Henry's night helped the Roadrunners tally 203 rushing yards to go with 170 through the air. Owen McCown passed for 121 while Brandon Tennison came off the bench in the fourth quarter and completed both of his pass attempts, including a 34-yard TD toss to AJ Wilson. Shad Banks Jr. registered seven tackles with one for a loss, while Kendrick Blackshire and Jimmy Wyrick added five stops apiece. UTSA held Texas A&M to only 108 rushing yards and 399 total.

SCOUTING TEXAS STATE

The Bobcats opened the season with a 52-27 home triumph over Eastern Michigan on Saturday. Texas State piled up 606 yards of offense, 392 rushing and 214 passing, while allowing 391 total yards. Lincoln Pare paced the ground attack with 167 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries, while Brad Jackson completed 18 of 26 passes for 214 yards and four TDs. Beau Sparks was the top receiver with seven catches for 82 yards and four scores. Defensively, Treylin Payne registered nine tackles, while Jaden Rios had three stops including a sack. Head coach GJ Kinne is 17-10 in his third season at the helm.

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday will mark the seventh meeting on the gridiron between UTSA and Texas State. The Roadrunners lead the series, 5-1, including a perfect 3-0 mark in games played at the Alamodome. The three previous matchups in San Antonio have been decided by an average margin of six points.

WHO'S COUNTING?

Now in their 15th season of play, the Roadrunners will play the 174th game in program history on Saturday when they face Texas State. UTSA is 91-82 (.526) all-time and 55-30 (.647) at the Alamodome, including 29-3 (.906) under head coach Jeff Traylor. By comparison, Texas State has played football since 1904 and has an all-time record of 572-528-33.

UTSA VERSUS IN-STATE FOES

The Roadrunners are 37-24 all-time against teams from the state of Texas including a 17-8 mark under sixth-year head coach Jeff Traylor. Texas State is the second of three consecutive opponents from the Lone Star State on this season's docket, which also includes Rice and North Texas in October.

FAMILIAR FACE

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor will see a familiar face across the field on Saturday. Texas State head coach G.J. Kinne played quarterback under Traylor as a senior at Gilmer High School in 2006, helping lead the Buckeyes to a 10-0 record and the district title. The two also worked together on the same staffs in 2017 at SMU and in 2018 at Arkansas.

LAST MEETING

UTSA dropped a 49-10 decision to Texas State on Sept. 7, 2024, in San Marcos. The Bobcats used a balanced offense in the win, posting 504 total yards, 309 passing and 195 rushing, to notch their first win in the series. Two different quarterbacks combined to pass for 252 yards, as Owen McCown completed 10 passes for 105 in the first half and Eddie Lee Marburger piled up 147 yards and a touchdown on 14 completions, all after halftime. Marburger connected with Willie McCoy on a 2-yard TD pass in the third quarter, and McCoy also had a 40-yard reception in the fourth, as the receiver racked up a team-high 59 receiving yards on three catches. Devin McCuin led all Roadrunners with six grabs for 29 yards, Patrick Overmyer had three receptions for 31 yards and Chris Carpenter hauled in two passes for 43 yards. Ken Robinson paced UTSA with seven tackles including one for a loss.

SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

UTSA's 12-game regular season schedule features four non-conference games and eight American Conference contests. The Roadrunners kicked off the campaign on Aug. 30 against Texas A&M at Kyle Field. UTSA will host back-to-back home games against Texas State (Sept. 6) and UIW (Sept. 13) before traveling to Fort Collins to face Colorado State (Sept. 20). The Roadrunners are slated to open league play on Oct. 4 at Temple in Philadelphia before hosting Rice for Homecoming the following Saturday. UTSA will face North Texas on Oct. 18 in Denton before back-to-back Thursday night affairs on ESPN or ESPN2 at home against Tulane (Oct. 30) and on the road against South Florida (Nov. 6). Following a road date with Charlotte on Nov. 15, the Roadrunners will close out the regular season with home games versus East Carolina on Nov. 22 and defending conference champion Army on either Nov. 28 or 29. The American Football Championship is set for Friday, Dec. 5 at 7 p.m. CT on ABC.

CHALLENGING NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

The Roadrunners' four-game non-conference slate sets up to be one of the toughest in the FBS this season. Texas A&M, Texas State and Colorado State all won eight games in 2024, while UIW registered 11 wins and made a run to the FCS quarterfinal round. That adds up to a combined 35 victories a year ago for UTSA's four non-league foes.

FAMILIAR FOES

UTSA will face familiar foes in 2025, as the Roadrunners have previously faced all 12 teams on the regular season schedule. The most-played series in program history is with North Texas, and the two teams will meet for the 14th time in October with UTSA holding an 8-5 edge. The Roadrunners and Rice will play for the 13th time, also in October, with UTSA boasting an 8-4 advantage. UTSA and Texas State will meet for the seventh time in the home opener with the Roadrunners leading that series, 5-1, while the regular season finale will mark the sixth meeting with Army.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

UTSA is no stranger to close contests in the Jeff Traylor era, as 38 of the 67 have been one-score ballgames in the fourth quarter. The Roadrunners own a 25-13 record (.658) in those games. Dating back to the 2021 campaign, UTSA has seen 25 of the last 46 contests decided in the fourth quarter or later. Additionally, the Roadrunners are 14-7 (.667) in games decided by eight points or less since 2021.

HIGH-SCORING ROADRUNNERS

UTSA has emerged as one of the top scoring offenses in the FBS under head coach Jeff Traylor. UTSA has scored 20-plus points in 11 straight games and in 53 of the last 59 contests dating back to the 2020 campaign. The Roadrunners have tallied 2,240 points in 67 games under head coach Jeff Traylor, good for an average of 33.4 points per game. Last season, the Roadrunners scored 431 points in 13 games for an average of 33.2 points per game, which ranked fourth in the American Conference and 27th in the FBS. They topped the 20-point barrier in each of the last 10 games and 11 times overall while surpassing the 40-point barrier in five of the last six contests. In 2021, the Roadrunners set school records for scoring, tallying 516 total points in 14 contests for a program-record 36.9 points per game to rank 11th nationally. The following year, the Roadrunners came up just shy of the school record with 515 points in 14 games for an average of 36.8 per outing, good for 14th in the FBS. The Roadrunners scored 415 points in 13 games in 2023, good for an average of 31.9 per contest. In fact, these last four seasons rank as the top four scoring totals and averages in program history.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

The Jeff Traylor era has produced the most productive offenses in UTSA history with offensive coordinator Justin Burke directing the unit since the 2022 Cure Bowl. The Roadrunners have registered the top four and five of the top six single-season yardage totals since Traylor arrived for the 2020 campaign. Additionally, the top five rushing seasons and four of the top five passing years have occurred under Traylor's watch. UTSA also has set program standards for single-game

output in the past five seasons. Nine of the top 10 games for total yards, eight of the top 10 contests for passing yards and five of the top nine outings for rushing yards have happened in the Traylor era.

BORN TO PLAY QB

UTSA redshirt junior Owen McCown was born to play quarterback. The lefthander is the son of current Minnesota Vikings quarterbacks coach Josh McCown, who was a third-round draft pick in 2002 and played 18 seasons in the NFL after a collegiate career at SMU and Sam Houston. Two of his uncles also played the position. Luke McCown starred at Louisiana Tech before he was selected in the fourth round of the 2004 NFL Draft and enjoyed a 12-year NFL career. Randy McCown played quarterback at Texas A&M from 1996 to 1999, helping the Aggies to the 1998 Big 12 Conference Championship. Those three McCown brothers all played for UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor when he was an assistant coach at Jacksonville High School in the 1990s. A member of five preseason watch lists, Owen registered one of the most productive seasons by any UTSA QB in 2024. He completed 294 of 467 passes for 3,424 yards and 25 touchdowns and rushed for 340 yards and three TDs, giving him 3,764 yards of total offense. One of only 16 FBS quarterbacks who owns at least one start in three consecutive seasons, his 2024 numbers rank second on the school's single-season charts for passing yards, attempts, completions and total offense and third in passing TDs. He also set a school record with 434 passing yards versus Tulsa and broke loose for the longest rush by a UTSA quarterback with his 75-yard touchdown dash in the win against North Texas last fall. He completed 19 passes for 121 yards in the 2025 opener at No. 19 Texas A&M to up his UTSA career totals to 356 completions and 3,987 passing yards, which both rank fourth in school history. He also ranks second in completion percentage (.639) and passing efficiency (136.6) and fourth with 29 TD passes and 557 attempts.

HENRY HEATING UP

Back for his third year as a Roadrunner thanks to the NCAA's waiver for junior college players, running back Robert Henry Jr. has heated up over his last three games with 523 yards, six touchdowns and three runs of 75-or-more yards. A member of watch lists for the Doak Walker and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Awards, he topped the century mark in back-to-back wins last November before missing the last two games with an injury. He rushed for 168 yards and two touchdowns — including an 83-yard dash — on 20 totes and tallied 57 yards on three receptions in the 48-27 win over North Texas. The following week, he broke loose for a UTSA career-best 178 yards and a pair of scores on 16 totes, including an 88-yard rush in the 51-27 triumph over Temple. In the 2025 season opener, he piled up 177 yards and two scores — including a 75-yard sprint — against No. 19 Texas A&M, averaging 11.1 yards on 16 attempts. His rushing yardage total is tied for the fourth most in a game by an FBS player this season. A native of Lumberton, Mississippi, who joined the Roadrunners after a two-year career at Jones College, he was UTSA's top rusher last season with 706 yards and seven touchdowns on 130 carries. He has rushed for 1,294 yards and 18 TDs in 24 career contests with UTSA.

TIGHT END DEPTH ON DISPLAY

UTSA once again boasts a deep tight end group with three returnees who all have at least 30 career receptions. Fifth-year senior Dan Dishman has made the most appearances with 40 games under his belt. The Seabrook, Texas, native owns 30 catches for 375 yards and four touchdowns. Redshirt junior Houston Thomas has the most receptions (46) and yards (593) to go with three TDs in 31 contests. The College Station High School product, who appears on the John Mackey Award Watch List, led UTSA tight ends in 2024 with 34 catches and 470 receiving yards. Redshirt sophomore Patrick Overmyer burst onto the scene last fall with 283 yards and three scores on 31 receptions en route to second-team freshman All-America accolades from The Athletic. The Kingwood native opened 2025 with three catches for seven yards at No. 19 Texas A&M. Altogether, that trio has combined for 110 catches for 1,258 yards and 10 touchdowns as Roadrunners.

McATTACK

UTSA's offense features a trio of weapons whose last names all start with Mc in senior wide receiver Willie McCoy, redshirt junior quarterback Owen McCown and junior wide receiver Devin McCuin. In his first year as the starting QB, McCown, a product of Rusk High School, directed the "McAttack" by throwing for 3,424 yards and 25 touchdowns on 294-of-467 passing (.63%) in 2024. McCoy, a Houston

native, paced the Roadrunners with 536 receiving yards on 28 catches, good for school-record average of 19.14 yards per reception. A member of the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List, McCuin led UTSA in receptions with 45 despite missing five games, piling up 424 yards and a team-best five receiving touchdowns last fall. The Jacksonville High School product opened 2025 with six catches for 33 yards against No. 19 Texas A&M.

EXPERIENCE UP FRONT

UTSA boasts one of the most experienced offensive lines in the FBS. Entering the season, the Roadrunners’ o-line owned a combined 288 combined games played, which ranked second in the nation behind only Virginia (334) and ahead of Florida State (265), Illinois (259) and Oregon (253). Additionally, UTSA carried a combined 151 starts into the 2025 campaign, which stood sixth among FBS programs. UTSA’s most-experienced lineman is Kamar Missouri, who has played in 33 games between his time at Rutgers and in San Antonio. Demetris Allen, a seventh-year senior, has appeared in 32 contests, while Deandre Marshall and Trevor Timmons — a transfer from Georgia State — have played in 29 apiece. Timmons and Cory Godinet — who at 26 years old is the oldest current FBS offensive lineman — share the team lead for starts with 24 each, while Venly Tatafu has started 22 of his 28 contests.

MR. VERSATILITY

Redshirt sophomore David Amador II is UTSA’s Mr. Versatility. Not only is he one of the team’s top wide receivers, but he also has rush attempts, a punt return and a pass attempt to his name. A product of perennial power Galena Park North Shore High School, he has 45 receptions for 519 yards and two touchdowns to go with 61 rushing yards on only five carries. He has emerged as UTSA’s punt returner this season, returning one for nine yards against No. 19 Texas A&M. Last year, he completed his only pass attempt, a 27-yard strike to Dan Dishman in the 44-36 win over No. 25 Memphis.

APPLYING THE PRESSURE

The Roadrunners have developed a reputation for fielding a pressure defense since head coach Jeff Traylor arrived in 2020. Under the direction of defensive coordinator Jess Loepp since the 2021 campaign, UTSA has logged the top three season totals for sacks and four of the top five tallies for tackles for loss. Additionally, the Roadrunners have registered nine of the top 10 single-game totals for both sacks and TFLs in the Jeff Traylor era.

TAKEAWAY STREAK

UTSA entered the season opener at Texas A&M riding a streak of 23 consecutive games with a takeaway, but the Roadrunners came away without forcing a turnover. That stretch started with a fumble recovery against Tennessee on Sept. 23, 2023. The Roadrunners went on to tally 18 takeaways that season, picking off 10 passes and recovering eight fumbles. In 2024, UTSA forced 22 turnovers by its opponents. Led by All-American Zah Frazier’s school-record six interceptions, the Roadrunners claimed 11 INTs to go with 11 fumble recoveries.

SACK ATTACK

UTSA has developed a reputation for a defense that racks up tackles behind the line of scrimmage. The Roadrunners recorded a pair of tackles for loss in the opener at No. 19 Texas A&M, but they saw their 23-game streak with a sack come to an end. Last season, the Roadrunners registered 42 sacks, four shy of the school record of 46 set in 2023. UTSA shattered the program standard for tackles for loss in a season with 114 last fall, beating the previous mark of 99 established in 2023. Over the past two seasons, the Roadrunners have recorded 215 TFLs (7.9/game) and 88 sacks (3.3/game).

STUFFING THE RUN

The Roadrunners were tough to run against in 2024, and that carried into the 2025 season opener at No. 19 Texas A&M. UTSA surrendered only 108 rushing yards against the Aggies, who ended last season ranked second in the SEC and 26th in the FBS with 195.5 rushing yards per game. Last fall, UTSA allowed only 109.3 rushing yards per game, which led the American Conference and ranked 11th in the FBS. The Roadrunners held eight of their 13 opponents to 100 or fewer yards on the ground, including four who gained no more than 51 yards.

TOUGH ON THIRD DOWN

Last fall, UTSA emerged as one of the best in the FBS at getting off the field on third down. Opponents converted third downs at just a 31.1-percent clip, a mark that led the American Conference and ranked seventh in the FBS. UTSA allowed only 57 first downs on 183 total third-down attempts, including four-or-fewer successful third-down conversions in eight contests. In the season opener at No. 19 Texas A&M, the Roadrunners held the Aggies to just 3 of 11 (27.3%) on third down.

D-LINE DEPTH ON DISPLAY

Over the past several seasons, UTSA traditionally has rotated at least nine players on the defensive line. Despite losing five veterans of the position group from last season's squad, 12 d-linemen saw action in the 2025 opener at No. 19 Texas A&M. Leading the way for the returnees are Jameian Buxton, Jon Jones, Tai Leonard, Chidera Otutu and Daemian Wimberly, who all saw significant action last fall. Buxton, a junior from New Orleans who earned a spot on the CSC Academic All-District Team last year, has logged 23 career appearances. Jones, a senior from Dallas who previously played at Missouri and Northern Arizona, played in 12 contests last fall, while Leonard, a redshirt junior from Galena Park North Shore High School, has 28 career games under his belt. Otutu played in all 13 contests as a true freshman last season, while Wimberly saw time in a dozen games as a redshirt freshman for UTSA in 2024.

BANKS SHINES IN UTSA DEBUT

UTSA inside linebacker Shad Banks Jr. shined in his debut with the Roadrunners last Saturday against No. 19 Texas A&M. The graduate transfer from TCU paced the defense with seven total tackles, including six solo stops and a tackle for loss. A former star wide receiver at perennial power Galena Park North Shore High School, he began his career at the same position with the Aggies in the spring of 2021 before transferring to TCU, where he played in 42 career games following a switch to linebacker. He was voted by his UTSA teammates into the coveted No. 0 jersey in his first season on campus.

PEWEE THE PLAYMAKER

Owen Pewee has developed a reputation as a playmaker for UTSA's defense from the money backer position. He registered 42 total tackles, 25 unassisted stops, 6.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, two interceptions, a pair of pass breakups and one forced fumble in 2024. He opened that season with a career-high six tackles, including five unassisted and one behind the line of scrimmage, to go with one pass breakup in the victory over Kennesaw State in what was his first start. He logged his first interception of the season in the third game when he picked off a Quinn Ewers pass and returned it 11 yards in the first quarter versus No. 2 Texas. The Cypress Park High School product posted his second INT of the year to go with four tackles, two TFLs and a sack and in the 38-24 win versus Florida Atlantic. One of 50 student-athletes on the roster who wears a first-generation student patch, he matched his career best with six stops in the home win against North Texas and he closed the campaign with three solo stops in the 44-15 triumph over Coastal Carolina in the Myrtle Beach Bowl, helping lead the Roadrunners to their second straight bowl win. Originally from Liberia, Pewee had a hand in a tackle behind the line of scrimmage in six different games last season. After logging one quarterback hurry in the season opener at No. 19 Texas A&M, he now has 75 tackles, 47 solo stops, 13 TFLs, three sacks, four PBU's, four QB hurries, three interceptions and a forced fumble in 31 career contests for the Roadrunners.

EDGE THREATS

Over the past two seasons, UTSA's will linebacker position has produced arguably the league's top defender, as a Roadrunner has claimed American Conference Defensive Player of the Year honors each of the last two years (Jimmori Robinson, 2024; Trey Moore, 2023). This season, Camron Cooper and Vic Shaw are two of the leading candidates to step into that role for UTSA. A redshirt junior out of Dayton High School, Cooper began his collegiate career as a tight end before moving to inside linebacker and eventually landing at outside linebacker in the last half of the 2024 campaign. He earned his first start against No. 22 Army in the regular season finale and posted four tackles. He made his second career start in the season opener at No. 19 Texas A&M and turned in one tackle. Shaw, a redshirt sophomore who hails from Texarkana Pleasant Grove High School, made his first start in the 44-15 victory over Coastal Carolina in the 2024 Myrtle Beach Bowl, logging four solo stops with one sack. He opened this season with three stops against the Aggies.

TV BIRDS

Saturday's game will air on ESPN+, marking 152 straight televised/streamed appearances for the Roadrunners. The last UTSA game that was not broadcast was the 2012 season finale against Texas State.

TRAYLOR THE HALL OF FAMER

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor has been inducted into two different halls of fame this calendar year. A legendary high school coach for his hometown Gilmer Buckeyes, he was inducted into the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in May in a class that also included Patrick Mahomes II, Robert Griffin III, Pat Thomas, Gary Keithley, Brad Goebel, John C. Norman, David Smoak and Curtis Barbay. In July, he was recognized as part of the 2025 Texas High School Coaches Associations (THSCA) Hall of Honor at the organization's annual convention in San Antonio. Traylor built Gilmer into a prep powerhouse during his 15-year tenure at the helm. He posted a 175-26 record (.871) and led the Buckeyes to state championships in 2004, 2009 and 2014, two additional state title game appearances in 2007 and 2012 and 12 district crowns.

GRAHAM MAKES 40 UNDER 40 LIST

UTSA assistant head coach and cornerbacks coach Nick Graham was chosen for this year's Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40. A former standout cornerback at Tulsa and a six-year pro, Nick Graham is in his sixth season as UTSA's cornerbacks coach and second as assistant head coach after serving as defensive pass game coordinator in 2023. During his time in San Antonio, the Roadrunners have enjoyed the most successful five-year run in program history with a 46-20 overall record, 31-8 regular season league mark, two conference championships, five bowl appearances and back-to-back bowl wins. He also has landed one of his cornerbacks on the all-conference first team in each of the past three seasons. Graham also has been instrumental in the development of a pair of NFL Draft picks who starred at cornerback under his tutelage in Tariq Woolen (Seahawks) and Zah Frazier (Bears). This marks the fifth consecutive year a UTSA coach has been honored on the list.

A FOCUS ON RECRUITING TEXAS

UTSA's 120-man roster features 83 players — 69% — who hail from the state of Texas. Florida boasts the second-most Roadrunners with eight and five are from Mississippi. Georgia and Louisiana have three apiece, Arizona, Arkansas, Maryland and Oregon are each home to two, while Alabama, California, Indiana, Iowa, Missouri, Ohio, Tennessee and Virginia have one native. Caile Hogan is the lone UTSA player from Australia and Cory Godinet is the first Roadrunner from American Samoa.

KEEPING THEM HOME

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor and his staff have placed an emphasis on recruiting the city of San Antonio and surrounding area. This year's roster includes 17 players from the San Antonio area.

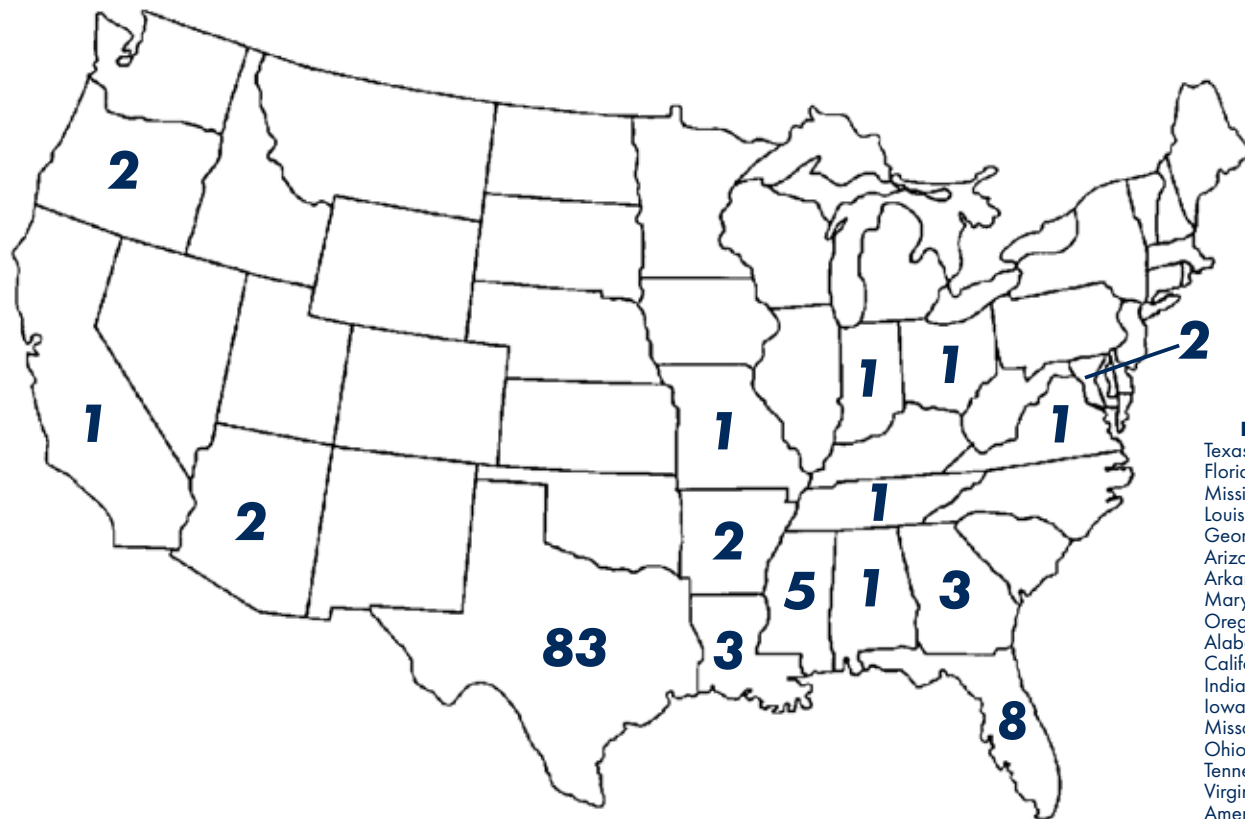

Named UTSA's third head coach on Dec. 9, 2019, Jeff Traylor has had an immediate impact on the program, university and city of San Antonio during his tenure.

Traylor has turned around the UTSA football program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, which has led to positive results on and off the field. The Gilmer, Texas, native took over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival and has led the Roadrunners to a 46-20 record in his first five years at the helm, the most wins and best winning percentage (.697) by a coach in program history. Under his watch, UTSA has recorded the most wins (46) among FBS teams from the state of Texas since 2020.

Traylor also has helped turn UTSA's home facility — the Alamodome — into a true homefield advantage with a 29-3 (.906) home record during his tenure. In fact, the Roadrunners own the third-most home wins among FBS teams since 2020, trailing only Alabama (32) and Ohio State (30).

During the Traylor era, UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned five straight bowl berths with back-to-back bowl wins and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls. He has coached nine All-Americans, three national award finalists, 91 all-conference selections and three NFL Draft picks.

That success is not limited to just the gridiron. The Roadrunners also have received numerous honors for their work in the classroom under Traylor's leadership, including three College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, a William V. Campbell Trophy finalist, 13 CSC Academic All-District Selections, four conference all-academic team selections and the AFCA Academic Achievement Award.

In 2024, Traylor guided UTSA to seven wins and its fifth consecutive bowl appearance under his watch, a 44-15 triumph over Coastal Carolina in the Myrtle Beach Bowl. UTSA also went undefeated at the Alamodome for the second time during his tenure with a 6-0 mark, pushing the home winning streak to a school record-tying 10 games.

Eight Roadrunners earned All-American Athletic Conference accolades in 2024, including outside linebacker Jimmori Robinson, a fourth-team All-America selection by Phil Steele who was chosen as Defensive Player of the Year to mark the second straight season a USA player has garnered that award. Zah Frazier, a cornerback who set the program record with six interceptions and later was selected in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Bears, joined Robinson on the All-AAC First Team and was named an All-American by Phil Steele (third team) and CBS Sports (honorable mention). Additionally, UTSA boasted a pair of national player of the week honorees in Robinson (Walter Camp) and quarterback Owen McCown (Manning Award)

and also reeled in three conference weekly awards during the season.

In 2023, Traylor led the Roadrunners to a 9-4 record, a 7-1 mark in their debut campaign in The American and the program's first bowl win with a 35-17 victory over Marshall in the Frisco Bowl. UTSA received votes in both the final Associated Press Top 25 and USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll for the third consecutive season.

A total of 16 Roadrunners collected all-conference honors in 2023, led by five first-team honorees in Defensive Player of the Year and outside linebacker Trey Moore, quarterback Frank Harris, wide receiver Joshua Cephus, cornerback Kam Alexander and safety Rashad Wisdom. Moore was named a second-team All-American by the AFCA, while Harris was chosen as a semifinalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award for the third year in a row and to the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2023, his fourth career appearance on that annual list. Harris also was named national player of the week by those two organizations, while the Roadrunners hauled in five AAC Player of the Week awards.

In 2022, Traylor guided UTSA to an 11-3 record, a second straight Conference USA title, a top-25 ranking in all three major polls for the second consecutive season and the third bowl appearance in a row with the Cure Bowl matchup against Troy. He repeated as Conference USA Coach of the Year and was chosen as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson and Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year, as well as a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award.

Under Traylor's guidance, UTSA collected a school-record 30 league postseason honors, as 27 made the 2022 all-conference teams —including six first-team and five second-team selections — while 16 received honorable mention and three landed on the Conference USA All-Freshman Team. Harris was voted the league's MVP and Kevorian Barnes was tabbed Conference USA Freshman of the Year. Harris (4) and Jared Sackett (5) combined to earn nine player of the week accolades during the season.

Also in 2022, wide receiver Zakhari Franklin was named an honorable mention All-American by Phil Steele, the sixth Roadrunner to receive All-America accolades in the Traylor era. Additionally, Harris was named a finalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

Under Traylor's tutelage, UTSA enjoyed a record-setting campaign in 2021. The Roadrunners won their first 11

games, were nationally ranked as high as No. 15 and captured the program's first league title. UTSA capped the season with its second straight and third overall bowl appearance against San Diego State in the Frisco Bowl.

Traylor was honored as the 2021 Conference USA Coach of the Year, the AFCA FBS Regional Coach of the Year for Region 4 and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, AFCA National Coach of the Year and George Munger College Coach of the Year Award. A member of the Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year watch list, he was chosen as the 2021 San Antonio Express-News Sportsman of the Year.

A total of 23 Roadrunners received recognition on the all-conference and Conference USA All-Freshman teams in 2021 with Sincere McCormick earning Offensive Player of the Year accolades for the second straight season.

McCormick garnered All-America accolades from three different organizations in 2021, while Spencer Burford and Clarence Hicks

were tabbed honorable mention All-Americans by Phil Steele. McCormick also was an Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award finalist and a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award for the second straight year. Harris landed on semifinalist lists for the Davey O'Brien and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Awards, while Hunter Duplessis was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy for the second year in a row. Harris and McCormick each collected Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award National Player of the Week honors, while Harris also was a Manning Award Quarterback of the Week. Additionally, UTSA collected nine league weekly awards.

In his first season at the helm, Traylor guided the Roadrunners to a 7-5 overall record, a runner-up finish in Conference USA's West Division with a 5-2 mark and an appearance in the 2020 First Responder Bowl. The Roadrunners received votes in a national poll (AP Top 25) for the first time in program history after a 3-0 start and the seven wins are the most by a first-year UTSA head coach.

Dean, Duplessis and McCormick received All-America accolades, while McCormick also was a finalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. Additionally, Duplessis (Campbell Trophy, Lou Groza) and McCormick (Doak Walker) were national award semifinalists, while Harris made the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2020. Dean was tabbed Conference USA Special Teams Player of the Year and McCormick was named the league's offensive player of the year, while a total of 23 Roadrunners were recognized by the league's head coaches, including 19 as all-conference and four on the all-freshman team. The Roadrunners collected a program-record 11 C-USA Player of the Week certificates and a trio of national player of the week accolades in McCormick (Earl Campbell Tyler Rose National Player of the Week), Dean (Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week) and Rashad Wisdom (Jim Thorpe Award Player of the Week).

During his time in San Antonio, Traylor has overseen the development of several Roadrunners who have moved on to the professional ranks. In April 2022, UTSA doubled the number of NFL draft picks on one afternoon, as the 49ers selected Spencer Burford in the fourth round while the Seahawks picked Tariq Woolen one round later. Burford earned the starting spot at right guard in year one and Woolen picked off half a dozen passes in his rookie campaign en route to being selected to the Pro Bowl. Additionally, his former players Cephus, Hicks, McCormick, Leroy Watson, Charles Wiley and Wisdom all have made active rosters or practice squads.

UTSA student-athletes have been honored for their work in the classroom under Traylor, as well. In 2023, UTSA was one of 13 schools to receive the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) 2023 Academic Achievement Award for posting the highest graduation rate among FBS programs in the most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) report.

Individually, Ahofitu Maka became the third Roadrunner to be named a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy and the second

to be selected as a College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-American when he landed on the first team in 2022. He also earned spots on the CSC Academic All-District Team for a third time and the Conference USA All-Academic Team for the second straight season. Duplessis was a two-time Conference USA Football Scholar Athlete of the Year, a 2021 CSC Academic All-American, a two-time Conference USA All-Academic Team selection and a two-time CSC Academic All-District pick. Dean was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy in 2023 and he earned 2021 Conference USA All-Academic Team recognition and CSC Academic All-District Team accolades in 2021-23. Kaedric Cobbs, Cory Godinet, Trey Moore and Tate Sandell also made the 2023 CSC Academic All-District Team, while Jameian Buxton was named academic all-district and Cardenas made the Campbell Trophy semifinalist list in 2024.

Traylor has more than 30 years of coaching experience including a highly successful 15-year career as head coach at Gilmer High School, where he led teams to three state championships and two state

runner-up finishes and won more than 87% of his games, a winning percentage that ranks 10th all-time in Texas high school history.

Prior to coming to the Alamo City, the Gilmer native served as associate head coach and running backs coach for two seasons at Arkansas, where he helped sign the school's first top-20 recruiting class. Prior to that, he served in the same role at SMU for the 2017 season. He began his collegiate coaching career as the special teams coordinator and tight ends coach at Texas in 2015 before becoming the Longhorns' associate head coach for offense and wide receivers coach the following year.

Taylor's impact on the offense was felt immediately in his first season at Arkansas, as his running backs corps racked up 1,721 yards and 11 touchdowns in 2018. The unit was led by Rakeem Boyd, who rushed for more than 100 yards in three different SEC games, including a season-best 113 against Vanderbilt. The Houston Stratford High School product took over the starting tailback role in the fifth game of the season and his most impressive stretch of the season came during a four-game stretch against Alabama, Ole Miss, Tulsa and Vanderbilt, as he topped the century mark three times and totaled 423 yards. His 102 yards against Alabama made him the first Arkansas running back to eclipse 100 yards against the Crimson Tide since Darren McFadden in 2007.

In Taylor's second season coaching the Arkansas running backs, Boyd rushed for 1,133 yards and eight touchdowns on 184 carries (6.2 avg.) to spearhead a ground game that accumulated 1,766 yards. Boyd topped 100 yards in five contests, including a season-best 185 and two scores on just eight attempts against Western Kentucky. He also rushed for 100-plus against Portland State (114), Colorado State (122), Kentucky (134) and Mississippi (114).

Prior to his time at Arkansas, Taylor spent the 2017 season as associate head coach and running backs coach at SMU under Chad Morris. He also served as the Mustangs' interim head coach before joining Morris' staff at Arkansas.

During his one year at SMU, Taylor's running backs piled up 2,223 yards on the ground. Three players rushed for 500-plus yards, with Xavier Jones leading the group at 1,075. The Mustangs topped the 200-yard mark on the ground six times, including a season-best 311 in a win against Arkansas State. SMU ranked in the top 20 nationally in several offensive categories, including 12th in scoring offense and 15th in total offense.

Prior to his time in Dallas, Taylor spent two seasons at Texas. He was the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator in 2015 and then the associate head coach for offense and wide receivers coach in 2016, when the Longhorns boasted the nation's No. 16-ranked offense that averaged 491.3 yards per game. During his time as the lead recruiter, he helped the Longhorns sign the No. 7-ranked recruiting class in the country in back-to-back years and was named Scout.com's

Big 12 Recruiter of the Year. He recruited punter Michael Dickson, who went on to earn multiple All-America honors, win Big 12 Conference Special Teams Player of the Year in 2016 and 2017 as well as the 2017 Ray Guy Award, and currently punts for the Seattle Seahawks.

Taylor built his hometown program into a prep powerhouse during his 15-year tenure leading the Gilmer Buckeyes.

A four-time Texas High School Coach of the Year, he posted a 175-26 record (.871) and led Gilmer to five state championship game appearances, three state titles (2004, '09, '14) and 12 district crowns. The Buckeyes turned in a pair of perfect 16-0 seasons, won 10-or-more games 11 times and registered seven 13-win seasons and three 15-win campaigns during his career.

In 2014, his Class 4A Division II state championship team boasted one of the most prolific offenses in Texas prep history. Gilmer scored 950 points, the second-most at that time in state history, averaging 59.4 points and 536.1 yards over the 16-game season. The Buckeyes topped 60 points nine times, including two 80-point performances. Gilmer also averaged 536.1 total yards per game (8,577 yards) behind a balanced 293.9 passing yards and 242.1 rushing yards per contest. The defense was equally dominant, allowing only 276 points (17.3) with five single-digit efforts and two shutouts, while recording 23 interceptions and forcing 17 fumbles. Gilmer closed out the season with a win over West Orange-Stark and had eight different players earn Class 4A All-State honors from either the AP or Texas Sports Writers Association.

Gilmer's two other state titles under Taylor both came in Class 3A in 2004 (Division II) and 2009 (Division I), before the change in class structure in Texas high school football moved the school into Class 4A. After 15 years on its sidelines, Gilmer renamed Buckeye Stadium to Jeff Traylor Stadium to honor his successful career.

Inducted into the East Texas Coaches Association Hall of Honor in 2019, Taylor received numerous honors during his prep coaching career, including being named Coach of the Decade (2000s) by the Tyler Morning Telegraph. He is a 12-time District Coach of the Year, four-time East Texas Coach of the Year and a four-time Ted Jeffries Award winner. He has received the Carl Padilla Coach of the Year, KYKX Coach of the Year and Old Coach Network Coach of the Year awards twice each. He was inducted into both the Texas High School Coaches Association (THSCA) Hall of Honor and the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in 2025.

Taylor began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Big Sandy High School in 1990-93 before a seven-year stint (1994-2000) at Jacksonville High School where he served as passing coordinator, defensive backs coach, receivers coach and special teams coordinator. There, he helped coach future NFL quarterbacks Josh McCown and Luke McCown and former Texas A&M standout signal-caller Randy McCown.

A 1986 graduate of Gilmer High School, Traylor earned both undergraduate (1990) and graduate (2002) degrees in education from Stephen F. Austin while playing football as a walk-on.

He and his wife, Cari, have three children: Jordan, Jacob and Jaci.

Texas A&M 42, UTSA 24
Saturday, Aug. 30

COLLEGE STATION, Texas — Robert Henry Jr. rushed for 177 yards and two touchdowns, but No. 19 Texas A&M pulled away in the second half for a 42-24 victory over UTSA on Saturday night in front of 107,521 fans at Kyle Field.

Henry topped the century mark on the ground for his third straight game, doing so on a 75-yard TD dash on the first play from scrimmage in the second half, which got the Roadrunners (0-1) to within four points in the third all-time meeting with the Aggies (1-0). The senior from Lumberton, Mississippi, averaged 11.1 yards on his 16 carries, coming up just one yard shy of his UTSA career high of 178 posted in the win over Temple last November. He also rushed for 168 yards against North Texas the week prior, giving him 523 yards and six TDs over that three-game stretch.

Henry's night helped the Roadrunners tally 203 rushing yards to go with 170 through the air. Owen McCown passed for 121 while Brandon Tennison came off the bench in the fourth quarter and completed both of his pass attempts, including a 34-yard TD toss to AJ Wilson.

Defensively, Shad Banks Jr. registered seven tackles with one for a loss, while Kendrick Blackshire and Jimmy Wyrick added five stops apiece. UTSA held Texas A&M to only 108 rushing yards and 399 total.

The Aggies struck first with a special teams score. KC Concepcion fielded a punt at his own 20-yard line and raced 80 yards to the end zone midway through the opening quarter.

The Roadrunners responded with a 12-play, 56-yard drive that was capped by a 36-yard field goal from Michael Petro. Henry had a 21-yard run into Texas A&M territory to key the possession.

Texas A&M took a 14-3 lead early in the second stanza after a 24-yard touchdown pass from Marcel Reed to Mario Craver.

UTSA answered again, this time with a nine-play, 75-yard march. David Amador II had back-to-back catches of 18 and 14 yards to set up Henry for a 15-yard touchdown scamper around left end and just inside the pylon.

The Aggies went back up by two scores on their next possession, which ended with a 31-yard TD catch by Concepcion with 5:38 left to play until halftime.

UTSA had a chance to cut the deficit late in the first half, driving inside the A&M 30-yard line. However, a 43-yard field goal attempt into the wind sailed wide left, leaving the score at 21-10.

Henry paced the offense in the first half with 95 yards on 11 rushes, while Amador had three catches for 41 yards.

On the first play from scrimmage of the second half, Henry padded his rushing yardage total with his 75-yard sprint up the middle to paydirt. Petro's extra point pulled UTSA to within 21-17.

The Aggies pushed the lead back out to two scores later in the third quarter when Reed hit Theo Melin Ohrstrom on a 1-yard touchdown pass on a fourth-down play.

Texas A&M stretched its advantage to 42-17 after a 22-yard touchdown catch by Craver and a 3-yard plunge by EJ Smith midway through the fourth quarter.

Tennison tossed his first career touchdown pass to Wilson down the left sideline in the final minute and Petro drilled the extra point to provide the final margin.

Reed paced the Aggies with 289 yards and four TDs through the air and 39 more yards on the ground. Craver hauled in eight passes for 122 yards and a pair of scores.
