Carving his own path

Born in Liberia, Owen Pewee never imagined he would play American football, but his journey has taken him from West Africa to being one of the highest-rated players ever to sign with the UTSA Football program.

Moving to Texas at age 6, Pewee gravitated to the sport of basketball. For fun, he would play football with his friends in the parks of Cypress on Houston's northwest side without ever expecting a future on the gridiron. His peers encouraged him otherwise.

"Everybody was telling me that I was good," Pewee said. "Hearing that, I second-guessed myself because I never saw myself playing football. Seventh grade was my first time playing football and I did well. I was messing up everybody on the field. I got invited to play FBU [Football University] and it just took off from there."

Watching their son play American football for the first time, Pewee's parents – his mother is a nurse and his father is employed by FedEx – who were unfamiliar with the sport were shocked by the physicality of the game.

"When they first came to the games, they were like, 'You're too violent; you're going to hurt somebody,'" Pewee said. "But I told them about the game and, after a couple of games watching it, they got used to it."



Pewee went on to star as a linebacker at Cypress Park High School, where he was a consensus three-star prospect. At the time of his signing in December 2021, he was the highest-rated player ever to ink with the Roadrunners, according to the 247 Sports composite rankings.

There were other offers, but Pewee was drawn to the culture within the UTSA program and the relationships he had built with the coaching staff.

"It's a family environment here," he said. "UTSA shows a lot of love. They kept in touch with me throughout my high school career. It was close to my home and I wanted to stay close so my family could come see the games. I felt like it was a good opportunity to come here."

As a freshman in 2022, Pewee saw action in four games and used his redshirt year. Since then, he has played in every game for the Roadrunners at money backer. Last season, he was voted into UTSA's vaunted single digits and, this year, he will wear No. 2 as part of the team's elite 2-1-0 jerseys, an allusion to San Antonio's 210 area code.

"It means a lot, knowing that we vote for that, and the guys voted me in," Pewee said. "Especially at a young age last year. I put in a lot of work for that."

Leadership is an opportunity that Pewee embraces, inspired largely by the program's leaders who came before him. He headlines UTSA's defense and

joins another Owen, quarterback Owen McCown, in being the public faces of the Roadrunners this season.

"Seeing the other leaders that have come through this program and watching how they operate, I feel like I can do that," Pewee. "I've been locked in and working on everything I can. I take a lot of pride in this program."

With many of the well-known faces from UTSA's past defenses having moved on following last season, Pewee knows that the public perception is that the talent on his side of the ball is unproven. But he believes that the combination of talent and chemistry that he has witnessed leading up to the season will spell success for the Roadrunners' defense.

"I know everybody says it's a new defense, but we've still got guys who have played on the defense and gotten snaps, they just never started," he said. "I feel like we've got the same defense, just with a couple new players. We trust in each other, everybody is communicating and we're doing the little things right. We're just getting tighter and tighter, and I feel like it's going to take us a long way."

Pewee is one of 50 players on this year's team who are first-generation college students. Starting this year, first-generation student-athletes at UTSA will don special first-generation patches on their uniforms, recognizing the importance of their achievement.

"My family and I moved here to have a better lifestyle, to do better for ourselves and for me to have the opportunity that I have right now," Pewee said. "It is important to me because I want to set the standard for generations to come. My mom has always been pushing me to be great, so I knew I had to do it."

The expectations this year are high for Pewee, who posted 42 total tackles a year ago with 25 solo stops, 6.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and a pair of interceptions. He welcomes the expectations and is focused on making an impact.

"I want to show everybody how physical I can be and show my talent," he said. "I feel like this is going to be my year and I'm ready for everything that comes my way."

OPENING DRIVE

- UTSA will open its six-game, regular-season home slate on Saturday against Texas State riding a school record-tying 10-game home winning streak.
- The Roadrunners are 4-1 in home openers under head coach Jeff Traylor and 9-5 all-time in home debuts.
- UTSA is 29-3 (.906) at home in the Jeff Traylor era, and the 29 wins since 2020

- UTSA and Texas State will meet for the third straight season and seventh time overall on Saturday.

- UTSA is 46-21 (.687) overall in the Jeff Traylor era (since 2020), the most wins among FBS teams from both the state of Texas and current American Conference members over that span.
- The Roadrunners are 37-24 versus teams from the state of Texas, including 17-8 under Jeff Traylor.
- Saturday's Battle for I-35 will serve as the annual Orange Out game, as UTSA aims to break the program's all-time home game attendance record of 56,743 fans.

SETTING THE SCENE

UTSA will open its six-game, regular-season home slate on Saturday, Sept. 6, against Texas State in the Battle for I-35. Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. at the Alamodome for the annual Orange Out game. The Roadrunners (0-1), who are riding a school record-tying 10-game home winning streak, and Bobcats (1-0) will meet for the third straight season and seventh time overall in a series that UTSA leads, 5-1. UTSA is aiming to break the program's all-time home game attendance record of 56,743 fans set on Sept. 3, 2011, in the inaugural game versus Northeastern State. The last time these two teams met at the Alamodome on Sept. 9, 2023, the second-largest home crowd of 49,342 fans witnessed a 20-13 victory for the Roadrunners.

TUNING IN

Saturday's game will air on ESPN+ and via the ESPN app. Jack Benjamin (play-by-play) and LaDarrin McLane (analyst) will call the action. UTSA Sports Media Network will air the game live in the San Antonio area on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at ticket760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Ed Suarez (reporter) have the call. There will be a two-hour pregame show hosted by Pat Evans and a 45-minute postgame show.

CELEBRATING CAMPAIGN NO. 15

The Roadrunners are celebrating their 15th season of football in 2025. One of the newer FBS programs and now in its third year as a member of the American Conference, UTSA started its program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played its first season as an FCS Independent in 2011 before joining the We stern Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign. UTS A moved into Conference $USA in 2013 \, and \, became a full-fledged FBS member starting with the 2014 season.$ The Roadrunners set NCAA modern startup program records in 2011 by drawing 56,743 fans to their in augural game against Northeastern State and by averaging 35,521 fans for their six home contests that season. UTSA made its first postseason $appearance at the 2016 \, New Mexico Bowlin its sixth season of play and registered$ its first win against a team from the Big 12 Conference the following season with a 17-10 victory over Baylor. The Roadrunners made history in 2021, opening the fall with a road win against Illinois of the Big Ten Conference, capturing their first conference championship with a 49-42 decision against WKU and capping a 12-2 ledger with their third bowl game. They repeated as league champions with a 48-27 win over North Texas in 2022 and made their third straight bowl appearance. ending the year with an 11-3 mark. The Roadrunners not ched their first bowl victory with a 35-17 decision over Marshall in the 2023 Frisco Bowl to cap a 9-4 ledger that include a 7-1 mark in their debut in the American. UTSA collected its second straight bowl win with a 44-15 triumph over Coastal Carolina in the Myrtle Beach Bowl to close out a seven-win campaign in 2024. UTSA now has posted at least six wins in nine of its 14 previous seasons, and it has reached the seven-win plateau seven times, including in each of the first five years of the Jeff Traylor era.

HOME SWEET DOME

UTSA has been tough to beat at the Alamodome during the Jeff Traylor era, boastinga 29-3 (.906) record at the facility dating back to the 2020 season. The 29 wins are tied for the third most among FBS teams over that span behind only Alabama (32) and Ohio State (31). The Roadrunners have won a school record-tying 10 straight and 17 of their last 18 home contests entering Saturday's Battle for I-35 against Texas State. Their last home loss was against Army on Sept. 15, 2023. UTSA first reeled off a 10-game home win streak that started with a 27-26 victory over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020, and ran through

the 49-41 win against WKU in the 2021 Conference USA Championship Game before it was snapped in triple overtime against No. 24 Houston in the 2022 season opener. The Roadrunners have been victorious in 27 of their last 29 home contests and are 55-30 (.647) all-time in the Alamodome.

HOME OPENER IS HERE!

UTSA is 9-5 all-time in home openers, including 4-1 under head coach Jeff Traylor. The Roadrunners have won seven of their last nine home debuts.

PACKING THE DOME

UTSA fans have packed the Alamodome over the past four seasons, as five of the program's nine-largest home crowds have been recorded during that span. The Roadrunners are aiming to break the program's home game attendance record of 56,743 fans when they host Texas State in the home opener this Saturday. The last time these two teams met in San Antonio, 49,342 fans watched UTSA beat Texas State in the 2023 home opener to mark the second-largest crowd in program history. Since the return from COVID-19 protocols for the 2021 season, 688,533 fans have filed into the Alamodome to watch the Roadrunners, an average of 26,482 per contest. In the 2024 season opener against Kennesaw State, the program eclipsed the two-million fan mark, and now 2,114,786 spectators have watched the Roadrunners at the Alamodome, an average of 24,880 over 85 home contests. UTSA set NCAA modern startup program records in its first season by drawing 56,743 fans to the inaugural game against Northeastern State on Sept. 3, 2011, and by averaging 35,521 fans for six home contests.

SCOUTING TEXAS STATE

The Bobcats opened the season with a 52-27 home triumph over Eastern Michigan on Saturday. Texas State piled up 606 yards of offense, 392 rushing and 214 passing, while allowing 391 total yards. Lincoln Pare paced the ground attack with 167 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries, while Brad Jackson completed 18 of 26 passes for 214 yards and four TDs. Beau Sparks was the top receiver with seven catches for 82 yards and four scores. Defensively, Treylin Payne registered nine tackles, while Jaden Rios had three stops including a sack. Head coach GJ Kinne is 17-10 in his third season at the helm.
