2025 TEMPLE FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

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Things to Look For in Week Six...

A win for Temple would be the first win over UTSA in program history.

Temple is 6-6 in the last 12 American Conference openers, dating back to 2013 under Matt Rhule. When those conference openers are in Philadelphia, the Owls have a 3-2 record.

Turnovers play a big piece in the story of both teams. Temple sits at third in the conference and eighth in the nation in turnover margin (1.25). UTSA sits at sixth in the conference and 29th in the nation (0.75).

The red zone has proven to be a big success for the Temple offense in 2025. The Owls have converted all 12 trips to the red zone this season to touchdowns.

Although Temple head coach K.C. Keeler has had plenty of experience coaching against teams from Texas, 15 different ones to be exact, this will be his first time facing UTSA.

UTSA is the first team that Temple has faced this season with a loss on the year. The Owls have faced all undefeated teams up until this week.

Game 5: Temple (2-2, 0-0) vs. UTSA (2-2, 0-0) Lincoln Financial Field | Philadelphia, Pa. October 4, 2025 | 1:00 p.m. ET

THIS WEEK

Temple will return to action in week six to kick off American Conference play against the UTSA Roadrunners. Both teams enter the contest off of a bye week in search of a third win on the season. The game will be in Philadelphia at Lincoln Financial Field and is scheduled to kick off at 1:00 pm. The contest will be streamed on ESPN+ and can be heard at OwlSports.com/listen.

LAST TIME OUT

Temple fell to the No. 18 Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets on the road in week four 45-24. The contest got lopsided from the start for Temple, as the Owls found themselves down 21-0 at the conclusion of the first quarter. The second frame, however, moved the needle towards the Cherry & White. The Temple defense tightened up in a big way, allowing the offense to get into a rhythm and claw back into the game. Jay Ducker notched his second touchdown of the season early in the second to get the Owls on the board. The Temple defense would follow up that score by that offense by holding the Ramblin' Wreck to just nine yards the remainder of the quarter, the lowest number of yards in a quarter for Georgia Tech thus far in the season.

The second half opened up strong for Temple, forcing Heisman-hopeful quarterback Haynes King to cough up the ball for the turnover. Temple's offense would then quickly score, thanks to the arm of Evan Simon and the route-running of JoJo Bermudez. On the second play of the drive from 28-yards out, Simon found Bermudez wide open for the touchdown making it 21-14 in favor of Georgia Tech. Big plays allowed by the Temple defense told the story for most of the game, and the ensuing drive by the Yellow Jackets further proved that trend. The third touchdown of 24 yards or more was scored by Georgia Tech's Malachi Hosley. The running back took the ball 34-yards to the house to put the Yellow Jackets back up by two touchdowns with 11:47 left in the third. The Temple offense had a hard time starting back up throughout the remainder of the third, and the defense gave in as well. Entering the fourth quarter Temple was down 35-14, but played all the way to the end of the game. The final drive of the day for the Owls' offense was a 13-play, 75-yard drive that resulted in a touchdown pass from Gevani McCoy to Xavier Irvin.

UTSA IN 2025

The 2-2 UTSA Roadrunners enter the contest with Temple on a two-game winning streak. After dropping the first two games of the season, UTSA rebounded with a resounding win over Incarnate Word at home, and then traveled to Fort Collins, Colo. to face Colorado State. The win against Colorado State went down to the wire, but the Roadrunners ended up on top thanks to star running back Robert Henry Jr. With seven minutes remaining, Henry broke the 10-10 tie to give UTSA a 17-10 lead. The Rams would end up scoring on a 13-play, 75-yard drive. On the extra point attempt, the Roadrunners jumped offside, which would cause Colorado State to change its approach and go for the two-point conversion. The attempt would fail, giving the Roadrunners the 17-16 victory. The week six contest against Temple will also be UTSA's first American Conference game of the 2025 season.

SERIES HISTORY

These two schools have a limited history. This match up has only been played twice, with the Roadrunners earning the win in both instances. The first game occurred in 2023 in Philadelphia with Temple falling 49-34. The last time the teams met was in 2024 in San Antonio, with UTSA coming out on top 51-27.

UP NEXT

Week 7 is homecoming for Temple as the Owls welcome the Navy Midshipmen to Philadelphia on Saturday, October 11. The game time for the contest has yet to be announced. To purchase tickets for the game go to OwlStix.com.

WEEK 6 PREVIEW

HIGH SCORING HISTORY

In the short two game history between Temple and UTSA, there have been a lot of points scored in all. In the two wins by the Roadrunners they have scored a resounding 100 points even. Temple has accumulated 61 points in the two games against UTSA.

WELCOME TO AMERICA(N)

UTSA has been a part of the American Conference since the 2023 season. In the two seasons, the Roadrunners have gone 11-5 in those games.

CONFERENCE PLAY

Saturday will be the 2025 American Conference opener for both schools. Since the 2013 season, Temple has gone 41-56 in conference games. In those 12 seasons the Owls have gone 6-6 in American Conference openers, and 3-2 in those games when played in Philadelphia.

EVERYTHING'S BIGGER IN TEXAS...

They say everything is bigger in Texas. To further prove this statement one would have to simply look at Temple head coach K.C. Keeler's record when competing against schools from Texas. While at Sam Houston State (2014-2024), Keeler finished his time there with a 42-10 record against schools located in Texas. Keeler faced off against 15 different programs during this time frame, and finished five different seasons with at least five wins over schools from The Lone Star State.

EAST COASTIN'

UTSA not only has a short history in the American Conference, but the Roadrunners' football program has only been in existence since 2011. In the 15 years as a program, UTSA has only played 14 games in Eastern Standard Time. UTSA has played the most games in Florida (5) and the

least in Georgia and Pennsylvania (1). In the 14 games, UTSA has gone 8-6, not winning more than one game in the six different states in the Eastern Standard Time zone.

A FAMILIAR LAST NAME

UTSA's starting quarterback is redshirt junior Owen McCown. That name might sound familiar to Philadelphia Eagles fans. McCown's father Josh was a member of the Eagles from 2019-2020. He is most remembered by Eagles fans for filling in for quarterback Carson Wentz in the 2019 Wild Card round, where McCown himself played a majority of the game with a torn hamstring.

KING HENRY (JR.)

Senior running back Robert Henry Jr. has had quite the start to the 2025 season. Henry has run for at least 144 yards in each of the four games played this season. His season high game against a tough opponent in Texas A&M in week one, rushing for 177 yards and two touchdowns. Henry has tallied seven rushing touchdowns and pulled in two receiving touchdowns thus far in 2025.

UNHOOK THE TRAYLOR

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor is in his sixth season at the helm in San Antonio. Traylor has implemented a "Triangle of Toughness" culture that has paid dividends. During the Traylor era, UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned five straight bowl berths with back-to-back bowl wins and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls. He has coached nine All-Americans, three national award finalists, 91 all-conference selections and a pair of NFL Draft picks.

TEXAS CONNECTIONS

5th year senior corner back Ben Osueke and redshirt junior defensive tackle Joseph Auzenne both hail from the Lone Star State. Osueke is from Richmond, Texas which is 191 miles away from UTSA. Auzenne is from Atascocita, Texas which is 232 miles from UTSA.

TEMPLE TUFF

The phrase "Temple Tuff" is synonymous with the fight and grit of Temple's football team. However, it was coined by legendary Temple basketball coach John Chaney whose teams also were noted for their hard-nosed, lunch-pail passion by which they played. An ever-present figure on Temple's campus, Chaney passed away on January 29, 2021.

A NEW ERA AT 10TH AND DIAMOND

K.C. Keeler comes into the 2025 college football season as the 34th head coach in Temple football history to ring in a new era of Temple Owls football. Keeler comes to Temple as a championship-winning head coach who has built winning programs at multiple levels of college football. Keeler comes to Temple from Sam Houston State where over the course of 11 years he compiled a 97-39 record, six playoff appearances, and a 10-0 record in 2020 that led to a FCS national title. Prior to his time at Sam Houston State, Keeler was the head coach of the University of Delaware from 2002-12 where he led the Blue Hens to three national championship game appearances, winning the title in 2003.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU!

The news of K.C. Keeler broke to himself and his wife Janice while the two were out to dinner for her birthday. After Keeler spoke to his agent about becoming the head coach at Temple, he went back into the restaurant to share the news with his wife, who shed happy tears once told. The two were set to go back home to their roots as they have family in the tri-state area.

FROM TEXAS TO PHILLY

K.C. Keeler was very strategic when building his staff. He knows that each person he adds needs to fit into the overall outlook perfectly. Keeler took general manager Clayton Barnes and head strength and conditioning coach Kevin Schadt from Sam Houston State as part of his new staff at Temple.

NFL FILMS

In 2013 head coach K.C. Keeler spent time working for NFL Films in New Jersey. Keeler spent time breaking down film while working there, helping shows prepare for their segments. Keeler worked out of former Philadelphia Eagles quarterback Ron Jaworski's office.

IT'S ALL IN THE COMMUNITY

Temple features 10 former community college players, with many expected to see significant playing time: DT Joseph Auzenne, OL Diego Barajas, WR Kajiya Hollawayne, LB Curly Ordenez, OL Mause Palu, DE Khalil Poteat, OL Chris Smith, WR Cole Sprague, LB Eric Stuart, and LB Katin Suprenant.

OWLS ARE EVERYWHERE

Temple has seven countries represented on this year's roster: Australia (P Dante Atton), Canada (TE Ryder Kusch and OL Davray Venu), England (TE Peter Clarke), Germany (TE Daniel Evert), Nigeria (CB Ben Osueke), Tonga (OL Mause Palu), and the United States.

STEWART OR STUART?

Temple has five players with the last name 'Stewart' or 'Stuart': WR Ian Stewart, LB Jalen Stewart, LB Eric Stuart, WR Tyler Stewart, and OLB Cam'Ron Stewart.

NEW THREADS

Temple Football revealed two new Nike jerseys for the upcoming 2025 season. The uniforms consist of new helmets, jersey tops, and pants that embody a traditional look and feel, while aiming to remain in the modern style of collegiate football. This is the first jersey redesign for Temple since signing with Nike in 2020.

When looking at the helmets, the Temple 'T' logo returns to both sides of the helmet. There are two helmet options for Temple this season: a cherry based helmet with the Temple 'T' on both sides of the helmet in white, and large white diamonds striping down the center of the helmet. The Owls will also don a white based helmet with the Temple 'T' on both sides of the helmet in cherry, and large cherry diamonds striping down the center of the helmet.

There are also two jersey top options for 2025. The

traditional home jerseys are a cherry base color with 'Temple' written on the chest above the numbers in white. The Temple 'T' logo returns to both shoulders and will be in white on the home jersey. The collar of the jersey is laced in white diamonds, with Temple's secondary logo making its debut on the chest plate of the jersey.

The 2025 road uniforms are a white base with cherry accents throughout. The shoulder 'T' logo is in cherry, as well as the numbers.

The pant options for the uniforms come in white or cherry. The white pant has cherry diamonds striping down the leg with the Temple 'T' in white. The cherry option has white diamonds striping down the leg with the Temple 'T' in cherry.

A FAMILIAR FOE

Players transferring in today's world of college athletics is more and more common, which presents for some match ups with former schools. Four Owls will compete this season for Temple against their former team: Jalen Stewart and Aaron Beckwith (UMass), K.J. Miles (Georgia Tech), and Johnny Martin (Charlotte).

P4 PROCESS

K.C. Keeler has assembled a vastly experienced staff for his first year in Philadelphia with seven coaches having Power 4 level experience: Brian Smith (Defensive Coordinator), Henry Baker (Defensive Backs), Cedric Calhoun (Defensive Line), Keith Dudzinski (Linebackers), Al Johnson (Offensive Line), Andrew Pierce (Running Backs), and Roy Roundtree (Wide Receivers).

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

Heading into the 2025 college football season, media outlets released their lists for who to watch for in each conference, and certain Temple Owls are turning heads. Phil Steele's All-American teams mentioned four different Owls: RB Jay Ducker (Second Team), LB Jalen Stewart (Third Team), CB Ben Osueke (Third Team), DT Demerick Morris (Fourth Team).

Athlon Sports also released its preseason All-American team with the following Owls being named to it: Ducker (Second Team), Osueke (Third Team), Stewart (Third Team), Morris (Fourth Team), and OL Grayson Mains (Fourth Team).

NON-CONFERENCE BATTLES

The 2025 non-conference schedule features two Power 4 match ups for Temple, including a visit from the Oklahoma Sooners on Saturday, Sept. 13, at Lincoln Financial Field. Temple fell to the Sooners in Norman, OK, last season as part of a three-game series. Temple is 1-2 all-time against Oklahoma. In the week three battle, the Sooners topped the Owls 42-3. The game was led by Heisman-hopeful quarterback John Mateer for Oklahoma.

Temple kicked off the season on the road against the Massachusetts Minutemen and came out with a 42-10 win. Temple is undefeated against UMAs in the matchup's history. This was the first time Temple competed at McGuirk Alumni Stadium as the only other time these teams faced off in Massachusetts was at Gillette Stadium, the home of the New England Patriots.

The 2025 home opener at Lincoln Financial Field was against the Howard Bison. The Owls came out of the week two contest with a resounding 55-7 victory.

The final non-conference game in 2025 was against the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets in Atlanta, Ga. This is the second meeting between the two schools and the first to be in Atlanta. Temple beat the Yellow Jackets back in 2019 in Philadelphia. The #18 ranked Yellow Jackets topped Temple in the meeting, securing a 45-24 win.

STACKING WINS

K.C. Keeler is among the top of FBS in wins football among active coaches. Keeler has accumulated 273 total wins in his career, only trailing Brian Kelly (294) of LSU. Some notable names that Keeler is in front of are Kirk Ferentz of Iowa, Dabo Swinney of Clemson, and Mike Gundy of Oklahoma State.



Offense

PUTTING UP POINTS

New to Temple in the 2025 season is offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Tyler Walker. Walker comes to 10th and Diamond from Montana State where he orchestrated the top offense in FCS throughout the 2024 season. His offense led the FCS in points per game (40.8), total yards (478.4 ypg), and rushing yards (294.8 ypg). The success on offense for Walker and MSU led them to a 15-1 overall record and an appearance in the FCS Championship game last season. Senior quarterback Tommy Mellott, under Walker's direction, was named the Walter Payton Award Winner as the FCS Player of the year. Mellott threw for 31 touchdowns and was one of three players to rush for 1,100+ yards and 14+ scores. Through the first two weeks of the season Temple has an +80 point differential. That is the largest two-game span since 2014 for the Owls when the team defeated Delaware State (59-0) and UConn (36-10) for a +85 point margin.

NEW LOOK OFFENSE

"If you understand Tyler's [Walker] background, he was a defensive coordinator. So, when he put together this offense it was 'what were all of the things that drove me crazy as a defensive coordinator'. That's how he developed this offense. The philosophy is we're going to give you something different every snap. It could be a shift, it could be a formation, it could be a motion, it could be a tempo and that becomes a lot of work for the defense."

Head coach K.C. Keeler laid out towards the end of spring camp the look and feel of the Owls' offense going into the 2025 season. Offensive Coordinator Tyler Walker had consistent success last year on the ground at Montana State. The Bobcats rushed for 218 first downs, 4,897 yards gained, 294.6 ypg, and 53 touchdowns on the ground.

RUNNING BACK TO THE AMERICAN CONFERENCE

Transfer redshirt-senior running back Jay Ducker is coming to Temple with familiarity of the American Conference. Prior to his time last season with K.C. Keeler at Sam Houston State, Ducker spent two seasons as a Memphis Tiger, and his freshman year at Northern Illinois. During his time with Keeler, Ducker appeared in all 13 games in 2024 and rushed for a team-high 745 total yards with seven touchdowns. After his week one performance against UMass, Ducker is now the only player ever to have at least one 100-yard rushing game at four different FBS schools.

LIMIT THE TURNOVERS

From day one of being the head coach at Temple, K.C. Keeler has emphasized that the Owls must win the turnover battle in any given game. If Temple wins the turnover battle, Keeler is a firm believer that his team will be in every game played in. This is something the Owls have been doing throughout the season, and dating back to 2024, especially at home. Quarterback Evan Simon has protected the football in Temple's home stadium Lincoln Financial Field since last October. It's been 345 days since Simon last threw an interception at home. This is a total of 209 offensive snaps.

INSIDE THE QB ROOM

After a spring where Evan Simon took the majority of the snaps, K.C. Keeler thought that Simon needed some added competition and brought in Gevani McCoy from Oregon State. McCoy not only came into fall camp and played well, but he and Simon elevated each others game to the point that Temple went into the opener undecided on the starter. In fact, both quarterbacks saw action. However, Simon did get the bulk of the snaps and responded with a career-high and school tying record of six TD passes.

THE BIG MEN UP FRONT

Temple enters the 2025 season with a majority of the offensive line room returning under K.C. Keeler. Redshirt junior Grayson Mains highlights this group as he was named to Athlon Sports All-American Conference fourth team heading into the season. Mains is entering his second season as an Owl after spending two seasons in South Carolina. He played and started in the first nine games last season. After an injury against Tulane, Mains returned for the season finale and ended up lettering. Also returning from the starting group last year are: Eric King, Jackson Pruitt, Kevin Terry, and Diego Barajas. Luke Watson returns to the field in 2025 after being sidelined for all of 2024 with an injury.

Defense

DEFENDING THE (TEMPLE) OWLS

Brian Smith comes to Temple as a familiar face within the American. Smith served as the defensive coordinator from 2018-24 for the Rice Owls down in Houston. Smith was nominated in 2024 for the Broyles Award after his defense finished the regular season ranked ninth in passing defense, holding opponents to 173.8 yards per game and a 55.4% completion percentage. Prior to Rice, Smith spent time at the University of Michigan under Jim Harbaugh. Prior to Michigan, Smith spend time in the NFL with the Philadelphia Eagles and the New York Jets in varying roles. At the onset of his coaching career Smith coached at the University of Massachusetts.

THE CORNERBACK CORNER

The 2025 Temple cornerback room is full of youth and talent poised to take big steps this season. The group is led by fifth year Ben Osueke. The Texas native was named to two preseason All-American Conference third teams (Phil Steele and Athlon Sports). Redshirt senior transfer Jaylen Castleberry comes to Temple this season from Youngstown State. Castleberry appeared in 12 games for the Penguins last season and finished the season with 50 total tackles and five tackles for loss. The remainder of the room is youthful: Zavien Bryant (Fr.), Denzel Chavis (R-Fr.), Omar Ibrahim (Jr.), Earl Kulp (R-Fr.), Adrian Laing (R-Fr.), Quaire Locks (R-Fr.), Devonate Ward-Grant (Fr.), and Jett White (Fr.).

NEW LOOK DEFENSE

The idea of 'multiplicity' is something that is said throughout Edberg-Olson Hall since the K.C. Keeler era began, and that remains true with the defense being put into place. Defensive coordinator Brian Smith is installing a NFL-style defense aimed to give an offense different looks and keep them guessing. "We're multiple, it really depends on the personnel that we have. It's an NFL-style system and a lot of what we do comes from Rex Ryan, the former head coach of the New York Jets," said Smith.

A CUT ABOVE

There's a common saying in sports that if you look good, you play good. DL Demerrick Morris has done his part in helping his teammates achieve this by becoming the Owls' unofficial team barber. The redshirt junior learned how to cut hair just one year ago. Morris has honed the craft so well that he even cuts his own hair now.

Special Teams

R.E.S.P(UNTER).E.C.T

Junior punter Dante Atton has had a big start to the 2025 season and he is turning heads each and every week. Going into Temple's week four contest against Georgia Tech, head coach Brenty Key made it a point to tell the announcers how much of a weapon Atton is. "The punter [Atton] is the team's most dangerous guy," said Key. Key understood how much variety Atton has to his game. The Owls allow Atton to use direction and spin on the football to pin teams deep and cause chaos on any punt he hits. Atton has pinned the opposing offense within their own 20-yard line five times this season through four games.

A DIAMOND ON 10TH & DIAMOND

"I was told when I got here that the second best kicker in the (American) conference is in this building and he's a walk-on," said head coach K.C. Keeler when speaking on redshirt-sophomore kicker Carl Hardin. Hardin spent 2024 sitting behind Maddux Trujillo, who was a star for the Owls, at one point making a 64-yard field goal against Utah State which is the longest made field goal in the history of Lincoln Financial Field. Hardin enters the year on scholarship, something Keeler's staff did soon after his arrival to Temple.

IT'S ALL IN THE FAMILY

Temple's specialist coach Rick Brown and his family have a lot of history in the special teams world of football. Brown spent time with K.C. Keeler at Delaware where the two led the Blue Hens to a FCS national championship in 2003. Brown's brother Randy is currently the special teams coach for the Baltimore Ravens and his nephew, Tyler, holds a similar role with the Philadelphia Eagles.

WELCOME ON (G)INN

The first hire to the coaching staff for K.C. Keeler was special teams coordinator Brian Ginn. Keeler and Ginn were on the same staff while at Delaware. Ginn spent 2018-21 with the Chicago Bears under Matt Nagy in varying roles. From 2018-19 he served as an offensive assistant, and from 2020-21 he was an assistant special teams coach. Keeler brought Ginn back on his staff in the 2022 season while at Sam Houston State as an offensive consultant. Ginn spent 23 seasons at Delaware as a player and a coach which is where he met Nagy, leading to his role in the NFL.

WHAT'S THIS

Sophomore punter Dante Atton came to Temple from Australia. The unique part of Atton's story is that prior to 2023, he had never played a snap of organized football in his life. When he took the field for the Owls as a freshman, it was the first time he had ever punted in a football game. Just two years after learning the game of football, he is now a Temple Tuff Single-Digit number.

Miscellaneous

THE WINNING FORMULA

Since his arrival at 10th & Diamond, K.C. Keeler has preached the following three things key to a winning football program: high-level special teams play, minimize mental mistakes, and be the most physical team on the field. Keeler and his staff have been instilling this message in every student-athlete that is a part of the program. Keeler has been coaching for a long time, and he's been winning for a long time. The message is firm and something everyone has to buy into in order to continue Keeler's winning ways.

LEADING THE WAY

K.C. Keeler instills trust into his team, and allows them to lead. Since Keeler arrived at 10th & Diamond he assembled a leadership council made up of the following 21 members of the roster: Dante Atton, Diego Barajas, JoJo Bermudez, Jaylen Castleberry, Colin Chase, Peter Clarke, Ty Davis, Jay Ducker, Allan Haye, Sekou Kromah, Grayson Mains, Gevani McCoy, Demerick Morris, Javier Morton, Ben Osueke, Evan Simon, Cam Stewart, Ian Stewart, Eric Stuart, and Katin Suprenant.

SETTING THE RECRUITING FOOTPRINT

K.C. Keeler has made a point to reinvigorate the recruiting trail to local ties in the Philadelphia area. Keeler is focusing on high schools from New York down to Virginia, and out to Ohio. That area is the footprint. The Owls will always continue to tap into the Florida, Georgia, and Texas pools, but the Owls will keep their eyes shifted towards home.

FEAST YOUR EYES ON THIS

Temple University's Diamond Marching Band has been selected to perform in the 2025 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade. This tradition is viewed by more than 50 million people worldwide, so this is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to showcase the Cherry & White on one of America's biggest stages. A NEW ERA

On July 31, 2023, Temple University officially unveiled its new athletics logo, signaling a reinvigorated era in North Philadelphia. The cherry and white logo incorporates Temple's traditional "T" above a new Owl mark, encased in a diamond outline. The new athletics logo is Temple made, originating from designs conceived by students and professors at the Tyler School of Art and Architecture.

JUST DO IT.

In the summer of 2020, Temple Athletics signed a three-year deal with Nike which makes it the official outfitter of Temple Athletics. The agreement, which was extended in 2023, makes Nike the exclusive athletics footwear, apparel and accessories provider for the football team as well as the other 18 varsity sports. Heading into the 2025 season Temple revealed the first redesign of its football uniforms since joining the Nike family.

HEAD COACH U

NFL head coach Todd Bowles (Tampa Bay) used Temple as a stepping stone on his path to the NFL. Bowles played for the Owls from 1981-85. From 2010-18, Temple placed five straight head coaches into higher paying jobs: Al Golden, Steve Addazio, Matt Rhule, Geoff Collins, and Manny Diaz. Ohio State's Ryan Day, one of the top FBS head coaches, was part of the Owls staff for the 2006 and 2012 seasons. Matt Rhule, who spent two-and-a-half seasons as the head coach of the Carolina Panthers, was hired by Nebraska in 2023. Syracuse football head coach Fran Brown began his coaching career at 10th and Diamond in 2011.

DID YOU KNOW...

Temple holds an 87-year-old NCAA college football record? In 1937, Temple played in an NCAA-record four scoreless tie games in one season. No school has matched that since.

TEMPLE AT A GLANCE...

Temple is in the 4th largest media market in the country, with over 2.9 million TV homes according to Nielsen. The designated market area (DMA) is 7.6 million.

Temple is located in a region of 6.25 million people, and is only 95 miles from NYC and 120 miles from Washington, D.C. In fact, more than 40% of the US population is within a day's drive from Philadelphia.

Founded in 1884, Temple is among the top 50 largest public universities in the country with over 30,000 students. Temple has more than 600 academic programs including five professional schools of law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and podiatry.

For nearly a decade, Temple has been recognized as an R1 research institution by the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education. The classification is given out only to institutions that demonstrate the "highest research activity" which is roughly the top 4% of colleges and universities in the United States.

Temple University placed No. 89 in the 2023 "Best Colleges" U.S. News and World Report ranking of National Universities. This marks the highest ranking ever for the university and the first time Temple has been included

in the Top 100. The university has an overall graduation rate of 75%, and has a full time retention rate for undergraduate students at 84%.

Temple is one of 13 FBS institutions in the country with an average APR of 990 or greater since 2015-16.

Temple's GSR (Graduation Success Rate) is 94 which is tied for 20th among all FBS institutions. That score is tied for second in the American Athletic Conference and one of just eight outside of the Power 5 with a GSR of 94-or-better.

Temple has over 370,000 alumni around the world including just under 200,000 alumni that live in the Philadelphia DMA.

Temple's athletic department has 19 sports and 500 student-athletes.

Temple has been bowl eligible six out of the last 11 years. The Owls finished 10-4, won the AAC Eastern Division and were ranked in the Top 25 twice in the past decade. They won the AAC Championship in 2016 and the Gasparilla Bowl in 2017.

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Media Hub

The American Conference maintains a comprehensive online hub designed to assist members of the media in their coverage of The American and its member football programs.

The media hub will be updated daily and will contain links to the most recent media sessions of coaches and student-athletes as they are made available. The hub will also list the weekly media schedule for each American team and will link to media guides and weekly game notes.

Conference Championship Game

The date of the American Conference Championship is set for December 5, 2025. With the removal of the East and West divisions, the top two overall team from the conference will play against each other in the Conference Championship Game.

Temple posted the largest attendance gain during the 2015 season, playing in front of an average home crowd of 44,159, an increase of 20,789 per game. This excitement led ESPN to bring their popular pregame show, College Gameday, to Philadelphia.

The Temple game played against Notre Dame in 2015 had a 3.9 national rating and an 18.1 local rating. It was ABC's highest ranking game ever in the Philadelphia area, which is impactful given the market is the fourth largest in the country.

Temple's athletic facilities are among the finest in the country. The football team plays its games in the NFL stadium operated by Super Bowl LII & LIX Champion Philadelphia Eagles. The basketball arena is a state-of-the-art facility with a capacity crowd of 10,000. Over the last five years Temple has spent over \$50 million for athletics multipurpose facilities with all the athletic facilities being state-of-the-art.

The University itself has over \$400 million planned for capital projects over the next five years including a \$170 million state of the art library that opened in 2020.

Temple had a school record four players get drafted into the NFL in 2020: Matt Hennessy (Falcons), Harrison Hand (Vikings), Shaun Bradley (Eagles), and Chapelle Russell (Buccaneers) - with four more players getting signed as undrafted free agents. Temple is the only team outside of the Power 5 conferences to have multiple players drafted to the NFL from 2016-20. In all, Temple has 15 current players in the NFL, the most of any school outside of the Power 5. Twelve of the league's 32 teams will sport some Cherry and White this season. Furthermore, when adding coaches and team personnel into the equation, there are over 50 people in the NFL with ties to Owl Nation.

2025 was the 11th straight year that Temple sent at least one player to the NFL. That marks the second longest streak in school history – Temple sent players to the NFL in every year from 1979-89.

The 2019 Temple Linebacker room had seven NFL players on its unit. The starters were Shaun Bradley, Sam Franklin (Broncos) and Chapelle Russell. Backups included Isaiah Graham Mobley, William Kwenkeu (Ravens), and freshmen Jordan Magee (Commanders) and Yvandy Rigby. Bradley (Eagles), Magee (Commanders), and Russell (Buccaneers) were drafted and the others signed as undrafted free agents.



HEAD COACH

K.C. KEELER

Delaware '80

Temple University hired K.C. Keeler as the new head coach of the Temple football program on December 1, 2024.

Keeler, a championship-winning head coach who has successfully built winning programs at multiple levels of college football, brings a track record of effective recruiting in the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic regions and elite-level coaching to the Owls' program.

"Coach Keeler has a track record of evaluating, recruiting, and developing student-athletes into championship-level young men," Vice President/Debbie and Stanley Lefkowitz '65 Director of Athletics Arthur Johnson said. "His leadership, experience, and the culture he establishes within programs are exactly what Temple football needs as we look to return to prominence in the competitive college football landscape. We are ecstatic to welcome K.C., his wife, Janice, and his entire family to Temple."

"Coach Keeler is a proven winner, but just as important as that, he is a proven program builder. That is exactly what he did at both the University of Delaware and Sam Houston State University," said Temple University President John Fry. "He also led the Bearkats through a seamless transition from the FCS to the FBS, where his teams continually rose to the challenge. Coach Keeler is the perfect leader to help us navigate the rapidly changing landscape of college football and position Temple to compete for conference championships and play in bowl games. This is a great day for Temple University."

Voted one of the 150 greatest college coaches of all time by Blue Ribbon ESPN panel in 2019, Keeler most recently served as head coach at Sam Houston where he compiled a 97-39 record over his 11 years at the helm. The Bearkats advanced to the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs six times and went a perfect 10-0 during the 2020 season to capture a FCS national title.

Additionally, Keeler guided the Bearkats through their successful transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision as part of Conference USA, where they earned bowl eligibility this year with a 9-3 record, narrowly missing out on an appearance in the C-USA title game.

"I am beyond thrilled to be named Temple University's next head football coach," Keeler said. "I would like to thank Arthur Johnson and President John Fry for this incredible opportunity. Their shared vision and enthusiasm for returning this program to greatness has been contagious. I'm eager to get to work to bring that vision to fruition for the Cherry and the White. It's a perfect fit and it feels great to be coming back home!"

Keeler's experience also includes coaching stints at Rowan University (1993-2001) and the University of Delaware (2002-12), where he led the Blue Hens to three FCS national championship game appearances and won the 2003 title. Throughout his career, Keeler has earned several prestigious coaching honors, including the Eddie Robinson Award as the FCS Coach of the Year in 2016.

In his remarkable coaching career, Keeler has amassed 271 career wins, making him the second-winningest active college coach and 21st-winningest college coach of all-time. His teams have appeared in 17 NCAA postseason playoff appearances, 11 conference championships, and have played in nine national championship games across all levels. Keeler made history as the only coach to win national titles at two different FCS institutions, having claimed championships at both Sam Houston (2020) and Delaware (2003). He was also the fifth-fastest coach to record 250 wins in college football history.

Keeler's accomplishments extend beyond his team's successes on the field. He is known for developing NFL talent, including Super Bowl MVP Joe Flacco and 2018 second-round pick PJ Hall, and for mentoring 77 All-America players. His ability to cultivate academic excellence has also been a hallmark of his career, with 22 student-athletes earning national or district Academic All-America honors under his watch.

In addition to his coaching success, Keeler has been involved in numerous community service initiatives. He and his wife, Janice, raised nearly \$1 million as part of the One Campaign for the Boys and Girls Club of Delaware, and he has been recognized by the Andy Talley Bone Marrow Foundation for his commitment to helping others.

Keeler, originally from Emmaus, Pennsylvania, is a graduate of the University of Delaware, where he played linebacker for the Blue Hens. He and his wife, Janice, have two children, Kate and Jackson, and are the proud grandparents of Gannon, Isla, and Calla.

QUARTERBACKS

The quarterback room is led by offensive coordinator **Tyler Walker**, in his first year at Temple after leading Montana State's offense to the FCS Championship Game and QB Tommy Mellott to the Walter Payton Award.

Evan Simon returns after starting nine games in 2024 for Temple when he threw for 2,032 yards and 15 TDs on 58.8% completions. He established himself as a team leader taking all the starting snaps throughout the spring. The Mount Joy, Pa., native made his first collegiate start at Lincoln Financial Field against Temple in 2022 as a member of the Rutgers Scarlet Knights.

Simon will be pushed by **Gevani McCoy**, a late spring transfer portal pickup who started seven games for Oregon State a year ago. Prior to OSU, McCoy was a Jerry Rice Award winner at Idaho, given to the FCS Freshman of the Year. In 36 games before his time at Temple, he threw for 7,134 yards and 46 TDs to go with 629 yards and 10 TDs rushing.

Redshirt sophomores **Tyler Douglas** and **Patrick Keller** joined Temple in 2023. Douglas was part of the 2023 recruiting class and was a mid-year enrollee who participated in spring practice. Keller was a walk-on.

The Owls added an experienced arm in **Anthony Chiccutt** in January. A three-year starter at Robert Morris, the Bethel Park, Pa., native has played in 26 games and passed for 4,387 yards and 33 TDs.

Camren Boykin [Upper Marlboro, Md. / Maret School] was part of the 2025 recruiting class.

WIDE RECEIVERS

Roy Roundtree begins his first season as wide receivers coach at Temple. The former Michigan Wolverine standout has climbed the coaching ranks with stops at his alma mater, Grand Valley State, McNeese State, and Miami (OH).

Temple returns three veteran receivers with varying degrees of playing experience. **Antonio Jones** and **Kaijya Hollowayne** joined the Owls a year ago after time at Grambling State. Jones played in all 12 games for Temple in 2024 and finished with 23 catches for 170 yards and a score. Hollowayne played 11 games and recorded nine receptions for 120 yards. Hollowayne was a former quarterback recruit for UCLA in 2021 but has since moved on to wide receiver. They are joined by **Ian Stewart** who came to Temple from Michigan State in 2022 but missed most of his first three seasons due to injury. Stewart has impressed on and off the field, earning a single-digit for the 2023-24 seasons.

The position was bolstered following the spring with the additions of **Colin Chase** and **JoJo Bermudez**. Chase played 22 games in three seasons at St. Thomas. In 2024, he hauled in 37 passes for 633 yards and six TDs. Bermudez was originally a Cincinnati recruit after setting the New Jersey receiving records (183-3,128). He transferred to Delaware and posted back-to-back 25 reception seasons.

The Owls have had a number of receivers make contributions over the past few seasons including two from the 2023 recruiting cycle - **Preston Everhart** and **Kian Johnson**. Class of 2024 recruit **Tyler Stewart** earned the lead kickoff and punt return role by the end of his true freshman season.

Bryson Goodwin was part of the 2024 recruiting class

and redshirted. **JoJo Huntley** joined the Owls as walk-ons during 2023. Huntley was injured in the spring and will miss the 2025 season.

Kaegan Chambers (Wadesboro, N.C. / Monroe), **Rameir Hardy** (Philadelphia, Pa. / St. Joe's Prep), and **Zander Baptiste** (Montreal, Canada/ Asheville) were part of the 2025 recruiting class.

RUNNING BACKS

Running backs coach **Andrew Pierce** is reunited with Coach Keeler. Pierce was a walk-on running back at Delaware from 2010-13.

Jay Ducker is another person in the running back room who is reunited with Keeler. Ducker played the 2024 season at Sam Houston and is the only Bobcat to come east with the head coach. He also makes a return to the AAC - Ducker was a member of the Memphis Tigers in 2022-23 and was the Tigers leading rusher in 2022 with 533 yards.

Joquez Smith is the only experienced returner in the backfield. Smith has been an Owl since 2023 and has played in 22 games with 465 yards and two scores. He started game 3 of his true freshman season against Norfolk State and had a coming out party, rushing for 142 yards and adding a 15-yard TD reception.

Temple restocked the backfield with two transfer portal additions. **Hunter Smith** joined the team in the summer after two-plus seasons at Louisiana-Monroe where he played in 24 games and rushed for 516 yards on 96 carries. **Johnny Martin** signed back in January and after two seasons at Stony Brook. He originally enrolled at Charlotte and played in four games for the 49ers in 2022.

Darius Morant was added as a walk-on in the 2024 summer.

Keveun Mason (Avon Park, Fla. / Sebring) and **DeCarlos Young** (Palmer Park, Md. / Wise) were part of the 2025 recruiting class. Young was a mid-year enrollee but missed the entire spring recovering from surgery.

TIGHT ENDS

The tight end group is coached by **Chris Zarkoskie**. He came from James Madison after stops as an offensive line coach at Holy Cross, Princeton, Lehigh, Brown, and New Hampshire, his alma mater.

Following spring ball Temple bolstered the tight end position with the additions of **Jake Woods** and **Thomas Nance** via the transfer portal. Woods spent the last three seasons at Cal Poly after two years at Northern Arizona. In 2024, he played in 11 games with 21 receptions for 175 yards and three TDs. Nance makes his return to the AAC having begun his college career as a defensive lineman at South Florida in 2019. He blossomed at Bethune-Cookman in 2024 catching 33 passes for 365 yards in 11 games..

Peter Clarke was part of the 2023 recruiting class. He received the 2023 Efe Obada Community Impact Award which is the NFL Academy equivalent of the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year. In 20 games, mostly as a blocking tight end, he converted five catches into three touchdowns..

Daniel Evert was part of the 2024 recruiting class and was 8-143-2TDs as a true freshman.

Ryder Kusch (White Rock, British Columbia / The Huh School) was part of the 2025 recruiting class. He was a mid-year enrollee and was impressive during spring practices.

David Wise walked-on in 2024.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Al Johnson takes over the reins of Temple's offensive line in 2025. The former NFL offensive lineman (Cowboys, Cardinals, Dolphins, Patriots) comes to the Owls after two seasons at Montana State where he worked with offensive coordinator Tyler Walker as the Bobcats earned a spot in the FCS Championship game.

After years of cross-training for Temple's offensive linemen, Johnson entered spring ball with the following lineup - LT **Kevin Terry**, LG **Eric King**, C **Chris Smith**, RG **Jackson Pruitt**, and RT **Diego Barajas** - and kept that unit intact all spring. By the end of spring that unit was the most improved part of the team. During fall camp, Terry suffered an injury that would sideline him for multiple weeks. In his stead, Giakoby Hills stepped up to hold down the left tackle spot, and he still holds that starting job heading into week six.

Two important pieces spent the spring recovering from injury. **Grayson Mains**, a redshirt-junior transfer portal pickup from South Carolina a year ago, started nine games at center in 2024 before his season was derailed by injury. **Luke Watson** started 10 games as a true freshman in 2023 but missed the entire 2024 season following surgery.

Temple also beefed up the line in the spring portal window with the additions of **Ken Meir**, **Nic Reeves**, **C.J. Van Buren**. Meir played at Foothill College and Lindenwood before coming to the Owls. Reeves redshirted as a true freshman in 2024 at Georgia. Van Buren started all 12 games at left guard last year at Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

Adding depth are upperclassmen **Kevin Smithwick** and **Mau-sa Palu**, as well as a collection of redshirt freshmen **Giakoby Hills**, **Davray Venu**, **Lucas Possenti**, **Carter Sheehan**, and **Shane Toolan**.

Billy Brown (Phillips Andover Academy / Swarthmore, Pa.) was added in the 2025 summer.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Cedric Calhoun joined the coaching staff in 2025 as the defensive line coach. He worked with defensive coordinator Brian Smith at Rice for seven seasons.

Calhoun inherits the deepest position on the Temple roster. The interior is anchored by **Demerick Morris** who was part of the 2020 recruiting class and is the elder statesman of the team. Morris has been a vocal leader for the defensive line, earning a single-digit in 2024. He tested the transfer portal in December 2024 and joined Oklahoma State before returning to Temple shortly thereafter.

Redshirt senior **Allan Haye** and redshirt junior **K.J. Miles** came to Temple from the ACC and continue to get better with more consistent play.

Aaron Beckwith is another experienced run-stuffer who joined the group in 2025. He previously played for UMass.

Redshirt junior **Joseph Auzenne** and redshirt freshman **Russell Sykes** earned game action a year ago.

Semi Odedele joined the Owls as a walk-on in 2024 and **Yamael Wiggins** joined the group this spring.

Troy Cunningham [South Park (Pa.) High] was part of the 2025 recruiting class.

The outside is anchored by a talented pair of players who shared the role a year ago. Senior **Sekou Kromah** played in all 12 games for Temple a year ago after transferring from Monroe College. **Sultan Badmus** played all 12 games as a true freshman in 2024.

Khalil Poteat and **Cameron Jones** spent their first season at Temple in 2024 and battled through injury with limited playing time.

Brandon Enarusai was added in 2023 as a walk-on.

RUSH ENDS / OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS

Leading the outside linebackers is **Chris Raitano** who reunites with defensive coordinator Brian Smith after coaching at Monmouth in 2024.

Redshirt senior **Cam'Ron Stewart** who missed the second half of the 2024 season due to injury, leads the group. Stewart played his first three seasons at Rutgers before joining the Owls in 2024.

Redshirt senior **Charles Calhoun** was a 2025 spring transfer portal addition from Gannon.

Jordan Montgomery was part of the 2023 recruiting class. He redshirted as a linebacker as a true freshman and is was converted into a defensive end in 2024.

Ty Davis comes to Temple after being a big-play maker at Delaware. He will be pushed by **Tyrese Whitaker** who has made the biggest improvement of any player inherited by the Keeler staff.

David Kpeglo and **London Hall** have seen limited action in their first two seasons at Temple and have embraced a fresh slate.

Adrian McLean (Lansdowne, Pa. / Penn Wood) was part of the 2025 recruiting class and **Brian Adderely** (Wilmington, Del. / Tower Hill) joined as a walk-on.

LINEBACKERS

The linebackers are led by **Keith Dudzinski** who also is reunited with defensive coordinator Brian Smith. Dudzinski was Smith's coach at UMass.

Temple added **Jalen Stewart** (UMass) and **Jayvant Brown** (Kentucky) as transfers. Stewart played for Dudzinski at UMass, is coming off surgery, and joined the Owls in June. Brown joined Temple in January and participated in spring ball.

Temple went the JUCO route to bring in experience to the position in 2024. **Eric Staurt**, and **Katin Surprenant** came from California with plenty of experience. Stuart started the first three games in 2024 before suffering a season ending injury; and Surprenant played in all 12 games as a core member of the special teams.

Curly Ordonez was a JUCO transfer (Independence CC) who joined the Owls in the winter.

- Played in Temple's first-ever ranked vs. ranked football games - vs. Notre Dame and at Houston.
- Ranked in the Top 25 for four consecutive weeks and for seven weeks total - both for the first time ever.
- Had a national award winner - Tyler Matakevich with the Bronko Nagurski and Chuck Bednarik Award for the first time since 1974 (when Steve Joachim won the Maxwell Award).
- Had a player earn first-team All-American honors for the first time since 1986 (Matakevich).
- Beat a ranked team at home (#21 Memphis).
- Beat Cincinnati in 2015 for the first time in 30 years and six tries.

Henry Baker came to Temple in 2025 to take over the cornerbacks.

Ben Osueke is now in his third season at Temple and is the elder statesman of the group. He exercised his ability to play a fifth season after playing his first two seasons at junior college.

Redshirt senior **Jaylen Castleberry** (Youngstown State) and junior **Omar Ibrahim** (Hampton) add experience to the position. Both joined the Owls in January and practiced through spring ball.

The 2024 recruiting class provided **Denzel Chavis** and **Adrian Laing**. Each saw limited action in 2024 and redshirted.

Earl Kulp joined the group in the summer after spending his true freshman season at Purdue.

The 2025 recruiting class added **Devontae Ward-Grant** (Florida City, Fla. / Evans) and **Jett White** (Los Angeles, Calif. / Edison).

Quaire Locks was added as a walk-on in 2024.

SAFETIES

The safeties are led by **Brian L. Smith** who also serves as the defensive coordinator. Smith spent the last seven years as the DC at Rice. Temple is likely to play three safeties at a time as the unit shares the "Viper" position.

Javier Morton and **Louis Frye** each played quite a bit in 2024 and provide experience for a young unit.

Five portal additions - sophomore **Willy Love** (Monmouth), redshirt juniors **Avery Powell** (Missouri State), and **Pooh Lawton** (Slippery Rock), and redshirt senior **Dontae Pollard** (Samford) - are expected to compete for snaps. Love and Powell impressed during spring drills and Lawton was added in the summer. **Jamere Jones** comes to Temple from the University of Nebraska Kearney. Jones has totaled seven years in FBS football coming into this season with the Owls.

The Owls added two freshmen to the position in 2023 - **Zyil Powell** and **Ihsim Smith-Marsette**. Both redshirted before playing a lot on special teams in 2024.

Temple added **Brandon Taylor** (2023), **Jack Paessler**, and **James Paessler** (2024) as walk-ons.

The 2025 recruiting class added **Zavien Bryant** (Orlando, Fla. / Evans) and **Jamarcus Pierre** (Deerfield Beach, Fla. / Cardinal Gibbons).

SPECIALISTS

The unit is led by **Brian Ginn** who reunites with Keeler as they coached together at Delaware for over a decade. Ginn coached the special teams for the Chicago Bears under Matt Nagy.

Although he never played a down of American football till joining Temple as a freshman in 2023, **Dante Atton** showed nerves of steel during his first season. He has become a quiet leader of the team entering his third season.

Carl Hardin walked-on as a freshman in 2023 and earned the kickoff chores. He did not play in 2024 as the Owls signed Maddux Trujillo, now a member of the Indianapolis Colts.

Isaiah Hayse transferred to Temple from Indiana Wesleyan where he held down the long snapping chores for three seasons. **Conlan Greene**, a converted defensive tackle, is the backup.

Lucas Glassburn was added as a walk-on in 2024 and **Darren Wu** joined the unit in 2025.

On punt returns and kick returns in 2025 it will be maned by two guys. Wide receiver **Tyler Stewart** will lead the way in both situations, and will be backed up by wide receiver **JoJo Bermudez**.

AMERICAN BOWL LINEUP

The American Conference teams are guaranteed at least seven bowl appearances annually as part of the conference's new postseason lineup, which began with the 2020 season and is in place through 2025. The American Conference sent its champion to a New Year's Six bowl eight times in the last 10 seasons of the previous postseason structure. With a 12-team format in place, the American Conference teams are also eligible for the College Football Playoff if they are among the top 12 teams in the final CFP rankings.

As part of the current bowl cycle, The American Conference will annually send teams to the Military Bowl against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent, the Fenway Bowl in Boston, also against an ACC team, and a third annual spot which will alternate between the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl and the Independence Bowl.

In the 2025 season, The American Conference will additionally fill four spots from a group of eight bowls: the Birmingham Bowl, the Boca Raton Bowl, the Cure Bowl, the Frisco Bowl, the New Mexico Bowl, the Myrtle Beach Bowl, the ServPro First Responder Bowl, and Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl.

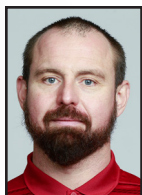

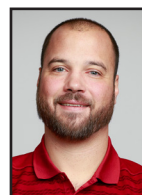

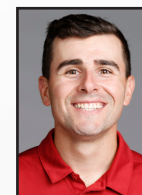
