« OPENING DRIVE »

- UTSA and Rice will meet for the 13th time on Saturday at the Alamodome, matching for one week the North Texas series as the most played in program history.
- The Roadrunners lead the all-time series, 8-4, including 5-1 at home.
- UTSA is 10-4 all-time in Homecoming games, including a perfect 5-0 under head coach Jeff Traylor.
- The Roadrunners have hosted Rice three times previously for Homecoming (2017, '19, '21) and have won all three of those matchups.
- UTSA is 48-23 (.676) in the Jeff Traylor era (since 2020), tied with Texas for the most wins among FBS teams from the state of Texas and tied with Memphis for the most among current American Conference teams.
- The Roadrunners are 30-4 (.882) at home with Jeff Traylor at the helm, the most wins among Texas FBS teams and the second most among current American Conference schools (Memphis – 31).
- UTSA is 38-25 all-time against teams from the state of Texas, including 18-9 under Jeff Traylor.
- Senior RB Robert Henry Jr. leads the FBS in all-purpose yards per game (154.2), scrimmage plays of 70-plus yards (5) and rushes of 70-plus yards (4), and he ranks second nationally in rushing yards per game (133.2), rushing yards per carry (8.33) and total touchdowns (9).
- After posting two against Temple, UTSA now has recorded a sack in 27 of the past 28 games.

Athletics Communications

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SETTING THE SCENE

UTSA will return home for the first time in nearly one month to host Rice for Homecoming on Saturday, Oct. 11. Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m. at the Alamodome and the game will be televised nationally on ESPNU. The Roadrunners and Owls will meet for the 13th time, matching for one week the North Texas series as the most played in program history. UTSA owns an 8-4 advantage in the series, including a 5-1 mark at home. The Roadrunners had won eight straight meetings before Rice pulled out a 29-27 victory last October in Houston. UTSA (2-3, 0-1) is looking to bounce back from a 27-21 setback at Temple in the American Conference opener last Saturday. Rice (3-3, 1-2) has dropped back-to-back league contests to Navy and Florida Atlantic.

TUNING IN

Saturday's game will be televised nationally on ESPNU and it will be available via the ESPN app. Courtney Lyle (play-by-play) and Rene Ingoglia (analyst) will call the action. UTSA Sports Media Network will air the game live in the San Antonio area on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at ticket760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Ed Suarez (reporter) have the call. There will be a two-hour pregame show hosted by Pat Evans and a 45-minute postgame show.

UTSA IN HOMECOMING GAMES

Saturday marks UTSA's annual Homecoming Game, and it also is the Hispanic Heritage Game, UTSA Family Weekend and UTSA Hall of Fame Weekend. A complete list of UTSA's official Homecoming events can be found online at utsa.edu/homecoming. The Roadrunners have won their last six Homecoming games and are 10-4 all time in such contests. In the Jeff Traylor era, UTSA has beaten Florida Atlantic last year (38-24), East Carolina in 2023 (41-27), North Texas in 2022 (31-27), Rice in 2021 (45-0) and UTEP in 2020 (52-21) on Homecoming.

UTSA ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME WEEKEND

UTSA Athletics will honor the 2025 Hall of Fame Class this weekend. The third class in UTSA Athletics Hall of Fame history features Fabiola Arriaga (women's golf), Rudy Davalos (athletics director), Amanda Michalsky (softball) and Mark Schramek (baseball). The UTSA Athletics Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will be held on Friday, Oct. 10, at Pedrotti's Ranch. The Hall of Fame plaques will be revealed on Saturday morning and the group will be recognized at a first-half media timeout during the Homecoming game against Rice that night at the Alamodome.

HOME SWEET DOME

UTSA has been tough to beat at the Alamodome during the Jeff Traylor era, boasting a 30-4 (.882) record at the facility dating back to the 2020 season. The 30 wins are the most among FBs teams from the state of Texas and the second most behind Memphis (31) among current American Conference members. The Roadrunners saw their school record-tying 10-game home winning streak snapped in a heartbreaking loss to Texas State in the home opener on Sept. 6, but they raced past UIW 48-20 a week later at the Alamodome, giving them 18 wins over their last 20 home contests. UTSA also reeled off a 10-game home win streak that started with a 27-26 victory over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24, 2020, and ran through the 49-41 win against WKU in the 2021 Conference USA Championship Game before it was snapped in

triple overtime against No. 24 Houston in the 2022 season opener. The Roadrunners have been victorious in 28 of their last 31 home contests and are 56-31 (.644) all-time in the Alamodome.

PACKING THE DOME

UTSA fans have packed the Alamodome over the past four-plus seasons, as six of the program's 10-largest home crowds have been recorded during that span. The Roadrunners drew 45,778 fans for the home opener against Texas State on Sept. 6, marking the third-largest attendance for a UTSA game at the Alamodome. The last time those two teams met in San Antonio, 49,342 fans watched UTSA beat Texas State in the 2023 home opener to mark the second-largest crowd in program history. Since the return from COVID-19 protocols for the 2021 season, 754,732 fans have filed into the Alamodome to watch the Roadrunners, an average of 26,955 per contest. In the 2024 season opener against Kennesaw State, the program eclipsed the two-million fan mark, and now 2,180,985 spectators have watched the Roadrunners at the Alamodome, an average of 25,069 over 87 home contests. UTSA set NCAA modern startup program records in its first season by drawing 56,743 fans to the inaugural game against Northeastern State on Sept. 3, 2011, and by averaging 35,521 fans for six home contests.

CELEBRATING CAMPAIGN NO. 15

The Roadrunners are celebrating their 15th season of football in 2025. One of the newer FBS programs and now in its third year as a member of the American Conference, UTSA started its program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played its first season as an FCS Independent in 2011 before joining the Western Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign. UTSA moved into Conference USA in 2013 and became a full-fledged FBS member starting with the 2014 season. The Roadrunners set NCAA modern startup program records in 2011 by drawing 56,743 fans to their inaugural game against Northeastern State and by averaging 35,521 fans for their six home contests that season. UTSA made its first postseason appearance at the 2016 New Mexico Bowl in its sixth season of play and registered its first win against a team from the Big 12 Conference the following season with a 17-10 victory over Baylor. The Roadrunners made history in 2021, opening the fall with a road win against Illinois of the Big Ten Conference, capturing their first conference championship with a 49-42 decision against WKU and capping a 12-2 ledger with their third bowl game. They repeated as league champions with a 48-27 win over North Texas in 2022 and made their third straight bowl appearance, ending the year with an 11-3 mark. The Roadrunners notched their first bowl victory with a 35-17 decision over Marshall in the 2023 Frisco Bowl to cap a 9-4 ledger that include a 7-1 mark in their debut in the American. UTSA collected its second straight bowl win with a 44-15 triumph over Coastal Carolina in the Myrtle Beach Bowl to close out a seven-win campaign in 2024. UTSA has posted at least six wins in nine of its 14 previous seasons, and it has reached the seven-win plateau seven times, including in each of the first five years of the Jeff Traylor era.

TRAYLOR TAKING ROADRUNNERS TO NEW HEIGHTS

Sixth-year head coach Jeff Traylor has taken UTSA to new heights during his time in San Antonio. The Roadrunners are 48-23 (.676) under his direction, tied with Texas for the most wins among FBS teams from the state of Texas and tied with Memphis for the most among current American Conference teams. UTSA boasts a 30-4 (.882) home record in the Traylor era, the most wins

among Texas FBS teams and the second most among current American Conference schools behind Memphis (31). Since Traylor — the winningest coach in program history — arrived in San Antonio, UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned five straight bowl berths with back-to-back bowl wins and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls. He has coached nine All-Americans, three national award finalists, 91 all-conference selections and a trio of NFL Draft picks at UTSA.

UTSA VERSUS IN-STATE FOES

The Roadrunners are 38-25 all-time against teams from the state of Texas including an 18-9 mark under sixth-year head coach Jeff Traylor. Rice is the fourth of five opponents from the Lone Star State on this season's ledger, which also includes North Texas on Oct. 18.

SCOUTING RICE

The Owls fell to 3-3 overall and 1-2 in American Conference action after a 27-21 home loss to Florida Atlantic last Saturday night. Rice has wins over Louisiana, Prairie View A&M and Charlotte this year and is averaging 20.5 points and 312.8 yards per game while allowing 21.5 points and 344.0 yards per contest. Chase Jenkins has completed 59 of 86 passes for 520 yards and four touchdowns and added 268 yards and four TDs on the ground. Quinton Jackson is the top rusher with 481 yards and three touchdowns on 92 carries, while Drayden Dickmann is the top pass-catcher with 22 receptions for 229 yards and three scores. Defensively, Andrew Awe leads the way with 48 tackles, while Michael Daley owns a team-high four sacks. Head coach Scott Abell is in his first season at the helm and he owns an 89-56 career record following stints at Davidson and Washington & Lee.

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday will mark the 13th meeting between UTSA and Rice, making it tied for one week with North Texas as the most-played series in program history. The Roadrunners lead the all-time series, 8-4, including 5-1 in games played at the Alamodome. UTSA had won eight straight meetings before the Owls posted a last-second 29-27 win last October in Houston. The two schools have been scheduled to play each season dating back to 2012; however, the 2020 game was canceled due to COVID-19 protocols within the UTSA program.

RICE CONNECTIONS

Several members of the UTSA staff have connections to Rice. Defensive coordinator and safeties coach Jess Loepp was the recruiting coordinator and safeties coach at Rice in 2006 under then-head coach Todd Graham. Assistant wide receivers coach Luke Turner, who was coached by Jeff Traylor at Gilmer High School and helped the Buckeyes to the 2009 state championship, played for the Owls from 2012 to 2015. He was the 2013 Conference USA Championship Game MVP and totaled 503 rushing yards, 244 receiving yards, 158 passing yards, 362 kick return yards, 16 total touchdowns and 18 tackles during 51 career games at Rice. UTSA associate sports performance coach Jared Kaaiohelo was Rice's head strength & conditioning coach from 2009 to 2013. Additionally, UTSA associate head coach/pass game coordinator/wide receivers coach Joe Price was an assistant coach under Rice defensive coordinator Jon Kay when he was the head coach at Galena Park North Shore High School, where a trio of Roadrunners — David Amador II, Shad Banks Jr. and Tai Leonard — also played for Kay.

WHO'S COUNTING?

Now in their 15th season of play, the Roadrunners will play the 178th game in program history on Saturday when they host Rice for Homecoming. UTSA is 93-84 (.525) all-time and 56-31 (.644) at home. By comparison, Rice has been playing football since 1912 and owns an all-time record of 488-630-32.

LAST MEETING

Owen McCown passed for 256 yards and three touchdowns but E.J. Warner's TD pass to Matt Sykes with four seconds left lifted Rice to a 29-27 victory over UTSA on Oct. 12, 2024, at Rice Stadium. Trailing 23-13 entering the fourth quarter, the Roadrunners rallied to reclaim the lead with back-to-back scoring drives. McCown found Devin McCuin on a 6-yard touchdown pass with 5:40 remaining to make it a three-point contest. He then connected with Houston Thomas over the middle on a 38-yard TD pass with 2:06 on the clock. However, Warner directed an eight-play, 65-yard scoring march that gave the Owls the lead for good. A defensive pass interference penalty gave Rice the ball at the UTSA 17-yard line. Following an offensive pass interference call that pushed the line of scrimmage back to the 32, Warner hit Drayden Dickmann on a 14-yard pass play to set up the game-winning, 18-yard touchdown pass to Sykes. Warner then took a knee on the point-after-touchdown attempt to leave the score at 29-27. UTSA got the ball back for one last play following a touchback on the ensuing kickoff, but the Rice defense came up with the stop to seal the win.

FAMILIAR FOES

UTSA will face familiar foes in 2025, as the Roadrunners have previously faced all 12 teams on the regular season schedule. The most-played series in program history is with North Texas, and the two teams will meet for the 14th time in October with UTSA holding an 8-5 edge. The Roadrunners and Rice will play for the 13th time this weekend with UTSA boasting an 8-4 advantage. UTSA and Texas State met for the seventh time in the home opener, while the regular season finale will mark the sixth meeting with Army.

LAST TIME OUT

Kendrick Blackshire posted a game-high 10 tackles and Patrick Overmyer scored a pair of touchdowns, but Temple rallied from a 14-3 halftime deficit for a 27-21 victory over UTSA in the American Conference opener for both teams last Saturday at Lincoln Financial Field. Overmyer's two scores helped hand the Roadrunners a 14-3 lead in the first half, but the Owls found the end zone three times in the third quarter to rally for their first win in the series. Blackshire logged six solo tackles as part of his double-digit output to pace the defense, which held Temple to 309 yards of offense. Shad Banks Jr. added six stops while Nnanna Anyanwu and Daemian Wimberly each recorded a sack. The Roadrunners carried a 14-3 advantage into the locker room only to see Temple strike for two quick touchdowns early in the third quarter. JoJo Bermudez hauled in an 8-yard touchdown pass to make it a one-score contest. Following an interception, Hunter Smith broke loose for a 54-yard TD run to hand the home team the lead. UTSA reclaimed the lead on the ensuing possession. Owen McCown completed passes on back-to-back plays to AJ Wilson of 16 and 36 yards to set up an 18-yard TD pass to Devin McCuin. Michael Petro's PAT made it 21-17 with 5:28 left in the third. With the benefit of a short field, Temple pulled back ahead late in the third on a 15-yard touchdown catch by Peter Clarke, capping a two-play, 38-yard drive. The Owls tacked on a late field goal by Hardin from 36 yards with

just under two minutes remaining to pad the lead at 27-21. UTSA had one final offensive drive but turned it over on downs deep on its own end of the field and Temple ran out the clock to seal the win.

LAPEZE LANDS ON CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST

UTSA redshirt junior Luke Lapeze has been chosen as a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, college football's premier scholar-athlete award. Celebrating its 36th year, the Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. The Humble, Texas, native is one of 177 semifinalists for the award, marking the ninth consecutive year that a Roadrunner has made the semifinalist list. He earned his bachelor's degree in history in December 2024, graduating with a 3.36 GPA. A two-time American Conference All-Academic Team selection, he has made the UTSA Honor Roll three times and the Dean's List once.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

UTSA is no stranger to close contests in the Jeff Traylor era, as 41 of the 71 have been one-score ballgames in the fourth quarter. The Roadrunners own a 26-15 record (.634) in those games. Dating back to the 2021 campaign, UTSA has seen 28 of the last 50 contests decided in the fourth quarter or later. Since 2020, the Roadrunners are 20-12 (.625) in games decided by eight points or less.

HIGH-SCORING ROADRUNNERS

UTSA has emerged as one of the top scoring offenses in the FBS under head coach Jeff Traylor. UTSA has scored 20-plus points in 14 of the last 15 games and in 56 of the last 63 contests dating back to the 2020 campaign. The Roadrunners have reached the 40-point plateau in six of their last 11 games, including in the 48-20 victory over UIW on Sept. 13. UTSA has tallied 2,362 points in 71 games under head coach Jeff Traylor, good for an average of 33.3 points per game. Last season, the Roadrunners scored 431 points in 13 games for an average of 33.2 points per game, which ranked fourth in the American Conference and 27th in the FBS. They topped the 20-point barrier in each of the last 10 games and 11 times overall while surpassing the 40-point barrier in five of the last six contests. In 2021, the Roadrunners set school records for scoring, tallying 516 total points in 14 contests for a program-record 36.9 points per game to rank 11th nationally. The following year, the Roadrunners came up just shy of the school record with 515 points in 14 games for an average of 36.8 per outing, good for 14th in the FBS. The Roadrunners scored 415 points in 13 games in 2023, good for an average of 31.9 per contest. In fact, these last four seasons rank as the top four scoring totals and averages in program history.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

The Jeff Traylor era has produced the most productive offenses in UTSA history with offensive coordinator Justin Burke directing the unit since the 2022 Cure Bowl. The Roadrunners have registered the top four and five of the top six single-season yardage totals since Traylor arrived for the 2020 campaign. Additionally, the top five rushing seasons and four of the top five passing years have occurred under Traylor's watch. UTSA also has set program standards for single-game output in the past five seasons. Nine of the top 10 games for total yards, eight of the top 10 contests for passing yards and five of the top nine outings for rushing yards have happened in the Traylor era. The Roadrunners have recorded 400-plus yards of offense in eight of their last 12 games dating back to last October.

BORN TO PLAY QB

UTSA redshirt junior Owen McCown was born to play quarterback. The lefthander is the son of current Minnesota Vikings quarterbacks coach Josh McCown, who was a third-round draft pick in 2002 and played 18 seasons in the NFL after a collegiate career at SMU and Sam Houston. Two of his uncles also played the position. Luke McCown starred at Louisiana Tech before he was selected in the fourth round of the 2004 NFL Draft and enjoyed a 12-year NFL career. Randy McCown played quarterback at Texas A&M from 1996 to 1999, helping the Aggies to the 1998 Big 12 Conference Championship. Those three McCown brothers all played for UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor when he was an assistant coach at Jacksonville High School in the 1990s. A member of five preseason watch lists, Owen registered one of the most productive seasons by any UTSA QB in 2024. He completed 294 of 467 passes for 3,424 yards and 25 touchdowns and rushed for 340 yards and three TDs, giving him 3,764 yards of total offense. One of only 16 FBS quarterbacks who owns at least one start in three consecutive seasons, his 2024 numbers rank second on the school's single-season charts for passing yards, attempts, completions and total offense and third in passing TDs. He also set a school record with 434 passing yards versus Tulsa and broke loose for the longest rush by a UTSA quarterback with his 75-yard touchdown dash in the win against North Texas last fall. This season, he has completed 111 of 175 passes (63.4%) for 990 yards and nine touchdowns through the first five games. In the 48-20 win over UIW, he threw for 243 yards and four TDs on 30-of-36 passing (83.3%) with a UTSA career-best 11 consecutive completions at one point during the first half. He now has 448 completions, 700 attempts, 4,856 passing yards, and 38 TD passes as a Roadrunner, which all rank fourth in school history. He also ranks second in completion percentage (.640) and

third in passing efficiency (135.3). Including his true freshman season numbers at Colorado in 2022, he has completed 505 of 800 passes (63.1%) for 5,456 yards and 40 touchdowns.

HENRY A HOME RUN THREAT

UTSA running back Robert Henry Jr. has emerged as one of the top home-run threats in the FBS this season. The senior owns five plays from scrimmage of 70-or-more yards, three more than any other player. That total includes four rushes of 70-plus yards, which is twice as many as any other player this season. Most of his big plays have come in unique fashion, as he broke free for a 75-yard touchdown run on the first play from scrimmage of the second half against nationally ranked Texas A&M in the season opener. He then found paydirt on a 75-yard rush on the second play from scrimmage of the second half against Texas State in the second game before busting a 74-yard TD run on the third play from scrimmage after halftime of the 48-20 win over UIW on Sept. 13. A member of watch lists for the Doak Walker, Maxwell and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Awards, Henry is believed to be the only FBS player who has scored a touchdown within the first three plays from scrimmage of a half in every game this season. He also had a 76-yard touchdown scamper in the first half and a key 74-yard TD catch in the fourth quarter of the 17-16 road win over Colorado State on Sept. 20. Henry has piled up 666 yards and seven touchdowns on 80 carries this season, good for an average of 8.3 yards per carry. He also has caught 14 passes for 105 yards and a pair of scores, giving him 771 all-purpose yards, good for an FBS-leading average of 154.2 per game. He piled up 177 yards and two TDs on just 16 attempts in the opener against the Aggies, an average of 11.1 yards per tote. He tallied 159 yards and two rushing touchdowns to go with a 4-yard receiving TD against Texas State before totaling 144 rushing yards in each of the wins against UIW and Colorado State. Back for his third year as a Roadrunner thanks to a recent NCAA waiver for JUCO players, Henry’s hot streak began last November when topped the century mark in back-to-back wins before missing the final two games with an injury. He rushed for 168 yards and two touchdowns — including an 83-yard dash — on 20 totes and tallied 57 yards on three receptions in the 48-27 win over North Texas. The following week, he broke loose for a UTSA career-best 178 yards and a pair of scores on 16 attempts, including an 88-yard rush, in the 51-27 triumph over Temple. Over his last seven games, he has accumulated 1,042 rushing yards, 11 rushing touchdowns, 13 total TDs and seven plays of 74-plus yards, including six runs. A native of Lumberton, Mississippi, who joined the Roadrunners after a two-year career at Jones College, he has rushed for 1,960 yards, which places him fifth in school history, and 25 TDs (No. 3/UTSA) in 29 career contests with UTSA. His current 5.8 yards-per-rush average is the best in UTSA history.

TIGHT END DEPTH ON DISPLAY

UTSA once again boasts a deep tight end group with three returnees who all have at least 30 career receptions. Fifth-year senior Dan Dishman has made the most appearances with 44 games under his belt. The Seabrook, Texas, native owns 36 catches for 418 yards and five touchdowns, including six for 43 yards and a score this season. Redshirt junior Houston Thomas has the most receptions (56) and yards (714) to go with three TDs in 35 career contests. The College Station High School product, who appears on the John Mackey Award Watch List, led UTSA tight ends in 2024 with 34 catches and 470 receiving yards and he has 12 catches for 143 yards through five games this year. Redshirt sophomore Patrick Overmyer burst onto the scene last fall with 283 yards and three scores on 31 receptions en route to second-team freshman All-America accolades from The Athletic. The Kingwood native has opened 2025 with eight receptions for 24 yards, one receiving touchdown and a rushing TD through the first five contests. Altogether, that trio has combined for 131 catches for 1,439 yards and 12 touchdowns as Roadrunners.

McATTACK

UTSA’s offense features a trio of weapons whose last names all start with “Mc” in senior wide receiver Willie McCoy, redshirt junior quarterback Owen McCown and junior wide receiver Devin McCuin. In his first year as the starting QB, McCown, a product of Rusk High School, directed the “McAttack” by throwing for 3,424 yards and 25 touchdowns on 294-of-467 passing (63%) in 2024. He has passed for 990 yards and nine TDs through five games this year. McCoy, a Houston native, paced the Roadrunners with 536 receiving yards on 28 catches, good for school-record average of 19.14 yards per reception. A member of the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List, McCuin led UTSA in receptions in 2024 with 45 despite missing five games, piling up 424 yards and a team-best five receiving touchdowns last fall. The Jacksonville High School product

has opened 2025 with team highs of 28 catches, 277 receiving yards and three TD receptions this year.

EXPERIENCE UP FRONT

UTSA boasts one of the most experienced offensive lines in the FBS. Entering the season, the Roadrunners' o-line owned a combined 288 combined games played, which ranked second in the nation behind only Virginia (334) and ahead of Florida State (265), Illinois (259) and Oregon (253). Additionally, UTSA carried a combined 151 starts into the 2025 campaign, which stood sixth among FBS programs. UTSA's most-experienced lineman is Kamar Missouri, who has played in 37 games between his time at Rutgers and in San Antonio. Demetris Allen, a seventh-year senior, has appeared in 36 contests, while Deandre Marshall and Trevor Timmons — a transfer from Georgia State — have played in 33 and 32, respectively. Timmons has the team lead with 28 starts, while Cory Godinet — who at 26 years old is the oldest current FBS offensive lineman — owns 25 career starts. Jaylen Garth has played in 27 contests with 13 starts, Darrell Jones boasts 21 appearances and 18 starts and Ben Rios has appeared in 21 games and started a dozen.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY IN TRENCHES

UTSA has started the same five offensive linemen in three of the first five games this season. Ben Rios (center), Kamar Missouri (left tackle) and Trevor Timmons (left guard) have earned the start in all five games. Darrell Jones received the starting nod at right guard in four of the first five contests with Cory Godinet drawing that assignment in the win at Colorado State. Jaylen Garth started the first four games at right tackle before suffering an injury, with Deandre Marshall getting his first career start in the last outing. Last season, UTSA had six different starting lineups on the offensive line through the first seven games, with the last of those orders staying put for the remaining six contests. So far in 2025, the offensive line has helped pave the way for the FBS' second-leading rusher in Robert Henry Jr. (133.2 ypg). Additionally, the unit has surrendered just five sacks through the first five games, an average that ranks in the top 20 of the FBS.

MR. VERSATILITY

Redshirt sophomore David Amador II is UTSA's Mr. Versatility. Not only is he one of the team's top wide receivers, but he also has rush attempts, punt returns and a pass attempt to his name. A product of perennial power Galena Park North Shore High School, he has 57 receptions for 582 yards and two touchdowns to go with 61 rushing yards on only five carries. He also has a pair of punt returns this season while last year, he completed his only career pass attempt, a 27-yard strike to Dan Dishman in the 44-36 win over No. 25 Memphis.

APPLYING THE PRESSURE

The Roadrunners have developed a reputation for fielding a pressure defense since head coach Jeff Traylor arrived in 2020. Under the direction of defensive coordinator Jess Loepp since the 2021 campaign, UTSA has logged the top three season totals for sacks and four of the top five tallies for tackles for loss. Additionally, the Roadrunners have registered nine of the top 10 single-game totals for both sacks and TFLs in the Jeff Traylor era.

SACK ATTACK

UTSA has developed a reputation for a defense that racks up tackles behind the line of scrimmage. The Roadrunners recorded a pair of tackles for loss in the opener at No. 19 Texas A&M, but they saw their 23-game streak with a sack come to an end. They logged five TFLs and a sack against Texas State and then made 10 tackles behind the line with four sacks in the 48-20 victory over UIW, marking the sixth time with double-digit TFLs over a 12-game stretch. The Roadrunners tallied five TFLs behind Nnanna Anyanwu's three sacks in the 17-16 win at Colorado State. Anyanwu and Daemian Wimberly each posted a sack as part of a half dozen TFLs against Temple in their last outing. UTSA now has logged a sack in 27 of its last 28 contests dating back to early in the 2023 campaign. Last season, the Roadrunners registered 42 sacks, four shy of the school record of 46 set in 2023. UTSA shattered the program standard for tackles for loss in a season with 114 last

fall, beating the previous mark of 99 established in 2023. Over the past two-plus seasons, the Roadrunners have recorded 241 TFLS (7.8/game) and 98 sacks (3.2/game).

TURNING THEM OVER

UTSA entered the season opener at Texas A&M riding a streak of 23 consecutive games with a takeaway, but the Roadrunners did not force a turnover for the first time since early in the 2023 season, as that stretch started with a fumble recovery against Tennessee on Sept. 23 of that year. The Roadrunners went on to tally 18 takeaways that season, picking off 10 passes and recovering eight fumbles. In 2024, UTSA forced 22 turnovers by its opponents. Led by All-American Zah Frazier’s school-record six interceptions, the Roadrunners claimed 11 INTs to go with 11 fumble recoveries. The Roadrunners came away with their first forced turnover of the 2025 campaign against Texas State on an interception by Shad Banks Jr. Banks logged two of UTSA’s four takeaways in the 48-20 victory over UIW with his second pick of the season along with a fumble recovery. Jimmy Wyrick also recovered a fumble, and Davin Martin posted his first career INT in the win over the Cardinals. UTSA now has five takeaways this season and at least one in 25 of its last 28 games.

STUFFING THE RUN

The Roadrunners were tough to run against in 2024, and that has carried into the 2025 season. UTSA surrendered only 108 rushing yards against nationally ranked Texas A&M, who ended last season ranked second in the SEC and 26th in the FBS with 195.5 rushing yards per game. The Roadrunners limited UIW to only 33 rushing yards in a 48-20 victory on Sept. 6, marking the fewest rushing yards allowed in a game since surrendering only five yards to Rice on Nov. 19, 2022. UTSA currently ranks fourth in the American Conference and 45th in the FBS in rushing defense (118.0 ypg). Last fall, UTSA allowed only 109.3 rushing yards per game — which led the league and ranked 11th in the FBS — and held eight of their 13 opponents to 100 or fewer yards on the ground, including four who gained no more than 51 yards.

D-LINE DEPTH ON DISPLAY

Over the past several seasons, UTSA traditionally has rotated at least nine players on the defensive line. Despite losing five veterans of the position group from last season’s squad, 12 d-linemen saw action in the 2025 opener at No. 19 Texas A&M and 11 played in the home opener versus Texas State. In the 48-20 victory over UIW, a season-high 15 players rotated among the defensive line, while 10 saw the field in the 17-16 win at Colorado State followed by 13 in the conference opener at Temple. Leading the way for the returnees are Jameian Buxton, Jon Jones, Tai Leonard, Chidera Otutu and Daemian Wimberly, who all saw significant action last fall. Buxton, a junior from New Orleans who earned a spot on the CSC Academic All-District Team last year, has logged 28 career appearances. Jones, a senior from Dallas who previously played at Missouri and Northern Arizona, played in 12 contests last fall and has seen action in each of the first five games this year. Leonard, a redshirt junior from Galena Park North Shore High School, has 31 career games under his belt. Otutu played in all 13 contests as a true freshman last season and has earned starts in each of his last three outings, while Wimberly saw time in a dozen games as a redshirt freshman for UTSA in 2024 and has played in all five games this year.

BANKS EMERGES AS DEFENSIVE LEADER

UTSA inside linebacker Shad Banks Jr. has emerged as a leader for the UTSA defense in his debut campaign with the Roadrunners, as he was voted by his UTSA teammates into the coveted No. 0 jersey in his first season on campus. He paces the defense with 37 total tackles, 23 solo stops and two interceptions to go with two tackles for loss, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery. In the season opener at No. 19 Texas A&M, the graduate transfer from TCU paced the defense with seven total tackles, including six solo stops and a tackle for loss. He followed that with a team-high nine tackles, one TFL and an interception against Texas State. He came away with two of UTSA’s four takeaways in the 48-20 victory over UIW, recovering a fumble and logging his second interception of the season to go with five unassisted

tackles. He became the fourth Roadrunner to record both a fumble recovery and interception in a game and the first since Triston Wade on Oct. 1, 2014, against FIU. Banks tallied a career high-tying 11 tackles in the 17-16 win at Colorado State before making six stops and forcing a fumble against Temple. A former star wide receiver at perennial power Galena Park North Shore High School, he began his career at the same position with the Aggies in the spring of 2021 before transferring to TCU, where he played in 42 games following a switch to linebacker.

PEWEE THE PLAYMAKER

Owen Pewee has developed a reputation as a playmaker for UTSA’s defense from the money backer position. One of 50 student-athletes on the roster who wears a first-generation student patch, he registered 42 total tackles, 25 unassisted stops, 6.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, two interceptions, a pair of pass breakups and one forced fumble in 2024. Originally from Liberia, he has posted 12 total tackles, five solo stops, two TFLs and three quarterback hurries through the first five games this season. Voted into a single-digit jersey number for the second straight year with No. 2 this season, he now has 87 tackles, 52 solo stops, 15 TFLs, three sacks, four PBUs, seven QB hurries, three interceptions and a forced fumble in 35 career contests for the Roadrunners.

A LEADER IN THE SECONDARY

UTSA safety Jimmy Wyrick has emerged as a leader in the UTSA secondary. Voted into a single-digit jersey (No. 7) by his teammates this season, the redshirt sophomore has posted 28 total tackles, 19 solo stops, a half-tackle for loss, two pass breakups and a fumble recovery through the first five games in 2025. He tied for the team high with 11 tackles in the 17-16 win at Colorado State and broke up a pair of passes versus Temple in his last outing. A product of South Oak Cliff High School in Dallas, he transferred from Stanford after earning his bachelor’s degree in economics in less than four years. He played in four games last fall for UTSA before suffering a season-ending injury.

PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER PART II

Senior punter Caile Hogan is a native of Melbourne, Australia, who joined the Roadrunners prior to the 2024 season. Following in the footsteps of Lucas Dean, a fellow Aussie who set several school records for punting

during his career from 2019 to 2023, Hogan has emerged as a weapon on special teams this season. A product of ProKick Australia, like Dean, he is averaging 47.2 yards per punt through the first five games this season, an average that leads the American Conference and ranks eighth in the FBS. Of his 25 punts, nine have sailed at least 50 yards — including a season-long 60-yard kick at Temple on Oct. 4 — and nine have pinned opponents inside their own 20-yard line. His average has leaped dramatically from last season when he averaged 40.0 yards on 55 punts. He had five that went 50-plus yards with a long of 63 yards and 16 that ended up inside the 20 in 2024.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Through the first five games this season, 13 Roadrunners have logged their first career start. That is tied for the fifth most first-time starters in the FBS this year.

TRAYLOR THE HALL OF FAMER

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor has been inducted into two different halls of fame this calendar year. A legendary high school coach for his hometown Gilmer Buckeyes, he was inducted into the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in May in a class that also included Patrick Mahomes II, Robert Griffin III, Pat Thomas, Gary Keithley, Brad Goebel, John C. Norman, David Smoak and Curtis Barbay. In July, he was recognized as part of the 2025 Texas High School Coaches Associations (THSCA) Hall of Honor at the organization’s annual convention in San Antonio. Traylor built Gilmer into a prep powerhouse during his 15-year tenure at the helm. He posted a 175-26 record (.871) and led the Buckeyes to state championships in 2004, 2009 and 2014, two additional state title game appearances in 2007 and 2012 and 12 district crowns.

GRAHAM MAKES 40 UNDER 40 LIST

UTSA assistant head coach and cornerbacks coach Nick Graham was chosen for this year’s Dave Campbell’s Texas Football 40 Under 40. A former standout cornerback at Tulsa and a six-year pro, Graham is in his sixth season as UTSA’s cornerbacks coach and second as assistant head coach after serving as defensive pass game coordinator in 2023. He has landed one of his cornerbacks on the all-conference first team in each of the past three seasons. Graham also has been instrumental in the development of a pair of NFL Draft picks who starred at cornerback under his tutelage in Tariq Woolen (Seahawks) and Zah Frazier (Bears). This marks the fifth consecutive year a UTSA coach has been honored on the list.

KEEPING THEM HOME

UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor and his staff have placed an emphasis on recruiting the city of San Antonio and surrounding area. This year's roster includes 17 players from the San Antonio area.

A FOCUS ON RECRUITING TEXAS

UTSA's 120-man roster features 83 players — 69% — who hail from the state of Texas. Florida boasts the second-most Roadrunners with eight and five are from Mississippi. Georgia and Louisiana have three apiece, Arizona, Arkansas, Maryland and Oregon are each home to two, while Alabama, California, Indiana, Iowa, Missouri, Ohio, Tennessee and Virginia have one native. Caile Hogan is the lone UTSA player from Australia and Cory Godinet is the first Roadrunner from American Samoa.

UTSA's 210 TRIANGLE OF TOUGHNESS

Since his arrival in December 2019 head coach Jeff Traylor has instilled into the program his 210 Triangle of Toughness — run the football, be physical on defense and be sound on special teams — and its Culture Pillars: Integrity, Passion, Mental & Physical Toughness, Selfless and Perfect Effort. As part of that culture, the players voted during fall camp on who would earn single-digit jersey numbers, a reward for representing mental and physical toughness on and off the field. The numbers 2, 1 and 0 — San Antonio's area code — were chosen for the players voted to best represent the 210 Triangle of Toughness brand. UTSA FIRST-GENERATION PATCH

UTSA Athletics has established itself as a national leader in serving first-generation student-athletes. As an institution, UTSA's first-generation student population comprises approximately 45 percent of the total student body. More than one-third of the UTSA student-athletes are first-generation college students, including 50 members of the football team.

Beginning with the 2025-26 season, UTSA student-athletes who are first-generation college students will wear special patches on their uniforms recognizing their accomplishment of being the first in their family to attend college.



PRO ROADRUNNERS

A dozen former UTSA players made NFL training camp rosters this year, including four NFL draft selections. Marcus Davenport, now a member of the Detroit Lions, became the first Roadrunner to be selected in the first round when the Saints picked him 14th overall in 2018. Spencer Burford was a fourth-round pick by the San Francisco 49ers in 2022, while Tariq Woolen was selected by the Seattle Seahawks in the next round in the same year. Zah Frazier was taken by the Chicago Bears in the fifth round of this year's draft. With the NFL season underway, eight former UTSA players currently are signed to NFL rosters or practice squads.

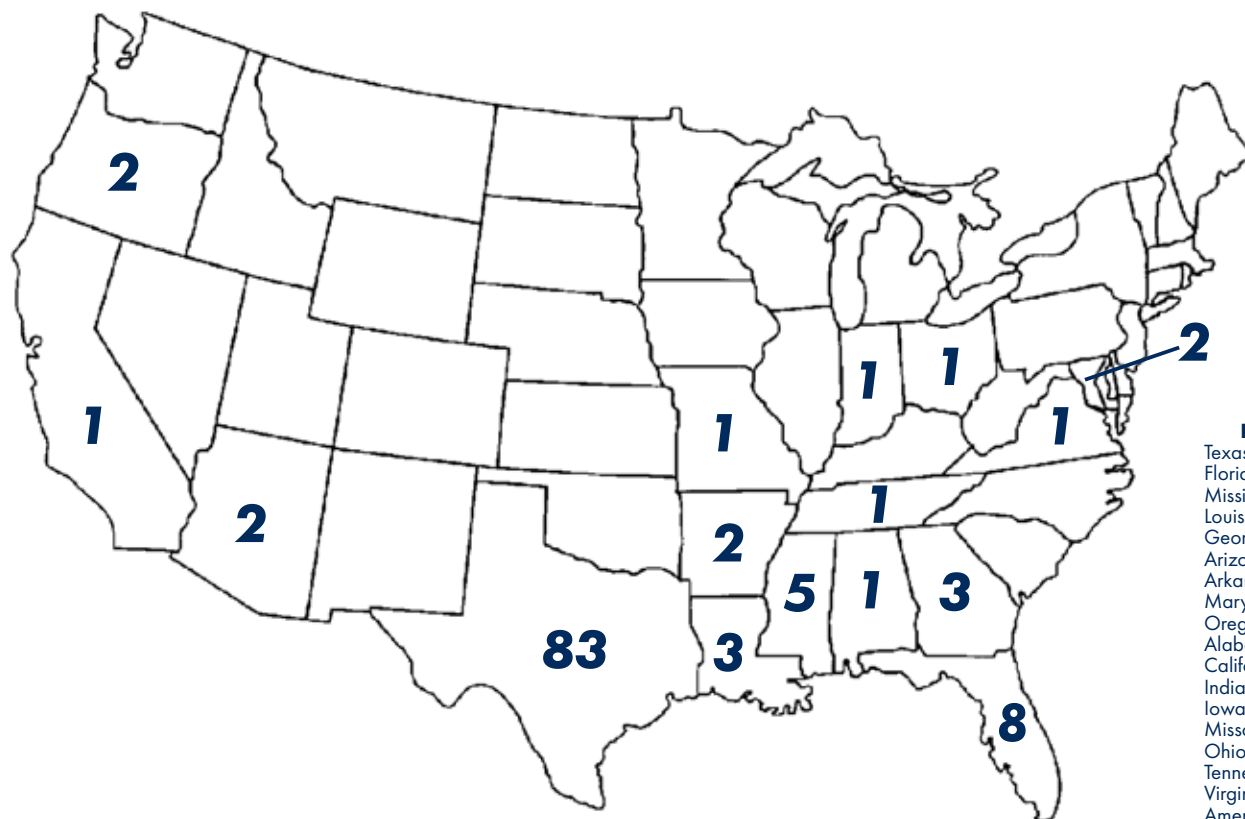

Named UTSA's third head coach on Dec. 9, 2019, Jeff Traylor has had an immediate impact on the program, university and city of San Antonio during his tenure.

Traylor has turned around the UTSA football program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, which has led to positive results on and off the field. The Gilmer, Texas, native took over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival and has led the Roadrunners to a 46-20 record in his first five years at the helm, the most wins and best winning percentage (.697) by a coach in program history. Under his watch, UTSA has recorded the most wins (46) among FBS teams from the state of Texas since 2020.

Traylor also has helped turn UTSA's home facility — the Alamodome — into a true homefield advantage with a 29-3 (.906) home record during his tenure. In fact, the Roadrunners own the third-most home wins among FBS teams since 2020, trailing only Alabama (32) and Ohio State (30).

During the Traylor era, UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned five straight bowl berths with back-to-back bowl wins and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls. He has coached nine All-Americans, three national award finalists, 91 all-conference selections and three NFL Draft picks.

That success is not limited to just the gridiron. The Roadrunners also have received numerous honors for their work in the classroom under Traylor's leadership, including three College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, a William V. Campbell Trophy finalist, 13 CSC Academic All-District Selections, four conference all-academic team selections and the AFCA Academic Achievement Award.

In 2024, Traylor guided UTSA to seven wins and its fifth consecutive bowl appearance under his watch, a 44-15 triumph over Coastal Carolina in the Myrtle Beach Bowl. UTSA also went undefeated at the Alamodome for the second time during his tenure with a 6-0 mark, pushing the home winning streak to a school record-tying 10 games.

Eight Roadrunners earned All-American Athletic Conference accolades in 2024, including outside linebacker Jimmori Robinson, a fourth-team All-America selection by Phil Steele who was chosen as Defensive Player of the Year to mark the second straight season a USA player has garnered that award. Zah Frazier, a cornerback who set the program record with six interceptions and later was selected in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Bears, joined Robinson on the All-AAC First Team and was named an All-American by Phil Steele (third team) and CBS Sports (honorable mention). Additionally, UTSA boasted a pair of national player of the week honorees in Robinson (Walter Camp) and quarterback Owen McCown (Manning Award)

and also reeled in three conference weekly awards during the season.

In 2023, Traylor led the Roadrunners to a 9-4 record, a 7-1 mark in their debut campaign in The American and the program's first bowl win with a 35-17 victory over Marshall in the Frisco Bowl. UTSA received votes in both the final Associated Press Top 25 and USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll for the third consecutive season.

A total of 16 Roadrunners collected all-conference honors in 2023, led by five first-team honorees in Defensive Player of the Year and outside linebacker Trey Moore, quarterback Frank Harris, wide receiver Joshua Cephus, cornerback Kam Alexander and safety Rashad Wisdom. Moore was named a second-team All-American by the AFCA, while Harris was chosen as a semifinalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award for the third year in a row and to the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2023, his fourth career appearance on that annual list. Harris also was named national player of the week by those two organizations, while the Roadrunners hauled in five AAC Player of the Week awards.

In 2022, Traylor guided UTSA to an 11-3 record, a second straight Conference USA title, a top-25 ranking in all three major polls for the second consecutive season and the third bowl appearance in a row with the Cure Bowl matchup against Troy. He repeated as Conference USA Coach of the Year and was chosen as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson and Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year, as well as a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award.

Under Traylor's guidance, UTSA collected a school-record 30 league postseason honors, as 27 made the 2022 all-conference teams —including six first-team and five second-team selections — while 16 received honorable mention and three landed on the Conference USA All-Freshman Team. Harris was voted the league's MVP and Kevorian Barnes was tabbed Conference USA Freshman of the Year. Harris (4) and Jared Sackett (5) combined to earn nine player of the week accolades during the season.

Also in 2022, wide receiver Zakhari Franklin was named an honorable mention All-American by Phil Steele, the sixth Roadrunner to receive All-America accolades in the Traylor era. Additionally, Harris was named a finalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

Under Traylor's tutelage, UTSA enjoyed a record-setting campaign in 2021. The Roadrunners won their first 11

games, were nationally ranked as high as No. 15 and captured the program's first league title. UTSA capped the season with its second straight and third overall bowl appearance against San Diego State in the Frisco Bowl.

Traylor was honored as the 2021 Conference USA Coach of the Year, the AFCA FBS Regional Coach of the Year for Region 4 and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, AFCA National Coach of the Year and George Munger College Coach of the Year Award. A member of the Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year watch list, he was chosen as the 2021 San Antonio Express-News Sportsman of the Year.

A total of 23 Roadrunners received recognition on the all-conference and Conference USA All-Freshman teams in 2021 with Sincere McCormick earning Offensive Player of the Year accolades for the second straight season.

McCormick garnered All-America accolades from three different organizations in 2021, while Spencer Burford and Clarence Hicks

were tabbed honorable mention All-Americans by Phil Steele. McCormick also was an Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award finalist and a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award for the second straight year. Harris landed on semifinalist lists for the Davey O'Brien and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Awards, while Hunter Duplessis was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy for the second year in a row. Harris and McCormick each collected Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award National Player of the Week honors, while Harris also was a Manning Award Quarterback of the Week. Additionally, UTSA collected nine league weekly awards.

In his first season at the helm, Traylor guided the Roadrunners to a 7-5 overall record, a runner-up finish in Conference USA's West Division with a 5-2 mark and an appearance in the 2020 First Responder Bowl. The Roadrunners received votes in a national poll (AP Top 25) for the first time in program history after a 3-0 start and the seven wins are the most by a first-year UTSA head coach.

Dean, Duplessis and McCormick received All-America accolades, while McCormick also was a finalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. Additionally, Duplessis (Campbell Trophy, Lou Groza) and McCormick (Doak Walker) were national award semifinalists, while Harris made the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2020. Dean was tabbed Conference USA Special Teams Player of the Year and McCormick was named the league's offensive player of the year, while a total of 23 Roadrunners were recognized by the league's head coaches, including 19 as all-conference and four on the all-freshman team. The Roadrunners collected a program-record 11 C-USA Player of the Week certificates and a trio of national player of the week accolades in McCormick (Earl Campbell Tyler Rose National Player of the Week), Dean (Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week) and Rashad Wisdom (Jim Thorpe Award Player of the Week).

During his time in San Antonio, Traylor has overseen the development of several Roadrunners who have moved on to the professional ranks. In April 2022, UTSA doubled the number of NFL draft picks on one afternoon, as the 49ers selected Spencer Burford in the fourth round while the Seahawks picked Tariq Woolen one round later. Burford earned the starting spot at right guard in year one and Woolen picked off half a dozen passes in his rookie campaign en route to being selected to the Pro Bowl. Additionally, his former players Cephus, Hicks, McCormick, Leroy Watson, Charles Wiley and Wisdom all have made active rosters or practice squads.

UTSA student-athletes have been honored for their work in the classroom under Traylor, as well. In 2023, UTSA was one of 13 schools to receive the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) 2023 Academic Achievement Award for posting the highest graduation rate among FBS programs in the most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) report.

Individually, Ahofitu Maka became the third Roadrunner to be named a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy and the second

to be selected as a College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-American when he landed on the first team in 2022. He also earned spots on the CSC Academic All-District Team for a third time and the Conference USA All-Academic Team for the second straight season. Duplessis was a two-time Conference USA Football Scholar Athlete of the Year, a 2021 CSC Academic All-American, a two-time Conference USA All-Academic Team selection and a two-time CSC Academic All-District pick. Dean was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy in 2023 and he earned 2021 Conference USA All-Academic Team recognition and CSC Academic All-District Team accolades in 2021-23. Kaedric Cobbs, Cory Godinet, Trey Moore and Tate Sandell also made the 2023 CSC Academic All-District Team, while Jameian Buxton was named academic all-district and Cardenas made the Campbell Trophy semifinalist list in 2024.

Traylor has more than 30 years of coaching experience including a highly successful 15-year career as head coach at Gilmer High School, where he led teams to three state championships and two state

runner-up finishes and won more than 87% of his games, a winning percentage that ranks 10th all-time in Texas high school history.

Prior to coming to the Alamo City, the Gilmer native served as associate head coach and running backs coach for two seasons at Arkansas, where he helped sign the school's first top-20 recruiting class. Prior to that, he served in the same role at SMU for the 2017 season. He began his collegiate coaching career as the special teams coordinator and tight ends coach at Texas in 2015 before becoming the Longhorns' associate head coach for offense and wide receivers coach the following year.

Traylor's impact on the offense was felt immediately in his first season at Arkansas, as his running backs corps racked up 1,721 yards and 11 touchdowns in 2018. The unit was led by Rakeem Boyd, who rushed for more than 100 yards in three different SEC games, including a season-best 113 against Vanderbilt. The Houston Stratford High School product took over the starting tailback role in the fifth game of the season and his most impressive stretch of the season came during a four-game stretch against Alabama, Ole Miss, Tulsa and Vanderbilt, as he topped the century mark three times and totaled 423 yards. His 102 yards against Alabama made him the first Arkansas running back to eclipse 100 yards against the Crimson Tide since Darren McFadden in 2007.

In Traylor's second season coaching the Arkansas running backs, Boyd rushed for 1,133 yards and eight touchdowns on 184 carries (6.2 avg.) to spearhead a ground game that accumulated 1,766 yards. Boyd topped 100 yards in five contests, including a season-best 185 and two scores on just eight attempts against Western Kentucky. He also rushed for 100-plus against Portland State (114), Colorado State (122), Kentucky (134) and Mississippi (114).

Prior to his time at Arkansas, Traylor spent the 2017 season as associate head coach and running backs coach at SMU under Chad Morris. He also served as the Mustangs' interim head coach before joining Morris' staff at Arkansas.

During his one year at SMU, Traylor's running backs piled up 2,223 yards on the ground. Three players rushed for 500-plus yards, with Xavier Jones leading the group at 1,075. The Mustangs topped the 200-yard mark on the ground six times, including a season-best 311 in a win against Arkansas State. SMU ranked in the top 20 nationally in several offensive categories, including 12th in scoring offense and 15th in total offense.

Prior to his time in Dallas, Traylor spent two seasons at Texas. He was the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator in 2015 and then the associate head coach for offense and wide receivers coach in 2016, when the Longhorns boasted the nation's No. 16-ranked offense that averaged 491.3 yards per game. During his time as the lead recruiter, he helped the Longhorns sign the No. 7-ranked recruiting class in the country in back-to-back years and was named Scout.com's

Big 12 Recruiter of the Year. He recruited punter Michael Dickson, who went on to earn multiple All-America honors, win Big 12 Conference Special Teams Player of the Year in 2016 and 2017 as well as the 2017 Ray Guy Award, and currently punts for the Seattle Seahawks.

Traylor built his hometown program into a prep powerhouse during his 15-year tenure leading the Gilmer Buckeyes.

A four-time Texas High School Coach of the Year, he posted a 175-26 record (.871) and led Gilmer to five state championship game appearances, three state titles (2004, '09, '14) and 12 district crowns. The Buckeyes turned in a pair of perfect 16-0 seasons, won 10-or-more games 11 times and registered seven 13-win seasons and three 15-win campaigns during his career.

In 2014, his Class 4A Division II state championship team boasted one of the most prolific offenses in Texas prep history. Gilmer scored 950 points, the second-most at that time in state history, averaging 59.4 points and 536.1 yards over the 16-game season. The Buckeyes topped 60 points nine times, including two 80-point performances. Gilmer also averaged 536.1 total yards per game (8,577 yards) behind a balanced 293.9 passing yards and 242.1 rushing yards per contest. The defense was equally dominant, allowing only 276 points (17.3) with five single-digit efforts and two shutouts, while recording 23 interceptions and forcing 17 fumbles. Gilmer closed out the season with a win over West Orange-Stark and had eight different players earn Class 4A All-State honors from either the AP or Texas Sports Writers Association.

Gilmer's two other state titles under Traylor both came in Class 3A in 2004 (Division II) and 2009 (Division I), before the change in class structure in Texas high school football moved the school into Class 4A. After 15 years on its sidelines, Gilmer renamed Buckeye Stadium to Jeff Traylor Stadium to honor his successful career.

Inducted into the East Texas Coaches Association Hall of Honor in 2019, Traylor received numerous honors during his prep coaching career, including being named Coach of the Decade (2000s) by the Tyler Morning Telegraph. He is a 12-time District Coach of the Year, four-time East Texas Coach of the Year and a four-time Ted Jeffries Award winner. He has received the Carl Padilla Coach of the Year, KYKX Coach of the Year and Old Coach Network Coach of the Year awards twice each. He was inducted into both the Texas High School Coaches Association (THSCA) Hall of Honor and the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in 2025.

Traylor began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Big Sandy High School in 1990-93 before a seven-year stint (1994-2000) at Jacksonville High School where he served as passing coordinator, defensive backs coach, receivers coach and special teams coordinator. There, he helped coach future NFL quarterbacks Josh McCown and Luke McCown and former Texas A&M standout signal-caller Randy McCown.

A 1986 graduate of Gilmer High School, Traylor earned both undergraduate (1990) and graduate (2002) degrees in education from Stephen F. Austin while playing football as a walk-on.

He and his wife, Cari, have three children: Jordan, Jacob and Jaci.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas — Robert Henry Jr. rushed for 177 yards and two touchdowns, but No. 19 Texas A&M pulled away in the second half for a 42-24 victory over UTSA on Saturday night in front of 107,521 fans at Kyle Field.

Henry topped the century mark on the ground for his third straight game, doing so on a 75-yard TD dash on the first play from scrimmage in the second half, which got the Roadrunners (0-1) to within four points in the third all-time meeting with the Aggies (1-0). The senior from Lumberton, Mississippi, averaged 11.1 yards on his 16 carries, coming up just one yard shy of his UTSA career high of 178 posted in the win over Temple last November. He also rushed for 168 yards against North Texas the week prior, giving him 523 yards and six TDs over that three-game stretch.

Henry's night helped the Roadrunners tally 203 rushing yards to go with 170 through the air. Owen McCown passed for 121 while Brandon Tennon came off the bench in the fourth quarter and completed both of his pass attempts, including a 34-yard TD toss to AJ Wilson.

Defensively, Shad Banks Jr. registered seven tackles with one for a loss, while Kendrick Blackshire and Jimmy Wyrick added five stops apiece. UTSA held Texas A&M to only 108 rushing yards and 399 total.

The Aggies struck first with a special teams score. KC Concepcion fielded a punt at his own 20-yard line and raced 80 yards to the end zone midway through the opening quarter.

The Roadrunners responded with a 12-play, 56-yard drive that was capped by a 36-yard field goal from Michael Petro. Henry had a 21-yard run into Texas A&M territory to key the possession.

Texas A&M took a 14-3 lead early in the second stanza after a 24-yard touchdown pass from Marcel Reed to Mario Craver.

UTSA answered again, this time with a nine-play, 75-yard march. David Amador II had back-to-back catches of 18 and 14 yards to set up Henry for a 15-yard touchdown scamper around left end and just inside the pylon.

The Aggies went back up by two scores on their next possession, which ended with a 31-yard TD catch by Concepcion with 5:38 left to play until halftime.

UTSA had a chance to cut the deficit late in the first half, driving inside the A&M 30-yard line. However, a 43-yard field goal attempt into the wind sailed wide left, leaving the score at 21-10.

Henry paced the offense in the first half with 95 yards on 11 rushes, while Amador had three catches for 41 yards.

On the first play from scrimmage of the second half, Henry padded his rushing yardage total with his 75-yard sprint up the middle to paydirt. Petro's extra point pulled UTSA to within 21-17.

The Aggies pushed the lead back out to two scores later in the third quarter when Reed hit Theo Melin Ohrstrom on a 1-yard touchdown pass on a fourth-down play.

Texas A&M stretched its advantage to 42-17 after a 22-yard touchdown catch by Craver and a 3-yard plunge by EJ Smith midway through the fourth quarter.

Tennon tossed his first career touchdown pass to Wilson down the left sideline in the final minute and Petro drilled the extra point to provide the final margin.

Reed paced the Aggies with 289 yards and four TDs through the air and 39 more yards on the ground. Craver hauled in eight passes for 122 yards and a pair of scores.

Texas State 43, UTSA 36

SAN ANTONIO — Robert Henry Jr. registered his fourth consecutive 100-yard rushing game, but Texas State used a 65-yard touchdown reception by Beau Sparks with 10 minutes remaining to oulcast UTSA, 43-36, on Saturday afternoon in front of 45,778 fans at the Alamodome.

Henry rushed for 159 yards and two touchdowns, including a 75-yard sprint in the third quarter and a 30-yard dash in the fourth that pulled the Roadrunners (0-2) within two. Owen McCown then completed a pass to Devin McCuin to knot the score at 36-all with 10:22 left to play.

The Bobcats [2-0] answered quickly on their next play from scrimmage, reclaiming the lead on a deep ball from Brad Jackson to Sparks, who finished the day with 155 receiving yards. Tyler Robles's extra point gave the visitors a 43-36 cushion.

UTSA had three more possessions down the stretch but turned the ball over on downs twice, including with 1:28 left, allowing Texas State to run out the clock and snap the Roadrunners' 10-game home winning streak.

Henry also had four receptions for 21 yards including a 4-yard score in the third quarter, and the senior now has rushed for 159-or-more yards and two TDs in each of his last four outings. In fact, the Lumberton, Mississippi, native has piled up 682 rushing yards, eight rushing and nine total touchdowns and four runs of 75-plus yards.

McCown threw for 219 yards and a pair of TDs with McCuin leading the receiving corps with 83 yards on five catches, as UTSA tallied 464 yards of offense, including 245 on the ground.

Jackson directed the Bobcats offense by completing 12 of 20 passes for 286 yards and a score and rushing for 34 and two TDs. Lincoln Pare led the ground game with 71 yards to help Texas State total 454 yards.

The scoring started with the first safety allowed by the Roadrunners in 10 years, as a high snap on a punt was batted through the back of the end zone early in the opening frame.

Pare had a 1-yard TD plunge at the 12:10 mark of the second stanza to help push Texas State's lead to 9-0 before UTSA responded with an eight-play, 75-yard drive that was capped with a 1-yard touchdown rush by A'Marion Peterson.

The two teams traded touchdowns late in the first half with DJ Allen's 1-yard catch and Michael Petro's PAT pulling the home side within 16-14. However, the Bobcats drove quickly to the UTSA 32-yard line and Robles drilled a 50-yard field goal as time expired, arming Texas State with a five-point advantage at the break.

Henry's 75-yard score on the second play from scrimmage of the second half gave UTSA its first lead of the day, yet it was short-lived as Jaylen Jenkins' 17-yard touchdown dash at the 11:35 mark of the third made it 26-21.

The Roadrunners reclaimed the lead when Henry found paydirt again on his short TD reception. Petro's extra point made it 28-26 midway through the third quarter.

Robles connected with his leg again in the ensuing possession to hand Texas State a 29-28 lead and Jackson's TD on a 6-yard keeper with 14:11 left in the game.

Shad Banks Jr. paced the UTSA defense with nine tackles, one tackle for loss and an interception for the Roadrunners' first takeaway of the season. Jimmy Wyrick and Tyan Milton pitched in with six stops apiece.

SAN ANTONIO — Shad Banks Jr. came up with two of UTSA's four takeaways and Robert Henry Jr. registered his fifth consecutive 100-yard rushing game to help the Roadrunners roll past No. 8 (FCS) UIW, 48-20, on Saturday afternoon at the Alamodome.

Banks had his second interception of the season and recovered a fumble to go with five solo tackles to help the Roadrunners (1-2) record their first win of the campaign and second in two all-time meetings with the Cardinals (1-2). Davin Martin logged his first career pick and Jimmy Wyrick had a fumble recovery, as UTSA forced four turnovers on the day.

Henry rushed for 144 yards and two touchdowns — including a 74-yard dash on the third play from scrimmage of the third quarter — on only 14 attempts, good for an average of 10.3 yards per carry. The leading rusher in the FBS entering today's contest, the senior from Mississippi now boasts 144-plus rushing yards, two rushing TDs and a run of at least 74 yards in each of his last five outings.

UTSA piled up 442 yards of offense, 243 through the air and 199 on the ground. Owen McCown completed 11 straight pass attempts at one point during the first half and finished 30 of 36 (83.3%) for 243 yards and four touchdowns. He found six different receivers, led by Devin McCuin, who caught seven for 51 yards and two TDs. AJ Wilson had a team-high 104 yards and a TD on five receptions, while DJ Allen hauled in seven passes for 29 yards.

The Roadrunners held the Cardinals to 357 yards of offense, including only 33 rushing, the fewest allowed since limiting Rice to five rushing yards in 2022. Brandon Tucker paced the defense with eight tackles, including seven solo stops. Martin had six tackles to go with his INT, while KK Meier made five stops.

UTSA took advantage of the first UIW turnover on the game's opening possession, as Wyrick pounced on a loose ball at the UIW 33-yard line. Six plays later, McCown connected with McCuin on a 13-yard TD pass.

Michael Petro pushed the lead to 1-0 when he split the uprights from 26 yards with 5:29 left in the opening period.

Henry found paydirt early in the second stanza on a 3-yard TD run and the McCown found Dan Dishman all alone in the end zone on a 4-yard touchdown pass to increase the lead to 24-0 with 8:03 left until halftime.

Henry's 74-yard dash on the first drive of the second half helped give the Roadrunners a 31-0 lead. That also marked the third time this season that he has scored on a run of 74-plus yards on the first, second or third play of the second half.

The Cardinals broke through for their first score of the game on a 38-yard touchdown pass from EJ Colson to Chedon James.

The Roadrunners responded with their longest passing touchdown since the 2023 season, a 77-yard bomb from McCown to Wilson that helped extend the lead to 38-7.

Colson and James hooked up for their second score of the half on a 15-yard TD before Petro made his second field goal of the day, a 31-yarder at the 9:19 mark of the fourth quarter that made it 41-14.

Colson hit James on a 36-yard touchdown pass with 6:19 remaining and a two-point conversion attempt failed, providing the final margin.

Colson came off the bench in the second half to throw for 213 yards and three TDs on 17-of-24 passing. James had a game-high 134 yards and three scores on eight catches.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. — Nnanna Anyanwu posted three sacks and Robert Henry Jr. turned in his sixth straight 100-yard rushing game to help UTSA hold off Colorado State, 17-16, on Saturday night at Canvas Stadium.

What began as a low-scoring affair ended in thrilling fashion. After the Rams (1-2) tied the score at 10-10 with under seven minutes left to play, the Roadrunners (2-2) grabbed the lead again after Henry broke free for a 74-yard touchdown reception.

Colorado State would not go away though, as Jackson Brousseau spearheaded a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a TD pass to Rocky Beers with 29 seconds remaining. Initially, CSU tied the score with a successful extra-point attempt by Isaiah Hankins. However, UTSA was called for offside on the try and the Rams decided to accept the penalty and go for a potential game-winning two-point conversion. Another Rams quarterback, Tahj Bullock, entered the game and rolled to his right, but his pass sailed incomplete out of bounds due to tight coverage from the Roadrunners. The ensuing onside kick went out of bounds and UTSA ran out the clock to claim victory in the series for the first time in three meetings.

Anyanwu was responsible for four of the Roadrunners' five tackles for loss on a defense that held the Rams to 223 yards of offense through the first three quarters. Making his first career start, he became the seventh UTSA player to record three-or-more sacks in a game and just the sixth to log four-plus TFLs.

Meanwhile, Henry rushed for 144 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries and he added 76 receiving yards to give him 220 all-purpose yards on the night, the fifth-best single-game performance in program history. He extended his school-record streak of 100-yard rushing games to six, a stretch that has seen him register a rush of at least 74 yards in each contest.

After a scoreless first quarter, UTSA struck first thanks to another long touchdown run from Henry. Facing a third down and three from their own 24-yard line, the senior running back broke free for a 76-yard dash to paydirt to put the Roadrunners on the board first.

The Rams responded with a seven-play, 69-yard drive that was capped with a 23-yard field goal from Hankins at the 7:04 mark of the second stanza.

UTSA added a field goal in the final minute of the opening half when Michael Petro split the uprights from 40 yards to hand the visitors a 10-3 advantage at the break.

Both defenses proved tough to gain yards against in the third quarter, as the teams combined for 46 yards of offense in the frame.

Colorado State put together a game-tying drive midway through the fourth. Tahj Bullock's 10-yard quarterback keeper put an end to a nine-play, 67-yard march and Hankins' extra point knotted the score with 6:19 left to play, setting up the thrilling final minutes.

Shad Banks Jr. and Jimmy Wyrick paced the UTSA defense with 11 tackles apiece, the first time two Roadrunners have made double-digit stops in the same game since the 2022 season opener.

SPHILADELPHIA — Kendrick Blackshire posted a game-high 10 tackles and Patrick Overmyer scored a pair of touchdowns, but Temple rallied from a 14-3 halftime deficit for a 27-21 victory over UTSA in the American Conference opener for both teams on Saturday afternoon at Lincoln Financial Field.

Overmyer's two scores helped hand the Roadrunners (2-3, 0-1) a 14-3 lead in the first half, but the Owls (3-2, 1-0) found the end zone three times in the third quarter to rally for their first win in the series.

Blackshire logged six solo tackles as part of his double-digit output to pace the defense, which held Temple to 309 yards of offense. Shad Banks Jr. added six stops while Nnanna Anyanwu and Daemion Wimberly each recorded a sack.

The Roadrunners carried a 14-3 advantage into the locker room only to see Temple strike for two quick touchdowns early in the third quarter. JoJo Bermudez hauled in an 8-yard touchdown pass to make it a one-score contest. Following an interception, Hunter Smith broke loose for a 54-yard TD run to hand the home team the lead.

UTSA reclaimed the lead on the ensuing possession. Owen McCown completed passes on back-to-back plays to AJ Wilson of 16 and 36 yards to set up an 18-yard TD pass to Devin McCuin. Michael Petro's PAT made it 21-17 with 5:28 left in the third.

With the benefit of a short field, Temple pulled back ahead late in the third on a 15-yard touchdown catch by Peter Clarke, capping a two-play, 38-yard drive.

The Owls tacked on a late field goal by Hardin from 36 yards with just under two minutes remaining to pad the lead at 27-21.

UTSA had one final offensive drive but turned it over on downs deep on its own end of the field and Temple ran out the clock to seal the win.

McCown completed 25 of 37 passes for 234 yards and a pair of touchdowns. McCuin had six catches for 60 yards, David Amador II made six grabs for 34 yards and AJ Wilson totaled a team-high 67 yards on three receptions.

The Roadrunners marched 75 yards in 12 plays on their first possession to take an early lead. Patrick Overmyer reached the end zone on a 1-yard plunge and Petro's extra point made it 7-0 with 8:44 on the clock in the opening frame. That score was set up by a 14-yard catch by Amador II and a 17-yard grab by Houston Thomas.

The Owls also scored on their first possession, as Carl Hardin drilled a 31-yard field goal to make it 7-3.

UTSA took a 14-3 lead midway through the second stanza. McCown found Overmyer wide open in the end zone for a 7-yard TD pass to put an exclamation point on a 14-play, 81-yard drive that took 7:46 off the clock.

Evan Simon threw for 181 yards and two TDs to pace Temple's offense. Clarke had a game-high 82 yards on four receptions and Smith rushed for 74 yards on only eight attempts.
