

ALETTER FROM LISA CAMPOS



ROADRUNNERS FAMILY

Entering the 2024-25 academic year, we knew that it would be a season like no other in college athletics. We are experiencing an accelerated shift in the landscape in which we operate, but it is a change that is full of excitement and opportunity.

The American Conference has been on the forefront of directly supporting student-athletes, which we are now permitted to do through revenue sharing as part of the House v. NCAA decision. We are joining with our conference peers to provide at least \$10 million in revenue sharing to our student-athletes over the next three years. Your support has allowed us to continue transforming lives as San Antonio's nationally recognized NCAA Division I athletics program.

Our second year in The American was another historic one for the Roadrunners, which has helped us continue to provide countless new opportunities for our student-athletes and elevate the national brand of our university. UTSA's integration with UT Health San Antonio will bring together two R1 institutions to create UT San Antonio, the third-largest research university in the state of Texas.

This past year, our women's basketball and baseball programs won American Conference regular-season championships, while both recording the most wins in a single season in school history. Our baseball team claimed the NCAA Austin Regional and advanced to the NCAA Super Regional, marking the first top-10 NCAA finish ever for any sport program at UTSA. Our football program claimed its second consecutive bowl victory while making its school-record fifth straight bowl game appearance and also earned the first win against a top-25 opponent in school history.

For the fourth time in five years, UTSA Athletics notched a departmental record for NCAA Graduation Success Rate, this time achieving a record 90 percent mark.

Across all of our nearly 400 student-athletes, the Roadrunners averaged a departmental GPA of better than 3.0 and 206 of our student-athletes were named to The American All-Academic Team. Baseball's James Taussig was recognized as the American Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, while Danijal Muminovic was the American's Men's Tennis Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Track & Field standout Ida Breigan was recognized by College Sports Communicators as an Academic All-American. I could not be more proud of their accomplishments.

Many of you were with us this past December when we broke ground on our Basketball and Volleyball Training Facility, a state-of-the-art \$38 million facility that will provide our student-athletes in those three sports a top-notch development and training experience when it opens next fall. Our commitment to first-class facilities will continue, as we next look to make enhancements for the baseball and softball programs.

Roadrunner Nation once again set the standard while cheering on our great teams in 2024-25. The women's basketball and baseball programs set new single-game home attendance records, while volleyball and women's basketball also broke their single-season attendance marks. For the second consecutive season, soccer led The American in average home attendance.

College athletics may look a little different as we continue to evolve but remain assured that our core mission is the same. We are dedicated to developing champions in the classroom, in competition and in life, while serving as an integral part of the undergraduate student experience, enhancing the visibility of the university and engaging the San Antonio community.

On behalf of our students, coaches and staff, thank you for the impact that you make on our program and this university. We could not do it without you!

CHAMPIONSHIP SUCCESS



WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

THE UTSA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM AMASSED A 17-1 LEAGUE RECORD THAT CEMENTED AN AMERICAN CONFERENCE REGULAR-SEASON CHAMPIONSHIP. UTSA FINISHED 26-5 OVERALL FOR THE BEST SEASON IN PROGRAM HISTORY, AND A 13-0 HOME RECORD ALLOWED THEM TO FINISH UNDEFEATED IN THE CONVO FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE 1984-85. JORDYN JENKINS PLAYED A CRITICAL ROLE, EARNING AMERICAN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE YEAR, WHILE KAREN ASTON WAS CHOSEN UNANIMOUSLY AS COACH OF THE YEAR AND NINA DE LEON NEGRON PICKED UP NEWCOMER OF THE YEAR HONORS. ADDITIONALLY, THE SQUAD'S AT-LARGE BID TO THE WBIT MARKED BACK-TO-BACK SEASONS THAT UTSA HAS REACHED THE POSTSEASON.

FOOTBALL

THE UTSA FOOTBALL TEAM PRODUCED ITS SECOND STRAIGHT BOWL VICTORY WITH A 44-15 WIN OVER COASTAL CAROLINA AT THE 2024 MYRTLE BEACH BOWL IN CONWAY, SOUTH CAROLINA. OWEN MCGOWN PASSED FOR 254 YARDS WITH A TOUCHDOWN AND ADDED A 35-YARD SCORE ON THE GROUND EN ROUTE TO BEING NAMED THE GAME'S MVP. BRANDON BROWN PACED A DOMINATING DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCE WITH FIVE TACKLES, INCLUDING TWO SACKS, AS THE ROADRUNNERS REGISTERED 10 TACKLES FOR LOSS AND FOUR SACKS ON THE DAY.



BASEBALL

THE UTSA BASEBALL TEAM EARNED ITS THIRD-EVER REGULAR-SEASON CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP AND FINISHED FIRST IN THE AMERICAN CONFERENCE BY GOING 23-4 AGAINST CONFERENCE FOES. THE ROADRUNNERS RECEIVED THEIR FIRST-EVER AT-LARGE BID TO THE NGAA POSTSEASON. BEING SELECTED AS THE TWO SEED IN THE AUSTIN REGIONAL. UTSA SWEPT THE REGIONAL AFTER AN OPENING-ROUND WIN OVER KANSAS STATE FOLLOWED BY BACK-TO-BACK VICTORIES OVER NO. 2 OVERALL SEED TEXAS, LEADING TO ITS FIRST SUPER REGIONAL APPEARANCE AT NO. 15 UCLA. THE ROADRUNNERS FINISHED THE HISTORIC SEASON WITH A 47-15 OVERALL RECORD. THE MOST WINS AND BEST WINNING PERCENTAGE (.758) IN SCHOOL HISTORY. THE ROADRUNNERS TIED FOR NINTH IN THE COUNTRY, MARKING THE FIRST TOP-10 NGAA FINISH FOR ANY SPORT IN PROGRAM HISTORY.



TRACK&FIELD

THE UTSA TRACK & FIELD TEAMS CONTINUED THEIR HISTORY OF COLLECTING INDIVIDUAL TITLES WITH 10 ON THE YEAR AND THE WOMEN'S SQUAD WAS A MERE 3.5 POINTS SHY OF THE PROGRAM'S FIRST AMERICAN INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS TITLE. FINISHING AS RUNNER-UP WITH 92.5 POINTS, IDA BREIGAN SWEPT AAC MOST OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCE HONORS AND WON BOTH THE INDOOR AND OUTDOOR. SHE SHARED THE ANERICAN INDOOR HONOR WITH MIA LIEN, WHO WON THE PENTATHLON. RACHELA PAGE ALSO SWEPT THE SEASON CROWNS IN THE TRIPLE JUMP. AS DID SOPHOMORE SHOT PUTTER NYALUET DIEW, UTSA ALSO ADDED TITLES FOR THE MEN'S INDOOR LONG JUMP (CHRISTIAAN LE ROUX), MEN'S INDOOR TRIPLE JUMP (DYLAN JAMES) AND WOMEN'S OUTDOOR HIGH JUMP (EDLIN LAUR). BREIGAN AND LIEN REACHED THE NCAA INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS, BOTH EARNING SECOND- TEAM ALL AMERICA ACCOLADES. AT THE NGAA OUTDOOR, LIEN AND PAGE GARNERED SECOND-TEAM ALL-AMERICA LAURELS. WHILE HUGO MENIN WAS HONORABLE MENTION ALL-AMERICA.





IN FEBRUARY 2024, VICE PRESIDENT FOR INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS LISA CAMPOS ANNOUNCED THAT, THANKS TO INCREDIBLE INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT, FUNDRAISING EFFORTS AND NEWLY IDENTIFIED FINANCIAL OPPORTUNITIES, UTSA ATHLETICS WILL BE INVESTING AN ESTIMATED \$57MILLION INTO FACILITIES AND CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR UTSA ATHLETICS.

THIS INCLUDES A NEW, STATE-OF-THE -ART BASKETBALL AND VOLLEYBALL TRAINING FACILITY THAT WILL PROVIDE UTSA Student-Athletes with 24-hour access to a top-tier training center. It will open in fall 2026.

OVER THE NEXT FIVE YEARS, THIS EMPHASIS ON FACILITIES AND CAPITAL PROJECTS WILL ALLOW UTSA TO FOCUS ON EXISTING FACILITY ENHANCEMENTS FOR BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL, INCLUDING PLAYER DEVELOPMENT CENTERS FOR BOTH SPORTS, A NUTRITION PERFORMANCE CENTER FOR ALL STUDENT-ATHLETES AND A COVERED FOOTBALL PAVILION.

BRINGING THIS AMBITIOUS VISION TO REALITY WILL BE A COLLECTIVE EFFORT AND THE SUPPORT OF EVERYONE IN THE ROADRUNNERS FAMILY WILL BE PARAMOUNT. THIS 57 MILLION WILL HELP SPARK THE START OF NEEDED FACILITY PROJECTS, BUT IT IS JUST THE START.


