ABOUT THE ROADRUNNERS

A Statement Weekend

Over the weekend, UTSA made its first appearance at the BRUCE BOLT College Classic. The tournament, formerly known as the Astros Foundation College Classic, has stood since 2001, hosting elite Division I programs from across the nation. The 'Runners finished the weekend 3-0 with wins over two Power Four programs and ninth-ranked Coastal Carolina, just missing out on the tournament championship via run differential, which favored 3-0 Texas.

The Bats Are HOT

UTSA ranks inside the nation's top 15 with a .342 batting average (11th), 10.3 runs scored per game (13th) and a .462 on-base percentage (11th).

Record-Setting 2025

A season ago, the Roadrunners tore up the record book as they set the new benchmark for most wins in a single season (47), RBIs (488), times hit by pitch (125) and runs scored (530). The team's batting average (.312) was just shy of the program record (.317 in 2009).

Two Away from 200

Seventh-year Head Coach Pat Hallmark enters the series with 198

victories at UTSA. With two more wins, he will become the third coach of the Roadrunners to surpass 200 with the program, doing so in the fewest amount of games. Hallmark reached his 150th win a year ago while coaching UTSA on Mar. 1, 2025, in the Roadrunners' win over Youngstown State.

Hurts So Good

This year, UTSA has already been hit by 28 pitches, ranking 28th in the nation and highest in the conference. In their Feb. 17 win over UIC, a season-high nine Roadrunners were struck at the plate.

Staying Disciplined

UTSA has drawn 71 walks through 12 games in 2026, meaning the group averages 8.2 free bases per night (combined BB/HBP). The squad has drawn at least four walks in all but one game this season.

History Made

Starting the season with a perfect 7-0 record, UTSA secured its most wins to open a campaign without a loss in program history. The streak ended on Feb. 24 with a 7-2 loss at Texas State.

ABOUT THE ROADRUNNERS

In His Lane

Lane Haworth has started all 12 games in right field for Pat Hallmark's squad this spring. The junior is batting .478, racking up a team-high 22 hits to go with 12 RBIs over the first three-plus weeks of the campaign. The left-handed batter has drawn 11 walks and been hit by two pitches, stealing three bases en route to scoring 15 runs himself this season. At the BRUCE BOLT College Classic, he belted his first two home runs of the season, hitting the same spot in the outfield bleachers on back-to-back at-bats across Friday and Saturday.

You Det He Will

Drew Detlefsen made a splash in 2025, earning the distinction as an American Conference Co-Newcomer Position Player of the Year. After a shaky start to 2026 at the plate, the left fielder has come alive as of late. The left fielder just wrapped up a week (Feb. 24-March 1) with eight hits, including four for extra base hits. His three home runs helped drive in six RBIs, while boosting his OPS to 1.500 across the four games. On Monday, Detlefsen was named to the American Conference Player of the Week Honorable Mention list.

A New Hallmark Story

Christian Hallmark has been electric in center field this season, doing his best to fill the void left by standout Mason Lytle. The first-year Roadrunner is batting .379, boasting an OPS of 1.055. His grand slam on Feb. 17 was the first of his collegiate career, breaking things open in an eventual 10-3 win over UIC. The San Antonio native was named American Conference Player of the Week on Feb. 23 for his efforts. On Tuesday, Hallmark went deep once again, breaking a 3-3 tie with a two-run shot in the sixth inning.

The Offense is a 10/10

In eight of 12 games this season, UTSA has scored at least 10 runs. The group is averaging more than 1.2 runs per frame, plating 123 runners in 100 innings of work. Against No. 9 Coastal Carolina, the 'Runners hung a 16 on the board, falling one shy of their season record which came on opening day versus South Dakota State (Feb. 13).

Fly Like Dove

Junior Kendall Dove has been simply shutting the opposition down early in 2026. The second-year Roadrunner has made three appearances on the mound, tallying 13.1 innings of work. Dove is now 2-0 on the season, striking out 12 batters and allowing just four earned runs. Batters are hitting .226 and still have yet to record a home run across his trio of weekend starts.

Miller Time

Starting all 12 games at first base this season has been sophomore Caden Miller. The second-year Roadrunner is batting .317 to open the campaign, already notching 13 hits, including seven for extra bases. He has driven in 13 runs while scoring 17 of his own, due in part to his three stolen bases and team-high 12 walks drawn. His four-hit weekend in Houston was highlighted by a three-run blast against Baylor on Sunday, securing his second straight three-RBI day.

The First of Its Kind

On Saturday, UTSA made program history when it faced No. 9 Coastal Carolina. The 'Runners had never squared off with a nationally-ranked opponent at a neutral site, improving to 1-0 in such contests with a 16-10 win over the Chanticleers.

The Slim Reaper

By the time the dust settled on a Friday night home victory over Dallas Baptist on Feb. 20, Sam Simmons already had his second win of the week on the mound. The senior sidearm specialist, nicknamed 'Slim' by his teammates, has been remarkable out of the bullpen this season. The second-year Roadrunner is already 3-0, boasting an ERA of 0.69 across 13.0 innings of work.

Simmons has struck out 10 batters and allowed just one run to score across five outings. On Tuesday, he tossed the final 2.1 innings, earning a win with four strikeouts at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

Energy Stu

Graduate catcher Stucky, whose last name is pronounced STEW-key, was the inspiration for a team mantra, Energy Stu. The catchphrase originates from practice, as it was shouted to the team to raise its energy at practice.

Home Grown

34 of the 40 players on the UTSA squad are from Texas, making up 85 percent of the roster. Five Roadrunners are San Antonio natives: Jacob Silva, Christian Hallmark, Josh Vaughn, Ryan Self and Ryan Mason.

210 Support

During the sweep of DBU (Feb. 20-22), the squad not only set a record for wins to open a season, but 3,048 spectators made their way to Roadrunner Field. The attendance was a ballpark record for a single series, marking the first average of more than 1,000 fans per contest.

Head Coach Pat Hallmark 7th Season

Pat Hallmark is in his seventh season leading the Roadrunners after being named the fifth head baseball coach in UTSA history on June 16, 2019. During his time leading the program, Hallmark has turned the Roadrunners into annual conference title contenders. UTSA has won at least 30 games in each of the last four seasons, including back-to-back 38-win campaigns in 2022-23, and has been nationally ranked for the first time in program history. The program has produced 22 all-conference selections, two all-region performers, a pair of conference award recipients and an All-American during his tenure. Hallmark guided UTSA to 32 wins in 2024, finishing as the runner-up in the American Athletic Conference regular season race with a 17-10 mark. The Roadrunners registered 10 series victories, including taking two of three games against then-No. 10-ranked East Carolina and NCAA regional finalist Grand Canyon and sweeping NCAA regional qualifier Tulane. Hallmark's squad earned eight all-conference certificates with a program-record four first-team selections, including AAC Newcomer Position Player of the Year and first-team outfielder Mason Lytle.

Assistant Coach Ryan Aguayo 7th Season

Ryan Aguayo is in his seventh season as UTSA's assistant coach, recruiting and offensive coordinator in 2026. He joined the staff in July of 2019. In 2024, the Roadrunners finished second in their first season in the American Athletic Conference. Continuing the success at the plate, the Aguayo helped lead six batters to bat above .300 and played an integral role in Freshman Diego Diaz's success as he went on to be named to the AAC All-Freshman Team. In 2023, Aguayo helped lead the Roadrunners to finish second in Conference USA. That year, Aguayo saw six hitters bat above .300. Also that year, the Roadrunners set a program record in on-base percentage with a .408 and a program high .976 fielding percentage. Aguayo has had a major impact through his first five seasons, helping shepherd UTSA through a COVID-19 shortened season in 2020 and spearheading a rapidly rising offensive attack in 2021 and 2022 that ranked as some of the nation's best, breaking multiple school records. In 2022, Aguayo oversaw a Roadrunner lineup that had eight players above the at-bat threshold have .300+ batting averages. UTSA's offense produced 467 runs on the year, tying the school record for most in a single season set back in 2008. The Roadrunner offense also produced 440 RBI, setting a new school record.



Assistant Coach Zach Butler 6th Season

Zach Butler is in his fifth season as UTSA's assistant and pitching coach in 2023. After eight years on the staff at Nicholls, Butler, regarded as an elite pitching coach in the South, was announced by head coach Pat Hallmark on Jan. 21, 2021. Under Butler, the 2024 Roadrunners continued to succeed as they managed to toss 32 wins and 16 saves. The UTSA pitching staff managed to strike out 466 batters, holding them to a .279 batting average. Helped lead Robert Orloski to being named to the AAC All-Freshman Team. In 2023, the pitching staff shined as they marked a program record of 17 saves and a program low of 26 wild pitches. The Roadrunners held a 5.07 ERA on the year, holding their opponents to a batting average of .276. Under Butler, the 2022 Roadrunner pitching staff shattered the school record for most strikeouts in a season, posting 519 and breaking the previous record of 454. Amongst C-USA teams, Butler's pitchers allowed the third fewest hits, second fewest doubles and fourth fewest triples of any staff. UTSA's 519 punchouts were the third most in the conference.



Assistant Coach Michael Cavazos 2nd Season

A native of San Antonio, Michael Cavazos was hired as an assistant baseball coach in August 2024. Cavazos came to the Roadrunners following a two-year stint as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at St. Mary's. He helped the Rattlers to 45 wins, including 41 in the Lone Star Conference, over his two seasons on the staff. The San Antonio Lee High School product helped coach players to a combined six all-conference selections, and a pair to all-region accolades — including Clay Bradford by three different organizations — while Ryan McGowen was a South Central Region All-Defensive Team selection. Prior to his time at St. Mary's, Cavazos spent the 2022 season as an assistant coach at Lindenwood in St. Charles, Missouri. Lindenwood finished with 27 wins, including a 16-12 record in their final campaign in the Great Lakes Valley Conference before making the transition to NCAA Division I. A pair of Lions earned all-conference honors while the team received the 2021-22 American Baseball Coaches Association Team Academic Excellence Award. Cavazos was an assistant coach from 2019 through 2021 at Southeast Missouri State (SEMO). He worked with the hitters and outfielders, served as camp director and oversaw baseball operations, helping the Redhawks win the Ohio Valley Conference Championship and advance to the program's first NCAA Regional since 2016. During his time on the staff, the Redhawks boasted a pair of All-Americans, three all-conference honorees and a Freshman All-American.



Director of Player Development/Analytics Luke Malone 2nd Season

Former UTSA pitcher Luke Malone was named the program's Director of Player Development and Analytics in October 2024. Malone was a star pitcher for the Roadrunners from 2020 to 2023, earning all-conference accolades in each of his final two seasons. The right-hander finished his career with a 17-9 record, 4.45 ERA, 178 strikeouts and a pair of saves in 63 appearances that totaled 234.2 innings pitched. In 2023, Malone earned second-team All-Conference USA accolades after posting six wins and 77 strikeouts in 16 appearances. In 2022, the Round Rock, Texas, native was a first-team all-conference selection after going 9-3 with two saves across 19 appearances, including 11 starts. He led the league in wins and posted a 2.67 ERA with 62 strikeouts against only 14 walks in 87.2 innings of work. He also landed on the Conference USA All-Tournament Team after helping lead the Roadrunners to the championship game, beginning with a record-setting appearance in the opening game where he came on in relief after the first two batters reached and scattered six hits over nine frames to set a tournament record for most relief innings pitched. Malone currently pitches for the Boise Hawks of the Pioneer Baseball League, an MLB Partner League. He has earned eight wins and struck out 108 batters in 41 appearances over the past two seasons. As a starter in 2024, he finished in the top five in the league in ERA and was a midseason all-star selection after starting his pro career as a reliever the year prior.

The UTSA Roadrunners have played in only four NCAA regional baseball tournaments, compared to 62 for the Texas Longhorns. The Roadrunners have competed in baseball for 34 seasons, and the Longhorns, by comparison, have appeared in the College World Series a record 38 times. UTSA plays in a facility in San Antonio that doesn't measure up to many anywhere, at any level, while Texas plays at Disch-Falk Field, one of the most iconic venues in the NCAA. In that regard, after the Roadrunners swept three games to win the Austin Regional, including two straight over the Longhorns, it wasn't surprising that Pat Hallmark was asked if he thought he had just shocked the world.

"I don't know," UTSA's sixth-year head coach said. "Maybe the college baseball world, a little bit. I don't want to go too much into that, but we'll shock the world when we win the whole thing. That would shock the world. But, like [UTSA outfielder James Taussig] said [Saturday] night, he said, 'Three more [wins] to Omaha.' And I was like, 'Wow, he's right.' And he said tonight, 'Two more.' 'So, I don't know if we [have] shocked the world or not. We surprised a few people. But people that have seen us all year, these guys [in the San Antonio media] that have seen us all year, I don't know that they are totally shocked. Again, we beat the Longhorns. I did not know we were going to do this. I knew we had a chance."

"But, [Texas'] Jim Schlossnagle is an amazing coach, and this is the University of Texas, so..."

So, yes, the Roadrunners surprised many in Hallmark's profession by what happened here in the last 72 hours. In succession, they downed Kansas State, Texas and Texas again. Three straight victories over teams in Power 4 conferences, and they capped off the run with a 7-4 victory Sunday night in the regional final.

As a result, the Roadrunners advance to meet the NCAA tournament's 15th-seeded UCLA Bruins in the Super Regional round. - Jerry Briggs, The JB Replay

Lorenzo Morresi grew up in Italy, in the town of Macerata, located about 100 miles to the north and east of Rome and about 30 miles to the west of the Adriatic Sea.

Soccer is king in Italy. Always has been, and, probably always will be.

But somewhere in the city of Macerata, in an apartment inhabited by grocery shop owners, at least one television set was dialed in last weekend to the NCAA Austin Regional baseball tournament.

As Morresi played perhaps the tournament of his young life for the UTSA Roadrunners, his father and mother stayed up late to watch and cheer on the Roadrunners. How late?

"They were, like, sleeping and watching," Morresi told The JB Replay Wednesday afternoon. "They were back home in Italy. They were trying to stay up to watch the game. Because, at 6 p.m. [in Texas], it's like 1 a.m. over there."

If one or both of his parents dozed off during the games, it would be understandable.

Morresi said in an interview under the oak trees at Roadrunner Field that his mom and dad run a business in Macerata.

The couple manage a fruit and vegetable shop in a town of about 40,000 that sits on a hilltop between two rivers, the Chienti and the Potenza.

So, between the hard work of their day job and the thrill of watching in the middle of the night as their son pursues his baseball dreams, some level of exhaustion would be expected.

Morresi assured that his dad, a former baseball player, was definitely tuned in.

Valter Morresi, as his son pointed out, loves baseball. He played the game in his youth, as a second baseman, primarily.

His son, one of the unsung heroes of UTSA's historic victory in the Austin Regional, said his dad played on club teams until he was 29 years old.

"He loves baseball," Lorenzo Morresi said. "He wanted to be here so bad, to watch us play."

Valter Morresi likely was thrilled with what he saw on television, regardless, because his son put on quite a show. A show of perseverance, resilience and skill.

Lorenzo Morresi didn't get the same start in the game that most of his teammates did. There was no travel ball, no high school ball. Only club ball to hone his skills.

Despite all that, he showed enough promise to start getting feelers from college coaches in the United States.

But just as he started to flourish as a player, the Covid-19 pandemic hit. Lorenzo was at home in Italy, shuttered at home with his family in Macerata for about five months, allowed to go out for essentials only one a day.

Because of the pandemic and the after-shocks felt throughout Italy, Morresi didn't get to start playing college ball in America until the 2021-22 school year at New Mexico Junior College in Hobbs, N.M. In junior college, Morresi found his groove, hitting .341 as a freshman and .365 as a sophomore. In between those seasons, he received another opportunity to improve his game.

He was invited to play for his country.

In July of 2022, he traveled to the Netherlands to play for Italy in the 30th edition of the Haarlem Baseball Week.

The two-week experience was a memorable one in that he played for Mike Piazza, a former major league star who played primarily with the Los Angeles Dodgers and the New York Mets.

Piazza, who spent about two months in 1992 with the San Antonio Missions, went on to star for 16 years in MLB and was later inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame.

At UTSA, Morresi has played for the past two seasons. This season has been a struggle for him in that he has been limited to 26 games while battling through injuries.

A sore back injury, in particular, was an issue a few months ago. Regardless, Morresi stayed with it and tried to stay positive. "It's been a tough season," he acknowledged. "I tried to stay focused, like, [stay] up mentally and don't lose the focus. And then, like, 'Let's go. Let's go win.'"

Feeling better physically, Morresi gradually worked his way back into the playing rotation. He's played only 26 of 60 games this season but has started in the last six, playing a mix at catcher, first base and designated hitter.

For the season, he's hitting a modest .287, but ever since UTSA's second game in the American Athletic Conference tournament, one of Italy's finest has been on the field each day for the Roadrunners,

spraying the ball around and hitting .333.

Moreover, as UTSA won an NCAA regional for the first time in program history last weekend, he was on base six times and scored five runs in three games.

His batting average in Austin? It was .412, on five for 12. Memorably, he went two for three with an RBI in a 10-2 victory over Kansas State. Next, he was one for four with a run scored in a 9-7 victory over Texas. Finally, he had two hits and a run scored in five at bats against Texas in the clincher.

In UTSA's biggest test in 34 years of baseball, Morresi was hitting the ball hard just about every time he came to the plate. How did he do it? Considering the amount of time he sat on the bench earlier in the season, how was it possible?

"It's just part of the job," he said. "Like, I'm going to do my job. Put the ball in play. Play hard. Try to win the game. It's part of the job. It's nothing, like, crazy."

Morresi was locked in mentally with what he had to do each day in Austin, though he did acknowledge feeling an adrenaline rush once, noticing all the Roadrunners and Longhorns fans in attendance.

"The first inning, in the first game against the Longhorns, I was just like looking around," he said. "And I saw so many people. And I said, 'That's beautiful.' Like, I should not feel pressure. I should just enjoy it and then do my job."

"It's like, I'm here for that."

Morresi's story this season is not unlike some of his teammates. Designated hitter Garrett Gruell didn't play consistently during the season. Neither did Gunnar Brown. But all three figured prominently last weekend.

It's something that defines the Roadrunners as much as their ability to score runs.

Perhaps it's because of the bond between players and coaches. There seems to be a certain trust factor between coaches and players, even players who aren't on the field every day.

"There are so many people in the locker room on this ride who aren't getting base hits or throwing pitches, but the quality of them as people is so genuine and real," Head Coach Pat Hallmark told Sean Cartell at goutsa.com. "These kids are pretty good at baseball and here they are sitting on the bench for us and so supportive of everything we're doing."

"When they're 40 years old, I'll think of them as much as the guys doing the actual game-playing. That's why I coach."

During his junior college days in New Mexico, Morresi acknowledged that he had options to play at other schools.

"Yeah, I had a few other options," he said. "But as soon as I got here and talked to coach Hallmark and coach Aguayo ... I knew I wanted to be here. I felt like I could get better here."

As for the upcoming super regional round at UCLA, it stands as an odd twist on history that Morresi will be there in Los Angeles, in the same city where Piazza, his former mentor, started his major league career.

Morresi said he didn't realize that Piazza played in the minor leagues in San Antonio in the Dodgers' system before moving up to play for Manager Tommy Lasorda in Los Angeles.

"I didn't know that," he said. "But that is pretty cool, that there's a link between us."

Morresi said the message from Hallmark to the players has been the same as it's been all year.

"It's like, practice hard, play hard," he said. "Try to win every game. Every pitch. Every situation."

The Super Regional against UCLA opens Saturday at Jackie Robinson Stadium. It's a best-of-three format, with the winner earning a trip to the College World Series. Can UTSA win two in Los Angeles?

"Our expectations are to compete and win," Morresi said. "We cannot control winning, but, like, we are going there to win and play hard. We're not going there just for a vacation. We're going there because we want to go to Omaha. It's our goal." - Jerry Briggs, The JB Replay

As money increasingly shapes the narrative in college athletics, UTSA's upset win over Texas in Saturday's NCAA baseball regional stood as a rare and resounding counterpoint that financial might doesn't always guarantee victory.

In a classic budgetary David-vs.-Goliath matchup, the Roadrunners toppled the Longhorns—a program that spends more than three-and-a-half times as much on its baseball operations. UTSA's 9-7 victory in Austin vaulted the team into Sunday night's NCAA regional final.

According to the schools' latest NCAA financial disclosures, UTSA reported \$1.73 million in total operating expenses for the 2024 fiscal year.

By comparison, the SEC power reported \$6.35 million in total baseball expenditures for the same period—excluding an additional \$5.2 million paid out in coaching severance payments.

The disparity was stark across nearly every category.

UTSA paid head coach Pat Hallmark \$272,296, while assistants Ryan Aguayo and Zach Butler earned a combined \$240,741. (The program added a third assistant, Michael Cavazos, last August.) Texas spent \$1.8 million on its former head coach David Pierce and another \$1.22 million on three full-time assistants. After firing Pierce last June, the Longhorns hired former Texas A&M coach Jim Schlossnagle, who reportedly earns \$1 million this season with a contract that rises to \$2.68 million by 2026-27.

Recruiting budgets also underscored the resource gap: UTSA spent \$28,001, while Texas allocated \$147,739. UTSA reported \$96,202 in equipment and uniform expenses—less than a third of Texas's \$317,227. Unlike Texas, UTSA had no support staff expenditures, because it had no support staff. That changed in October with the hiring of Luke Malone as director of player development and analytics.

Saturday's victory was UTSA's second over Texas this year, following a 12-inning, 8-7 regular season win on March 18. At 46-13, the Roadrunners entered Sunday's regional final with momentum, having already defeated a more financially comparable Kansas State team—though even the Wildcats still drastically outspent UTSA with a \$3.78 million budget in FY24.

On Sunday night, UTSA is set to face the winner of the earlier Texas-Kansas State elimination game in the Austin regional final.

Regardless of the outcome, the Roadrunners have already made a compelling case for at least one thing next season: a bigger budget.

Then again, that would kind of defeat their point. - Dainel Libit, Sportico

As the UTSA team bus returned to campus Monday afternoon, it was greeted by a sea of supporters, staff members and former players who came together to line Barshop Blvd. and celebrate the program's first-ever NCAA Regional Championship.

The 2025 American Athletic Conference regular-season champion Roadrunners are now 47-13 on the season and have continued to set impressive records and notch milestones along the way. Headed into this weekend's Super Regional at UCLA, the Roadrunners are just two victories away from advancing to the College World Series.

For the long-time supporters of the UTSA Baseball team, this year's accomplishments have been no surprise. For four consecutive seasons, the Roadrunners have notched 32 or more wins and have proven they can beat any team they face.

"We probably surprised a few people, but people that have seen us all year, I don't know that they were totally shocked," said UTSA's sixth-year head coach Pat Hallmark, the 2025 American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. "I knew we had a chance to do this, but I did not know if we would do it. We've had a good team for four years."

With crowds of better than 7,000 fans per game throughout the NCAA Regional weekend at UFCU Disch-Falk Field in Austin, UTSA in essence created Bird Bath North, an extension of the hostile home-field environment for which Roadrunner Field is known.

In the ninth inning Sunday, with UTSA's trip to the Super Regionals on the line, Texas pinch hitter Tommy Farmer IV popped his 3-2 pitch into foul territory. As UTSA third baseman Norris McClure snagged the foul ball for the first out of the frame, Hallmark's view of the play was obstructed by the camera well down the third-base line. The reaction to the play by the Roadrunners' fans was overwhelming.

"From my dugout view, I couldn't see Norris catch the pop up, all I saw was the crowd," Hallmark said. "The crowd was so loud and there were so many of them when he caught it, I thought he missed it because I thought it was Texas fans because it was so loud. As he comes bouncing back on the field where I could see him and we made the out, I thought, 'these fans are fantastic.'"

Among those in the crowd this weekend was a number of Hallmark's former players from throughout his coaching career.

"I'm glad it was so close that they were able to come up," Hallmark said. "We don't do this without the groundwork those people laid. It's not lost on me. There were kids there that I coached at UIW. I'm glad to see every one of them. They're all San Antonio people and a lot of UTSA people also. I loved seeing the former players."

UTSA's players took note of the impact of the fans who exhorted them to the historic feat.

"We go out there, we play good ball and we have a phenomenal fan base behind us," McClure said. "There were times where they were drowning out some of the Texas fans. I can't even imagine the ratio between which was which. Just like we all fight for each other and play for each other, the fans are out there doing their work too. It's awesome."

As it prepares to face UCLA in this weekend's NCAA Super Regional in Los Angeles, Hallmark's message to the Roadrunner faithful is a simple one, filled with appreciation.

"I'm just blessed and grateful," Hallmark said. "Thank you and keep coming." - Sean Cartell, UTSA Athletics

Chants of UT-SA engulfed Austin's UFCU Disch-Falk Field as orange and blue clad fans clamored for an opportunity to high five the victorious players and cameras clicked away capturing moments that will never be forgotten.

Pat Hallmark's UTSA Baseball team had just defeated No. 2 national seed Texas for the second night in a row, advancing to the first NCAA Super Regional in program history.

As he took in the celebration Sunday night in front of a crowd of more than 7,000, the Roadrunners' sixth-year head coach was filled with pride as he reflected on just how far his players have come since they started practice last fall.

Gunnar Brown, the right-handed pitcher who transferred to UTSA from Sam Houston — where he made only two appearances — after the 2024 campaign, had stepped into one of the most high-pressure situations imaginable, starting the NCAA Regional Final game. Brown emerged as the winning pitcher, throwing 5.0 innings, striking out four and allowing just one earned run as the Roadrunners staked themselves to a 7-1 advantage that Texas never overcame. He had progressed a long way from where he started when he first arrived at UTSA.

"He just beat Texas in a Regional Final game to send us to the Super Regional and I've been hard on him," Hallmark said. "During the early part of the season, Coach [Zach] Butler and I thought he should have made a play and he made a couple excuses. When the excuses come, it becomes about lacking accountability. I want growth from everyone. Gunnar just kept showing up."

Anyone who knows Hallmark or has watched him coach knows the passion that he brings to the job. He brings that same enthusiasm for the young men he coaches and isn't afraid to be vulnerable when expressing how much he cares about them.

"The players have seen me tear up," Hallmark said. "Once the players see that side of you, they totally, totally buy in because they know you care. You can break down in front of them and tell them how proud you are of them. They just beat Texas. I was talking to Gunnar but it was in front of the whole team. I wish more people would do it because they have it in them, but they're just scared to be vulnerable." Hallmark absolutely loved playing baseball.

After two seasons playing at Alvin Community College south of Houston, he was a First-Team All-Southwest Conference player at Rice for the Hall of Fame Coach Wayne Graham.

The 498th pick of the 1995 Major League Baseball draft, Hallmark, who calls himself a "marginal minor league player," played professionally until the age of 30, advancing as high as the Triple A level. After the 2003 season, he found he no longer had the same motivation to play.

"I still had a contract to play minor league baseball another year," Hallmark said. "I was married at that point. The offseason wasn't the same. The same will and desire to train wasn't there. I thought that this wasn't going to work if the will to prepare isn't there."

Hallmark had never intended to coach baseball, but he quickly realized that being close to the game is what brought him contentment.

"I actually did not decide I wanted to coach until I decided I was going to retire from playing," Hallmark said. "I never, ever wanted to

coach. I wanted to get into the medical field, pharmaceutical sales or something like that. Literally when my playing days ended, it was almost overnight. I couldn't see myself not involved with baseball. The coaching bug hit me pretty quick at that point."

Encouraged to become a baseball coach by his youth coaches and other mentors in his life, Hallmark sought out his first opportunity. He was named the head coach at St. Thomas High School, a Catholic college preparatory school in Houston, for the 2005 season.

"I was 100 percent prepared to be a high school coach the rest of my life," Hallmark said. "I did it for a year and I loved it."

"Pat, do you want my job?" It was an unexpected question that Hallmark received when he was working a summer camp at his alma mater.

Zane Curry, Rice's volunteer coach and the starting catcher on the Owls' 1999 College World Series team, was making a career change into the business world and thought Hallmark would make a good replacement.

"I thought he was kidding," Hallmark said. "Coach Graham was my coach at Rice. They had just been to the College World Series and were No. 1 in the nation. It was super high profile. Zane told me to go talk to Coach. I left my station and the group of kids I was working with; he took over my station. And I went in to talk to Coach."

Graham, who had led Rice to the 2003 NCAA Championship, surprised Hallmark with the question he asked in the moment.

"Do you really want to coach or are you trying this out and you're going to be selling insurance in 10 years?" Graham asked. Hallmark was all in.

He spent 11 seasons at Rice, becoming the Owls' pitching coach in 2012. During that time, he was part of a staff that advanced to three College World Series and claimed nine Conference USA regular-season titles.

It was under Graham's guidance that Hallmark developed much of the coaching philosophy he uses today.

"It was all about making the current player and/or the current team better," Hallmark said. "That's what Graham was all about: What does this player need? What does this team need? It was always a combination of the two because they work so in sync with each other. Every day was a chore — a chore in the positive, loving, organic way — to improve the personnel. Graham was the leader and he would sometimes give me specific areas. Mike Taylor, David Pierce and I were there, all directed by Coach Graham. In hindsight as I look back, there's so many things that we still do. We live in the moment. It's never a long-term thing, it's always about the current player and the current moment."

How well the Roadrunners have responded to pressure-packed moments might surprise those spectators who are new to UTSA Baseball. But preparing his team for the biggest moments has always been at the core of Hallmark's approach. It's about making practice so challenging that the games seem straightforward in comparison.

"The fall was very pressure-filled," Hallmark said. "Intentionally there are moments in the fall, whether it was when I was at Rice or now, where we put pressure on people and try to make them uncomfortable. October is probably my favorite time of the year. It's just pure coaching — player development and pure baseball. That's when you really try to ramp up the pressure on people."

As he celebrated with his team Sunday evening, Hallmark knew that the Roadrunners met the moment because they had been well prepared for it.

"Who really wants to play against Texas on June 1 and who just says that?" Hallmark posed. "If you're going to pout in October, what are you going to do at Disch-Falk Field on June 1? Creating uncomfortable moments can be very telling."

Those moments are ones Hallmark has always embraced, dating back to his playing days. He knew he wasn't the most talented player on the field, but his commitment to every aspect of his game allowed him to defeat opponents who, on paper, were better. Because the game isn't played on paper.

"I always felt like I had to do more with less," Hallmark said of his time as a player. "That tells you what I thought of my own personal ability. It's a little bit of healthy fear and a little bit of a chip on the shoulder. I wasn't as good as the next guy. At UTSA, we don't have as much as some of the people we're trying to beat. As a player, I was 100 percent that way and that's how I coach."

Hallmark left Rice in 2016 to become the pitching coach at Missouri. A year later, he earned his first head coaching opportunity at UIW. In two years leading the Cardinals, his teams totaled 66 wins and Hallmark was named Southland Conference Coach of the Year in 2019. His UIW squad notched signature wins against Notre Dame, Texas and Texas A&M that season.

On June 16, 2019, Hallmark was named the head coach at UTSA, where he has quickly developed the Roadrunners into a national contender. He's led them to four consecutive 30-plus-win seasons and UTSA has been in the mix for a conference title each of those years.

Texas head coach Jim Schlossnagle, a coach for whom Hallmark has repeatedly expressed his high regard, spoke to the program that has been built at UTSA.

"They're not a fly-by-night team," Schlossnagle said. "That is a real team — an Omaha-caliber club in every way. They can play a lot of different brands of baseball. They definitely have a persona about them and it's a winning persona."

The Roadrunners have long termed themselves the Junkyard Dogs, alluding to a grittiness that allows them to shake off any adversity and find a way to get the job done. That moniker has now become well-known nationally, but it's a mindset that Hallmark has instilled since arriving at UTSA.

"If you love playing baseball, you will love playing for UTSA," Hallmark said. "If you're coming here for any other reason, it isn't going to work."

Hallmark has been able to attract talent to his roster — talent that has largely chosen to stay committed to the Roadrunners, even in the modern era of Name, Image and Likeness and the transfer portal. What that has ensured is that the players on his roster are the ones who are in it for the right reasons.

"It's not lost on me, some of the entitlement that you see, it's the opposite of JYD," Hallmark said. "Coach [Ryan] Aguayo, Coach Butler and I have talked about this. There are programs with higher NIL budgets than us that have problems we don't have. They have the kid who is just there for the NIL money. If they're coming to UTSA, they're coming to play ball."

UTSA has won 47 games [and counting] this season and is in the midst of the most successful season in school history. The Roadrunners claimed the 2025 American Athletic Conference regular-season championship and have set countless records this year. While UTSA knows that it has more to accomplish, it has embraced the winning culture that has gotten the Roadrunners to this point.

"The winning's like a big measuring stick," Hallmark said. "Some coaches at mid-majors brush the winning under the rug like it's too hard. It's still the measuring stick."

Still, despite all the milestones and accolades, winning isn't the only thing for Hallmark and his staff. Far from it, in fact, they're developing leaders who will be successful in all avenues of life.

"The winning is not ultimately why we do it," Hallmark said. "You do it for the people, the relationships, the memories and the experiences. You have to win too. They go hand in hand. We place a supreme priority on relationships and winning. You can impact more people when you win."

When he thinks about the most rewarding aspects of his job, Hallmark points to the hard-working players on his roster who don't get all the accolades or attention that others do. They're still growing as players and as people, fulfilling his primary objective.

"There are so many people in the locker room on this ride who aren't getting base hits or throwing pitches, but the quality of them as people is so genuine and real," Hallmark said. "These kids are pretty good at baseball and here they are sitting on the bench for us and so supportive of everything we're doing. When they're 40 years old, I'll think of them as much as the guys doing the actual game-playing. That's why I coach." - Sean Cartell, UTSA Athletics

UTSA is a perfect example of why college baseball is such a fantastic sport. It's a story of toughness, adaptability and perseverance. That magical story will continue in this NCAA tournament after the Roadrunners dominated No. 2 national seed Texas for a third time this season on the way to a 4-1 victory to advance to the Super Regional round to face UCLA in Los Angeles next weekend.

"That's not even close to being some fly-by-night type of team ... that's an Omaha-caliber club in every way," Texas head coach Jim Schlossnagle said after the loss to UTSA. "They can pitch. And I like I said the other night, they have a persona about them."

"That's a real team right there. They can hit right and lefthanded, they can hit for power and they've got a bunch of different looks out of the bullpen," he added. "Coach Hallmark has been around the block a few times, and I'm super happy for him."

To understand how the Roadrunners arrived would be to know how everything began. The pieces of this team began to come together toward the end of last season. After UTSA finished last season with a respectable 32-24 overall record and 17-10 mark in the American Athletic Conference, it was thought that it was dealt a tough blow when righthanded pitcher Ruger Riojas transferred to Texas and stud infielder Matt King transferred to Arizona State. Riojas was one of the better pitchers on Texas's staff this season, while King went on to earn the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Award.

From talking to many coaches in a similar situation as Hallmark, they often speak of significant transfer departures like the above as if they're crippling to a program's success. That most certainly is the case for some programs. But that is not the case for UTSA.

Hallmark and his coaching staff aren't fans of excuses, so when Riojas and King moved out of the program, they immediately went to work to replace them. Clearly, several key arms, including Braylon Owens, have risen to the occasion this spring. Meanwhile, Ty Hodge, who impressed over the weekend and plays shortstop for the Roadrunners, was a late pickup from the portal because of King's departure.

Another late addition, former Spring Hill College (DII) standout Norris McClure, made incredibly hard contact throughout the weekend, and has been a massive part of UTSA's success this spring.

"We're just an adaptable program. We can get hurt by the portal, but we lost some good players ... but it's also a situation where we aren't here if they are here. We're kind of here because they left. Norris is here, and Ty is here because of some departures. Those guys are a big reason we're headed to a Super Regional. So, for our program, it's about adaptability and persistence."

"At the end of the day, it's about doing what you can with what you have," Hallmark added. "We are going to move on to the next guy, and again, those two guys are a big reason why we're here."

McClure had yet another standout night against the Longhorns in the clincher. He helped set the tone in the first inning with a two-run home run off Texas starting pitcher Hudson Hamilton on a ball that was 104 mph off the bat and traveled 421 feet. He continued his hot hitting with a single in the third inning and a double in the fourth inning. Meanwhile, Hodge had a base-clearing double in the third inning and added a single in the fifth inning.

"It's hard to put this into words. I can't say enough about this group of guys," Hodge said after the game. "We knew this group was going to be pretty special ... even off the field. This group loves each other, and it's a joy for me to be a part of it, given the work we put in each day."

"We feel like this isn't a surprise," Hodge added. "We deserve to be here, and all of our hard work is paying off."

There are moments in every season when a head coach and staff realize that they might have a special team on their hands. Those moments for the Roadrunners included fall workouts and a midweek win over this Texas team earlier this fall.

In the fall, Hallmark loved UTSA's blend of athleticism, power and speed. Hallmark, formerly at UIW, was aware of how most mid-major programs look from a physical standpoint. This was not a typical team for this institution.

The other moment that stood out to Hallmark was earlier this season when the Roadrunners impressed offensively on the way to an 8-7 midweek win over the Longhorns. From that point forward, Hallmark believed that this team would end the year in the NCAA tournament. Super regional bound, though? Yeah, he's not going to go that far.

This was at least somewhat of a surprise to the skipper. "I knew in the fall that we had a much different look than most mid-majors. We had a unique combination of physical bodies that were over 200 pounds that could run really well," Hallmark said.

"That's usually what you see at Power Four schools, and I loved the way we looked physically and athletically in the fall."

"I began to think this was a NCAA tournament team earlier this season when we beat Texas. I thought if our pitching could continue to get better, we could do some pretty special things," he added. "But to tell you I thought we'd be here [heading to a Super Regional], that wouldn't be true."

My overarching takeaway from the Austin Regional is that UTSA looked like the better overall club this weekend. The Roadrunners showed plenty of balance offensively, and I thought it said a lot about their offense that James Taussig had a quiet final game, but the rest of the offense picked up the slack.

The pitching staff also took care of business when needed. For instance, in the final, righthanded pitcher Gunnar Brown, who entered the game with an ERA north of seven, struck out four and allowed just a run on six hits in five innings. Meanwhile, righthanded pitcher Robert Orloski threw the final three innings and was up to 95-96 mph with his heater. And how about Braylon Owens in Saturday's win over the Longhorns? A special performance.

After winning the opening game of the Austin Regional against Kansas State, someone asked Hallmark about winning the first tournament game in program history. He sat there stoically and answered that he wasn't there just to win one game. He wanted to win three. He and the Roadrunners got their third win Sunday night.

Now, the historic ride continues with a trip to the Super Regional round.- Kendall Rogers, D1 Baseball

Beware of the junkyard dogs. For the last three to four years, the UTSA baseball team has had a piece of tape hanging over one of the doors in the locker room. That tape says 'JYD'. It appropriately stands for junkyard dogs.

That hard-nosed personality and unique clutch ability was on display yet again on Saturday night at the Austin Regional as the Roadrunners overcame a 6-1 deficit to No. 2 national seed Texas to win 9-7 and to get into the driver's seat in the regional — just one win away from a Super Regional appearance.

"Pat [Hallmark] has been a really great coach for a long time — and he learned under coach Wayne Graham. He has done a great job of creating that persona for his program," Texas head coach Jim Schlossnagle said. "His guys continue to get better, and they've got a lot of weapons. They're playing free and he's done a great job with them."

"That is not some jacked-up team who is just hot ... they are some junkyard dogs," he added. "They're good players, and they present a lot of problems. They play fearlessly and they will take a shot at something — even if it doesn't work. They can really hit."

Another word you can use to describe UTSA's club is resilient. Texas was the aggressor in the first three frames, but the Roadrunners stayed calm and collected and struck with a vengeance ... or as some would say, like junkyard dogs.

"What we talk about a lot as a team is trying to beat people in a lot of ways. You get to this point in the season, and other teams are going to prepare to attack the one or two things you don't do as well as something else."

"That was a little bit of a challenge at a place like UTSA early on ... the kids [when he got there] didn't really know what I meant by that. They weren't used to being really good," he added. "But this team is different. We're way more athletic with Norris McClure — we're more athletic than some other mid-majors. That helps on the bases, and it helps beat people in different ways."

Hallmark and his coaching staff put on a coaching clinic in this game. First, they executed a double steal in the fifth inning. They also had a couple of hits that were partly the result of runners being in motion.

The most unique moment of the game offensively for UTSA was in the ninth inning with fab freshman Dylan Volantis on the mound for Texas. Volantis had struck out four of the six hitters he had faced entering the ninth inning, but the Roadrunners got a runner to third base with two outs — with three-hole hitter James Taussig heading to the plate. Taussig, a 6-foot-6, 230-pounder, knew that Volantis was holding lefthanded hitters to an insanely low batting average.

He took matters into his own hands with a drag bunt that not only scored a run but also caused Volantis to have a look of amazement that he had just executed that play.

That is UTSA in a nutshell. It evoked shades of the fabulous 2014 Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns club, which had such a versatile offensive lineup.

"When we get down early, we don't talk about scoring five runs or whatever. We just talk about scoring one run," Hallmark said. "We will try to score runs in a variety of ways. On that James Taussig drag bunt, that was actually not our call. That was his own call. He was telling me that Volantis was holding lefties to something like a .140 average. That was just impressive that it was him telling me that — not a coach to him."

Senior righthanded pitcher Braylon Owens was another junkyard dog in this game for the Roadrunners.

Looking for stability in the middle innings, the Roadrunners went to the veteran righty after a leadoff walk in the sixth inning. Owens walked the first batter he saw in Adrian Rodriguez, but induced a pop out on a bunt to Jalin Flores and struck out Will Gasparino on a 95 mph heater and Jonah Williams on a 79 mph slider.

He was in a similar position two innings later in the eighth. He walked Kimble Schuessler and Rodriguez to start the frame before getting Flores to pop out and striking out Gasparino on an 84 mph slider and Williams on a 94 mph heater.

He proceeded to close out the game, striking out seven and allowing just a run and a hit in four innings of work. Owens was up to 96 mph with his heater against the Longhorns.

"He throws a ton of strikes and he's got a good changeup and breaking ball," Schlossnagle said. "I think he pitched against us in the midweek game ... he's really good."

This historic UTSA team continues to write chapter after chapter. On Friday, it won the program's first-ever NCAA tournament game. On Saturday, it advanced to the Regional title game for the first time in school history. Now, the program has a chance to knock down the ultimate door and reach a Super Regional for the first time in school history.




