- A 100% of garden furniture sold is FSC certified or is sourced from forests working towards FSC certification.
- B More than 75% of garden furniture is FSC certified or is sourced from forests working towards FSC certification.
- C More than 50% of garden furniture is FSC certified or is sourced from forests working towards FSC certification.
- D Less than 50% of garden furniture is FSC certified or is sourced from forests working towards FSC certification.
- E No significant percentage of garden furniture is FSC certified or from forests working towards FSC certification.
- F Failed to respond to Greenpeace enquiries.
