7 Response Steps When Handling


Blood & Bodily Fluids

Wear Gloves



- wear latex, rubber or nitrile gloves
- double up if the gloves are thin
- cover cuts/sores with a bandage
- inspect gloves for holes/tears
- avoid touching the outside of the gloves with bare skin
- dispose of gloves properly

Clean Up the Spill



- carefully cover the spill
- use an absorbent material such a paper towels
- prevent splashing of blood/bodily fluids

Decontaminate the Area



- use an appropriate disinfectant
- pour gently
- solution = 1 parts bleach to 10 parts water work from the edge of the spill towards the center

4 Wait 10 Minutes



- let the disinfecting solution penetrate for 10 minutes
- carefully wipe up the spilled material
- be alert for broken glass and sharp objects

Disinfect Cleaning Tools



properly disinfect all cleaning tools such as mops and buckets

Dispose of Contaminated Material



- use a broom and dustpan to pick up broken glasswear
- place glasswear in a puncture resistant container
- handle soiled laundry as little as possible

- place in a sealed plastic bag
- send home with the parent

Wash Your Hands



- use soap and water
- wash thoroughly
