THE MATCH-UP

The University of Iowa soccer team will make its first NCAA Tournament appearance in school history, facing No. 23 Notre Dame on Friday at Alumni Stadium in South Bend, Ind. The game is set to begin at 6 p.m. (CT).

HISTORY MAKERS

- In its 17th year as a program, the Hawkeyes are making the first NCAA Tournament appearance in school history Friday at Notre Dame.
- It is the third time in the state of Iowa history that a Division I team has advanced to the NCAA Tournament (Iowa State, 2005; Drake, 2006).
- Iowa has won a school-record 15 games this season and has won 12 or more games in each of the past three seasons. It is the best three-year stretch in school history.
- Iowa posted the first two postseason wins in program history, downing No. 7 Michigan (1-0) and No. 20 Penn State (1-0) at the 2013 Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes finished as runner-up after falling to No. 18 Nebraska, 1-0, in the title game.
- The Hawkeyes are 3-3 against ranked foes in 2013. The victory over No. 7 Michigan was the highest ranked team Iowa has defeated all-time and the three wins are the most in a single season for the program.
- Iowa is one of a Big Ten-record eight schools to advance to the NCAA Tournament along with Michigan, Penn State, Nebraska, Illinois, Minnesota, Ohio State and Indiana.

HAWKEYE QUICK HITTERS

- The Hawkeyes are receiving votes in the NSCAA/Continental Tire NCAA Division I poll. Iowa has 42 votes, which puts the team at No. 26 in the rankings.
- Iowa did not make a substitution in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinal victory over No. 7 Michigan, and used just one sub in the semifinal win over Penn State. The Hawkeyes' played 14 players in the championship game against No. 18 Nebraska, the most players used since Oct. 19 at Wisconsin.
- Over the last four games, sophomore goalkeeper Hannah Clark is 3-1 with a 0.25 goals against average. She has 20 saves, a .952 save percentage and three shutouts, included two over ranked foes.
- Junior Melanie Pickert and sophomore Hannah Clark were named to the Big Ten All-Tournament Team. The defensive duo helped Iowa to a pair of shutouts and surrendered just one goal in three games. Clark had a 0.33 goals against average and made 14 saves, while Pickert scored the game-winning goal in the semifinal win over No. 20 Penn State.

ONE NCAA HAWKEYE

Junior Emily Scott has two games of NCAA Tournament experience, having helped lead Wisconsin-Milwaukee to NCAA berths in each of the past two seasons. The Panthers lost 3-1 at Notre Dame last season and 2-1 against Ohio State in 2011.





HEAD COACH RON RAINEY

Ron Rainey has turned the University of Iowa soccer program into consistent contenders, guiding Iowa to its two best seasons in program history the past two years. With Rainey at the helm, the Hawkeyes have averaged over 10 wins a season the past four years, marking its most successful stretch in program history.

With 80 career victories at Iowa, Rainey is the school's all-time winningest coach. His career record is 170-131-39, while he sports a 80-66-18 record at Iowa. He has guided Iowa to at least 12 wins in the past two seasons, going undefeated in nonconference play and qualifying for the Big Ten Tournament in consecutive seasons. Iowa has also re-written the record books the past two years, breaking or tying 10 school records.

Iowa wrapped up a 12-6-3 season in 2012 with a trip to Bloomington, Ind., for the Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes went 9-0 in nonconference play and outscored its opponents 31-3 in that stretch. Iowa picked up Big Ten victories against Indiana and Purdue, and defeated Wisconsin, 2-0, to reach the postseason in a dramatic conclusion of the regular season. Iowa outscored its opponents, 40-19, in 2012.

The Hawkeyes finished 13-4-3 in 2011 and set or tied nine school records. Iowa went 9-0 in nonconference play and outscored its opponents 35-5 in that stretch. Iowa's 5-4-2 Big Ten record was its best since 2000. Iowa went on to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament for the sixth time in program history. The Hawkeyes ranked near the top in many major Big Ten statistical categories and finished fifth in Big Ten standings.

Rainey joined the Hawkeyes from Ball State University before the start of the 2006 season, where he served as the school's head coach since the program's inaugural season in 1999. Under his tutelage, the Cardinals posted a 70-52-17 record in seven seasons.

Before starting the program at Ball State, Rainey served as an assistant coach at the University of Iowa for the first two seasons of the Hawkeye program (1997-98). In Iowa's first year of varsity soccer, Rainey and the Hawkeyes were named the No. 1 first-year program by Soccer Buzz Magazine.

Rainey's wife Margaret earned her master's degree in education at Iowa and played collegiate soccer at the University of Wisconsin. They have three children: Wade (11), Sally (9) and Mary (7).

CLARK WITH THE SAVE

Sophomore Hannah Clark tied a career-high, making eight saves to lift Iowa to a 1-0 shutout victory over No. 20 Penn State in the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament on Nov. 8. The Colorado native withstood 25 Nittany Lion shots to preserve the shutout -- the 10th for the Hawkeyes this season. The 10 shutouts are a team and individual school record and lead the Big Ten.

TOP-FIVE FINISH

Iowa finished in a three-way tie for fifth place in the final Big Ten regular season standings. It is the third top-five showing in the program's 17-year history. The Hawkeyes finished third in 1999 and tied for fifth in 2011 and 2013.

3 HAWKEYES GARNER ALL-BIG HONORS

Juniors Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert were tabbed as second team All-Big Ten honorees for the 2013 season. The pair are the sixth and seventh such honorees in school history and the first for the program since 2011. Freshman Amanda Lulek was selected to the All-Freshman team, while senior Alex Melin received the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award.

LAST GAME

A penalty kick goal in the 30th minute by Nebraska's Jaycie Johnson sent the Huskers to a 1-0 victory over Iowa in the Big Ten Tournament championship game. Nebraska sagged back defensively in the second half, making it difficult for the Hawkeye offense. Iowa had six shots -- none on goal -- en route to being shut out for the first time in 2013.

SCOUTING NOTRE DAME

The Fighting Irish are making their 21st-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance after posting an 11-7-1 record in its first season as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference. Six of Notre Dame's seven losses were decided by one goal, including four in double overtime. The Irish finished fifth in the regular season standings with a 7-5-1 conference record, which included a 1-0 win over No. 1 North Carolina, a 5-0 triumph over No. 21 Maryland and a 1-1 draw with No. 13 Wake Forest. Notre Dame lost in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament to No. 5 Virginia Tech, 2-1.

Fourteen different Irish players have scored this season for a team that holds a 40-18 goal differential. Lauren Bohaboy paces the team with seven strikes and four assists, while Morgan Andrews, the ACC Freshman of the Year, has five goals and five assists. Cari Roccaro (four goals, two assists) was first team All-ACC, Andrews was second team, and Mandy Laddish (two goals, five assists) was third team.

Kaela Little has played all but 41:57 minutes in goal for Notre Dame this season, posting a 0.93 goals against average with 70 saves and five

shutouts.

THE SERIES

Friday's meeting will be the first in the series between Iowa and Notre Dame. The Hawkeyes have faced three current ACC opponents, downing Wake Forest (2-1; 2000) and falling to Miami (Fla.) (2-1; 1998) and Boston College (2-1; 2002).

GREAT TIME FOR FIRST GAME WINNER

Freshman Bri Toelle picked the most opportune time to tally the first game-winning goal of her career. The Colorado native scored in the 62nd minute to send the Hawkeyes to a 1-0 victory over No. 7 Michigan in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament on Nov. 6.

Toelle's initial shot at Wolverine goalkeeper Taylor Bucklin was saved, but Toelle collected the rebound and fired it into the lower right corner of the net for the game-winner. The strike was her fourth goal this season.

CLARK IN BIG

Sophomore Hannah Clark is among the Big Ten leaders in three statistical categories. The Colorado native's 10 shutouts lead the Big Ten, while her 0.47 shutouts per game and 0.94 goals against average rank second in the conference.

A CONSTANT IN THE MIDFIELD

Since arriving on campus in 2010, Alex Melin has been a constant in the Iowa lineup. The Wisconsin native has started all 81 games of her Hawkeye career.

DOWN GOES PENN STATE

Iowa defeated No. 16 Penn State for the first time in school history on Oct. 25 by a score of 3-2 -- the first win in 18 tries. Junior Cloe Lacasse scored the game-winning goal in the 75th minute, securing the Hawkeyes' first win over a ranked opponent since 2008. Iowa posted its second-straight win over the Nittany Lions on Nov. 8 in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals.

NASENBENNY NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Junior Katie Nasenbenny has been named to the 2013-14 Capital One Academic All-District team. The midfielder from LaGrange, Ill., is now eligible to earn Academic All-America honors following the conclusion of the season.

CAREER HIGHS FOR PICKERT

Junior Melanie Pickert has posted career highs in goals (six) and points (16) this season, while attempting a career high 49 shots. The Canton, Mich., native has scored three game-winning goals, the first three of her career.

Pickert, a second team All-Big Ten selection, has also been a key component to an Iowa defense that



has a Big Ten-leading 10 shutouts.

QUICK STARTS

Iowa has scored the game's first goal in 16-of-22 matches this season. The Hawkeyes are unbeaten (15-0-1) when notching the game's first goal and 9-1-0 when netting the first goal in the first half.

IRON WOMEN

Juniors Caitlin Brown and Emily Scott are the only two position players to play every minute for the Hawkeyes in 2013, logging 2,015 minutes apiece. Goalkeeper Hannah Clark, who has also played every minute of the season, has thrived with Brown and Scott leading a defense that allows only 11.1 shots per game.

BALANCED SCORING

Eight different Iowa players have scored at least one goal in 2013. Junior Cloe Lacasse leads the Hawkeyes in goals (six), assists (seven) and points (19), while junior Melanie Pickert has six goals and senior Ashley Catrell has five goals. Lacasse's seven assists are tied for the ninth-most in the Big Ten.

OUTSHOOTING, OUT SCORING

In 22 games, Iowa has out-shot its opponents, 360-245. The Hawkeyes have limited the opposition to 99 shots on goal and a .086 shot percentage.

Offensively, Iowa has a 34-21 advantage in goals.

2 HAWKEYES EARN B1G WEEKLY HONORS

Two Hawkeyes -- junior Cloe Lacasse and sophomore Hannah Clark -- were named Big Ten Players of the Week in 2013.

Lacasse was the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Nov. 4 after scoring both goals in Iowa's 2-0 victory over Purdue to send the Hawkeyes to the Big Ten Tournament. The two-goal performance was forward's first of the season and sixth of her career. The honor is Lacasse's first Offensive Player of the Week nod. She is the first Iowa player to receive the accolade since Keli McLaughlin in 2009.

Clark was tabbed as the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 3 after posting consecutive shutouts and leading the Hawkeyes to the team title at the Pacific Soccer Classic. The Fort Collins, Colo., native made six saves on the weekend and had a 0.00 goals against average and a 1.000 saves percentage.

LACASSE HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

In two-plus years, junior Cloe Lacasse has made her mark on the Iowa soccer program.

The Sudbury, Ontario, native is currently second in career goals (31) and game-winning

goals (10), and third in points (82) and shots (223).

Lacasse has led Iowa in goals scored, points, and shots taken in both the 2011 and 2012 seasons.

Lacasse was named Iowa's MVP in 2012, scoring goals in each of the team's first nine matches. She was named to the Madness' 2012 All-Big Ten first-team by CollegeSportsMadness.com, and was an All-Great Lakes Region second team honoree by the NSCAA.

BREAKING RECORDS, BEATING RIVALS

The Hawkeyes continued their dominance over Iowa State on Sept. 6, beating the Cyclones 3-0 in front of a record crowd of 1,594 at the Iowa Soccer Complex. The crowd bested the previous high mark of 975 fans set in the 2011 season.

The win was the sixth-straight for Iowa in the series. In those six games, Iowa has out scored the Cyclones 19-4.

ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH

In his eighth season as Iowa head coach, Ron Rainey is the winningest coach in school history. He has compiled a 80-66-18 record, which includes 40 victories the past two plus seasons.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Senior Alex Melin and junior Caitlin Brown have been voted team captains for the 2013 Iowa soccer team.

NONCONFERENCE DOMINANCE

The Hawkeyes have been dominant in non-league competition dating back to the 2011 season. The Hawkeyes have compiled a 25-0 nonconference record during the stretch.

Iowa's last nonconference loss came during the 2010 season against Nebraska, a year before it joined the Big Ten.

Since the 2011 season, the Hawkeyes have out scored their nonconference opponents, 81-12.

HAWKEYES TAKE TOURNEY TITLE

After defeating UC Davis on Aug. 30 and Pacific on Sept. 1, the Hawkeyes captured the Pacific Soccer Classic team title.

Senior Alex Melin, juniors Melanie Pickert, Caitlin Brown, Cloe Lacasse, and sophomore Hannah Clark were named to the all-tournament team.
